The Games

The Liberty Flames (30-17, 16-7 Big South) complete their 2009 regular season this weekend by hosting the Radford Highlanders (23-21, 14-8 Big South) in a key Big South Conference series. The series will help decide seeding for the upcoming conference championship next week. The series opens Thursday at 4 p.m., followed by a 1 p.m. first pitch on Friday. The final contest of the three-game set is scheduled for Saturday afternoon. First pitch is scheduled for 1 p.m.

What to Watch

The Liberty Flames enter the final weekend, have clinched one of the top three seeds for the Big South Baseball Championship.

Liberty begins the weekend with a .314 team batting average. The Flames' mound staff has posted a 5.13 ERA so far this season.

Curran Redal continues to pace Liberty at the plate with a .397 batting average. The center fielder ranks fifth in the Big South in the category. His 71 hits tie him for the fifth spot in the conference. Redal is tied with outfielder Doug Bream for the Flames' lead in multi-hit contest with 21 multi-hit contests. Bream enters the weekend, second on the team with a .361 batting average.

Flames pitchers also find themselves among the Big South leaders. Andrew Wilson, Steven Evans and Shawn Teufel are all among the conference's ERA leaders. Wilson is fourth in the Big South with a 3.19 ERA, followed by Evans, who is tied for sixth, with a 3.75 ERA. Teufel is 10th with a 4.35 ERA. Teufel is also tied for second in the conference in wins, with a 7-2 record.

The Radford Highlanders begin the weekend, trying to hold off the Gardner-Webb Bulldogs for the No. 4 seed in the upcoming conference championship.

The Highlanders are hitting .318 as team this season, while their pitching staff sports a 5.98 ERA through 44 games.

First baseman Alex Gregory enters the weekend third in the conference with a .406 batting average. He also paces the Radford with 37 RBIs.

Right-hander Aerik Taylor enters his start on Thursday with a 5-3 mark with team-leading 4.06 ERA in 12 starts. Reliever Josh Patten is second in the Big South with eight saves.

Head Coach Jim Toman

Record at Liberty: 65-43-1 (Second Year)
Career Record: Same

After a solid campaign in his first year as Liberty's head coach, Jim Toman is in his second season at the helm of the program.

Last season, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish the season with a 35-26-1 mark, making Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's 36-year history. Toman guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by a Flames team, as Liberty won 30 or more games in a season for the fourth consecutive year for the first time in program history.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks this past summer. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty batters eclipsed the school's single-season doubles mark, ripping 155 two-base hits. The total ranked the Flames fifth in the country in the category. Liberty hitters also set a program record for hit by pitch.

The Flames finished their season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed Liberty to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. The Flames went on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman is the sixth head coach in the 34-year history of the Liberty Baseball program. The second-year skipper comes to Liberty after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 19-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball. Toman's 2003, 2005 and 2006 classes were named the top recruiting classes by the publication.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

In addition, South Carolina posted eight-straight seasons of 40 or more wins with Toman on the Gamecock coaching staff, including 2007. During Toman's 11 seasons at South Carolina, he helped the Gamecocks to a combined 500-220 (.694) record.

Toman earned four baseball letters at N.C. State, 1981-84, and was captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in vocational industrial education in 1985. He received a Master of Science degree in sport management from N.C. State in 1995.

Upon graduation, Toman entered the coaching profession as an assistant at Richmond County High School in Rockingham, N.C., for two years. He moved into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989 as an assistant at Florida International for one year. At FIU, he was responsible for the weight program, worked with the squad's catchers and coached first base. Toman joined the N.C. State staff before the 1990 season.

The Coaches

Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman is in his second year at the helm of the Flames. In this first season at Liberty, he guided the Flames to a 35-26-1 mark, the best record by a Liberty team under a first-year coach in program history. This season, his Flames have posted the most victories by a Liberty team in conference play, eclipsing the previous mark of 15.

A 20-year member of the college coaching ranks, he served 18 years as a member of Ray Tanner's staffs at South Carolina and N.C. State. Toman was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball.

