The Games

The Liberty Flames (0-0) travel to Kennesaw State to open their 2010 campaign, with a three-game weekend series with the Owls, Feb. 19-21. Kennesaw State (0-0) was selected to finished fourth in the Atlantic Sun this season in the conference's preseason poll, while Liberty was picked to finish second in the Big South Conference in its preseason poll.

The series will begin with the first contest of the year for either team, Friday at 4 p.m. at Stillwell Stadium. Saturday, the Flames and the Owls will square off in the middle game of the series at 1 p.m., before closing the series on Sunday at 1 p.m. The series is the first of seven consecutive road games to open the season for Liberty.

Last Time Out

Liberty fell to Winthrop, 6-1, on May 23, the last day of the Big South Baseball Championship, at McCormick Field in Asheville, N.C. The loss eliminated the Flames from the tournament, as Liberty completed the season, 33-21. The Flames finished the Big South Conference regular season with a 17-9 conference mark, its most wins ever since joining the league in 1992.

On Deck

The Flames will continue its seven-game, season-opening road swing, by competing in the Hughes Bros. Challenge, next Friday-Sunday, in Wilmington, N.C. Liberty will face Morehead State Friday, Lehigh Saturday and host UNC Wilmington Sunday at the tournament. Game time Friday is scheduled for 12:30 p.m. Saturday's contest is slated to begin at 10 a.m. and Sunday's game time is set for 1:30 p.m.

First Meeting

Liberty and Kennesaw State have never met on the baseball diamond.

Record at Liberty: 68-47-1 (Two Years)

Career Record: Same

After leading the Flames to the best record of any Liberty head coach during his first two years, 68-47-1, Jim Toman is in his third year at the helm of the Flames program.

Last season, Liberty recorded a 33-21 overall record, while posting a 17-9 mark in Big South Conference play, the most victories by the school since joining the conference in 1992. While recording 30 or more wins in each of Toman's seasons in Lynchburg, Liberty reached the plateau for the fifth consecutive season for the first time in the program's 36-year history in 2009.

Liberty set a new fielding standard in 2009, committing the fewest errors, 53 and finishing the year with the highest fielding percentage, .974, in team history. The 2009 team's fielding percentage ranked 16th in the country. From that infield, third baseman Tyler Bream was named a Freshman All-American by the Collegiate Baseball News.

Pitcher Andrew Wilson became the third player during Toman's time at Liberty to be taken in the MLB draft (Atlanta Braves), while catcher Errol Hollinger later signed a free agent contract (Arizona Diamondbacks).

In 2008, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish the Toman's first season at Liberty with a 35-26-1 mark. The record made Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's 36-year history. He guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by Flames team.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks this past summer. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty also eclipsed the school's single-season doubles mark, ripping 155 two-base hits. The total ranked the Flames fifth in the country in the category.

Liberty finished its season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed the Flames to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. Liberty would go on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman is the sixth head coach in the 35-year history of the Liberty Baseball program. The second-year skipper comes to Liberty after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 19-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball. Toman's 2003, 2005 and 2006 classes were named the top recruiting classes by the publication.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

In addition, South Carolina posted eight-straight seasons of 40 or more wins with Toman on the Gamecock coaching staff, including 2007. During Toman's 11 seasons at South Carolina, he helped the Gamecocks to a combined 500-220 (.694) record.

Toman earned four baseball letters at N.C. State, 1981-84, and was captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in vocational industrial education in 1985. He received a Master of Science degree in sport management from N.C. State in 1995.

Upon graduation, Toman entered the coaching profession as an assistant at Richmond County High School in Rockingham, N.C., for two years. He moved into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989 as an assistant at Florida International for one year. At FIU, he was responsible for the weight program, worked with the squad's catchers and coached first base. Toman joined the N.C. State staff before the 1990 season.

Following the Flames

This season, the Flames Sports Network plans to broadcast over 35 Liberty baseball regular season games and the Big South Baseball Championship, either by radio or video streaming. Nick Pierce will handle the play-by-play duties, with former Flames pitcher Doug Wallace handling the color duties.

