The Liberty Flames (22-10, 6-3 Big South) host the No. 26 ranked VMI Keydets (29-5, 10-2) for a key Big South Conference series, Friday-Sunday at Worthington Stadium. Friday, the series will open with a 7 p.m. start time, followed by a 4 p.m. first pitch on Saturday. The series will conclude, Sunday, with first pitch scheduled for 1 p.m.

Last Time Out

The visiting Elon Phoenix scored three fifth-inning runs to defeat the Liberty Flames, 5-3, Tuesday evening in a non-conference game at Worthington Stadium. The loss snapped a four-game win streak by Liberty.

The Flames plated all three of their runs in the bottom of the fourth inning. After which, they were held in check the rest of the way by winning pitcher Ken Ferrer and three Elon relievers.

Center fielder Curran Redal was the only Flame with two hits in the contest, as Liberty had seven hits in the contest.

On Deck

Liberty will closeout its six-game homestand with two midweek nonconference games. Tuesday, the Flames will welcome the Duke Blue Devils to Worthington Stadium. Game time is scheduled for 6 p.m. Wednesday, Liberty will host the James Madison Dukes. First pitch is scheduled for 3 p.m.

Head Coach Jim Toman

**Record at Liberty: 90-57-1 (Three Years)
Career Record: Same**

After leading the Flames to the best record of any Liberty head coach during his first two years, 68-47-1, Jim Toman is in his third year at the helm of the Flames.

Last season, Liberty recorded a 33-21 overall record, while posting a 17-9 mark in Big South Conference play, the most victories by the school since joining the conference in 1992. While recording 30 or more wins in each of Toman's seasons in Lynchburg, Liberty reached the plateau for the fifth consecutive season for the first time in the program's 36-year history in 2009.

Liberty set a new fielding standard in 2009, committing the fewest errors, 53 and finishing the year with the highest fielding percentage, .974, in team history. The 2009 team's fielding percentage ranked 16th in the country. From that infield, third baseman Tyler Bream was named a Freshman All-American by the Collegiate Baseball News.

Pitcher Andrew Wilson became the third player during Toman's time at Liberty to be taken in the MLB draft (Atlanta Braves), while catcher Errol Hollinger later signed a free agent contract (Arizona Diamondbacks).

In 2008, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish the Toman's first season at Liberty with a 35-26-1 mark. The record made Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's 36-year history. He guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by Flames team.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks this past summer. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty also eclipsed the school's single-season doubles mark, ripping 155 two-base hits. The total ranked the Flames fifth in the country in the category.

Liberty finished its season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed the Flames to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. Liberty would go on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman is the sixth head coach in the 35-year history of the Liberty Baseball program. The second-year skipper comes to Liberty after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 19-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball. Toman's 2003, 2005 and 2006 classes were named the top recruiting classes by the publication.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

In addition, South Carolina posted eight-straight seasons of 40 or more wins with Toman on the Gamecock coaching staff, including 2007. During Toman's 11 seasons at South Carolina, he helped the Gamecocks to a combined 500-220 (.694) record.

Toman earned four baseball letters at N.C. State, 1981-84, and was captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in vocational industrial education in 1985. He received a Master of Science degree in sport management from N.C. State in 1995.

Upon graduation, Toman entered the coaching profession as an assistant at Richmond County High School in Rockingham, N.C., for two years. He moved into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989 as an assistant at Florida International for one year. At FIU, he was responsible for the weight program, worked with the squad's catchers and coached first base. Toman joined the N.C. State staff before the 1990 season.

The Coaches

Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman is in his third year at the helm of the Flames. In his first two seasons, he guided the Flames to 68 wins, the most during the first two years under any head coach in program history, and best winning percentage (.591) over the same span.

Last season, Liberty posted the most victories in Big South Conference play with a 17-9 mark, since joining the conference in 1992. The Flames recorded an overall record of 33-21 in Toman's second year.

A 21-year member of the college coaching ranks, he served 18 years as a member of Ray Tanner's staffs at South Carolina and N.C. State. Toman was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball.

Marlin Ikenberry is in his seventh season at the helm of the VMI program, and is the winningest coach in the history of VMI Baseball. Ikenberry has posted a 190-172 record at his alma mater.

After finishing 18-35 in 2009, Ikenberry has led the Keydets to their highest national ranking and their best start in school history this season. VMI enters the weekend with the most victories in the country.