During his time in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three-consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

Highlanders' Head Coach Raccuia, a 1995 Radford graduate, returned to his roots in July of 2007, when he was named the fifth head coach in Radford baseball history. His path home has been a busy one, ranging from the head coaching job at Marist to an assistant's position at Alabama. In each case, he's had a successful run, setting the stage for his return to his alma mater.

In Raccuia's first season with the Highlanders in 2008, the team produced 24 wins, the most since Radford won 28 in 2000. The final total was a 14-game turnaround from the 2007 season.

Following the Flames

This season, the Flames Sports Network plans to broadcast several Liberty baseball regular season games. Games will air live on WWMC 90.9 FM "The Light" and on the World Wide Web at both LibertyFlames.com and thelightonline.com. Thursday's game will be broadcast from Worthington Field, starting at 7 p.m.

In addition, selected games will be video streamed live on the internet via the Big South Edge, available on BigSouthSports.com. The stream can be accessed for a nominal fee through a link on LibertyFlames.com or by going directly to BigSouthSports.com. This weekend, Friday's and Saturday's games are scheduled for streaming on the Edge.

Flames at Worthington Stadium

For the past 31 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium home. Liberty has compiled an impressive 504-227-5 record at the facility for a winning percentage of .688 since the stadium's inception in 1979.

The Flames have posted an 18-3 record at the facility this season, already eclipsing last season's home win total of 11. Liberty is scheduled to play 24 games at home this season.

Liberty on the Road

Liberty finished its regular season, 11-13, on the road. The Flames are also 1-1 on neutral fields. The Flames completed their 2008 road schedule, with a 15-8 road record and a 9-6 neutral field mark. Liberty's 15 road victories were the most by a Liberty club in program history. Liberty's .652 road winning percentage was its best road mark since 1980, when the Flames went 9-2 on the road for an .818 percentage.

Liberty at Night

Liberty is 6-6 at night this season. The Flames are currently scheduled to play 14 games under the lights in 2009. Thursday's game at Worthington Stadium is the next night game on the Liberty schedule.

The Flames finished the 2008 campaign with an 8-4 mark at night. The Flames closed out the year by winning six out of their last seven night contests. Since 2004, Liberty has gone 24-29 under artificial lighting.

Flames By the Month

Liberty has started the month of May 1-3. The Flames will finish their regular season schedule with seven games during the fifth month, before participating in the Big South Championship, May 19-23 at McCormick Field in Asheville, N.C.

Last season, Liberty went 13-3-1 in the month, including a 4-2 mark in the Big South Championship. The Flames forced a second game against Coastal Carolina for the 2008 Big South title.

Liberty is 152-116-3 (.566) all-time, including Big South Championship appearances and three NCAA Regional appearances, during May. Liberty has gone 111-86-3 in regular season games during the month. In the Big South Championship, the Flames are 40-24, with championships in 2001, 1998 and 1993. In three NCAA appearances, Liberty is 1-6 all-time.

The Flames finished the month of April with a 10-8 record. Liberty posted a 9-3 mark in Big South Conference play. Since 1976, the Flames have recorded an all-time mark of 331-281-1 (.541) in April.

The Flames posted a 16-3 (.842) overall mark and started 7-1 in Big South play during the month of March. Last season, the Flames posted a 7-12 overall mark and a 1-2 record in conference action during the month. Liberty is 337-267-2 (.557) all-time in program history during March.

Liberty finished its February schedule with a 3-3 mark. The Flames were scheduled to play nine games in the month, but had three canceled due to inclement weather. Liberty has an all-time mark of 64-32 in February.

Overall, Big South

30 Wins - Five Consecutive Years

With its 4-1 win over Duke, Tuesday, Liberty has reached 30 wins for the fifth consecutive season, and the first two years under head coach Jim Toman. It is the first time in the 36-year history of the program, the Flames have won 30 or more games five-straight years.

