The Games

The Liberty Flames (9-9, 0-0 Big South) open Big South play this weekend, with a three-game series at Worthington Stadium against the Charleston Southern Buccaneers (10-8, 0-0 Big South). The series begins a seven-game homestand for the Flames. The conference series get underway on Friday with the first night game of 2011 at Worthington Stadium. First pitch is scheduled for 7 p.m. The Flames and the Buccaneers will then meet on Saturday at 3 p.m. and in the series finale, Sunday at 1 p.m.

Last Time Out

The Liberty Flames saw their four-game winning streak come to end, falling to the Maryland Terrapins, 10-5, Wednesday afternoon at Smith Stadium.

After the Terps jumped out to a 6-2 advantage early, Liberty cut its deficit to 6-5 in the top of the sixth inning. However, it was as close as the Flames got on the day, as Maryland answered with four runs in the bottom of the inning, en route to the victory.

On Deck

The Flames continue their homestand with a nonconference game against the Virginia Tech Hokies, Tuesday afternoon. Game time is scheduled for 3 p.m.

Next weekend, Liberty will closed out the homestand with another Big South series. The Flames will host the Winthrop Eagles for three games, starting Friday evening at 7 p.m. at Worthington Stadium, followed by games Saturday at 3 p.m. and Sunday at 1 p.m.

Following the Flames

All three games this weekend will be video streamed LIVE. The feed will be available for a nominal fee on the Big South Network. The video stream will also be available on the World Wide Web at both LibertyFlames.com and BigSouthSports.com. In addition, an online audio stream will be available on the World Wide web at LibertyFlames.com.

Nick Pierce will handle play-by-play duties and former Flames pitcher Doug Wallace will provide commentary for the games. Sunday's series finale may also be heard LIVE on WVMC 90.9 FM radio.

Head Coach Jim Toman

Record at Liberty: 119-75-1 (Fourth Year)

Career Record: Same

After leading his team to a school-record 42 victories in 2010, Jim Toman enters his fourth year at Liberty with the best mark of any Flames head coach over his first three years.

Since taking over the program for the 2008 season, Liberty has won 35 or more games twice and last season posted only the second 40-win campaign in the 37-year history of the program. The Flames notched a 110-66-1 record during his first three seasons on Liberty Mountain.

On May 2, 2010, Toman recorded his 100th career victory, as the Flames defeated Gardner-Webb, 10-7, at Worthington Stadium. The sixth coach in program history, Toman became the fastest Liberty baseball head coach to amass the milestone, passing first coach Al Worthington, by reaching his 100th win in 160 games, six fewer than Worthington.

The impressive strides made by the program have not gone unnoticed. This past November, Rivals.com cited Liberty as one being one of college baseball's top 10 rising programs.

Last season, the Flames had their best season under Toman, posting a school record for wins in a single season with a 42-19 record. The team's ledger was boosted by a 21-8 road mark, the nation's 10th-best road record in 2010.

In addition, Liberty recorded a 19-7 mark in Big South play, eclipsing its record of the previous season for most victories by the school since joining the conference in 1992. The Flames finished second in the league's regular season and were conference runner-up at the Big South Baseball Championship.

Pitcher Shawn Teufel became the fourth player from one of Toman's Liberty squads to be taken in the MLB Draft. The two-time Big South all-conference first team pitcher and National Pitcher of the Year Watch list member capped a strong senior campaign by being selected by the Detroit Tigers.

In 2009, Liberty recorded a 33-21 overall record, while posting a 17-9 mark in Big South Conference play. Liberty set a new fielding standard in 2009, committing the fewest errors, 53, and finishing the year with the highest fielding percentage, .974, in team history. From that infield, third baseman Tyler Bream was named a Freshman All-American by the Collegiate Baseball News.

Pitcher Andrew Wilson became the third player during Toman's time at Liberty to be taken in the MLB draft (Atlanta Braves).

In 2008, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish Toman's first season at Liberty with a 35-26-1 mark. The record made Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's history. He guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by a Flames team.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB Draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty finished its season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed the Flames to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. Liberty would go on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman was named the sixth head coach in the history of the Liberty Baseball program in June 2007, after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and coached the catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 22-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. During his final years with the Gamecocks, he recruited many of the players who were members of the 2010 South Carolina National Championship team. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight straight between 2000 and 2007, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 14 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

Toman was a four-year letterwinner at N.C. State from 1981-84, and served as team captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons.

