The Games

The Liberty Flames (0-0, 0-0 Big South) travel to Mobile, Ala., to start their 2009 campaign and the program's 36th year at the Coca-Cola Classic, Feb. 20-22 at Stanky Field. Liberty will open its season, Friday, against the No. 12 Ole Miss Rebels (0-0, 0-0 SEC) at 2 p.m. The following day, the Flames will play two contests, at noon and 7 p.m., against the tournament host South Alabama Jaguars (0-0,0-0 Sun Belt). Liberty will conclude the weekend tournament by facing the Mercer Bears (0-0, 0-0 A-Sun) at 11 a.m. Sunday.

What to Watch

After posting a 35-26-1 mark in 2008, Liberty will attempt to get out to a fast start in 2009 with seven new faces in the starting line-up. The Flames' starting nine returns catcher Errol Hollinger, infielder Cody Brown and outfielder Jeff Jefferson from last year's line-up. Hollinger, who will start behind the plate for the fourth consecutive season, has been named to the 2009 Brooks Wallace Player of the Year Watch list. Liberty's Friday starter, Dustin Umberger, led the Big South Conference in strikeouts and was second in wins in 2008. The senior right-hander was voted by conference coaches as one of the top pitchers in the Big South (College Baseball Insider) entering 2009.

Friday's opponent Ole Miss is ranked No. 12 in the nation and comes off its sixth straight NCAA Regional appearance in 2008. The Rebels posted a 39-26 record in 2008 and advanced to the championship game of the SEC Tournament for the second time in three seasons. Returning for Ole Miss is a bevy of players, highlighted by right-handed pitcher Scott Bittle, catcher Brett Basham and outfielder Logan Power. Bittle is a pre-season All-America selection and candidate for the Brooks Wallace Award, while Basham was the top defensive catcher in the SEC last season and Power is the top returning hitter for the Rebels.

Host South Alabama returns five starters from last season's 32-26 team. Like Liberty, the Jaguars are led by a catcher. Senior David Doss has been named to the Sun Belt Conference's pre-season all-conference team. The catcher, along with returning first baseman Ryan Bohanan, each hit over .325 in 2008.

Mercer returns five starters from 2008's 24-33 team. Among the Bears' returners are outfielder Joe Winkler, who was an A-Sun all-conference selection and Mercer's leading hitter last season, and senior pitcher Dan April, who had a 2.70 ERA and 55 strikeouts in 70 innings pitched in 2008.

Head Coach Jim Toman

**Record at Liberty: 35-26-1 (One Year)
Career Record: Same**

After a solid campaign in his first year as Liberty's head coach, Jim Toman enters his second season at the helm of the program.

Last season, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish the season with a 35-26-1 mark, making Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's 35-year history. Toman guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by a Flames team, as Liberty won 30 or more games in a season for the fourth consecutive year for the first time in program history.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks this past summer. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty batters eclipsed the school's single-season doubles mark, ripping 155 two-base hits. The total ranked the Flames fifth in the country in the category. Liberty hitters also set a program record for hit by pitch.

The Flames finished their season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed Liberty to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. The Flames went on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman is the sixth head coach in the 34-year history of the Liberty Baseball program. The second-year skipper comes to Liberty after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 19-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball. Toman's 2003, 2005 and 2006 classes were named the top recruiting classes by the publication.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

In addition, South Carolina posted eight-straight seasons of 40 or more wins with Toman on the Gamecock coaching staff, including 2007. During Toman's 11 seasons at South Carolina, he helped the Gamecocks to a combined 500-220 (.694) record.

Toman earned four baseball letters at N.C.State, 1981-84, and was captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in vocational industrial education in 1985. He received a Master of Science degree in sport management from N.C. State in 1995.

Upon graduation, Toman entered the coaching profession as an assistant at Richmond County High School in Rockingham, N.C., for two years. He moved into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989 as an assistant at Florida International for one year. At FIU, he was responsible for the weight program, worked with the squad's catchers and coached first base. Toman joined the N.C. State staff before the 1990 season.

The Coaches

Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman is in his second year at the helm of the Flames. In this first season at Liberty, he guided the Flames to a 35-26-1 mark, the best record by a Liberty team under a first-year coach in program history.

