The Games

The Liberty Flames (27-12, 14-3 Big South) travels to Boiling Springs, N.C., to square off with Big South Conference newcomer Gardner-Webb Bulldogs (20-16, 9-6 Big South) in a three-game conference series at Williams H. Masters Field, Friday-Sunday. The series gets underway Friday afternoon at 3 p.m., followed by a 1 p.m. start time for game two of the set on Saturday. The finale of the series is scheduled for Sunday at 1 p.m.

What to Watch

The Liberty Flames begin the weekend, riding a four-game winning streak. Last weekend, the Flames swept a three-game conference series from Winthrop to take over the top spot in the Big South standings.

Liberty has hit .320 as team this season and has averaged 7.46 runs per game. The Flames have also used the extra base hit to their advantage this season with 146 (87 2Bs, 10 3Bs, 49 HRs).

Six Liberty hitters are batting over .300 topped by center fielder Curran Redal, who begins the weekend with a .397, fourth in the Big South. Third baseman Tyler Bream has hit .350 with 11 RBIs and four home runs over his last 10 games. Bream is second in the conference with 49 RBIs. Second baseman P.J. Jimenez has paced the Flames at the plate over the last 10 contests with a .400 average.

Steven Evans, who will start Friday, and Shawn Teufel, who is slated to start Saturday's game, have six wins each. Evans has a 6-2 record with a 3.48 ERA. Teufel has won five consecutive games to run his season's mark to 6-1 with a 4.63 ERA. Reliever Andrew Wilson has picked up a win and four saves in nine game over the past three weekends. The senior right-hander has a 4-1 record with a 3.19 ERA.

In its first year in the Big South Conference, Gardner-Webb has posted nine victories to enter the weekend with a 9-6 mark in conference play. Like the Flames, the Bulldogs swept their conference series last weekend, taking three from UNC Asheville.

Third baseman Justin Loyd begins the weekend as the Big South's second-leading hitter with a .414 batting average. He is also among the conference leaders with a team-leading 41 RBIs. Five other Gardner-Webb players are hitting over .300, as the Bulldogs enter the series with a .326 team batting average.

Pitchers Ryan Maxa and Brett Stackhouse each have recorded four victories to pace the Bulldog mound staff. Maxa has a team-leading 4.24 ERA.

Record at Liberty: 62-38-1 (Second Year)
Career Record: Same

After a solid campaign in his first year as Liberty's head coach, Jim Toman enters his second season at the helm of the program.

Last season, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish the season with a 35-26-1 mark, making Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's 36-year history. Toman guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by a Flames team, as Liberty won 30 or more games in a season for the fourth consecutive year for the first time in program history.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks this past summer. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty batters eclipsed the school's single-season doubles mark, ripping 155 two-base hits. The total ranked the Flames fifth in the country in the category. Liberty hitters also set a program record for hit by pitch.

The Flames finished their season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed Liberty to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. The Flames went on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman is the sixth head coach in the 34-year history of the Liberty Baseball program. The second-year skipper comes to Liberty after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 19-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball. Toman's 2003, 2005 and 2006 classes were named the top recruiting classes by the publication.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

In addition, South Carolina posted eight-straight seasons of 40 or more wins with Toman on the Gamecock coaching staff, including 2007. During Toman's 11 seasons at South Carolina, he helped the Gamecocks to a combined 500-220 (.694) record.

Toman earned four baseball letters at N.C. State, 1981-84, and was captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in vocational industrial education in 1985. He received a Master of Science degree in sport management from N.C. State in 1995.

Upon graduation, Toman entered the coaching profession as an assistant at Richmond County High School in Rockingham, N.C., for two years. He moved into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989 as an assistant at Florida International for one year. At FIU, he was responsible for the weight program, worked with the squad's catchers and coached first base. Toman joined the N.C. State staff before the 1990 season.

The Coaches

Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman is in his second year at the helm of the Flames. In this first season at Liberty, he guided the Flames to a 35-26-1 mark, the best record by a Liberty team under a first-year coach in program history. This season, he got the Flames off to the second-best start in the history of Liberty baseball through games.

A 20-year member of the college coaching ranks, he served 18 years as a member of Ray Tanner's staffs at South Carolina and N.C. State. Toman was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball.

