The Games

The Liberty Flames (3-0) travel to Wilmington, N.C., for the Hughes Brothers Challenge, Friday-Sunday at Brooks Stadium. Liberty will square off with the Morehead State Eagles (2-3), Friday at 12:30 p.m., followed by a 10:00 a.m. contest, Saturday against the Lehigh Mountain Hawks. Sunday, the Flames will face tournament host UNC Wilmington (2-1) in the final game of the tournament. First pitch is scheduled for 1:30 p.m.

Last Time Out

Liberty completed a three-game, season-opening sweep at Kennesaw State, with a 10-4 victory over the Owls, Sunday. Third baseman Tyler Bream had four hits and scored three times in the contest. Teammates P.J. Jimenez and Michael Robertson each had three hits for the Flames, who had 16 hits in the game.

Left-hander Steven Evans, the first of six Liberty pitchers to take the mound in the contest, recorded his first win of year.

The victory enabled Liberty to start a year, 3-0, for the second time under third-year head coach Jim Toman.

On Deck

The Flames will complete their seven-game, season-opening road swing, with a visit to Richmond, Va., Tuesday, to face the VCU Rams. The contest will be the first midweek contest of the year for Liberty. Game time is scheduled for 3 p.m. at the Diamond.

All-Time Against the Hughes Bros. Field

Friday's and Saturday's contests will be the first-ever meetings between the two teams. Liberty has never met Morehead State or Lehigh on the baseball diamond.

On Sunday, Liberty will renew acquaintances with UNC Wilmington. The Flames and the Seahawks, who have not faced each other since 2002, will square off for the ninth time. Liberty holds a 5-3 in the all-time series. The Flames took both ends of a doubleheader from the Seahawks the last time the two met on May 4, 2002, 10-6 and 13-6.

Record at Liberty: 70-47-1 (Three Years)

Career Record: Same

After leading the Flames to the best record of any Liberty head coach during his first two years, 68-47-1, Jim Toman is in his third year at the helm of the Flames program.

Last season, Liberty recorded a 33-21 overall record, while posting a 17-9 mark in Big South Conference play, the most victories by the school since joining the conference in 1992. While recording 30 or more wins in each of Toman's seasons in Lynchburg, Liberty reached the plateau for the fifth consecutive season for the first time in the program's 36-year history in 2009.

Liberty set a new fielding standard in 2009, committing the fewest errors, 53 and finishing the year with the highest fielding percentage, .974, in team history. The 2009 team's fielding percentage ranked 16th in the country. From that infield, third baseman Tyler Bream was named a Freshman All-American by the Collegiate Baseball News.

Pitcher Andrew Wilson became the third player during Toman's time at Liberty to be taken in the MLB draft (Atlanta Braves), while catcher Errol Hollinger later signed a free agent contract (Arizona Diamondbacks).

In 2008, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish the Toman's first season at Liberty with a 35-26-1 mark. The record made Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's 36-year history. He guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by Flames team.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks this past summer. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty also eclipsed the school's single-season doubles mark, ripping 155 two-base hits. The total ranked the Flames fifth in the country in the category.

Liberty finished its season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed the Flames to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. Liberty would go on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman is the sixth head coach in the 35-year history of the Liberty Baseball program. The second-year skipper comes to Liberty after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 19-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball. Toman's 2003, 2005 and 2006 classes were named the top recruiting classes by the publication.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

In addition, South Carolina posted eight-straight seasons of 40 or more wins with Toman on the Gamecock coaching staff, including 2007. During Toman's 11 seasons at South Carolina, he helped the Gamecocks to a combined 500-220 (.694) record.

Toman earned four baseball letters at N.C. State, 1981-84, and was captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in vocational industrial education in 1985. He received a Master of Science degree in sport management from N.C. State in 1995.

Upon graduation, Toman entered the coaching profession as an assistant at Richmond County High School in Rockingham, N.C., for two years. He moved into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989 as an assistant at Florida International for one year. At FIU, he was responsible for the weight program, worked with the squad's catchers and coached first base. Toman joined the N.C. State staff before the 1990 season.

Following the Flames

This season, the Flames Sports Network plans to broadcast over 35 Liberty baseball regular season games and the Big South Baseball Championship, either by radio or video streaming. Nick Pierce will handle the play-by-play duties, with former Flames pitcher Doug Wallace handling the color duties.

