TRIP DETAILS

The Plan. . .

We will leave Lynchburg after classes on Friday September 30th, and arrive in the D.C. area (either Arlington or Alexandria) later that evening where we will spend 2 nights at an accommodating hotel. On Saturday we will take the metro into D.C. and spend the day in the D.C. metro area touring museums, walking around the National Mall, and enjoying the sights, with a tour of the Capitol building. That evening we will attend a play in Spanish and go to dinner together. After breakfast on Sunday, October 2nd, we will check out of the hotel and return to Lynchburg mid-afternoon. Please note that the hotel provides a full breakfast on Friday and Saturday mornings. Apart from that, students will be responsible for all other meals.

Cost and Fundraising opportunities. . .

The total cost per student is around \$170. This includes travel to and from D.C., two nights in the hotel*, breakfast on Thursday and Friday, and play tickets. A non refundable deposit of \$25 for current active members is required at the time you turn in your application.

The Spanish Honor Society will hold various fundraisers prior to and following the trip.
