Candidates seeking licensure as 6-12 or K-12 teachers should have completed a bachelor's degree with a major in the teaching endorsement, or a degree in a related field with courses similar to that required for a bachelor's degree in the teaching endorsement. Candidates must document a *minimum* of 30 semester hours of content courses including each of the competencies listed for the endorsement. [See Content Competencies for subject area.] In addition, candidates must successfully complete the appropriate *Praxis II* content exam in the area of endorsement *prior* to student teaching.

**Graduation Requirements**

- 36 semester hours
- 2.5 GPA
- No more than *two* courses with a grade of "C"
- Degree must be completed within 5 years
- Three courses in Residence

- <sup>1</sup>Residency Requirement (minimum 9 hours)
- <sup>2</sup>EDUC 571 to be taken the semester directly before or during student teaching.
- <sup>3</sup>500/600 level content elective may be substituted
- <sup>4</sup>All other endorsements choose one course:  
EDUC 524 *or* EDUC 627
- <sup>5</sup>EDUC 536 (1 credit) will not be offered after Fall 2008. EDUC 535 will be increased to 3 credits in Spring 2009. Students enrolling after Fall 2008 will take EDUC 535 for 3 credits, instead of EDUC 536.
