### The Games

The Liberty Flames (26-12, 14-3 Big South) travel to Farmville, Va., Tuesday, for a meeting with the Longwood Lancers. Game time is scheduled for 7 p.m. On Wednesday, the Flames will welcome the Virginia Tech Hokies (24-13, 9-11 ACC) to Worthington Stadium. First pitch is scheduled for 3 p.m.

### What to Watch

Liberty enters the week fresh off a sweep of Winthrop in Big South Conference play over the weekend. With the sweep, the Flames move on top of the conference standings. As a team, Liberty has hit .324 on the year. Six Flames are hitting .320 or better.

On Friday, Curran Redal hit safely in his 32nd straight game, setting a Big South record. The center fielder enters the week fourth in the conference in batting average with a .401 average.

Meanwhile, second baseman P.J. Jimenez's bat has heated up over the past 10 games, leading the Flames at the plate with a .433 average. With 13 hits over the time span, he has raised his average 60 points. Of his base knocks during the period, five have been doubles and one a home run.

Longwood dropped all four of its games over the weekend at LeMoyne. The independent Lancers have won four of their last 10 contests. As a team, Longwood is hitting .332, with seven hitters over .300.

Left fielder David Smiy, Jr. paces the Lancers with a .391 batting average. Catcher Jonathan Quigley leads Longwood with 38 RBIs. He also has hit .355 with seven home runs and 10 doubles on the season.

Virginia Tech begins the week, having taken two-of-three games from Clemson in an ACC series. The Hokies have won nine out of their last 10 games and will host William & Mary, Tuesday, before meeting the Flames, Wednesday. As a team, Virginia Tech is hitting .327 beginning the week.

Outfielder Steve Domecus leads the Hokies with a .410 batting average and 40 RBIs. Shortstop Austin Wates is hitting .357.

**Head Coach Jim Toman**

**Record at Liberty: 61-38-1 (Second Year)  
Career Record: Same**

After a solid campaign in his first year as Liberty's head coach, Jim Toman enters his second season at the helm of the program.

Last season, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish the season with a 35-26-1 mark, making Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's 36-year history. Toman guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by a Flames team, as Liberty won 30 or more games in a season for the fourth consecutive year for the first time in program history.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks this past summer. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty batters eclipsed the school's single-season doubles mark, ripping 155 two-base hits. The total ranked the Flames fifth in the country in the category. Liberty hitters also set a program record for hit by pitch.

The Flames finished their season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed Liberty to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. The Flames went on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman is the sixth head coach in the 34-year history of the Liberty Baseball program. The second-year skipper comes to Liberty after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 19-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball. Toman's 2003, 2005 and 2006 classes were named the top recruiting classes by the publication.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

In addition, South Carolina posted eight-straight seasons of 40 or more wins with Toman on the Gamecock coaching staff, including 2007. During Toman's 11 seasons at South Carolina, he helped the Gamecocks to a combined 500-220 (.694) record.

Toman earned four baseball letters at N.C. State, 1981-84, and was captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in vocational industrial education in 1985. He received a Master of Science degree in sport management from N.C. State in 1995.

Upon graduation, Toman entered the coaching profession as an assistant at Richmond County High School in Rockingham, N.C., for two years. He moved into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989 as an assistant at Florida International for one year. At FIU, he was responsible for the weight program, worked with the squad's catchers and coached first base. Toman joined the N.C. State staff before the 1990 season.

## The Coaches

Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman is in his second year at the helm of the Flames. In this first season at Liberty, he guided the Flames to a 35-26-1 mark, the best record by a Liberty team under a first-year coach in program history. This season, he got the Flames off to the second-best start in the history of Liberty baseball through 29 games.

A 20-year member of the college coaching ranks, he served 18 years as a member of Ray Tanner's staffs at South Carolina and N.C. State. Toman was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball.

During his time in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three-consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

Longwood Head Coach Buddy Bolding is in his 31st year with the Lancers. Bolding reached his 800th career coaching victory at the school on March 8, 2008, when Longwood defeated Binghamton, 6-5.

Under Bolding, Longwood posted a winning record of 34-19 during 2007, the program's 27th winning season overall and the program's 12th 30-win season. Bolding's tenure at Longwood is highlighted by six appearances in the NCAA Division II Tournament, and two trips to the Division II College World Series.

## Following the Flames

This season, the Flames Sports Network plans to broadcast several Liberty baseball regular season games. Games will air live on WWMC 90.9 FM "The Light" and on the World Wide Web at both LibertyFlames.com and thelightonline.com. Wednesday's contest will be on "The Light", starting 3 p.m.

