The Games

The Liberty Flames (3-3, 0-0 Big South) will open their 2009 home schedule this weekend, by welcoming the Temple Owls (2-2, 0-0 A-10) to Al Worthington Stadium for a four-game series, Friday-Sunday. The series opens a nine-game homestand for Liberty, the longest homestand of the season. Friday, the Owls and Flames will begin the set with a single game, beginning at 5 p.m., followed by a doubleheader, Saturday afternoon, scheduled to start at Noon. The non-conference series will conclude with a single game, Sunday. First pitch Sunday is slated for 1 p.m.

What to Watch

After not playing in over a week due to inclement weather, Liberty will look to get back on track this weekend against Temple after dropping its last two games.

The Flames' starting nine returns catcher Errol Hollinger, infielder Cody Brown and outfielder Jeff Jefferson from last year's line-up. Hollinger, who is starting behind the plate for the fourth consecutive season, has been named to the 2009 Brooks Wallace Player of the Year Watch list. The catcher hit two home runs two Saturdays ago in wins over South Alabama during Liberty's march to the 2009 Coca-Cola Classic title.

Freshman third baseman Tyler Bream and Jefferson have led the Liberty at the plate in the early going. Bream has collected seven hits on the season, hitting his first collegiate home run at North Carolina, last Wednesday and hitting four doubles. Jefferson has a team-high eight hits, including a home run and a double. The outfielder also driven in a team-high six RBIs.

Temple enters this weekend's four-game set having split four games this season. Like the Flames, the Owls have had their last four games wiped out due to weather. Temple last played a week ago, dropping a 5-4 decision at High Point.

Second baseman Carmen Del Mastro leads the Owls with a .500 batting average and seven hits through their first four games. He was named the Philadelphia Big 5 Baseball Player of the Week on Feb. 24 for his play, so far this season.

Right-fielder Sean Barksdale is second on Temple's roster with six hits. The senior was an All-A-10 performer last season.

Head Coach Jim Toman

**Record at Liberty: 38-29-1 (Second Year)
Career Record: Same**

After a solid campaign in his first year as Liberty's head coach, Jim Toman enters his second season at the helm of the program.

Last season, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish the season with a 35-26-1 mark, making Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's 35-year history. Toman guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by a Flames team, as Liberty won 30 or more games in a season for the fourth consecutive year for the first time in program history.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks this past summer. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty batters eclipsed the school's single-season doubles mark, ripping 155 two-base hits. The total ranked the Flames fifth in the country in the category. Liberty hitters also set a program record for hit by pitch.

The Flames finished their season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed Liberty to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. The Flames went on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman is the sixth head coach in the 34-year history of the Liberty Baseball program. The second-year skipper comes to Liberty after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 19-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball. Toman's 2003, 2005 and 2006 classes were named the top recruiting classes by the publication.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

In addition, South Carolina posted eight-straight seasons of 40 or more wins with Toman on the Gamecock coaching staff, including 2007. During Toman's 11 seasons at South Carolina, he helped the Gamecocks to a combined 500-220 (.694) record.

Toman earned four baseball letters at N.C.State, 1981-84, and was captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in vocational industrial education in 1985. He received a Master of Science degree in sport management from N.C. State in 1995.

Upon graduation, Toman entered the coaching profession as an assistant at Richmond County High School in Rockingham, N.C., for two years. He moved into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989 as an assistant at Florida International for one year. At FIU, he was responsible for the weight program, worked with the squad's catchers and coached first base. Toman joined the N.C. State staff before the 1990 season.

The Coaches

Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman is in his second year at the helm of the Flames. In this first season at Liberty, he guided the Flames to a 35-26-1 mark, the best record by a Liberty team under a first-year coach in program history.

A 20-year member of the college coaching ranks, he served 18 years as a member of Ray Tanner's staffs at South Carolina and N.C. State. Toman was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball.

During his time in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three-consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

Temple Head Coach Rob Valli enters his fourth year with the Owls. Last season, he guided Temple to its first Atlantic 10 Tournament berth in six years, posting the most conference wins (16) and the most overall victories (27) by the Owls since 1999. Under his guidance, Temple went 27-29 in 2008 and finished fourth in the A-10 regular-season standings.