Radio broadcasts will air live on WWMC 90.9 FM "The Light" and on the World Wide Web at both LibertyFlames.com and thelightonline.com, while selected games will be video streamed live on the internet via the Big South Network. The network is available on BigSouthSports.com and can be accessed for a nominal fee through a link on LibertyFlames.com or by going directly to BigSouthSports.com. All of the Flames' Big South Conference home games are currently scheduled to be produced by the Flames Sports Network. In addition, several conference schools will provide video streams of Big South Conference away games involving the Flames during the season on the Big South Network.

The Coaches

Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman is in his third year at the helm of the Flames. In his first two seasons, he guided the Flames to 68 wins, the most during the first two years under any head coach in program history, and best winning percentage (.591) over the same span.

Last season, Liberty posted the most victories in Big South Conference play with a 17-9 mark, since joining the conference in 1992. The Flames recorded an overall record of 33-21 in Toman's second year.

A 21-year member of the college coaching ranks, he served 18 years as a member of Ray Tanner's staffs at South Carolina and N.C. State. Toman was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball.

During his time in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three-consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

Morehead State Head Coach Jay Sorg is in his third season at his alma mater. The Eagles are 35-68 during his tenure. Last season, Morehead State went 22-32 overall and was 12-10 in the Ohio Valley Conference, finishing third in the regular-season standings.

Lehigh is coached by Sean Leary, who enters his 15th season at the helm of the Mountain Hawks and 18th overall. Leary had led Lehigh to a 261-319-5 mark, and was named the 2006 Patriot League Coach of the Year after leading Lehigh to its first Patriot League title and a NCAA Regional berth.

UNC Wilmington Head Coach Mark Scalf is in his 19th year, leading his alma mater. The winningest coach in Seahawk history, UNC Wilmington has posted five 40-win seasons in the past seven years and a 589-460-1 record during Scalf's tenure.

Last season, the Seahawks ranked as high as 26th nationally, completing the year with a 31-23 overall mark and a 10-8 record in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA). In 2008, Scalf led UNC Wilmington to the NCAA Regional for the fourth time, earning CAA Coach of the Year honors. The Seahawks posted a school and conference record for wins, with 42 overall and 25 conference victories.

Scalf earned his 500th career win, all at UNCW, with an 8-7 win over Elon on April 17, 2007. He has been named the CAA Coach of the Year four times during his Seahawk coaching career.

Scouting the Eagles

Morehead State returns every starter from last year's team, which finished third in the Ohio Valley standings. The Eagles, who were picked to place fifth this season in the Ohio Valley, have started the season, 2-3. Morehead State enters Friday's contest with the Flames having dropped their last three contests. Last weekend, the Eagles opened the season by splitting four games at Mercer, before falling at No. 13 Louisville, 7-2, Tuesday.

Morehead State has been led at the plate by sophomore outfielder Cameron Flynn, who has hit .429 with two doubles, two home runs and three RBIs in three games. Flynn has also appeared in two other games as a pitcher. Flynn and senior shortstop Drew Lee have each hit two of the Eagles' seven home runs on the year. Lee, who was named Co-Preseason Ohio Valley Player of the Year, has a team-high five RBIs. The shortstop was named a Preseason All-American by both the Collegiate Baseball Newspaper and Ping! Baseball.com.

On the mound, Morehead State begins the weekend with an 8.32 ERA through five games. Senior Michael Bottoms is the lone starter on the Eagle pitching staff to record a win in the early going. The right-hander pitched six innings in Morehead State's 7-6 victory over Mercer in its season opener this past Friday. Bottoms, like Flynn, also plays in the field.

Freshman reliever Cody Gibson has saved both of the Eagle wins this season. The right-hander earned the save in each of his first two collegiate appearances.

Scouting the Mountain Hawks

Lehigh will open its 2010 season Friday against tournament host UNC Wilmington, before playing Liberty on Saturday. Last season, a young Mountain Hawk club went 11-36-1 and was picked this year to finish sixth in the Patriot League standings in its pre-season poll.

Lehigh will head into the season with six positional starters returning from last season, including Patriot League first team selection Andy Russell. The junior outfielder led the Mountain Hawks in every major offensive category last season. Russell hit .348 with 38 RBIs and 35 runs scored in 48 games. In addition, Lehigh will welcome back junior short-stop Brendan McGaheeran who missed all of last season due to injury.

The Mountain Hawks return four pitchers from last team. Lehigh will look to improve upon its 7.13 ERA from 2009. The staff is expected to rely heavily on senior right-hander Andrew Berger. The senior made 11 appearances last season with nine starts, posting a 5.31 ERA in 57 2/3 innings.

Scouting the Seahawks

UNC Wilmington is expected to challenge for the Colonial Athletic Association title this season. The Seahawks were picked to finish second in the CAA Preseason Poll. UNC Wilmington has begun the year, 2-1, after visiting defending Atlantic Sun Champion Jacksonville last weekend to open its season.

