### The Game

The Liberty Flames (22-9, 6-3 Big South), winners of four straight and nine out of their last 10, will look to continue their winning ways, Tuesday. Liberty will open a six-game homestand by hosting the Elon Phoenix (21-12, 9-6 SoCon) at Worthington Stadium. First pitch is scheduled for 6 p.m.

### Last Time Out

Liberty completed a sweep of their Big South Conference series at Radford, with a 7-6 victory Sunday.

Curran Redal had three hits, including a two-run home run to lead the Flames to their four consecutive win. Tyler Bream and P.J. Jimenez added two hits apiece for the Flames.

Steven Evans returned to the mound after missing a start to run his record to 4-1 on the year. J.J. McLeod earned his fourth save by pitching out of a bases loaded jam in the eighth and retiring all three batters in order in the ninth.

### On Deck

The Flames will host the No. 26 VMI Keydets in a key Big South Conference three-game series at Worthington Stadium, Friday-Sunday. The series gets underway Friday at 7 p.m., with single games Saturday at 4 p.m. and Sunday at 1 p.m.

### Flames on the Air

Tuesday's Elon - Liberty baseball game will be video streamed LIVE. The feed will be available for a nominal fee on the Big South Network. Nick Pierce will handle play-by-play duties and former Flames pitcher Doug Wallace will provide commentary. The broadcast will also be available on the World Wide Web at both LibertyFlames.com and BigSouthSports.com.

**Head Coach Jim Toman**

**Record at Liberty: 90-56-1 (Three Years)  
Career Record: Same**

After leading the Flames to the best record of any Liberty head coach during his first two years, 68-47-1, Jim Toman is in his third year at the helm of the Flames.

Last season, Liberty recorded a 33-21 overall record, while posting a 17-9 mark in Big South Conference play, the most victories by the school since joining the conference in 1992. While recording 30 or more wins in each of Toman's seasons in Lynchburg, Liberty reached the plateau for the fifth consecutive season for the first time in the program's 36-year history in 2009.

Liberty set a new fielding standard in 2009, committing the fewest errors, 53 and finishing the year with the highest fielding percentage, .974, in team history. The 2009 team's fielding percentage ranked 16th in the country. From that infield, third baseman Tyler Bream was named a Freshman All-American by the Collegiate Baseball News.

Pitcher Andrew Wilson became the third player during Toman's time at Liberty to be taken in the MLB draft (Atlanta Braves), while catcher Errol Hollinger later signed a free agent contract (Arizona Diamondbacks).

In 2008, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish the Toman's first season at Liberty with a 35-26-1 mark. The record made Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's 36-year history. He guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by Flames team.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks this past summer. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty also eclipsed the school's single-season doubles mark, ripping 155 two-base hits. The total ranked the Flames fifth in the country in the category.

Liberty finished its season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed the Flames to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. Liberty would go on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman is the sixth head coach in the 35-year history of the Liberty Baseball program. The second-year skipper comes to Liberty after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 19-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball. Toman's 2003, 2005 and 2006 classes were named the top recruiting classes by the publication.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

In addition, South Carolina posted eight-straight seasons of 40 or more wins with Toman on the Gamecock coaching staff, including 2007. During Toman's 11 seasons at South Carolina, he helped the Gamecocks to a combined 500-220 (.694) record.

Toman earned four baseball letters at N.C. State, 1981-84, and was captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in vocational industrial education in 1985. He received a Master of Science degree in sport management from N.C. State in 1995.

Upon graduation, Toman entered the coaching profession as an assistant at Richmond County High School in Rockingham, N.C., for two years. He moved into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989 as an assistant at Florida International for one year. At FIU, he was responsible for the weight program, worked with the squad's catchers and coached first base. Toman joined the N.C. State staff before the 1990 season.

## The Coaches

Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman is in his third year at the helm of the Flames. In his first two seasons, he guided the Flames to 68 wins, the most during the first two years under any head coach in program history, and best winning percentage (.591) over the same span.

Last season, Liberty posted the most victories in Big South Conference play with a 17-9 mark, since joining the conference in 1992. The Flames recorded an overall record of 33-21 in Toman's second year.

A 21-year member of the college coaching ranks, he served 18 years as a member of Ray Tanner's staffs at South Carolina and N.C. State. Toman was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball.

Elon Head Coach Mike Kennedy is in his 14th season. The winningest coach in school history, Kennedy has led the Phoenix to 11 campaigns of 30 or more victories.

