**The Games**

The Liberty Flames (29-14, 16-4 Big South) travel to Conway, S.C., for a three-game Big South Conference series against the No. 22 Coastal Carolina Chanticleers (33-13, 12-5 Big South), Friday-Sunday at Charles Watson Stadium.

**What to Watch**

The Liberty Flames enter the Big South Conference series, atop the league standings with 16 conference victories, the most wins ever in Big South play by a Liberty team.

The Flames begin the weekend with a .320 team batting average and averaging 7.47 runs per game. In conference, Liberty has hit .333 as a team and its pitchers have an earned run average of 4.64.

Curran Redal collected his 19th multiple hit game of the year, Tuesday at Virginia to improve his season's batting average to .405. The center fielder continues to be in the top five in the conference in the category.

Seven other Flames start the three-game series with above-.300 batting averages. Doug Bream, Tyler Bream, Trey Wimmer, Errol Hollinger, Jeff Jefferson, Tim Rotola and Joseph Feeley also have posted averages over .300.

On the mound, starter Shawn Teufel has won six consecutive starts and enters the weekend at 7-1 with a 4.25 ERA. Starter Steven Evans has a 6-2 mark with 3.90 ERA. Reliever Andrew Wilson has carried the workload in the late innings for the Flames lately. He is among the conference leaders with a 3.14 ERA and a 5-2 record with four saves.

The Coastal Carolina Chanticleers begin the weekend in third place in the Big South standings with 12 victories. The Chanticleers are ranked as high as No. 22 nationally in several national polls.

Coastal Carolina is hitting .332 as team and is averaging 8.5 runs per game so far this season. The Chanticleers lead the Big South with a .338 conference average, while posting a 4.11 ERA in conference play.

First baseman David Anderson, who is among the Big South leaders in several offensive categories, paces Coastal Carolina with a .379 batting average. Eight Chanticleers are hitting .300 or better.

On the mound, right-hander Cody Wheeler leads the conference in wins with an 8-0 record with a 3.06 ERA. Starter Anthony Meo has a 5-2 mark with a 3.26 ERA. Out of the bullpen, Nick McCully has made 22 appearances, posting a 3-1 mark with a 1.89 ERA and eight saves.

## Head Coach Jim Toman

Record at Liberty: 64-40-1 (Second Year)  
Career Record: Same

After a solid campaign in his first year as Liberty's head coach, Jim Toman is in his second season at the helm of the program.

Last season, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish the season with a 35-26-1 mark, making Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's 36-year history. Toman guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by a Flames team, as Liberty won 30 or more games in a season for the fourth consecutive year for the first time in program history.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks this past summer. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty batters eclipsed the school's single-season doubles mark, ripping 155 two-base hits. The total ranked the Flames fifth in the country in the category. Liberty hitters also set a program record for hit by pitch.

The Flames finished their season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed Liberty to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. The Flames went on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman is the sixth head coach in the 34-year history of the Liberty Baseball program. The second-year skipper comes to Liberty after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 19-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball. Toman's 2003, 2005 and 2006 classes were named the top recruiting classes by the publication.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

In addition, South Carolina posted eight-straight seasons of 40 or more wins with Toman on the Gamecock coaching staff, including 2007. During Toman's 11 seasons at South Carolina, he helped the Gamecocks to a combined 500-220 (.694) record.

Toman earned four baseball letters at N.C. State, 1981-84, and was captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in vocational industrial education in 1985. He received a Master of Science degree in sport management from N.C. State in 1995.

Upon graduation, Toman entered the coaching profession as an assistant at Richmond County High School in Rockingham, N.C., for two years. He moved into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989 as an assistant at Florida International for one year. At FIU, he was responsible for the weight program, worked with the squad's catchers and coached first base. Toman joined the N.C. State staff before the 1990 season.