UNC Wilmington returns all eight position players from last season's 31-23 squad, which played for the CAA Championship for the third consecutive year. Junior catcher Cody Stanley and senior designated hitter Robby Monday were named to the CAA Pre-season All-Conference team.

Shortstop Michael Rooney opened the year with a .429 batting average for the Seahawks, who are hitting .277 as a team.

The pitching staff is considered the backbone of UNC Wilmington's team. The Seahawks return nine hurlers who made at least one start last season. Considered UNC Wilmington's top starter, junior Daniel Cropper was named the Co-CAA Pitcher of the Week for his effort in his first start last weekend. The right-hander allowed one run on five hits over seven innings this past Sunday in a no-decision at Jacksonville. Bryan Booth and Jesse Haney have each recorded a save for the Seahawks this season.

Fast Starts in February

For the third consecutive year, the Flames opened the first weekend of February under head coach Jim Toman with three wins. This year and 2008, Liberty opened the year unbeaten with 3-0 marks.

Since beginning play during the month of February in 1984, Liberty has posted an all-time mark of 67-32 for a .677 winning percentage. In 22 Februaries as the starting month of the season, the Flames have recorded a .500 or better mark for the month 19 times.

Over the past five years, Flames are 25-9 (.735) during the month of February and have recorded an 11-3 mark under Toman during his three years at Liberty.

Standing Tall in Season Openers

With its 10-4 victory over Kennesaw State last Friday, Liberty is now 24-11 in season-opening contests since 1976.

The win moves the Flames to 2-1 in campaign openers under head coach Jim Toman. Liberty defeated Notre Dame, 6-2, on Feb. 22, 2008 at the Clearwater, Fla. Invitational in the coach's first contest as the Flames head coach.

Flames on the Road

Liberty is in the midst of seven consecutive games away from home to begin the 2010 season. After their sweep of Kennesaw State last weekend, the Flames have started the season 3-0 in road games.

Liberty finished 2009 with a 11-13 final road ledger. The Flames also compiled a 3-3 record on neutral fields.

Bream Named Conference Player of the Week

Liberty sophomore third baseman Tyler Bream was named as the Big South Conference Choice Hotels Baseball Player of the Week for Feb. 23.

Bream hit .700 (7-for-10) in the Flames' three-game, season-opening sweep of Kennesaw State. The third baseman scored six runs and drove in five RBIs during the three-game series, reaching base three times in each contest to record a .688 on-base percentage. The sophomore had two doubles and a towering two-run home run during the weekend to post a 1.200 slugging percentage.

Bream opened the season last Friday by going 3-for-3, including an RBI-double and a two-run homer, while driving in four runs. Saturday, he walked twice, drove in a run with a sacrifice fly and scored twice. On Sunday, Bream finished the series by going 4-for-5 with a double and three runs scored to lead the Flames to the sweep.

Flames Open Season with Sweep

Liberty opened its 2010 season with a three-game sweep of host Kennesaw State, last weekend.

Led by third baseman Tyler Bream, who hit .700 in the series, the Flames batted .321 during the series and posted double-digit run totals in each contest. Right-fielder Michael Robertson hit .417 with a team-high six RBIs in his debut in a Liberty uniform.

In the opener Friday, Bream went 3-for-3 with four RBIs and a home run in a 10-2 victory and on Sunday, the third baseman went 4-for-5 with a double and scored three runs in another 10-2 win. Robertson drove in two runs in each game of the series and was 3-for-5 and scored three runs in Sunday's win.

The Liberty mound staff held the Owls in check over the span of the series. The Kennesaw State batters hit .194 for the series and struck out 31 times. Flames right-hander Keegan Linza highlighted the weekend for the staff, allowing one run on two hits and striking out eight over six innings in his first outing in a Liberty uniform in an 11-2 victory Saturday. Freshman Josh Richardson did not allow a run in two appearances out of the Flames bullpen.

Veteran Roster Returns

Liberty returns seven out of its eight position starters from 2009. Among the returners are the Flames' entire starting infield from a year ago, with three of the four, Trey Wimmer, Matt Williams and Tyler Bream, being sophomores.

In addition, the Flames return 14 players who saw significant playing time in 2009, and 11 seniors, the most of any class on its 2010 roster.

Umberger Among Flames' All-Time K Kings

Liberty senior right-hander Dustin Umberger entered 2010, his final season in a Flames uniform, already listed among the program's all-time leaders in strikeouts. With two strikeouts in an inning of work during Liberty's 11-2 victory at Kennesaw State, last Saturday, Umberger has struck out 196 batters over his Liberty career to rank sixth on the school's career strikeout list.

