The Games

The Liberty Flames (16-8, 1-2 Big South) host the High Point Panthers (16-10, 3-3 Big South) in a three-game Big South Conference series, this weekend at Worthington Stadium. The series gets underway Friday, with the first night game of the season at Worthington Stadium. First pitch is scheduled for 7 p.m. The two teams will wrapup the conference series with a doubleheader, Saturday. Game one is scheduled to start at 1 p.m., with game two to follow.

Last Time Out

Liberty third baseman Tyler Bream had three hits, including a home run, and Cameron Giannini pitched seven strong innings, as the Liberty Flames defeated the VCU Rams, 7-4, Wednesday evening at the Diamond.

Bream drove in three runs with the trio of hits, including his third home run of the season and his first triple of the year. Center fielder Curran Redal also had three hits in the contest. He also walked and scored a run for the Flames.

Giannini, making his second career start, recorded his first win in a Liberty uniform. The freshman right-hander allowed four runs on four hits over seven innings. He struck out four batters and walked three. Josh Richardson finished up for the Flames, pitching two scoreless frames.

On Deck

The Flames will take to the road for their second meeting of the year with the Old Dominion Monarchs, Tuesday. Game time at the Bud Metheny Baseball Complex in Norfolk, Va., is scheduled for 5 p.m.

Saturday's High Point - Liberty doubleheader game will be video streamed LIVE. The feed will be available for a nominal fee on the Big South Network. Nick Pierce will handle play-by-play duties and former Flames pitcher Doug Wallace will provide commentary for both games. Record at Liberty: 84-55-1 (Three Years)

Career Record: Same

After leading the Flames to the best record of any Liberty head coach during his first two years, 68-47-1, Jim Toman is in his third year at the helm of the Flames.

Last season, Liberty recorded a 33-21 overall record, while posting a 17-9 mark in Big South Conference play, the most victories by the school since joining the conference in 1992. While recording 30 or more wins in each of Toman's seasons in Lynchburg, Liberty reached the plateau for the fifth consecutive season for the first time in the program's 36-year history in 2009.

Liberty set a new fielding standard in 2009, committing the fewest errors, 53 and finishing the year with the highest fielding percentage, .974, in team history. The 2009 team's fielding percentage ranked 16th in the country. From that infield, third baseman Tyler Bream was named a Freshman All-American by the Collegiate Baseball News.

Pitcher Andrew Wilson became the third player during Toman's time at Liberty to be taken in the MLB draft (Atlanta Braves), while catcher Errol Hollinger later signed a free agent contract (Arizona Diamondbacks).

In 2008, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish the Toman's first season at Liberty with a 35-26-1 mark. The record made Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's 36-year history. He guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by Flames team.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks this past summer. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty also eclipsed the school's single-season doubles mark, ripping 155 two-base hits. The total ranked the Flames fifth in the country in the category.

Liberty finished its season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed the Flames to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. Liberty would go on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman is the sixth head coach in the 35-year history of the Liberty Baseball program. The second-year skipper comes to Liberty after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 19-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball. Toman's 2003, 2005 and 2006 classes were named the top recruiting classes by the publication.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

In addition, South Carolina posted eight-straight seasons of 40 or more wins with Toman on the Gamecock coaching staff, including 2007. During Toman's 11 seasons at South Carolina, he helped the Gamecocks to a combined 500-220 (.694) record.

Toman earned four baseball letters at N.C. State, 1981-84, and was captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in vocational industrial education in 1985. He received a Master of Science degree in sport management from N.C. State in 1995.

Upon graduation, Toman entered the coaching profession as an assistant at Richmond County High School in Rockingham, N.C., for two years. He moved into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989 as an assistant at Florida International for one year. At FIU, he was responsible for the weight program, worked with the squad's catchers and coached first base. Toman joined the N.C. State staff before the 1990 season.