Last season, the Flames posted a 35-26-1 mark to record four-straight seasons of 30 wins or more. It was the first time, Liberty has accomplished the four-year feat.

Before last season, the Liberty baseball program had won 30 or more games in season, three consecutive years. The Flames won 30 or more contests three consecutive seasons from 2000-03.

Liberty All-Time Against Radford

Thursday's contest will be the 68th meeting between the Flames and the Highlanders on the diamond since the two Commonwealth of Virginia schools first met in 1985. Liberty leads the all-time series with Radford, 43-24.

The Flames took four of the five meeting between the two last season. Liberty swept the regular season three-game set in Radford, April 11-13. However in the opening contest in the Big South Championship on May 21 at Memorial Park in Danville, Va., the No. 6 seed Highlanders defeated the No. 2 seed Flames. Two days later, Liberty eliminated Radford to advance in the tournament.

Liberty Against the Big South

Liberty, a 18-year member of the Big South Conference, has compiled a 241-172 (.588) record against the Big South Conference's current membership. The Flames are currently in first place in the conference with a 16-7 record, posting the most wins by a Liberty team since joining the Big South in 1992.

Last season, the Flames finished second in the standings during the regular season with a 14-7 record, and were tournament runners-up for the third-straight year.

Flames Post Most Victories in Big South Play

With their 10-9, 11-inning win at Gardner-Webb, April 26, the 2009 Liberty Flames have recorded 16 Big South victories, the most ever by a Liberty baseball team since joining the conference in 1992. The victory total surpasses the 15 Big South wins by the 1995 Flames, who finished their conference season at 15-9. Jim Toman's squad still has six Big South Conference games remaining.

The Last Time Out

The Liberty Flames scored three times in the ninth inning, breaking a 1-1 tie, en route to their 30th victory of the season, a 4-1 win, over the Duke Blue Devils, Tuesday afternoon at Jack Coombs Field.

In the bottom of the inning, Flames' reliever Andrew Wilson retired the host Blue Devils in order, sealing Liberty's 30th win of the season, earning his fifth save of the year.

Center fielder Curran Redal and designated hitter Cody Brown each had two of the Flames' eight hits in the contest.

Liberty starter Tyler Light pitched seven strong innings, allowing an unearned run on six hits. The senior right-hander struck out a season-high eight Blue Devil batters, while walking one. Carter Browning pitched a scoreless eighth inning to run his record to 2-1 on the year.

This year, Flames batters have been hit by a pitch seven times in a game twice to set a new school standard. Temple pitchers hit seven Liberty hitters on March 7 and High Point hurlers plunked seven Flames on March 22.

Last season, the Flames set a new school record by being hit by a pitch 82 times. The mark eclipsed the previous standard of 75 in the 2001 season.

Fine Fielding

Jim Toman's squad ranked 24th in the nation in fielding percentage with a .973 percentage in the latest NCAA Division I statistical report, for games through May 10. In addition, the Flames' percentage .973 tops the Big South Conference. Liberty has committed 48 errors in 1791 chances this season.

The best team fielding percentage over a season in school history was set by the 2005 Flames. That season, Liberty posted a .971 fielding percentage and also committed the fewest errors in school history with 62.

Two Flames Tough to K

Entering the week, Liberty outfielders Curran Redal and Doug Bream have shown themselves to be two of the toughest hitters in the nation to strike out.

Through games played on May 10, Redal had struck out once every 20 at bats, ranking him ninth among NCAA Division I batters in the country. Meanwhile, fellow Flame Doug Bream ranked 30th on the same list, striking out once every 15.5 at bats.

Flames Win 16th Big South Contest

Liberty catcher Errol Hollinger hit a game-tying grand slam and first baseman Trey Wimmer blasted the game-winning home run, as the Flames rallied from a 9-3 deficit for a 10-9, 11-inning win over the Gardner-Webb Bulldogs in Big South Conference baseball action, April 26 at Masters Field.

