The Game

The Liberty Flames (23-11, 11-3 Big South) host the Old Dominion Monarchs (11-19, 5-7 CAA), Tuesday in a midweek game at Worthington Stadium. Game time is scheduled for 3 p.m.

What to Watch

The Flames begin the week looking to gain some momentum, going into this weekend's three-game weekend series with Big South leader Winthrop. After getting out to a 19-5 mark, Liberty has posted a 4-6 record over their last 10 games.

The Flames enter the week, hitting .320 as a team. Liberty has scored 262 runs this season, 7.71 runs per game.

After hitting .529 last week, outfielder Curran Redal, who enters the week as the Big South leader in hits with 56, is among the conference leaders in batting average and RBIs. The junior begins the week tied for second in the Big South with a .427 batting average. Redal also is third in the conference with 39 RBIs and seventh with 33 runs scored.

Third baseman Tyler Bream is second in the conference with 42 RBIs

Two Liberty pitchers are second in the Big South with five wins apiece. Left-handers Shawn Teufel and Steven Evans each recorded a win over the weekend to post their fifth victory of the year. Teufel struck out a career-high nine batters during his win, Friday, the most by a Flames hurler this year.

Old Dominion enters Tuesday's contest, having gone 5-5 over its last 10 games.

Third baseman Jake McAloose has started all 30 of the Monarch's contests and leads his team with a .371 batting average. Left fielder Donnie Costner has drove in a team-high 25 RBIs, and has a .314 batting average.

Chris Boggs, who the Flames faced when the squads met earlier this season, has a 3-0 mark for Old Dominion. Brett Harris also has posted a 3-3 mark.

Head Coach Jim Toman

**Record at Liberty: 58-37-1 (Second Year)
Career Record: Same**

After a solid campaign in his first year as Liberty's head coach, Jim Toman enters his second season at the helm of the program.

Last season, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish the season with a 35-26-1 mark, making Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's 36-year history. Toman guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by a Flames team, as Liberty won 30 or more games in a season for the fourth consecutive year for the first time in program history.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks this past summer. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty batters eclipsed the school's single-season doubles mark, ripping 155 two-base hits. The total ranked the Flames fifth in the country in the category. Liberty hitters also set a program record for hit by pitch.

The Flames finished their season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed Liberty to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. The Flames went on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman is the sixth head coach in the 34-year history of the Liberty Baseball program. The second-year skipper comes to Liberty after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 19-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball. Toman's 2003, 2005 and 2006 classes were named the top recruiting classes by the publication.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

In addition, South Carolina posted eight-straight seasons of 40 or more wins with Toman on the Gamecock coaching staff, including 2007. During Toman's 11 seasons at South Carolina, he helped the Gamecocks to a combined 500-220 (.694) record.

Toman earned four baseball letters at N.C. State, 1981-84, and was captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in vocational industrial education in 1985. He received a Master of Science degree in sport management from N.C. State in 1995.

Upon graduation, Toman entered the coaching profession as an assistant at Richmond County High School in Rockingham, N.C., for two years. He moved into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989 as an assistant at Florida International for one year. At FIU, he was responsible for the weight program, worked with the squad's catchers and coached first base. Toman joined the N.C. State staff before the 1990 season.

The Coaches

Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman is in his second year at the helm of the Flames. In this first season at Liberty, he guided the Flames to a 35-26-1 mark, the best record by a Liberty team under a first-year coach in program history. This season, he got the Flames off to the second-best start in the history of Liberty baseball through 29 games.

A 20-year member of the college coaching ranks, he served 18 years as a member of Ray Tanner's staffs at South Carolina and N.C. State. Toman was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball.

During his time in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three-consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

Old Dominion Head Coach Jerry Meyers is in his fifth year with the Monarchs. Last season, the Monarchs posted a 25-27 mark under Meyers.

In 2007, Old Dominion compiled a 35-24 record and was the top seed in the CAA tournament and co-regular season champions. The Monarch pitching staff topped the CAA with a 3.97 ERA and 471 strikeouts.

Meyers was awarded the 2006 Collegiate Coach of the Year from the Mid-Atlantic Major League Baseball Scouts Association. Old Dominion enjoyed one of the nation's biggest turnarounds after going 39-17 and finishing second in the CAA. The Monarchs climbed back into the national top 15 for the first time since the mid 1980's. He also was named the CAA Coach of the Year.

He spent eight years at South Carolina, working with the team's pitchers, before taking over at Old Dominion. Meyers served on the same staff with Liberty's Jim Toman.

Following the Flames

This season, the Flames Sports Network plans to broadcast several Liberty baseball regular season games. Games will air live on WWMC 90.9 FM "The Light" and on the World Wide Web at both LibertyFlames.com and thelightonline.com. The schedule of games will be posted on thelightonline.com, when the radio station announces its broadcast schedule.

