The Games

The Liberty Flames (12-5, 1-1 Big South) travel to High Point, N.C., for their first Big South Conference road series of the year. The Flames will square off with the High Point Panthers (5-10, 1-3 Big South) in a three-game weekend series, beginning Friday. The first two games of the series are scheduled as night contests. Friday's and Saturday's contests are both scheduled to begin at 6 p.m. Sunday, the series will conclude at 1 p.m.

What to Watch

After going 3-3 to start the season, Liberty has won nine of its last 11 contests. During the stretch, the Flames have hit .365 and averaged 11 runs per game. Liberty has also hit 23 home runs during the span.

Big South Player of the Week, center fielder Curran Redal, and outfielder/first baseman Doug Bream have paced the Flames at the plate over the last 11 games. Redal has hit .447 during the span to raise his batting average to .379, while Bream has hit .465 with six doubles and four home runs during the stretch to up his team-leading batting average to .465.

Named to the Johnny Bench Award Watch List this past week, catcher Errol Hollinger's bat has heated up also. The senior has hit .341 in his last 11 games to move his average over .300 on the year to .311. He has also hit a team-leading five home runs this season.

On the mound, newcomer Mark Swanson and sophomore Steven Evans have had solid starts to 2009. Swanson has posted a 2-0 mark with a 2.29 ERA, while Evans also has a 2-0 mark with one save and 1.40 ERA.

High Point enters the weekend series looking to get back on the winning track after dropping seven of their last eight games.

The Panthers have four players hitting over .320 on the year, and as a team are hitting .292. Center fielder Bill Manion leads High Point at the plate with a .371 average and 15 RBIs. Catcher Billy Manion, who enters the contest with a .345 average, was recently named to the Johnny Bench Award Watch List.

Record at Liberty: 47-31-1 (Second Year)

Career Record: Same

After a solid campaign in his first year as Liberty's head coach, Jim Toman enters his second season at the helm of the program.

Last season, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish the season with a 35-26-1 mark, making Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's 35-year history. Toman guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by a Flames team, as Liberty won 30 or more games in a season for the fourth consecutive year for the first time in program history.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks this past summer. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty batters eclipsed the school's single-season doubles mark, ripping 155 two-base hits. The total ranked the Flames fifth in the country in the category. Liberty hitters also set a program record for hit by pitch.

The Flames finished their season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed Liberty to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. The Flames went on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman is the sixth head coach in the 34-year history of the Liberty Baseball program. The second-year skipper comes to Liberty after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 19-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball. Toman's 2003, 2005 and 2006 classes were named the top recruiting classes by the publication.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

In addition, South Carolina posted eight-straight seasons of 40 or more wins with Toman on the Gamecock coaching staff, including 2007. During Toman's 11 seasons at South Carolina, he helped the Gamecocks to a combined 500-220 (.694) record.

Toman earned four baseball letters at N.C.State, 1981-84, and was captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in vocational industrial education in 1985. He received a Master of Science degree in sport management from N.C. State in 1995.

Upon graduation, Toman entered the coaching profession as an assistant at Richmond County High School in Rockingham, N.C., for two years. He moved into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989 as an assistant at Florida International for one year. At FIU, he was responsible for the weight program, worked with the squad's catchers and coached first base. Toman joined the N.C. State staff before the 1990 season.

The Coaches

Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman is in his second year at the helm of the Flames. In this first season at Liberty, he guided the Flames to a 35-26-1 mark, the best record by a Liberty team under a first-year coach in program history.

A 20-year member of the college coaching ranks, he served 18 years as a member of Ray Tanner's staffs at South Carolina and N.C. State. Toman was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball.

During his time in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three-consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

High Point Head Coach Chris Cozart is in his first year in guiding the Panthers' program. Cozart came to High Point following a highly successful 12-year coaching stint at UCF, where he moved up the ranks from student assistant to associate head coach during his tenure. A key member of the Knight coaching staff over the past decade, he helped develop UCF into one of the nation's elite Division I baseball programs. In his role as the pitching coach, Cozart built a tradition of pitching excellence during his time at UCF.

At UCF, Cozart helped guide the Knights to a 455-274 overall mark during his 12 seasons on the coaching staff. The Knights made five NCAA Tournaments appearances during that stretch and also captured four conference championships.

