The Games

The Liberty Flames (21-8, 9-2 Big South) close out a seven-game road trip with two games this week. The Flames travel to Williamsburg, Va., for non-conference game against the Tribe of William & Mary (11-17, 3-6 CAA), Tuesday. The contest is scheduled for 7 p.m. at Plumeri Park. The following afternoon, Liberty will square off with the George Mason Patriots (24-5, 7-2 CAA). First pitch, Wednesday at "Hap" Spuhler Field is scheduled for 3 p.m.

What to Watch

Liberty enters the week, off to the second best start in program history. The Flames have improved seven games over last season's record through 29 games.

As a team, Liberty is hitting .329 and has two players hitting better than .400. With eight hits in 15 at bats over the weekend, center fielder Curran Redal begins the week hitting .412. He joins outfielder Doug Bream, who sports a .444 average to lead the Flames, above the .400 mark. Bream leads the Big South Conference in the category.

William & Mary went 3-2 last week, taking two midweek games from Richmond and a game from Northeastern on the weekend.

Outfielder Jeff Jones continues to lead the Tribe in batting average, with a .375 average. The senior also leads the CAA in stolen bases with 18. Fellow senior Tyler Stampone has hit .424 over the last 10 games. The third baseman has collected a team-high 14 RBIs over the span.

George Mason begins the week, ranked nationally for the first time in school history. The Patriots are ranked No. 25 by the Collegiate Baseball News and No. 30 by the NCBWA. George Mason leads the CAA after sweeping UNC Wilmington over the weekend. The Patriots will enter Wednesday's game with a 20-game home winning streak, the nation's longest.

Catcher Chris Henderson paces George Mason, with a .445 batting average. He is one of six Patriots with an above .300 average. As at team, George Mason is hitting .310.

The 2008 All-East Region outfielder Scott Krieger leads the Patriots with 37 RBIs and 10 home runs.

Head Coach Jim Toman

Record at Liberty: 56-34-1 (Second Year)
Career Record: Same

After a solid campaign in his first year as Liberty's head coach, Jim Toman enters his second season at the helm of the program.

Last season, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish the season with a 35-26-1 mark, making Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's 35-year history. Toman guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by a Flames team, as Liberty won 30 or more games in a season for the fourth consecutive year for the first time in program history.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks this past summer. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty batters eclipsed the school's single-season doubles mark, ripping 155 two-base hits. The total ranked the Flames fifth in the country in the category. Liberty hitters also set a program record for hit by pitch.

The Flames finished their season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed Liberty to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. The Flames went on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman is the sixth head coach in the 34-year history of the Liberty Baseball program. The second-year skipper came to Liberty after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 19-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball. Toman's 2003, 2005 and 2006 classes were named the top recruiting classes by the publication.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

In addition, South Carolina posted eight-straight seasons of 40 or more wins with Toman on the Gamecock coaching staff, including 2007. During Toman's 11 seasons at South Carolina, he helped the Gamecocks to a combined 500-220 (.694) record.

Toman earned four baseball letters at N.C. State, 1981-84, and was captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in vocational industrial education in 1985. He received a Master of Science degree in sport management from N.C. State in 1995.

Upon graduation, Toman entered the coaching profession as an assistant at Richmond County High School in Rockingham, N.C., for two years. He moved into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989 as an assistant at Florida International for one year. At FIU, he was responsible for the weight program, worked with the squad's catchers and coached first base. Toman joined the N.C. State staff before the 1990 season.

The Coaches

Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman is in his second year at the helm of the Flames. In this first season at Liberty, he guided the Flames to a 35-26-1 mark, the best record by a Liberty team under a first-year coach in program history. This season, he got the Flames off to the second-best start in the history of Liberty baseball through 24 games.

A 20-year member of the college coaching ranks, he served 18 years as a member of Ray Tanner's staffs at South Carolina and N.C. State. Toman was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball.

During his time in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three-consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

William & Mary Head Coach Frank Leoni is in his fourth season at the helm of the Tribe. Last season, Leoni led William & Mary to a 36-21 record. The Tribe's win total was one victory shy of the school record. The 2008 Tribe finished third in the nation with a .343 batting average and lead the CAA in fielding.

