The Games

The Liberty Flames (10-4, 1-1 Big South) travel to Harrisonburg, Va., Tuesday to square off with the James Madison Dukes (11-7, 0-0 CAA) in the first of three midweek contests. Game time is slated for 3 p.m. at Long Field/Mauck Stadium. The following afternoon, the Flames return to Worthington Stadium and host the Fordham Rams (4-10, 0-0 A-10). Wednesday's first pitch is scheduled for 3 p.m. Thursday, Liberty will play its first night contest of the year at Worthington Stadium, welcoming the Lafayette Leopards (7-3, 2-0 Patriot) to Lynchburg. Game time is slated for 6 p.m.

What to Watch

After going 7-1 during its first homestand of 2009, Liberty looks to continue its winning ways during its three midweek contests. The Flames, who had seven-game win streak halted Sunday, have hit .360 as a team and scored 11.13 runs per game over their last eight contests.

Big South Player of the Week, center fielder Curran Redal, leads the Flames with a .500 batting average and 14 RBIs during the stretch. Doug Bream, who has been in the Liberty line-up as a first baseman, right fielder and designated hitter during the span, posted a .467 batting average in the eight games. First baseman Trey Wimmer is the third Flame over .400 during the eight-game period, hitting .455.

James Madison enters the week after dropping two of three games to Bryant last weekend at home. Shortstop David Hrbek has led the Dukes in hitting since the beginning of the season, and starts the week with a .444 average. He also leads James Madison with 25 RBIs. Outfielder/pitcher Trevor Knight has hit .382 and is 1-1 on the mound.

Fordham comes to Liberty, Wednesday, after winning two-out-three games at Wofford over the weekend. The Rams are looking to get their bats going, as they are hitting .256 as a team so far this season.

First basman Bobby DiNardo is pacing Fordham at the plate with a .367 batting average and also leads the Rams with 17 RBIs. Leadoff hitter and center fielder Danny Leach also is hitting above .350, with .351 average. He has stole nine bases through 14 games.

Lafayette has used a .341 team batting average to forge a strong start to its season. The Leopards, who have yet to play a home game in 2009, are paced by Daniel Bierce and Rob Froiro at the plate. Both players are hitting above .450. Bierce, Lafayette's starting shortstop, has hit .500 and driven in a team-leading 12 runs. Froiro, the Leopards' center fielder and leadoff hiter, enters the week, hitting .477 and has scored 16 runs.

Head Coach Jim Toman

**Record at Liberty: 45-30-1 (Second Year)
Career Record: Same**

After a solid campaign in his first year as Liberty's head coach, Jim Toman enters his second season at the helm of the program.

Last season, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish the season with a 35-26-1 mark, making Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's 35-year history. Toman guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by a Flames team, as Liberty won 30 or more games in a season for the fourth consecutive year for the first time in program history.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks this past summer. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty batters eclipsed the school's single-season doubles mark, ripping 155 two-base hits. The total ranked the Flames fifth in the country in the category. Liberty hitters also set a program record for hit by pitch.

The Flames finished their season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed Liberty to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. The Flames went on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman is the sixth head coach in the 34-year history of the Liberty Baseball program. The second-year skipper comes to Liberty after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 19-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball. Toman's 2003, 2005 and 2006 classes were named the top recruiting classes by the publication.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

In addition, South Carolina posted eight-straight seasons of 40 or more wins with Toman on the Gamecock coaching staff, including 2007. During Toman's 11 seasons at South Carolina, he helped the Gamecocks to a combined 500-220 (.694) record.

Toman earned four baseball letters at N.C.State, 1981-84, and was captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in vocational industrial education in 1985. He received a Master of Science degree in sport management from N.C. State in 1995.

Upon graduation, Toman entered the coaching profession as an assistant at Richmond County High School in Rockingham, N.C., for two years. He moved into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989 as an assistant at Florida International for one year. At FIU, he was responsible for the weight program, worked with the squad's catchers and coached first base. Toman joined the N.C. State staff before the 1990 season.

The Coaches

Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman is in his second year at the helm of the Flames. In this first season at Liberty, he guided the Flames to a 35-26-1 mark, the best record by a Liberty team under a first-year coach in program history.