## Flames at Worthington Stadium

For the past 31 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium home. Liberty has compiled an impressive 503-227-5 record at the facility for a winning percentage of .688 since the stadium's inception in 1979.

The Flames have posted a 17-3 record at the facility this season, already eclipsing last season's home win total of 11. Liberty is scheduled to play 24 games at home this season.

Last year, the Flames played 24 home games at the stadium, posting an 11-12-1 record at Worthington.

## Liberty on the Road

Liberty is 8-8 on the road this season. The Flames are also 1-1 on neutral fields. The Flames completed their 2008 road schedule, posting a 15-8 road record and a 9-6 neutral field mark. The Flames' 15 road victories were the most by a Liberty club in program history. Liberty's .652 road winning percentage was its best road mark since 1980, when the Flames went 9-2 on the road for an .818 percentage.

## Liberty at Night

Liberty is 6-3 at night this season. The Flames are currently scheduled to play 15 games under the lights in 2009. Tuesday night at Longwood is the next night game for Liberty. The Flames finished the 2008 campaign with an 8-4 mark at night. The Flames closed out the year by winning six out of their last seven night contests. Since 2004, Liberty has gone 24-27 under artificial lighting.

## Flames By the Month

Liberty is 7-6 during the month of April. However, the Flames have posted a 7-2 record in Big South Conference play in the month. Jim Toman's squad is scheduled to play 19 games in the month this season. Since 1976, the Flames have recorded an all-time mark of 330-280-1 (.541) in April. The Flames posted a 16-3 (.842) overall mark and started 7-1 in Big South play during the month of March. Last season, the Flames posted a 7-12 overall mark and a 1-2 record in conference action during the month. Liberty is 337-267-2 (.557) all-time in program history during March. Liberty finished its February schedule with a 3-3 mark. The Flames were scheduled to play nine games in the month, but had three canceled due to inclement weather. Liberty has an all-time mark of 64-32 in February.

## Flames All-Time Against Longwood, Virginia Tech

Liberty and Longwood will meet for the 19th time on the baseball diamond, Tuesday. The Flames hold a 16-3 lead over the Lancers since the series started in 1978. Earlier this season, Longwood turned four double plays in defeating Liberty, 7-3, April 2 in Farmville, Va. Wednesday, Virginia Tech and Liberty will meet for the 53rd time on the baseball diamond. After splitting a pair of games last season, the Hokies lead the series, 32-20, since 1977. Each team won on the other's field in 2008, as Liberty won the last meeting between the squads, 7-6, May 7 at English Field, while Virginia Tech took the meeting at Worthington Stadium, April 16, 11-1.

### Redal Breaks Big South Consecutive Game Hit Mark

Center fielder Curran Redal singled through the left side of the infield in the first inning, last Friday night against Winthrop, to hit safely in his 32nd game in a row, a new Big South record. The junior breaks the previous mark of 31-consecutive games with at least one hit, which he held with UNC Asheville shortstop Kevin Weidenbacher. The UNC Asheville shortstop set the previous record last season.

During the streak, the junior hit .452, collecting 57 hits in 126 at bats. He has also drove in all 40 of his season's RBI total over the span.

### Taking One for the Team

Entering play this week, Liberty batters have been hit by a pitch 76 times this season. Flame batters have been plunked by an opposition an average of two times per game. Liberty ranked second in the nation in the category in the latest NCAA Division I statistical report, through games of April 12, with 74.

This year, Flames batters have been hit by a pitch seven times in a game twice to set a new school standard. Temple pitchers hit seven Liberty hitters on March 7 and High Point hurlers plunked seven Flames on March 22.

Last season, the Flames set a new school record by being hit by a pitch 82 times. The mark eclipsed the previous standard of 75 in the 2001 season.

### Fine Fielding

Jim Toman's squad ranked No. 11 in the nation in fielding percentage with a .976 percentage in the latest NCAA Division I statistical report, for games through April 12. In addition, they start the week tops in the Big South Conference with a .977 percentage. Liberty has committed 34 errors in 1454 chances this season.

The Flames fielding percentage is 17 points higher than at the same juncture of the year, last season. Through 38 games, Liberty had made 62 errors, 28 more than this year, in 1532 chances for a .960 fielding percentage in 2008. The Flames ended the year with a .963 percentage.

