The Liberty Flames (13-5, 0-0 Big South) travel to Blacksburg, Va. for their only meeting this season with the Virginia Tech Hokies (13-8, 2-4 ACC), Wednesday. First pitch at English Field is scheduled for 5:30 p.m.

Last Time Out

The Liberty Flames took over the lead with a four-run fifth inning, and never looked back, defeating the Manhattan Jaspers, 8-6, Sunday afternoon at Worthington Stadium.

Five Flames had two hits in the contest. Second baseman P.J. Jimenez was one of the Flames with two hits, including his second home run of the year.

Starter Keegan Linza went 8 1/3 innings to remain unbeaten at 4-0 on the year. The junior right-hander was relieved by J.J. McLeod, who induced a double-play grounder to close out the win and record his second save of the year.

On Deck

Liberty will open Big South Conference play with a weekend series at UNC Asheville, Friday-Sunday. The series will open on Friday at 3 p.m. at Greenwood Field. Saturday, the middle contest of the three game set is scheduled for 2 p.m. Sunday's series finale first pitch is scheduled for 1 p.m.

Record at Liberty: 81-52-1 (Three Years)

Career Record: Same

After leading the Flames to the best record of any Liberty head coach during his first two years, 68-47-1, Jim Toman has the Flames out to their best start in his thee-year tenure.

Last season, Liberty recorded a 33-21 overall record, while posting a 17-9 mark in Big South Conference play, the most victories by the school since joining the conference in 1992. While recording 30 or more wins in each of Toman's seasons in Lynchburg, Liberty reached the plateau for the fifth consecutive season for the first time in the program's 36-year history in 2009.

Liberty set a new fielding standard in 2009, committing the fewest errors, 53 and finishing the year with the highest fielding percentage, .974, in team history. The 2009 team's fielding percentage ranked 16th in the country. From that infield, third baseman Tyler Bream was named a Freshman All-American by the Collegiate Baseball News.

Pitcher Andrew Wilson became the third player during Toman's time at Liberty to be taken in the MLB draft (Atlanta Braves), while catcher Errol Hollinger later signed a free agent contract (Arizona Diamondbacks).

In 2008, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish the Toman's first season at Liberty with a 35-26-1 mark. The record made Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's 36-year history. He guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by Flames team.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks this past summer. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty also eclipsed the school's single-season doubles mark, ripping 155 two-base hits. The total ranked the Flames fifth in the country in the category.

Liberty finished its season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed the Flames to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. Liberty would go on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman is the sixth head coach in the 35-year history of the Liberty Baseball program. The second-year skipper comes to Liberty after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 19-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball. Toman's 2003, 2005 and 2006 classes were named the top recruiting classes by the publication.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

In addition, South Carolina posted eight-straight seasons of 40 or more wins with Toman on the Gamecock coaching staff, including 2007. During Toman's 11 seasons at South Carolina, he helped the Gamecocks to a combined 500-220 (.694) record.

Toman earned four baseball letters at N.C. State, 1981-84, and was captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in vocational industrial education in 1985. He received a Master of Science degree in sport management from N.C. State in 1995.

Upon graduation, Toman entered the coaching profession as an assistant at Richmond County High School in Rockingham, N.C., for two years. He moved into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989 as an assistant at Florida International for one year. At FIU, he was responsible for the weight program, worked with the squad's catchers and coached first base. Toman joined the N.C. State staff before the 1990 season.

The Coaches

Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman is in his third year at the helm of the Flames. In his first two seasons, he guided the Flames to 68 wins, the most during the first two years under any head coach in program history, and best winning percentage (.591) over the same span.

Last season, Liberty posted the most victories in Big South Conference play with a 17-9 mark, since joining the conference in 1992. The Flames recorded an overall record of 33-21 in Toman's second year.

A 21-year member of the college coaching ranks, he served 18 years as a member of Ray Tanner's staffs at South Carolina and N.C. State. Toman was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball.

During his time in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three-consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

Head Coach Pete Hughes is in his fourth season at Virginia Tech. In four seasons, Hughes has amassed a 91-92 record, including a 32-21 mark last season. The Hokies' 2009 record accounted for Tech's best winning percentage (.604) since 1999, when the Hokies went 42-17 (.712). The 32 wins were Tech's highest total since winning 34 in 2003, and the 12 conference wins were the most since winning 15 that same year as a member of the BIG EAST.

Prior to his arrival at Virginia Tech, Hughes spent eight seasons as the head coach at Boston College. During their eight seasons under Hughes, the Eagles averaged 31 wins per year. In 2005, he led Boston College to a school record 37 wins and his squad was named the Division I New England Baseball Team of the Year. He also was the head coach at Trinity University in Texas for two seasons (1997-98).