Toman Reaches 100 Coaching Wins

With a 10-7 win over Gardner-Webb on May 2, 2010, Liberty head coach Jim Toman recorded his 100th career coaching win.

Of the six head coaches in Liberty history, Toman becomes the fastest to reach 100 coaching victories. Toman reached the milestone in 160 games, eclipsing program founder and first head coach Al Worthington, who reached his 100th win in 166 games.

The Coaches

Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman is in his fourth year at the helm of the Flames. During his time at Liberty, he has guided the Flames to a 119-75-1 record. He led the Flames to the best mark of any Liberty head coach over his first three seasons on Liberty Mountain.

Last season, the Flames had their best year under Toman, posting a school record for wins in a single season with a 42-19 record. The team's ledger was boosted by a 21-8 road mark, the nation's 10th best road record in 2010.

In addition, Liberty recorded a 19-7 mark in Big South play, eclipsing its record of the previous season for most victories by the school since joining the conference in 1992. The Flames finished second in the league's regular season and were conference runner-up at the Big South Baseball Championship.

In 2009, Liberty posted the most victories in Big South Conference play with a 17-9 mark, since joining the conference in 1992. The Flames recorded an overall record of 33-21 in Toman's second year.

A 20-year member of the college coaching ranks, he served 18 years as a member of Ray Tanner's staffs at South Carolina and N.C. State. Toman was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina.

Stuart Lake is in the third year as the head coach of his alma mater, Charleston Southern. In his first three seasons, the Buccaneers have posted a 43-83 mark under the 1994 CSU graduate.

A 14-year coaching veteran, Lake has been an assistant coach at the Citadel, Ole Miss, College of Charleston and South Carolina, before taking over the Buccaneer program. Lake got his start in college coaching at South Carolina, serving on the same staff with the Flames' Jim Toman.

All-Time Series Against the Charleston Southern

Friday's game between the Buccaneers and the Flames will be the 60th all-time meeting between the two teams on the baseball diamond. Liberty holds a 38-21 advantage in the series, which started in 1977.

Last season, Liberty swept all three games between the two teams at CSU Ballpark in Charleston, S.C. The Flames won the opening game behind the trio of Steven Evans, Dane Beakler and J.J. McLeod, 7-5, before going on to sweep the series with 4-1 and 13-4 victories.

The Buccaneers and the Flames split a conference series shortened to two games due to rain last time the two met at Worthington Stadium, March 13-15, 2009. Liberty edged Charleston Southern, 5-4, in the opener on March 13. The Bucs defeated the Flames, 7-4, on March 15.

A Look at Charleston Southern

The Buccaneers enter their first Big South series with a record of 10-8. Charleston Southern snapped a three-game losing skid with a 15-13 victory in a slugfest at USC Upstate on Wednesday. The Bucs rallied from an early 8-0 deficit to win the contest.

The Buccaneers have hit .308 as a team and averaged 6.17 runs per game so far this season. Charleston Southern was picked by the Big South head baseball coaches to finish eighth in the league standings this season, after a 6-20 conference record last season.

Outfielder Brantley Meier, who started the week eighth in the Big South with a .406 batting average, leads the Buccaneers in category. He has also scored a conference-leading 21 times. In addition, 2010 All-Big South second team first baseman Nick Chiners is also off to a good start at the plate, hitting .355 with 16 RBIs.

Designated hitter Derek Smith has provided the power for Charleston Southern, hitting .353 with a team-leading five home runs and 21 RBIs.

Meanwhile, the Buccaneer pitchers have posted a 5.67 ERA and allowed 6.9 runs per game, so far this season. Opposing batters are hitting .291 against the Buc hurlers.

Friday's starter Stew Brase enters the contest with a 2-1 record and a 1.59 ERA in 22 2/3 innings over four starts. He has been a little on the wild side, as the right-hander has walked 14 batters and struck out 11. Saturday's starter Patrick Dolan has opened the year with a 1-1 mark and a 1.65 ERA over 16 1/3 innings, while Sunday's probable starter Jesse Cadenhead is 1-2 with a 7.83 ERA in 23 innings.

The Buccaneer bullpen has been anchored by right-hander Corey Deighan, who in 10 relief appearances has recorded five saves and a 1-1 record, so far. The junior has an 8.03 ERA. Left-hander Charlie McCready leads the team in both ERA and appearances. He has a 2-0 record with a 0.48 ERA in 11 appearances.