Leoni is in his 17th year overall as a coach. Before taking over the reigns of the Tribe, he spent 13 seasons at his alma mater, Rhode Island. During his time there, he was twice named A-10 Coach of the Year and garnered New England Coach of the Year honors in 2004.

After spending two years as a player and two years as an assistant coach, George Mason Head Coach Bill Brown is in his 28th season as the head coach at his alma mater. In that span, Brown has gone from being the then-youngest Division I head coach in the nation to the dean of coaches in the Colonial Athletic Association.

George Mason's all-time leader in coaching victories with a 28-year mark of 777-689-5, Brown has been honored as CAA Coach of the Year a record five times. Under his guidance, the Patriots have made five NCAA Tournament appearances under the 1980 George Mason graduate. The Patriots also have posted at least 30 victories in a season 12 times, including a 35-19 mark in 2005 and a 39-19 record in 2004 when the Patriots received an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament. Brown was named CAA Coach of the Year for his work during that year's campaign.

Last season, Brown took a team that was young and lost several starters to injury and led it to a 30-25 mark and a third-place finish in the CAA. The Patriots took a pair of wins over nationally-ranked schools and Brown was named CAA Co-Coach of the Year.

Following the Flames

This season, the Flames Sports Network plans to broadcast several Liberty baseball regular season games. Games will air live on WWMC 90.9 FM "The Light" and on the World Wide Web at both LibertyFlames.com and thelightonline.com. The schedule of games will be posted on thelightonline.com, when the radio station announces its broadcast schedule.

Flames at Worthington Stadium

For the past 31 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium home. Liberty has compiled an impressive 498-225-5 record at the facility for a winning percentage of .688 since the stadium's inception in 1979.

The Flames have opened the year, 12-1 at the facility, already eclipsing last season's home win total of 11. Liberty is scheduled to play 25 games at home this season.

Last year, the Flames played 24 home games at the stadium, posting an 11-12-1 record at Worthington. The slate of home games included the first night contests in the history of the stadium. March 28, 2008 was the first night contest ever at the stadium, and nine contests were played under the lights.

Liberty on the Road

With two wins this past weekend at VMI, Liberty is 8-6 on the road this season. The Flames are also 1-1 on neutral fields.

The Flames completed their 2008 road schedule, posting a 15-8 road record and a 9-6 neutral field mark. The Flames' 15 road victories were the most by a Liberty club in program history. Liberty's .652 road winning percentage was its best road mark since 1980, when the Flames went 9-2 on the road for an .818 percentage.

Liberty at Night

Coming into Tuesday night's contest at William & Mary, Liberty is 4-2 at night this season. The Flames have dropped their last two contests under the lights. Liberty is currently scheduled to play 16 games under the lights in 2009.

Liberty finished the 2008 campaign with an 8-4 mark at night. The Flames closed out the year by winning six out of their last seven night contests. Since 2004, Liberty has gone 18-24 under artificial lighting.

Flames By the Month

Liberty started its April schedule with a 2-2 record. The Flames are scheduled to play 19 games in the month this season. Since 1976, the Flames have recorded an all-time mark of 325-276-1 (.541) in April.

The Flames posted a 16-3 (.842) overall mark and started 7-1 in Big South play during the month of March. Last season, the Flames posted a 7-12 overall mark and a 1-2 record in conference action during the month. Liberty is 337-267-2 (.557) all-time in program history during March.

Liberty finished its February schedule with a 3-3 mark. The Flames were scheduled to play nine games in the month, but had three canceled due to inclement weather. Liberty has an all-time mark of 64-32 in February.

The Last Time Out

After getting out of a bases loaded, no out jam in the sixth without allowing a run, the Flames scored twice in the seventh to break a 1-1 tie, en route to a 4-3 victory at VMI, Sunday in Big South Conference action.

Second Best Start in Liberty History

Through the first 29 games of the season, the Flames have posted a 21-8 overall record to tie for the second-best start to a season in the 36-year history of Liberty baseball.

Jim Toman's team's record ties them with six other Flames squads. The 2006, 1995, 1983, 1981, 1980 and 1979 Liberty teams all had 21-8 marks through 29 contests.