In addition, after winning 41 last season, Kennedy's Elon teams have won 40 or more games in three of the last four seasons. His 2006 squad set a new school record with 45 victories, while the 2008 team fell just one win shy of that mark and captured the program's first NCAA Division I league tournament title.

Last year, Elon won its third Southern Conference regular season title in four years and earned a second seed in the Atlanta Regional of the NCAA Tournament. Kennedy's squad finished the SoCon season with a 22-3 record and went 41-18 overall. The team also collected the program's first top-25 finish at the Division I level, ranking 24th in the final Baseball America poll and 27th in the last National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association top-30 poll. Kennedy was chosen as the league's coach of the year for the third time in his career.

Prior to the start of the 2009 season, Kennedy was selected to serve as the pitching coach for USA Baseball's National Team (Collegiate) during the summer. Under Kennedy's guidance, Team USA's pitching staff recorded a 2.16 ERA in the squad's 24 games and won the 2009 World Baseball Challenge title.

### All-time against Elon

Tuesday's meeting between Elon, a former member of the Big South Conference, and Liberty will be the 23rd meeting all-time between the two teams on the baseball diamond. However, the two teams have not met since 2003.

Liberty holds a 15-7 advantage in the all-time series, which began in 1976.

### Baseball in the Commonwealth

Thirteen Division I baseball teams call the Commonwealth of Virginia home. The Flames will play a slate of 15 games against opponents from the "Old Dominion State" this season. Liberty enters the week with a 7-3 mark in games against Virginia foes.

The Flames are scheduled to meet state squads George Mason (two times), James Madison (two times), Old Dominion (two times), VCU (two times) and Virginia Tech (one time) along with Big South Conference opponents Radford (three times) and VMI (three times) this season.

## Scouting the Phoenix

Elon enters Tuesday night's contest having dropped their last two contests, Saturday and Sunday, against Georgia Southern. Prior to the setbacks, the Phoenix had run off six straight victories, including a win at then No. 20 North Carolina this past Tuesday. Elon begins the week with the fifth best road record in the country at 11-3.

Last week's SoCon Player of the Week, catcher Mike Melillo leads the Phoenix with a .348 batting average, 32 runs scored and 34 RBIs. Shortstop Neal Pritchard and designated hitter Alex Swim each are hitting .341. Melillo and Pritchard are the only Elon players to have started every game this season.

As a team, the Phoenix are hitting .300 and averaging 8.42 runs per game. Meanwhile, Elon's mound staff has a 5.84 ERA and has held opponents to a .297 batting average.

Tuesday's starter Ken Ferrer has posted a 5-2 record with a 6.54 ERA in 11 appearances this season, including four starts.

Three Phoenix have made 13 or more appearances out of the bullpen. Kyle Webb has the most outings with 14, striking out at least one batter in each of his 16 innings this season. He has posted an 0-1 record with three saves and a 5.62 ERA. Thomas Girdwood, who was first team All-SoCon last season, has made 13 appearances with a 3-0 mark with two saves and a 1.93 ERA. Last year, he had 17 saves for the Phoenix. John Brebbia also has been summoned from the bullpen 13 times. He is 1-0 with 5.5 ERA.

## Analyzing April

The Flames have jumped out to a 6-1 record, including a 5-1 Big South mark, to begin April. Liberty is scheduled to play 18 games during the month.

Last season, the Flames finished the month of April with a 10-8 record. Liberty posted a 9-3 mark in Big South Conference play. Since 1976, the Flames have recorded an all-time mark of 337-282-1 (.544) in April.

## March Mayhem

With three-straight victories to close the month, Liberty posted a 10-8 mark in games during March this season, including a 1-2 start to Big South Conference play. The Flames are 347-275-2 (.558) all-time in program history during the month.

## Fast Starts in February

After completing the month of February with a 6-0 record, its best February start since 1995, the Flames have recorded a .500 or better mark for the month 20 out of 23 times. Since beginning play during the month of February in 1984, Liberty has posted an all-time mark of 70-32 for a .686 winning percentage.

Over the past five years, the Flames are 28-9 (.757) during the month of February, while recording a 14-3 mark under head coach Jim Toman during his three years at Liberty.

## Home Sweet Home

For the past 32 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium home. Named for program architect and the first Liberty head baseball coach, Al Worthington, Liberty has compiled an impressive 515-233-5 record at the stadium for a winning percentage of .687 since the facility's inception in 1979.

The Flames have posted a 10-4 record at Worthington this season. Liberty is slated to play 28 contests at home in 2010.

The Flames finished the 2009 regular season with a 19-5 record at the facility and are 33-18-1 at home under three-year head coach Jim Toman's guidance.