The right-hander is 16 strikeouts away from moving ahead of Randy Tomlin for fifth place on the list. Tomlin recorded 211 strikeouts for the Flames from 1986-88. Mike Brown, who pitched at Liberty from 1994-97, holds the career strikeout mark with 287.

Voted as one of the three toughest pitchers to face in the conference by Big South head coaches in a recent poll by CollegeInsider.com, Umberger returns after receiving a medical redshirt in 2009.

In 2008, he led the league with 88 strikeouts and tied for second with eight wins. The right-hander posted an 8-3 record with one save and a 3.80 ERA over 83 innings. He walked only 19 batters for a 4.6-to-1 strikeout to walk ratio. After starting the year in the bullpen, Umberger made nine starts, pitching two complete games and compiling a 6-1 record.

Coaching Staff Additions

Jason Murray and Adam Ward have joined head coach Jim Toman's staff for the 2010 season. Murray takes over assistant coaching duties, working with the Flames' infielders and coaching third base during games. He also coordinates Liberty's recruiting efforts.

Ward is serving as a volunteer assistant coach on the staff. He works with the team's outfielders and coaches first base for the Flames. Ward also is in charge of grounds at Worthington Stadium.

Staying in the Commonwealth

Of the 35 players on Liberty's roster, 10 Flames hail from the Commonwealth of Virginia. After the Old Dominion State, four Flames each come from the near-by states of North Carolina and Pennsylvania, while four others hail from Washington state. In total, 12 states are represented on the 2010 Liberty roster.

Fine Fielding

The Flames only committed one error during their three-game series at Kennesaw State last weekend, picking up where they left off last season.

Jim Toman's squad set the school standard for team fielding percentage over a season by finishing 2009 with a .974 fielding percentage. The mark eclipses the .971 fielding percentage of the 2005 Flames team. The 2009 Liberty team's fielding percentage ranked 16th in the country.

In addition, the Flames committed the fewest errors in the 36-year history of the program. Liberty made just 53 errors last season, nine fewer than the previous mark of 62 by the 2005 team.

Roundtrippers = Wins

In 26 out of Liberty's 33 victories last season, the Flames hit at least one home run in the contest. Liberty had a record of 26-6 when hitting at least one roundtripper in a game.

Jim Toman's squad belted 60 home runs last season, 14 more than in 2007. Liberty's 60 home runs were the most by the Flames since 2002, when Liberty hit 86.

The Flames have started this season out in similar fashion, hitting a home run in two of their three wins at Kennesaw State. Third baseman Tyler Bream hit a home run in Friday's 10-4 win over the Owls, while catcher Nathan Thompson belted a round tripper on Sunday in Liberty's second 10-4 victory of the weekend.

Seniors Named Captains

Catcher Nathan Thompson and pitchers Shawn Teufel and Dustin Umberger have been chosen as captains for the 2010 Liberty Baseball team. The three seniors were selected by virtue of a team vote, with the trio received overwhelming support from their teammates.

Three Newcomers MLB Draft Picks

A trio of players, who have joined the Liberty roster for the 2010 season, have been selected in the Major League Baseball Draft. Junior Austin Taylor, sophomore Michael Robertson and freshmen Cameron Giannini have each been selected in a Major League Draft.

Taylor, an infielder, was drafted out of Thomas County Central High School by the Cincinnati Reds in 2007. The junior college transfer was taken in the 43rd round.

Robertson, an outfielder, was also picked in the MLB Draft by the Cincinnati Reds in 2009. The junior college transfer was selected in the 40th round of the draft by the Reds.

Giannini, a pitcher, was a 2009 Draft Choice of the Detroit Tigers out of Hargrave Christian. The right-hander was selected in the 49th round by the Tigers.

Liberty Picked Second in Big South Preseason Poll

Liberty was tabbed to finish second in the Big South Conference standings this season in voting by the Big South Coaches. The Flames were selected second, behind three-time defending champion Coastal Carolina.

The Flames, who received one first-place vote, garnered 88 points in the poll, nine less than Coastal Carolina. The Chanticleers received eight first-place votes and 97 total points.

Winthrop, who garnered the final first-place vote, was tabbed third by the panel with 91 points, followed by Radford, High Point and VMI. Charleston Southern was picked seventh, while Gardner-Webb was voted to finish eighth. Presbyterian, who is eligible for the regular-season title but not the tournament title, and UNC Asheville round out the poll.

The 2010 Big South Championship will be contested May 25-29 at the Winthrop Ballpark in Rock Hill, S.C. The winner of the double-elimination tournament receives the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament.