The last several years have seen Ikenberry's Keydets post three consecutive winning seasons for the first time in 52 years, defeat a ranked team for four straight years and have multiple players drafted in each of the past five seasons.

In 2007, Ikenberry led the Keydets to a 34-21 record. The win total is the most in school history.

All-time against VMI

Friday's meeting between VMI and Liberty will be the 39th meeting all-time between the two teams on the baseball diamond. Liberty holds a 28-10 advantage in the all-time series since 1976.

Last season, the Flames took two out of three games from the Keydets in Lexington, April 3-5. Liberty dropped the first game, 13-6, but rebounded with 9-7 and 4-3 wins to take the series.

The last time the two teams met in Lynchburg, Liberty took two of the three games. After the Flames won the opener, 8-0, the Keydets won the longest game in Liberty history, 6-5 in 16 innings. Liberty won the final game of the set, 6-1.

Baseball in the Commonwealth

Thirteen Division I baseball teams call the Commonwealth of Virginia home. The Flames will play a slate of 15 games against opponents from the "Old Dominion State" this season. Liberty begins the weekend with a 7-3 mark in games against Virginia foes.

The Flames are scheduled to meet state squads George Mason (two times), James Madison (two times), Old Dominion (two times), VCU (two times) and Virginia Tech (one time) along with Big South Conference opponents Radford (three times) and VMI (three times) this season.

Scouting theKeydets

Coming off a 12-3 victory over No.1 Virginia, Wednesday in Lexington, the No. 26 VMI Keydets enter this weekend's series with a 29-5 overall record and a 10-2 Big South mark. The Keydets are tied with Coastal Carolina with the nation's most wins and are ranked the highest they have ever been in school history. In addition, VMI is riding a nine-game winning streak.

The Keydets have displayed one of the top offenses in the country this season. VMI entered the week ranked sixth in the country with a .355 team batting average and is eighth in the nation in runs scored per game with a 9.2 average.

Catcher Alex Haitzuka, the Big South's leading hitter, is one of three Keydets with a batting average higher than .400. Haitzuka has posted a .446 average, which ranks 16th in the country.

Leftfielder Graham Sullivan and second baseman Cory Spangenberg are the other two Keydets over .400, with each hitting .411. Sullivan is second in the Big South with 46 RBIs. Spangenberg is second in the conference in runs scored with 48 runs scored.

The VMI mound staff has also been solid this season. The Keydets enter the week-end with a 3.90 ERA and are allowing 4.7 runs per game.

Pacing the VMI mound staff is Saturday starter Jason Farley. The left-hander began the week third in the conference with a 2.03 ERA. He is 4-1 with 27 strikeouts in 48 2/3 innings of work. Adam Lopez, Friday's starter, has recorded a 5-0 record with a 3.32 ERA over eight starts this season. He is third in the Big South with 57 strikeouts.

In the bullpen, the Keydets have been led by this week's conference Co-Pitcher of the Week, Michael Devine. The reliever is 3-1 with Big South-leading seven saves in 14 appearances this season. John Garrett has also seen a lot of time out of the VMI bullpen, posting a 4-0 record with a 1.65 ERA in 12 appearances.

Analyzing April

The Flames have posted a 6-2 record, including a 5-1 Big South mark, so far in the month of April. Liberty is scheduled to play 18 games during the month.

Last season, the Flames finished the month of April with a 10-8 record. Liberty posted a 9-3 mark in Big South Conference play. Since 1976, the Flames have recorded an all-time mark of 337-283-1 (.543) in April.

March Mayhem

With three-straight victories to close the month, Liberty posted a 10-8 mark in games during March this season, including a 1-2 start to Big South Conference play. The Flames are 347-275-2 (.558) all-time in program history during the month.

Fast Starts in February

After completing the month of February with a 6-0 record, its best February start since 1995, the Flames have recorded a .500 or better mark for the month 20 out of 23 times. Since beginning play during the month of February in 1984, Liberty has posted an all-time mark of 70-32 for a .686 winning percentage.

Over the past five years, the Flames are 28-9 (.757) during the month of February, while recording a 14-3 mark under head coach Jim Toman during his three years at Liberty.