## Flames on the Road

With four wins on the road last week, the Flames have posted a 10-5 mark on the road this season. Liberty has won five-straight games. The Flames are also 2-0 in contests on neutral fields.

Head Coach Jim Toman's team finished 2009 with a 11-13 final road ledger. The Flames also compiled a 3-3 record on neutral fields.

Over the last 10 games, four Flames have hit better than .400, led by second baseman P.J. Jimenez. The senior has hit .564, with 22 hits. Jimenez has raised his average to .388, tying Curran Redal for the team lead. Redal has hit .512 during the stretch, with 21 hits.

Corner outfielders Michael Robertson and Doug Bream have also posted above .400 averages during the stretch. Robertson, who begins the week with a 12-game hitting streak, has hit .457. Bream has a .414 average over the period and team-high 10 RBIs.

## Teufel Strikes Out Career High

Senior left-hander Shawn Teufel struck out 10 batters in a 10-2 Liberty victory at Radford, Friday. The 10 strikeouts were a career-high for the left-hander. Previously, he had struck out nine on three different occasions.

Teufel moved to 6-1 on the season in the contest, allowing two runs on eight hits over eight innings. He walked only one batter to go along with the 10 strikeouts, the most by a Liberty pitcher this season. The senior finished strong, retiring the last nine batters he faced in the game.

The left-hander received backing from second baseman P.J. Jimenez had three hits to lead the Flames. It was the second baseman's seventh multi-hit game in his last eight contests. Shortstop Matt Williams, designated hitter Jeff Jefferson and right fielder Michael Robertson each had two hits apiece. Robertson also had three RBIs.

## Liberty Outduels Radford

The Liberty Flames defeated the Radford Highlanders, 3-1, in a pitcher's duel, Saturday afternoon in a Big South Conference match-up at the RU Baseball Field.

Liberty starter Keegan Linza and reliever Josh Richardson combined to keep Radford off the scoreboard in the game. Linza recorded the win to run his record to a Big South-leading 7-0. The junior gave up the only Radford run of the afternoon on five hits over 5 1/3 innings. He struck out six batters and walked five.

Richardson earned his third save of the season, with 3 2/3 innings of relief. The freshman struck out three batters. He gave up five hits and received an assist from left fielder Doug Bream in the bottom of seventh, when the outfielder threw out a runner trying to tie the game at 2-2 at home plate.

Third baseman Tyler Bream had two hits for the Flames, including a RBI double in the eighth to extend the Liberty advantage to 3-1.

### Umberger Joins Big South 200 Ks Club

With two strikeouts in his first start of the season on March 17 at Duke, Liberty senior right-hander Dustin Umberger became the 53rd pitcher in Big South Conference history to record 200 or more strikeouts. The senior becomes the first Flame since David Bechtold in 2005 to strike out over 200 batters. Bechtold struck out 241 hitters from 2002-05.

Currently, Umberger's career strikeout totals ranks sixth on the school's career strikeout list. The right-hander has struck out 209 batters, and enters the week, three strikeouts away from moving ahead of Randy Tomlin for fifth place on the list. Tomlin recorded 211 strikeouts for the Flames from 1986-88. For two years, he was Umberger's pitching coach with the Flames. Mike Brown, who pitched at Liberty from 1994-97, holds the career strikeout mark with 287.

Returning from a medical redshirt in 2009, Umberger is 0-1 on the year with a 6.20 ERA in nine appearances this season. The right-hander has struck out 15 batters in 20 1/3 innings this season. He has made four starts.

### Redal At It Again

Liberty outfielder Curran Redal completed the 2009 season as one of the toughest hitters in the nation to strike out. The junior finished the year, striking out once every 21.3 at bats, ranking him ninth among NCAA Division I batters in the country. Redal struck out only 10 times in 213 at bats over 54 games last season.

This year, the senior has once again proven to be hard to strike out. Redal has fanned only three times in 121 at bats this season, or once per every 40.3 at bats. The outfielder ranked as the second toughest batter to strike out in the country in the latest NCAA statistics through games of April 4.

The outfielder enters the week ranked third in the Big South Conference in on base percentage with a .493 average.

### Redal Garners Player of the Week Honors

Liberty senior outfielder Curran Redal was named the Big South Conference Player of the Week for games played March 29-April 4.

