The Games

The Liberty Flames (13-6, 0-0 Big South) travel to Asheville, N.C., for their first Big South series of the season, Friday-Sunday, against the UNC Asheville Bulldogs (5-12, 0-3 Big South) at Greenwood Field. First pitch in the series opener is scheduled for 3 p.m. Saturday's contest is scheduled for a 2 p.m. start. The series finale gets underway Sunday at 1 p.m.

Last Time Out

The host Virginia Tech Hokies used a five-run third inning to down the Flames, 10-0, Wednesday at English Field.

In the only meeting between the two teams this season, Liberty was held to four hits by Hokie pitching. Catcher Nathan Thompson had two hits for the Flames.

On Deck

Liberty will host George Mason, Tuesday in a midweek contest. Game time at Worthington Stadium is scheduled for 3 p.m. Wednesday, the Flames will travel to Richmond, Va., to play the VCU Rams at the Diamond. First pitch is scheduled for 6 p.m.

Flames in Big South Openers

For the 14th time during Liberty's 18 years in the Big South, the Flames will start conference play with a road series. Liberty is 24-26 in their Big South opening series of the season.

Of the 50 games, Liberty has opened conference play on the road 13 times, posting a 15-21 record. The Flames have opened at home five times, going 9-5.

Last season, Liberty opened the Big South portion of its schedule at Worthington Stadium, splitting a pair of games with the Charleston Southern Buccaneers during a rain-fill weekend. The Flames won the opening contest, 5-4, and dropped the other contest 7-4.

In 2008, Liberty opened conference play with the first night game in stadium history, a 5-3, 11 inning setback to Coastal Carolina on March 28. The Flames bounced back the following afternoon for a 9-6 win, before dropping the finale game of the set on March 30, 2-1.

Record at Liberty: 81-53-1 (Three Years)

Career Record: Same

After leading the Flames to the best record of any Liberty head coach during his first two years, 68-47-1, Jim Toman is in his third year at the helm of the Flames.

Last season, Liberty recorded a 33-21 overall record, while posting a 17-9 mark in Big South Conference play, the most victories by the school since joining the conference in 1992. While recording 30 or more wins in each of Toman's seasons in Lynchburg, Liberty reached the plateau for the fifth consecutive season for the first time in the program's 36-year history in 2009.

Liberty set a new fielding standard in 2009, committing the fewest errors, 53 and finishing the year with the highest fielding percentage, .974, in team history. The 2009 team's fielding percentage ranked 16th in the country. From that infield, third baseman Tyler Bream was named a Freshman All-American by the Collegiate Baseball News.

Pitcher Andrew Wilson became the third player during Toman's time at Liberty to be taken in the MLB draft (Atlanta Braves), while catcher Errol Hollinger later signed a free agent contract (Arizona Diamondbacks).

In 2008, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish the Toman's first season at Liberty with a 35-26-1 mark. The record made Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's 36-year history. He guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by Flames team.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks this past summer. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty also eclipsed the school's single-season doubles mark, ripping 155 two-base hits. The total ranked the Flames fifth in the country in the category.

Liberty finished its season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed the Flames to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. Liberty would go on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman is the sixth head coach in the 35-year history of the Liberty Baseball program. The second-year skipper comes to Liberty after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 19-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball. Toman's 2003, 2005 and 2006 classes were named the top recruiting classes by the publication.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

In addition, South Carolina posted eight-straight seasons of 40 or more wins with Toman on the Gamecock coaching staff, including 2007. During Toman's 11 seasons at South Carolina, he helped the Gamecocks to a combined 500-220 (.694) record.

Toman earned four baseball letters at N.C. State, 1981-84, and was captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in vocational industrial education in 1985. He received a Master of Science degree in sport management from N.C. State in 1995.

Upon graduation, Toman entered the coaching profession as an assistant at Richmond County High School in Rockingham, N.C., for two years. He moved into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989 as an assistant at Florida International for one year. At FIU, he was responsible for the weight program, worked with the squad's catchers and coached first base. Toman joined the N.C. State staff before the 1990 season.

The Coaches

Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman is in his third year at the helm of the Flames. In his first two seasons, he guided the Flames to 68 wins, the most during the first two years under any head coach in program history, and best winning percentage (.591) over the same span.

Last season, Liberty posted the most victories in Big South Conference play with a 17-9 mark, since joining the conference in 1992. The Flames recorded an overall record of 33-21 in Toman's second year.

