**The Games**

The Liberty Flames (9-3, 0-0 Big South) open Big South Conference play this weekend, hosting the Charleston Southern Buccaneers (7-7, 2-1 Big South) for a three-game series. The series completes the Flames longest homestand of the season, nine games. The three-game set opens Friday at 3 p.m., followed Saturday by the middle game of the series at 2 p.m. The final contest of the three games between the two squads is set for 1 p.m., Sunday.

**What to Watch**

In the midst of a nine-game homestand, the Liberty Flames look to remain unbeaten at home this season. The Flames bats have come alive during the first six games of the stretch, scoring 13.3 runs per game. Liberty has averaged 14.5 hits, 3.83 doubles and 2.3 home runs so far during the homestand.

Center fielder Curran Redal has paced the Flames hitters, while enjoying the week at Worthington Stadium. The junior has hit .550 with 11 RBIs over the six games. He has raised his season batting average to a team-leading .400. First baseman Trey Wimmer has also enjoyed some home cooking, hitting .526 during the homestand. Teammates Doug Bream and Jeff Jefferson are the last of the Liberty batters to have an over .400 average during the homestand. Bream is hitting .478, while Jefferson has a .409 average in the six games.

Meanwhile, starting pitchers Mark Swanson and Steven Evans have given the Flames strong outings in the early going. Swanson enters the weekend, sporting a 2-0 mark with a 1.32 ERA in 13 2/3 innings. Evans is 1-0 with a save and a 1.56 ERA in 17 1/3 innings.

Charleston Southern enters the weekend, looking to keep its winning conference record in tact. Last weekend, the Buccaneers took two-of-three from UNC Asheville in a conference series.

Charleston Southern has six players, hitting over .300. Outfielder Patrick Dolan (.388) and second baseman Scotty Radabaugh (.370) paced the Bucs at the plate.

Reliever Tyler Thornburg has posted a 3-0 mark and has not allowed a run in 8 1/3 innings so far this season for Charleston Southern's pitching staff.

**Head Coach Jim Toman**

**Record at Liberty: 44-29-1 (Second Year)  
Career Record: Same**

After a solid campaign in his first year as Liberty's head coach, Jim Toman enters his second season at the helm of the program.

Last season, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish the season with a 35-26-1 mark, making Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's 35-year history. Toman guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by a Flames team, as Liberty won 30 or more games in a season for the fourth consecutive year for the first time in program history.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks this past summer. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty batters eclipsed the school's single-season doubles mark, ripping 155 two-base hits. The total ranked the Flames fifth in the country in the category. Liberty hitters also set a program record for hit by pitch.

The Flames finished their season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed Liberty to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. The Flames went on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman is the sixth head coach in the 34-year history of the Liberty Baseball program. The second-year skipper comes to Liberty after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 19-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball. Toman's 2003, 2005 and 2006 classes were named the top recruiting classes by the publication.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

In addition, South Carolina posted eight-straight seasons of 40 or more wins with Toman on the Gamecock coaching staff, including 2007. During Toman's 11 seasons at South Carolina, he helped the Gamecocks to a combined 500-220 (.694) record.

Toman earned four baseball letters at N.C.State, 1981-84, and was captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in vocational industrial education in 1985. He received a Master of Science degree in sport management from N.C. State in 1995.

Upon graduation, Toman entered the coaching profession as an assistant at Richmond County High School in Rockingham, N.C., for two years. He moved into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989 as an assistant at Florida International for one year. At FIU, he was responsible for the weight program, worked with the squad's catchers and coached first base. Toman joined the N.C. State staff before the 1990 season.

## The Coaches

Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman is in his second year at the helm of the Flames. In this first season at Liberty, he guided the Flames to a 35-26-1 mark, the best record by a Liberty team under a first-year coach in program history.

A 20-year member of the college coaching ranks, he served 18 years as a member of Ray Tanner's staffs at South Carolina and N.C. State. Toman was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball.

During his time in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three-consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

Charleston Southern Head Coach Stuart Lake is in his first season with the Buccaneers. A 1994 graduate of Charleston Southern, Lake returned to take over the reigns of his alma mater after having spent time at South Carolina, Ole Miss, College of Charleston and his most recent stop, The Citadel. The 14-year college coaching veteran is heading up a program for the first time in his career with the Bucs. Lake got his start in college coaching at South Carolina, serving on the same staff with the Flames' Jim Toman.