Radio broadcasts will air live on WWMC 90.9 FM "The Light" and on the World Wide Web at both LibertyFlames.com and thelightonline.com, while selected games will be video streamed live on the internet via the Big South Network. The network is available on BigSouthSports.com and can be accessed for a nominal fee through a link on LibertyFlames.com or by going directly to BigSouthSports.com. All of the Flames' Big South Conference home games are currently scheduled to be produced by the Flames Sports Network. In addition, several conference schools will provide video streams of Big South Conference away games involving the Flames during the season on the Big South Network.

The Coaches

Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman is in his third year at the helm of the Flames. In his first two seasons, he guided the Flames to 68 wins, the most during the first two years under any head coach in program history, and best winning percentage (.591) over the same span.

Last season, Liberty posted the most victories in Big South Conference play with a 17-9 mark, since joining the conference in 1992. The Flames recorded an overall record of 33-21 in Toman's second year.

A 20-year member of the college coaching ranks, he served 18 years as a member of Ray Tanner's staffs at South Carolina and N.C. State. Toman was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball.

During his time in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three-consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

The winningest head coach in Kennesaw State history, Mark Sansig enters his 19th season with the Owls. Over his career at Kennesaw State, Sansig has taken the Owls to six national tournaments, including a pair of national titles, the 1994 NAIA title and the 1996 NCAA Division II crown.

Most recently, the Owls leader has guided the program's move in the NCAA from Division II to Division I. During the mandatory four-year reclassification period, Sansig's squads produced 116 wins and two second-place Atlantic Sun Conference finishes.

Kennesaw State posted a 30-22 overall record and finished second in the A-Sun with a 20-9 mark last season under Sansig. The Owls are 724-329 during his tenure at the school. In 21 years of collegiate coaching, he has won over 800 games (827-315).

Scouting the Owls

For the first time in program history, Kennesaw State is eligible for NCAA Division I postseason play after four years of transition from the Division II ranks. Last season, the Owls posted a 30-22 record and finished second in the competitive Atlantic Sun (A-Sun) Conference.

The 2010 Kennesaw State roster will have a youthful look, with the departure of 13 players from last year's squad, including four all-conference players. The Owls return four position starters from last season and have 13 freshmen in uniform, the largest class on its roster.

Kennesaw State does return its leading hitter from last season, senior infielder Tyler Stubblefield. Last season, Stubblefield hit .300 with 20 doubles over 51 games. The senior has been selected to the Preseason A-Sun All-Conference team.

The other Owl on the A-Sun squad is outfielder Justin Whitaker. The outfielder returns for his junior season after having a productive season cut to 22 games due to injury. Whitaker hit .379 with four home runs and 25 RBIs in 66 at bats in 2009.

On the mound, Kennesaw State looks to replace its top four pitchers from a year ago. The Owls return seven of the 13 pitchers from their roster, who saw mound time in 2009.

Junior right-hander Ryan Rodenbaugh is the lone starting hurler who returns to roster in 2010. Rodenbaugh went 1-1 with two saves and a 4.10 ERA in 48 1/3 innings last season. The junior made 22 appearances, with six starts, striking out 61 and walking 16 batters.

After Rodenbaugh, senior Brad Long logged the most innings of any returning Owl hurler in 2009. The right-hander went 3-3 with a 5.76 ERA over 37 2/3 innings last season.

Fast Starts in February

Since beginning play during the month of February in 1984, Liberty has posted an all-time mark of 64-32 for a .667 winning percentage. In 22 Februaries as the starting month of the season, the Flames have recorded a .500 or better mark 19 times.

Last season, Liberty recorded a 3-3 record and won the Coca-Cola Classic held Feb. 20-22 in Mobile, Ala., in the second month of the year.

Over the past five years, Flames are 22-9 (.710) during the month of February and have recorded an 8-3 mark under head coach Jim Toman during his first two years.

Standing Tall in Season Openers

Friday's contest with Kennesaw State will be the 37th season opener in program history for the Flames. Despite a 7-6 setback to No. 6 Ole Miss at the 2010 Coca Cola Classic in Mobile, Ala., last season, Liberty has recorded a 23-11 record in season lid-lifters since 1976.

In their first two years under head coach Jim Toman, the Flames have gone 1-1 in campaign openers, defeating Notre Dame, 6-2, on Feb. 22, 2008 at the Clearwater, Fla. Invitational.