Home Sweet Home

For the past 32 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium home. Named for program architect and the first Liberty head baseball coach, Al Worthington, Liberty has compiled an impressive 515-234-5 record at the stadium for a winning percentage of .686 since the facility's inception in 1979.

The Flames have posted a 10-5 record at Worthington this season. Liberty is slated to play 28 contests at home in 2010.

The Flames finished the 2009 regular season with a 19-5 record at the facility and are 33-18-1 at home under three-year head coach Jim Toman's guidance.

Flames on the Road

With four wins on the road last week, the Flames have posted a 10-5 mark on the road this season. Liberty has won five-straight games. The Flames are also 2-0 in contests on neutral fields.

Head Coach Jim Toman's team finished 2009 with a 11-13 final road ledger. The Flames also compiled a 3-3 record on neutral fields.

Liberty at Night

The Flames have started the season, 2-0, with victories in their first two night games of the season. Liberty will play 11 games under the lights this year. The Flames went 8-7 at night last season.

Making It Tough to Score

Liberty enters its weekend series with the Keydets, allowing its opponents 4.74 runs per game. Liberty has only given up more than five runs in a contest 10 times this season. Through 32 games, Liberty has outscored its opponents, 240-152.

Scoring First

Liberty has gotten on the scoreboard first in 26 of their 32 contests this season. The Flames are 21-5, when scoring first. The Flames' 7-3 victory at UNC Asheville on March 27 is the only time this season that Liberty has won a contest when not scoring first.

Liberty All-Time Against the Big South

Redal At It Again

Liberty outfielder Curran Redal completed the 2009 season as one of the toughest hitters in the nation to strike out. The junior finished the year, striking out once every 21.3 at bats, ranking him ninth among NCAA Division I batters in the country. Redal struck out only 10 times in 213 at bats over 54 games last season.

This year, the senior has once again proven to be hard to strike out. Redal has fanned only three times in 121 at bats this season, or once per every 40.3 at bats. The outfielder ranked as the second toughest batter to strike out in the country in the latest NCAA statistics through games of April 11.

The outfielder enters the week ranked fourth in the Big South Conference in on base percentage with a .490 average.

Victory 1,000 Reached

With a 10-2 win last Friday at Radford, Liberty recorded its 1,000th win in the program's history. Flames' left-hander Shawn Teufel, who ran his record to 6-1 in the contest, set a new career-high of his own with 10 strikeouts in the game. Liberty baseball is in its 37th year of intercollegiate competition. The Flames posted an 11-14 record in its inaugural season under Al Worthington in 1974.

- The Flames have recorded one 40-win season (1983).
- The Flames have won 30 or more games in a season on 14 occasions. In addition, Liberty has posted 30 or more victories in a season each of the last five seasons.
- The Flames have had six head coaches during their 37 years - Al Worthington, Bobby Richardson, Johnny Hunton, Dave Pastors, Matt Royer and Jim Toman. Worthington, the program's first coach, is also its winningest and longest tenured, recording 343 victories over 13 seasons.

Jimenez's Multi-Hit Binge

Second baseman P.J. Jimenez enters this weekend having posted eight multi-hit games in his last 11 contests. During the span, the senior has hit .534.

The burst at the plate has raised the senior's batting average to .383 on the year. He is second on the Flames in a batting average.

Over the period, Jimenez has had three hits in a contest four times. All four contests were Flames' wins. The second baseman leads the Flames with 16 multi-hit games and is ranked eighth in the Big South Conference in batting average.

Bats Power Recent Success

The Flames won nine out of 10 games from March 28 through April 11. Fueling the successful span was the Liberty bats. The Flames hit .355 as a team during the span, raising their team average 19 points during the period from .299 to .318.

Over the 10 games, four Flames hit better than .400, led by second baseman P.J. Jimenez. The senior has hit .564, with 22 hits. Jimenez raised his average to .388, tying Curran Redal for the team lead at the time. Redal hit .512 during the stretch, with 21 hits.

Corner outfielders Michael Robertson and Doug Bream also posted above .400 averages during the stretch. Robertson hit .457, while Bream had a .414 average over the period with a team-high 10 RBIs.

Teufel Strikes Out Career High

Senior left-hander Shawn Teufel struck out 10 batters in a 10-2 Liberty victory at Radford, last Friday. The 10 strikeouts were a career-high for the left-hander. Previously, he had struck out nine on three different occasions.