With the win, the Flames moved to 16-4 in conference play. Liberty's 16 league victories are the most ever by a Liberty baseball team since joining the Big South in 1992. The victory total surpasses the 15 Big South wins by the 1995 Flames. With the win, Liberty takes the three-game series, two games to one.

After Liberty erased a 9-3 Gardner-Webb lead to knot the contest at 9-9, Wimmer led off the 11th inning by blasting the first pitch of the inning over the left field wall. The home run, the first baseman's sixth of the season, gave Liberty a 10-9 advantage. Reliever Andrew Wilson then closed out the Bulldogs in bottom of the inning, stranding the tying run on second base to run his record to 5-2. The right-hander threw four innings of scoreless relief, allowing two hits, while striking out five and walking one.

The Flames knotted the contest in the eighth inning. The first three hitters in the inning, second baseman P.J. Jimenez, shortstop Matt Williams and center fielder Curran Redal, each singled to begin the frame, loading the bases with no one out. Two batters later, Hollinger drilled a 1-0 pitch over the left field wall, tying the contest at 9-9. The grand slam was the catcher's eighth round tripper of the year.

The Flames' Redal had four hits to lead all players in the contest. Doug Bream added three hits. Hollinger had five RBIs for Liberty.

A day earlier, Tyler Bream drove in six runs and Liberty pitchers held Gardner-Webb hitters in check throughout the contest, as the Flames downed the Bulldogs, 10-2.

Bream, who was 4-for-4 in the contest, ripped a pair of two-out, two-run base hits in first and the third innings. In the first, the Liberty third baseman singled and in the third, he doubled. He drove in his final two runs in the ninth with a single.

Liberty starter Shawn Teufel won his sixth consecutive start, running his record to 7-1 on the year. The left-hander gave up one run, while scattering six hits over 6 1/3 innings. Carter Browning pitched out of a bases loaded jam in the seventh inning, recording two outs. Andrew Wilson came on in the eighth inning to also end a bases loaded Bulldog threat. The trio of hurlers stranded 12 Gardner-Webb runners and blanked Bulldog hitters with runners in scoring position, as the Flames' hosts went 0-12 with men on second or third base through the first eight innings. Freshman John Long pitched the ninth in the victory.

With two men aboard and trailing 3-1 in the bottom of the ninth inning, third baseman Tyler Bream connected for a two-out, three run walk-off home run, propelling the Flames past the Virginia Tech Hokies, 4-3, April 22 at Worthington Stadium.

After 13 consecutive batters had been retired, the Flames got the first two hitters of the ninth inning on base. Shortstop Matt Williams drew a walk to open the inning and center fielder Curran Redal dropped a single into center field. After the next two Liberty batters were retired, Bream worked a 3-2 count against reliever Ben Rowen, before belting his eighth home run of the year over the right field wall for the 4-3 victory.

Designated hitter Cody Brown also hit a home run for the Flames.

Liberty's four hurlers on the afternoon gave up three runs on four hits, striking out five and walking one. Bream's blast gave freshman hurler John Long his first collegiate win, moving to 1-0 on the season.

Flames Sweep Winthrop

P.J. Jimenez drove in four runs with a home run and a single, helping the Liberty Flames defeat the Winthrop Eagles, 10-5, in game two of their Big South doubleheader at Worthington Stadium, April 18, sweeping both the doubleheader and the three-game series. With the sweep, the Flames moved into first place in the conference standings.

Liberty second baseman Jimenez connected for his second home run of the year, with two men aboard, during a four-run second inning. He later plated another run with an infield single with the bases loaded in the seventh frame.

During one stretch in the game, Flames pitchers Mark Swanson and Cody Brown retired combined to retire 14 batters in a row from the second inning through the seventh inning. Brown earned the win to raise his record to 2-2 on the year. Carter Browning recorded his fourth save with 1 1/3 innings of relief.

Liberty catcher Errol Hollinger led all players in the contest with four hits. Left fielder Tim Rotola and shortstop Matt Williams had three hits apiece for the Flames, as head coach Jim Toman's squad had six players with multiple hits in the game.

