The Games

The Liberty Flames (23-12, 11-3 Big South) host the conference-leading Winthrop Eagles (24-12, 12-3 Big South) in a key Big South three-game series, Friday-Sunday at Worthington Stadium. The series gets underway Friday at 7 p.m., followed by the middle game of the three-game set, Saturday at 4 p.m. The series concludes Sunday, with game time scheduled for 1 p.m.

What to Watch

The Flames begin the weekend one game behind in the Big South standings with an 11-3 record. Liberty's current mark is tied for the best start by a Flames team in conference play.

Liberty enters the weekend hitting .325 as team in conference play, while the Flames mound staff has posted a 4.75 ERA through 14 Big South Conference contests.

Curran Redal paces the Liberty with a .422 batting average. He leads the conference in hits with 57 and is second in batting average. On Tuesday, the junior center fielder tied the Big South record for consecutive games with at least one hit, when he singled in the first inning for at least a one hit in 31 straight games.

Left-handers Steven Evans and Shawn Teufel, who will start games this weekend for Liberty, each have posted a team-high five wins. Last Friday, Teufel struck out nine in a win over UNC Asheville, the most by a Flames pitcher this season.

Winthrop brings a Big South leading 12 victories into the series this weekend. The Eagles are hitting .338 in conference, while their pitchers open the three-game set with a 3.25 ERA in Big South play.

First baseman Eddie Tisdale, who is among the conference leaders in several offensive categories, leads Winthrop with a .393 batting average. He also is the Eagle leader in RBIs with 37.

Third baseman Matt Thielepape earned Big South Player of the Week honors this week, batting .684 (13-19) with four home runs and six RBI in games played from April 6-12. On the season, he is one of nine Eagles hitting .300 or better, with a .355 average.

Head Coach Jim Toman

**Record at Liberty: 58-38-1 (Second Year)
Career Record: Same**

After a solid campaign in his first year as Liberty's head coach, Jim Toman enters his second season at the helm of the program.

Last season, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish the season with a 35-26-1 mark, making Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's 36-year history. Toman guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by a Flames team, as Liberty won 30 or more games in a season for the fourth consecutive year for the first time in program history.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks this past summer. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty batters eclipsed the school's single-season doubles mark, ripping 155 two-base hits. The total ranked the Flames fifth in the country in the category. Liberty hitters also set a program record for hit by pitch.

The Flames finished their season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed Liberty to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. The Flames went on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman is the sixth head coach in the 34-year history of the Liberty Baseball program. The second-year skipper comes to Liberty after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 19-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball. Toman's 2003, 2005 and 2006 classes were named the top recruiting classes by the publication.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

In addition, South Carolina posted eight-straight seasons of 40 or more wins with Toman on the Gamecock coaching staff, including 2007. During Toman's 11 seasons at South Carolina, he helped the Gamecocks to a combined 500-220 (.694) record.

Toman earned four baseball letters at N.C. State, 1981-84, and was captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in vocational industrial education in 1985. He received a Master of Science degree in sport management from N.C. State in 1995.

Upon graduation, Toman entered the coaching profession as an assistant at Richmond County High School in Rockingham, N.C., for two years. He moved into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989 as an assistant at Florida International for one year. At FIU, he was responsible for the weight program, worked with the squad's catchers and coached first base. Toman joined the N.C. State staff before the 1990 season.

The Coaches

Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman is in his second year at the helm of the Flames. In this first season at Liberty, he guided the Flames to a 35-26-1 mark, the best record by a Liberty team under a first-year coach in program history. This season, he got the Flames off to the second-best start in the history of Liberty baseball through 29 games.

A 20-year member of the college coaching ranks, he served 18 years as a member of Ray Tanner's staffs at South Carolina and N.C. State. Toman was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball.

During his time in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three-consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

Winthrop Head Coach Joe Hudak is in his 26th year of collegiate baseball coaching. The Eagles skipper has posted over 800 career wins and is the Big South leader in that department with 827. Only 27 active college baseball coaches have 800 or more wins in their career.