## Following the Flames

This season, the Flames Sports Network plans to broadcast several Liberty baseball regular season games. Games will air live on WWMC 90.9 FM "The Light" and on the World Wide Web at both LibertyFlames.com and thelightonline.com. The schedule of games will be posted on thelightonline.com, when the radio station announces its broadcast schedule.

The stream can be accessed for a nominal fee through a link on LibertyFlames.com or by going directly to BigSouthSports.com. All three of this weekend's contests with Charleston Southern will be available on the Edge.

## The Last Time Out

The Liberty Flames jumped out to a 14-2 advantage, and then held off a charge by the Tribe of William & Mary for an 18-13 victory, Wednesday. The victory extended the Flames winning streak to six straight.

First baseman Trey Wimmer hit his second home run of the season, and catcher Errol Hollinger and outfielder Jeff Jefferson each drove in three runs in the Liberty victory. Seven Flames collected two hits apiece in the contest.

After a six-run fifth and a five-run sixth frame by the Tribe, reliever Cody Brown restored order, recording his first victory of the year to run his mark to 1-0 on the year. The senior right-hander allowed one run on two hits over the last 3 2/3 innings.

## Flames at Worthington Stadium

For the past 31 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium home. Liberty has compiled an impressive 492-224-5 record at the facility for a winning percentage of .686 since the stadium's inception in 1979.

Unbeaten at Worthington Stadium so far this season, Jim Toman's squad has started the home portion of its schedule at 6-0. The Flames are scheduled to play 28 games at home this season.

Last year, the Flames played 24 home games at the stadium, posting an 11-12-1 record at Worthington. The slate of home games included the first night contests in the history of the stadium. March 28 was the first night contest ever at the stadium, and nine contests were played under the lights.

## Liberty on the Road

Liberty has opened the season with a 2-2 road record. The Flames are 1-1 on neutral fields.

Liberty completed their 2008 road schedule, posting a 15-8 road record and a 9-6 neutral field mark. The Flames' 15 road victories were the most by a Liberty club in program history. Liberty's .652 road winning percentage was its best road mark since 1980, when the Flames went 9-2 on the road for an .818 percentage.

## Flames in Big South Openers

This weekend's series is only the fifth time during Liberty's 18 years in the Big South, the Flames have started conference play at home. Liberty is 23-25 in their Big South opening series of the season.

Of the 48 games, Liberty has opened conference play on the road 13 times with a record of 15-21. The Flames have opened at home four times, going 8-4.

Last season, Liberty opened the Big South portion of its schedule at Worthington Stadium, with the first night game in stadium history, a 5-3, 11 inning setback to Coastal Carolina on March 28. The Flames bounced back the following afternoon for a 9-6 win, before dropping the finale game of the set on March 30, 2-1.

## Baseball in the Commonwealth

Thirteen Division I baseball teams call the Commonwealth of Virginia home. This season, Liberty is scheduled to face opponents from the "Old Dominion State" 20 times.

The Flames have begun their games against Commonwealth teams at 1-1, after defeating William & Mary at Worthington Stadium, 18-13, this past Wednesday. Liberty posted a 13-13-1 record against in-state opponents in 2008.

The Flames will meet state squads George Mason (two times), James Madison (three times), Longwood (one time), Old Dominion (two times), Radford (three times), VCU (one time), VMI (three times), Virginia (one time), Virginia Tech (two times) and William & Mary (two times) this season.

## Liberty at Night

Liberty's Feb. 21 meeting with the South Alabama Jaguars was the first night contest of 2009 for the Flames. With a 3-2, 10-inning win, Liberty is 1-0 at night.

The Flames are currently scheduled to play 16 games under the lights this season, including the opener of a three-game series at Coastal Carolina on May 1, which will be televised by ESPNU.

Liberty finished the 2008 with a 8-4 mark at night. The Flames finished the year by winning six out of their last seven night contests. Since 2004, Liberty has gone 18-24 under artificial lighting.

## All-Time Against Charleston Southern

Friday will be the 55th meeting between the Flames and the Buccaneers on the base-baseball diamond since 1976. Liberty holds a 34-20 advantage in the all-time series.

Last season, the Flames swept a three-game series in Charleston, S.C. Liberty took the opener on May 3, 8-3. The following afternoon, the Flames won both ends of a doubleheader between the two teams, 13-2 and 8-2. Liberty holds a 10-2 edge over Charleston Southern since 2005.

## Bats Enjoy Homecooking

Entering a nine-game homestand last Friday, the Flames were hitting .235 and averaging four runs per game. Since then, the Liberty bats have heated up, as Jim Toman's squad has run off six consecutive victories on its longest homestand of the season.