The Coaches

Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman is in his third year at the helm of the Flames. In his first two seasons, he guided the Flames to 68 wins, the most during the first two years under any head coach in program history, and best winning percentage (.591) over the same span.

Last season, Liberty posted the most victories in Big South Conference play with a 17-9 mark, since joining the conference in 1992. The Flames recorded an overall record of 33-21 in Toman's second year.

A 21-year member of the college coaching ranks, he served 18 years as a member of Ray Tanner's staffs at South Carolina and N.C. State. Toman was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball.

During his time in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three-consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

Head Coach Chris Cozart is in his second year at High Point. In his first season he led the Panthers to a 21-32 overall record and an 11-12 record in the Big South Conference. In the conference tournament, he led the Panthers to two wins, marking the time a Panther team has won two games at the conference tournament

Cozart came to High Point following a highly successful 12-year coaching stint at UCF, where he moved up the ranks from student assistant to associate head coach during his tenure. A key member of the Knight coaching staff over the past decade, he helped to develop UCF into one of the nation's elite Division I baseball programs. In his role as the pitching coach, Cozart built a tradition of pitching excellence during his time at UCF.

At UCF, Cozart helped guide the Knights to a 455-274 overall mark during his 12 seasons on the coaching staff. The Knights made five NCAA Tournaments appearances during that stretch and also captured four conference championships.

All-time against High Point

Friday will be the 59th meeting between Liberty and High Point on the baseball diamond since 1976. The Flames hold the advantage in the all-time series, 32-25.

Last year, Liberty swept a three-game series at High Point, March 20-22, 2009. The Flames opened the series with a 9-8 win, before running off 7-3 and 19-5 victories. In the March 22 game, Liberty third baseman Tyler Bream drove in nine runs, tying the school record for RBIs in a game.

The last time the two team meet at Worthington Stadium, Liberty took two-of-three from High Point from May 16-18, 2008 to close the regular season for both teams. The Flames won the first two games, 8-1 and 5-4, before falling in the last game of the series, 8-4.

Scouting the Panthers

After winning the first two games at Winthrop last weekend, the Panthers enter the their weekend series with the Flames, having lost their last three games. The Eagles took the final game of the double-header on Saturday and High Point has dropped games at Duke and Western Carolina during the week.

The Panthers are off to the best start in the High Point's Division I era, with a 16-10 record. High Point leads the Big South Conference in hitting, batting .362 as a team.

First baseman Steve Antolik begins the weekend second in the conference with a .429 batting average. He is also tied for second on the Panthers with 31 RBIs. Right fielder Nate Roberts is currently fourth in the Big South with a .402 batting average. He also has 31 RBIs and leads the conference with 40 runs scored.

Left fielder Matt Gantner is the current Big South Player of the Week, after hitting .611 in five games last week. He posted a hit in every game he played in and notched four multi-hit games. He drove in eight RBIs and scored seven runs. The left fielder is hitting .391 with a team-leading 33 RBIs beginning the weekend.

While offense has not been a problem for the Panthers, consistency by their mound staff has. High Point enters the weekend with a 6.75 team ERA.

Friday's starter Jaime Serber has opened the season with a 3-0 record. The right-hander has posted a 5.17 ERA in 31 1/3 innings.

Saturday's first game starter Ben Jones has yet to post a win in 2010, entering the weekend with a 0-2 record and a 5.87 ERA. Jared Avidon, the game two starter, is 2-0 with a 6.39 ERA.

Corey Swickle has been the workhorse of the High Point bullpen, making 14 appearances and sporting a 4-0 record. Without a start this season, he has pitched 26 innings. Mikel Rodenberg has recorded a 1-1 mark with five saves in 11 appearances, but begins the weekend with a 8.44 ERA.

Analyzing April

Friday night's contest will be the first game in the month of April for the Flames. Liberty is scheduled to play 18 games during the month.