Hudak has led 15 teams to 30 or more wins during his coaching tenure. He has coached six teams to 40 or more victories, including the 1995, 1999, 2001, 2005 and the 2006 Eagles team that posted a 46-18 mark. The 2006 Winthrop team finished second at the NCAA Regional in Chapel Hill, NC.

Following the Flames

This season, the Flames Sports Network plans to broadcast several Liberty baseball regular season games. Games will air live on WWMC 90.9 FM "The Light" and on the World Wide Web at both LibertyFlames.com and thelightonline.com. The schedule of games will be posted on thelightonline.com, when the radio station announces its broadcast schedule.

In addition, selected games will be video streamed live on the internet via the Big South Edge, available on BigSouthSports.com. The stream can be accessed for a nominal fee through a link on LibertyFlames.com or by going directly to BigSouthSports.com.

Each game of this weekend's three-game series between the Eagles and Flames is scheduled for web cast.

Flames at Worthington Stadium

For the past 31 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium home. With an 11-4 victory over UNC Asheville in the second game of a doubleheader last Saturday, Liberty won its 500th contest at the stadium. Liberty has compiled an impressive 500-227-5 record at the facility for a winning percentage of .686 since the stadium's inception in 1979.

The Flames have posted a 14-3 record at the facility this season, already eclipsing last season's home win total of 11. Liberty is scheduled to play 25 games at home this season.

Last year, the Flames played 24 home games at the stadium, posting an 11-12-1 record at Worthington. The slate of home games included the first night contests in the history of the stadium. The first night contest ever at the stadium was played on March 28, 2008.

Liberty on the Road

Liberty is 8-8 on the road this season. The Flames are also 1-1 on neutral fields.

The Flames completed their 2008 road schedule, posting a 15-8 road record and a 9-6 neutral field mark. The Flames' 15 road victories were the most by a Liberty club in program history. Liberty's .652 road winning percentage was its best road mark since 1980, when the Flames went 9-2 on the road for an .818 percentage.

Liberty at Night

Liberty is 4-3 at night this season. The Flames are currently scheduled to play 15 games under the lights in 2009. The next night game for Liberty is next Friday at Worthington against Winthrop.

Liberty finished the 2008 campaign with an 8-4 mark at night. The Flames closed out the year by winning six out of their last seven night contests. Since 2004, Liberty has gone 18-25 under artificial lighting.

Flames By the Month

Liberty is 4-6 during the month of April. However, the Flames have posted a 4-2 record in Big South Conference play in the month.

Jim Toman's squad is scheduled to play 19 games in the month this season. Since 1976, the Flames have recorded an all-time mark of 327-280-1 (.539) in April.

The Flames posted a 16-3 (.842) overall mark and started 7-1 in Big South play during the month of March. Last season, the Flames posted a 7-12 overall mark and a 1-2 record in conference action during the month. Liberty is 337-267-2 (.557) all-time in program history during March.

Liberty finished its February schedule with a 3-3 mark. The Flames were scheduled to play nine games in the month, but had three canceled due to inclement weather. Liberty has an all-time mark of 64-32 in February.

Flames All-Time Against Winthrop

Friday night's contest between Winthrop and Liberty will be the 61st meeting since 1981, the first year the two teams met on the baseball diamond.

The Eagles hold a slim 32-28 lead, as the two teams split a four games last season.

Winthrop took a three-game series from the Flames in Rock Hill, S. C., at the Winthrop Ballpark, April 25-27. The Eagles took the opener and the finale of the series, 10-5 and 8-7, with the Flames winning the middle game, 7-6. Later in the year, Liberty defeated the No. 4 seed Winthrop, 15-3, to advance to the Big South Baseball Championship title game, May 23 at Dan Daniel Memorial Park in Danville, Va.

The Last Time Out

Liberty outfielder Curran Redal tied the Big South Conference record for consecutive games with a hit, singling in the first inning, as the Flames fell to the Old Dominion Monarchs, 7-2, Tuesday afternoon at Worthington Stadium.

In the bottom of the first inning, Redal tied the Big South record for consecutive games with hit when he lined a single to right field giving the Liberty center fielder at least one base knock for the 31st straight contest. The Flames center fielder ties the previous standard set by UNC Asheville shortstop Kevin Weidenbacher last season.

