The Games

The Liberty Flames (19-9, 3-3 Big South) travel to Radford, Va., for a three-game Big South Conference series with the Radford Highlanders (13-13, 4-2 Big South), Friday-Sunday, at the RU Baseball Field. The series gets underway Friday at 3 p.m., followed by a 2 p.m. start for the middle contest of the series on Saturday. The three-game set will finish on Sunday. First pitch is scheduled for 1 p.m.

Last Time Out

Liberty opened the game with seven runs in the top of the first inning and never looked back, downing the Old Dominion Monarchs, 12-9, Tuesday evening at Bud Metheny Stadium. With the win, the Flames have won six of their last seven contests.

Four Flames, Curran Redal, Doug Bream, Tyler Bream and P.J. Jimenez, had three hits each in the contest. Jeff Jefferson hit a two-run home run, his second roundtripper of the year, for Liberty.

Cameron Giannini picks up his second consecutive win to run his record to 2-1 on the season. The first of four Liberty pitchers in the contest, the right-hander allowed one run on five hits through the first five innings.

On Deck

The Flames return home to start a six-game homestand, by hosting the Elon Phoenix, Tuesday at Worthington Stadium. First pitch is scheduled for 6 p.m.

Each game of this weekend's Liberty - Radford series may be heard LIVE from Radford, Va., on WWMC 90.9 FM "The Light." Nick Pierce will handle play-by-play duties and former Flames pitcher Doug Wallace will provide commentary. Head Coach Jim Toman

**Record at Liberty: 87-56-1 (Three Years)
Career Record: Same**

After leading the Flames to the best record of any Liberty head coach during his first two years, 68-47-1, Jim Toman is in his third year at the helm of the Flames.

Last season, Liberty recorded a 33-21 overall record, while posting a 17-9 mark in Big South Conference play, the most victories by the school since joining the conference in 1992. While recording 30 or more wins in each of Toman's seasons in Lynchburg, Liberty reached the plateau for the fifth consecutive season for the first time in the program's 36-year history in 2009.

Liberty set a new fielding standard in 2009, committing the fewest errors, 53 and finishing the year with the highest fielding percentage, .974, in team history. The 2009 team's fielding percentage ranked 16th in the country. From that infield, third baseman Tyler Bream was named a Freshman All-American by the Collegiate Baseball News.

Pitcher Andrew Wilson became the third player during Toman's time at Liberty to be taken in the MLB draft (Atlanta Braves), while catcher Errol Hollinger later signed a free agent contract (Arizona Diamondbacks).

In 2008, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish the Toman's first season at Liberty with a 35-26-1 mark. The record made Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's 36-year history. He guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by Flames team.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks this past summer. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty also eclipsed the school's single-season doubles mark, ripping 155 two-base hits. The total ranked the Flames fifth in the country in the category.

Liberty finished its season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed the Flames to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. Liberty would go on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman is the sixth head coach in the 35-year history of the Liberty Baseball program. The second-year skipper comes to Liberty after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 19-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball. Toman's 2003, 2005 and 2006 classes were named the top recruiting classes by the publication.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

In addition, South Carolina posted eight-straight seasons of 40 or more wins with Toman on the Gamecock coaching staff, including 2007. During Toman's 11 seasons at South Carolina, he helped the Gamecocks to a combined 500-220 (.694) record.

Toman earned four baseball letters at N.C. State, 1981-84, and was captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in vocational industrial education in 1985. He received a Master of Science degree in sport management from N.C. State in 1995.

Upon graduation, Toman entered the coaching profession as an assistant at Richmond County High School in Rockingham, N.C., for two years. He moved into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989 as an assistant at Florida International for one year. At FIU, he was responsible for the weight program, worked with the squad's catchers and coached first base. Toman joined the N.C. State staff before the 1990 season.

The Coaches

Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman is in his third year at the helm of the Flames. In his first two seasons, he guided the Flames to 68 wins, the most during the first two years under any head coach in program history, and best winning percentage (.591) over the same span.

Last season, Liberty posted the most victories in Big South Conference play with a 17-9 mark, since joining the conference in 1992. The Flames recorded an overall record of 33-21 in Toman's second year.

A 21-year member of the college coaching ranks, he served 18 years as a member of Ray Tanner's staffs at South Carolina and N.C. State. Toman was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball.

Radford Head Coach Joe Raccuia, a 1995 Radford graduate, is in his third season at his alma mater. Last season, his second year at the helm of the Highlanders, continued the turnaround for the program, as Radford went 26-24 overall and 16-9 in conference play. The Highlanders' season record was the fifth winning campaign in school history and their 16 conference wins were the program's second-most all-time.