## Remembering A Teacher, Mentor and Fan

The Liberty University community, athletics department and baseball program would like to remember Jeff Taylor, an Assistant Professor of Health Sciences and Kinesiology, who died accidentally Tuesday. Prior to his educational position, Taylor was an athletic trainer at both Liberty and UNC Asheville.

Taylor will be remembered for his influence on students to pursue their careers and the friendship he provided many in the Lynchburg community. An avid baseball fan, Taylor followed the Flames on a regular basis and loved to talk baseball with whoever he could.

Please remember the Taylor's wife and family in your prayers. A moment of silence will be observed in Taylor's memory before Friday's contest.

## The Coaches

Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman is in his second year at the helm of the Flames. In this first season at Liberty, he guided the Flames to a 35-26-1 mark, the best record by a Liberty team under a first-year coach in program history. This season, his Flames have posted the most victories by a Liberty team in conference play, elipsing the previous mark of 15.

A 20-year member of the college coaching ranks, he served 18 years as a member of Ray Tanner's staffs at South Carolina and N.C. State. Toman was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball.

During his time in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three-consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

Coastal Carolina Head Coach Gary Gilmore is in his 14th year of guiding the Chanticleer baseball program. In his time at Coastal Carolina, he has led the Chanticleers to eight NCAA berths, eight 40-plus win seasons in the last 10 years, 11-straight winning seasons, and the school's first trip to the NCAA Super Regional last season.

Last season, the 1980 Coastal Carolina alumnus led his team to a 50-14 record, hosting and winning the NCAA Conway Regional. The Chanticleers advanced to the NCAA Cary Super Regional, a first in the school's history. Gilmore was named the Big South Coach of the Year for the fifth time, as the Chants won both the regular-season and tournament championships.

In his 19 seasons as a college head coach, Gilmore's teams have averaged more than 39 wins a year, including 12 40-plus win seasons. In his 13 years at Coastal Carolina, Gilmore's ball clubs have finished in the top four of the Big South Conference standings 12 times, including regular season titles in 1999, 2002, 2005, 2007 and 2008.

## Following the Flames

Friday night's series opener will be televised by ESPNU starting at 6 p.m. It will be the first ever appearance on ESPNU for the Flames. Justin Kutchner will provide the play-by-play for the telecast, with Leland Maddox providing the color commentary.

This season, the Flames Sports Network plans to broadcast several Liberty baseball regular season games. Games will air live on WWMC 90.9 FM "The Light" and on the World Wide Web at both LibertyFlames.com and thelightonline.com. The next planned broadcast is Tuesday from English Field in Blacksburg, Va., when the Flames square off with the Virginia Tech Hokies. Game time is scheduled for 7 p.m.

### Flames at Worthington Stadium

For the past 31 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium home. Liberty has compiled an impressive 504-227-5 record at the facility for a winning percentage of .688 since the stadium's inception in 1979.

The Flames have posted an 18-3 record at the facility this season, already eclipsing last season's home win total of 11. Liberty is scheduled to play 24 games at home this season.

### Liberty on the Road

Liberty is 10-10 on the road this season. The Flames are also 1-1 on neutral fields. Jim Toman's squad is in the midst of a nine-game road stretch, posting a 2-2 mark so far.

The Flames completed their 2008 road schedule, posting a 15-8 road record and a 9-6 neutral field mark. Liberty's 15 road victories were the most by a Liberty club in program history. Liberty's .652 road winning percentage was its best road mark since 1980, when the Flames went 9-2 on the road for an .818 percentage.

### Liberty at Night

Liberty is 6-4 at night this season. The Flames are currently scheduled to play 14 games under the lights in 2009. The first two games of their series at Coastal Carolina are scheduled night games.

The Flames finished the 2008 campaign with an 8-4 mark at night. The Flames closed out the year by winning six out of their last seven night contests. Since 2004, Liberty has gone 24-27 under artificial lighting.

### Flames By the Month

Liberty is 10-8 during the month of April. However, the Flames have posted a 9-3 record in Big South Conference play in the month.