The 1995 Flames have the best start through the first 29 games of the season in Liberty history, starting 22-7. Head Coach Johnny Hunton's team went on to post a 33-20 mark.

Strong Big South Start

With two conference wins this past weekend, the Flames are off to their best conference start since 1998 at 9-2. Liberty is tied atop the Big South standings with Winthrop. Both the Flames and Eagles have recorded nine victories each.

The start is the second best Big South start in program history. Liberty started Big South play in 1992. The 2009 Flames current mark of 9-2 ties them with the 1995 Liberty squad under Dave Pastors, who also started their conference season at 9-2.

Pastors' 1998 club recorded the best Big South start by a Flames team, running out to an 11-2 mark to begin their conference season.

Making the Most of an Opportunity

Doug Bream made the most of an opportunity to break into the Liberty line-up and has now established himself as a everyday starter.

Since receiving his first start of the year on March 6, the sophomore has hit .458 with 26 RBIs and scoring 21 runs. He also has posted the Flames highest slugging percentage, .719, with five home runs and 10 doubles.

In 22 starts since, Bream has occupied four different positions in the Liberty line-up, playing right field, left field and first baseman, while also serving as the designated hitter. His hitting has upped his overall batting average to .444, tops in the Big South Conference.

Bream Named Big South Player of the Week

Liberty freshman third baseman Tyler Bream has been selected as the Big South Conference Choice Hotels Baseball Player of the Week for March 30.

Bream batted .467 (7-15) and drove in 10 runs to help Liberty post a 4-0 mark last week and move atop the Big South standings. He started the week with three hits, three RBIs, two doubles and four runs in the Flames' win at North Carolina State on Tuesday. On Friday against Presbyterian, Bream walked with the bases loaded to force in the winning run, and the next day against the Blue Hose, Bream drove in both Liberty runs in a 2-1 victory. Sunday, the freshman had his second three-hit game of the week and hit his first collegiate grand slam to complete the sweep of Presbyterian. On the week, Bream slugged .800, had a .556 on-base percentage, scored six runs and walked three times. He also has 23 RBIs in his last 10 games.

Bream is the second Flame selected as the Big South Player of the Week this season. Center fielder Curran Redal was named the conference's player of the week for March 16.

Streaks Help Flames March Through March

Two winning streaks propelled Liberty to a 16-3 record in March. The Flames began the third month of the year with a seven-game winning streak, March 6-13. After two setbacks, Liberty went on a nine-game winning skein, March 18-30, its longest of the season.

The nine-game streak ties the 2009 Flames with the 2008, 2006, 1995 and 1985 clubs for the most consecutive wins in a season during the program's Division I era. The 1976 Liberty team holds the school record for the longest win streak in the history of the program with a 12-game streak.

Mashing in March

After going 3-3 to begin the season, the Flames went 16-3 in the month of March, keyed by their hitting.

Over its last 19 games, Liberty hit .356 as a team, and scored 10.2 runs per game. This month's hitting outburst raised the Flames' batting average for the season 88 points, to .326.

During the stretch, Liberty enjoyed a power burst too. The Flames hit 31 home runs and boasted a .563 slugging percentage over the month's 19 games.

Flames Sweep Blue Hose In First-Ever Series

Liberty hit five home runs, propelling the Flames to a 14-7 victory over Presbyterian, and a sweep of its three-game series with the Blue Hose, March 29 at Worthington Stadium. The series was the first-ever between the Flames and Big South newcomer Blue Hose.

Third baseman Tyler Bream hit his first collegiate grand slam in the third inning, while outfielders Curran Redal and Doug Bream connected for back-to-back home runs in the fifth. Catcher Errol Hollinger and Trey Wimmer also hit four-baggers for the Flames.

Redal's round tripper was his fourth of the season, while Doug Bream's was his fifth of the year. It is the second time this season, the Flames have hit back-to-back home runs in a contest. Hollinger and outfielder Casey Brown hit back-to-back home runs in the fifth inning of an 11-1 victory over Temple on March 7.

Liberty starter Shawn Teufel improved to 3-1 on the season. The left-hander gave up four runs on seven hits, striking out six in six innings of work.

