The Games

The Liberty University Flames (16-10, 3-3 Big South) travel to Fairfax, Va., for a mid-week non-conference game against the George Mason Patriots (11-12, 7-4 CAA), Wednesday afternoon, at Raymond "Hap" Spuhler Field. First pitch is set for 2:30 p.m.

The Series Against George Mason

On Wednesday, the Flames and Patriots will meet for the 51st time. George Mason holds a 29-21 edge in the all-time series since 1977. Last season, the two squads met for the first time since 2003 with Liberty taking both midweek games. The Flames won 11-2, on March 29 at Worthington Stadium and defeated the Patriots at Spuhler Field, 18-4, on April 25.

The Last Time Out

The host High Point Panthers took the last two games of a three-game series with the Flames to capture the Big South series, 2-1. The Panthers plated four runs in the fifth to erase a 3-1 Liberty advantage, downing the Flames, 8-4, in the final contest. Tommy Bussey and Tim Nanry both collected solo home runs in the game.

On Saturday, High Point defeated Liberty, 10-2. The Panthers scored eight times in the fifth inning to break open a close game. High Point starter Eammon Portice allowed only three hits in seven innings, and the Flames managed seven total hits in the game.

In Friday's series opener, Liberty starter Michael Solbach won his fifth-straight start as the Flames downed the Panthers, 7-5. Solbach allowed one unearned run on five hits over six innings, striking out three and walking three. Phil John was 3-for-5 with four RBI including a bases-loaded double to back the right-hander.

Flames on the Radio

This season, the Flames Sports Network plans to broadcast 20 Liberty baseball regular season games. Games will air live on WWMC 90.9 FM "The Light" and on the World Wide Web at both www.LibertyFlames.com and www.thelightonline.com. The station's next broadcast is scheduled for April 1, as the Flames host Monmouth. The broadcast is scheduled to begin around 1 p.m.

The Coaches

Liberty: Matt Royer (Liberty, '80)
Record at School: 133-117 (Five Years)
Overall Record: 451-357 (17 Years)

Notes: Matt Royer is in his fifth year at the helm of his alma mater ... last season, Royer guided the Flames to their second-straight 30-plus win season, their first back-to-back 30-win seasons during his tenure and the fourth in school history ... Liberty posted 39 victories in 2006, the most Division I wins in program history ... on Feb. 21, 2006, he won his 400th career game as a head coach when the Flames defeated Longwood, 4-3 ... in each of his first four years, the Liberty win total has improved each season ... Royer has led the Flames to the Big South Championship final game in both 2002 and 2006 ... prior to his stint at Liberty, he had a nine-year run at Kutztown, where he posted a 271-176 mark ... the Golden Bears never had a losing season in his nine years at the school ... guided Kutztown to the Division II College World Series during his final two seasons at the school.

George Mason: Bill Brown (George Mason, '80)
Record at School: 707-644-5 (26 Years)

Notes: Bill Brown is in his 26th year at his alma mater ... all-time winningest coach in George Mason history ... earlier this season, he won his 700th game as the Patriots' head coach with a 10-9 victory over William & Mary on March 4 ... last season, Brown led George Mason to a 20-31 mark ... in 2005, led the Patriots to a 35-19 record, the 11th time under his guidance George Mason has recorded 30 or more victories ... has been named CAA Coach of the Year five times including in 2004 ... Brown ranks as the third youngest active Division I coach to reach the 600 career-victory mark, reaching that number in 2003.

Returning to Their Alma Mater

The Liberty coaching staff, led by head coach Matt Royer, along with assistant coaches Terry Weaver and Reggie Reynolds, is unusual for Division I baseball. All three coaches are graduates of Liberty University.

Royer received his degree in 1980, while playing baseball for the program's founder, Al Worthington. Weaver and Reynolds also obtained their bachelor's degrees from Liberty, with Weaver achieving his in the fall of 1997 and Reynolds having his conferred upon him in 1998.

Flames at Worthington Stadium

For the past 27 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium their home. The Flames have compiled an impressive 462-208-4 record at home for a winning percentage of .688 since the stadium's inception in 1979. Under head coach Matt Royer, the Flames are proving the stadium to be an even tougher venue for opponents, having posted a 117-48 record (.709) during Royer's five years at the helm.

This season, the Flames have posted a 10-4 mark (.714) at home. Liberty went 22-9 (.710) at Worthington Stadium in 2006.

Liberty on the Road

Liberty is 6-6 in contests played away from Worthington Stadium in 2007. This season, the Flames are 5-5 in road contests and 1-1 at neutral sites. Liberty finished the 2006 season with a 17-12 road mark. Its record was a four-game improvement over 2005, when the Flames went 9-12 away from home.

Flames in Big South Openers

The series with UNC Asheville over the weekend of March 16-18 was the third time in their 15 years as a member of the Big South, the Flames started conference play at home. With two wins in the series over the Bulldogs, Liberty is now 22-23 in its Big South opening three-game series of the season.

Of the 45 games, Liberty has opened conference play on the road 12 times with a record of 15-21. The Flames have opened at home three times and have now posted a 7-2 mark.

Flames Against the Big South

Liberty has compiled a 194-150 record against current members of the Big South. The Flames have also compiled a 30-16 mark in Big South Championship games over the same span.

Baseball in the Commonwealth

Thirteen Division I baseball teams call the Commonwealth of Virginia home. This season, the Flames are scheduled to face opponents from the "Old Dominion State" 17 times. Liberty has begun its slate against in-state opponents with a 3-2 mark.