Last season, the Liberty catcher finished among the Big South leaders in runs scored (6th – 60), hits (7th – 82), RBIs (tied 8th – 47), doubles (tied 5th – 19) and total bases (tied 7th – 127). On the defensive side, he led the conference in runners caught stealing with 26 and fewest passed balls with four.

The senior hit .319 with eight home runs and a .494 slugging percentage in 62 games in 2008. He led the Flames by hitting in 21-straight games, the longest hitting streak by a Liberty player last season. Hollinger also led Liberty in both multiple-hit games (26) and multiple-RBI games (15). The catcher was selected to the Big South all-conference second team at the end of the season.

Redal Tabbed Big South Player of the Week

Liberty junior outfielder Curran Redal was selected as the Big South Conference Choice Hotels Baseball Player of the Week for games played March 9-16.

Redal helped Liberty post a 3-1 record during the week, with a .500 batting average (5-10), .684 on-base percentage and a .900 slugging percentage. The junior scored five runs, knocked in seven runs, doubled, homered, walked six times and was 3-3 in stolen bases. Redal enters the week on a 10-game hit streak, hitting .500 over the stretch.

The center fielder slugged a home run and walked twice in Liberty's 6-3 victory over Duke, March 10, and had two hits and two RBIs in the Flames' win over William & Mary, March 11. In two games March 13-15, he collected two hits and three RBIs in Liberty's two games against Charleston Southern.

Tyler Bream's Record Helps Complete Sweep

Third baseman Tyler Bream tied the Liberty record for RBIs in a game with nine, as the Flames defeated the High Point Panthers, 19-5, March 22 at Coy Willard Stadium to complete a sweep of its three-game Big South series.

With a run-scoring single in seventh inning, Bream tied the Liberty record for RBIs in a game with nine. The freshman third baseman's nine RBIs tied the school mark set by former Flame standout Pat Sipe, who recorded nine RBIs in a 13-2 win over Richmond on April 19, 1986, at Worthington Stadium.

Bream went 3-for-4 with four runs scored to go along with his nine RBIs for the Flames. Catcher Errol Hollinger went 3-for-3 with three RBIs and a run scored.

Left-hander Steven Evans went the distance, recording his first complete game of the season, as the Liberty Flames defeated the High Point Panthers, 7-3, Saturday night in the middle game of the series.

After the first inning, Evans cruised throughout the remainder of the contest, keeping the Panther batters in check to run his record to 3-0. The sophomore allowed three runs on nine hits. He struck out three and walked one. He became the first Flames pitcher to pitch a complete game this season.

Bream paced Liberty at the plate with three hits and three RBIs. Second baseman Kizuku Scott also had three hits for the Flames, scoring three times in the victory.

Friday night in the opening game of a three-game Big South series, Justin Richardson doubled home the go ahead run in the top of the ninth and reliever Andrew Wilson made it stand in the bottom of the frame, as the Liberty Flames defeated the High Point Panthers, 9-8.

With the game tied 8-8 in the top of the ninth, Liberty took the lead for good on a two-base hit by Richardson. With two out and first baseman Trey Wimmer on second base, Richardson rocketed a double to the left center field gap to give the Flames a 9-8 lead. Earlier in the contest, Richardson had tied the game with a pinch-hit, RBI double in the seventh inning.

In the bottom of the inning, High Point threatened to tie the contest by putting runners on the corners with two out against Wilson on a bad hop single by designated hitter Max Fulginiti. But, the Liberty right-hander induced Panther catcher Billy Alvino to ground out to second base, sealing the Flames' victory.

Wilson, the third pitcher on the night for Liberty, recorded the win, running his record to 3-1 on the year. The senior right-hander pitched 3 1/3 scoreless innings, giving up three hits.

Hollinger led all hitters in the contest with three hits. Right fielder Doug Bream and Richardson had two hits apiece and each drove in two runs for the Flames.
