Aviation Maintenance Technician Program

OVERVIEW

Purpose:

The purpose of the Liberty University Aviation Technician Program (LU AMTP) is train pilots, as well as non-pilots to inspect and maintain aircraft. The program is applicable to those pursuing careers in Mission, general, corporate and commercial aviation.

Format:

LU AMTP is an accredited, accelerated maintenance training program designed to be completed as a single block, in one year. Classes begin in January, May, and August and are completed in one calendar year.

Objectives:

- 1) Prepare the student for competent, independent performance in aircraft maintenance,
- 2) To qualify and prepare the student for FAA certification, and
- 3) Meet the needs of faith-based, corporate, and commercial aviation organizations by providing well-trained aircraft maintenance applicants.

Entrance Requirements:

- 1) Acceptance into Liberty University, and
- 2) Acceptance into Liberty University School of Aeronautics AMTP program

Cost:

- 1) Tuition: \$23,000.00 (approximate - for 3 consecutive semesters)
- 2) Tools: \$1,800.00 (estimate)
- 3) Books: \$500.00 (estimate)
- 4) Uniforms: \$150.00 (estimate)
- 5) FAA Testing: \$850.00 (estimate - for three FAA written exams and three FAA practical exams)