Flames on the Road

Liberty finished 2009 with a 11-13 final road ledger. The Flames also compiled a 3-3 record on neutral fields. Liberty will begin the 2010 campaign with seven contests away from Worthington Stadium, its home field.

Home Sweet Home

For the past 32 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium home. Named for program architect and first Liberty head baseball coach, Al Worthington, Liberty has compiled an impressive 505-229-5 record at the stadium for a winning percentage of .685 since the facility's inception in 1979.

The Flames finished the 2009 regular season with a 19-5 record at the facility and are 30-17-1 in two seasons under head coach Jim Toman's guidance.

Liberty is scheduled to open its 2010 home schedule on March 5 against the Delaware State Hornets. The Flames are slated to play 26 contests at Worthington Stadium this season.

Liberty Picked Second in Big South Preseason Poll

Liberty was tabbed to finish second in the Big South Conference standings this season in voting by the Big South Coaches. The Flames were selected second, behind three-time defending champion Coastal Carolina.

The Flames, who received one first-place vote, garnered 88 points in the poll, nine less than Coastal Carolina. The Chanticleers received eight first-place votes and 97 total points.

Winthrop, who garnered the final first-place vote, was tabbed third by the panel with 91 points, followed by Radford, High Point and VMI. Charleston Southern was picked seventh, while Gardner-Webb was voted to finish eighth. Presbyterian, who is eligible for the regular-season title but not the tournament title, and UNC Asheville round out the poll.

The 2010 Big South Championship will be contested May 25-29 at the Winthrop Ballpark in Rock Hill, S.C. The winner of the double-elimination tournament receives the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament.

Coaching Staff Additions

Jason Murray and Adam Ward have joined head coach Jim Toman's staff for the 2010 season. Murray takes over assistant coaching duties, working with the Flames' infielders and coaching third base during games. He also coordinates Liberty's recruiting efforts.

Ward is serving as a volunteer assistant coach on the staff. He works with the team's outfielders and coaches first base for the Flames. Ward also is in charge of grounds at Worthington Stadium.

A Brief Review of the Decade

When the Flames take the field Friday, it will begin a new decade of Liberty baseball. Here's a short look back at the last 10 years of Flames baseball:

- Liberty posted a 325-247-3 record and a .568 winning percentage during the just finished decade.
- The Flames had four players honored as Freshman All-Americans during the decade:
2000 - Keith Bulter, OF
Joey Monahan, SS
2005 - Aaron Grijalva, 1B
2009 - Tyler Bream, 3B
- Liberty had at least one player taken in each of the past 10 Major League Baseball Drafts. A program-high five players were taken in 2002. Along with players signing free agent contracts, 21 former Flames went on to play professional baseball during the decade.
- Liberty had 38 players selected to Big South All-Conference teams during the decade. Seventeen Flames were named to the conference's first team, while 21 were selected to the second team. In 2000, outfielder Keith Butler was named both the Player and Rookie of the Year, while pitcher Brian Harrell was honored with the Scholar-Athlete of the Year. The Flames were Big South Champions that season.
- The Flames compiled 30 or more victories in a season eight times during the decade. In 2006, Liberty posted a 39-21 mark, the most wins by a Flames team since moving to Division I in 1984. Liberty closed the decade with five consecutive seasons with 30 or more wins each year.

Three Newcomers MLB Draft Picks

A trio of players, who have joined the Liberty roster for the 2010 season, have been selected in the Major League Baseball Draft. Junior Austin Taylor, sophomore Michael Robertson and freshmen Cameron Giannini have each been selected in a Major League Draft.

Taylor, an infielder, was drafted out of Thomas County Central High School by the Cincinnati Reds in 2007. The junior college transfer was taken in the 43rd round.

Robertson, an outfielder, was also picked in the MLB Draft by the Cincinnati Reds in 2009. The junior college transfer was selected in the 40th round of the draft by the Reds.

Giannini, a pitcher, was a 2009 Draft Choice of the Detroit Tigers out of Hargrave Christian. The right-hander was selected in the 49th round by the Tigers.