Last season, the Flames finished the month of April with a 10-8 record. Liberty posted a 9-3 mark in Big South Conference play. Since 1976, the Flames have recorded an all-time mark of 331-281-1 (.541) in April.

March Mayhem

With three-straight victories to close the month, Liberty posted a 10-8 mark in games during March this season, including a 1-2 start to Big South Conference play. The Flames are 347-275-2 (.558) all-time in program history during the month.

Fast Starts in February

After completing the month of February with a 6-0 record, its best February start since 1995, the Flames have recorded a .500 or better mark for the month 20 out of 23 times. Since beginning play during the month of February in 1984, Liberty has posted an all-time mark of 70-32 for a .686 winning percentage.

Over the past five years, the Flames are 28-9 (.757) during the month of February, while recording a 14-3 mark under head coach Jim Toman during his three years at Liberty.

Home Sweet Home

For the past 32 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium home. Named for program architect and the first Liberty head baseball coach, Al Worthington, Liberty has compiled an impressive 513-232-5 record at the stadium for a winning percentage of .687 since the facility's inception in 1979.

The Flames have posted a 8-3 record at Worthington this season. Liberty is slated to play 28 contests at home in 2010.

The Flames finished the 2009 regular season with a 19-5 record at the facility and are 33-18-1 at home under three-year head coach Jim Toman's guidance.

With their victory Wednesday night at VCU, the Flames have posted a 6-5 mark on the road this season. Liberty is also 2-0 in contests on neutral fields.

The Flames finished 2009 with a 11-13 final road ledger. The Flames also compiled a 3-3 record on neutral fields.

Making It Tough to Score

Liberty enters the week, allowing its opponents 4.6 runs per game. Liberty has only given up more than five runs in a contest seven times this season. Through 24 games, Liberty has outscored its opponents, 181-112.

Umberger Joins Big South 200 Ks Club

With two strikeouts in his first start of the season on March 17 at Duke, Liberty senior right-hander Dustin Umberger became the 53rd pitcher in Big South Conference history to record 200 or more strikeouts. The senior becomes the first Flame since David Bechtold in 2005 to strikeout over 200 batters. Bechtold struck out 241 hitters from 2002-05.

Umberger has struck out 203 batters during his Liberty career to rank sixth on the school's career strikeout list. The right-hander is nine strikeouts away from moving ahead of Randy Tomlin for fifth place on the list. Tomlin recorded 211 strikeouts for the Flames from 1986-88. Mike Brown, who pitched at Liberty from 1994-97, holds the career strikeout mark with 287.

Returning from a medical redshirt in 2009, Umberger is 0-1 on the year with a 5.87 ERA in eight appearances this season. He has made three starts.

Redal At It Again

Liberty outfielder Curran Redal completed the 2009 season as one of the toughest hitters in the nation to strike out. The junior finished the year, striking out once every 21.3 at bats, ranking him ninth among NCAA Division I batters in the country. Redal struck out only 10 times in 213 at bats over 54 games last season.

This year, the senior has once again proven to be hard to strike out. Redal has fanned only twice this season or once per every 42.5 at bats. The outfielder currently ranks as the third toughest batter to strike out in the country.

Teufel Named to Watch List

Liberty senior Shawn Teufel has been listed on the 2010 National Pitcher of the Year Watch List. The Flames left-hander is one of 49 pitchers on the initial list released by the College Baseball Foundation, March 23.

Teufel has allowed only five earned runs over 36 1/3 innings this season, for a 1.24 ERA. The left-hander had opened the 2010 season with a 4-0 record and a 0.62 ERA, before dropping his last start, 5-4, at UNC Asheville this past Friday. He was also among the national ERA leaders, ranking fourth in the last NCAA National Statistical Summary through games of March 23.

He has struck out 29 batters and walking 19. The senior is also holding opponents to a .187 batting average.

After yielding one run in the opening inning of Liberty season opener at Kennesaw State, Teufel ran off a string of 24 scoreless innings, before giving up a run during the Flames' 8-4 win over Manhattan, March 19.