All-Time Against Virginia Tech

Wednesday's meeting between the Flames and the Hokies will be the 56th contest between the two schools. Virginia Tech holds a 32-23 all-time series advantage. Last season, Liberty took a 4-3 victory in the lone meeting between the two teams at Worthington Stadium on April 22, 2009.

The Flames also won the last contest between the two squads at English Field, 7-6, on May 7, 2008.

Scouting the Hokies

After jumping out to a 13-4 record, Virginia Tech enters Wednesday's game with the Flames on a four-game losing skid. This past weekend, the Hokies dropped all three of their contests at No. 7 Clemson.

The Virginia Tech offense has found its stride so far this season. The Hokies are hitting .338 as team and averaging 8.3 runs per game.

Outfielder Austin Wates leads the Hokies with a .444 batting average and has knocked in 17 runs. A base-stealing threat, Wates has a team-high seven stolen bases. Teammate Tim Smalling enters Wednesday's game with a .436 average. The Hokie shortstop was held out of games this past weekend due to injury.

Two-way player Ronnie Shaban has hit .360 with 17 RBIs as Virginia Tech's third baseman. The Hokie has also seen mound time, making five appearances with a 3.38 ERA. Second baseman Michael Seaborn leads Virginia Tech with 20 RBIs.

Meanwhile, the Hokie pitching staff has has a 4.70 ERA entering Wednesday. Ben Rowen has been a workhorse for Virginia Tech out of the bullpen so far this season. The right-hander has appeared in 14 games, posting a 1-0 record and two saves, with a 0.55 ERA. He is averaging 1.79 strikeouts per inning this season.

Manny Martir, Wednesday's probable starter, has made one start for the Hokies this season. In two total appearances, he is 0-1 with a 10.80 ERA in 6 2/3 innings.

March Mayhem

Liberty has posted a 7-5 record during the month of March this season. The Flames are 344-272-2 (.558) all-time in program history during the month.

Last season, Liberty posted a 16-3 (.842) overall mark and started 7-1 in Big South play during the month.

Liberty is scheduled to play 18 games during March. Three of those games will begin Big South Conference play. The Flames will travel to UNC Asheville for a conference series, this weekend at Greenwood Field.

Fast Starts in February

After completing the month of February with a 6-0 record, its best February start since 1995, the Flames have recorded a .500 or better mark for the month 20 out of 23 times. Since begining play during the month of February in 1984, Liberty has posted an all-time mark of 70-32 for a .686 winning percentage.

Over the past five years, the Flames are 28-9 (.757) during the month of Feburary, while recording a 14-3 mark under head coach Jim Toman during his three years at Liberty.

Home Sweet Home

For the past 32 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium home. Named for program architect and the first Liberty head baseball coach, Al Worthington, Liberty has compiled an impressive 512-232-5 record at the stadium for a winning percentage of .686 since the facility's inception in 1979.

The Flames have posted a 7-3 record at Worthington this season. Liberty is slated to play 28 contests at home in 2010.

The Flames finished the 2009 regular season with a 19-5 record at the facility and are 33-18-1 at home under three-year head coach Jim Toman's guidance.

Flames on the Road

After starting the year, 4-0 in road games, the Flames have dropped their last two road games for a 4-2 road mark. Liberty is also 2-0 in contests on neutral fields.

The Flames finished 2009 with a 11-13 final road ledger. The Flames also compiled a 3-3 record on neutral fields.

Making It Tough to Score

Liberty enters Wednesday's game, allowing its opponents 4.5 runs per game Meanwhile, the Flames are averaging 8.5 runs per game. Liberty has only given up more than five runs in a contest five times this season. Through 18 games, Liberty has outscored its opponents, 153-81.

Scoring First

The Flames have gotten on the scoreboard first in 15 of their 18 contests this season. Liberty is 13-2, when scoring first.

Teufel Named to Watch List

Liberty senior Shawn Teufel has been listed on the 2010 National Pitcher of the Year Watch List. The Flames left-hander is one of 49 pitchers on the initial list released by the College Baseball Foundation, Tuesday.

Teufel has opened the 2010 season with a 4-0 record and a 0.62 ERA in five starts. The left-hander leads the Big South Conference in both wins and ERA. He is also among the national leaders, ranking fourth in ERA.

Teufel has allowed only two runs over 29 innings this season, striking out 28 batters and walking 18. He is also holding opponents to a .170 batting average, which ranks second among Big South pitchers.