During his time in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three-consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

Gardner-Webb Head Coach Randy Troupe is in his seventh year guiding the Bulldogs. Troupe last season lead Gardner-Webb to a 29-30 record and run to the A-Sun Championship game in their final season at the conference. The 20-year coaching veteran has posted 192 victories over his career.

Following the Flames

This season, the Flames Sports Network plans to broadcast several Liberty baseball regular season games. Games will air live on WWMC 90.9 FM "The Light" and on the World Wide Web at both LibertyFlames.com and thelightonline.com.

In addition, selected games will be video streamed live on the internet via the Big South Edge, available on BigSouthSports.com. The stream can be accessed for a nominal fee through a link on LibertyFlames.com or by going directly to BigSouthSports.com.

Flames at Worthington Stadium

For the past 31 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium home. Liberty has compiled an impressive 504-227-5 record at the facility for a winning percentage of .688 since the stadium's inception in 1979.

The Flames have posted an 18-3 record at the facility this season, already eclipsing last season's home win total of 11. Liberty is scheduled to play 24 games at home this season.

Last year, the Flames played 24 home games at the stadium, posting an 11-12-1 record at Worthington.

Liberty on the Road

Liberty is 8-8 on the road this season. The Flames are also 1-1 on neutral fields. The Flames will play their next nine games on the road.

Liberty completed their 2008 road schedule, posting a 15-8 road record and a 9-6 neutral field mark. The Flames' 15 road victories were the most by a Liberty club in program history. Liberty's .652 road winning percentage was its best road mark since 1980, when the Flames went 9-2 on the road for an .818 percentage.

Liberty at Night

Liberty is 6-3 at night this season. The Flames are currently scheduled to play 14 games under the lights in 2009. Tuesday night at Virginia is the next night game for Liberty.

The Flames finished the 2008 campaign with an 8-4 mark at night. The Flames closed out the year by winning six out of their last seven night contests. Since 2004, Liberty has gone 24-27 under artificial lighting.

Flames By the Month

Liberty is 8-6 during the month of April. However, the Flames have posted a 7-2 record in Big South Conference play in the month.

Jim Toman's squad is scheduled to play 19 games in the month this season. Since 1976, the Flames have recorded an all-time mark of 331-280-1 (.542) in April.

The Flames posted a 16-3 (.842) overall mark and started 7-1 in Big South play during the month of March. Last season, the Flames posted a 7-12 overall mark and a 1-2 record in conference action during the month. Liberty is 337-267-2 (.557) all-time in program history during March.

Liberty finished its February schedule with a 3-3 mark. The Flames were scheduled to play nine games in the month, but had three canceled due to inclement weather. Liberty has an all-time mark of 64-32 in February.

The Last Time Out

With two men aboard and trailing 3-1 in the bottom of the ninth inning, third baseman Tyler Bream connected for a two-out, three run walk-off home run, propelling the Flames past the Virginia Tech Hokies, 4-3, Wednesday afternoon at Worthington Stadium.

After 13 consecutive batters had been retired, the Flames got the first two hitters of the ninth inning on base. Shortstop Matt Williams drew a walk to open the inning and center fielder Curran Redal dropped a single into center field. After the next two Liberty batters were retired, Bream worked a 3-2 count against reliever Ben Rowen, before belting his eighth home run of the year over the right field wall for the 4-3 victory.

Designated hitter Cody Brown also hit a home run for the Flames.

Liberty's four hurlers on the afternoon gave up three runs on four hits, striking out five and walking one. Bream's blast gave freshman hurler John Long his first collegiate win.

Flames Sweep Winthrop

P.J. Jimenez drove in four runs with a home run and a single, helping the Liberty Flames defeat the Winthrop Eagles, 10-5, in game two of their Big South doubleheader at Worthington Stadium, last Saturday, sweeping both the doubleheader and the three-game series. With the sweep, the Flames moved into first place in the conference standings.

Liberty second baseman Jimenez connected for his second home run of the year, with two men aboard, during a four-run second inning. He later plated another run with an infield single with the bases loaded in the seventh frame.

During one stretch in the game, Flames pitchers Mark Swanson and Cody Brown retired combined to retire 14 batters in a row from the second inning through the seventh inning. Brown earned the win to raise his record to 2-2 on the year. Carter Browning recorded his fourth save with 1 1/3 innings of relief.

