

Liberty University Verification Policy

Liberty University notifies all students selected for verification through means of a document tracking letter.

Students are notified of the deadline to submit verification documents and the consequences for failure to submit the documentation in the document tracking letter. The deadline for submitting documents is 14 days from the date of the document tracking letter. Students not complying with the deadline for submitting documents may lose the Pell grant, FSEOG grant, Stafford loan and institutional aid.

When documentation submitted by the student does not agree to the information reported on the FAFSA, corrections will be made and submitted to the Department of Education.

Students are notified of award changes resulting from verification within 28 days of the change through an award change notification letter.

Students with an overpayment of federal grant funds will be reported to the Department of Education. Students will be given the following options.

1. Repay the overpayment in full to the school.
2. Sign a repayment agreement with the school.

The school will then return the overpayment to the appropriate grant fund.

If a student does not choose option 1 or 2 above, they will be referred to the Department of Education as an overpayment. The University will report overpayments to FSA Student Management Collections (Ed Collections) through NSLDS. Should the student decide to make a payment, the university will accept the payment and forward to Ed Collections on behalf of the student.