Most Victories by First-Year Coach at Liberty

With 35 wins in 2008, Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman became the winningest first-year coach in the program's history. Toman, the sixth head coach in the 35-year history of the Flames, led Liberty to a 35-26-1 mark in his first year, eclipsing the mark of Dave Pastors, the fourth head coach in program history. In 1998, his first season, Pastors led the Flames to a 32-29 record.

Following the Flames

This season, the Flames Sports Network plans to broadcast several Liberty baseball regular season games. The Last Time Out

Liberty Flames plated five, two-out runs in the fourth inning, cutting No. 1 North Carolina's lead to 6-5, but couldn't catch the Tar Heels, falling 9-5, Feb. 25 at Boshamer Stadium.

Center fielder Curran Redal paced the Flames by going 2-for-3 with a triple and two RBIs in the contest. Third baseman Tyler Bream hit his first collegiate home run for Liberty.

Flames at Worthington Stadium

For the past 29 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium their home. Liberty has compiled an impressive 486-224-5 record at the facility for a winning percentage of .683 since the stadium's inception in 1979. Friday's game is the home opener for Liberty.

Last year, the Flames played 24 home games at the stadium, posting an 11-12-1 record at Worthington. The slate of home games included the first night contests in the history of the stadium. March 28 was the first night contest ever at the stadium, and nine contests were played under the lights.

The Flames in Home Openers

Friday will be the 32nd home opener at Liberty's Worthington Stadium. The Flames are 26-5 in home openers at the facility. Last season, Flames senior shortstop Aaron Phillips broke a 3-3 tie with a home run to lead off the seventh inning, pushing the Flames past the Rider Broncs, 4-3, on Feb. 29.

Liberty on the Road

After opening the season with two road victories, setbacks on the road in midweek games last week have evened Liberty's road record at 2-2. The Flames are 1-1 on neutral fields.

Liberty completed their 2008 road schedule, posting a 15-8 road record and a 9-6 neutral field mark. The Flames' 15 road victories were the most by a Liberty club in program history. Liberty's .652 road winning percentage was its best road mark since 1980, when the Flames went 9-2 on the road for an .818 percentage.

Baseball in the Commonwealth

Thirteen Division I baseball teams call the Commonwealth of Virginia home. This season, the Flames head coach Jim Toman's squad is scheduled to face opponents from the "Old Dominion State" 20 times, starting this past Tuesday with the first of three games this season with James Madison. After falling in the contest, the Flames have begun their Commonwealth games at 0-1. Liberty posted a 13-13-1 record against in-state opponents in 2008.

The Flames will meet state squads George Mason (two times), James Madison (three times), Longwood (one time), Old Dominion (two times), Radford (three times), VCU (one time), VMI (three times), Virginia (one time), Virginia Tech (two times) and William & Mary (two times) this season.

Liberty at Night

Liberty's Feb. 21 meeting with the South Alabama Jaguars was the first night contest of 2009 for the Flames. With a 3-2, 10-inning win, Liberty is 1-0 at night.

The Flames are currently scheduled to play 16 games under the lights this season, including the opener of a three-game series at Coastal Carolina on May 1, which will be televised by ESPNU.

Liberty finished the 2008 with a 8-4 mark at night. The Flames finished the year by winning six out of their last seven night contests. Since 2004, Liberty has gone 18-24 under artificial lighting.

Flames By the Month

Liberty finished its February schedule with a 3-3 mark. The Flames were scheduled to play nine games in the month, but had three canceled due to inclement weather. Liberty has traditionally been successful in the month, with an all-time mark of 64-32.

Over the past three years, the Flames have played strong in the month of February. Last season, Liberty opened with a 5-0 record in the month, while Liberty started the 2007 campaign by posting a 7-3 mark in February. In 2006, Liberty started its season by recording a 7-2 record in the month.

The Flames have yet to play a contest in the month of March. This season, Liberty is scheduled to play 21 games during the month, including the start of Big South Conference play. With a 7-12 mark during March in 2008, the Flames are 325-266-2 (.550) all-time in program history.

Inclement Weather Causes Cancellations

Liberty will take to the baseball diamond for the first time since Feb. 25, when the Flames squared off with No. 1 North Carolina in Chapel Hill, N.C. Due to inclement weather, Liberty has had five contests canceled. The Flames' home series with Manhattan last weekend was canceled, along with midweek games earlier this week at VCU and with George Mason. Flames Capture Coca-Cola Classic Title

Liberty opened its 2009 season, by going 3-1 to open the year and claiming the Coca-Cola Classic in Mobile, Ala., Feb. 20-22.