Liberty catcher Errol Hollinger led all players in the contest with four hits. Left fielder Tim Rotola and shortstop Matt Williams had three hits apiece for the Flames, as head coach Jim Toman's squad had six players with multiple hits in the game.

Taking One for the Team

Entering play this week, Liberty batters have been hit by a pitch 76 times this season. Flame batters have been plunked by an opposition an average of two times per game. Liberty ranked fourth in the nation in the category in the latest NCAA Division I statistical report, through games of April 19, with 76.

This year, Flames batters have been hit by a pitch seven times in a game twice to set a new school standard. Temple pitchers hit seven Liberty hitters on March 7 and High Point hurlers plunked seven Flames on March 22.

Last season, the Flames set a new school record by being hit by a pitch 82 times. The mark eclipsed the previous standard of 75 in the 2001 season.

Fine Fielding

Jim Toman's squad ranked No. 11 in the nation in fielding percentage with a .977 percentage in the latest NCAA Division I statistical report, for games through April 12. In addition, the percentage tops the Big South Conference. Liberty has committed 34 errors in 1491 chances this season.

The Flames fielding percentage is 17 points higher than at the same juncture of the year, last season. Through 39 games, Liberty had made 64 errors, 30 more than this year, in 1572 chances for a .960 fielding percentage in 2008. The Flames ended the year with a .963 percentage.

The best team fielding percentage over a season in school history was set by the 2005 Flames. That season, Liberty posted a .971 fielding percentage and also committed the fewest errors in school history with 62.

Teufel Strikes Out Season-High

Liberty left-hander Shawn Teufel struck out nine UNC Asheville batters in a 9-0 win over the Bulldogs in the opening game of their three-game Big South series, April 10. Teufel's nine strikeouts were the most in a game this season by a Liberty pitcher and set a career-high for the left-hander.

Teufel pitched seven scoreless innings, giving up two hits. He combined with Carter Browning and Chris McDougal to pitch the first shutout for the Flames this season.

Third baseman Tyler Bream and center fielder Curran Redal each hit a home run in the contest. Both players had two hits apiece in the game. Bream had three RBIs for Liberty.

Liberty Takes Series From VMI

The Liberty Flames broke a 1-1 tie in the seventh inning with two runs, and then held on for a 4-3 victory over the VMI Keydets, 4-3, April 5 in Big South Conference action at Gray/Minor Stadium. With the win, the Flames took the three-game series, two games to one.

In the bottom of the sixth inning, VMI loaded the bases with no one out. However, after being summoned from the bullpen, Liberty reliever Andrew Wilson induced three consecutive ground balls, which resulted in force outs at home plate, preventing the Keydets from scoring.

After getting out of the bases loaded jam in the previous inning, the Flames broke the deadlock on the scoreboard with two runs.

Wilson picked up the win to run his record to 4-1 on the year. The right-hander allowed two runs on two hits over three innings of work. Carter Browning recorded his third save of the season with the perfect ninth for Liberty.

Flames left fielder Doug Bream led all hitters on the afternoon with three hits. Catcher Errol Hollinger had two more hits for Liberty.

On April 4, center fielder Curran Redal drove in four runs with three hits, helping lead the Flames past the Keydets, 9-7, rebounding from a setback on Friday.

Redal had three hits and drove in four runs in the victory for Liberty. Shortstop Matt Williams, Hollinger, outfielder Casey Brown and P.J. Jimenez added two hits each for the Flames.

Bream Named Big South Player of the Week

Liberty freshman third baseman Tyler Bream was selected as the Big South Conference Choice Hotels Baseball Player of the Week for March 30.

Bream batted .467 (7-15) and drove in 10 runs to help Liberty post a 4-0 mark that week and move atop the Big South standings. He started the week with three hits, three RBIs, two doubles and four runs in the Flames' win at North Carolina State, March 25. March 27 against Presbyterian, Bream walked with the bases loaded to force in the winning run, and the next day against the Blue Hose, Bream drove in both Liberty runs in a 2-1 victory. March 28, the freshman had his second three-hit game of the week and hit his first collegiate grand slam to complete the sweep of Presbyterian. On the week, Bream slugged .800, had a .556 on-base percentage, scored six runs and walked three times.

Streaks Help Flames March Through March

Two winning streaks propelled Liberty to a 16-3 record in March. The Flames began the third month of the year with a seven-game winning streak, March 6-13. After two setbacks, Liberty went on a nine-game winning skein, March 18-30, its longest of the season.