Redal hit .579 (11-19) with three multi-hit games and a .654 on-base average from the leadoff spot in the Liberty order, helping the Flames post a 4-1 mark during the week. He opened his week with two walks, a hit-by-pitch and an RBI in Liberty's 9-7 win against George Mason on March 30, and followed that by reaching base five times in a win at VCU, the next day. In the 7-4 win, Redal was 3-3 with a walk, hit-by-pitch, stolen base and run scored.

The Flames center fielder hit .571 (8-14) in Liberty's three-game series against High Point at Worthington Stadium, April 2-3. He notched a hit and a run scored in the Flames' 6-4 win in the series opener, April 2, and went 7-10 in doubleheader split on April 3. In the first game, Redal had the first five-hit game of his Liberty career, and added two hits in the nightcap. For the week, Redal slugged .684, had 13 total bases and walked four times. In addition, he added two doubles, four runs scored and three RBIs.

He is the second Flame tabbed the conference's Player of the Week. Third baseman Tyler Bream was named the Big South Player of the Week for games played Feb. 19-21.

### Jimenez's Multi-Hit Binge

Second baseman P.J. Jimenez posted a .526 batting average during the week of March 30-April 3, and continued his hot hitting this past week.

The second baseman opened the week with three-hit games at Old Dominion, Tuesday and Radford, Friday. After only one hit on Saturday, Jimenez had two hits, Sunday afternoon at Radford.

The burst at the plate has raised the senior's batting average to .388 on the year. He is tied with Curran Redal for the team lead. The second baseman has had eight multi-hit games in the 10 games over the two-week stretch. Jimenez leads the Flames with 16 multi-hit games. He also leads Liberty in runs scored with 33.

### Teufel Named to Watch List

Liberty senior Shawn Teufel has been listed on the 2010 National Pitcher of the Year Watch List. The Flames left-hander is one of 49 pitchers on the initial list released by the College Baseball Foundation, March 23.

Teufel has posted a 1.86 ERA with a 6-1 record this season. He is among the national ERA leaders, ranking 22nd in the latest NCAA National Statistical Summary through games of April 4. In addition, the left-hander ranks second in the Big South in both ERA and wins.

Teufel has struck out 47 batters, ranking fourth in the conference. The senior is also holding opponents to a .214 batting average. The mark ranks third in the Big South in the category. He has pitched 53 1/3 innings, which ranks him second in the conference behind teammate Keegan Linza.

In his past two starts, Teufel has set personal milestones. Last Friday at Radford, Teufel struck out a career-high 10 batters in a 10-2 Liberty win. A week before (April 2), the left-hander recorded his first career complete game in a 6-4 win over High Point.

After yielding one run in the opening inning of Liberty's season opener at Kennesaw State, Teufel ran off a string of 24 scoreless innings, before giving up a run during the Flames' 8-4 win over Manhattan, March 19.

### Turning Two

Liberty has turned 34 double plays this season, and ranked tied for 20th nationally in double plays in the last NCAA Statistical Report for games through April 4. The Flames total is just two shy of last year's season total of 36 over 54 games.

In addition, the Liberty Flames turned five ground balls into double plays during their 9-1 win over St. John's on March 12. The five double plays turned by the Liberty infield are the most in a game by the Flames over the past 11 seasons.

In 2008, the Flames turned four double plays in a game twice. The contests happened a week apart, as Liberty had four double plays in an 11-5 win over Army, March 8. Seven days later, the Flames recorded four double plays in a 5-0 loss at Southern Miss, March 15.

Liberty also turned four double plays this season in a 6-3 victory over Lehigh on Feb. 27 at the Hughes Brothers Challenge in Wilmington, N.C.

### Roundtrippers = Wins

In 26 out of Liberty's 33 victories last season, the Flames hit at least one home run in the contest. Liberty had a record of 26-6 when hitting at least one roundtripper in a game.

Jim Toman's squad belted 60 home runs last season. Liberty's 60 home runs were the most by the Flames since 2002, when Liberty hit 86.

The Flames have started this season out in similar fashion, hitting at least one home run in 15 of their 22 victories.

### Teufel Notches Complete Game

Liberty left-hander Shawn Teufel went the distance for the first time in his career, as the Flames downed the High Point Panthers, 6-4, April 2 in a Big South Conference night contest at Worthington Stadium.

Facing the fourth-best hitting team in the country, Teufel held the Panthers in check for most of the contest, running his record to 5-1 on the year. The senior scattered four runs on nine hits in the game. He struck out eight batters and walked two.

Liberty took the lead for good in the contest during the bottom of the fifth inning, sending 11 men to the plate to score five runs on five hits and taking advantage of three Panther errors. Left fielder Doug Bream had the big blow of the frame, launching a first pitch, bases-loaded, double off the wall in right-center field, to give the Flames the lead at 5-3.