A 20-year member of the college coaching ranks, he served 18 years as a member of Ray Tanner's staffs at South Carolina and N.C. State. Toman was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball.

During his time in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three-consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

Joe "Spanky" McFarland is in his 12th season as the skipper of the James Madison Dukes. In 11 seasons, he has guided the Dukes to seven NCAA Regional appearances, including last season. In 2008, McFarland led James Madison to the CAA title and a 39-19 record. The Dukes have won 35 or more games six times during McFarland's tenure and posted a 44-win season in 2002.

McFarland led Northern Illinois for seven years prior to coming to James Madison, resurrecting a dormant Hokies program. He has an all-time career record of 520-510-3 during his 19-year head coaching career. Known for developing pitchers, McFarland has seen 61 of his pitchers go on to sign professional contracts.

Joe Restaino is in his fifth season at the helm of his alma mater, Fordham. The 1993 Fordham graduate has kept his team in contention for the Atlantic-10 title during his first four years, as the Rams head coach.

Last season, Fordham posted a 29-21-1 mark, while finishing 13-14 in the A-10. During the 2007 season, Fordham posted a 35-22 overall record and a 19-8 mark in Atlantic 10 play. The 35 wins were just one shy of the school's modern era record, while the 19 conference wins topped the previous mark of 17 in 2005. Fordham finished the regular season in second place, and made it to the Atlantic 10 Championship game for the first time since 1998. Restaino earned A-10 Coach of the Year honors in 2005.

Joe Kinney enters his 10th season as the head coach at Lafayette. Since taking over in 1999, Kinney has continuously raised the talent level to the point where Lafayette is consistently in contention for a Patriot League title.

The 2008 campaign was another winning one for the Leopards, as they finished with an overall record of 25-23, marking the third straight winning season for Lafayette.

The 2007 season was one for the record books, as the Leopards recorded a program-best 33 wins, including 17 Patriot League victories, and advanced to the NCAA Regional. The team's performance that season earned Kinney his first-ever Patriot League Coach of the Year honor. The success of 2007 came on the heels of a highly successful 2006 season in which the Leopards posted 27 wins, the second-highest win total in Lafayette history.

Following the Flames

The Last Time Out

Liberty's seven-game winning streak came to halt, as the Charleston Southern Buccaneers defeated the Flames, 7-4, Sunday at Worthington Stadium. The setback was the first for Liberty this season at home.

Third baseman Tyler Bream went 3-for-3 and scored a run in the contest for the Flames. Center fielder Curran Redal moved his hitting streak to 10-straight games, with a two-run single in the sixth inning.

Flames at Worthington Stadium

For the past 31 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium home. Liberty has compiled an impressive 493-225-5 record at the facility for a winning percentage of .685 since the stadium's inception in 1979.

With their first homestand of 2009 in the books, the Flames are 7-1 at the facility this season. Liberty is scheduled to play 27 games at home this season.

Last year, the Flames played 24 home games at the stadium, posting an 11-12-1 record at Worthington. The slate of home games included the first night contests in the history of the stadium. March 28 was the first night contest ever at the stadium, and nine contests were played under the lights.

Liberty on the Road

Liberty is a 2-2 on the road this season, with a 1-1 mark on neutral fields.

The Flames completed their 2008 road schedule, posting a 15-8 road record and a 9-6 neutral field mark. The Flames' 15 road victories were the most by a Liberty club in program history. Liberty's .652 road winning percentage was its best road mark since 1980, when the Flames went 9-2 on the road for an .818 percentage.

All-Time Against James Madison, Fordham, Lafayette

Tuesday will be the 60th meeting between Liberty and James Madison on the baseball diamond since 1976. With a victory earlier in the season, the Dukes hold a 33-26 advantage in the all-time series.

Tuesday's contest is the second of the season between the teams. On Feb. 24, James Madison defeated Liberty, 11-2, at Long Field/Mauck Stadium in Harrisonburg, Va.

Wednesday will be the fifth meeting between Liberty and Fordham in baseball. The Flames have a 3-1 edge in the all-time series since 1976.