Jim Toman's squad is scheduled to play 19 games in the month this season. Since 1976, the Flames have recorded an all-time mark of 331-281-1 (.541) in April.

The Flames posted a 16-3 (.842) overall mark and started 7-1 in Big South play during the month of March. Last season, the Flames posted a 7-12 overall mark and a 1-2 record in conference action during the month. Liberty is 337-267-2 (.557) all-time in program history during March.

Liberty finished its February schedule with a 3-3 mark. The Flames were scheduled to play nine games in the month, but had three canceled due to inclement weather. Liberty has an all-time mark of 64-32 in February.

### Liberty All-Time Against Coastal Carolina

Friday night will be the 65th meeting between Liberty and Coastal Carolina on the baseball diamond. The Chanticleers hold a 36-28 advantage in the all-time series with the Flames, which start in 1983.

Last season, Liberty and Coastal Carolina met five times, three during the regular season and twice for the Big South Championship.

### Flames Post Most Victories in Big South Play

With their 10-9, 11-inning win at Gardner-Webb, this past Sunday, the 2009 Liberty Flames have recorded 16 Big South victories, the most ever by a Liberty baseball team since joining the conference in 1992. The victory total surpasses the 15 Big South wins by the 1995 Flames, who finished their conference season at 15-9. Jim Toman's squad still has six Big South Conference games remaining.

### On the Verge of 30 Wins

With one more victory, Liberty will have reached 30 wins for the fifth consecutive season, and the first two years under head coach Jim Toman.

Last season, the Flames posted a 35-26-1 mark to record four-straight seasons of 30 wins are more. It was the first time in the 36-year history of the program, Liberty has accomplished the four-year feat.

Before last season, the Liberty baseball program had won 30 games in season, three consecutive years. The Flames won 30 or more contests three consecutive seasons from 2000-03.

### The Last Time Out

After Liberty had tied the contest in top of the inning, the No. 11 Virginia Cavaliers scored three runs in the bottom of the sixth, en route to a 5-2 win over the Flames, Tuesday night at Davenport Field.

In the top of the sixth inning, Liberty knotted the contest at 2-2. Shortstop Matt Williams singled past the pitcher's mound and into center field to begin the frame. Center fielder Curran Redal followed by moving Williams to second with a sacrifice bunt. Williams promptly swiped third base and scored when the next batter, catcher Errol Hollinger a double inside the bag at third.

In the bottom of the stanza, the Cavaliers countered with three runs to go back on top in the contest, 5-2. Center fielder Jarrett Parker hit his 13th home run of the season, leading off the inning. Later, catcher John Hicks grounded a two-out single up the middle, scoring two more runs for the final score.

## Taking One for the Team

Entering play this weekend, Liberty batters have been hit by a pitch 82 times, tying the school record the Flames set last season. Liberty batters have been plunked by the opposition an average of two times per game. The Flames ranked fourth in the nation in the category in the latest NCAA Division I statistical report, through games of April 26, with 81.

This year, Flames batters have been hit by a pitch seven times in a game twice to set a new school standard. Temple pitchers hit seven Liberty hitters on March 7 and High Point hurlers plunked seven Flames on March 22.

Last season, the Flames set a new school record by being hit by a pitch 82 times. The mark eclipsed the previous standard of 75 in the 2001 season.

## Fine Fielding

Jim Toman's squad ranked seventh in the nation in fielding percentage with a .978 percentage in the latest NCAA Division I statistical report, for games through April 26. In addition, the Flames' current percentage of .977 tops the Big South Conference. Liberty has committed 37 errors in 1643 chances this season.

The Flames fielding percentage is 26 points higher than at the same juncture of the year, last season. Through 42 games, Liberty had made 67 errors, 30 more than this year, in 1712 chances for a .951 fielding percentage in 2008. The Flames ended the year with a .963 percentage.