A 20-year member of the college coaching ranks, he served 18 years as a member of Ray Tanner's staffs at South Carolina and N.C. State. Toman was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball.

During his time in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three-consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

Ole Miss Head Coach Mike Bianco begins his ninth season with the Rebels. In eight seasons, he has guided Ole Miss to seven post-season appearances in eight years, including hosting four-straight regionals and playing in three-straight Super Regionals in 2005, 2006 and 2007.

Last season, Bianco led the Rebels to a 39-26 record and a NCAA Regional appearance. Ole Miss has won 35 or more games each of Bianco's eight seasons in Oxford, and posted three-straight 40-win seasons, from 2005-2007, for the first time in school history.

South Alabama Head Coach Steve Kittrell heads into the 2009 season on the verge of history. In his 26 seasons of collegiate coaching, Kittrell has amassed 998 wins, two short from becoming the 50th NCAA coach to reach 1,000 wins. When the milestone happens, he will become the 37th Division I coach to reach 1,000. Among active coaches, he is in the Top 15 in all-time wins.

Kittrell, who returned to his alma mater in the summer of 1983, has led South Alabama to 18 NCAA Tournament appearances and 10 Sun Belt Conference championships. He has also directed the program to within one win of the College World Series six times. Last season, the Jaguars finished 32-26 under his guidance.

Mercer Head Coach Craig Gibson enters his sixth season with the Bears. Under his guidance, Mercer has experienced arguably some of its best seasons in the history of its program, posting above .500 marks in 2007 and 2006 for the first time since the 1982-83 seasons. Last season, the Bears went 24-33 and finished fifth in the Sun Belt Conference.

Most Victories by First-Year Coach at Liberty

With 35 wins in 2008, Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman became the winningest first-year coach in the program's history. Toman, the sixth head coach in the 35-year history of the Flames, led Liberty to a 35-26-1 mark in his first year, eclipsing the mark of Dave Pastors, the fourth head coach in program history. In 1998, his first season, Pastors led the Flames to a 32-29 record.

The Last Time Out

Liberty, the No. 2 seed, defeated No. 1 seed and nationally ranked Coastal Carolina, 13-2, for its fourth straight double-digit victory, forcing a second game on May 24, 2008 at the Big South Baseball Championship in Danville, Va. The Flames fell in the second contest, 9-2, to become the conference runner-up for the third consecutive season.

During the tournament, Liberty set a championship record for runs scored with 55 runs in six games.

All-Time Against Invitational Field

Friday will be the first-ever meeting between Liberty and Ole Miss on the baseball diamond. The last time, the Flames faced a SEC team was on Feb. 16, at the Crab House Shootout in Charleston, S.C. The South Carolina Gamecocks, who were ranked No.1 in the country at the time, defeated Liberty, 10-2.

On Saturday, the Flames and will meet host South Alabama twice. The morning contest will be the first meeting between the two squads. Liberty has not faced a Sun Belt team since the Flames shut out Florida International, 3-0, on Mar. 17, 1997 at the Homestead, Fla. Challenge.

On Sunday, Liberty will meet another first time opponent in the Mercer Bears. The last time the Flames met an Atlantic Sun Conference team, Liberty fell to Jacksonville, 5-1, on Mar. 13, 2001 in Jacksonville, Fla.

Flames at Worthington Stadium

For the past 29 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium their home. Liberty has compiled an impressive 486-224-5 record at the facility for a winning percentage of .683 since the stadium's inception in 1979.

Last year, the Flames played 24 home games at the stadium, posting an 11-12-1 record at Worthington. The slate of home games included the first night contests in the history of the stadium. March 28 was the first night contest ever at the stadium, and nine contests were played under the lights.

Liberty on the Road

Liberty completed its 2008 road schedule, posting a 15-8 road record and a 9-6 neutral field mark. The Flames' 15 road victories were the most by a Liberty club in program history. Liberty's .652 road winning percentage was its best road mark since 1980, when the Flames went 9-2 on the road for an .818 percentage.