Flames in Big South Openers

For only fifth time during Liberty's 20 years in the Big South, the Flames will start conference play with a home series. Liberty is 25-28 in its Big South opening series of the season.

Of the 52 games, Liberty has opened conference play on the road 15 times, posting a 16-23 record. The Flames have opened at home four times, going 9-5.

March Musings

Liberty will enter the weekend with a 6-4 record during the month of March. The Flames have already had one game canceled against Binghamton due to rain this month. Jim Toman's squad is scheduled to play 19 games during the month and starts Big South play with a three-game, home series against Charleston Southern this weekend (March 18-20).

Liberty posted a 10-8 mark in games during March last season, including a 1-2 start to Big South Conference play. The Flames are 353-279-2 (.558) all-time during the month.

February Record

The Flames finished the the month of February with a 3-5 record. Since beginning play during the month of February in 1984, Liberty has posted an all-time mark of 73-37 for a .664 winning percentage for the month.

Over the past six years, the Flames are 31-14 (.689) during the month of February, while recording a 17-8 mark under head coach Jim Toman during his four years at Liberty.

Home Sweet Home

For the past 32 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium home. Named for program architect and the first Liberty head baseball coach, Al Worthington, Liberty has compiled an impressive 526-240-5 record at the stadium for a winning percentage of .686 since the facility's inception in 1979.

The Flames have started 2-2 on the year at Worthington Stadium. Liberty opened the home portion of their 2011 schedule on March 4, defeating Binghamton, 12-2. The victory moves Liberty's record in home openers to 25-8 since the facility opened.

Liberty posted a 19-9 record at home in 2010. The Flames are 52-27-1 at home under four-year head coach Jim Toman's guidance.

The Flames have started the season, 7-7 away from home. Liberty is 5-7 in road contests and 2-0 in neutral site games.

Liberty is slated to play 29 regular-season contests away from home. The Flames will square off with 27 of their opponents on their home field this season and already have met two teams, Rutgers and Monmouth, on a neutral field during the Keith LeClair Classic in Greenville, N.C., March 11-13. Liberty captured the event by winning all three of its games at the East Carolina-hosted event.

The Flames went 21-10 away from their home, Worthington Stadium, in 2010. Liberty posted the 10th-best road mark in the nation during the year. The Flames went 18-8 in road games and 3-2 in neutral site contests during the year. Liberty won six consecutive road contests to open the 2010 season.

Playing Under the Lights

Liberty fell in its first night contest, 5-0 at North Florida, Feb. 25 to drop to 0-1 in night games this season. Liberty is scheduled to play 17 games under the stars this year. The Flames will play the first night game of the season at Worthington Stadium, Friday night in the opening game of this series.

Last season, Liberty posted a 5-6 record in night contests.

Liberty Versus the Big South

Liberty, a 20-year member of the Big South Conference, has compiled a 265-185 (.589) record against the Big South Conference's current membership. The Flames finished the regular season in second place in conference play with a 19-7 record in 2010. The victory total was the most wins by a Liberty team since joining the Big South in 1992.

What's the RISP?

Through the first 18 games of the year, the Flames have hit .270 with runners in scoring position. Outfielder Ian Parmley leads Liberty with a .438 batting average with runners in scoring position. Fellow outfielders Doug Bream and Michael Robertson are next with .400 averages with runners in position. Bream leads the Flames by driving in 12 runs when hitting with runners in scoring position. Meanwhile, Bream and second baseman Zach Haley paced the Flames in hitting with runners in scoring position and two out. Both Flames have hit .364 so far with that situation. In addition, six out of Haley's seven RBIs this season have come while hitting with two outs.

In comparison, Liberty hitters batted .316 with runners in scoring position (RISP) in 2010. Bream led the Flames with a .429 batting average with runners in scoring position, while catcher Nathan Thompson, who graduated last season, had 44 RBIs, the most with runners in scoring position. Justin Richardson has also hit .438 with runners in scoring position and two outs to lead the team.

Get Your Running Shoes On

What a difference a year makes. So far this season, Liberty has tried to take advantage of its team speed, doubling its stolen base total through 18 games from a year ago. The Flames have stolen 28 bases in 35 attempts this season, compared to 2010, when the Flames swiped only 14 bases in 22 tries through 18 games.

