Last Time Out

Liberty achieved a doubleheader split, taking the second game of a twinbill at UNC Asheville, 7-3, Saturday.

Right-hander Keegan Linza went the distance for the Flames, running his record to 5-0 on the season. The junior scattered three runs on 12 hits over nine innings for the victory.

Left fielder Doug Bream went 3-for-4, with two RBIs and two runs scored. Second baseman P.J. Jimenez joined him by going 3-for-4 for the Flames. He also scored a run.

On Deck

Liberty will host the High Point Panthers in a three-game Big South Conference series this weekend at Worthington Stadium. The series will get underway Friday with the first night game of the season at 7 p.m. Saturday, the two will wrapup the series with a doubleheader. Game one is scheduled to start at 1 p.m.

Head Coach Jim Toman

Record at Liberty: 82-55-1 (Three Years)

Career Record: Same

After leading the Flames to the best record of any Liberty head coach during his first two years, 68-47-1, Jim Toman is in his third year at the helm of the Flames.

Last season, Liberty recorded a 33-21 overall record, while posting a 17-9 mark in Big South Conference play, the most victories by the school since joining the conference in 1992. While recording 30 or more wins in each of Toman's seasons in Lynchburg, Liberty reached the plateau for the fifth consecutive season for the first time in the program's 36-year history in 2009.

Liberty set a new fielding standard in 2009, committing the fewest errors, 53 and finishing the year with the highest fielding percentage, .974, in team history. The 2009 team's fielding percentage ranked 16th in the country. From that infield, third baseman Tyler Bream was named a Freshman All-American by the Collegiate Baseball News.

Pitcher Andrew Wilson became the third player during Toman's time at Liberty to be taken in the MLB draft (Atlanta Braves), while catcher Errol Hollinger later signed a free agent contract (Arizona Diamondbacks).

In 2008, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish the Toman's first season at Liberty with a 35-26-1 mark. The record made Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's 36-year history. He guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by Flames team.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks this past summer. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty also eclipsed the school's single-season doubles mark, ripping 155 two-base hits. The total ranked the Flames fifth in the country in the category.

Liberty finished its season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed the Flames to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. Liberty would go on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman is the sixth head coach in the 35-year history of the Liberty Baseball program. The second-year skipper comes to Liberty after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 19-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball. Toman's 2003, 2005 and 2006 classes were named the top recruiting classes by the publication.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

In addition, South Carolina posted eight-straight seasons of 40 or more wins with Toman on the Gamecock coaching staff, including 2007. During Toman's 11 seasons at South Carolina, he helped the Gamecocks to a combined 500-220 (.694) record.

Toman earned four baseball letters at N.C. State, 1981-84, and was captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in vocational industrial education in 1985. He received a Master of Science degree in sport management from N.C. State in 1995.

Upon graduation, Toman entered the coaching profession as an assistant at Richmond County High School in Rockingham, N.C., for two years. He moved into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989 as an assistant at Florida International for one year. At FIU, he was responsible for the weight program, worked with the squad's catchers and coached first base. Toman joined the N.C. State staff before the 1990 season.

The Coaches

Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman is in his third year at the helm of the Flames. In his first two seasons, he guided the Flames to 68 wins, the most during the first two years under any head coach in program history, and best winning percentage (.591) over the same span.

Last season, Liberty posted the most victories in Big South Conference play with a 17-9 mark, since joining the conference in 1992. The Flames recorded an overall record of 33-21 in Toman's second year.

A 21-year member of the college coaching ranks, he served 18 years as a member of Ray Tanner's staffs at South Carolina and N.C. State. Toman was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball.

During his time in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three-consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

George Mason Head Coach Bill Brown is in his 29th season as the head coach at his alma mater. In that span, Brown has gone from being the then-youngest Division I head coach in the nation to the dean of coaches in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA).

Brown, a 1980 George Mason graduate, has been honored as CAA Coach of the Year a record six times and has guided his alma mater to some of its greatest accomplishments. Since 1985, the Patriots have won two CAA titles and finished second three other times, and they have made six appearances in the NCAA Tournament.