A 21-year member of the college coaching ranks, he served 18 years as a member of Ray Tanner's staffs at South Carolina and N.C. State. Toman was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball.

During his time in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three-consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

UNC Asheville Head Coach Tom Smith is in his first season heading up the Bulldog program. This past June, he became the the eighth head coach in the history of the UNC Asheville baseball program. He had served on the UNC Asheville coaching staff for two years, serving as a volunteer assistant in 2008 and as an assistant in 2009.

Before coming to UNC Asheville, Smith was considered one of the top high school coaches in the nation at T.C. Roberson HS in Asheville. He coached the Rams program for 28 years and led the school to three 3-A state titles in 1983, 2000 and 2002. The Rams won 14 conference titles during his tenure.

Smith had 20 players drafted by major league teams during his time at Roberson. The list includes pitcher Darren Holmes who went to pitch 17 years in the major leagues, current left-hander pitcher Chris Narveson of the Milwaukee Brewers and outfielder Cameron Maybin of the Florida Marlins, who was drafted in the first round in 2005.

All-Time Against UNC Asheville

Friday's meeting will be the 57th meeting between Liberty and UNC Asheville on the baseball diamond. The Flames hold a 39-17 advantage in the all-time series started in 1986.

Last season, Liberty took two of three contests from UNC Asheville in Lynchburg, Va. The Flames won 9-0 in Friday's opener, before falling in the first game of a doubleheader Saturday, 9-2. Liberty closed out the series with a win in the series finale in the second game of the twinbill, 11-4.

The last time the two teams met in Asheville on April 4-6, the Bulldogs took the opening contest 9-0, only to see the Flames rally from behind the next day for a 14-13 win in 10 innings. Liberty then closed out the series with an 11-6 victory.

Scouting the Bulldogs

After being swept last weekend at Radford in its first Big South series of the year, UNC Asheville will be hosting its first conference series this weekend looking for its first Big South win of the year. The Bulldogs enter their set with the Flames at 5-12 overall.

As a team, UNC Asheville is hitting .282 on the year, and averages 6.1 runs per game. Catcher Ian Graham is Asheville's leading hitter, having posted a .377 average. Second baseman Robert McInthosh, who has also made three pitching appearances for the Bulldogs, follows Graham with a .339 average.

The UNC Asheville pitching staff is lead by Taylor Wohlwend, who will face the Flames Friday. Wohlwend is a 1-3 so far this season with a save and a 5.32 ERA. He leads the Bulldog staff with 23 2/3 innings pitched and 28 strike outs. Ryan Dull, Saturday's starter, is 2-0. He has posted a 5.73 ERA in 22 innings.

Tyler Coyle and Dan Weller have been the most relied upon hurlers out of the Bulldog bullpen this season. Coyle has made nine appearances and is 1-0 with a 5.00 ERA. Weller has a team-best 2.45 ERA in eight appearances.

March Mayhem

Liberty has posted a 7-6 record during the month of March this season. The Flames are 344-273-2 (.557) all-time in program history during the month.

Last season, Liberty posted a 16-3 (.842) overall mark and started 7-1 in Big South play during the month.

Liberty is scheduled to play 18 games during March. Three of those games will begin Big South Conference play. The Flames will travel to UNC Asheville for a conference series, this weekend at Greenwood Field.

Fast Starts in February

After completing the month of February with a 6-0 record, its best February start since 1995, the Flames have recorded a .500 or better mark for the month 20 out of 23 times. Since beginning play during the month of February in 1984, Liberty has posted an all-time mark of 70-32 for a .686 winning percentage.

Over the past five years, the Flames are 28-9 (.757) during the month of February, while recording a 14-3 mark under head coach Jim Toman during his three years at Liberty.

Home Sweet Home

For the past 32 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium home. Named for program architect and the first Liberty head baseball coach, Al Worthington, Liberty has compiled an impressive 512-232-5 record at the stadium for a winning percentage of .686 since the facility's inception in 1979.

The Flames have posted a 7-3 record at Worthington this season. Liberty is slated to play 28 contests at home in 2010.

The Flames finished the 2009 regular season with a 19-5 record at the facility and are 33-18-1 at home under three-year head coach Jim Toman's guidance.

Flames on the Road

After starting the year, 4-0 in road games, the Flames have dropped their last three road games for a 4-3 road mark. Liberty is also 2-0 in contests on neutral fields.