Following the Flames

This season, the Flames Sports Network plans to broadcast several Liberty baseball regular season games. Games will air live on WWMC 90.9 FM "The Light" and on the World Wide Web at both LibertyFlames.com and thelightonline.com. The schedule of games will be posted on thelightonline.com, when the radio station announces its broadcast schedule.

In addition, selected games will be video streamed live on the internet via the Big South Edge, available on BigSouthSports.com. The stream can be accessed for a nominal fee through a link on LibertyFlames.com or by going directly to BigSouthSports.com. This weekend, all three games will be web cast via the Edge.

The Last Time Out

Liberty took an early lead and never looked back, downing the Lafayette Leopards, 12-1, Thursday night at Worthington Stadium. The victory runs the Flames home mark to 9-1 on the year.

Catchers Errol Hollinger and Nathan Thompson each hit home runs for Liberty, and teammate Doug Bream drove in four runs in the contest. Shortstop Matt Williams led all hitters in the contest with three hits, as pitcher Chris McDougal recorded his first collegiate win with two scoreless innings of relief.

Flames at Worthington Stadium

For the past 31 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium home. Liberty has compiled an impressive 495-225-5 record at the facility for a winning percentage of .686 since the stadium's inception in 1979.

The Flames have opened the year, 9-1 at the facility. Liberty is scheduled to play 25 games at home this season.

Last year, the Flames played 24 home games at the stadium, posting an 11-12-1 record at Worthington. The slate of home games included the first night contests in the history of the stadium. March 28 was the first night contest ever at the stadium, and nine contests were played under the lights.

Liberty on the Road

Liberty is a 2-3 on the road this season, with a 1-1 mark on neutral fields.

The Flames completed their 2008 road schedule, posting a 15-8 road record and a 9-6 neutral field mark. The Flames' 15 road victories were the most by a Liberty club in program history. Liberty's .652 road winning percentage was its best road mark since 1980, when the Flames went 9-2 on the road for an .818 percentage.

All-Time Against High Point

Friday will be the 55th meeting between Liberty and High Point on the baseball diamond since 1976. The Flames hold the advantage in the series, 29-25.

Last season, Liberty took two-of-three from High Point in a series at Worthington Stadium, May 16-18, to close the regular season for both teams. The Flames won the first two games, 8-1 and 5-4, before falling in the last game of the series, 8-4.

The last time the two teams met in High Point, the Panthers won two of the three games in the series. Liberty won the first game, 7-5, with High Point taking the last two contests, 10-2 and 8-4.

Flames in Big South Openers

Last weekend's series with Charleston Southern was only the fifth time during Liberty's 18 years in the Big South, the Flames have started conference play at home. Liberty is 24-26 in their Big South opening series of the season.

Of the 50 games, Liberty has opened conference play on the road 13 times with a record of 15-21. The Flames have opened at home now five times, going 9-5.

Liberty at Night

With last night's victory over Lafayette under the lights, Liberty is now 2-0 at night. The contest was the first night game at Worthington Stadium this season. The Flames are currently scheduled to play 16 games under the lights in 2009.

Liberty finished the 2008 with a 8-4 mark at night. The Flames finished the year by winning six out of their last seven night contests. Since 2004, Liberty has gone 18-24 under artificial lighting.

Flames By the Month

The Flames have started the third month of the year, March, with a 9-2 mark and a 1-1 Big South record. This season, Liberty is scheduled to play 21 games during March, including nine scheduled conference games.

Last season, the Flames posted a 7-12 overall mark and a 1-2 record in conference action during the month. Liberty is 330-267-2 (.553) all-time in program history during March.

Liberty finished its February schedule with a 3-3 mark. The Flames were scheduled to play nine games in the month, but had three canceled due to inclement weather. Liberty has an all-time mark of 64-32 in February.

Many New Faces

The Liberty Flames have 18 new members on their roster in 2009. Over fifty percent of Liberty's roster consists of first-year players. Of the first-year players, six are transfers, 10 are freshmen and two are sophomores.

Junior outfielder Curran Redal, freshman shortstop Matt Williams and freshman third baseman Tyler Bream are all first-year players who have started all 14 games this season for Liberty.