In Raccuia's first season with the Highlanders in 2008, the team produced 24 wins, the most since Radford won 28 in 2000. The final total was a 14-game turnaround from the 2007 season.

His path back to Radford was a busy one, ranging from the head coaching job at Marist to an assistant's position at Alabama. In each case, he had a successful run, setting the stage for his return to his alma mater.

All-time against Radford

Friday will be the 71st meeting between Liberty and Radford on the baseball diamond all-time in a series, which started in 1985. The Highlanders have been the most common opponent for the Flames during the program's 37-year history. Liberty enters the weekend series, with a 44-26 record in the all-time series with Radford.

Last season, the two teams split four games. The Flames took a 9-8 win in the opening game of a three-game series against the Highlanders at Worthington Stadium on May 14. Radford came back the following day, by sweeping a doubleheader, 5-3 and 7-5.

The two teams then met on the opening day of the Big South Championship on May 20. Liberty won the contest, 10-3, at McCormick Field in Asheville, N.C.

Baseball in the Commonwealth

Thirteen Division I baseball teams call the Commonwealth of Virginia home. The Flames will play a slate of 15 games against opponents from the "Old Dominion State" this season, including all four of their games this week.

Liberty enters this weekend's three-game series with fellow instate rival Radford looking to build upon their current 4-3 mark against Commonwealth foes.

Liberty is scheduled to meet state squads George Mason (two times), James Madison (two times), Old Dominion (two times), VCU (two times) and Virginia Tech (one time) along with Big South Conference opponents Radford (three times) and VMI (three times) this season.

Scouting the Highlanders

Radford enters this weekend's series with the Flames with a 4-2 Big South record, and a 13-13 overall mark, after losing five out of its last six contests.

The Highlanders rank ninth in the Big South in hitting with a .265 average and eighth in runs scored, averaging 5.7 runs per game.

Outfielder Reggie Keen leads Radford with a .344 average and 18 RBIs. Fellow outfielder Matt Hillsinger is next with a .333 average.

The Highlanders have used their team speed to their advantage this season, stealing 64 bases or at least two per game. Keen has 16 base thefts to lead Radford.

The mound staff begins the weekend with a 5.86 ERA. Friday's starter Aerik Taylor has made a team-high seven starts, posting a 2-0 record with a 4.50 ERA in 40 innings pitched. Eddie Butler, who starts Saturday for the Highlanders, is 4-1 with a team-high 3.61 ERA in 42 1/3 innings. Butler is ninth in the Big South in strikeouts with 33. Bobby Boiling will start Sunday's game. He is 1-0 with a 5.24 ERA.

In the bullpen, Brad Wimmer has been called upon the most this season, making 13 appearances. The right-hander is 1-1 with a 3.92 ERA. Jason Patten leads Radford with three saves.

Analyzing April

The Flames have started April with a 3-1 record, including a 2-1 Big South mark. Liberty is scheduled to play 18 games during the month.

Last season, the Flames finished the month of April with a 10-8 record. Liberty posted a 9-3 mark in Big South Conference play. Since 1976, the Flames have recorded an all-time mark of 331-281-1 (.541) in April.

March Mayhem

With three-straight victories to close the month, Liberty posted a 10-8 mark in games during March this season, including a 1-2 start to Big South Conference play. The Flames are 347-275-2 (.558) all-time in program history during the month.

Fast Starts in February

After completing the month of February with a 6-0 record, its best February start since 1995, the Flames have recorded a .500 or better mark for the month 20 out of 23 times. Since beginning play during the month of February in 1984, Liberty has posted an all-time mark of 70-32 for a .686 winning percentage.

Over the past five years, the Flames are 28-9 (.757) during the month of February, while recording a 14-3 mark under head coach Jim Toman during his three years at Liberty.

Home Sweet Home

For the past 32 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium home. Named for program architect and the first Liberty head baseball coach, Al Worthington, Liberty has compiled an impressive 515-233-5 record at the stadium for a winning percentage of .687 since the facility's inception in 1979.

The Flames have posted a 10-4 record at Worthington this season. Liberty is slated to play 28 contests at home in 2010.

The Flames finished the 2009 regular season with a 19-5 record at the facility and are 33-18-1 at home under three-year head coach Jim Toman's guidance.

Flames on the Road

With their victory on Tuesday at Old Dominion, the Flames have posted a 7-5 mark on the road this season. Liberty is also 2-0 in contests on neutral fields.