Teufel moved to 6-1 on the season in the contest, allowing two runs on eight hits over eight innings. He walked only one batter to go along with the 10 strikeouts, the most by a Liberty pitcher this season. The senior finished strong, retiring the last nine batters he faced in the game.

Liberty Sweeps Radford

Curran Redal had three hits, including a two-run home run, as the Liberty Flames defeated the Radford Highlanders, 7-6, last Sunday at the RU Baseball Field to complete a sweep of a three-game Big South series.

Liberty starter Steven Evans picked up the win to move to 4-1 on the year. The left-hander gave up four runs on 11 hits. He struck out six batters and walked two. J.J. McLeod, the last of four Flames to take the mound in the contest, earned his fourth save of the season. He pitched the final 1 2/3 innings, striking out three batters and walking one. Liberty pitchers stranded 15 Highlander baserunners in the contest.

Besides Redal with three hits, Tyler Bream and P.J. Jimenez had two hits apiece for the Flames. The Highlanders loaded the bases twice in the game, once with one out and once with two outs, but were unable to score a run.

The Flames defeated Radford, 3-1, in a pitcher's duel, the day before. Liberty starter Keegan Linza and reliever Josh Richardson combined to keep Radford off the scoreboard in the game.

Linza recorded the win to run his record to a Big South-leading 7-0. The junior gave up the only Radford run of the afternoon on five hits over 5 1/3 innings. He struck out six batters and walked five.

Richardson earned his third save of the season, with 3 2/3 innings of relief. The freshman struck out three batters. He gave up five hits and recieved an assist from left fielder Doug Bream in the bottom of seventh, when the outfielder threw out a runner trying to tie the game at 2-2 at home plate.

Tyler Bream had two hits for the Flames, including a RBI double in the eighth to extend the Liberty advantage to 3-1.

In the opener on Friday, Liberty jumped out to a five-run advantage in the first inning and Shawn Teufel struck out a career-high 10 batters, as the Flames cruised to a 10-3 victory over the Highlanders.

Teufel ran his record to 6-1 on the season. The left-hander allowed three runs on eight hits over eight innings of work. He struck out 10 and walked one, retiring the last nine batters he faced.

Liberty batted around to open the contest, plating five runs on five hits and two errors in the top of the first to take a 5-0 advantage.

Jimenez, who had multi-hit games in seven of his last eight contests, had three hits for the Flames. Matt Williams, Jeff Jefferson and Michael Robertson each had two hits apiece. Robertson also had three RBIs.

Umberger Joins Big South 200 Ks Club

With two strikeouts in his first start of the season on March 17 at Duke, Liberty senior right-hander Dustin Umberger became the 53rd pitcher in Big South Conference history to record 200 or more strikeouts. The senior became the first Flame since David Bechtold in 2005 to strike out over 200 batters. Bechtold struck out 241 hitters from 2002-05.

Curently, Umberger's career strikeout totals ranks sixth on the school's career strikeout list. The right-hander has struck out 209 batters, and enters the weekend, three strikeouts away from moving ahead of Randy Tomlin for fifth place on the list.

Tomlin recorded 211 strikeouts for the Flames from 1986-88. For two years, he was Umberger's pitching coach with the Flames. Mike Brown, who pitched at Liberty from 1994-97, holds the career strikeout mark with 287.

Returning from a medical redshirt in 2009, Umberger is 0-1 on the year with a 6.20 ERA in nine appearances this season. The right-hander has struck out 15 batters in 20 1/3 innings this season. He has made four starts.

Four Flames, Curran Redal, Doug Bream, Tyler Bream and P.J. Jimenez, had three hits each in the contest. Jeff Jefferson hit a two-run home run, his second roundtripper of the year, for Liberty, capping the seven-run first frame.

Freshman right-hander Cameron Giannini picked up his second consecutive win to run his record to 2-1 on the season. The first of four Liberty pitchers in the contest, the right-hander allowed one run on five hits through the first five innings.

Redal Garners Player of the Week Honors

Liberty senior outfielder Curran Redal was named the Big South Conference Player of the Week for games played March 29-April 4.

Redal hit .579 (11-19) with three multi-hit games and a .654 on-base average from the leadoff spot in the Liberty order, helping the Flames post a 4-1 mark during the week. He opened his week with two walks, a hit-by-pitch and an RBI in Liberty's 9-7 win against George Mason on March 30, and followed that by reaching base five times in a win at VCU, the next day. In the 7-4 win, Redal was 3-3 with a walk, hit-by-pitch, stolen base and run scored.