Turning Two

Liberty has turned 28 double plays this season, and ranks 12th nationally in double plays. The Flames total is just eight shy of last year's total of 36 over 54 games.

In addition, the Liberty Flames turned five ground balls into double plays during their 9-1 win over St. John's on March 12. The five double plays turned by the Liberty infield are the most in a game by the Flames over the past 11 seasons.

In 2008, the Flames turned four double plays in a game twice. The contests happened a week apart, as Liberty had four double plays in an 11-5 win over Army, March 8. Seven days later, the Flames recorded four double plays in a 5-0 loss at Southern Miss, March 15.

Liberty also turned four double plays this season in a 6-3 victory over Lehigh on Feb. 27 at the Hughes Brothers Challenge in Wilmington, N.C.

Roundtrippers = Wins

In 26 out of Liberty's 33 victories last season, the Flames hit at least one home run in the contest. Liberty had a record of 26-6 when hitting at least one roundtripper in a game.

Jim Toman's squad belted 60 home runs last season. Liberty's 60 home runs were the most by the Flames since 2002, when Liberty hit 86.

The Flames have started this season out in similar fashion, hitting at least one home run in 12 of their 16 victories.

In the span of a week, the Flames saw three of their contests go to extra innings, their only games to go more than nine frames this season. The span started with St. John's on March 14 and ended against Manhattan on March 20. Unfortunately for Liberty, it ended up on the short end of the score in each of the three games.

Last season, the Flames had two games go to extra innings, a 4-3 win at South Alabama on Feb. 21 and a 10-9 victory at Gardner-Webb on April 26.

Double Delight

Liberty first baseman Trey Wimmer drove in five runs with three doubles, propelling the Flames past the George Mason Patriots, 9-7, this past Tuesday afternoon at Worthington Stadium.

The Liberty first baseman went 3-for-3 with a walk in the contest, scoring two runs. He got thing started in the first inning with a two-run double, and later scored in a three-run inning. His second two-base hit in the fifth inning scored a run, giving the Flames the lead for good. In the seventh, he chased home his final two runs of the contest with his third double of the game.

Wimmer's three doubles tie 13 other Liberty players for most double in a game in program history. The last time a Flame had three two-base hits in a contest was on May 21, 2009, when catcher Errol Hollinger had three in a 20-10 win over High Point at the Big South Conference Baseball Championship at McCormick Field in Asheville, N.C.

Dane Beakler, the second Liberty pitcher of the contest, evened his record at 1-1 on the year. The reliever yielded one run, while scattering seven hits over 4 1/3 innings. He struck out two and did not walk a batter. J.J. McLeod entered the contest with two outs and retired the one batter he faced with the bases full for his third save of the season.

Right fielder Michael Robertson had three hits in the contest for Liberty and scored three times.

Linza Goes Distance

Pitcher Keegan Linza went the distance for the first time in his Liberty career, Saturday, in a 7-3 Liberty win at UNC Asheville.

With the win, Linza runs his record to a Big South-leading 5-0 on the year. The right-hander was efficient, allowing three runs, while scattering 12 hits. He struck out six batters and walked two.

The junior right-hander was backed by left fielder Doug Bream and second baseman P.J. Jimenez, who each had three hits in the contest.

Flames Take Two From Manhattan

The Liberty Flames sandwiched two wins around a disappointing setback, March 19-21, in a three-game, weekend series at Worthington Stadium with the Manhattan Jaspers.

Behind a strong pitching performance by Shawn Teufel, the Liberty Flames defeated the Manhattan Jaspers, 8-4, March 19 in the opening game of the set. Teufel held the Jaspers in check throughout the first seven innings of the contest to run his record to 4-0 on the season. The left-hander allowed one run and scattered five hits in the victory, striking out five and walking three. The Jaspers scored their lone run against Teufel in the fourth inning.