The best team fielding percentage over a season in school history was set by the 2005 Flames. That season, Liberty posted a .971 fielding percentage and also committed the fewest errors in school history with 62.

## Two Flames Tough to K

Entering the weekend, Liberty outfielders Curren Redal and Doug Bream have shown themselves to be two of the toughest hitters in the nation to strike out.

Through games played on April 26, Redal has struck out once every 20.6 at bats, ranking him 12th among NCAA Division I batters in the country. Meanwhile, fellow Flame Doug Bream ranks 13th on the same list, striking out once every 20.4 at bats.

## Flames Win 16th Big South Contest

Liberty catcher Errol Hollinger hit a game-tying grand slam and first baseman Trey Wimmer blasted the game-winning home run, as the Flames rallied from a 9-3 deficit for a 10-9, 11-inning win over the Gardner-Webb Bulldogs in Big South Conference baseball action, last Sunday at Masters Field.

With the win, the Flames moved to 16-4 in conference play. Liberty's 16 league victories are the most ever by a Liberty baseball team since joining the Big South in 1992. The victory total surpasses the 15 Big South wins by the 1995 Flames. With the win, Liberty takes the three-game series, two games to one.

After Liberty erased a 9-3 Gardner-Webb lead to knot the contest at 9-9, Wimmer led off the 11th inning by blasting the first pitch of the inning over the left field wall. The home run, the first baseman's sixth of the season, gave Liberty a 10-9 advantage. Reliever Andrew Wilson then closed out the Bulldogs in bottom of the inning, stranding the tying run on second base to run his record to 5-2. The right-hander threw four innings of scoreless relief, allowing two hits, while striking out five and walking one.

The Flames knotted the contest in the eighth inning. The first three hitters in the inning, second baseman P.J. Jimenez, shortstop Matt Williams and center fielder Curran Redal, each singled to begin the frame, loading the bases with no one out. Two batters later, Hollinger drilled a 1-0 pitch over the left field wall, tying the contest at 9-9. The grand slam was the catcher's eighth round tripper of the year.

The Flames' Redal had four hits to lead all players in the contest. Doug Bream added three hits. Hollinger had five RBIs for Liberty.

A day earlier, Tyler Bream drove in six runs and Liberty pitchers held Gardner-Webb hitters in check throughout the contest, as the Flames downed the Bulldogs, 10-2.

Bream, who was 4-for-4 in the contest, ripped a pair of two-out, two-run base hits in first and the third innings. In the first, the Liberty third baseman singled and in the third, he doubled. He drove in his final two runs in the ninth with a single.

After 13 consecutive batters had been retired, the Flames got the first two hitters of the ninth inning on base. Shortstop Matt Williams drew a walk to open the inning and center fielder Curran Redal dropped a single into center field. After the next two Liberty batters were retired, Bream worked a 3-2 count against reliever Ben Rowen, before belting his eighth home run of the year over the right field wall for the 4-3 victory.

Designated hitter Cody Brown also hit a home run for the Flames.

Liberty's four hurlers on the afternoon gave up three runs on four hits, striking out five and walking one. Bream's blast gave freshman hurler John Long his first collegiate win, moving to 1-0 on the season.

### Flames Sweep Winthrop

P.J. Jimenez drove in four runs with a home run and a single, helping the Liberty Flames defeat the Winthrop Eagles, 10-5, in game two of their Big South doubleheader at Worthington Stadium, April 18, sweeping both the doubleheader and the three-game series. With the sweep, the Flames moved into first place in the conference standings.

Liberty second baseman Jimenez connected for his second home run of the year, with two men aboard, during a four-run second inning. He later plated another run with an infield single with the bases loaded in the seventh frame.

During one stretch in the game, Flames pitchers Mark Swanson and Cody Brown retired combined to retire 14 batters in a row from the second inning through the seventh inning. Brown earned the win to raise his record to 2-2 on the year. Carter Browning recorded his fourth save with 1 1/3 innings of relief.