Baseball in the Commonwealth

Thirteen Division I baseball teams call the Commonwealth of Virginia home. This season, the Flames are scheduled to face opponents from the "Old Dominion State" 20 times. Liberty posted a 13-13-1 record against instate opponents in 2008.

The Flames will meet state squads George Mason (two times), James Madison (three times), Longwood (one time), Old Dominion (two times), Radford (three times), VCU (one time), VMI (three times), Virginia (one time), Virginia Tech (two times) and William & Mary (two times) this season.

Liberty in Season Openers

Friday's contest against No. 12 Ole Miss will be Liberty's 34th season opener since 1976. The Flames have recorded a 23-10 record over the span.

Liberty has won four straight season openers, beginning with a 7-6 win over Old Dominion at Worthington Stadium on Feb. 15, 2005. Last season, the Flames defeated Notre Dame, 6-2, on Feb. 22 at the Clearwater Invitational in their season opening contest.

Since 2000, Liberty has a 7-2 mark in season openers.

Liberty at Night

Saturday night's meeting with the South Alabama Jaguars will be the first night contest of 2009 for the Flames. Liberty is currently scheduled to play 16 games under the lights this season, including the opener of a three-game series at Coastal Carolina on May 1, which will be televised by ESPNU.

Liberty Picked Second in Big South Preseason Poll

The Flames were tabbed by the Big South Coaches to finish second in the conference standings this season. Liberty was voted second, behind two-time defending champion Coastal Carolina.

The Flames, who were picked to finish atop the conference standings by two coaches, garnered 86 points in the poll, 11 less than Coastal Carolina. The Chanticleers received seven first place votes and 97 total points.

After last year's two Big South Championship finalists, Winthrop, who garnered the final first-place vote, was tabbed third by the panel, followed by VMI, Radford, High Point and conference newcomer Gardner-Webb. UNC Asheville, Charleston Southern and Presbyterian, another conference newcomer, rounded out the poll.

Presbyterian is eligible for the conference regular-season title, but not the Big South Championship title. The 2009 Big South Championship will be contested May 19-23 at McCormick Field in Asheville, N.C.

Hollinger Named to Brooks Wallace Player of the Year Watch List

Liberty senior catcher Errol Hollinger has been named to the preseason 2009 Brooks Wallace Player of the Year Award Watch List. The Wallace Award is presented annually to the nation's top collegiate baseball player, in conjunction with the College Baseball Hall of Fame's annual induction festivities.

Hollinger is listed among 204 collegiate players appearing on the preseason Wallace Watch list. It is the second straight year a Flame has appeared on the list. Last season, Garrett Young was named to the award's watch list.

This past season, Hollinger finished among the Big South leaders in runs scored (6th - 60), hits (7th - 82), RBIs (tied 8th - 47), doubles (tied 5th - 19) and total bases (tied 7th - 127). On the defensive side, he led the conference in runners caught stealing with 26 and fewest passed balls with four.

The senior hit .319 with eight home runs and a .494 slugging percentage in 62 games in 2008. He led the Flames by hitting in 21 straight games, the longest hitting streak by a Liberty player last season. Hollinger also led Liberty in both multiple-hit games (26) and multiple-RBI games. The catcher was selected to the Big South all-conference second team at the end of the season.

In a recent survey of Big South Coaches by CollegeBaseballInsider.com, Hollinger was voted the conference's best catcher. He also received honorable mention consideration on the 2009 Ping! Baseball Preseason team. The senior was also voted team captain by his teammates for the second consecutive year.

Umberger Among Flames' All-Time K Kings

Liberty senior right-hander Dustin Umberger enters 2009, his final season in a Flames uniform, already listed among the program's all-time leaders in strikeouts. The Hummelstown, Pa., native has struck out 189 batters over his first three seasons at Liberty to rank seventh on the school's career strikeout list. Mike Brown, who pitched at Liberty from 1994-97, holds the career strikeout mark with 287.

Voted as one of the three toughest pitchers to face in the conference by Big South head coaches in a recent poll by CollegeInsider.com, Umberger led the league with 88 strikeouts last season and tied for second with eight wins. The right-hander posted an 8-3 record with one save and a 3.80 ERA over 83 innings in 2008. He walked only 19 batters for a 4.6-to-1 strikeout to walk ratio. After starting the year in the bullpen, Umberger made nine starts, pitching two complete games and compiling a 6-1 record.