George Mason also has posted at least 30 victories in a season 13 times in the last 23 years under his guidance, including a school-record 42 wins and an at-large berth in the NCAA Tournament in 2009. Mason was nationally-ranked for the first time in school history rising into the top 30 in both the National College Baseball Writers Association and Collegiate Baseball polls, last season.

George Mason's all-time leader in coaching victories with a 29-year mark of 807-705-5, he led the Patriots to a 42-14 record last season.

VCU Head Coach Paul Keyes is in his 15th year with the Rams. He enters Tuesday's game with a 526-355 record during his tenure at VCU. Keyes has led the Rams to the NCAA tournament seven times in the past 11 seasons and has been named CAA Coach of the Year three times.

Last season, the Rams posted a 20-26 record under Keyes, and a 8-16 record in the CAA, finishing in 10th in the league standings. It was the first time in 12 seasons, VCU did not have a winning year. The Rams have won 40 or more games in four of the last 12 seasons.

All-Time Against George Mason

Tuesday will be the 56th meeting between Liberty and George Mason on the baseball diamond. The Patriots hold a 32-23 advantage in the all-time series, started in 1977.

Last season, George Mason defeated the Flames, 12-0, on April 8 in Fairfax, Va., in the only meeting between the two teams. The other contest scheduled between the two at Worthington Stadium was canceled due to inclement weather.

The last time George Mason played Liberty at Worthington Stadium, the Patriots edged the Flames, 7-6 in 11 innings, on April 30, 2008. George Mason has won the last three meetings between the two squads.

All-Time Against VCU

Wednesday will be the 49th meeting between Liberty and VCU on the baseball diamond, but the first since 2008. The Rams hold a 28-20 advantage in the all-time series started in 1977.

The last time the two teams met, VCU defeated Liberty, 5-4, at the Diamond on March 4, 2008.

Scouting the Patriots

After dropping two of three games against James Madison at home this past weekend, George Mason enters Tuesday's game with a 12-7 overall mark.

Traditionally a strong hitting team, the 2010 version of the Patriots has proven no different. George Mason begins the week with a .329 team batting average. The Patriots are averaging 9.1 runs per game this season.

Third baseman Mark Hill leads not only George Mason, but the Colonial Athletic Association in hitting with a .493 batting average. Teammate Ryan Soares is also above .400 with a .430 average. The shortstop leads the Patriots with 32 RBIs and 25 runs scored.

The George Mason pitching staff has posted a 5.44 ERA, so far this season. Tuesday's starter, freshman left-hander Nick Kendrick, is 0-1 with a 9.00 ERA in two starts this season.

In the bullpen, A.J. Johnson and Darren McLean have made the most appearances for the Patriots. McLean has made a team-leading nine appearances, with a 2-0 record and a 5.79 ERA. Johnson has entered eight games this season and has not allowed a run over nine innings. He has recorded four saves.

Scouting the Rams

VCU visits Maryland on Tuesday, before hosting the Flames on Wednesday. The Rams begin the week at 13-10 overall. This past weekend, they swept a three-game series from Northeastern.

The Rams begin the week with a .302 team batting average and averaging 6.8 runs per game. VCU has used its team speed to its advantage, stealing 38 bases in 50 attemps (76%).

Catcher Taylor Perkins leads the Rams in both batting average, with a .381 average, and 21 RBIs. First baseman Brent Mikionis is second in hitting with a .377 average.

The VCU mound staff has posted a 5.19 ERA and is allowing 6.4 runs per game. Opponents have hit a respectable .269 against the Rams staff, but VCU has yielded 90 walks.

Robbie Andrews has made a team-high eight appearances for the Rams. He has recorded three saves and a 2.61 ERA. Jonathan Watson, 1.72 ERA, Joe Van Meter, 3.07 ERA with one save, and Kyle Pelchy, 3.75 ERA, each have appeared in seven games.

March Mayhem

Liberty has gone 8-8 in games during the month of March this season. The Flames are 345-275-2 (.556) all-time in program history during the month.

Last season, Liberty posted a 16-3 (.842) overall mark and started 7-1 in Big South play during the month. The Flames are scheduled to play 18 games during March.