During their first six games of the 2009 season at Worthington Stadium, the Flames have hit .387, averaging 13.3 runs per game. Liberty has posted double-digit hit totals in five of the six contests. With the red hot hitting, the Flames have raised their team batting average 80 points during the span to .315.

## Four-game Sweep of Temple

Liberty hit 11 home runs and banded out 16 doubles, scoring 56 runs, during a four-game sweep of the Temple Owls last weekend.

In their home opener, last Friday, Flames third baseman Tyler Bream drove in four runs and three teammates, Cody Brown, Doug Bream and Trey Wimmer, each hit home runs in a 12-2 win. Left-hander Steven Evans ran his mark to 1-0, allowing two runs, one earned, on seven hits over 6 2/3 innings in the contest.

Saturday, the Flames swept a doubleheader from the Owls, 18-9 and 11-1. Liberty hit four home runs in game one, including a pinch hit grand slam by Doug Bream in the win. The four home runs were the most in a game by the Flames since they hit four round trippers in a 28-7 victory over Richmond on Feb. 18 at Riley Park in Charleston, S.C., during the Crab House Shootout.

Doug Bream hit the first pitch he saw as a pinch hitter with the bases loaded in the fifth inning for his second career grand slam. The first baseman/outfielder hit his other grand slam on March 8, 2008 in an 11-5 win over Army. Two other pinch hitters, Justin Richardson and Kizuku Scott, each hit their first collegiate home run in the game, while Jeff Jefferson hit his third round tripper of the year in the victory.

The power display made a winner of right-hander Mark Swanson, who ran his record to 2-0 on the year. The junior did not allow an earned run in 6 2/3 innings in his second start in a Liberty uniform.

In the nightcap, catcher Errol Hollinger and right fielder Casey Brown connected for back-to-back home runs in the fifth inning, propelling Liberty to an 11-1 victory. Center fielder Curran Redal also added a home run in the contest for the Flames, helping to make a winner of left-hander Shawn Teufel (1-0).

It was the first time Liberty batters hit back-to-back home runs in a game since Hollinger and former Flame David Giammaresi launched back-to-back round trippers at Raymond "Hap" Spuhler Field during a six-run fourth inning, en route to an 18-4 win over George Mason on April 25, 2006.

Sunday, the Flames rallied from a 6-1 deficit after two innings of play for a 15-11 win and a series sweep. First baseman Trey Wimmer paced Liberty with four hits, scoring two runs and driving in two more. Jefferson, Doug Bream, shortstop Matt Williams and infielder P.J. Jimenez each had two hits for Liberty. Jimenez also hit his first home run in a Liberty uniform in the win. Carter Browning picked up his first victory for the Flames, with 4 2/3 innings of relief. Austin Poretz earned his first collegiate save by pitching the last three frames.

## Liberty Takes Midweek Tilts

This past week, the Flames won both of their contests during the midweek, running their overall season record to 9-3.

Liberty began the week, by using two two-run home runs against Duke to push past the Blue Devils, 6-3, Tuesday, in the first meeting between the two teams since 1988. Center fielder Curran Redal hit his second home run of the year, with a runner aboard in the second inning. Catcher Errol Hollinger smacked his fourth home run of the year in the year in the fourth inning, putting the Flames up for good in the contest, 4-2.

Senior right-hander Andrew Wilson allowed three runs on 12 hits over 7 1/3 innings, running his record to 2-1 on the year. He struck out four batters and walked two. Left-hander Stevens Evans recorded his first save of the year, retiring four of the five batters he faced over the final 1 2/3 innings.

Liberty upped its winning streak to six-straight games, with an 18-13 victory over in-state rival William & Mary, Wednesday. The Flames had 16 hits and benefited from seven Tribe errors in the win.

Scoring runs in each of the first four frames, Liberty jumped out to a 14-2 lead. First baseman Trey Wimmer capped a four-run first inning with a two-out, two-run home run, his second round tripper of the season. After plating two in the second, the Flames scored seven in the third inning, taking advantage of three William & Mary errors.

The Tribe closed the gap during the middle innings, with six runs in the fifth and five in the sixth, cutting the Liberty advantage to 14-13. However, reliever Cody Brown held William & Mary in check the rest of the way, yielding one run on two hits over 3 2/3 innings, as the Flames pulled away in the victory.

