The Games

The Liberty University Flames (28-22, 9-6 Big South) host the Big South-leading Winthrop University Eagles (30-19, 14-1 Big South) in a key three-game conference weekend series at Worthington Stadium, Friday-Sunday. The series will mark the final three home games of the season for the Flames. It will open on Friday at 4 p.m., followed by games on Saturday and Sunday at 2 p.m.

Sunday afternoon will be Senior Day. Before the game, the six members of the Flames who will be playing in their final home game at Worthington Stadium that afternoon will be honored.

The Series Against Winthrop

Friday afternoon's contest will be the 53rd meeting between the Flames and Eagles on the diamond. The two teams first met in 1981. Winthrop holds a 29-23 advantage in the all-time series between the squads.

Last season, the No. 29 Eagles swept all three games between the two teams at the Winthrop Ballpark in Rock Hill, S.C., March 24-26, 13-1, 8-7 and 10-8. However, the Flames came back to take both meetings at the 2006 Big South Championship. Sixth-seeded Liberty defeated second-seeded Winthrop in the first game of the tournament, 9-6, on May 24. The Flames eliminated the Eagles three days later with an 11-7 victory on May 27.

The Last Time Out

Arizona designated hitter Oliver Padre's single with one out in the bottom of the 10th inning scored the game-winning run from second base as the No. 15 Wildcats edged the Flames, 7-6 in 10 innings, Sunday afternoon at Kindall Field at Sancet Stadium.

The two squads exchanged five-run frames in the second inning. After the Wildcats scored to go on top in the bottom of the sixth, the Flames knotted the score again at 7-7 in the top of the seventh on a single by P. K. Keller.

Tim John pitched out of several late-inning jams, before yielding the winning run in the bottom of the 10th.

Hot-hitting Arizona had taken the first two contests in the series, 16-2 and 16-3.

Liberty: Matt Royer (Liberty, '80)
Record at School: 145-126 (Five Years)
Overall Record: 463-363 (17 Years)

Notes: Matt Royer is in his fifth year at the helm of his alma mater ... last season, Royer guided the Flames to their second-straight 30-plus win season, their first back-to-back 30-win seasons during his tenure and the fourth in school history ... Liberty posted 39 victories in 2006, the most Division I wins in program history ... on Feb. 21, 2006, he won his 400th career game as a head coach when the Flames defeated Longwood, 4-3 ... in each of his first four years, the Liberty win total has improved each season ... Royer has led the Flames to the Big South Championship final game in both 2002 and 2006 ... prior to his stint at Liberty, he had a nine-year run at Kutztown, where he posted a 271-176 mark ... the Golden Bears never had a losing season in his nine years at the school ... guided Kutztown to the Division II College World Series during his final two seasons at the school.

Winthrop: Joe Hudak (Malone, 1972)

Notes: Hudak is in his 16th year at the helm of the Winthrop Eagles ... has led the Eagles to five NCAA tournament berths and three Big South championships ... last season led Winthrop to a 46-18 mark and an at-large berth in the NCAA tournament ... in 2005, the Eagles finished 44-22 and won the Big South Tournament Championship; receiving the conference's automatic a NCAA tournament bid ... over the past 11 years, his teams have averaged 36 wins per season and six times, the Eagles have won 40 or more games in a season ... in 2001, he led Winthrop to a program-best record of 48-16 and a NCAA Regional berth

Returning to Their Alma Mater

The Liberty coaching staff, led by head coach Matt Royer, along with assistant coaches Terry Weaver and Reggie Reynolds, is unusual for Division I baseball. All three coaches are graduates of Liberty University.

Royer received his degree in 1980, while playing baseball for the program's founder, Al Worthington. Weaver and Reynolds also obtained their bachelor's degrees from Liberty, with Weaver achieving his in the fall of 1997 and Reynolds having his conferred upon him in 1998.

Flames on the Radio

This season, the Flames Sports Network plans to broadcast 20 Liberty baseball regular season games. Games will air live on WWMC 90.9 FM "The Light" and on the World Wide Web at both www.LibertyFlames.com and www.thelightonline.com. The station's next broadcast is planned for May 13 against Winthrop. The broadcast is scheduled to begin around 2 p.m.