Designated hitter Cody Brown hit a home run for Liberty. First baseman Trey Wimmer and P.J. Jimenez each had two hits for the Flames.

Redal Ties Big South Consecutive Game Hit Mark

Liberty center fielder Curran Redal enters Friday's game, having had at least one hit in 31 consecutive games. The streak ties the Big South record for consecutive games with a hit, set last season by UNC Asheville shortstop Kevin Weidenbacher.

Redal sharply singled to right field in the first inning of Tuesday's game at Worthington Stadium against Old Dominion to reach 31 to tie him with Weidenbacher.

During the streak, the junior has hit .455, collecting 55 hits in 121 at bats. He has also driven in all 39 of his season's RBI total over the span.

Best Big South Start

With two conference wins last weekend, the Flames are off to their best conference start since 1998 with an 11-3 record. Liberty is one game behind Winthrop in the Big South standings.

The start by the current Flames ties the squad with the 1998 and 1995 Liberty teams. Both teams also started Big South conference play with an 11-3 record.

Recognizing Redal

Liberty outfielder Curran Redal entered the week among the national and Big South leaders in several categories. In the latest Big South Conference statistical report, the junior led the conference in hits with 56 and total bases with 87. The center fielder ranks second in the league with a .427 average, third with 39 RBIs and second with a .664 slugging percentage.

In addition, Redal ranked among the national elite in several categories in the national statistical report for games through April 12. On this week's report, he was the fourth toughest hitter to strike out in the country, striking out once every 32.8 at bats. His hit total placed him 24th in the nation (56) and his batting average (.427) ranked him 38th.

Redal begins the week, having collected at least one hit in 31 consecutive games. During the span, he has hit .455. The center fielder leads the Flames with 13 multiple RBI games. In addition, he was named Big South Player of the Week for games played March 9-13.

Taking One for the Team

Entering play this weekend, Liberty batters have been hit by a pitch 74 times this season. Flame batters have been plunked by an opposition an average of 2.1 times per game. Liberty ranked second in the nation in the category as a team in the latest NCAA Division I statistical report through games of April 5.

This year, Flames batters have been hit by a pitch seven times in a game twice to set a new school standard. Temple pitchers hit seven Liberty hitters on March 7 and High Point hurlers plunked seven Flames on March 22.

Last season, the Flames set a new school record by being hit by a pitch 82. The mark eclipsed the previous standard of 75 in the 2001 season.

Fine Fielding

Beginning the week, Jim Toman's squad ranked No. 11 in the nation in fielding percentage with a .976 percentage. The percentage tops the Big South Conference. Liberty has committed 32 errors in 1342 chances this season.

The Flames fielding percentage is 18 points higher than that the same juncture of the year, last season. Through 35 games, Liberty made 59 errors, 27 more than this year, in 1390 chances for a .958 fielding percentage in 2008. The Flames ended the year with a .963 percentage.

The best team fielding percentage over a season in school history was set by the 2005 Flames. That season, Liberty posted a .971 fielding percentage and also committed the fewest errors in school history with 62.

Teufel Strikes Out Season-High

Liberty left-hander Shawn Teufel struck out nine UNC Asheville batters in a 9-0 win over the Bulldogs in the opening game of their three-game Big South series, last Friday. Teufel's nine strikeouts were the most in a game this season by a Liberty pitcher and was a career-high for the left-hander.

Teufel pitched seven scoreless innings, giving up two hits. He combined with Carter Browning and Chris McDougal to pitch the first shutout for the Flames this season.

Third baseman Tyler Bream and center fielder Curran Redal each hit a home run in the contest. Both players had two hits apiece in the contest. Bream had three RBIs for Liberty.

Liberty Takes Series From VMI

The Liberty Flames broke a 1-1 tie in the seventh inning with two runs, and then held on for a 4-3 victory over the VMI Keydets, 4-3, April 5 in Big South Conference action at Gray/Minor Stadium. With the win, the Flames took the three-game series, two games to one.