## Streaks Help Flames March Through March

Two winning streaks propelled Liberty to a 16-3 record in March. The Flames began the third month of the year with a seven-game winning streak, March 6-13. After two setbacks, Liberty went on a nine-game winning skein, March 18-30, its longest of the season.

The nine-game streak ties the 2009 Flames with the 2008, 2006, 1995 and 1985 clubs for the most consecutive wins in a season during the program's Division I era. The 1976 Liberty team holds the school record for the longest win streak in the history of the program with a 12-game streak.

## Mashing in March

After going 3-3 to begin the season, the Flames went 16-3 in the month of March, keyed by their hitting. Over its 19 games during the month, Liberty hit .356 as a team, and scored 10.2 runs per game. The hitting outburst raised the Flames' batting average for the season 88 points, to .326.

During the stretch, Liberty enjoyed a power burst too. The Flames hit 31 home runs and boasted a .563 slugging percentage over the March's 19 games.

## Flames Sweep Blue Hose In First-Ever Series

Liberty hit five home runs, propelling the Flames to a 14-7 victory over Presbyterian, and a sweep of its three-game series with the Blue Hose, March 29 at Worthington Stadium. The series was the first-ever between the Flames and Big South newcomer Blue Hose.

Third baseman Tyler Bream hit his first collegiate grand slam in the third inning, while outfielders Curran Redal and Doug Bream connected for back-to-back home runs in the fifth. Catcher Errol Hollinger and Trey Wimmer also hit four-baggers for the Flames.

Redal's round tripper was his fourth of the season, while Doug Bream's was his fifth of the year. It is the second time this season, the Flames have hit back-to-back home runs in a contest. Hollinger and outfielder Casey Brown hit back-to-back home runs in the fifth inning of an 11-1 victory over Temple on March 7.

Liberty starter Shawn Teufel improved to 3-1 on the season. The left-hander gave up four runs on seven hits, striking out six in six innings of work.

The two prior days, March 28-27, Liberty receiving strong pitching efforts from right-hander Mark Swanson and left-hander Steven Evans in posting identical 2-1 wins in each game. On March 28th, Swanson pitched eight complete innings to run his record to 4-0 on the year. Reliever Carter Browning earned his second save with a scoreless ninth. Tyler Bream singled home the only runs Liberty needed in the fourth inning for a 2-1 victory, as the two Flames' hurlers combined to retire the last 13 Presbyterian.

In the first-ever meeting between the two squads in the series opener, March 27, Evans went the distance in his second-straight start to run his season record to 4-0. The left-hander gave up one run on six hits, striking out five.

Trailing 1-0 in the ninth, the Flames rallied to win. Center fielder Curran Redal singled to open the frame and scored on a double by right fielder Doug Bream. After the next two batters were intentionally walked, Tyler Bream walked with the bases loaded, forcing in Doug Bream with the winning run.

## Season-High 23 Hits at N.C. State

The Liberty Flames banged out a season-high 23 hits, leading from start to finish, en route to a 17-5 victory over the N.C. State Wolfpack, March 25 at Doak Field.

The Flames collected 23 hits in the contest, the most by Jim Toman's team this season. The hit total eclipses the 18 hits Toman's squad had on three other occasions earlier this year.

Center fielder Curran Redal and first baseman Trey Wimmer paced the Flames at the plate with four hits each. Tyler Bream, Errol Hollinger and Jeff Jefferson added three hits apiece for Liberty. Wimmer had four RBIs in the contest, while Jefferson hit his fourth home run.

Mark Swanson, the second Liberty pitcher in the contest, picked up the win to run his record to 3-0 on the year. The right-hander pitched 2 1/3 scoreless innings, giving up one hit and striking out three.

## Hollinger On Johnny Bench Watch List

Liberty senior catcher Errol Hollinger has been listed on the 2009 Coleman Company-Johnny Bench Watch List. The award is given annually to the top Division I collegiate catcher. The initial list includes 44 catchers nominated for the award by their coaches.