A Brief Review of the Decade

When the Flames took the field at Kennesaw State last week, it began a new decade of Liberty baseball. Here's a short look back at the last 10 years of Flames baseball:

- Liberty posted a 325-247-3 record and a .568 winning percentage during the just finished decade.
- The Flames had four players honored as Freshman All-Americans during the decade:
 - 2000 - Keith Bulter, OF
 - Joey Monahan, SS
 - 2005 - Aaron Grijalva, 1B
 - 2009 - Tyler Bream, 3B
- Liberty had at least one player taken in each of the past 10 Major League Baseball Drafts. A program-high five players were taken in 2002. Along with players signing free agent contracts, 21 former Flames went on to play professional baseball during the decade.
- Liberty had 38 players selected to Big South All-Conference teams during the decade. Seventeen Flames were named to the conference's first team, while 21 were selected to the second team. In 2000, outfielder Keith Butler was named both the Player and Rookie of the Year, while pitcher Brian Harrell was honored with the Scholar-Athlete of the Year. The Flames were Big South Champions that season.
- The Flames compiled 30 or more victories in a season eight times during the decade. In 2006, Liberty posted a 39-21 mark, the most wins by a Flames team since moving to Division I in 1984. Liberty closed the decade with five consecutive seasons with 30 or more wins each year.

Flames Post Most Victories in Big South Play

The 2009 Liberty Flames recorded a 17-9 Big South mark. Their victory total was the most ever by a Liberty baseball team since joining the conference in 1992.

The victory total surpassed the 15 Big South wins recorded by the 1995 Flames, who finished their conference season at 15-9.

Most Coaching Wins in First Two Years

In its first two seasons under head coach Jim Toman, Liberty has gone 68-47-1. The Flames' 68 wins are the most over the first two years for any head coach in program history. In addition, Toman's .591 winning percentage during his first two seasons is the highest among the six head coaches to ever guide the Flames.

Third Baseman Bream Named Freshman All-American

Liberty third baseman Tyler Bream was selected to the Louisville Slugger Freshman All-America team, chosen and announced by Collegiate Baseball newspaper last season. The infielder becomes the fourth Flame to be named to Louisville Slugger team in its 19-year history.

Bream finished the year ranked third in the Big South Conference with 57 RBIs. In 46 games, the Zelenople, Pa., native hit .337 with 16 doubles and eight home runs. He scored 35 runs for the Flames and was third on the team with 107 total bases.

Bream opened his first season in a Liberty uniform as the starter at third base and started the first 46 games of the 2009 campaign, until an injury cut short his maiden season of college baseball. He tied the school record with nine RBIs in a game during the Flames' 19-5 victory over High Point, March 22. During a seven-game stretch, Bream drove in 23 runs (March 20-29), leading to him being named the Big South Player of the Week on March 30.

Returners Redal and Teufel Honored in 2009

Senior outfielder Curran Redal and pitcher Shawn Teufel were named to the 2009 Big South Conference first and the VaSID All-State second teams.

In his first year with the Flames in 2009, Redal finished the season ranked among the Big South leaders in batting average (.380), hits (81), triples (4) and on base percentage (.447). He scored 50 runs and drove in 42 runs, with 13 doubles and six home runs.

Redal also set a new Big South record by hitting safely in 32 consecutive games from Feb. 24-April 17. He led the Flames with 23 multi-hit games and 13 multi-RBI contests. The outfielder was selected the Big South Player of the week for March 9-16.

Teufel finished the year second in the Big South with nine wins and third with 72 strikeouts in his first season on the mound for the Flames. The left-hander was also among the conference leaders in ERA (4.33). He went 9-2 in 14 games over 72 2/3 innings, and won six consecutive starts from March 22 to May 2.

Redal Tough to K

Outfielder Curran Redal completed the 2009 season as one of the toughest hitters in the nation to strike out. The junior finished the year, striking out once every 21.3 at bats, ranking him ninth among NCAA Division I batters in the country. Redal struck out 10 times in 213 at bats over 54 games this past season.

Redal Breaks Big South Consecutive Game Hit Mark

Last season, outfielder Curran Redal singled through the left side of the infield in the first inning, April 17 against Winthrop, to hit safely in his 32nd game in a row, a new Big South record. The junior broke the previous mark of 31 consecutive games with at least one hit, which he held along with UNC Asheville shortstop Kevin Weidenbacher. The UNC Asheville shortstop set the previous record last season.

During the streak, the junior hit .452, collecting 57 hits in 126 at bats. He also drove in 40 RBIs over the span.