In the bottom of the sixth inning, VMI loaded the bases with no one out. However, after being summoned from the bullpen, Liberty reliever Andrew Wilson induced three consecutive ground balls, which resulted in force outs at home plate, preventing the Keydets from scoring.

After getting out of the bases loaded jam in the previous inning, the Flames broke the deadlock on the score board with two runs.

Wilson picked up the win to run his record to 4-1 on the year. The right-hander allowed two runs on two hits over three innings of work. Carter Browning recorded his third save of the season with the perfect ninth for Liberty.

Flames left fielder Doug Bream led all hitters on the afternoon with three hits. Catcher Errol Hollinger had two more hits for Liberty.

On April 4, center fielder Curran Redal drove in four runs with three hits, helping lead the Flames past the Keydets, 9-7, rebounding from a setback on Friday.

Redal had three hits and drove in four runs in the victory for Liberty. Shortstop Matt Williams, Hollinger, outfielder Casey Brown and P.J. Jimenez added two hits each for the Flames.

Liberty starter Shawn Teufel ran his record to 4-1 on the year, after pitching the first six innings for the Flames. The left-hander allowed six runs, five earned, on six hits. Bream Named Big South Player of the Week

Liberty freshman third baseman Tyler Bream has been selected as the Big South Conference Choice Hotels Baseball Player of the Week for March 30.

Bream batted .467 (7-15) and drove in 10 runs to help Liberty post a 4-0 mark last week and move atop the Big South standings. He started the week with three hits, three RBIs, two doubles and four runs in the Flames' win at North Carolina State on Tuesday. On Friday against Presbyterian, Bream walked with the bases loaded to force in the winning run, and the next day against the Blue Hose, Bream drove in both Liberty runs in a 2-1 victory. Sunday, the freshman had his second three-hit game of the week and hit his first collegiate grand slam to complete the sweep of Presbyterian. On the week, Bream slugged .800, had a .556 on-base percentage, scored six runs and walked three times. He also has 23 RBIs in his last 10 games.

Streaks Help Flames March Through March

Two winning streaks propelled Liberty to a 16-3 record in March. The Flames began the third month of the year with a seven-game winning streak, March 6-13. After two setbacks, Liberty went on a nine-game winning skein, March 18-30, its longest of the season.

The nine-game streak ties the 2009 Flames with the 2008, 2006, 1995 and 1985 clubs for the most consecutive wins in a season during the program's Division I era. The 1976 Liberty team holds the school record for the longest win streak in the history of the program with a 12-game streak.

Mashing in March

After going 3-3 to begin the season, the Flames went 16-3 in the month of March, keyed by their hitting.

Over its last 19 games, Liberty hit .356 as a team, and scored 10.2 runs per game. This month's hitting outburst raised the Flames' batting average for the season 88 points, to .326.

During the stretch, Liberty enjoyed a power burst too. The Flames hit 31 home runs and boasted a .563 slugging percentage over the month's 19 games.

Flames Sweep Blue Hose In First-Ever Series

Liberty hit five home runs, propelling the Flames to a 14-7 victory over Presbyterian, and a sweep of its three-game series with the Blue Hose, March 29 at Worthington Stadium. The series was the first-ever between the Flames and Big South newcomer Blue Hose.

Third baseman Tyler Bream hit his first collegiate grand slam in the third inning, while outfielders Curran Redal and Doug Bream connected for back-to-back home runs in the fifth. Catcher Errol Hollinger and Trey Wimmer also hit four-baggers for the Flames.

Redal's round tripper was his fourth of the season, while Doug Bream's was his fifth of the year. It is the second time this season, the Flames have hit back-to-back home runs in a contest. Hollinger and outfielder Casey Brown hit back-to-back home runs in the fifth inning of an 11-1 victory over Temple on March 7.

Liberty starter Shawn Teufel improved to 3-1 on the season. The left-hander gave up four runs on seven hits, striking out six in six innings of work.

The two prior days, March 28-27, Liberty receiving strong pitching efforts from right-hander Mark Swanson and left-hander Steven Evans in posting identical 2-1 wins in each game. On March 28th, Swanson pitched eight complete innings to run his record to 4-0 on the year. Reliever Carter Browning earned his second save with a scoreless ninth. Tyler Bream single home the only runs Liberty needed in the fourth inning for a 2-1 victory, as the two Flames' hurlers combined to retire the last 13 Presbyterian.