Veteran Roster Returns

Liberty returns seven out of its eight position starters from 2009. Among the returners are the Flames' entire starting infield from a year ago, with three of the four, Trey Wimmer, Matt Williams and Tyler Bream, being sophomores.

In addition, the Flames return 14 players who saw significant playing time in 2009, and 11 seniors, the most of any class on its 2010 roster.

Seniors Named Captains

Catcher Nathan Thompson and pitchers Shawn Teufel and Dustin Umberger have been chosen as captains for the 2010 Liberty Baseball team. The three seniors were selected by virtue of a team vote, with the trio received overwhelming support from their teammates.

Staying in the Commonwealth

Of the 35 players on Liberty's roster, 10 Flames hail from the Commonwealth of Virginia. After the Old Dominion State, four Flames each come from the near-by states of North Carolina and Pennsylvania, while four others hail from Washington state. In total, 12 states are represented on the 2010 Liberty roster.

Flames Post Most Victories in Big South Play

The 2009 Liberty Flames recorded a 17-9 Big South mark. Their victory total was the most ever by a Liberty baseball team since joining the conference in 1992.

The victory total surpassed the 15 Big South wins recorded by the 1995 Flames, who finished their conference season at 15-9.

Most Coaching Wins in First Two Years

In its first two seasons under head coach Jim Toman, Liberty has gone 68-47-1. The Flames' 68 wins are the most over the first two years for any head coach in program history. In addition, Toman's .591 winning percentage during his first two seasons is the highest among the six head coaches to ever guide the Flames.

Fine Fielding

Jim Toman's squad set the school standard for team fielding percentage over a season by finishing 2009 with a .974 fielding percentage. The mark eclipses the .971 fielding percentage of the 2005 Flames team. The 2009 Liberty team's fielding percentage ranked 16th in the country.

In addition, the Flames committed the fewest errors in the 36-year history of the program. Liberty made just 53 errors last season, nine fewer than the previous mark of 62 by the 2005 team.

Third Baseman Bream Named Freshman All-American

Liberty third baseman Tyler Bream was selected to the Louisville Slugger Freshman All-America team, chosen and announced by Collegiate Baseball newspaper last season. The infielder becomes the fourth Flame to be named to Louisville Slugger team in its 19-year history.

Bream finished the year ranked third in the Big South Conference with 57 RBIs. In 46 games, the Zelienople, Pa., native hit .337 with 16 doubles and eight home runs. He scored 35 runs for the Flames and was third on the team with 107 total bases.

Bream opened his first season in a Liberty uniform as the starter at third base and started the first 46 games of the 2009 campaign, until an injury cut short his maiden season of college baseball. He tied the school record with nine RBIs in a game during the Flames' 19-5 victory over High Point, March 22. During a seven-game stretch, Bream drove in 23 runs (March 20-29), leading to him being named the Big South Player of the Week on March 30.

30 Wins - Five Consecutive Years

With its 4-1 win over Duke, May 12, Liberty posted its 30th victory in 2009, reaching the 30-win plateau for the fifth consecutive season, including the first two years under head coach Jim Toman. It is the first time in the 36-year history of the program, the Flames have won 30 or more games for five straight years.

Returners Redal and Teufel Honored in 2009

Senior outfielder Curran Redal and pitcher Shawn Teufel were named to the 2009 Big South Conference first and the VaSID All-State second teams.

In his first year with the Flames in 2009, Redal was the ninth-toughest hitter in country to strike out, fanning once every 21.3 at bats on the year. He finished the season ranked among the Big South leaders in batting average (.380), hits (81), triples (4) and on base percentage (.447). He scored 50 runs and drove in 42 runs, with 13 doubles and six home runs.

The outfielder also set a new Big South record by hitting safely in 32 consecutive games from Feb. 24-April 17. He led the Flames with 23 multi-hit games and 13 multi-RBI contests. The outfielder was selected the Big South Player of the week for March 9-16.

Teufel, a left-hander, finished the year second in the Big South with nine wins and third with 72 strikeouts in his first season on the mound for the Flames. He was also among the conference leaders in ERA (4.33).

The pitcher went 9-2 in 14 games over 72 2/3 innings, and won six consecutive starts from March 22 to May 2.