Shortstop Matt Williams had three hits for the Flames, driving in a run and scoring one. Center fielder Curran Redal and catcher Nathan Thompson added two hits apiece. Designated hitter Austin Taylor hit his first home run in a Liberty uniform in the first inning.

After falling in 10 innings, the next day, 14-13, the Flames took the series behind another solid pitching effort on March 21. Right-hander Keegan Linza went 8 1/3 innings, the longest outing for a Liberty pitcher this season, and J.J. McLeod recorded the last two outs by inducing a double play for his second save in an 8-6, Flames win.

Linza allowed six runs on five hits during the 8 1/3 inning span. He struck out six and walked three. In the top of the ninth, McLeod was summoned with a runner on and one out, and got the double play to close out the victory for the Flames.

Liberty took the lead for good in the contest with four runs on four hits in the fifth inning. The big frame gave the Flames an 8-4 lead.

Williams, Redal, second baseman P.J. Jimenez, third baseman Tyler Bream and right fielder Michael Robertson each had two hits for the balanced offensive attack by the Flames. One of Jimenez's two hits was his second home run of the season.

Teufel's Scoreless Streak Ends

Senior left-hander Shawn Teufel gave up only his second run of the season March 19. A Manhattan home run in the fourth halted the left-hander's scoreless innings streak at 24, which spanned over five starts for the senior. Teufel had allowed only one prior run, in the first inning of his season-opening start at Kennesaw State on Feb. 19, and has not allow one since.

The streak tops a previous career-high of 10 scoreless innings by the pitcher last season, from April 4-18. The scoreless span left the left-hander five innings shy of the school record of 29, set by Tim Harrell in 2000.

Liberty Takes Two From St. John's

With wins, March 12 and 13, Liberty took two games of its three-game series with the St. John's Red Storm, at Worthington Stadium.

On the 12th, the Flames belted three home runs in a 9-1 win over the Red Storm. In the game, Liberty plated a run in the first inning to stake itself to a lead it never relinquished.

In the second, the Flames extended their lead with the first of their three round trippers in the contest. With one out, right fielder Michael Robertson connected for a solo home run, his second of the year. Later in the inning with two men aboard and two out, second baseman P.J. Jimenez ripped the second home run of the inning, his first of the year. The three-run home run gave Liberty a 5-0.

After a rain delay, shortstop Josh Richardson hit a solo home run, his second of the day, for the third Flame homer of the contest.

In addition, Liberty turned five ground ball double plays in the contest. Left-hander Shawn Teufel tossed six scoreless innings in the contest to run his record to 3-0 on the year.

A day later, after battling back with four runs in the seventh inning to tie the contest at 9-9, Liberty plated five runs in the eighth for a 14-9 victory. Third baseman Tyler Bream and catcher Nathan Thompson hit back-to-back run-scoring doubles to give the Flames an 11-9 lead. Three batters later, first baseman Trey Wimmer blasted a three-run home run, his first of the year, to make it, 14-9, Flames.

Chris Roach pitched two scoreless innings of relief to pick up his first victory in a Flames uniform.

Best Start Since 1995

Liberty started its 2010 season with a 9-0 record. The mark tied the 1995 Flames for the best start to a year in the 36-year history of the program. Liberty tied the mark with a 10-1 win over Delaware State at Worthington Stadium on March 7.

The Flames' start was the best during the three-year tenure of Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman. During Toman's first season in 2008, the Flames opened the year, 5-1.

Liberty also tied the programs' record for consecutive wins at the NCAA Division I level with the streak. Five other Flames squads have won nine consecutive games (2009, 2008, 2006, 1995, 1985). The 1976 Liberty team holds the school record for consecutive victories with 15.

Flames Open Home Slate with Sweep

The weekend of March 5-7, Liberty opened its 2010 home schedule with a sweep of a three-game series with the Delaware State Hornets. The Flames dominated the series, outscoring the Hornets, 34-2, over the span of the three games. Liberty also hit .368 as a team, while Flames pitchers limited Delaware State to a .167 batting average.