For the second year in a row, the right-hander was selected to the Big South All-Tournament team. On May 23, Umberger allowed two runs on six hits, striking out 10 in a complete game, 11-2 victory over Radford.

Many New Faces

The Liberty Flames will have 18 new members on their roster in 2009. Fifty percent of Liberty's roster will consist of first-year players. In addition, the Flames starting line-up will feature six new faces.

Of the first-year players, six are junior college transfers, 10 are freshmen and two are sophomores.

An Old Face in a New Place

Liberty senior Cody Brown moves from one corner of the infield to the other for his final season in a Flames uniform. The senior will move from third base, which he manned last season, to first base.

Last season, Brown started 55 games at third base for Liberty, and is the top returning hitter for the Flames from a year ago after posting a .341 batting average. He finished among the Big South leaders with 21 doubles (tied for third) and 52 RBIs (fifth), while leading the Flames with nine home runs. Brown also scored 46 runs.

The senior infielder finished 2008 in strong fashion by hitting .500 with nine runs and seven RBIs in six games in the Big South Championship to earn all-tournament honors. Brown also had four doubles, belted two home runs and had a .885 slugging percentage during the tournament.

Liberty-Coastal Carolina to battle on ESPNU

ESPNU, the 24-hour college sports network, has announced it will televise the opening contest of Liberty's three-game series at Coastal Carolina on May 1, live from Charles L. Watson Stadium.

The telecast, scheduled to begin at 6 p.m., will be a rematch of last year's Big South Championship title game. The two teams have met in the conference tournament final the last two seasons. It will be the first time Liberty has ever played on ESPNU.

Hollinger and Umberger Selected as Team Captains

Senior catcher Errol Hollinger and senior right-hander Dustin Umberger have been chosen as captains for the 2009 Liberty Baseball team. They were selected by virtue of a team vote, and the senior duo received overwhelming support from their teammates.

Hollinger is a four-year starter for the Flames and Umberger led the pitching staff in 2008 with eight wins and 88 strikeouts. Umberger's strikeout total led the Big South Conference.

"I thought our team chose two outstanding individuals to lead them this spring," said Toman. "Errol and Dustin are proven veterans in the Big South Conference and are well-respected by all of their teammates."

Toman also added a Captains Cabinet this year, which is comprised of four players who also received substantial support in the voting. "Fortunately, we had many players who received votes this year," added Toman. "So, we seem to have great leadership."

Senior 1B/RHP Cody Brown, junior left-hander Shawn Teufel, junior right-hander Joe Steinwedell and junior right-hander Mark Swanson will comprise the Captains Cabinet.

"This group will give our team added leadership and accountability," said Toman. "They are great choices and will act as a sounding board to Errol and Dustin."

Quinn and Daniels Join Coaching Staff

The Liberty coaching staff has added two members to its ranks in Assistant Coach Garrett Quinn and Director of Baseball Operations Billy Daniels. Quinn will serve as the Flames' pitching coach and assist in recruiting, while Daniels will oversee several administrative phases such as team travel, camps, budget, academics, alumni relations and the day-to-day operations of the baseball office.

Quinn joins the Liberty staff after four years at Stetson, where he was the Hatters' pitching coach and recruiting coordinator. During his time at Stetson, he coached two All-Americans, seven A-Sun all-conference performers and four conference all-freshman team members.

Under his guidance, the Hatters' mound corps was 30th in the nation with a 3.81 ERA, first in the A-Sun in opponent batting average with a .259 average and seventh in the nation with seven shutouts in 2007. The previous year, the Stetson staff finished first in the conference with a 4.11 ERA and an opponent batting average of .270. Both seasons, the Hatters were A-Sun Champions and advanced to a NCAA Regional.

Daniels, a 2006 Liberty graduate and former Flames baseball player, served as an assistant coach at Longwood during the 2007-08 academic year. The Lancers' pitching coach during the 2008 season, he oversaw a Longwood staff which posted a 4.83 ERA with 291 strikeouts over 429 innings. The Lancers recorded a 23-26-1 record last season.