The last time the two teams meet, Liberty swept a doubleheader from Fordham, March 17, 2004 at Worthington Stadium. The Flames took the first game, 9-1, and the second game, 5-1.

Thursday, Liberty and Lafayette will meet for the first time on the diamond.

Flames in Big South Openers

Last weekend's series with Charleston Southern was only the fifth time during Liberty's 18 years in the Big South, the Flames have started conference play at home. Liberty is 24-26 in their Big South opening series of the season.

Of the 50 games, Liberty has opened conference play on the road 13 times with a record of 15-21. The Flames have opened at home now five times, going 9-5.

Baseball in the Commonwealth

Thirteen Division I baseball teams call the Commonwealth of Virginia home. This season, Liberty is scheduled to face opponents from the "Old Dominion State" 20 times.

The Flames have begun their games against Commonwealth teams at 1-1, after defeating William & Mary at Worthington Stadium, 18-13, last Wednesday. Liberty posted a 13-13-1 record against in-state opponents in 2008.

The Flames will meet state squads George Mason (two times), James Madison (three times), Longwood (one time), Old Dominion (two times), Radford (three times), VCU (one time), VMI (three times), Virginia (one time), Virginia Tech (two times) and William & Mary (two times) this season.

Liberty at Night

Liberty's Feb. 21 meeting with the South Alabama Jaguars was the first night contest of 2009 for the Flames. With a 3-2, 10-inning win, Liberty is 1-0 at night.

Thursday night will be the second Liberty contest under the lights for the Flames, and the first at Worthington Stadium this season. The Flames are currently scheduled to play 16 games under the lights in 2009. Liberty finished the 2008 with a 8-4 mark at night. Liberty Splits Big South Opening Series

The Flames opened the Big South portion of their 2009 schedule, this past weekend. Liberty split a pair of games with Charleston Southern, as the two teams had to contend with inclement weather throughout the weekend.

Jim Toman's squad rallied from a 3-1, sixth inning deficit for a 5-4 win, Friday. Third baseman Tyler Bream tripled in the eight breaking a 3-3 tie and added some cushion, scoring on a P.J. Jimenez fly out to make it 5-3.

Charleston Southern scored an unearned run in the ninth, but Liberty reliever Steven Evans held off the Buccaneers for a 5-4 victory. The lefty moved to 2-0 on the year, with two innings of work.

After Saturday's game was moved to Sunday due to rain, the Flames and Bucs could only get a single game in Sunday. Charleston Southern plated an opening inning run and lead the entire contest, snapping Liberty's seven-game winning streak.

Tyler Bream went 3-for-3 in the contest and scored a run for the Flames. Center fielder Curran Redal drove in two runs with a single, extending his hitting streak to 10-straight contests.

Bats Enjoy Homecooking

Entering an eight-game homestand on March 6, the Flames were hitting .235 and averaging four runs per game. Over the next eight games, the Liberty bats have heated up, as Jim Toman's squad ran off seven consecutive victories to begin its longest homestand of the season. The Flames ended up finishing their homestand, 7-1.

During the first homestand of the 2009 season at Worthington Stadium, the Flames hit .360, averaging 11.13 runs per game. Liberty posted double-digit hit totals in five of the eight contests. With the red-hot hitting, the Flames raised their team batting average 73 points during the span to .3085.

In addition, Liberty had a .610 slugging percentage over the eight-game stretch, banging out 42 extra base hits - 26 doubles, 1 triple and 15 home runs.

In two of the contests, the Flames scored a season-high 18 runs, defeating Temple in the first game of a doubleheader, March 7, 18-9, and William & Mary, March 11, 18-13. Also, Liberty hit two or more home runs in each of the first five games at Worthington Stadium this season. The streak ended March 11, when Liberty hit only one round tripper in its win over the Tribe.

Four-game Sweep of Temple

Liberty hit 11 home runs and banged out 16 doubles, scoring 56 runs, during a four-game sweep of the Temple Owls, March 6-8.