Catcher Nathan Thompson paced Liberty at the plate in the series, going 5-for-10 (.500) with two home runs, a double, five runs scored and seven RBIs. In Sunday's final game, the senior catcher hit his team-leading fourth home run, a three-run round tripper in the first inning, and drove in five of Liberty's runs in the Flames' 10-1 win. Center fielder Curran Redal also hit .500 for Liberty.

Flames pitchers had a 0.72 ERA during the three-game series, striking out 24 and walking 10. Starters Keegan Linza and Steven Evans each won their third game of the year in as many outings, while Friday's starter Shawn Teufel ran his mark to 2-0 on the season.

Starters Strong at Hughes Brothers

Strong pitching helped the Flames win each of their three games in the Hughes Brothers Challenge, Feb. 26-28, in Wilmington, N.C.

On the 26th, starter Shawn Teufel did not allow a run over six innings in a no decision against Morehead State. The Flames rallied with three, two-out runs in the seventh inning to take a 5-2 win. Catcher Nathan Thompson tied the game with a home run in the frame.

Starter Keegan Linza was in control during his seven innings of work, running his mark to 2-0 on the year on Feb. 27. He gave up one run on four hits, as Liberty defeated Lehigh, 6-3. Catcher Jerry Neufang belted his first home run of the year in the contest and shortstop Matt Williams had four of the Flames' eight hits in the game.

On Feb. 28th, backed by a four-hit effort, including a home run, by third baseman Tyler Bream, Steven Evans ran his record to 2-0 on the season in a 12-2 win over UNC Wilmington. Evans allowed two runs on six hits over 6 2/3 innings for the victory. Shortstop Josh Richardson and right fielder Michael Robertson each also hit roundtrippers for the Flames.

Bream Named Conference Player of the Week

Liberty sophomore third baseman Tyler Bream was named as the Big South Conference Choice Hotels Baseball Player of the Week for Feb. 23.

Bream hit .700 (7-for-10) in the Flames' three-game, season-opening sweep of Kennesaw State. The third baseman scored six runs and drove in five RBIs during the three-game series, reaching base three times in each contest to record a .688 on-base percentage. The sophomore had two doubles and a towering two-run home run during the weekend to post a 1.200 slugging percentage.

Bream opened the season on Feb. 19 by going 3-for-3, including an RBI-double and a two-run homer, while driving in four runs. The following afternoon, the third baseman walked twice, drove in a run with a sacrifice fly and scored twice. In the final game of the series on Feb. 21, Bream finished the series by going 4-for-5 with a double and three runs scored to lead the Flames to the sweep.

Flames Open Season with Road Sweep

Liberty opened its 2010 season with a three-game sweep of host Kennesaw State, Feb. 19-21. Led by third baseman Tyler Bream, who hit .700 in the series, the Flames batted .321 during the series and posted double-digit run totals in each contest. Right-fielder Michael Robertson hit .417 with a team-high six RBIs in his debut in a Liberty uniform.

In the opener of the series on Feb. 19, Bream went 3-for-3 with four RBIs and a home run in a 10-2 victory and in the final game of the three-game set on Feb. 21, the third baseman went 4-for-5 with a double and scored three runs in another 10-2 win. Robertson drove in two runs in each game of the series and was 3-for-5 and scored three runs in the Flames' victory in the final game of the series.

The Liberty mound staff held the Owls in check over the span of the series. The Kennesaw State batters hit .194 for the series and struck out 31 times. Flames right-hander Keegan Linza highlighted the weekend for the staff, allowing one run on two hits and striking out eight over six innings in his first outing in a Liberty uniform in an 11-2 victory during the middle contest on Feb. 20. Freshman Josh Richardson did not allow a run in two appearances out of the Flames bullpen during the weekend.