After dropping a tightly contested season opener to No. 6/12 Ole Miss, 6-5, Friday, the Flames won three straight, Saturday and Sunday, to capture the tournament title.

Saturday morning, right-hander Mark Swanson did not allow a batter past second base in pitching seven scoreless innings in his Liberty debut. Catcher Errol Hollinger hit a solo home run and outfielder Jeff Jefferson drove in a run with a RBI double for a 5-2 win, over the tournament host South Alabama Jaguars.

In the evening, the Flames rallied from a 3-2 deficit and down to their last strike to defeat the Jaguars, 4-3, in 10 innings. Third baseman Tyler Bream doubled off the right-center field wall with two outs in the top of the ninth and scored when the next batter, short-stop Matt Williams, singled to tie the contest at 3-3. In the 10th, Jefferson lined a single off the glove of South Alabama's first baseman to plate Tim Rotola with the game-winning run. Andrew Wilson picked up the win for Liberty with five innings of scoreless relief. The senior did not allow a run over the final five innings, scattering two hits, striking out three batters and walking one.

Sunday, Jefferson beat out an infield single in the eighth inning to score second baseman P.J. Jimenez, pushing Liberty past Mercer, 3-2. Flames starter Steven Evans gave up two runs on six hits over seven innings, but did not figure in the decision. He struck out six and did not walk a Bear batter. Reliever Tyler Light recorded the win in his first appearance of the season. The right-hander pitched two scoreless frames of relief, allowing two hits and striking out two batters.

On the weekend, Jefferson collected a team-high seven hits and five RBIs. Bream also started his collegiate career strongly, with six hits, four which were doubles. Hollinger hit two home runs for Liberty.

Bream Has Solid Start to First Season

Liberty freshman third baseman Tyler Bream has started his first year of collegiate baseball in strong fashion. The son of former Liberty standout and major leaguer Sid Bream leads the Flames with a .333 batting average through the first six games of the year, with four doubles and a home run. His four two-base hits rank him second in the Big South behind Charleston Southern's Patrick Dolan despite playing three fewer games. The third baseman also leads Liberty with a .667 slugging percentage.

In Liberty's last game at No. 1 North Carolina, Bream hit his first collegiate home run in the fourth inning, helping the Flames cut their 6-0 deficit to 6-5. During the Flames' Coca-Cola Classic title on the season's opening weekend, he had six hits, four of which went for doubles. On Feb. 21, down to his last strike with two outs and Liberty trailing 3-2 to South Alabama in the ninth inning, the freshman roped a liner off the right-center field wall to begin a rally to tie the contest. Fellow freshman, shortstop Matt Williams, followed with a single to score Bream. The Flames scored again in the 10th for a 4-3 win.

Hollinger Named to Brooks Wallace Player of the Year Watch List

Liberty senior catcher Errol Hollinger has been named to the preseason 2009 Brooks Wallace Player of the Year Award Watch List. The Wallace Award is presented annually to the nation's top collegiate baseball player.

Hollinger was listed among 204 collegiate players appearing on the preseason Wallace Watch list. It is the second straight year a Flame has appeared on the list. Last season, Garrett Young was named to the award's watch list.

This past season, Hollinger finished among the Big South leaders in runs scored (6th – 60), hits (7th – 82), RBIs (tied 8th – 47), doubles (tied 5th – 19) and total bases (tied 7th – 127). On the defensive side, he led the conference in runners caught stealing with 26 and fewest passed balls with four.

The senior hit .319 with eight home runs and a .494 slugging percentage in 62 games in 2008. He led the Flames by hitting in 21 straight games, the longest hitting streak by a Liberty player last season. Hollinger also led Liberty in both multiple-hit games (26) and multiple-RBI games. The catcher was selected to the Big South all-conference second team at the end of the season.

In a preseason survey of Big South Coaches by CollegeBaseballInsider.com, Hollinger was voted the conference's best catcher. He also received honorable mention consideration on the 2009 Ping! Baseball Preseason team.