In their home opener, March 6, Flames third baseman Tyler Bream drove in four runs and three teammates, Cody Brown, Doug Bream and Trey Wimmer, each hit home runs in a 12-2 win. Left-hander Steven Evans ran his mark to 1-0, allowing two runs, one earned, on seven hits over 6 2/3 innings in the contest.

The following afternoon, the Flames swept a doubleheader from the Owls, 18-9 and 11-1. Liberty hit four home runs in game one, including a pinch hit grand slam by Doug Bream in the win. The four home runs were the most in a game by the Flames since they hit four round trippers in a 28-7 victory over Richmond on Feb. 18 at Riley Park in Charleston, S.C., during the Crab House Shootout.

Doug Bream hit the first pitch he saw as a pinch hitter with the bases loaded in the fifth inning for his second career grand slam. The first baseman/outfielder hit his other grand slam on March 8, 2008 in an 11-5 win over Army. Two other pinch hitters, Justin Richardson and Kizuku Scott, each hit their first collegiate home run in the game, while Jeff Jefferson hit his third round tripper of the year in the victory.

The power display made a winner of right-hander Mark Swanson, who ran his record to 2-0 on the year. The junior did not allow a earned run in 6 2/3 innings in his second start in a Liberty uniform.

In the nightcap, catcher Errol Hollinger and right fielder Casey Brown connected for back-to-back home runs in the fifth inning, propeling Liberty to an 11-1 victory. Center fielder Curran Redal also added a home run in the contest for the Flames, helping to make a winner of left-hander Shawn Teufel (1-0).

It was the first time Liberty batters hit back-to-back home runs in a game since Hollinger and former Flame David Giammaresi launched back-to-back round trippers at Raymond "Hap" Spuhler Field during a six-run fourth inning, en route to an 18-4 win over George Mason on April 25, 2006.

On March 8, the Flames rallied from a 6-1 deficit after two innings of play for a 15-11 win and a series sweep. First baseman Trey Wimmer paced Liberty with four hits, scoring two runs and driving in two more. Jefferson, Doug Bream, shortstop Matt Williams and infielder P.J. Jimenez each had two hits for Liberty. Jimenez also hit his first home run in a Liberty uniform in the win. Carter Browning picked up his first victory for the Flames, with 4 2/3 innings of relief. Austin Poretz earned his first collegiate save by pitching the last three frames.

Liberty Takes Midweek Tilts

Last week, the Flames won both of their contests during the midweek, running their overall season record to 9-3.

Liberty began the week, by using two two-run home runs against Duke to push past the Blue Devils, 6-3, Tuesday, in the first meeting between the two teams since 1988. Center fielder Curran Redal hit his second home run of the year, with a runner aboard in the second inning. Catcher Errol Hollinger smacked his fourth home run of the year in the fourth inning, putting the Flames up for good in the contest, 4-2.

Senior right-hander Andrew Wilson allowed three runs on 12 hits over 7 1/3 innings, running his record to 2-1 on the year. He struck out four batters and walked two. Left-hander Stevens Evans recorded his first save of the year, retiring four of the five batters he faced over the final 1 2/3 innings.

Liberty upped its winning streak to six-straight games, with an 18-13 victory over in-state rival William & Mary, Wednesday. The Flames had 16 hits and benefited from seven Tribe errors in the win.

Scoring runs in each of the first four frames, Liberty jumped out to a 14-2 lead. First baseman Trey Wimmer capped a four-run first inning with a two-out, two-run home run, his second round tripper of the season. After plating two in the second, the Flames scored seven in the third inning, taking advantage of three William & Mary errors.

The Tribe closed the gap during the middle innings, with six runs in the fifth and five in the sixth, cutting the Liberty advantage to 14-13. However, reliever Cody Brown held William & Mary in check the rest of the way, yielding one run on two hits over 3 2/3 innings, as the Flames pulled away in the victory.

Flames Capture Coca-Cola Classic Title

Liberty opened its 2009 season, by going 3-1 to open the year and claiming the Coca-Cola Classic in Mobile, Ala., Feb. 20-22. After dropping a tightly contested season opener to No. 6/12 Ole Miss, 6-5, Friday, Feb. 20, the Flames won three straight over the next two days to capture the tournament title.