Hollinger, a native of Upland, Calif., is a four-year starter at the position for the Flames. He entered the season named on the 2009 Brooks Wallace Player of the Year Watch list.

The senior enters Friday's contest tied for the team lead in home runs with eight. Hollinger is hitting .319 with 30 RBIs and 28 runs scored in 43 starts. He has also added 11 doubles.

Last season, the Liberty catcher finished among the Big South leaders in runs scored (6th – 60), hits (7th – 82), RBIs (tied 8th – 47), doubles (tied 5th – 19) and total bases (tied 7th – 127). On the defensive side, he led the conference in runners caught stealing with 26 and fewest passed balls with four.

The senior hit .319 with eight home runs and a .494 slugging percentage in 62 games in 2008. He led the Flames by hitting in 21-straight games, the longest hitting streak by a Liberty player last season. Hollinger also led Liberty in both multiple-hit games (26) and multiple-RBI games (15). The catcher was selected to the Big South all-conference second team at the end of the season.

## Redal Tabbed Big South Player of the Week

Liberty junior outfielder Curran Redal was selected as the Big South Conference Choice Hotels Baseball Player of the Week for games played March 9-16.

Redal helped Liberty post a 3-1 record during the week, with a .500 batting average (5-10), .684 on-base percentage and a .900 slugging percentage. The junior scored five runs, knocked in seven runs, doubled, homered, walked six times and was 3-3 in stolen bases. Redal enters the week on a 10-game hit streak, hitting .500 over the stretch.

The center fielder slugged a home run and walked twice in Liberty's 6-3 victory over Duke, March 10, and had two hits and two RBIs in the Flames' win over William & Mary, March 11. In two games March 13-15, he collected two hits and three RBIs in Liberty's two games against Charleston Southern.

## Tyler Bream's Record Helps Complete Sweep

Third baseman Tyler Bream tied the Liberty record for RBIs in a game with nine, as the Flames defeated the High Point Panthers, 19-5, March 22 at Coy Willard Stadium to complete a sweep of its three-game Big South series.

With a run-scoring single in seventh inning, Bream tied the Liberty record for RBIs in a game with nine. The freshman third baseman's nine RBIs tied the school mark set by former Flame standout Pat Sipe, who recorded nine RBIs in a 13-2 win over Richmond on April 19, 1986, at Worthington Stadium.

Bream went 3-for-4 with four runs scored to go along with his nine RBIs for the Flames. Catcher Errol Hollinger went 3-for-3 with three RBIs and a run scored.

Left-hander Steven Evans went the distance, recording his first complete game of the season, as the Liberty Flames defeated the High Point Panthers, 7-3, Saturday night in the middle game of the series.

After the first inning, Evans cruised throughout the remainder of the contest, keeping the Panther batters in check to run his record to 3-0. The sophomore allowed three runs on nine hits. He struck out three and walked one. He became the first Flames pitcher to pitch a complete game this season.

Bream paced Liberty at the plate with three hits and three RBIs. Second baseman Kizuku Scott also had three hits for the Flames, scoring three times in the victory.

Friday night in the opening game of a three-game Big South series, Justin Richardson doubled home the go ahead run in the top of the ninth and reliever Andrew Wilson made it stand in the bottom of the frame, as the Liberty Flames defeated the High Point Panthers, 9-8.

With the game tied 8-8 in the top of the ninth, Liberty took the lead for good on a two-base hit by Richardson. With two out and first baseman Trey Wimmer on second base, Richardson rocketed a double to the left center field gap to give the Flames a 9-8 lead. Earlier in the contest, Richardson had tied the game with a pinch-hit, RBI double in the seventh inning.

Walker allowed two walks and struck out four, leading the Bulldogs to a 3-0 win. The game marked the only shutout against the Flames on the season and the first no-hitter thrown against Liberty since 1992.