The Flames finished 2009 with a 11-13 final road ledger. The Flames also compiled a 3-3 record on neutral fields.

Making It Tough to Score

Liberty enters this weeken's series, allowing its opponents 4.8 runs per game. Meanwhile, the Flames are averaging 8.1 runs per game. Liberty has only given up more than five runs in a contest six times this season. Through 19 games, Liberty has outscored its opponents, 153-91.

Scoring First

The Flames have gotten on the scoreboard first in 15 of their 19 contests this season. Liberty is 13-2, when scoring first.

- The Flames have won 30 or more games in a season on 14 occasions. In addition, Liberty has posted 30 or more victories in a season each of the last five seasons.
- The Flames have had six head coaches during their 37 years - Al Worthington, Bobby Richardson, Johnny Hunton, Dave Pastors, Matt Royer and Jim Toman. Worthington, the program's first coach is also its winningest and longest tenured, recording 343 victories over 13 seasons.

Teufel Named to Watch List

Liberty senior Shawn Teufel has been listed on the 2010 National Pitcher of the Year Watch List. The Flames left-hander is one of 49 pitchers on the initial list released by the College Baseball Foundation, Tuesday.

Teufel has opened the 2010 season with a 4-0 record and a 0.62 ERA in five starts. The left-hander leads the Big South Conference in both wins and ERA. He is also among the national leaders, ranking fourth in ERA.

Teufel has allowed only two runs over 29 innings this season, striking out 28 batters and walking 18. He is also holding opponents to a .170 batting average, which ranks second among Big South pitchers.

After yielding one run in the opening inning of Liberty season opener at Kennesaw State, Teufel ran off a string of 24 scoreless innings, before giving up a run during the Flames' 8-4 win over Manhattan, Friday.

Roundtrippers = Wins

In 26 out of Liberty's 33 victories last season, the Flames hit at least one home run in the contest. Liberty had a record of 26-6 when hitting at least one roundtripper in a game.

Jim Toman's squad belted 60 home runs last season. Liberty's 60 home runs were the most by the Flames since 2002, when Liberty hit 86.

The Flames have started this season out in similar fashion, hitting at least one home run in 11 of their 13 victories. Liberty has hit a total of 18 home runs in 2010, with catcher Nathan Thompson leading the team with four roundtrippers.

Extras Haven't Been Kind

In the span of a week, the Flames saw three of their contests go to extra innings. The span started with St. John's on March 14 and ended against Manhattan on March 20. Unfortunately for Liberty, it ended up on the short end of the score in each of the three games. Last season, the Flames had two games go to extra innings, a 4-3 win at South Alabama on Feb. 21 and a 10-9 victory at Gardner-Webb on April 26.

Starting Sensations

One of the keys to the Flames' early-season success has been the performance of their three weekend starters, Shawn Teufel, Keegan Linza and Steven Evans.

The trio has combined to post an 11-0 record during their weekend starts, with a 1.96 ERA. With wins this past weekend, Teufel and Linza moved to 4-0 to lead the Big South Conference in wins, while Evans has posted a 3-0 record. During their weekend starts, teams have hit .183 against the trio and struck out 80 times.

Teufel's Scoreless Streak Ends

Senior left-hander Shawn Teufel gave up only his second run of the season Friday in five starts this season. A Manhattan home run in the fourth halted the left-hander's scoreless innings streak at 24. Teufel had allowed only one prior run, in the first inning of his season-opening start at Kennesaw State on Feb. 19, and has not allow one since.

The streak tops a previous career-high of 10 scoreless innings by the pitcher last season, from April 4-18. The scoreless span left the left-hander five innings shy of the school record of 29, set by Tim Harrell in 2000.

Allowing just two runs this season, Teufel leads the Big South Conference with a 0.62 ERA and ranks fifth in the country in the latest NCAA Statistical Report for games through March 21.

Redal At It Again

Liberty outfielder Curran Redal completed the 2009 season as one of the toughest hitters in the nation to strike out. The junior finished the year, striking out once every 21.3 at bats, ranking him ninth among NCAA Division I batters in the country. Redal struck out only 10 times in 213 at bats over 54 games last season.

This year, the senior is back among the nation's toughest hitters to strikeout, ranking second in the country by striking out just once in 69 at bats.