In addition, he previously served as a volunteer assistant coach at VCU during the fall of 2006 and throughout the 2007 campaign with the Rams. At VCU, he assisted in all aspects of the game, including assistance with the pitching staff and coaching first base. He also aided with team travel and organization of the program's camps. VCU finished 37-23 and advanced to a NCAA Regional in 2007.

Page and Stokes Taken in MLB Draft

Liberty senior pitchers Ryan Page and David Stokes were taken in the 2008 Major League Baseball Draft, becoming the 37th and 38th Liberty players to be picked during the league's draft. With their selections, the Flames have had a player taken in every Major League Draft since 2000.

Page, a left-hander, was drafted by the Toronto Blue Jays in the 20th round of the draft. He finished third in the Big South Conference and led the Flames with a 2.76 ERA in his final season at Liberty in 2008, posting a 5-5 record in 81 2/3 innings.

Stokes, a right-hander, was selected by the Detroit Tigers in the 28th round of the draft. He was named to the 2008 Big South All-Conference second team after his final season with the Flames. Stokes posted an 8-6 record with a 3.60 ERA in 100 innings of work. He finished 10th in the Big South in ERA and led the Big South both in innings pitched and games started.

In 15 starts, Stokes struck out 86 batters and walked only 16. He tied for second in the conference in both strikeouts and wins, while ranking 30th in the country in fewest walks per nine innings (1.40).

The two helped the Liberty pitching staff set a new school record for punchouts in a season with 508.

A Historic Night

March 28, 2008 was a historic evening for the Liberty baseball program, as Worthington Stadium, the Flames' home field, hosted its first-ever night game.

The contest between Coastal Carolina and Liberty, the opening game of Big South play for both teams, drew a stadium-record 3,183 fans. The stadium also debuted a new sound system at the game, which was won, 5-3, in 11 innings by the Chanticleers.

School Season Strikeout Record Falls

Last season, the Liberty pitching staff struck out 508 opposing batters to set a new school season record.

On May 10, in the first game of a doubleheader at Longwood, the 2008 Liberty mound staff passed the previous school record of 405 strikeouts in a season set by the 1997 squad, when right-hander Dustin Umberger struck out his second of six batters, in the third inning of a 5-3 Flames victory.

During the year, the Liberty mound staff averaged 8.2 punchouts per game. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 26th nationally in the final national statistical summary.

Umberger led the conference in strikeouts with 88, while senior right-hander David Stokes tied for second in the Big South rankings with 86 punchouts.

Thanks to their run in the Big South Championship, the 2008 Liberty Flames played 62 games, the most in a season for a Liberty team. The season total surpasses the 61 games played by the 1998 and 2007 teams.

The contests helped the Flames set season marks for at bats and innings pitched, as well. Liberty had 2,230 at bats in 2008, 64 more than the former mark of 2,166 by the 2006 squad.

The Liberty pitching staff also set a new standard for innings pitched in a year. Last season, the Flames amassed 557 1/3 innings in 2008, eclipsing the previous school mark of 542.

Dialing Up Doubles

The 2008 Liberty batters set a new team record for doubles with 155. The total surpasses the previous mark of 151 in a season set by the 2002 squad.

Among the nation's leaders in two-base hits for most of the year, the Flames finished fifth in the nation in two-base hits in the NCAA Division I statistical rankings. Jim Toman's squad also finished the year as the Big South leader in doubles.

Senior outfielder P.K. Keller and junior third baseman Cody Brown tied for second in the conference in doubles, leading the Flames with 21 two-base hits apiece. Senior first baseman David Giammaresi and junior catcher Errol Hollinger tied for fourth in the Big South with 19 doubles each.

Taking One for the Team

Liberty batters were hit by opposing pitchers 82 times in 2008 to set a new school mark. The record surpasses the previous record of 75 in 2001.

Flames Reach 30 Victories for Fourth Straight Season

There are several milestones upon which teams are measured in college baseball. One such milestone is winning 30 or more games in a season.

With its 8-1 victory over High Point on May 16 at Worthington Stadium, Liberty collected its 30th win of 2008 and went on to post a 35-26-1 record. It is the first time in the 35-year history of the program; Liberty has won 30 or more games in four consecutive seasons. The Flames started the run in 2005 with 36 wins, followed by a 39-victory season in 2006.