Redal Tough to K

Liberty outfielder Curran Redal completed the 2009 season as one of the toughest hitters in the nation to strike out. The junior finished the year, striking out once every 21.3 at bats, ranking him ninth among NCAA Division I batters in the country. Redal struck out 10 times in 213 at bats over 54 games this past season.

Umberger Among Flames' All-Time K Kings

Liberty senior right-hander Dustin Umberger enters 2010, his final season in a Flames uniform, already listed among the program's all-time leaders in strikeouts. The Hummelstown, Pa., native has struck out 194 batters over his Liberty career to rank sixth on the school's career strikeout list. Mike Brown, who pitched at Liberty from 1994-97, holds the career strikeout mark with 287.

Voted as one of the three toughest pitchers to face in the conference by Big South head coaches in a recent poll by CollegeInsider.com, Umberger returns after receiving a medical redshirt in 2009.

In 2008, he led the league with 88 strikeouts and tied for second with eight wins. The right-hander posted an 8-3 record with one save and a 3.80 ERA over 83 innings. He walked only 19 batters for a 4.6-to-1 strikeout to walk ratio.

After starting the year in the bullpen, Umberger made nine starts in 2008, pitching two complete games and compiling a 6-1 record. For the second year in a row, the right-hander was selected to the Big South All- Tournament team.

Redal Breaks Big South Consecutive Game Hit Mark

Last season, outfielder Curran Redal singled through the left side of the infield in the first inning, April 17 against Winthrop, to hit safely in his 32nd game in a row, a new Big South record. The junior broke the previous mark of 31 consecutive games with at least one hit, which he held along with UNC Asheville shortstop Kevin Weidenbacher. The UNC Asheville shortstop set the previous record last season.

During the streak, the junior hit .452, collecting 57 hits in 126 at bats. He also drove in 40 RBIs over the span.

Tyler Bream's Record Helps Complete Sweep

Third baseman Tyler Bream tied the Liberty record for RBIs in a game with nine last season during the Flames 19-5 victory over the High Point Panthers on March 22 at Coy Willard Stadium.

With a run-scoring single in seventh inning, Bream tied the Liberty record for RBIs in a game with nine. The freshman third baseman's nine RBIs equaled the school mark set by former Flame standout Pat Sipe, who recorded nine RBIs in a 13-2 win over Richmond on April 19, 1986, at Worthington Stadium.

Bream went 3-for-4 with four runs scored to go along with his nine RBIs for the Flames, helping the visiting Liberty complete a sweep of its three-game Big South series with the Panthers.

Roundtrippers = Wins

In 26 out of Liberty's 33 victories last season, the Flames hit at least one home run in the contest. Liberty had a record of 26-6 when hitting at least one roundtripper in a game.

Jim Toman's squad belted 60 home runs last season, 14 more than in 2007. Liberty's 60 home runs were the most by the Flames since 2002, when Liberty hit 86.

Taking One for the Team

Liberty batters were hit by a pitch 95 times in 2009, setting a new school record. The mark eclipses the record of 82, the Flames set the previous season. Liberty batters were plunked by the opposition an average of 1.76 times per game last year. The Flames finished ranked 14th in the country in the category.

During the 2009 season, Flames batters were hit by a pitch seven times in a game twice to set a new school single-game standard. Temple pitchers hit seven Liberty hitters on March 7 and High Point hurlers plunked seven Flames on March 22.

This game sparked three-consecutive shutouts for Valentin, during a span of 29-consecutive scoreless innings.

By Opponent: UNC Asheville's Jason Walker pitched a seven-inning no-hitter against the Flames on April 29, 2000, at Greenwood Field in Asheville, N.C. Walker allowed two walks and struck out four, leading the Bulldogs to a 3-0 win. The game marked the only shutout against the Flames on the season and the first no-hitter thrown against Liberty since 1992.

By Liberty: Liberty has never recorded a triple play.

By Opponent: Leading 6-4 with a runner on first and second to open the fourth inning, Patrick Gaillard hit a line drive which High Point second baseman Dustin Hoffman caught. Hoffman then tagged second and threw quickly to first to complete the triple play. The Flames went on to win the Big South Championship game, 9-7, on May 25, 2006 at Charles Watson Stadium in Conway, S.C.