The best team fielding percentage over a season in school history was set by the 2005 Flames. That season, Liberty posted a .971 fielding percentage and also committed the fewest errors in school history with 62.

### Teufel Strikes Out Season-High

Liberty left-hander Shawn Teufel struck out nine UNC Asheville batters in a 9-0 win over the Bulldogs in the opening game of their three-game Big South series, last Friday. Teufel's nine strikeouts were the most in a game this season by a Liberty pitcher and set a career-high for the left-hander.

Teufel pitched seven scoreless innings, giving up two hits. He combined with Carter Browning and Chris McDougal to pitch the first shutout for the Flames this season.

Third baseman Tyler Bream and center fielder Curran Redal each hit a home run in the contest. Both players had two hits apiece in the game. Bream had three RBIs for Liberty.

### Liberty Takes Series From VMI

The Liberty Flames broke a 1-1 tie in the seventh inning with two runs, and then held on for a 4-3 victory over the VMI Keydets, 4-3, April 5 in Big South Conference action at Gray/Minor Stadium. With the win, the Flames took the three-game series, two games to one.

In the bottom of the sixth inning, VMI loaded the bases with no one out. However, after being summoned from the bullpen, Liberty reliever Andrew Wilson induced three consecutive ground balls, which resulted in force outs at home plate, preventing the Keydets from scoring.

After getting out of the bases loaded jam in the previous inning, the Flames broke the deadlock on the scoreboard with two runs.

Wilson picked up the win to run his record to 4-1 on the year. The right-hander allowed two runs on two hits over three innings of work. Carter Browning recorded his third save of the season with the perfect ninth for Liberty.

### Bream Named Big South Player of the Week

Liberty freshman third baseman Tyler Bream was selected as the Big South Conference Choice Hotels Baseball Player of the Week for March 30.

Bream batted .467 (7-15) and drove in 10 runs to help Liberty post a 4-0 mark that week and move atop the Big South standings. He started the week with three hits, three RBIs, two doubles and four runs in the Flames' win at North Carolina State, March 25. Marcj 27 against Presbyterian, Bream walked with the bases loaded to force in the winning run, and the next day against the Blue Hose, Bream drove in both Liberty runs in a 2-1 victory. March 28, the freshman had his second three-hit game of the week and hit his first collegiate grand slam to complete the sweep of Presbyterian. On the week, Bream slugged .800, had a .556 on-base percentage, scored six runs and walked three times.

### Streaks Help Flames March Through March

Two winning streaks propelled Liberty to a 16-3 record in March. The Flames began the third month of the year with a seven-game winning streak, March 6-13. After two setbacks, Liberty went on a nine-game winning skein, March 18-30, its longest of the season.

The nine-game streak ties the 2009 Flames with the 2008, 2006, 1995 and 1985 clubs for the most consecutive wins in a season during the program's Division I era. The 1976 Liberty team holds the school record for the longest win streak in the history of the program with a 12-game streak.

### Mashing in March

After going 3-3 to begin the season, the Flames went 16-3 in the month of March, keyed by their hitting.

Over its 19 games during the month, Liberty hit .356 as a team, and scored 10.2 runs per game. The hitting outburst raised the Flames' batting average for the season 88 points, to .326.

During the stretch, Liberty enjoyed a power burst too. The Flames hit 31 home runs and boasted a .563 slugging percentage over the March's 19 games.

### Flames Sweep Blue Hose In First-Ever Series

Liberty hit five home runs, propelling the Flames to a 14-7 victory over Presbyterian, and a sweep of its three-game series with the Blue Hose, March 29 at Worthington Stadium. The series was the first-ever between the Flames and Big South newcomer Blue Hose.

Third baseman Tyler Bream hit his first collegiate grand slam in the third inning, while outfielders Curran Redal and Doug Bream connected for back-to-back home runs in the fifth. Catcher Errol Hollinger and Trey Wimmer also hit four-baggers for the Flames.

Redal's round tripper was his fourth of the season, while Doug Bream's was his fifth of the year. It is the second time this season, the Flames have hit back-to-back home runs in a contest. Hollinger and outfielder Casey Brown hit back-to-back home runs in the fifth inning of an 11-1 victory over Temple on March 7.

Liberty starter Shawn Teufel improved to 3-1 on the season. The left-hander gave up four runs on seven hits, striking out six in six innings of work.

The Liberty Flames banged out a season-high 23 hits, leading from start to finish, en route to a 17-5 victory over the N.C. State Wolfpack, March 25 at Doak Field.