In addition, selected games will be video streamed live on the internet via the Big South Edge, available on BigSouthSports.com. The stream can be accessed for a nominal fee through a link on LibertyFlames.com or by going directly to BigSouthSports.com.

Tuesday's game between the Monarchs and Flames is scheduled for web cast.

Flames at Worthington Stadium

For the past 31 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium home. With a 11-4 victory over UNC Asheville in the second game of a doubleheader Saturday, Liberty won its 500th contest at the stadium. Liberty has compiled an impressive 500-226-5 record at the facility for a winning percentage of .687 since the stadium's inception in 1979.

The Flames have opened the year, 14-2 at the facility, already eclipsing last season's home win total of 11. Liberty is scheduled to play 25 games at home this season.

Last year, the Flames played 24 home games at the stadium, posting an 11-12-1 record at Worthington. The slate of home games included the first night contests in the history of the stadium. March 28, 2008 was the first night contest ever at the stadium.

Liberty on the Road

Liberty is 8-8 on the road this season. The Flames are also 1-1 on neutral fields.

The Flames completed their 2008 road schedule, posting a 15-8 road record and a 9-6 neutral field mark. The Flames' 15 road victories were the most by a Liberty club in program history. Liberty's .652 road winning percentage was its best road mark since 1980, when the Flames went 9-2 on the road for an .818 percentage.

Liberty at Night

Liberty is 4-3 at night this season. The Flames are currently scheduled to play 15 games under the lights in 2009. The next night game for Liberty is next Friday at Worthington against Winthrop.

Liberty finished the 2008 campaign with an 8-4 mark at night. The Flames closed out the year by winning six out of their last seven night contests. Since 2004, Liberty has gone 18-25 under artificial lighting.

Flames By the Month

Liberty has started its April schedule with a 4-5 record. The Flames are 4-2 in Big South Conference play in the month. Jim Toman's squad is scheduled to play 19 games in the month this season. Since 1976, the Flames have recorded an all-time mark of 327-279-1 (.540) in April.

The Flames posted a 16-3 (.842) overall mark and started 7-1 in Big South play during the month of March. Last season, the Flames posted a 7-12 overall mark and a 1-2 record in conference action during the month. Liberty is 337-267-2 (.557) all-time in program history during March.

Liberty finished its February schedule with a 3-3 mark. The Flames were scheduled to play nine games in the month, but had three canceled due to inclement weather. Liberty has an all-time mark of 64-32 in February.

The Last Time Out

Liberty won the second game of a doubleheader with the UNC Asheville Bulldogs, 11-4, Saturday, to achieve a split of the twinbill at Worthington Stadium.

Right fielder Doug Bream and center fielder Curran Redal each hit a home run and John Long drove in three runs with two extra bases hits in the victory.

Designated hitter Long got the Flames on the score board in the second inning, ripping a two-run double. In the third inning, after third baseman Tyler Bream reached on an error, Long cashed in the runner with a triple off the right-center field wall for a 5-0 lead, which Liberty never relinquished.

Second baseman P.J. Jimenez had three hits in the contest to lead all Flames hitters. Long, Tyler Bream and Redal added two hits apiece.

Starter Steven Evans upped his mark to 5-2 on the year with six innings of work. Andrew Wilson earned his second save of the season with three innings of relief.

Second Best Start Since 1977

Through the first 29 games of the season, the Flames had posted a 21-8 overall record to tie for the second-best start to a season since 1977. Jim Toman's team's record at the time tied them with six other Flames squads for the best mark over a 29 games to begin a season. The 2006, 1995, 1983, 1981, 1980 and 1979 Liberty teams all had 21-8 marks through 29 contests.

The 1995 Flames have the best start through the first 29 games of the season in Liberty history, starting 22-7. Head Coach Johnny Hunton's team went on to post a 33-20 mark.

Liberty's current 23-11 record through 34 contests ranks fourth in the program's annuals. The 2006 and 1981 teams posted a 26-8 mark through 34 games to start their seasons. The 1995 Flames had a 25-9 record for the second best record over the opening 34 games.

Best Big South Start

With two conference wins this past weekend, the Flames are off to their best conference start since 1998 with an 11-3 record. Liberty is one game behind Winthrop in the Big South standings.

The start by the current Flames ties the squad with the 1998 and 1995 Liberty teams. Both teams also started Big South conference play with an 11-3 record.

Recognizing Redal

Liberty outfielder Curran Redal enters the week among the national and Big South leaders in several categories. In the latest Big South Conference statistical report, the junior leads the conference in hits with 56 and total bases with 87. The center fielder ranks second in the league with a .427 average, third with 39 RBIs and second with a .664 slugging percentage.