Catcher Nathan Thompson had three hits, drove in a run and scored a run in the contest.

Teufel held the Jaspers in check throughout the first seven innings of the contest to run his record to 4-0 on the season. The left-hander allowed one run and scattered five hits in the victory, striking out five and walking three. The Jaspers scored their lone run against Teufel in the fourth inning.

Shortstop Matt Williams had three hits for the Flames, driving in a run and scoring one. Center fielder Curran Redal and catcher Nathan Thompson added two hits apiece. Designated hitter Austin Taylor hit his first home run in a Liberty uniform in the first inning.

After falling in 10 innings, the next day, 14-13, the Flames took the series behind another solid pitching effort on March 21. Right-hander Keegan Linza went 8 1/3 innings, the longest outing for a Liberty pitcher this season, and J.J. McLeod recorded the last two outs by inducing a double play for his second save in an 8-6, Flames win.

Linza allowed six runs on five hits during the 8 1/3 inning span. He struck out six and walked three. In the top of the ninth, McLeod was summoned with a runner on and one out, and got the double play to close out the victory for the Flames.

Liberty took the lead for good in the contest with four runs on four hits in the fifth inning. The big frame gave the Flames an 8-4 lead.

Williams, Redal, second baseman P.J. Jimenez, third baseman Tyler Bream and right fielder Michael Robertson each had two hits for the balanced offensive attack by the Flames. One of Jimenez's two hits was his second home run of the season.

### Teufel's Scoreless Streak Ends

Senior left-hander Shawn Teufel gave up only his second run of the season March 19. A Manhattan home run in the fourth halted the left-hander's scoreless innings streak at 24, which spanned over five starts for the senior. Teufel had allowed only one prior run, in the first inning of his season-opening start at Kennesaw State on Feb. 19, and has not allow one since.

The streak tops a previous career-high of 10 scoreless innings by the pitcher last season, from April 4-18. The scoreless span left the left-hander five innings shy of the school record of 29, set by Tim Harrell in 2000.

### Best Start Since 1995

Liberty started its 2010 season with a 9-0 record. The mark tied the 1995 Flames for the best start to a year in the 36-year history of the program. Liberty tied the mark with a 10-1 win over Delaware State at Worthington Stadium on March 7.

The Flames' start was the best during the three-year tenure of Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman. During Toman's first season in 2008, the Flames opened the year, 5-1.

Liberty also tied the programs' record for consecutive wins at the NCAA Division I level with the streak. Five other Flames squads have won nine consecutive games (2009, 2008, 2006, 1995, 1985). The 1976 Liberty team holds the school record for consecutive victories with 15.

### Flames Open Home Slate with Sweep

The weekend of March 5-7, Liberty opened its 2010 home schedule with a sweep of a three-game series with the Delaware State Hornets. The Flames dominated the series, outscoring the Hornets, 34-2, over the span of the three games. Liberty also hit .368 as a team, while Flames pitchers limited Delaware State to a .167 batting average.

Catcher Nathan Thompson paced Liberty at the plate in the series, going 5-for-10 (.500) with two home runs, a double, five runs scored and seven RBIs. In Sunday's final game, the senior catcher hit his team-leading fourth home run, a three-run round tripper in the first inning, and drove in five of Liberty's runs in the Flames' 10-1 win. Center fielder Curran Redal also hit .500 for Liberty.

Flames pitchers had a 0.72 ERA during the three-game series, striking out 24 and walking 10. Starters Keegan Linza and Steven Evans each won their third game of the year in as many outings, while Friday's starter Shawn Teufel ran his mark to 2-0 on the season.

### Bream Named Conference Player of the Week

Liberty sophomore third baseman Tyler Bream was named as the Big South Conference Choice Hotels Baseball Player of the Week for Feb. 23.

Bream hit .700 (7-for-10) in the Flames' three-game, season-opening sweep of Kennesaw State. The third baseman scored six runs and drove in five RBIs during the three-game series, reaching base three times in each contest to record a .688 on-base percentage. The sophomore had two doubles and a towering two-run home run during the weekend to post a 1.200 slugging percentage.

Bream opened the season on Feb. 19 by going 3-for-3, including an RBI-double and a two-run homer, while driving in four runs. The following afternoon, the third baseman walked twice, drove in a run with a sacrifice fly and scored twice. In the final game of the series on Feb. 21, Bream finished the series by going 4-for-5 with a double and three runs scored to lead the Flames to the sweep.