Flames Lead Conference Categories

Several Flames enter the week ranked among the Big South statistical leaders. While Liberty leads the conference with a 3.57 ERA, left-hander Shawn Teufel is atop Big South rankings with a 0.62 ERA. Teufel is also tied with teammate Keegan Linza in wins with four, and is second in the conference in opponent batting average with a .170. In addition to being tied for the Big South lead in wins, Linza tops the league with 35 innings pitched and is fifth with a 2.57 ERA.

On the hitting side, third baseman Tyler Bream enter the week second in the conference in RBIs with 26. Shortstop Matt Williams is also second with a .536 on base percentage.

Besides leading the Big South in team ERA, the Flames also lead the conference in team fielding with a .976 fielding percentage.

Umberger Among Flames' All-Time K Kings

Liberty senior right-hander Dustin Umberger entered 2010, his final season in a Flames uniform, already listed among the program's all-time leaders in strikeouts.

Umberger has struck out 202 batters during his Liberty career to rank sixth on the school's career strikeout list. The right-hander is 10 strikeouts away from moving ahead of Randy Tomlin for fifth place on the list. Tomlin recorded 211 strikeouts for the Flames from 1986-88. Mike Brown, who pitched at Liberty from 1994-97, holds the career strikeout mark with 287.

Voted as one of the three toughest pitchers to face in the conference by Big South head coaches in a preseason poll by CollegeInsider.com, Umberger returned to the Liberty roster after receiving a medical redshirt in 2009.

The Liberty Flames sandwiched two wins around a disappointing setback last weekend in a three-game series at Worthington Stadium with the Manhattan Jaspers.

Behind a strong pitching performance by Shawn Teufel, the Liberty Flames defeated the Manhattan Jaspers, 8-4, Friday afternoon in the opening game of the set. Teufel held the Jaspers in check throughout the first seven innings of the contest to run his record to 4-0 on the season. The left-hander allowed one run and scattered five hits in the victory, striking out five and walking three. The Jaspers scored their lone run against Teufel in the fourth inning.

Shortstop Matt Williams had three hits for the Flames, driving in a run and scoring one. Center fielder Curran Redal and catcher Nathan Thompson added two hits apiece. Designated hitter Austin Taylor hit his first home run in a Liberty uniform in the first inning.

After falling in 10 innings, Saturday, 14-13, the Flames took the series behind another solid pitching effort. Linza allowed six runs on five hits during the 8 1/3 inning span to run his mark to 4-0 on the year. He struck out six and walked three. In the top of the ninth, McLeod was summoned with a runner on and one out, and got the double play to close out the victory for the Flames.

Liberty took the lead for good in the contest with four runs on four hits in the fifth inning. The big frame gave the Flames an 8-4 lead.

Williams, Redal, second baseman P.J. Jimenez, third baseman Tyler Bream and right fielder Michael Robertson each had two hits for the balanced offensive attack by the Flames. One of Jimenez's two hits was his second home run of the season.

Liberty Takes Two From St. John's

With wins, March 12 and 13, Liberty took two games of its three-game series with the St. John's Red Storm, this past weekend at Worthington Stadium.

On the 12th, the Flames belted three home runs in a 9-1 win over the Red Storm. In the game, Liberty plated a run in the first inning to stake itself to a lead it never relinquished.

In the second, the Flames extended their lead with the first of their three round trippers in the contest. With one out, right fielder Michael Robertson connected for a solo home run, his second of the year. Later in the inning with two men aboard and two out, second baseman P.J. Jimenez ripped the second home run of the inning, his first of the year. The three-run home run gave Liberty a 5-0.

After a rain delay, shortstop Josh Richardson hit a solo home run, his second of the day, for the third Flame homer of the contest.

In addition, Liberty turned five ground ball double plays in the contest. Left-hander Shawn Teufel tossed six scoreless innings in the contest to run his record to 3-0 on the year.

Liberty started its 2010 season with a 9-0 record. The mark tied the 1995 Flames for the best start to a year in the 36-year history of the program. Liberty tied the mark with a 10-1 win over Delaware State at Worthington Stadium on March 7.

The Flames' start was the best during the three-year tenure of Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman. During Toman's first season in 2008, the Flames opened the year, 5-1.

Liberty also tied the programs' record for consecutive wins at the NCAA Division I level with the streak. Five other Flames squads have won nine consecutive games (2009, 2008, 2006, 1995, 1985). The 1976 Liberty team holds the school record for consecutive victories with 15.