Last week, Redal ranked among the national elite in several categories in the national statistical report for games through April 5. He was the third toughest hitter to strike out in the country, striking out once every 38 at bats. His hit total placed him 50th in the nation (47) and his batting average (.412) ranked him 83rd.

Redal begins the week, having hit in 30 consecutive games. During the span, he has hit .462. The center fielder leads the Flames with 13 multiple RBI games. In addition, he was named Big South Player of the Week for games played March 9-13.

Teufel Strikes Out Season-High

Liberty left-hander Shawn Teufel struck out nine UNC Asheville batters in a 9-0 win over the Bulldogs in the opening game of their three-game Big South series Friday. Teufel's nine strikeouts were the most in a game this season by a Liberty pitcher and was a career-high for the left-hander.

Teufel pitched seven scoreless innings, giving up two hits. He combined with Carter Browning and Chris McDougal to pitch the first shutout for the Flames this season.

Third baseman Tyler Bream and center fielder Curran Redal each hit a home run in the contest. Both players had two hits apiece in the contest. Bream had three RBIs for Liberty.

Liberty Takes Series From VMI

The Liberty Flames broke a 1-1 tie in the seventh inning with two runs, and then held on for a 4-3 victory over the VMI Keydets, 4-3, April 5 in Big South Conference action at Gray/Minor Stadium. With the win, the Flames took the three-game series, two games to one.

In the bottom of the sixth inning, VMI loaded the bases with no one out. However, after being summoned from the bullpen, Liberty reliever Andrew Wilson induced three consecutive ground balls, which resulted in force outs at home plate, preventing the Keydets from scoring.

After getting out of the bases loaded jam in the previous inning, the Flames broke the deadlock on the score board with two runs.

Wilson picked up the win to run his record to 4-1 on the year. The right-hander allowed two runs on two hits over three innings of work. Carter Browning recorded his third save of the season with the perfect ninth for Liberty.

Flames left fielder Doug Bream led all hitters on the afternoon with three hits. Catcher Errol Hollinger had two more hits for Liberty.

On April 4, center fielder Curran Redal drove in four runs with three hits, helping lead the Flames past the Keydets, 9-7, rebounding from a setback on Friday.

Bream Named Big South Player of the Week

Liberty freshman third baseman Tyler Bream has been selected as the Big South Conference Choice Hotels Baseball Player of the Week for March 30.

Bream batted .467 (7-15) and drove in 10 runs to help Liberty post a 4-0 mark last week and move atop the Big South standings. He started the week with three hits, three RBIs, two doubles and four runs in the Flames' win at North Carolina State on Tuesday. On Friday against Presbyterian, Bream walked with the bases loaded to force in the winning run, and the next day against the Blue Hose, Bream drove in both Liberty runs in a 2-1 victory. Sunday, the freshman had his second three-hit game of the week and hit his first collegiate grand slam to complete the sweep of Presbyterian. On the week, Bream slugged .800, had a .556 on-base percentage, scored six runs and walked three times. He also has 23 RBIs in his last 10 games.

Streaks Help Flames March Through March

Two winning streaks propelled Liberty to a 16-3 record in March. The Flames began the third month of the year with a seven-game winning streak, March 6-13. After two setbacks, Liberty went on a nine-game winning skein, March 18-30, its longest of the season.

The nine-game streak ties the 2009 Flames with the 2008, 2006, 1995 and 1985 clubs for the most consecutive wins in a season during the program's Division I era. The 1976 Liberty team holds the school record for the longest win streak in the history of the program with a 12-game streak.

Mashing in March

After going 3-3 to begin the season, the Flames went 16-3 in the month of March, keyed by their hitting.

Over its last 19 games, Liberty hit .356 as a team, and scored 10.2 runs per game. This month's hitting outburst raised the Flames' batting average for the season 88 points, to .326.

During the stretch, Liberty enjoyed a power burst too. The Flames hit 31 home runs and boasted a .563 slugging percentage over the month's 19 games.

Flames Sweep Blue Hose In First-Ever Series

Liberty hit five home runs, propelling the Flames to a 14-7 victory over Presbyterian, and a sweep of its three-game series with the Blue Hose, March 29 at Worthington Stadium. The series was the first-ever between the Flames and Big South newcomer Blue Hose.

Third baseman Tyler Bream hit his first collegiate grand slam in the third inning, while outfielders Curran Redal and Doug Bream connected for back-to-back home runs in the fifth. Catcher Errol Hollinger and Trey Wimmer also hit four-baggers for the Flames.

