The Game

The Liberty University Flames (21-13, 3-3 Big South) travel to Williamsburg, Va. for a non-conference game against the Tribe of William & Mary College (20-16, 8-7 CAA). It will be the first night contest of the season for the Flames and the second meeting between the two squads this season. The Tribe and the Flames met last Tuesday at Worthington Stadium. Game time is scheduled for 7 p.m.

The Series Against William & Mary

Tuesday night's meeting will be the 41st meeting between the Flames and the Tribe on the diamond. William & Mary holds a slight edge, 21-19, in the all-time series between the two teams since 2006. The Tribe captured an 8-3 victory over the Flames this past Tuesday at Worthington Stadium. The last time, Liberty visited William and Mary's Plumeri Park on April 5, 2006, the Flames came away with a 15-4 victory.

The Last Time Out

Liberty swept a non-conference doubleheader from the Marshall Thundering Herd on Saturday afternoon at Worthington Stadium, 11-7 and 10-4.

In the first game, Kenneth Negron and Cody Brown each had three hits to lead a 15-hit Liberty attack, as the Flames came from behind to defeat the Marshall Thundering Herd, 11-7, in the first game. Trailing 5-0, Liberty plated six runs on six hits in the fourth inning to take the lead.

In the nightcap, Garrett Young and Phil John each connected for two-run home runs to back Tyler Light, who ran his season's mark to 4-1, in the 10-4 victory. John also drove in another run with a single for three RBI in the game. Light pitched six strong innings, allowing an unearned run on five hits.

Flames on the Radio

Liberty: Matt Royer (Liberty, '80)
Record at School: 138-120 (Five Years)
Overall Record: 456-359 (17 Years)

Notes: Matt Royer is in his fifth year at the helm of his alma mater ... last season, Royer guided the Flames to their second-straight 30-plus win season, their first back-to-back 30-win seasons during his tenure and the fourth in school history ... Liberty posted 39 victories in 2006, the most Division I wins in program history ... on Feb. 21, 2006, he won his 400th career game as a head coach when the Flames defeated Longwood, 4-3 ... in each of his first four years, the Liberty win total has improved each season ... Royer has led the Flames to the Big South Championship final game in both 2002 and 2006 ... prior to his stint at Liberty, he had a nine-year run at Kutztown, where he posted a 271-176 mark ... the Golden Bears never had a losing season in his nine years at the school ... guided Kutztown to the Division II College World Series during his final two seasons at the school.

William & Mary: Frank Leoni (Rhode Island, '90)
Record at School: 43-45 (Two Years)
Overall Record: 308-388-3 (15 Years)

Notes: Frank Leoni is in his second year as the Tribe's head coach ... in his first season, he guided a relatively inexperienced club to a 23-29 record overall and an 11-19 mark in the CAA ... finished the year by winning 10 of its final 13 contests, missing the CAA playoffs by one game ... before coming to William & Mary, Leoni led his alma mater, Rhode Island, for 13 seasons, compiling a 266-343-3 record ... in 2005, Rhode Island posted a 34-21 mark and earned the program's initial NCAA Tournament berth after claiming the A-10 title under his guidance ... named A-10 Coach of the Year in 2004 and 2005 and the New England Coach of the Year in 2005

Returning to Their Alma Mater

The Liberty coaching staff, led by head coach Matt Royer, along with assistant coaches Terry Weaver and Reggie Reynolds, is unusual for Division I baseball. All three coaches are graduates of Liberty University.

Royer received his degree in 1980, while playing baseball for the program's founder, Al Worthington. Weaver and Reynolds also obtained their bachelor's degrees from Liberty, with Weaver achieving his in the fall of 1997 and Reynolds having his conferred upon him in 1998.

Flames at Worthington Stadium

For the past 27 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium their home. The Flames have compiled an impressive 466-211-4 record at home for a winning percentage of .687 since the stadium's inception in 1979. Under head coach Matt Royer, the Flames are proving the stadium to be an even tougher venue for opponents, having posted a 124-51 record (.709) during Royer's five years at the helm.

This season, the Flames have posted a 14-7 mark (.647) at home. Liberty went 22-9 (.710) at Worthington Stadium in 2006.

Liberty Away From Worthington

Liberty is 7-6 in contests played away from Worthington Stadium in 2007. This season, the Flames are 6-5 in road contests and 1-1 at neutral sites. Liberty finished the 2006 season with a 17-12 road mark. Its record was a four-game improvement over 2005, when the Flames went 9-12 away from home.

2007 by the Month

With its three-game sweep this past weekend, Liberty has started the month of April on a high note, by posting a 4-1 mark in the month. The Flames will play 17 games in April, including Big South Conference three-game series with Charleston Southern, Radford and Coastal Carolina. Last season, April was very good to Liberty as it went 14-5 in the month.

Battling health issues for most of the month, the Flames finished March with a 10-9 overall mark and a 3-3 record in the Big South. Liberty opened the 2007 season by going 7-3 in February.

Another Fantastic February

The month of February has been good to the Flames the past three seasons. Liberty won its last five contests in the second month of the year in 2006 to post a 7-2 mark. In 2005, the Flames started 7-1 in February to begin the season.

2007 was no different, as Liberty finished the year's opening month on a six-game win streak to post a 7-3 mark in the season's first month.