The two prior days, March 28-27, Liberty receiving strong pitching efforts from right-hander Mark Swanson and left-hander Steven Evans in posting identical 2-1 wins in each game. On March 28th, Swanson pitched eight complete innings to run his record to 4-0 on the year. Reliever Carter Browning earned his second save with a scoreless ninth. Tyler Bream single home the only runs Liberty needed in the fourth inning for a 2-1 victory, as the two Flames' hurlers combined to retire the last 13 Presbyterian.

In the first-ever meeting between the two squads in the series opener, March 27, Evans went the distance in his second-straight start to run his season record to 4-0. The left-hander gave up one run on six hits, striking out five.

Trailing 1-0 in the ninth, the Flames rallied to win. Center fielder Curran Redal singled to open the frame and scored on a double by right fielder Doug Bream. After the next two batters were intentionally walked, Tyler Bream walked with the bases loaded, forcing in Doug Bream with the winning run.

Season-High 23 Hits at N.C. State

The Liberty Flames banged out a season-high 23 hits, leading from start to finish, en route to a 17-5 victory over the N.C. State Wolfpack, March 25 at Doak Field.

The Flames collected 23 hits in the contest, the most by Jim Toman's team this season. The hit total eclipses the 18 hits Toman's squad had on three other occasions earlier this year.

Center fielder Curran Redal and first baseman Trey Wimmer paced the Flames at the plate with four hits each. Tyler Bream, Errol Hollinger and Jeff Jefferson added three hits apiece for Liberty. Wimmer had four RBIs in the contest, while Jefferson hit his fourth home run.

Mark Swanson, the second Liberty pitcher in the contest, picked up the win to run his record to 3-0 on the year. The right-hander pitched 2 1/3 scoreless innings, giving up one hit and striking out three.

The contest marked the return of Toman to his alma mater as a head coach. The Liberty skipper was a four-year letterwinner in baseball with the Wolfpack from 1981-84.

Hollinger On Johnny Bench Watch List

Liberty senior catcher Errol Hollinger has been listed on the 2009 Coleman Company-Johnny Bench Watch List. The award is given annually to the top Division I collegiate catcher. The initial list includes 44 catchers nominated for the award by their coaches.

Hollinger, a native of Upland, Calif., is a four-year starter at the position for the Flames. He entered the season named on the 2009 Brooks Wallace Watch list. The award is given to the top collegiate player each season.

He enters Friday's contest with a team-leading seven home runs. So far on the year, Hollinger is hitting .355 with 18 RBIs and 23 runs scored over 26 games. He has also added five doubles.

Last season, the Liberty catcher finished among the Big South leaders in runs scored (6th - 60), hits (7th - 82), RBIs (tied 8th - 47), doubles (tied 5th - 19) and total bases (tied 7th - 127). On the defensive side, he led the conference in runners caught stealing with 26 and fewest passed balls with four.

The senior hit .319 with eight home runs and a .494 slugging percentage in 62 games in 2008. He led the Flames by hitting in 21-straight games, the longest hitting streak by a Liberty player last season. Hollinger also led Liberty in both multiple-hit games (26) and multiple-RBI games (15). The catcher was selected to the Big South all-conference second team at the end of the season.

Many New Faces

The Liberty Flames have 18 new members on their roster in 2009. Over fifty percent of Liberty's roster consists of first-year players. Of the first-year players, six are transfers, 10 are freshmen and two are sophomores.

Junior outfielder Curran Redal, freshman shortstop Matt Williams and freshman third baseman Tyler Bream are all first-year players who have started all 26 games this season for Liberty.

The Flames started four freshmen on the infield on various occasions throughout the season. The infield combination has been used nine times this season. This combination was used again, last Thursday at Longwood. Trey Wimmer manned first base, Kizuku Scott started at second base, Bream played third base and Williams started at shortstop.

Redal Tabbed Big South Player of the Week

Liberty junior outfielder Curran Redal was selected as the Big South Conference Choice Hotels Baseball Player of the Week for games played March 9-16.

Redal helped Liberty post a 3-1 record during the week, with a .500 batting average (5-10), .684 on-base percentage and a .900 slugging percentage. The junior scored five runs, knocked in seven runs, doubled, homered, walked six times and was 3-3 in stolen bases. Redal enters the week on a 10-game hit streak, hitting .500 over the stretch.

