The Game

The Liberty University Flames (26-16, 8-4 Big South) host the George Mason University Patriots (21-19, 10-9 CAA) in the final game of an eight-game homestand for the Flames, Tuesday, April 24, at Worthington Stadium. The non-conference game is scheduled for 3 p.m.

The Series Against George Mason

The Flames and Patriots will be meeting for the 52nd time on the baseball diamond Tuesday afternoon. George Mason holds a 29-22 advantage all-time since 1976.

Liberty edged the Patriots, 5-4, earlier this season at Raymond "Hap" Sphuler Field in Fairfax, Va. on March 28. The Flames took both games from George Mason last season, downing the Patriots, 11-2, at Worthington Stadium and 18-4 in Fairfax.

The Last Time Out

Liberty completed a three-game sweep of Big South rival Radford with a 13-5 victory Sunday afternoon. Designated hitter Tim Nanry drove in four runs and outfielder P.K. Keller went 3-for-3, scoring two runs and knocking in three others in the win. Liberty starter Michael Solbach was the beneficiary of the Flames' offensive support as the right-hander ran his record to 6-2 on the season. Garrett Young also had three hits on the afternoon for Liberty.

The Flames had taken the previous two games with the Highlanders, 16-3 and 13-1.

Flames on the Radio

This season, the Flames Sports Network plans to broadcast 20 Liberty baseball regular season games. Games will air live on WWMC 90.9 FM "The Light" and on the World Wide Web at both www.LibertyFlames.com and www.thelightonline.com. The station plans to broadcast Tuesday's contest with George Mason. The broadcast is scheduled to begin around 3 p.m.

The Coaches

Liberty: Matt Royer (Liberty, '80)
Record at School: 143-123 (Five Years)
Overall Record: 461-362 (17 Years)

Notes: Matt Royer is in his fifth year at the helm of his alma mater ... last season, Royer guided the Flames to their second-straight 30-plus win season, their first back-to-back 30-win seasons during his tenure and the fourth in school history ... Liberty posted 39 victories in 2006, the most Division I wins in program history ... on Feb. 21, 2006, he won his 400th career game as a head coach when the Flames defeated Longwood, 4-3 ... in each of his first four years, the Liberty win total has improved each season ... Royer has led the Flames to the Big South Championship final game in both 2002 and 2006 ... prior to his stint at Liberty, he had a nine-year run at Kutztown, where he posted a 271-176 mark ... the Golden Bears never had a losing season in his nine years at the school ... guided Kutztown to the Division II College World Series during his final two seasons at the school.

George Mason: Bill Brown (George Mason, '80)
Record at School: 717-651-5 (26 Years)
Overall Record: Same

Notes: Bill Brown is in his 26th year at his alma mater ... all-time winningest coach in George Mason history ... earlier this season, he won his 700th game as the Patriots' head coach with a 10-9 victory over William & Mary on March 4 ... last season, Brown led George Mason to a 20-31 mark ... in 2005, led the Patriots to a 35-19 record, the 11th time under his guidance George Mason has recorded 30 or more victories ... has been named CAA Coach of the Year five times including 2004 ... Brown ranks as the third youngest active Division I coach to reach the 600 career-victory mark, reaching that number in 2003.

Returning to Their Alma Mater

The Liberty coaching staff, led by head coach Matt Royer, along with assistant coaches Terry Weaver and Reggie Reynolds, is unusual for Division I baseball. All three coaches are graduates of Liberty University.

Royer received his degree in 1980, while playing baseball for the program's founder, Al Worthington. Weaver and Reynolds also obtained their bachelor's degrees from Liberty, with Weaver achieving his in the fall of 1997 and Reynolds having his conferred upon him in 1998.

Flames at Worthington Stadium

For the past 27 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium their home. The Flames have compiled an impressive 471-213-4 record at home for a winning percentage of .688 since the stadium's inception in 1979. Under head coach Matt Royer, the Flames are proving the stadium to be an even tougher venue for opponents, having posted a 129-53 record (.709) during Royer's five years at the helm.

This season, the Flames have posted a 19-9 mark (.679) at home. Liberty went 22-9 (.710) at Worthington Stadium in 2006.

Liberty Away From Worthington

Liberty is 7-7 in contests played away from Worthington Stadium in 2007. This season, the Flames are 6-6 in road contests and 1-1 at neutral sites. After Tuesday's contest, Liberty will play 10 of its last 13 games on the road to finish out the 2007 regular season schedule.

Liberty finished the 2006 season with a 17-12 road mark. Its record was a four-game improvement over 2005, when the Flames went 9-12 away from home.

2007 by the Month

Liberty is currently 9-4 overall and 5-1 in Big South contests during the month of April. The Flames will play 17 games in April, including Big South Conference three-game series with Charleston Southern, Radford and Coastal Carolina. Last season, April was good to Liberty as it went 14-5 during the month.

Battling health issues for most of the month, the Flames finished March with a 10-9 overall mark and a 3-3 record in the Big South. Liberty opened the 2007 season by going 7-3 in February.