Hollinger On Johnny Bench Watch List

Liberty senior catcher Errol Hollinger has been listed on the 2009 Coleman Company-Johnny Bench Watch List. The list was released earlier this week by the Greater Wichita Area Sports Commission.

The Johnny Bench Award is given annually to the top Division I collegiate catcher. The initial list includes 44 catchers nominated for the award by their coaches.

Hollinger, a native of Upland, Calif., is a four-year starter at the position for the Flames. He entered the season named on the 2009 Brooks Wallace Watch list. The award is given to the top collegiate player each season.

He enters tonight's contest tied for the Big South lead in home runs with five. So far on the year, Hollinger is hitting .311 with 13 RBIs and 14 runs scored over 17 games. He has also added three doubles.

Last season, the Liberty catcher finished among the Big South leaders in runs scored (6th - 60), hits (7th - 82), RBIs (tied 8th - 47), doubles (tied 5th - 19) and total bases (tied 7th - 127). On the defensive side, he led the conference in runners caught stealing with 26 and fewest passed balls with four.

The senior hit .319 with eight home runs and a .494 slugging percentage in 62 games in 2008. Center fielder Curran Redal, first baseman Trey Wimmer, left fielder Jeff Jefferson, designated hitter John Long and Bream all hit home runs in the contest for Liberty. Long's round tripper was the first home run of his collegiate career.

Bream's two home run game was the first by a Flame since teammate Errol Hollinger hit two four-baggers in a 5-4 win at Radford on April 11 of last season.

Wimmer had four hits and four RBIs, while Bream added three hits and three RBIs to pace the Flames' 18-hit attack, making a winner of pitcher Zane Bator. The right-hander picks up the victory in his first ever appearance on the mound in a Flames' uniform.

Liberty Splits Big South Opening Series

The Flames opened the Big South portion of their 2009 schedule, last weekend. Liberty split a pair of games with Charleston Southern, as the two teams had to contend with inclement weather throughout the weekend.

Jim Toman's squad rallied from a 3-1, sixth inning deficit for a 5-4 win, Friday. Third baseman Tyler Bream tripled in the eighth breaking a 3-3 tie and added some cushion, scoring on a P.J. Jimenez fly out to make it 5-3.

Charleston Southern scored an unearned run in the ninth, but Liberty reliever Steven Evans held off the Buccaneers for a 5-4 victory. The lefty moved to 2-0 on the year, with two innings of work.

After Saturday's game was moved to Sunday due to rain, the Flames and Bucs could only get a single game in Sunday. Charleston Southern plated an opening inning run and lead the entire contest, snapping Liberty's seven-game winning streak.

Tyler Bream went 3-for-3 in the contest and scored a run for the Flames. Center fielder Curran Redal drove in two runs with a single, extending his hitting streak to 10-straight contests.

Bats Enjoy Homecooking

Entering an eight-game homestand on March 6, the Flames were hitting .235 and averaging four runs per game. Over the next eight games, the Liberty bats have heated up, as Jim Toman's squad ran off seven consecutive victories to begin its longest homestand of the season. The Flames ended up finishing their homestand, 7-1.

During the first homestand of the 2009 season at Worthington Stadium, the Flames hit .360, averaging 11.13 runs per game. Liberty posted double-digit hit totals in five of the eight contests. With the red-hot hitting, the Flames raised their team batting average 73 points during the span to .3085.

In addition, Liberty had a .610 slugging percentage over the eight-game stretch, banging out 42 extra base hits - 26 doubles, 1 triple and 15 home runs.

In two of the contests, the Flames scored a season-high 18 runs, defeating Temple in the first game of a doubleheader, March 7, 18-9, and William & Mary, March 11, 18-13. Also, Liberty hit two or more home runs in each of the first five games at Worthington Stadium this season. Four-game Sweep of Temple

Liberty hit 11 home runs and banded out 16 doubles, scoring 56 runs, during a four-game sweep of the Temple Owls, March 6-8.

In their home opener, March 6, Flames third baseman Tyler Bream drove in four runs and three teammates, Cody Brown, Doug Bream and Trey Wimmer, each hit home runs in a 12-2 win. Left-hander Steven Evans ran his mark to 1-0, allowing two runs, one earned, on seven hits over 6 2/3 innings in the contest.