After taking their first three games against Virginia schools, Liberty has dropped its last two. Wednesday's meeting with George Mason will be the Flames' first with a school from the state since an 8-3 setback at James Madison on March 14.

Liberty posted a 15-5 record against Virginia teams in 2006. The Flames are scheduled to meet state squads George Mason (twice), James Madison (twice), Old Dominion (once), Radford (three times), Richmond (once), VCU (once), VMI (three times), Virginia Tech (twice) and William & Mary (twice) this season.

Another Fantastic February

The month of February has been good to the Flames the past three seasons. Liberty won its last five contests in the second month of the year in 2006 to post a 7-2 mark. In 2005, the Flames started 7-1 in February to begin the season.

2007 was no different, as Liberty finished the year's opening month on a six-game win streak to post a 7-3 mark in the season's first month.

2007 by the Month

The Flames will play 19 contests in the month of March. After dropping two of three at High Point this past weekend, Matt Royer's club currently stands at 9-7 overall and 3-3 in the Big South during the month of March.

Last season, Liberty dropped its first game of the month at James Madison on March 1, before reeling off nine victories to tie the school Division I record for consecutive wins. The Flames finished 12-6 during March 2006. In Big South Conference games in March, Liberty went 1-4 in the month to open league play.

Liberty opened the 2007 season by going 7-3 in February.

Over Two Years and Counting

The Flames have gone 164 games and almost three years without being shut out in a contest. During the span, the Liberty mound staff has pitched six shutouts, including three in 2006.

The last time a Liberty team was shut out was April 10, 2004 at Winthrop. Eagles' starter Jeff Reeves combined with relievers Jonathan Settle and Chris Leroux to allow the Flames three hits in a 6-0 win.

Liberty has been limited to one run five times during the period. Last season, Birmingham-Southern allowed the Flames single runs in in back-to-back games on April 28 and 29. Liberty also scored one run in a loss at Winthrop on March 24.

In 2005, Liberty scored only one run on two occasions, in a 1-0 victory over Fairfield on March 9 and in the last game of the season, a 2-1 setback to Coastal Carolina on May 27 at the Big South Baseball Championship.

The Flames have scored more than one run in each of its first 23 games this season.

Winning the Close Ones

Liberty finished last season 10-5 in one-run games. Its record in one-run games was one of the keys to Liberty's fast start to 2006 on its way to breaking the school mark for victories in a season. Six of the Flames' first 10 games were decided by one run. Liberty went 5-1 in those games.

The Flames have started 2007, 2-1, in contests decided by one run this season. The last two were Matt Royer's team's first two extra-inning contests of 2007. Two weeks ago, Liberty had back-to-back games go extra frames in order to determine an outcome. The Flames defeated George Washington, 7-6, in 10 innings on March 10, before falling to the Colonials, 6-5, in 10 innings on March 11.

What is It About the Fifth?

Liberty has scored 18 percent of their runs this season in the fifth inning. Of the 175 runs the Flames have scored in their 26 games this season, Liberty has plated 31 in the fifth frame. The mound staff been equally successful in the inning, allowing 17 runs. In addition, the Flames are 15-2 when leading after the fifth.

Some Things To Ponder

Liberty:

- is 12-0 when leading after the fourth inning
- is 15-1 when leading after the seventh inning (The Flames' only loss when leading after the seventh came in a 10-inning setback to George Washington on March 11)
- is 8-0 when leading after two innings
- is 14-2 when out-hitting an opponent and 1-8 when being out-hit
- is 9-0 when allowing an opponent two runs or less
- has won a season-high seven in a row, while dropping a season-high three straight
- has not had a player start all 23 games this season
- catchers have thrown out 16-of-35 would be base stealers this season

A Running Success

The Flames have been successful in swiping bases this season. So far in 2007, Liberty has stolen 32 bases in 35 attempts, a 91 percent success rate. Leading the way with nine steals is first baseman Aaron Grijalva. He has not been caught yet this season. Phil John is next with seven steals.

In 2006, Liberty led the Big South with 104 stolen bases. In addition, the Flames ranked 30th in the country among Division I programs in stolen bases per game, as they averaged 1.73 steals per contest, marking a stark contrast to 2005.

Last season, the Flames swiped 39 more stolen bases in 60 contests than they had in 55 the previous year. Liberty averaged 1.73 steals per game as they swiped 104 bases in 127 attempts, an 82 percent success rate.

In 2005, Liberty finished the season with a 77 percent success rate, as they stole 63 bases in 81 attempts (less than 1.15 per game).

Chad Miller finished fourth in the Big South with 24 steals in his final season with Flames. Aaron Grijalva ranked fifth in the conference with 23 stolen bases. Patrick Gaillard was also among the Big South leaders with 16 thefts, ranking ninth.

Looking Ahead

The Flames return to Worthington Stadium for a weekend series with Monmouth on Saturday and Sunday. The two teams will play a doubleheader on Saturday afternoon with a starting time of 11 a.m. The second game will follow approximately 30 minutes after the first game. Monmouth and Liberty will then meet on Sunday in a single game set for 1 p.m.

Liberty will continue the seven-game homestand with a midweek visit by William & Mary on April 3. First pitch between the two in-state rivals is scheduled for 3 p.m.

The Flames will close out the homestand with a visit to Worthington Stadium by Marshall for a single game on April 6 and a doubleheader on April 7.