Flames at Worthington Stadium

For the past 27 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium their home. The Flames have compiled an impressive 472-213-4 record at home for a winning percentage of .688 since the stadium's inception in 1979. Under head coach Matt Royer, the Flames are proving the stadium to be an even tougher venue for opponents, having posted a 130-53 record (.710) during Royer's five years at the helm.

This season, the Flames have posted a 20-9 mark (.690) at home. Liberty went 22-9 (.710) at Worthington Stadium in 2006.

Liberty Away From Worthington

Liberty is 8-13 in contests played away from Worthington Stadium in 2007. This season, the Flames are 7-12 in road contests and 1-1 at neutral sites. Liberty plays 10 of its last 13 games on the road to finish out the 2007 regular season schedule. Liberty finished the 2006 season with a 17-12 road mark. Its record was a four-game improvement over 2005, when the Flames went 9-12 away from home.

Under the Lights

The Flames have not found things easy under artificial light. Liberty is 1-4 this season in night contests.

With five night games under its belt, Liberty has two more games scheduled under the lights in the regular season. The Flames will square off with the VMI Keydets in a pair of Big South Conference contests under VMI's newly installed lights at Patchin Field next weekend.

Flames Against the Big South

Liberty has compiled a 200-153 record against current members of the Big South. The Flames have also compiled a 30-16 mark in Big South Championship games over the same span.

Another Fantastic February

The month of February has been good to the Flames the past three seasons. Liberty won its last five contests in the second month of the year in 2006 to post a 7-2 mark. In 2005, the Flames started 7-1 in February to begin the season.

2007 was no different, as Liberty finished the year's opening month on a six-game win streak to post a 7-3 mark in the season's first month.

Recognizing the Flames Playing in their Final Home Games

Outfielder Derek Bennion, shortstop Patrick Gaillard, outfielder Phil John, pitcher Tim John, outfielder/designated hitter Tim Nanry and pitcher Michael Solbach will be playing in their final games as Liberty Flames at Worthington Stadium this weekend.

The Liberty athletics department and baseball program thank the six players for their contributions to and impact upon the Flames baseball program.

Baseball in the Commonwealth

Thirteen Division I baseball teams call the Commonwealth of Virginia home. This season, the Flames are scheduled to face opponents from the "Old Dominion State" 17 times. After falling at Virginia Tech on May 1, Liberty now stands at 8-6 against in-state opponents so far this season. Liberty posted a 15-5 record against Virginia teams in 2006. The Flames are scheduled to meet state squads George Mason (twice), James Madison (twice), Old Dominion (once), Radford (three times), Richmond (once), VCU (once), VMI (three times), Virginia Tech (twice) and William & Mary (twice) this season.

Liberty Against Nationally Ranked Opponents

After this past weekend's three-game series with No. 15 Arizona, Liberty has now met a nationally ranked opponent 40 times in the program's history.

The Flames have posted a 10-29 mark in those meetings, with one contest ending in a tie after being called in the 7th inning due to rain.

This season, Liberty has played seven regular season games against a nationally ranked opponent, the most in the program's history. In addition, all seven contests were away from Worthington Stadium.

The Flames squared off against South Carolina, ranked No. 1 in the nation by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers of America, in their opening game at the the Crab House Shootout on Feb. 16. Liberty also traveled to No. 19 Coastal Carolina for a three-game series, April 27-29 and No. 15 Arizona for a three-game series, last weekend.

Liberty has faced a nationally ranked opponent 25 times during head coach Matt Royer's five-year tenure, including a three-game series at Rice, two games with Virginia and a match-up with South Carolina. The Royer-led Flames also played a three-game series at Georgia in 2004. Although unranked at the time, the Bulldogs went on to appear at the College World Series that season.

The Flames have squared off against two teams ranked No. 1 in one of the four major polls on five different occasions. Besides this year's meeting, Liberty's first meeting with a No. 1 ranked team came against South Carolina, in the 2000 NCAA Columbia Regional with the Flames dropping a 6-4 decision to the Gamecocks on May 26. In 2003, No. 1 and eventual national champion Rice swept a three-game series from Liberty in Houston, Texas (March 21-23).