The Flames finished 2009 with a 11-13 final road ledger. The Flames also compiled a 3-3 record on neutral fields.

Making It Tough to Score

Liberty enters its weekend series, allowing its opponents 4.9 runs per game. Liberty has only given up more than five runs in a contest nine times this season. Through 28 games, Liberty has outscored its opponents, 217-138.

With 999 victories in program history, the Flames enter Friday's contest one shy of the program's milestone 1,000th win. Liberty posted a 11-14 record in its inaugural season under Al Worthington in 1974.

Other notable Liberty wins in the program's 37-year history:

- 100th win - Liberty 9 Hampden-Sydney 2, April 17, 1979
- 200th win - Liberty 5, Azusa Pacific 4, NAIA National Tournament, June 4, 1981
- 300th win - Liberty 21, Radford 0, March 19, 1985
- 500th win - Liberty 9, Campbell 4, April 23, 1994
- 750th win - Liberty 8, Kutztown 4, March 7, 2003
- 900th win - Liberty 13, Radford 1, April 21, 2007

Other things to note:

- The Flames have recorded one 40-win season (1983).
- The Flames have won 30 or more games in a season on 14 occasions. In addition, Liberty has posted 30 or more victories in a season each of the last five seasons.
- The Flames have had six head coaches during their 37 years - Al Worthington, Bobby Richardson, Johnny Hunton, Dave Pastors, Matt Royer and Jim Toman. Worthington, the program's first coach, is also its winningest and longest tenured, recording 343 victories over 13 seasons.

Umberger Joins Big South 200 Ks Club

With two strikeouts in his first start of the season on March 17 at Duke, Liberty senior right-hander Dustin Umberger became the 53rd pitcher in Big South Conference history to record 200 or more strikeouts. The senior becomes the first Flame since David Bechtold in 2005 to strike out over 200 batters. Bechtold struck out 241 hitters from 2002-05.

Umberger added four strikeouts last Saturday in an unscheduled start against High Point, moving his career total to 207. Currently, his career strikeout totals ranks sixth on the school's career strikeout list. The right-hander is five strikeouts away from moving ahead of Randy Tomlin for fifth place on the list. Tomlin recorded 211 strikeouts for the Flames from 1986-88. For two years, he was Umberger's pitching coach with the Flames. Mike Brown, who pitched at Liberty from 1994-97, holds the career strikeout mark with 287.

Returning from a medical redshirt in 2009, Umberger is 0-1 on the year with a 5.95 ERA in eight appearances this season. He has made four starts.

Redal At It Again

Liberty outfielder Curran Redal completed the 2009 season as one of the toughest hitters in the nation to strike out. The junior finished the year, striking out once every 21.3 at bats, ranking him ninth among NCAA Division I batters in the country. Redal struck out only 10 times in 213 at bats over 54 games last season.

This year, the senior has once again proven to be hard to strike out. Redal has fanned only twice this season, or once per every 54.5 at bats. The outfielder ranked as the second toughest batter to strike out in the country in the latest NCAA statistics, released Tuesday.

Redal Garners Player of the Week Honors

Liberty senior outfielder Curran Redal has been named the Big South Conference Player of the Week for games played March 29-April 4, the league office announced Monday.

Redal hit .579 (11-19) with three multi-hit games and a .654 on-base average from the leadoff spot in the Liberty order, helping the Flames post a 4-1 mark, last week. He opened his week with two walks, a hit-by-pitch and an RBI in Liberty's 9-7 win against George Mason Tuesday, and followed that by reaching base five times in a win at VCU, Wednesday. In the 7-4 win, Redal was 3-3 with a walk, hit-by-pitch, stolen base and run scored.

Last weekend, the Flames center fielder hit .571 (8-14) in Liberty's three-game series against High Point at Worthington Stadium. He notched a hit and a run scored the Flames' 6-4 win in the series opener, and went 7-10 in Saturday's doubleheader split. In the first game, Redal had the first five-hit game of his Liberty career, and added two hits in the nightcap. For the week, Redal slugged .684, had 13 total bases and walked four times. In addition, he added two doubles, four runs scored and three RBIs.

He is the second Flame tabbed the conference's Player of the Week. Third baseman Tyler Bream was named the Big South Player of the Week for games played Feb. 19-21.

Jimenez's Multi-Hit Binge

Second baseman P.J. Jimenez posted a .526 batting average last week, and continued his hot hitting this week, with three hits in Liberty's 12-9 victory at Old Dominion, Tuesday. The burst at the plate has raised the senior's batting average to .373 on the year.