Another Fantastic February

The month of February has been good to the Flames the past three seasons. Liberty won its last five contests in the second month of the year in 2006 to post a 7-2 mark. In 2005, the Flames started 7-1 in February to begin the season.

2007 was no different, as Liberty finished the year's opening month on a six-game win streak to post a 7-3 mark in the season's first month.

Baseball in the Commonwealth

Thirteen Division I baseball teams call the Commonwealth of Virginia home. This season, the Flames are scheduled to face opponents from the "Old Dominion State" 17 times. After this weekend's sweep of Radford, Liberty now stands at 7-5 against in-state opponents so far this season. Liberty posted a 15-5 record against Virginia teams in 2006. The Flames are scheduled to meet state squads George Mason (twice), James Madison (twice), Old Dominion (once), Radford (three times), Richmond (once), VCU (once), VMI (three times), Virginia Tech (twice) and William & Mary (twice) this season.

Over Two Years and Counting

The Flames have gone 180 games and over three years without being shut out in a contest. During the span, the Liberty mound staff has pitched six shutouts, including three in 2006.

The last time a Liberty team was shut out was April 10, 2004 at Winthrop. Eagles' starter Jeff Reeves combined with relievers Jonathan Settle and Chris Leroux to allow the Flames three hits in a 6-0 win.

Liberty has been limited to one run six times during the period. On April 10 of this season, the Flames scored their lone run of the game in the first inning and were held scoreless the rest of the way in an 11-1 setback at William & Mary. It is the only time Liberty has failed to score more than one run in a contest in 2007.

In 2006, Birmingham-Southern allowed the Flames single runs in games on April 28 and 29. Liberty also scored one run in a loss at Winthrop on March 24.

In 2005, the Flames scored only one run on two occasions, in a 1-0 victory over Fairfield on March 9 and in the last game of the season, a 2-1 setback to Coastal Carolina on May 27 at the Big South Baseball Championship.

Winning the Close One

Liberty is 3-2 this season in contests decided by one run this season. Of the three Flames' contests which have gone to extra innings this season, each had been decided by one run. On March 31, Liberty dropped a 3-2 decision in 11 innings to Monmouth. The Flames also had back-to-back games go extra frames in order to determine an outcome on March 10 and 11. The Flames defeated George Washington, 7-6, in 10 innings, on March 10, before falling to the Colonials, 6-5, in 10 innings on March 11.

Liberty finished last season 10-5 in one-run games. Its record in one-run games was one of the keys to Liberty's fast start to 2006 on its way to breaking the school mark for victories in a season. Six of the Flames' first 10 games were decided by one run. Liberty went 5-1 in those games.

Some Things To Ponder

Liberty:

- is 18-0 when leading after the fourth inning
- is 25-1 when leading after the seventh inning (The Flames' only loss when leading after the seventh came in a 10-inning setback to George Washington on March 11.)
- is 22-2 when out-hitting an opponent and 3-14 when being out-hit
- is 11-0 when allowing an opponent two runs or less
- has a season-high winning streak of seven in a row and has a season-high losing streak of three straight
- has not had a player start more than 37 games this season (last season, three Flames started in all 60 Liberty contests)

Six Seems to Do the Trick

Liberty is 21-0 when scoring six or more runs in a game this season, while posting a 5-16 mark when tallying five or less in a contest. The Flames are also 20-2 when leading after the sixth inning.

Bullpen Closes Door

The Liberty mound relief corps has been outstanding in protecting leads this season. So far in 2007, the Flames are 25-1 when holding a lead after the seventh inning and 25-0 in games in which they held an advantage after eight innings of play.

Since no Liberty starter has gone the distance, the relief staff has been relied on to close out the victories for the Flames this season. Tim John and Ryan Page entered the week with four saves apiece and have posted ERAs of 2.05 and 3.12 respectively, to pace the Liberty pen.

In weekend series at the beginning of the month, right-hander Andrew Wilson gave the Flames two strong long relief efforts to pick-up his first two wins of 2007. Wilson gave up one run on three hits in 3 1/3 innings, allowing Liberty to rally for six runs in the seventh inning for an 8-6 win over Marshall on April 6.

In addition, he entered April 1's contest against Monmouth with runners on first and third and one out in the seventh frame and induced the next batter to hit into a double play to end the threat. He would go on to allow only one hit in 2 2/3 innings of work in Liberty's 11-6 victory over the Hawks.

Young Tough to K

Entering Tuesday's game, Liberty center fielder Garrett Young has shown himself to be one of the toughest hitters in the nation to strike out. Through April 17, Young has struck out once every 19.5 at bats, ranking him 17th among NCAA Division I batters in the country.

Keller's Bat Heats Up

Outfielder P. K. Keller has carried a hot bat over the past two weeks for the Flames. Since smacking a two-run single in the first game of a doubleheader against Marshall on April 7, Keller has hit .512 with 21 hits in 41 at bats over the 10-game span. In addition, the outfielder has had four three-hit games in his past eight games and seven contests with two hits or more in his last nine.

As the outdoor temperature rose the past 15 days, so has Keller's batting average. Hitting .271 entering the first game of the doubleheader on April 7, the junior has seen his batting average rise 100 points to .281 entering Tuesday's game.