After yielding one run in the opening inning of Liberty season opener at Kennesaw State, Teufel ran off a string of 24 scoreless innings, before giving up a run during the Flames' 8-4 win over Manhattan, Friday.

Roundtrippers = Wins

In 26 out of Liberty's 33 victories last season, the Flames hit at least one home run in the contest. Liberty had a record of 26-6 when hitting at least one roundtripper in a game.

Jim Toman's squad belted 60 home runs last season. Liberty's 60 home runs were the most by the Flames since 2002, when Liberty hit 86.

The Flames have started this season out in similiar fashion, hitting at least one home run in 11 of their 13 victories. Liberty has hit a total of 18 home runs in 2010, with catcher Nathan Thompson leading the team with four roundtrippers.

Extras Haven't Been Kind

In the span of a week, the Flames saw three of their contests go to extra innings. The span started with St. John's on March 14 and ended against Manhattan on March 20. Unfortunately for Liberty, it ended up on the short end of the score in each of the three games. Last season, the Flames had two games go to extra innings, a 4-3 win at South Alabama on Feb. 21 and a 10-9 victory at Gardner-Webb on April 26.

Starting Sensations

One of the keys to the Flames' early-season success has been the performance of their three weekend starters, Shawn Teufel, Keegan Linza and Steven Evans.

The trio has combined to post an 11-0 record during their weekend starts, with a 1.96 ERA. With wins this past weekend, Teufel and Linza moved to 4-0 to lead the Big South Conference in wins, while Evans has posted a 3-0 record. During their weekend starts, teams have hit .183 against the trio and struck out 80 times.

Teufel's Scoreless Streak Ends

Senior left-hander Shawn Teufel gave up only his second run of the season Friday in five starts this season. A Manhattan home run in the fourth halted the left-hander's scoreless innings streak at 24. Tuefel had allowed only one prior run, in the first inning of his season-opening start at Kennesaw State on Feb. 19, and has not allow one since.

The streak tops a previous career-high of 10 scoreless innings by the pitcher last season, from April 4-18. The scoreless span left the left-hander five innings shy of the school record of 29, set by Tim Harrell in 2000.

Allowing just two runs this season, Teufel leds the Big South Conference with a 0.62 ERA and ranks fifth in the country in the latest NCAA Statistical Report for games through March 21.

Redal At It Again

Liberty outfielder Curran Redal completed the 2009 season as one of the toughest hitters in the nation to strike out. The junior finished the year, striking out once every 21.3 at bats, ranking him ninth among NCAA Division I batters in the country. Redal struck out only 10 times in 213 at bats over 54 games last season.

This year, the senior is back among the nation's toughest hitters to strikeout, ranking second in the country by striking out just once in 69 at bats.

Flames Lead Conference Categories

Several Flames enter the week ranked among the Big South statistical leaders. While Liberty leads the conference with a 3.57 ERA, left-hander Shawn Teufel is atop Big South rankings with a 0.62 ERA. Teufel is also is tied with teammate Keegan Linza in wins with four, and is second in the conference in opponent batting aveage with a .170. In addition to being tied for the Big South lead in wins, Linza tops the league with 35 innings pitched and is fifth with a 2.57 ERA.

On the hitting side, third baseman Tyler Bream enter the week second in the conference in RBIs with 26. Shortstop Matt Williams is also second with a .536 on base percentage.

Besides leading the Big South in team ERA, the Flames also lead the conference in team fielding with a .976 fielding percentage.

Umberger Among Flames' All-Time K Kings

Liberty senior right-hander Dustin Umberger entered 2010, his final season in a Flames uniform, already listed among the program's all-time leaders in strikeouts.

The right-hander went over 200 strikeouts for his career, last Wednesday at Duke, striking out two batters in his first start of the season. Umberger has struck out 201 batters during his Liberty career to rank sixth on the school's career strikeout list. He will look to add to the total Wednesday, when he takes the mound as the Flames' starter at Virginia Tech.

The right-hander is 11 strikeouts away from moving ahead of Randy Tomlin for fifth place on the list. Tomlin recorded 211 strikeouts for the Flames from 1986-88. Mike Brown, who pitched at Liberty from 1994-97, holds the career strikeout mark with 287.

Voted as one of the three toughest pitchers to face in the conference by Big South head coaches in a preseason poll by CollegeInsider.com, Umberger returned to the Liberty roster after receiving a medical redshirt in 2009.

In 2008, he led the league with 88 strikeouts and tied for second with eight wins. The right-hander posted an 8-3 record with one save and a 3.80 ERA over 83 innings. He walked only 19 batters for a 4.6-to-1 strikeout to walk ratio. After starting the year in the bullpen, Umberger made nine starts, pitching two complete games and compiling a 6-1 record.