The second baseman had four multi-hit games in the five games played last week, including a three-hit outing in the Flames' 14-8 win in game one of a twinbill, last Saturday against High Point.

With five multi-hit games in his last six contests, Jimenez now leads the Flames with 14 multi-hit games. He also leads Liberty in runs scored with 29.

Teufel Named to Watch List

Liberty senior Shawn Teufel has been listed on the 2010 National Pitcher of the Year Watch List. The Flames left-hander is one of 49 pitchers on the initial list released by the College Baseball Foundation, March 23.

Teufel has posted a 1.79 ERA with a 5-1 record this season. He is among the national ERA leaders, ranking 22nd in the latest NCAA National Statistical Summary through games of April 4. In addition, the left-hander ranks second in the Big South in both ERA and wins.

Teufel has struck out 37 batters, tied for fifth in the conference. The senior is also holding opponents to a .205 batting average. The mark ranks fourth in the Big South.

This past Friday, the left-hander recorded his first complete game in a 6-4 win over High Point. With the complete game, Teufel has now pitched 45 1/3 innings, which ranks him third in the conference.

After yielding one run in the opening inning of Liberty's season opener at Kennesaw State, Teufel ran off a string of 24 scoreless innings, before giving up a run during the Flames' 8-4 win over Manhattan, March 19.

Turning Two

Liberty has turned 33 double plays this season, and ranked tied for 20th nationally in double plays in the last NCAA Statistical Report for games through April 6. The Flames total is just three shy of last year's season total of 36 over 54 games.

In addition, the Liberty Flames turned five ground balls into double plays during their 9-1 win over St. John's on March 12. The five double plays turned by the Liberty infield are the most in a game by the Flames over the past 11 seasons.

In 2008, the Flames turned four double plays in a game twice. The contests happened a week apart, as Liberty had four double plays in an 11-5 win over Army, March 8. Seven days later, the Flames recorded four double plays in a 5-0 loss at Southern Miss, March 15.

Liberty also turned four double plays this season in a 6-3 victory over Lehigh on Feb. 27 at the Hughes Brothers Challenge in Wilmington, N.C.

Roundtrippers = Wins

In 26 out of Liberty's 33 victories last season, the Flames hit at least one home run in the contest. Liberty had a record of 26-6 when hitting at least one roundtripper in a game.

Jim Toman's squad belted 60 home runs last season. Liberty's 60 home runs were the most by the Flames since 2002, when Liberty hit 86.

The Flames have started this season out in similar fashion, hitting at least one home run in 14 of their 19 victories. Jeff Jefferson belted a two-run home run in the first inning of Liberty's 12-9 win at Old Dominion, Tuesday.

Extras Haven't Been Kind

In the span of a week, the Flames saw three of their contests go to extra innings, their only games to go more than nine frames this season. The span started with St. John's on March 14 and ended against Manhattan on March 20. Unfortunately for Liberty, it ended up on the short end of the score in each of the three games.

Last season, the Flames had two games go to extra innings, a 4-3 win at South Alabama on Feb. 21 and a 10-9 victory at Gardner-Webb on April 26.

Teufel Notches Complete Game

Liberty left-hander Shawn Teufel went the distance for the first time in his career, as the Flames downed the High Point Panthers, 6-4, April 2 in a Big South Conference night contest at Worthington Stadium.

Facing the fourth-best hitting team in the country, Teufel held the Panthers in check for most of the contest, running his record to 5-1 on the year. The senior scattered four runs on nine hits in the game. He struck out eight batters and walked two.

Liberty took the lead for good in the contest during the bottom of the fifth inning, sending 11 men to the plate to score five runs on five hits and taking advantage of three Panther errors. Left fielder Doug Bream had the big blow of frame, launching a first pitch, bases-loaded, double off the wall in right-center field, to give the Flames the lead at 5-3.

Catcher Nathan Thompson had three hits, drove in a run and scored a run in the contest.

Bream Backs Giannini's First Win

Liberty third baseman Tyler Bream had three hits, including a home run, and Cameron Giannini pitched seven strong innings, as the Liberty Flames defeated the VCU Rams, 7-4, March 31st in an evening contest at the Diamond.

Bream drove in three runs with the trio of hits, including his third home run of the season and his first triple of the year. Center fielder Curran Redal also had three hits in the contest. He also walked and scored a run for the Flames.

Giannini, making his second career start, recorded his first win in a Liberty uniform. The freshman right-hander allowed four runs on four hits over seven innings. He struck out four batters and walked three. Josh Richardson finished up for the Flames, pitching two scoreless frames.

