

Frequently Asked Question for the Nursing BSN Program

1. How long is the program?

Liberty University Nursing program is a four-year, Baccalaureate program. Prerequisites are taken during the freshman year and, after being accepted into the program, the program requirements may be completed in the next three years. Transfer- and second-degree students may complete the program in three semesters and two summers.

2. What are the prerequisites?

BIOL 213/214 Human Anatomy and Physiology I (lecture and lab)

BIOL 215/216 Human Anatomy and Physiology II (lecture and lab)

CHEM 107 General Chemistry

NURS 101 Introduction to Nursing

NURS 105 Medical Terminology

NURS 115 Sciences in Nursing (PATHO)

*BIOL 203 Introduction to Microbiology is a prerequisite for Summer Accelerated Program only

Transfer Students may complete NURS 101 and NURS 105 after transferring to Liberty if they are not available at the current institution.

3. When do I apply to the Program?

Liberty University's BSN Nursing applications are accepted once a year. The applications are posted on the Nursing website during the week of Thanksgiving for downloading and are due back in the Nursing Office mid-February (see application for exact date. Applications cannot be completed online.) Students are notified mid-March of tentative acceptance to the program

4. What are the requirements for tentative acceptance?

- You **MUST** be accepted as a residential student at Liberty University before being accepted into the Nursing Program.
- Complete application packet, including all transcripts and references
- Cumulative GPA of 3.0 for Fall admissions or 3.25 for Summer Accelerated admission.
- Successful completion of all prerequisite coursework with a "C" or better by the end of the Spring semester
- Students must supply Spring grades to the Nursing Office for final acceptance.
- Official transcripts for ALL previous college work (including dual enrollment during high school) **MUST** accompany the application. (Students also send transcripts to Liberty's Registrar but these are not available to us.) You may want to order 2 sets of transcripts when applying to Liberty, one for the Registrar and hold the other (unopened) to later attach to the Nursing Application.