The following afternoon, the Flames swept a doubleheader from the Owls, 18-9 and 11-1. Liberty hit four home runs in game one, including a pinch hit grand slam by Doug Bream in the win. The four home runs were the most in a game by the Flames since they hit four round trippers in a 28-7 victory over Richmond on Feb. 18 at Riley Park in Charleston, S.C., during the Crab House Shootout.

Doug Bream hit the first pitch he saw as a pinch hitter with the bases loaded in the fifth inning for his second career grand slam. The first baseman/outfielder hit his other grand slam on March 8, 2008 in an 11-5 win over Army. Two other pinch hitters, Justin Richardson and Kizuku Scott, each hit their first collegiate home run in the game, while Jeff Jefferson hit his third round tripper of the year in the victory.

The power display made a winner of right-hander Mark Swanson, who ran his record to 2-0 on the year. The junior did not allow a earned run in 6 2/3 innings in his second start in a Liberty uniform.

In the nightcap, catcher Errol Hollinger and right fielder Casey Brown connected for back-to-back home runs in the fifth inning, propelling Liberty to an 11-1 victory. Center fielder Curran Redal also added a home run in the contest for the Flames, helping to make a winner of left-hander Shawn Teufel (1-0).

It was the first time Liberty batters hit back-to-back home runs in a game since Hollinger and former Flame David Giammaresi launched back-to-back round trippers at Raymond "Hap" Spuhler Field during a six-run fourth inning, en route to an 18-4 win over George Mason on April 25, 2006.

On March 8, the Flames rallied from a 6-1 deficit after two innings of play for a 15-11 win and a series sweep. First baseman Trey Wimmer paced Liberty with four hits, scoring two runs and driving in two more. Jefferson, Doug Bream, shortstop Matt Williams and infielder P.J. Jimenez each had two hits for Liberty. Jimenez also hit his first home run in a Liberty uniform in the win. Carter Browning picked up his first victory for the Flames, with 4 2/3 innings of relief. Austin Poretz earned his first collegiate save by pitching the last three frames.

Liberty Takes Midweek Tilts

Last week, the Flames won both of their contests during the midweek, running their overall season record to 9-3.

Liberty began the week, by using two two-run home runs against Duke to push past the Blue Devils, 6-3, Tuesday, in the first meeting between the two teams since 1988. Center fielder Curran Redal hit his second home run of the year, with a runner aboard in the second inning. Catcher Errol Hollinger smacked his fourth home run of the year in the year in the fourth inning, putting the Flames up for good in the contest, 4-2.

Senior right-hander Andrew Wilson allowed three runs on 12 hits over 7 1/3 innings, running his record to 2-1 on the year. He struck out four batters and walked two. Left-hander Stevens Evans recorded his first save of the year, retiring four of the five batters he faced over the final 1 2/3 innings.

Liberty upped its winning streak to six-straight games, with an 18-13 victory over in-state rival William & Mary, Wednesday. The Flames had 16 hits and benefited from seven Tribe errors in the win.

Scoring runs in each of the first four frames, Liberty jumped out to a 14-2 lead. First baseman Trey Wimmer capped a four-run first inning with a two-out, two-run home run, his second round tripper of the season. After dropping a tightly contested season opener to No. 6/12 Ole Miss, 6-5, Friday, Feb. 20, the Flames won three straight over the next two days to capture the tournament title.

On Saturday morning, Feb. 21, right-hander Mark Swanson did not allow a batter past second base in pitching seven scoreless innings in his Liberty debut. Catcher Errol Hollinger hit a solo home run and outfielder Jeff Jefferson drove in a run with a RBI double in a 5-2 win over the tournament host South Alabama Jaguars.

In the evening, the Flames rallied from a 3-2 deficit and down to their last strike to defeat the Jaguars, 4-3, in 10 innings. Third baseman Tyler Bream doubled off the right-center field wall with two outs in the top of the ninth and scored when the next batter, shortstop Matt Williams, singled to tie the contest at 3-3.

In the 10th, Jefferson lined a single off the glove of the South Alabama's first baseman to plate Tim Rotola with the game-winning run, as Andrew Wilson picked up the win for Liberty. The senior did not allow a run over the final five innings, scattering two hits, striking out three batters and walking one.