Fast Starts in February

After completing the month of February with a 6-0 record, its best February start since 1995, the Flames have recorded a .500 or better mark for the month 20 out of 23 times. Since beginning play during the month of February in 1984, Liberty has posted an all-time mark of 70-32 for a .686 winning percentage.

Over the past five years, the Flames are 28-9 (.757) during the month of February, while recording a 14-3 mark under head coach Jim Toman during his three years at Liberty.

Home Sweet Home

For the past 32 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium home. Named for program architect and the first Liberty head baseball coach, Al Worthington, Liberty has compiled an impressive 512-232-5 record at the stadium for a winning percentage of .686 since the facility's inception in 1979.

The Flames have posted a 7-3 record at Worthington this season. Liberty is slated to play 28 contests at home in 2010.

The Flames finished the 2009 regular season with a 19-5 record at the facility and are 33-18-1 at home under three-year head coach Jim Toman's guidance.

Flames on the Road

The Flames have gone 5-5 on the road this season. Liberty is also 2-0 in contests on neutral fields.

For the 14th time during Liberty's 18 years in the Big South, the Flames started conference play on the road, this past weekend at UNC Asheville. After falling in two out of the three games during the three-game series, Liberty is now 25-28 in its Big South opening series of the season all-time.

Liberty is 16-23 on the road to open conference play, while the Flames have opened at home five times, going 9-5.

Last season, Liberty opened the Big South portion of its schedule at Worthington Stadium, splitting a pair of games with the Charleston Southern Buccaneers during a rain-filled weekend. The Flames won the opening contest, 5-4, and dropped the other contest 7-4.

In 2008, Liberty opened conference play with the first night game in stadium history, a 5-3, 11-inning setback to Coastal Carolina on March 28. The Flames bounced back the following afternoon for a 9-6 win, before dropping the final game of the set on March 30, 2-1.

Closing in on Milestone 1,000

With 994 victories in program history, the Flames enter the week six games shy of the program's milestone 1,000th win. Liberty posted a 11-14 record in its inaugural season under Al Worthington in 1974.

Teufel Named to Watch List

Liberty senior Shawn Teufel has been listed on the 2010 National Pitcher of the Year Watch List. The Flames left-hander is one of 49 pitchers on the initial list released by the College Baseball Foundation, March 23.

Teufel has allowed only five earned runs over 36 1/3 innings this season, for a 1.24 ERA. The left-hander had opened the 2010 season with a 4-0 record and a 0.62 ERA, before dropping his last start, 5-4, at UNC Asheville this past Friday. He was also among the national ERA leaders, ranking fourth in the last NCAA National Statistical Summary through games of March 23.

He has struck out 29 batters and walking 19. The senior is also holding opponents to a .187 batting average.

After yielding one run in the opening inning of Liberty season opener at Kennesaw State, Teufel ran off a string of 24 scoreless innings, before giving up a run during the Flames' 8-4 win over Manhattan, March 19.

Roundtrippers = Wins

In 26 out of Liberty's 33 victories last season, the Flames hit at least one home run in the contest. Liberty had a record of 26-6 when hitting at least one roundtripper in a game.

Jim Toman's squad belted 60 home runs last season. Liberty's 60 home runs were the most by the Flames since 2002, when Liberty hit 86.

The Flames have started this season out in similar fashion, hitting at least one home run in 11 of their 14 victories. Liberty has hit a total of 18 home runs in 2010, with catcher Nathan Thompson leading the team with four roundtrippers.

Extras Haven't Been Kind

In the span of a week, the Flames saw three of their contests go to extra innings. The span started with St. John's on March 14 and ended against Manhattan on March 20. Unfortunately for Liberty, it ended up on the short end of the score in each of the three games.

Last season, the Flames had two games go to extra innings, a 4-3 win at South Alabama on Feb. 21 and a 10-9 victory at Gardner-Webb on April 26.

Teufel's Scoreless Streak Ends

Senior left-hander Shawn Teufel gave up only his second run of the season March 19. A Manhattan home run in the fourth halted the left-hander's scoreless innings streak at 24, which spanned over five starts for the senior. Teufel had allowed only one prior run, in the first inning of his season-opening start at Kennesaw State on Feb. 19, and has not allow one since.