The Flames collected 23 hits in the contest, the most by Jim Toman's team this season. The hit total eclipses the 18 hits Toman's squad had on three other occasions earlier this year.

Center fielder Curran Redal and first baseman Trey Wimmer paced the Flames at the plate with four hits each. Tyler Bream, Errol Hollinger and Jeff Jefferson added three hits apiece for Liberty. Wimmer had four RBIs in the contest, while Jefferson hit his fourth home run.

Mark Swanson, the second Liberty pitcher in the contest, picked up the win to run his record to 3-0 on the year. The right-hander pitched 2 1/3 scoreless innings, giving up one hit and striking out three.

#### Hollinger On Johnny Bench Watch List

Liberty senior catcher Errol Hollinger has been listed on the 2009 Coleman Company-Johnny Bench Watch List. The award is given annually to the top Division I collegiate catcher. The initial list includes 44 catchers nominated for the award by their coaches.

Hollinger, a native of Upland, Calif., is a four-year starter at the position for the Flames. He entered the season named on the 2009 Brooks Wallace Player of the Year Watch list.

The senior enters Tuesday's contest with a team-leading seven home runs. Hollinger is hitting .331 with 22 RBIs and 25 runs scored in 38 starts. He has also added 10 doubles.

Last season, the Liberty catcher finished among the Big South leaders in runs scored (6th - 60), hits (7th - 82), RBIs (tied 8th - 47), doubles (tied 5th - 19) and total bases (tied 7th - 127). On the defensive side, he led the conference in runners caught stealing with 26 and fewest passed balls with four.

The senior hit .319 with eight home runs and a .494 slugging percentage in 62 games in 2008. Redal helped Liberty post a 3-1 record during the week, with a .500 batting average (5-10), .684 on-base percentage and a .900 slugging percentage. Third baseman Tyler Bream tied the Liberty record for RBIs in a game with nine, as the Flames defeated the High Point Panthers, 19-5, March 22 at Coy Willard Stadium to complete a sweep of its three-game Big South series.

With a run-scoring single in seventh inning, Bream tied the Liberty record for RBIs in a game with nine. The freshman third baseman's nine RBIs tied the school mark set by former Flame standout Pat Sipe, who recorded nine RBIs in a 13-2 win over Richmond on April 19, 1986, at Worthington Stadium.

Bream went 3-for-4 with four runs scored to go along with his nine RBIs for the Flames. Catcher Errol Hollinger went 3-for-3 with three RBIs and a run scored.

Friday night in the opening game of a three-game Big South series, Justin Richardson doubled home the go ahead run in the top of the ninth and reliever Andrew Wilson made it stand in the bottom of the frame, as the Liberty Flames defeated the High Point Panthers, 9-8.

With the game tied 8-8 in the top of the ninth, Liberty took the lead for good on a two-base hit by Richardson. With two out and first baseman Trey Wimmer on second base, Richardson rocketed a double to the left center field gap to give the Flames a 9-8 lead. Earlier in the contest, Richardson had tied the game with a pinch-hit, RBI double in the seventh inning.

In the bottom of the inning, High Point threatened to tie the contest by putting runners on the corners with two out against Wilson on a bad hop single by designated hitter Max Fulginiti. But, the Liberty right-hander induced Panther catcher Billy Alvino to ground out to second base, sealing the Flames' victory.

Wilson, the third pitcher on the night for Liberty, recorded the win, running his record to 3-1 on the year. The senior right-hander pitched 3 1/3 scoreless innings, giving up three hits.

Hollinger led all hitters in the contest with three hits. Right fielder Doug Bream and Richardson had two hits apiece and each drove in two runs for the Flames.

Catchers Errol Hollinger and Nathan Thompson each hit home runs for Liberty, and teammate Doug Bream drove in four runs in the contest. Shortstop Matt Williams led all hitters in the contest with three hits, as pitcher Chris McDougal recorded his first collegiate win with two scoreless innings of relief.

A day earlier, the Flames hit six home runs, including two by Bream, en route to a 19-6 victory over the Fordham Rams at Worthington Stadium.

The Flames' six home runs were one shy of the Liberty record for home runs in a contest. Bream's two home run game was the first by a Flame since teammate Errol Hollinger hit two four-baggers in a 5-4 win at Radford on April 11 of last season.

Wimmer had four hits and four RBIs, while Bream added three hits and three RBIs to pace the Flames' 18-hit attack, making a winner of pitcher Zane Bator. The right-hander picked up the victory in his first-ever appearance on the mound in a Flames' uniform.