The Flames' home series with Manhattan, slated for Feb. 28-Mar. 1, was canceled, along with midweek games last week at VCU on Mar. 2 and with George Mason on Mar. 3. The VCU and George Mason games maybe reschedule later in the year.

### Flames Capture Coca-Cola Classic Title

Liberty opened its 2009 season, by going 3-1 to open the year and claiming the Coca-Cola Classic in Mobile, Ala., Feb. 20-22.

After dropping a tightly contested season opener to No. 6/12 Ole Miss, 6-5, Friday, Feb. 20, the Flames won three straight, Saturday and Sunday, to capture the tournament title.

On Saturday morning, Feb. 21, right-hander Mark Swanson did not allow a batter past second base in pitching seven scoreless innings in his Liberty debut. Catcher Errol Hollinger hit a solo home run and outfielder Jeff Jefferson drove in a run with a RBI double for a 5-2 win. over the tournament host South Alabama Jaguars.

In the evening, the Flames rallied from a 3-2 deficit and down to their last strike to defeat the Jaguars, 4-3, in 10 innings. Third baseman Tyler Bream doubled off the right-center field wall with two outs in the top of the ninth and scored when the next batter, short-stop Matt Williams, singled to tie the contest at 3-3. In the 10th, Jefferson lined a single off the glove of South Alabama's first baseman to plate Tim Rotola with the game-winning run. Andrew Wilson picked up the win for Liberty with five innings of scoreless relief. The senior did not allow a run over the final five innings, scattering two hits, striking out three batters and walking one.

Sunday, Feb. 22, Jefferson beat out an infield single in the eighth inning to score second baseman P.J. Jimenez, pushing Liberty past Mercer, 3-2. Flames starter Steven Evans gave up two runs on six hits over seven innings, but did not figure in the decision. He struck out six and did not walk a Bear batter. Reliever Tyler Light recorded the win in his first appearance of the season. The right-hander pitched two scoreless frames of relief, allowing two hits and striking out two batters.

### Hollinger Named to Brooks Wallace Player of the Year Watch List

Liberty senior catcher Errol Hollinger has been named to the preseason 2009 Brooks Wallace Player of the Year Award Watch List. The Wallace Award is presented annually to the nation's top collegiate baseball player.

Hollinger was listed among 204 collegiate players appearing on the preseason Wallace Watch list. It is the second straight year a Flame has appeared on the list. Last season, Garrett Young was named to the award's watch list.

This past season, Hollinger finished among the Big South leaders in runs scored (6th - 60), hits (7th - 82), RBIs (tied 8th - 47), doubles (tied 5th - 19) and total bases (tied 7th - 127). On the defensive side, he led the conference in runners caught stealing with 26 and fewest passed balls with four.

The senior hit .319 with eight home runs and a .494 slugging percentage in 62 games in 2008. He led the Flames by hitting in 21 straight games, the longest hitting streak by a Liberty player last season. Hollinger also led Liberty in both multiple-hit games (26) and multiple-RBI games. The catcher was selected to the Big South all-conference second team at the end of the season.

In a preseason survey of Big South Coaches by CollegeBaseballInsider.com, Hollinger was voted the conference's best catcher. He also received honorable mention consideration on the 2009 Ping! Baseball Preseason team.

### Liberty-Coastal Carolina to battle on ESPNU

ESPNU, the 24-hour college sports network, has announced it will televise the opening contest of Liberty's three-game series at Coastal Carolina on May 1, live from Charles L. Watson Stadium.

The telecast, scheduled to begin at 6 p.m., will be a rematch of last year's Big South Championship title game. The two teams have met in the conference tournament final the last two seasons. It will be the first time Liberty has ever played on ESPNU.

## **Liberty Picked Second in Big South Preseason Poll**

The Flames were tabbed by the Big South Coaches to finish second in the conference standings this season. Liberty was voted second, behind two-time defending champion Coastal Carolina.

The Flames, who were picked to finish atop the conference standings by two coaches, garnered 86 points in the poll, 11 less than Coastal Carolina. The Chanticleers received seven first place votes and 97 total points.

After last year's two Big South Championship finalists, Winthrop, who garnered the final first-place vote, was tabbed third by the panel, followed by VMI, Radford, High Point and conference newcomer Gardner-Webb. UNC Asheville, Charleston Southern and Presbyterian, another conference newcomer, rounded out the poll.

Presbyterian is eligible for the conference regular-season title, but not the Big South Championship title. The 2009 Big South Championship will be contested May 19-23 at McCormick Field in Asheville, N.C.