Leading the way for the Flames is catcher Casey Rasmus who is 6-for-6 in steal attempts this season and center fielder Ian Parmley who is 6-9, thus far. In addition, shortstop Matt Williams and Michael Robertson each have swiped four bases.

The Flames stolen base totals are definitely a stark contrast from last season, when only outfielder Kenneth Negron had stolen four bases at this point in the year.

What About Williams

About the only thing to slow down Liberty shortstop Matt Williams this season has been the flu. The shortstop has played in 17 games this season, missing Tuesday's game at Maryland due to illness. The hot-hitting Williams returned on Wednesday to collect two more hits, including a two-run double to notch his team-leading ninth game with multiple hits.

The junior has hit safely in 15 out of the 17 games he has played. He has also had two four-hit contests. He leads the Flames with a .408 batting average and entered the week listed sixth in the Big South in the category.

Williams also entered the week second in the conference in hits. The junior also leads the team with 14 runs, seven doubles and a slugging percentage of .606.

Last season, Williams was named to the Big South all-conference second team as a sophomore. The shortstop hit .360 with 30 RBIs and 52 runs scored. He tied with teammate Tyler Bream and 2002 Flame shortstop Joey Monahan for second on the Liberty single season list with 22 doubles.

Picking Up the Pace

With new bats and new rules to speed up time between innings and govern mound visits, the time Flames contests have been played in this season has seen a significant drop. So far this season, Liberty games have run an average of 2:27, compared to 2:49 minutes at this point in the season in 2010, a 22-minute difference.

Last season through 18 games, Liberty had already played six games which lasted three hours or longer, with the longest being 3:43 in a 14-13, 10 inning setback to Manhattan on March 20. This season, the Flames have had only three games go over three hours, the longest 3:11 in a 17-5 loss in game two of a twinbill at Mercer on Feb. 19.

In his second year at Liberty, Murray was the Buccaneers' head coach from 2005-08. He posted a 82-136 record during his tenure at Charleston Southern. Three Buccaneers were named Freshman All-Americans while playing for Murray, including current Charleston Southern designated hitter Derek Smith.

Baker Comes Up Big at Maryland

A strong relief appearance by Garrett Baker and seven extra base hits propelled the Liberty Flames past the Maryland Terrapins, 11-4, Tuesday afternoon at Smith Stadium in College Park, Md.

Baker entered the contest with the bases loaded, no one out and one run already in for Maryland in first inning and quickly restored order in the contest. The junior allowed only an unearned run, scattering three hits over eight effective innings. The left-hander struck out five and walked none, running his record to 2-0. He retired seven consecutive batters from the second through the fourth innings and later, finished his outing by setting down 12 Terrapins in order.

Despite trailing 3-0 after one inning, the Flames answered with four runs in the third inning to take a lead they never relinquished. In the frame, second baseman Zach Haley and first baseman Jeff Jefferson hit solo home runs. For Haley, it was his first of the season, while Jefferson's roundtripper was his second on the year.

Haley led all players in the contest with three hits, including two extra base hits. One of left fielder Doug Bream's two hits in the game was a bases-clearing double. Center fielder Ian Parmley, right fielder Michael Robertson and Jefferson also had two hits apiece.

Linza got things started on Friday, firing the first complete game of the season by a Liberty starting pitcher in a 5-2 victory over Rutgers. The senior right-hander allowed two runs on seven hits, striking out five and not walking a Scarlet Knight batter.

Linza retired the first 10 Scarlet Knight batters to face him in the contest and did not allow a runner past second base until the seventh inning, when Rutgers scored its first run of the contest. With the win, he runs his record to 3-0 on the year.

Saturday, right-hander John Niggli pitched seven strong innings to pick up his second victory of the year in a 4-3 win over Monmouth. When completed, the Flames will have travel 2,314 miles for contests during the road swing. Connections - Part I

Three Liberty Flames, catcher Casey Rasmus, third baseman Tyler Bream and infielder Austin Taylor, each have connections to Major League Baseball through family members.

Rasmus, a junior, is in his first season as a member of the Liberty roster. His brother Colby is a member of the St. Louis Cardinals and enters his third season as an outfielder with the team in 2011.

Bream, also a junior, is the son of former major leaguer Sid Bream. Sid Bream, a Liberty standout during his collegiate days, played 12 seasons in the majors (1983-94) with the Los Angeles Dodgers, Pittsburgh Pirates, Atlanta Braves and Houston Astros.