Looking for 30

There are several milestones upon which teams are measured in college baseball. One such milestone is a 30 or more win season.

After back-to-back 30-plus victory seasons in 2005 and 2006, Matt Royer's club is two wins away from once again posting a 30-win year in 2007. If the Flames reach the number, it would become only the second time in the program's 33-year history Liberty has won 30 or more games in three consecutive seasons. The feat would match the teams under Dave Pastors, which also won 30-plus from 2000-2002.

In 2005, the Flames won 36 games, while last season, Royer guided his alma mater to 39 victories, a school record for wins at the Division I level.

Over Two Years and Counting

The Flames have gone 188 games and 37 months without being shut out in a contest. During the span, the Liberty mound staff has pitched six shutouts, including three in 2006.

The last time a Liberty team was shut out was April 10, 2004 at Winthrop. Eagles' starter Jeff Reeves combined with relievers Jonathan Settle and Chris Leroux to allow the Flames three hits in a 6-0 win.

Liberty has been limited to one run six times during the period. On April 10 of this season, the Flames scored their lone run of the game in the first inning and were held scoreless the rest of the way in an 11-1 setback at William & Mary. It is the only time Liberty has failed to score more than one run in a contest in 2007.

In 2006, Birmingham-Southern allowed the Flames single runs in games on April 28 and 29. Liberty also scored one run in a loss at Winthrop on March 24.

In 2005, the Flames scored only one run on two occasions, in a 1-0 victory over Fairfield on March 9 and in the last game of the season, a 2-1 setback to Coastal Carolina on May 27 at the Big South Baseball Championship.

In the Close Ones

Liberty is 3-4 this season in contests decided by one run this season. Of the five Flames' contests which have gone to extra innings this season, four have been decided by one run, including this past Sunday's 7-6 setback to No. 15 Arizona in 10 innings. On March 31, Liberty dropped a 3-2 decision in 11 innings to Monmouth. The Flames also had back-to-back games go extra frames in order to determine an outcome on March 10 and 11. The Flames defeated George Washington, 7-6, in 10 innings, on March 10, before falling to the Colonials, 6-5, in 10 innings on March 11.

Liberty finished last season 10-5 in one-run games. Its record in one-run games was one of the keys to Liberty's fast start to 2006 on its way to breaking the school mark for victories in a season. Six of the Flames' first 10 games were decided by one run. Liberty went 5-1 in those games.

Six Seems to Do the Trick

Liberty is 23-4 when scoring six or more runs in a game this season, while posting a 5-18 mark when tallying five or fewer in a contest. The Flames are also 25-3 when leading after the sixth inning.

Tough to K

Entering this week, Liberty catcher Errol Hollinger has shown himself to be one of the toughest hitters in the nation to strike out.

Through May 7, Hollinger ranks 16th among NCAA Division I hitters. He has struck out once every 18.3 at bats. The sophomore has only K'd eight times in 141 at bats this season.

Young's Power Provides Boost

Flames' center fielder Garrett Young hit his seventh home run of the season on April 14 against Charleston Southern, going deep in an 8-4 Liberty win. With that result, the Flames are now 6-1 when Young homers, the only loss in those games coming on March 13 against Virginia Tech, an 8-2 Liberty defeat.

Gaillard Returns to Action

Liberty shortstop Patrick Gaillard returned to the starting lineup on April 6 versus Marshall after missing the previous 13 games with an injured shoulder. When the shortstop went on the shelf on March 13, the Flames had posted a 12-6 mark. However, while the co-captain was out of the lineup, Liberty struggled, posting a 6-7 record until his return on April 6. Liberty is 22-11 when Gaillard is the Flames' starting shortstop.

Young's Hit Streak Snapped

Center fielder Garrett Young saw his 18-game hit streak come to an end in the first game of April 13's doubleheader against Charleston Southern. It is the longest such streak this season by a Liberty player.