In the first-ever meeting between the two squads in the series opener, March 27, Evans went the distance in his second-straight start to run his season record to 4-0. The left-hander gave up one run on six hits, striking out five.

Trailing 1-0 in the ninth, the Flames rallied to win. Center fielder Curran Redal singled to open the frame and scored on a double by right fielder Doug Bream. After the next two batters were intentionally walked, Tyler Bream walked with the bases loaded, forcing in Doug Bream with the winning run.

The Liberty Flames banged out a season-high 23 hits, leading from start to finish, en route to a 17-5 victory over the N.C. State Wolfpack, March 25 at Doak Field.

The Flames collected 23 hits in the contest, the most by Jim Toman's team this season. The hit total eclipses the 18 hits Toman's squad had on three other occasions earlier this year.

Center fielder Curran Redal and first baseman Trey Wimmer paced the Flames at the plate with four hits each. Tyler Bream, Errol Hollinger and Jeff Jefferson added three hits apiece for Liberty. Wimmer had four RBIs in the contest, while Jefferson hit his fourth home run.

Mark Swanson, the second Liberty pitcher in the contest, picked up the win to run his record to 3-0 on the year. The right-hander pitched 2 1/3 scoreless innings, giving up one hit and striking out three.

The contest marked the return of Toman to his alma mater as a head coach. The Liberty skipper was a four-year letterwinner in baseball with the Wolfpack from 1981-84.

Hollinger On Johnny Bench Watch List

Liberty senior catcher Errol Hollinger has been listed on the 2009 Coleman Company-Johnny Bench Watch List. The award is given annually to the top Division I collegiate catcher. The initial list includes 44 catchers nominated for the award by their coaches.

Hollinger, a native of Upland, Calif., is a four-year starter at the position for the Flames. He entered the season named on the 2009 Brooks Wallace Player of the Year Watch list.

The senior enters Friday's contest with a team-leading seven home runs. The four-baggers rank him fourth in the Big South Conference. Hollinger is hitting .315 with 20 RBIs and 23 runs scored in 35 starts. He has also added nine doubles.

Last season, the Liberty catcher finished among the Big South leaders in runs scored (6th - 60), hits (7th - 82), RBIs (tied 8th - 47), doubles (tied 5th - 19) and total bases (tied 7th - 127). On the defensive side, he led the conference in runners caught stealing with 26 and fewest passed balls with four.

The senior hit .319 with eight home runs and a .494 slugging percentage in 62 games in 2008. He led the Flames by hitting in 21-straight games, the longest hitting streak by a Liberty player last season. Hollinger also led Liberty in both multiple-hit games (26) and multiple-RBI games (15). The catcher was selected to the Big South all-conference second team at the end of the season.

Redal Tabbed Big South Player of the Week

Liberty junior outfielder Curran Redal was selected as the Big South Conference Choice Hotels Baseball Player of the Week for games played March 9-16.

Redal helped Liberty post a 3-1 record during the week, with a .500 batting average (5-10), .684 on-base percentage and a .900 slugging percentage. The junior scored five runs, knocked in seven runs, doubled, homered, walked six times and was 3-3 in stolen bases. Redal enters the week on a 10-game hit streak, hitting .500 over the stretch.

The center fielder slugged a home run and walked twice in Liberty's 6-3 victory over Duke, March 10, and had two hits and two RBIs in the Flames' win over William & Mary, March 11. In two games March 13-15, he collected two hits and three RBIs in Liberty's two games against Charleston Southern.

With a run-scoring single in seventh inning, Bream tied the Liberty record for RBIs in a game with nine. The freshman third baseman's nine RBIs tied the school mark set by former Flame standout Pat Sipe, who recorded nine RBIs in a 13-2 win over Richmond on April 19, 1986, at Worthington Stadium.

Bream went 3-for-4 with four runs scored to go along with his nine RBIs for the Flames. Catcher Errol Hollinger went 3-for-3 with three RBIs and a run scored.