The Flames center fielder hit .571 (8-14) in Liberty's three-game series against High Point at Worthington Stadium, April 2-3. He notched a hit and a run scored in the Flames' 6-4 win in the series opener, April 2, and went 7-10 in doubleheader split on April 3. In the first game, Redal had the first five-hit game of his Liberty career, and added two hits in the nightcap. For the week, Redal slugged .684, had 13 total bases and walked four times. In addition, he added two doubles, four runs scored and three RBIs.

He is the second Flame tabbed the conference's Player of the Week. Third baseman Tyler Bream was named the Big South Player of the Week for games played Feb. 19-21.

Teufel Named to Watch List

Liberty senior Shawn Teufel has been listed on the 2010 National Pitcher of the Year Watch List. The Flames left-hander is one of 49 pitchers on the initial list released by the College Baseball Foundation, March 23.

Teufel has posted a 1.86 ERA with a 6-1 record this season. He is among the national ERA leaders, ranking 13th in the latest NCAA National Statistical Summary through games of April 11. In addition, the left-hander ranks second in the Big South in both ERA and wins.

Teufel has struck out 47 batters, ranking fourth in the conference. The senior is also holding opponents to a .214 batting average. The mark ranks third in the Big South in the category. He has pitched 53 1/3 innings, which ranks him second in the conference behind teammate Keegan Linza.

In his past two starts, Teufel has set personal milestones. Last Friday at Radford, Teufel struck out a career-high 10 batters in a 10-2 Liberty win. A week before (April 2), the left-hander recorded his first career complete game in a 6-4 win over High Point.

After yielding one run in the opening inning of Liberty's season opener at Kennesaw State, Teufel ran off a string of 24 scoreless innings, before giving up a run during the Flames' 8-4 win over Manhattan, March 19.

Turning Two

Liberty has turned 34 double plays this season, and ranks 25th nationally in double plays in the last NCAA Statistical Report for games through April 11. The Flames total is just two shy of last year's season total of 36 over 54 games.

In addition, the Liberty Flames turned five ground balls into double plays during their 9-1 win over St. John's on March 12. The five double plays turned by the Liberty infield are the most in a game by the Flames over the past 11 seasons.

Jim Toman's squad belted 60 home runs last season. Liberty's 60 home runs were the most by the Flames since 2002, when Liberty hit 86.

The Flames have started this season out in similar fashion, hitting at least one home run in 15 of their 22 victories.

Teufel Notches Complete Game

Liberty left-hander Shawn Teufel went the distance for the first time in his career, as the Flames downed the High Point Panthers, 6-4, April 2 in a Big South Conference night contest at Worthington Stadium.

Facing the fourth-best hitting team in the country, Teufel held the Panthers in check for most of the contest, running his record to 5-1 on the year. The senior scattered four runs on nine hits in the game. He struck out eight batters and walked two.

Liberty took the lead for good in the contest during the bottom of the fifth inning, sending 11 men to the plate to score five runs on five hits and taking advantage of three Panther errors. Left fielder Doug Bream had the big blow of the frame, launching a first pitch, bases-loaded, double off the wall in right-center field, to give the Flames the lead at 5-3.

Catcher Nathan Thompson had three hits, drove in a run and scored a run in the contest.

Bream Backs Giannini's First Win

Liberty third baseman Tyler Bream had three hits, including a home run, and Cameron Giannini pitched seven strong innings, as the Liberty Flames defeated the VCU Rams, 7-4, March 31st in an evening contest at the Diamond.

Bream drove in three runs with the trio of hits, including his third home run of the season and his first triple of the year. Center fielder Curran Redal also had three hits in the contest. He also walked and scored a run for the Flames.

Giannini, making his second career start, recorded his first win in a Liberty uniform. The freshman right-hander allowed four runs on four hits over seven innings. He struck out four batters and walked three. Josh Richardson finished up for the Flames, pitching two scoreless frames.

Double Delight

Liberty first baseman Trey Wimmer drove in five runs with three doubles, propelling the Flames past the George Mason Patriots, 9-7, March 30 at Worthington Stadium.