The streak tops a previous career-high of 10 scoreless innings by the pitcher last season, from April 4-18. The scoreless span left the left-hander five innings shy of the school record of 29, set by Tim Harrell in 2000.

Redal At It Again

Liberty outfielder Curran Redal completed the 2009 season as one of the toughest hitters in the nation to strike out. The junior finished the year, striking out once every 21.3 at bats, ranking him ninth among NCAA Division I batters in the country. Redal struck out only 10 times in 213 at bats over 54 games last season.

This year, the senior has once again proven to be hard to strike out. Redal has fanned only twice this season or once per every 42.5 at bats.

Linza Goes Distance

Pitcher Keegan Linza went the distance for the first time in his Liberty career, Saturday, in a 7-3 Liberty win at UNC Asheville.

With the win, Linza runs his record to a Big South-leading 5-0 on the year. The right-hander was efficient, allowing three runs, while scattering 12 hits. He struck out six batters and walked two.

The junior right-hander was backed by left-fielder Doug Bream, who went 3-for-4 with two RBIs and two runs scored, and second baseman P.J. Jimenez, who was 3-for-4 and scored a run.

Liberty senior right-hander Dustin Umberger entered 2010, his final season in a Flames uniform, already listed among the program's all-time leaders in strikeouts.

Umberger has struck out 202 batters during his Liberty career to rank sixth on the school's career strikeout list. The right-hander is 10 strikeouts away from moving ahead of Randy Tomlin for fifth place on the list. Tomlin recorded 211 strikeouts for the Flames from 1986-88. Mike Brown, who pitched at Liberty from 1994-97, holds the career strikeout mark with 287.

The senior, 0-1 on the year with a 5.40 ERA, will get a chance to add to his total Tuesday when he makes his third start of the season against George Mason. Umberger returned to the Liberty roster after receiving a medical redshirt in 2009.

Flames Take Two From Manhattan

The Liberty Flames sandwiched two wins around a disappointing setback, March 19-21, in a three-game, weekend series at Worthington Stadium with the Manhattan Jaspers.

Behind a strong pitching performance by Shawn Teufel, the Liberty Flames defeated the Manhattan Jaspers, 8-4, March 19 in the opening game of the set. Teufel held the Jaspers in check throughout the first seven innings of the contest to run his record to 4-0 on the season. The left-hander allowed one run and scattered five hits in the victory, striking out five and walking three. The Jaspers scored their lone run against Teufel in the fourth inning.

Shortstop Matt Williams had three hits for the Flames, driving in a run and scoring one. Center fielder Curran Redal and catcher Nathan Thompson added two hits apiece. Designated hitter Austin Taylor hit his first home run in a Liberty uniform in the first inning.

After falling in 10 innings, the next day, 14-13, the Flames took the series behind another solid pitching effort on March 21. Right-hander Keegan Linza went 8 1/3 innings, the longest outing for a Liberty pitcher this season, and J.J. McLeod recorded the last two outs by inducing a double play for his second save in an 8-6, Flames win.

Linza allowed six runs on five hits during the 8 1/3 inning span. He struck out six and walked three. In the top of the ninth, McLeod was summoned with a runner on and one out, and got the double play to close out the victory for the Flames.

Liberty took the lead for good in the contest with four runs on four hits in the fifth inning. The big frame gave the Flames an 8-4 lead.

Williams, Redal, second baseman P.J. Jimenez, third baseman Tyler Bream and right fielder Michael Robertson each had two hits for the balanced offensive attack by the Flames. One of Jimenez's two hits was his second home run of the season.

Liberty Takes Two From St. John's

With wins, March 12 and 13, Liberty took two games of its three-game series with the St. John's Red Storm, at Worthington Stadium.

On the 12th, the Flames belted three home runs in a 9-1 win over the Red Storm. In the game, Liberty plated a run in the first inning to stake itself to a lead it never relinquished.

In the second, the Flames extended their lead with the first of their three round trippers in the contest. With one out, right fielder Michael Robertson connected for a solo home run, his second of the year. Later in the inning with two men aboard and two out, second baseman P.J. Jimenez ripped the second home run of the inning, his first of the year. The three-run home run gave Liberty a 5-0.