Taylor, a senior, is the nephew of former major leaguer Bill Taylor. Bill Taylor spent parts of eight seasons with the Oakland A's, New York Mets and Tampa Bay Rays.

Connections - Part II

Three Flames are carrying on a family tradition, as a member of their family formerly played baseball at Liberty.

First baseman/outfielder Doug Bream's uncle Dave was a member of the Liberty baseball program from 1982-85.

Third baseman Tyler Bream's father, Sid, and two uncles, Dave and Sheldon, were members of the Flames. Sid, who went on to play in the major leagues, was a standout for Liberty on the diamond from 1979-81. The first baseman and Liberty Athletics Hall of Fame member was named a NAIA and NABC All-American in 1981, as the Flames reached the NAIA National Tournament.

Bream's uncles, Dave and Sheldon, were also members of the Flames baseball team during their college days. Dave played infield for Liberty from 1982-85, while Sheldon was an outfielder with the Flames from 1989-93. Tyler and Doug are second cousins.

Meanwhile, pitcher Garrett Baker begins his first season at Liberty. The junior left-hander's brothers, Jason and Steve, played for the Flames. Five or More RBIs in a Game - Catcher Nathan Thompson had four hits, including a home run, and drove in seven runs in Liberty's 16-9, 10-inning victory over Presbyterian College, April 25, 2010 at the PC Baseball Complex in Clinton, S.C.

Inside the Park Home Run - Kenneth Negron belted a liner into the right field gap which glanced off the Coastal Carolina right fielder's glove to cash in two runners at Charles Watson Stadium in Conway, S.C. on April 28, 2007. When the ball rolled all the way to the wall, the Liberty second baseman came home and scored standing up for his first home run of the season, knotting the back-and-forth contest with the No. 19 Chanticleers at 7-7. Coastal Carolina rallied in the bottom of the eighth inning to take the contest, 9-7.