The nine-game streak ties the 2009 Flames with the 2008, 2006, 1995 and 1985 clubs for the most consecutive wins in a season during the program's Division I era. The 1976 Liberty team holds the school record for the longest win streak in the history of the program with a 12-game streak.

Mashing in March

After going 3-3 to begin the season, the Flames went 16-3 in the month of March, keyed by their hitting.

Over its 19 games during the month, Liberty hit .356 as a team, and scored 10.2 runs per game. The hitting outburst raised the Flames' batting average for the season 88 points, to .326.

During the stretch, Liberty enjoyed a power burst too. The Flames hit 31 home runs and boasted a .563 slugging percentage over the March's 19 games.

Flames Sweep Blue Hose In First-Ever Series

Liberty hit five home runs, propelling the Flames to a 14-7 victory over Presbyterian, and a sweep of its three-game series with the Blue Hose, March 29 at Worthington Stadium. The series was the first-ever between the Flames and Big South newcomer Blue Hose.

Third baseman Tyler Bream hit his first collegiate grand slam in the third inning, while outfielders Curran Redal and Doug Bream connected for back-to-back home runs in the fifth. Catcher Errol Hollinger and Trey Wimmer also hit four-baggers for the Flames.

Redal's round tripper was his fourth of the season, while Doug Bream's was his fifth of the year. It is the second time this season, the Flames have hit back-to-back home runs in a contest. Hollinger and outfielder Casey Brown hit back-to-back home runs in the fifth inning of an 11-1 victory over Temple on March 7.

Liberty starter Shawn Teufel improved to 3-1 on the season. The left-hander gave up four runs on seven hits, striking out six in six innings of work.

The two prior days, March 28-27, Liberty receiving strong pitching efforts from right-hander Mark Swanson and left-hander Steven Evans in posting identical 2-1 wins in each game. On March 28th, Swanson pitched eight complete innings to run his record to 4-0 on the year. Reliever Carter Browning earned his second save with a scoreless ninth. Tyler Bream singled home the only runs Liberty needed in the fourth inning for a 2-1 victory, as the two Flames' hurlers combined to retire the last 13 Presbyterian.

In the first-ever meeting between the two squads in the series opener, March 27, Evans went the distance in his second-straight start to run his season record to 4-0. The left-hander gave up one run on six hits, striking out five.

The Flames collected 23 hits in the contest, the most by Jim Toman's team this season. The hit total eclipses the 18 hits Toman's squad had on three other occasions earlier this year.

Center fielder Curran Redal and first baseman Trey Wimmer paced the Flames at the plate with four hits each. Tyler Bream, Errol Hollinger and Jeff Jefferson added three hits apiece for Liberty. Wimmer had four RBIs in the contest, while Jefferson hit his fourth home run.

Mark Swanson, the second Liberty pitcher in the contest, picked up the win to run his record to 3-0 on the year. The right-hander pitched 2 1/3 scoreless innings, giving up one hit and striking out three.

Hollinger On Johnny Bench Watch List

Liberty senior catcher Errol Hollinger has been listed on the 2009 Coleman Company-Johnny Bench Watch List. The award is given annually to the top Division I collegiate catcher. The initial list includes 44 catchers nominated for the award by their coaches.

Hollinger, a native of Upland, Calif., is a four-year starter at the position for the Flames. He entered the season named on the 2009 Brooks Wallace Player of the Year Watch list.

The senior enters Tuesday's contest with a team-leading seven home runs. Hollinger is hitting .331 with 22 RBIs and 25 runs scored in 38 starts. He has also added 10 doubles.

Last season, the Liberty catcher finished among the Big South leaders in runs scored (6th – 60), hits (7th – 82), RBIs (tied 8th – 47), doubles (tied 5th – 19) and total bases (tied 7th – 127). On the defensive side, he led the conference in runners caught stealing with 26 and fewest passed balls with four.

Redal helped Liberty post a 3-1 record during the week, with a .500 batting average (5-10), .684 on-base percentage and a .900 slugging percentage. The junior scored five runs, knocked in seven runs, doubled, homered, walked six times and was 3-3 in stolen bases. Redal enters the week on a 10-game hit streak, hitting .500 over the stretch.