Flames Take Two From Manhattan

The Liberty Flames sandwiched two wins around a disappointing setback last weekend in a three-game series at Worthington Stadium with the Manhattan Jaspers.

Behind a strong pitching performance by Shawn Teufel, the Liberty Flames defeated the Manhattan Jaspers, 8-4, Friday afternoon in the opening game of the set. Teufel held the Jaspers in check throughout the first seven innings of the contest to run his record to 4-0 on the season. The left-hander allowed one run and scattered five hits in the victory, strucking out five and walking three. The Jaspers scored their lone run against Teufel in the fourth inning.

Shortstop Matt Williams had three hits for the Flames, driving in a run and scoring one. Center fielder Curran Redal and catcher Nathan Thompson added two hits apiece. Designated hitter Austin Taylor hit his first home run in a Liberty uniform in the first inning.

After falling in 10 innings, Saturday, 14-13, the Flames took the series behind another solid pitching effort. Right-hander Keegan Linza went 8 1/3 innings, the longest outing for a Liberty pitcher this season, and J.J. McLeod recorded the last two outs by inducing a double play for his second save in an 8-6, Flames win.

Linza allowed six runs on five hits during the 8 1/3 inning span to run his mark to 4-0 on the year. He struck out six and walked three. In the top of the ninth, McLeod was summoned with a runner on and one out, and got the double play to close out the victory for the Flames.

Liberty took the lead for good in the contest with four runs on four hits in the fifth inning. The big frame gave the Flames an 8-4 lead.

Williams, Redal, second baseman P.J. Jimenez, third baseman Tyler Bream and right fielder Michael Robertson each had two hits for the balanced offensive attack by the Flames. One of Jimenez's two hits was his second home run of the season.

In addition, Liberty turned five ground ball double plays in the contest. Left-hander Shawn Teufel tossed six scoreless innings in the contest to run his record to 3-0 on the year.

A day later, after battling back with four runs in the seventh inning to tie the contest at 9-9, Liberty plated five runs in the eighth for a 14-9 victory. Third baseman Tyler Bream and catcher Nathan Thompson hit back-to-back run-scoring doubles to give the Flames an 11-9 lead. Three batters later, first baseman Trey Wimmer blasted a three-run home run, his first of the year, to make it, 14-9, Flames.

Chris Roach pitched two scoreless innings of relief to pick up his first victory in a Flames uniform.

Double Delight

On March 12th, the Liberty Flames turned five ground balls into double plays during their 9-1 win over St. John's. The five double plays turned by the Liberty infield are the most in a game by the Flames this decade.

In 2008, the Flames turned four double plays in a game twice. The contests happened a week apart, as Liberty had four double plays in an 11-5 win over Army, March 8. A week later, the Flames recorded four double plays in a 5-0 loss at Southern Miss, March 15. Liberty also turned four double plays this season in a 6-3 victory over Lehigh on Feb. 27.

Best Start Since 1995

Liberty started its 2010 season with a 9-0 record. The mark tied the 1995 Flames for the best start to a year in the 36-year history of the program. Liberty tied the mark with a 10-1 win over Delaware State at Worthington Stadium on March 7.

In addition, the Flames' start was the best during the three-year tenure of Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman. During Toman's first season at Liberty in 2008, the Flames opened the year, 5-1.

Liberty also tied the programs' record for consecutive wins at the NCAA Division I level with the streak. Five other Flames squads have won nine consecutive games (2009, 2008, 2006, 1995, 1985). The 1976 Liberty team holds the school record for consecutive victories with 15.

Flames Open Home Slate with Sweep

The weekend of March 5-7, Liberty opened its 2010 home schedule with a sweep of a three-game series with the Delaware State Hornets. The Flames dominated the series, outscoring the Hornets, 34-2, over the span of the three games. Liberty also hit .368 as a team, while Flames pitchers limited Delaware State to a .167 batting average.

Catcher Nathan Thompson paced Liberty at the plate in the series, going 5-for-10 (.500) with two home runs, a double, five runs scored and seven RBIs. In Sunday's final game, the senior catcher hit his team-leading fourth home run, a three-run round tripper in the first inning, and drove in five of Liberty's runs in the Flames' 10-1 win. Center fielder Curran Redal also hit .500 for Liberty.

Flames pitchers had a 0.72 ERA during the three-game series, striking out 24 and walking 10. Starters Keegan Linza and Steven Evans each won their third game of the year in as many outings, while Friday's starter Shawn Teufel ran his mark to 2-0 on the season.