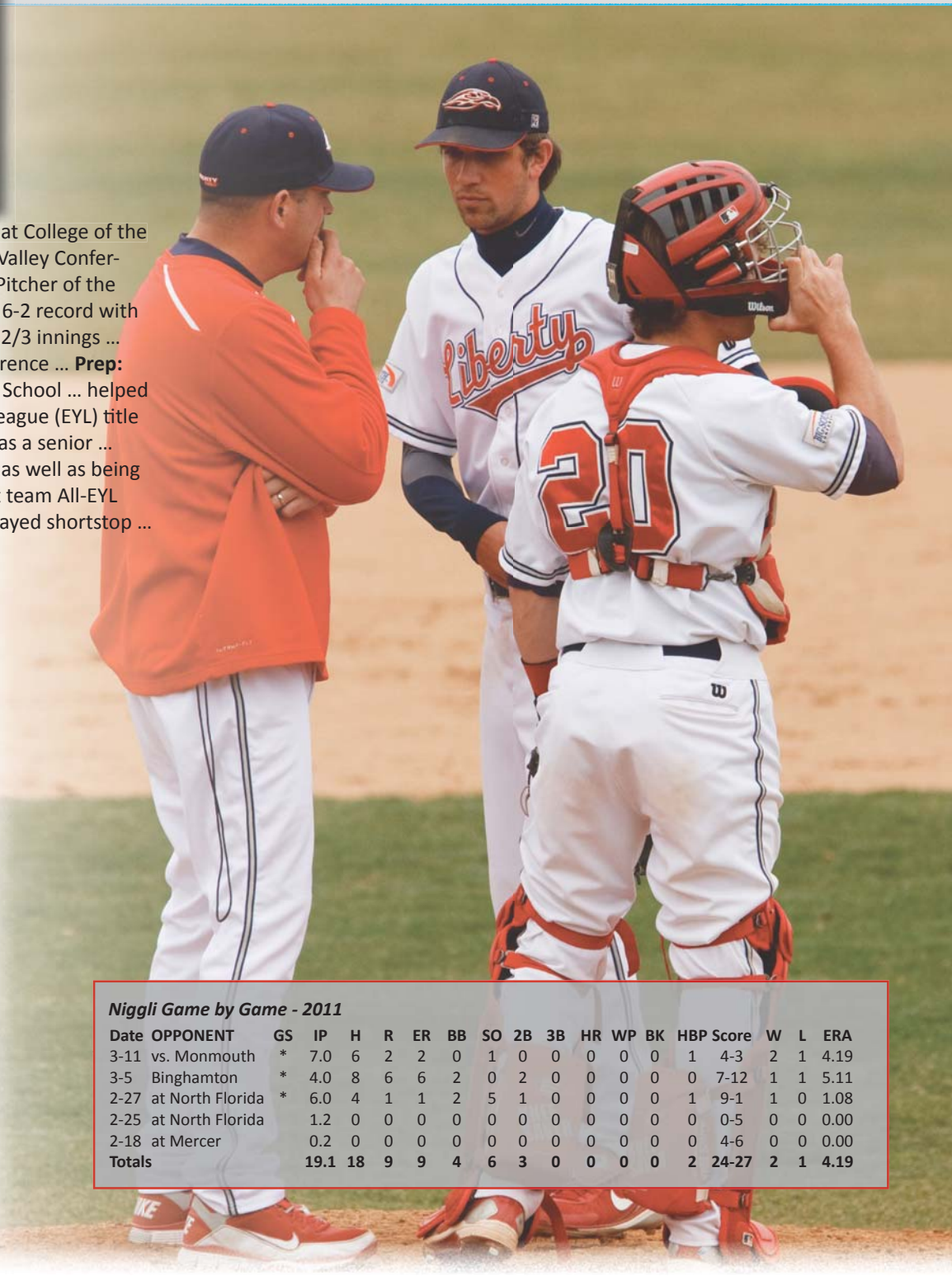

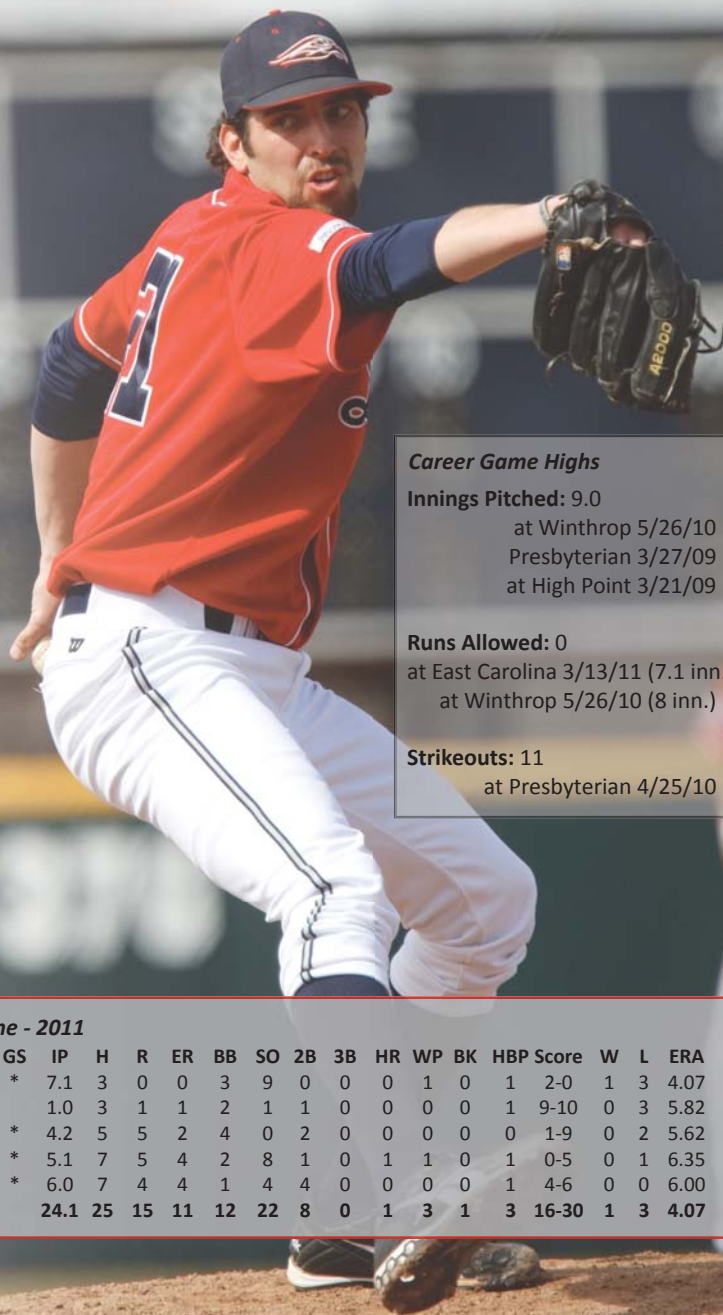