Redal's round tripper was his fourth of the season, while Doug Bream's was his fifth of the year. It is the second time this season, the Flames have hit back-to-back home runs in a contest. Hollinger and outfielder Casey Brown hit back-to-back home runs in the fifth inning of an 11-1 victory over Temple on March 7.

Liberty starter Shawn Teufel improved to 3-1 on the season. The left-hander gave up four runs on seven hits, striking out six in six innings of work.

The two prior days, March 28-27, Liberty receiving strong pitching efforts from right-hander Mark Swanson and left-hander Steven Evans in posting identical 2-1 wins in each game. On March 28th, Swanson pitched eight complete innings to run his record to 4-0 on the year. Reliever Carter Browning earned his second save with a scoreless ninth. Tyler Bream single home the only runs Liberty needed in the fourth inning for a 2-1 victory, as the two Flames' hurlers combined to retire the last 13 Presbyterian.

Season-High 23 Hits at N.C. State

The Liberty Flames banged out a season-high 23 hits, leading from start to finish, en route to a 17-5 victory over the N.C. State Wolfpack, March 25 at Doak Field.

The Flames collected 23 hits in the contest, the most by Jim Toman's team this season. The hit total eclipses the 18 hits Toman's squad had on three other occasions earlier this year.

Center fielder Curran Redal and first baseman Trey Wimmer paced the Flames at the plate with four hits each. Tyler Bream, Errol Hollinger and Jeff Jefferson added three hits apiece for Liberty. Wimmer had four RBIs in the contest, while Jefferson hit his fourth home run.

Mark Swanson, the second Liberty pitcher in the contest, picked up the win to run his record to 3-0 on the year. The right-hander pitched 2 1/3 scoreless innings, giving up one hit and striking out three.

The contest marked the return of Toman to his alma mater as a head coach. The Liberty skipper was a four-year letterwinner in baseball with the Wolfpack from 1981-84.

Hollinger On Johnny Bench Watch List

Liberty senior catcher Errol Hollinger has been listed on the 2009 Coleman Company-Johnny Bench Watch List. The award is given annually to the top Division I collegiate catcher. The initial list includes 44 catchers nominated for the award by their coaches.

Hollinger, a native of Upland, Calif., is a four-year starter at the position for the Flames. He entered the season named on the 2009 Brooks Wallace Watch list. The award is given to the top collegiate player each season.

He enters Tuesday's contest with a team-leading seven home runs. The four-baggers ranked him fourth in the Big South Conference. So far on the year, Hollinger is hitting .317 with 20 RBIs and 23 runs scored in 34 starts. He has also added nine doubles.

Last season, the Liberty catcher finished among the Big South leaders in runs scored (6th - 60), hits (7th - 82), RBIs (tied 8th - 47), doubles (tied 5th - 19) and total bases (tied 7th - 127). On the defensive side, he led the conference in runners caught stealing with 26 and fewest passed balls with four.

The senior hit .319 with eight home runs and a .494 slugging percentage in 62 games in 2008. The catcher was selected to the Big South all-conference second team at the end of the season.

Charleston Southern scored an unearned run in the ninth, but Liberty reliever Steven Evans held off the Buccaneers for a 5-4 victory. The lefty moved to 2-0 on the year, with two innings of work.

After Saturday's game was moved to Sunday due to rain, the Flames and Bucs could only get a single game played on March 15. Charleston Southern plated an opening inning run and led the entire contest, snapping Liberty's seven-game winning streak.

Tyler Bream went 3-for-3 in the contest and scored a run for the Flames. Center fielder Curran Redal drove in two runs with a single.

Bats Enjoy Home Cooking

Entering an eight-game homestand on March 6, the Flames were hitting .235 and averaging only four runs per game. Over the next eight games, the Liberty bats heated up, as Jim Toman's squad ran off seven consecutive victories to begin its longest homestand of the season. The Flames ended up finishing their homestand, 7-1.

During the first homestand of the 2009 season at Worthington Stadium, the Flames hit .360, averaging 11.13 runs per game. Liberty posted double-digit hit totals in five of the eight contests. With the red-hot hitting, the Flames raised their team batting average 73 points during the span to .308.

In addition, Liberty had a .610 slugging percentage over the eight-game stretch, banging out 42 extra base hits - 26 doubles, 1 triple and 15 home runs.

In two of the contests, the Flames scored a season-high 18 runs, defeating Temple in the first game of a doubleheader, March 7, 18-9, and William & Mary, March 11, 18-13. Also, Liberty hit two or more home runs in each of the first five games at Worthington Stadium this season. The streak ended March 11, when Liberty hit only one round tripper in its win over the Tribe. The Flames ended up hitting a home run in every game of the home stand, except the final contest of the homestand March 15 against Charleston Southern.