Over Two Years and Counting

The Flames have gone 172 games and three years without being shut out in a contest. During the span, the Liberty mound staff has pitched six shutouts, including three in 2006.

The last time a Liberty team was shut out was April 10, 2004 at Winthrop. Eagles' starter Jeff Reeves combined with relievers Jonathan Settle and Chris Leroux to allow the Flames three hits in a 6-0 win.

Liberty has been limited to one run five times during the period. Last season, Birmingham-Southern allowed the Flames single runs in in back-to-back games on April 28 and 29. Liberty also scored one run in a loss at Winthrop on March 24.

In 2005, Liberty scored only one run on two occasions, in a 1-0 victory over Fairfield on March 9 and in the last game of the season, a 2-1 setback to Coastal Carolina on May 27 at the Big South Baseball Championship .

The Flames have scored more than one run in each of its first 34 games this season.

First Night Game

Liberty will be playing its first night contest of the season Tuesday. The Flames have six more games scheduled under the lights this season, including contests at Coastal Carolina, Virginia Tech, Arizona and VMI. Last season, Liberty was 2-4 under the lights.

Winning the Close One

Liberty is 3-2 this season in contests decided by one run this season. Of the three Flames' contests which have gone to extra innings this season, each had been decided by one run. On March 31, Liberty dropped a 3-2 decision in 11 innings to Monmouth. The Flames also had back-to-back games go extra frames in order to determine an outcome on March 10 and 11. The Flames defeated George Washington, 7-6, in 10 innings, on March 10, before falling to the Colonials, 6-5, in 10 innings on March 11.

Liberty finished last season 10-5 in one-run games. Its record in one-run games was one of the keys to Liberty's fast start to 2006 on its way to breaking the school mark for victories in a season. Six of the Flames' first 10 games were decided by one run. Liberty went 5-1 in those games.

Some Things To Ponder

Liberty:

- is 16-0 when leading after the fourth inning
- is 20-1 when leading after the seventh inning (The Flames' only loss when leading after the seventh came in a 10-inning setback to George Washington on March 11.)
- is 9-0 when leading after two innings
- is 17-2 when out-hitting an opponent and 3-11 when being out-hit
- is 9-0 when allowing an opponent two runs or less
- has a season-high winning streak of seven in a row and has a season-high losing streak of three straight
- has not had a player start more than 29 games this season (last season, three Flames started in all 60 Liberty contests)
- is 6-1 in games played on Friday

Bullpen Closes Door

The Liberty mound relief corps has been outstanding in protecting leads this season. So far in 2007, the Flames are 20-1 when holding a lead after the seventh inning and 20-0 in games in which they held the advantage after eight innings of play.

Since no Liberty starter has gone the distance, the relief staff has been relied on to close out the victories for the Flames this season. Tim John and Ryan Page entered the week with four saves apiece and have posted ERAs of 2.36 and 3.62 respectively, to pace the Liberty pen.

The past two weekends, right-hander Andrew Wilson has given the Flames two more strong relief efforts to pick up his first two wins of 2007. Wilson gave up one run on three hits in 3 1/3 innings, allowing Liberty to rally for six runs in the seventh inning for an 8-6 win over Marshall, Friday. A week earlier, he entered April 1's contest against Monmouth with runners on first and third and one out in the seventh frame and induced the next batter to hit into a double play to end the threat. He would go on to allow only one hit in 2 2/3 innings of work in Liberty's 11-6 victory over the Hawks.

Negrón Makes the Move

Liberty's Kenneth Negrón showed his defensive versatility in the past few weeks. With the Flames already down a middle infield player due to an injury to starting shortstop Patrick Gaillard, Negrón, who had played his first 24 games in the outfield, took over the duties at second base, when Tommy Bussey could not play due to illness before Liberty's contest at George Mason.

Since then, Negrón has played eight games at second base, committing his first error on Saturday in his most recent contest at the position.

Young's Hit Streak Continues

Center fielder Garrett Young enters tonight's contest with a 17-game consecutive game hit streak. The outfielder has maintained the streak despite missing eight games in the middle of it due to injury and illness.

Young began the streak on Feb. 27 with a 4-for-5 afternoon at VCU. Three of the hits were doubles as he drove in three runs in the Flames' 8-2 win over the Rams. The junior then returned to the line-up against Monmouth on March 31 and resumed his streak. Young has had at least one hit in each of the seven contests he has played since his return.

During the span, the center fielder is batting .409 with 27 hits in 66 at bats. He also has had two or more hits in six of the 17 games.

Six-Run Seven Lifts Flames Past Hawks

After swapping the lead with the Monmouth Hawks several times on the afternoon, the Liberty Flames plated six runs in the seventh inning to take their final advantage and defeat the Hawks, 11-6, on April 1 at Worthington Stadium. With the win, the Flames captured the final game of the non-conference series after dropping both ends of a doubleheader the previous day.

Garrett Young homered and tripled in the contest for Liberty, driving in two runs. Teammates Derek Bennion and Tim Nanry also had two hits and two RBI apiece.

The Flames plated three runs in the third inning and then recieved outstanding mound efforts out of the bullpen by Ryan Page and Tim John in perserving the Liberty edge throughout the remainder of the contest.

The Liberty offense was sparked by Phil John, Giammaresi, Keller and Nanry, who each recorded a pair of base hits, sparking the Flames' 11-hit attack.