Dane Beakler, the second Liberty pitcher of the contest, evened his record at 1-1 on the year. The reliever yielded one run, while scattering seven hits over 4 1/3 innings. He struck out two and did not walk a batter. J.J. McLeod entered the contest with two outs and retired the one batter he faced with the bases full for his third save of the season.

Right fielder Michael Robertson had three hits in the contest for Liberty and scored three times.

Linza Goes Distance

Pitcher Keegan Linza went the distance for the first time in his Liberty career, in a 7-3 Liberty win at UNC Asheville on March 27.

Behind a strong pitching performance by Shawn Teufel, the Liberty Flames defeated the Manhattan Jaspers, 8-4, March 19 in the opening game of the set. Teufel held the Jaspers in check throughout the first seven innings of the contest to run his record to 4-0 on the season. The left-hander allowed one run and scattered five hits in the victory, striking out five and walking three. The Jaspers scored their lone run against Teufel in the fourth inning.

Teufel's Scoreless Streak Ends

Senior left-hander Shawn Teufel gave up only his second run of the season March 19. A Manhattan home run in the fourth halted the left-hander's scoreless innings streak at 24, which spanned over five starts for the senior. Teufel had allowed only one prior run, in the first inning of his season-opening start at Kennesaw State on Feb. 19, and has not allow one since.

The streak tops a previous career-high of 10 scoreless innings by the pitcher last season, from April 4-18. The scoreless span left the left-hander five innings shy of the school record of 29, set by Tim Harrell in 2000.

Liberty Takes Two From St. John's

With wins, March 12 and 13, Liberty took two games of its three-game series with the St. John's Red Storm, at Worthington Stadium.

On the 12th, the Flames belted three home runs in a 9-1 win over the Red Storm. In the game, Liberty plated a run in the first inning to stake itself to a lead it never relinquished.

In the second, the Flames extended their lead with the first of their three round trippers in the contest. With one out, right fielder Michael Robertson connected for a solo home run, his second of the year. Later in the inning with two men aboard and two out, second baseman P.J. Jimenez ripped the second home run of the inning, his first of the year. The three-run home run gave Liberty a 5-0.

After a rain delay, shortstop Josh Richardson hit a solo home run, his second of the day, for the third Flame homer of the contest.

In addition, Liberty turned five ground ball double plays in the contest. Left-hander Shawn Teufel tossed six scoreless innings in the contest to run his record to 3-0 on the year.

A day later, after battling back with four runs in the seventh inning to tie the contest at 9-9, Liberty plated five runs in the eighth for a 14-9 victory. Third baseman Tyler Bream and catcher Nathan Thompson hit back-to-back run-scoring doubles to give the Flames an 11-9 lead. Three batters later, first baseman Trey Wimmer blasted a three-run home run, his first of the year, to make it, 14-9, Flames.

Chris Roach pitched two scoreless innings of relief to pick up his first victory in a Flames uniform.

Best Start Since 1995

Liberty started its 2010 season with a 9-0 record. The mark tied the 1995 Flames for the best start to a year in the 36-year history of the program. Liberty tied the mark with a 10-1 win over Delaware State at Worthington Stadium on March 7.

The Flames' start was the best during the three-year tenure of Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman. During Toman's first season in 2008, the Flames opened the year, 5-1.

Liberty also tied the programs' record for consecutive wins at the NCAA Division I level with the streak. Five other Flames squads have won nine consecutive games (2009, 2008, 2006, 1995, 1985). The 1976 Liberty team holds the school record for consecutive victories with 15.

Flames Open Home Slate with Sweep

The weekend of March 5-7, Liberty opened its 2010 home schedule with a sweep of a three-game series with the Delaware State Hornets. The Flames dominated the series, outscoring the Hornets, 34-2, over the span of the three games. Liberty also hit .368 as a team, while Flames pitchers limited Delaware State to a .167 batting average.

Catcher Nathan Thompson paced Liberty at the plate in the series, going 5-for-10 (.500) with two home runs, a double, five runs scored and seven RBIs. In Sunday's final game, the senior catcher hit his team-leading fourth home run, a three-run round tripper in the first inning, and drove in five of Liberty's runs in the Flames' 10-1 win. Center fielder Curran Redal also hit .500 for Liberty.

Flames pitchers had a 0.72 ERA during the three-game series, striking out 24 and walking 10. Starters Keegan Linza and Steven Evans each won their third game of the year in as many outings, while Friday's starter Shawn Teufel ran his mark to 2-0 on the season.