The outfielder maintained the streak, despite missing eight games in the middle of it due to injury and illness. Young began the streak on Feb. 27 with a 4-for-5 afternoon at VCU. Three of the hits were doubles as he drove in three runs in the Flames' 8-2 win over the Rams. He would go on to hit safely in his next nine games, before having to come out of the Liberty line-up first due to injury and then illness. He played in only one of the Flames' next nine games, collecting a hit in two at bats against UMBC to keep the his streak. Young had at least one hit in each of the first seven contests he played upon his return, including an eighth-inning single to run the streak to 18 games on April 10.

Liberty Takes Extra-Inning Contest From No. 19 Coastal Carolina

David Giammaresi singled home the go-ahead run and Aaron Phillips blasted a two-run home run in the 12th inning for a 10-7 win over No. 19 Coastal Carolina in the first game of a three-game Big South series with the Chanticleers.

Reliever Tim John pitched out of jams in the 9th, 10th and 11th frames to pick up the win and run his mark to 2-1. The right-hander stranded the winning run for Coastal Carolina on second base in the ninth, third base in the 10th and second base in th 11th, all with less than two out.

Six Flames notched a pair of hits in the game. Along with Phillips, a defensive replacement in the third inning, blasting his second home run of the year, P.K. Keller and Aaron Grijalva also hit round trippers for Liberty.

Flames Hitters Have Big Day Against Mason

Liberty plated eight second-inning runs on nine hits as the Flames defeated the George Mason Patriots, 13-5, April 24 at Worthington Stadium.

Liberty had 20 hits in game, the first time the Flames reached the mark since their school record-breaking 28 hits against Richmond, Feb. 16, at the Crab House Shootout in Charleston, S.C.

The Flames sent 12 hitters to the plate, erupting for eight runs in the second inning. The eight-run outburst is the biggest in an inning for Liberty this season. At one point during the frame, the Flames had six consecutive hits, including five straight run producers.

Garrett Young also had three hits on the afternoon for Liberty.

The Flames had taken the previous two games with the Highlanders, 16-3 and 13-1. On Saturday afternoon, Liberty had 10 players collect hits during a 13-1 win. David Stokes picked up his team-leading seventh win, giving up one run over seven innings.

Outfielder Derek Bennion paced a 14-hit attack with three hits and Liberty took advantage of four Radford errors in a 16-3 victory over the Highlanders in the series opener on Friday.

Flames Take Two-of-Three From Charleston Southern

P.K. Keller went 3-for-4 and Liberty scored five runs in the fifth inning for an 8-4 victory over Charleston Southern, April 14, at Worthington Stadium.

With the win, Liberty prevailed in the three-game series, two games to one. In addition to Keller's performance, the Flames got strong games from starting pitcher David Stokes and outfielder Garrett Young. Nanry Receives Conference Player of the Week Honors

Outfielder Tim Nanry was selected the Big South Conference Choice Hotels Player of the Week for games played Feb. 12-18.

Nanry batted .667 (6-for-9) in three games, helping the Flames post a 2-1 record at the Crab House Shootout in Charleston, S.C. He garnered his first two starts of the season on Feb. 17 against host The Citadel and Feb. 18 against Richmond.

The outfielder responded with Liberty's first hit of the day against The Citadel in the fifth inning and scored the tying run in the Flames' 2-1, Feb. 17 win.

The next day against intra-state rival Richmond, Nanry belted three home runs, plated eight runs and scored four times in the Flames' 28-7 victory over the Spiders. The senior, who had the best day of his Liberty career, went 5-for-5 in the contest and was hit by a pitch to pace a 28-hit afternoon for the Flames, a new school record for hits in one game. Nanry finished with a 1.667 slugging percentage on the week.

Flames Break Records in Victory over Richmond

Tim Nanry hit three home runs to pace a school record-breaking, 28-hit attack as the Flames defeated the Richmond Spiders, 28-7, Feb. 18 at Riley Park in their final game at the Crab House Shootout in Charleston, S.C. The Flames broke the school mark with 28 hits and tied the single-game record for runs in the contest.

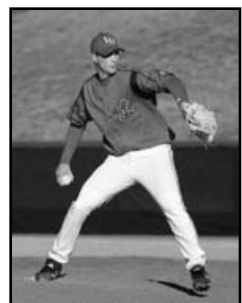