Young's Power Provides Boost

Flames' center fielder Garrett Young hit his seventh home run of the season on April 14 against Charleston Southern, going deep in an 8-4 Liberty win. With that result, the Flames are now 6-1 when Young homers, the only loss in those games coming on March 13 against Virginia Tech, an 8-2 Liberty defeat.

Gaillard Returns to Action

Liberty shortstop Patrick Gaillard returned to the starting lineup on April 6 versus Marshall after missing the previous thirteen games with an injured shoulder. When the shortstop went on the shelf on March 13, the Flames had posted a 12-5 mark. However, while the co-captain was out of the lineup, Liberty struggled in posting a 6-7 record. Since the senior's return, the Flames have posted a 8-3 mark, including this past weekend's sweep of Radford. All told, Liberty is 20-9 when Gaillard is the Flames starting shortstop.

Center Fielder's Hit Streak Snapped

Center fielder Garrett Young saw his 18-game hit streak come to an end in the first game of April 13's doubleheader against Charleston Southern. It is the longest such streak this season by a Liberty player.

The outfielder maintained the streak, despite missing eight games in the middle of it due to injury and illness. Young began the streak on Feb. 27 with a 4-for-5 afternoon at VCU. Three of the hits were doubles as he drove in three runs in the Flames' 8-2 win over the Rams. He would go on to hit safely in his next nine games, before having to come out of the Liberty line-up first due to injury and then illness. He played in only one of the Flames' next nine games, collecting a hit in two at bats against UMBC to keep the run going.

The junior then returned to the line-up against Monmouth on March 31 and resumed his streak. Young had at least one hit in each of the first seven contests he played upon his return, including an eighth-inning single to run the streak to 18 games on April 10.

Negron Makes the Move

Liberty's Kenneth Negron has shown his defensive versatility the past few weeks. With the Flames already down a middle infield player due to an injury to starting shortstop Patrick Gaillard, Negron, who played his first 24 games in the outfield, took over the duties at second base, when Tommy Bussey could not play due to illness before Liberty's contest at George Mason on March 28.

Since then, Negron has taken over as the starter at second base, committing only one fielding error in 76 chances in 15 games at the position. He has also seen some time in the outfield during the span, providing Liberty head coach Matt Royer several different defensive options.

Flames Take Two-of-Three From Charleston Southern

P.K. Keller went 3-for-4 and Liberty scored five runs in the fifth inning for an 8-4 victory over Charleston Southern, April 14, at Worthington Stadium.

With the win, Liberty prevailed in the three-game series, two games to one. In addition to Keller's performance, the Flames got strong games from starting pitcher David Stokes and outfielder Garrett Young. Young hit his seventh home run of the season, a blast over the left field wall, and Stokes went 6 2/3 innings, allowing just three runs to pick up his team-leading sixth victory of the season.

On April 13, the two teams split a doubleheader. Liberty took the first game, 4-2, as Patrick Gaillard doubled home two runs in the 8th inning to break a 2-2 tie. In the nightcap, Charleston Southern scored three runs in each of the second and fourth innings and then held off a late Liberty rally for a 6-4 win. Tim Nanry went 3-for-4 in the game with a RBI.

Liberty Sweeps Marshall

Liberty took both ends of a non-conference doubleheader from the Marshall Thundering Herd on April 7 at Worthington Stadium, 11-7 and 10-4, to complete a sweep of the three-game series.

In the first game, Kenneth Negron and Cody Brown each had three hits to lead a 15-hit Liberty attack, as the Flames came from behind to defeat the Marshall Thundering Herd, 11-7. Trailing 5-0, Liberty plated six runs on six hits in the fourth inning to take the lead.

Nanry Receives Conference Player of the Week Honors

Outfielder Tim Nanry was selected the Big South Conference Choice Hotels Player of the Week for games played Feb. 12-18.

Nanry batted .667 (6-for-9) in three games, helping the Flames post a 2-1 record at the Crab House Shootout in Charleston, S.C. He garnered his first two starts of the season on Feb. 17 against host The Citadel and Feb. 18 against Richmond.

The outfielder responded with Liberty's first hit of the day against The Citadel in the fifth inning and scored the tying run in the Flames' 2-1, Feb. 17 win .

The next day against intra-state rival Richmond, Nanry belted three home runs, plated eight runs and scored four times in the Flames' 28-7 victory over the Spiders. The senior, who had the best day of his Liberty career, went 5-for-5 in the contest and was hit by a pitch to pace a 28-hit afternoon for the Flames, a new school record for hits in one game. Nanry finished with a 1.667 slugging percentage on the week.

Flames Break Records in Victory over Richmond

Tim Nanry hit three home runs to pace a school record-breaking, 28-hit attack as the Flames defeated the Richmond Spiders, 28-7, Feb. 18 at Riley Park in their final game at the Crab House Shootout in Charleston, S.C. The Flames broke the school mark with 28 hits and tied the single-game record for runs in the contest.

Liberty's 28 hits set a new standard for hits in a contest, breaking the old mark of 26, which the 2006 squad reached in a contest at UNC Asheville on May 13 of last season and on March 25, 1995, against UMBC.