The Liberty first baseman went 3-for-3 with a walk in the contest, scoring two runs. He got things started in the first inning with a two-run double, and later scored in a three-run inning. His second two-base hit in the fifth inning scored a run, giving the Flames the lead for good. In the seventh, he chased home his final two runs of the contest with his third double of the game.

Wimmer's three doubles tie 13 other Liberty players for most doubles in a game in program history. The last time a Flame had three two-base hits in a contest was on May 21, 2009, when catcher Errol Hollinger had three in a 20-10 win over High Point at the Big South Conference Baseball Championship at McCormick Field in Asheville, N.C.

Dane Beakler, the second Liberty pitcher of the contest, evened his record at 1-1 on the year. The reliever yielded one run, while scattering seven hits over 4 1/3 innings. He struck out two and did not walk a batter. J.J. McLeod entered the contest with two outs and retired the one batter he faced with the bases full for his third save of the season.

Michael Robertson had three hits in the contest for Liberty and scored three times.

Linza Goes Distance

Pitcher Keegan Linza went the distance for the first time in his Liberty career, in a 7-3 Liberty win at UNC Asheville on March 27.

With the win, Linza ran his record to a Big South-leading 5-0 on the year. The right-hander was efficient, allowing three runs, while scattering 12 hits. He struck out six batters and walked two.

The junior right-hander was backed by left fielder Doug Bream and second baseman P.J. Jimenez, who each had three hits in the contest.

Teufel's Scoreless Streak Ends

Senior left-hander Shawn Teufel gave up only his second run of the season March 19. A Manhattan home run in the fourth halted the left-hander's scoreless innings streak at 24, which spanned over five starts for the senior. Teufel had allowed only one prior run, in the first inning of his season-opening start at Kennesaw State on Feb. 19, and has not allow one since.

The streak tops a previous career-high of 10 scoreless innings by the pitcher last season, from April 4-18. The scoreless span left the left-hander five innings shy of the school record of 29, set by Tim Harrell in 2000.

Best Start Since 1995

Liberty started its 2010 season with a 9-0 record. The mark tied the 1995 Flames for the best start to a year in the 36-year history of the program. Liberty tied the mark with a 10-1 win over Delaware State at Worthington Stadium on March 7.

The Flames' start was the best during the three-year tenure of Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman. During Toman's first season in 2008, the Flames opened the year, 5-1.

Liberty also tied the programs' record for consecutive wins at the NCAA Division I level with the streak. Five other Flames squads have won nine consecutive games (2009, 2008, 2006, 1995, 1985). The 1976 Liberty team holds the school record for consecutive victories with 15.

Flames Open Home Slate with Sweep

The weekend of March 5-7, Liberty opened its 2010 home schedule with a sweep of a three-game series with the Delaware State Hornets. The Flames dominated the series, outscoring the Hornets, 34-2, over the span of the three games. Liberty also hit .368 as a team, while Flames pitchers limited Delaware State to a .167 batting average.

Catcher Nathan Thompson paced Liberty at the plate in the series, going 5-for-10 (.500) with two home runs, a double, five runs scored and seven RBIs. In Sunday's final game, the senior catcher hit his team-leading fourth home run, a three-run round tripper in the first inning, and drove in five of Liberty's runs in the Flames' 10-1 win. Center fielder Curran Redal also hit .500 for Liberty.

Flames pitchers had a 0.72 ERA during the three-game series, striking out 24 and walking 10. Starters Keegan Linza and Steven Evans each won their third game of the year in as many outings, while Friday's starter Shawn Teufel ran his mark to 2-0 on the season.

Bream Named Conference Player of the Week

Liberty sophomore third baseman Tyler Bream was named as the Big South Conference Choice Hotels Baseball Player of the Week for Feb. 23.

Bream hit .700 (7-for-10) in the Flames' three-game, season-opening sweep of Kennesaw State. The third baseman scored six runs and drove in five RBIs during the three-game series, reaching base three times in each contest to record a .688 on-base percentage. The sophomore had two doubles and a towering two-run home run during the weekend to post a 1.200 slugging percentage.

Bream opened the season on Feb. 19 by going 3-for-3, including an RBI-double and a two-run homer, while driving in four runs. The following afternoon, the third baseman walked twice, drove in a run with a sacrifice fly and scored twice. In the final game of the series on Feb. 21, Bream finished the series by going 4-for-5 with a double and three runs scored to lead the Flames to the sweep.