After a rain delay, shortstop Josh Richardson hit a solo home run, his second of the day, for the third Flame homer of the contest.

In addition, Liberty turned five ground ball double plays in the contest. Left-hander Shawn Teufel tossed six scoreless innings in the contest to run his record to 3-0 on the year.

A day later, after battling back with four runs in the seventh inning to tie the contest at 9-9, Liberty plated five runs in the eighth for a 14-9 victory. Best Start Since 1995

Liberty started its 2010 season with a 9-0 record. The mark tied the 1995 Flames for the best start to a year in the 36-year history of the program. Liberty tied the mark with a 10-1 win over Delaware State at Worthington Stadium on March 7.

The Flames' start was the best during the three-year tenure of Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman. During Toman's first season in 2008, the Flames opened the year, 5-1.

Liberty also tied the programs' record for consecutive wins at the NCAA Division I level with the streak. Five other Flames squads have won nine consecutive games (2009, 2008, 2006, 1995, 1985). The 1976 Liberty team holds the school record for consecutive victories with 15.

Flames Open Home Slate with Sweep

The weekend of March 5-7, Liberty opened its 2010 home schedule with a sweep of a three-game series with the Delaware State Hornets. The Flames dominated the series, outscoring the Hornets, 34-2, over the span of the three games. Liberty also hit .368 as a team, while Flames pitchers limited Delaware State to a .167 batting average.

Catcher Nathan Thompson paced Liberty at the plate in the series, going 5-for-10 (.500) with two home runs, a double, five runs scored and seven RBIs. In Sunday's final game, the senior catcher hit his team-leading fourth home run, a three-run round tripper in the first inning, and drove in five of Liberty's runs in the Flames' 10-1 win. Center fielder Curran Redal also hit .500 for Liberty.

Flames pitchers had a 0.72 ERA during the three-game series, striking out 24 and walking 10. Starters Keegan Linza and Steven Evans each won their third game of the year in as many outings, while Friday's starter Shawn Teufel ran his mark to 2-0 on the season.

Starters Strong at Hughes Brothers

Strong pitching helped the Flames win each of their three games in the Hughes Brothers Challenge, Feb. 26-28, in Wilmington, N.C.

On the 26th, starter Shawn Teufel did not allow a run over six innings in a no decision against Morehead State. The Flames rallied with three, two-out runs in the seventh inning to take a 5-2 win. Catcher Nathan Thompson tied the game with a home run in the frame.

Starter Keegan Linza was in control during his seven innings of work, running his mark to 2-0 on the year on Feb. 27. He gave up one run on four hits, as Liberty defeated Lehigh, 6-3. Catcher Jerry Neufang belted his first home run of the year in the contest and shortstop Matt Williams had four of the Flames' eight hits in the game.

On Feb. 28th, backed by a four-hit effort, including a home run, by third baseman Tyler Bream, Steven Evans ran his record to 2-0 on the season in a 12-2 win over UNC Wilmington. Evans allowed two runs on six hits over 6 2/3 innings for the victory. Shortstop Josh Richardson and right fielder Michael Robertson each also hit roundtrippers for the Flames.

Bream Named Conference Player of the Week

Liberty sophomore third baseman Tyler Bream was named as the Big South Conference Choice Hotels Baseball Player of the Week for Feb. 23.

Bream hit .700 (7-for-10) in the Flames' three-game, season-opening sweep of Kennesaw State. The third baseman scored six runs and drove in five RBIs during the three-game series, reaching base three times in each contest to record a .688 on-base percentage. The sophomore had two doubles and a towering two-run home run during the weekend to post a 1.200 slugging percentage.

Bream opened the season on Feb. 19 by going 3-for-3, including an RBI-double and a two-run homer, while driving in four runs. The following afternoon, the third baseman walked twice, drove in a run with a sacrifice fly and scored twice. Flames Open Season with Road Sweep

Liberty opened its 2010 season with a three-game sweep of host Kennesaw State, Feb. 19-21. Led by third baseman Tyler Bream, who hit .700 in the series, the Flames batted .321 during the series and posted double-digit run totals in each contest. Right-fielder Michael Robertson hit .417 with a team-high six RBIs in his debut in a Liberty uniform.