The center fielder slugged a home run and walked twice in Liberty's 6-3 victory over Duke, March 10, and had two hits and two RBIs in the Flames' win over William & Mary, March 11. In two games March 13-15, he collected two hits and three RBIs in Liberty's two games against Charleston Southern.

The freshman third baseman's nine RBIs tied the school mark set by former Flame standout Pat Sipe, who recorded nine RBIs in a 13-2 win over Richmond on April 19, 1986, at Worthington Stadium.

Tyler Bream went 3-for-4 with four runs scored to go along with his nine RBIs for the Flames. Catcher Errol Hollinger went 3-for-3 with three RBIs and a run scored.

Over the next eight games, the Liberty bats heated up, as Jim Toman's squad ran off seven consecutive victories to begin its longest homestand of the season. The Flames ended up finishing their homestand, 7-1.

During the first homestand of the 2009 season at Worthington Stadium, the Flames hit .360, averaging 11.13 runs per game. Liberty posted double-digit hit totals in five of the eight contests. With the red-hot hitting, the Flames raised their team batting average 73 points during the span to .308.

In addition, Liberty had a .610 slugging percentage over the eight-game stretch, banging out 42 extra base hits - 26 doubles, 1 triple and 15 home runs.

In two of the contests, the Flames scored a season-high 18 runs, defeating Temple in the first game of a doubleheader, March 7, 18-9, and William & Mary, March 11, 18-13. Also, Liberty hit two or more home runs in each of the first five games at Worthington Stadium this season. The streak ended March 11, when Liberty hit only one round tripper in its win over the Tribe. The Flames ended up hitting a home run in every game of the home stand, except the final contest of the homestand March 15 against Charleston Southern.

Four-game Sweep of Temple

Liberty hit 11 home runs and banded out 16 doubles, scoring 56 runs, during a four-game sweep of the Temple Owls, March 6-8.

In their home opener, March 6, Flames third baseman Tyler Bream drove in four runs and three teammates, Cody Brown, Doug Bream and Trey Wimmer, each hit home runs in a 12-2 win. Left-hander Steven Evans ran his mark to 1-0, allowing two runs, one earned, on seven hits over 6 2/3 innings in the contest.

The following afternoon, the Flames swept a doubleheader from the Owls, 18-9 and 11-1. Liberty hit four home runs in game one, including a pinch hit grand slam by Doug Bream in the win. The four home runs were the most in a game by the Flames since they hit four round trippers in a 28-7 victory over Richmond on Feb. 18 at Riley Park in Charleston, S.C., during the Crab House Shootout.

Doug Bream hit the first pitch he saw as a pinch hitter with the bases loaded in the fifth inning for his second career grand slam. The first baseman/outfielder hit his other grand slam on March 8, 2008 in an 11-5 win over Army. Two other pinch hitters, Justin Richardson and Kizuku Scott, each hit their first collegiate home runs in the game, while Jeff Jefferson hit his third round tripper of the year in the victory.

The power display made a winner of right-hander Mark Swanson, who ran his record to 2-0 on the year. The junior did not allow a earned run in 6 2/3 innings in his second start in a Liberty uniform.

In the nightcap, catcher Errol Hollinger and right fielder Casey Brown connected for back-to-back home runs in the fifth inning, propelling Liberty to an 11-1 victory. Center fielder Curran Redal also added a home run in the contest for the Flames, helping to make a winner of left-hander Shawn Teufel (1-0).

It was the first time Liberty batters hit back-to-back home runs in a game since Hollinger and former Flame David Giammaresi launched back-to-back round trippers at Raymond "Hap" Spuhler Field during a six-run fourth inning, en route to an 18-4 win over George Mason on April 25, 2006.

On March 8, the Flames rallied from a 6-1 deficit after two innings of play for a 15-11 win and a series sweep. First baseman Trey Wimmer paced Liberty with four hits, scoring two runs and driving in two more. Jefferson, Doug Bream, shortstop Matt Williams and infielder P.J. Jimenez each had two hits for Liberty. Jimenez also hit his first home run in a Liberty uniform in the win. Carter Browning picked up his first victory for the Flames, with 4 2/3 innings of relief. Austin Poretz earned his first collegiate save by pitching the last three frames.