Liberty-Coastal Carolina to battle on ESPNU

ESPNU, the 24-hour college sports network, has announced it will televise the opening contest of Liberty's three-game series at Coastal Carolina on May 1, live from Charles L. Watson Stadium.

The telecast, scheduled to begin at 6 p.m., will be a rematch of last year's Big South Championship title game. The two teams have met in the conference tournament final the last two seasons. It will be the first time Liberty has ever played on ESPNU.

Many New Faces

The Liberty Flames will have 18 new members on their roster in 2009. Fifty percent of Liberty's roster will consist of first-year players. In addition, the Flames starting line-up will feature six new faces.

Of the first-year players, six are junior college transfers, 10 are freshmen and two are sophomores.

Hollinger and Umberger Selected as Team Captains

Senior catcher Errol Hollinger and senior right-hander Dustin Umberger have been chosen as captains for the 2009 Liberty Baseball team. They were selected by virtue of a team vote, and the senior duo received overwhelming support from their teammates.

Hollinger is a four-year starter for the Flames and Umberger led the pitching staff in 2008 with eight wins and 88 strikeouts. Umberger's strikeout total led the Big South Conference.

"I thought our team chose two outstanding individuals to lead them this spring," said Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman. "Errol and Dustin are proven veterans in the Big South Conference and are well-respected by all of their teammates."

Toman also added a Captains Cabinet this year, which is comprised of four players who also received substantial support in the voting. "Fortunately, we had many players who received votes this year," added Toman. "So, we seem to have great leadership."

Senior 1B/RHP Cody Brown, junior left-hander Shawn Teufel, junior right-hander Joe Steinwedell and junior right-hander Mark Swanson will comprise the Captains Cabinet.

"This group will give our team added leadership and accountability," said Toman. "They are great choices and will act as a sounding board to Errol and Dustin."

Quinn and Daniels Join Coaching Staff

The Liberty coaching staff has added two members to its ranks in Assistant Coach Garrett Quinn and Director of Baseball Operations Billy Daniels. Quinn will serve as the Flames' pitching coach and assist in recruiting, while Daniels will oversee several administrative phases such as team travel, camps, budget, academics, alumni relations and the day-to-day operations of the baseball office.

Quinn joins the Liberty staff after four years at Stetson, where he was the Hatters' pitching coach and recruiting coordinator. During his time at Stetson, he coached two All-Americans, seven A-Sun all-conference performers and four conference all-freshman team members.

Under his guidance, the Hatters' mound corps was 30th in the nation with a 3.81 ERA, first in the A-Sun in opponent batting average with a .259 average and seventh in the nation with seven shutouts in 2007. The previous year, the Stetson staff finished first in the conference with a 4.11 ERA and an opponent batting average of .270. Both seasons, the Hatters were A-Sun Champions and advanced to a NCAA Regional.

Daniels, a 2006 Liberty graduate and former Flames baseball player, served as an assistant coach at Longwood during the 2007-08 academic year. The Lancers' pitching coach during the 2008 season, he oversaw a Longwood staff which posted a 4.83 ERA with 291 strikeouts over 429 innings. The Lancers recorded a 23-26-1 record last season.

In addition, he previously served as a volunteer assistant coach at VCU during the fall of 2006 and throughout the 2007 campaign with the Rams. At VCU, he assisted in all aspects of the game, including assistance with the pitching staff and coaching first base. He also aided with team travel and organization of the program's camps. VCU finished 37-23 and advanced to a NCAA Regional in 2007.

Liberty Picked Second in Big South Preseason Poll

The Flames were tabbed by the Big South Coaches to finish second in the conference standings this season. Liberty was voted second, behind two-time defending champion Coastal Carolina.

The Flames, who were picked to finish atop the conference standings by two coaches, garnered 86 points in the poll, 11 less than Coastal Carolina. The Chanticleers received seven first place votes and 97 total points.

After last year's two Big South Championship finalists, Winthrop, who garnered the final first-place vote, was tabbed third by the panel, followed by VMI, Radford, High Point and conference newcomer Gardner-Webb. UNC Asheville, Charleston Southern and Presbyterian, another conference newcomer, rounded out the poll.

Presbyterian is eligible for the conference regular-season title, but not the Big South Championship title. The 2009 Big South Championship will be contested May 19-23 at McCormick Field in Asheville, N.C.