In 2007, Liberty won 36 games. It was the second time in school history; Liberty had posted 30 wins in three consecutive years. The Flames have reached 30 wins in a season 14 times in the program's 35-year history. Of the 14, 10 have come at the NCAA Division I level.

Championship Run Leads to Record

During their six games in the 2008 Big South Championship, the Flames posted four consecutive double-digit victories, enabling Liberty to set a championship record with 55 total runs scored. The Flames came back from a first-day defeat to reach the title game for the third-straight season.

The Last Time

Back-to-Back Home Runs

By Liberty: David Giammaresi and Errol Hollinger connected for back-to-back home runs at Hap Spuhler Field in a six-run fourth inning at George Mason on April 25, 2006. The second of three home runs in the inning, Giammaresi hit a two-run shot over the left field wall with one out and Hollinger followed with a solo shot, also to left field. Liberty scored six runs in the inning, on its way to an 18-4 victory over the Patriots.

By Opponent: Winthrop's Chris Carrara and Heath Rollins led off the final game of a three-game Big South Conference weekend series on March 26, 2006 at Winthrop Ballpark with back-to-back home runs. Liberty later came back in the contest to take a 5-2 lead, before the Eagles rallied for a 10-8 victory.

No-Hitter

By Liberty: Dan Valentin pitched a seven-inning no-hitter against Elon on April 16, 2000, at Worthington Stadium, marking the first no-hitter by a Flames pitcher in 20 years. Valentin walked seven batters and struck out eight in the game to give Liberty a 4-0 win. This game sparked three-consecutive shutouts for Valentin, during a span of 29-consecutive scoreless innings.

By Opponent: UNC Asheville's Jason Walker pitched a seven-inning no-hitter against the Flames on April 29, 2000, at Greenwood Field in Asheville, N.C. Walker allowed two walks and struck out four, leading the Bulldogs to a 3-0 win. The game marked the only shutout against the Flames on the season and the first no-hitter thrown against Liberty since 1992.

Triple Play

By Liberty: Liberty has never recorded a triple play.

By Opponent: Leading 6-4 with a runner on first and second to open the fourth inning, Patrick Gaillard hit a line drive which High Point second baseman Dustin Hoffman caught. Hoffman then tagged second and threw quickly to first to complete the triple play. The Flames went on to win the Big South Championship game, 9-7, on May 25, 2006 at Charles Watson Stadium in Conway, S.C.

Shutout

By Liberty: David Stokes scattered five hits through the first eight innings, striking out nine, and Andrew Wilson pitched a perfect ninth, for an 8-0 win over VMI on April 18, 2008 at Worthington Stadium.

By Opponent: Five James Madison pitchers limited the Flames to four hits in a 4-0 win at Worthington Stadium on April 8, 2008.

Grand Slam Home Run

By Liberty: With two outs and the bases loaded in the top of the second inning, Aaron Phillips homered over the left field wall to give Liberty a 4-0 advantage over host Virginia Tech on May 7, 2008 at English Field. The Flames went on to edge the Hokies, 7-6, in Blacksburg, Va.

By Opponent: George Mason's Justin Bour hit the first of his two home runs in the game, a grand slam in the sixth inning, to push the Patriots past Liberty, 13-0, on March 26, 2008 at Spuhler Field in Fairfax, Va.

A Look Ahead

Liberty will travel to James Madison and No. 1 North Carolina for its first midweek games of 2009. The Flames will square off with the James Madison Dukes, a 2008 NCAA Regional participant, at Long Field/Mauck Stadium, Tuesday at 3 p.m. It will be the first of three meetings between the two teams during the year. On Wednesday, Liberty will face the No.1 ranked North Carolina Tar Heels, a 2008 College World Series participant, at Bryson Field at Boshamer Stadium.

The Flames return to Lynchburg on Saturday, Feb. 28 to open their 2009 home schedule. Jim Toman's squad will host the Manhattan Jaspers in a doubleheader Saturday afternoon at Worthington Stadium. The twinbill will begin at noon. The two teams will conclude the series the following day with a single game, beginning at 1 p.m.