On Saturday morning, Feb. 21, right-hander Mark Swanson did not allow a batter past second base in pitching seven scoreless innings in his Liberty debut. Catcher Errol Hollinger hit a solo home run and outfielder Jeff Jefferson drove in a run with a RBI double in a 5-2 win over the tournament host South Alabama Jaguars.

In the evening, the Flames rallied from a 3-2 deficit and down to their last strike to defeat the Jaguars, 4-3, in 10 innings. Third baseman Tyler Bream doubled off the right-center field wall with two outs in the top of the ninth and scored when the next batter, shortstop Matt Williams, singled to tie the contest at 3-3.

In the 10th, Jefferson lined a single off the glove of the South Alabama's first baseman to plate Tim Rotola with the game-winning run, as Andrew Wilson picked up the win for Liberty. The senior did not allow a run over the final five innings, scattering two hits, striking out three batters and walking one.

Sunday, Feb. 22, Jefferson beat out an infield single in the eighth inning to score second baseman P.J. Jimenez, pushing Liberty past Mercer, 3-2. Flames starter Steven Evans gave up two runs on six hits over seven innings, but did not figure in the decision. He struck out six and did not walk a Bear batter. Reliever Tyler Light recorded the win in his first appearance of the season. The right-hander pitched two scoreless frames of relief, allowing two hits and striking out two batters.

Hollinger Named to Brooks Wallace Player of the Year Watch List

Liberty senior catcher Errol Hollinger has been named to the preseason 2009 Brooks Wallace Player of the Year Award Watch List. The Wallace Award is presented annually to the nation's top collegiate baseball player.

Hollinger was listed among 204 collegiate players appearing on the preseason Wallace Watch list. It is the second straight year a Flame has appeared on the list. Last season, Garrett Young was named to the award's watch list.

This past season, Hollinger finished among the Big South leaders in runs scored (6th – 60), hits (7th – 82), RBIs (tied 8th – 47), doubles (tied 5th – 19) and total bases (tied 7th – 127). On the defensive side, he led the conference in runners caught stealing with 26 and fewest passed balls with four.

The senior hit .319 with eight home runs and a .494 slugging percentage in 62 games in 2008. He led the Flames by hitting in 21 straight games, the longest hitting streak by a Liberty player last season. Hollinger also led Liberty in both multiple-hit games (26) and multiple-RBI games. The catcher was selected to the Big South all-conference second team at the end of the season.

In a preseason survey of Big South Coaches by CollegeBaseballInsider.com, Hollinger was voted the conference's best catcher. He also received honorable mention consideration on the 2009 Ping! Baseball Preseason team.

Many New Faces

The Liberty Flames have 18 new members on their roster in 2009. Fifty percent of Liberty's roster consists of first-year players. Of the first-year players, six are transfers, 10 are freshmen and two are sophomores.

Junior outfielder Curran Redal, freshman shortstop Matt Williams and freshman third baseman Tyler Bream are all first-year players who have started all 14 games this season for Liberty.

Liberty-Coastal Carolina to battle on ESPNU

ESPNU, the 24-hour college sports network, has announced it will televise the opening contest of Liberty's three-game series at Coastal Carolina on May 1, live from Charles L. Watson Stadium.

The telecast, scheduled to begin at 6 p.m., will be a rematch of last year's Big South Championship title game. The two teams have met in the conference tournament final the last two seasons. It will be the first time Liberty has ever played on ESPNU.

The Last Time

Back-to-Back Home Runs

By Opponent: Five James Madison pitchers limited the Flames to four hits in a 4-0 win at Worthington Stadium on April 8, 2008.

By Liberty: With the bases loaded and no one out, pinch hitter Doug Bream belted the first pitch from Temple relief pitcher over the right-center field wall during a nine-run fifth inning for Liberty on March 7, 2009. The Flames went on to hit four home runs in the game, winning the first game of a doubleheader, 18-9.

By Opponent: George Mason's Justin Bour hit the first of his two home runs in the game, a grand slam in the sixth inning, to push the Patriots past Liberty, 13-0, on March 26, 2008 at Spuhler Field in Fairfax, Va.
