Head Coach Jim Toman

Record at Liberty: 125-77-1 (Fourth Year)

Career Record: Same

After leading his team to a school-record 42 victories in 2010, Jim Toman enters his fourth year at Liberty with the best mark of any Flames head coach over his first three years.

Since taking over the program for the 2008 season, Liberty has won 35 or more games twice and last season posted only the second 40-win campaign in the 37-year history of the program. The Flames notched a 110-66-1 record during his first three seasons on Liberty Mountain.

On May 2, 2010, Toman recorded his 100th career victory, as the Flames defeated Gardner-Webb, 10-7, at Worthington Stadium. The sixth coach in program history, Toman became the fastest Liberty baseball head coach to amass the milestone, passing first coach Al Worthington, by reaching his 100th win in 160 games, six fewer than Worthington.

The impressive strides made by the program have not gone unnoticed. This past November, Rivals.com cited Liberty as one being one of college baseball's top 10 rising programs.

Last season, the Flames had their best season under Toman, posting a school record for wins in a single season with a 42-19 record. The team's ledger was boosted by a 21-8 road mark, the nation's 10th-best road record in 2010.

In addition, Liberty recorded a 19-7 mark in Big South play, eclipsing its record of the previous season for most victories by the school since joining the conference in 1992. The Flames finished second in the league's regular season and were conference runner-up at the Big South Baseball Championship.

Pitcher Shawn Teufel became the fourth player from one of Toman's Liberty squads to be taken in the MLB Draft. The two-time Big South all-conference first team pitcher and National Pitcher of the Year Watch list member capped a strong senior campaign by being selected by the Detroit Tigers.

In 2009, Liberty recorded a 33-21 overall record, while posting a 17-9 mark in Big South Conference play. Liberty set a new fielding standard in 2009, committing the fewest errors, 53, and finishing the year with the highest fielding percentage, .974, in team history. From that infield, third baseman Tyler Bream was named a Freshman All-American by the Collegiate Baseball News.

Pitcher Andrew Wilson became the third player during Toman's time at Liberty to be taken in the MLB draft (Atlanta Braves).

In 2008, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish Toman's first season at Liberty with a 35-26-1 mark. The record made Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's history. He guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by a Flames team.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB Draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty finished its season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed the Flames to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. Liberty would go on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman was named the sixth head coach in the history of the Liberty Baseball program in June 2007, after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and coached the catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 22-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. During his final years with the Gamecocks, he recruited many of the players who were members of the 2010 South Carolina National Championship team. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight straight between 2000 and 2007, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 14 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

Toman was a four-year letterwinner at N.C. State from 1981-84, and served as team captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons.

The Flames-Chants to meet on ESPNU

The middle game of Liberty's three-game Big South series at Coastal Carolina Saturday is scheduled to be televised on ESPNU. The contest will be the second time the Chanticleers and the Flames have met in a game on the network. In 2009, Liberty squared off with Coastal Carolina at Watson Stadium, on ESPNU, falling 13-7, on May 1.

The Coaches

Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman is in his fourth year at the helm of the Flames. During his time at Liberty, he has guided the Flames to a 124-77-1 record. He led the Flames to the best mark of any Liberty head coach over his first three seasons on Liberty Mountain.

Last season, the Flames had their best year under Toman, posting a school record for wins in a single season with a 42-19 record. The team's ledger was boosted by a 21-8 road mark, the nation's 10th best road record in 2010.

In addition, Liberty recorded a 19-7 mark in Big South play, eclipsing its record of the previous season for most victories by the school since joining the conference in 1992. The Flames finished second in the league's regular season and were conference runner-up at the Big South Baseball Championship.

In 2009, Liberty posted the most victories in Big South Conference play with a 17-9 mark, since joining the conference in 1992. The Flames recorded an overall record of 33-21 in Toman's second year.

A 24-year member of the college coaching ranks, he served 18 years as a member of Ray Tanner's staffs at South Carolina and N.C. State. Toman was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and recruited 16 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina.

Coastal Carolina Head Coach Gary Gilmore is in his 16th year of guiding the Chanticleer baseball program. In his time at Coastal Carolina, he has led the Chanticleers to 10 NCAA berths, 10 40-plus win seasons in the last 12 years, 13-straight winning seasons, and two trips to a NCAA Super Regional.

Last season, the 1980 Coastal Carolina alumnus led the Chanticleers to the Myrtle Beach Super Regional. The Chants captured both the Big South regular-season and tournament titles, posting a record of 55-10.

In 2008, Gilmore led his team to a 50-14 record, hosting and winning the NCAA Conway Regional. The Chanticleers advanced to the NCAA Cary Super Regional, a first in the school's history.

In his 22 seasons as a college head coach, Gilmore's teams have racked up a 877-415 mark, including 15 40-plus win seasons. In his previous 15 years at Coastal Carolina, Gilmore's ball clubs have finished in the top four of the Big South Conference standings 13 times, including seven regular season titles.

Toman Reaches 100 Coaching Wins

With a 10-7 win over Gardner-Webb on May 2, 2010, Liberty head coach Jim Toman recorded his 100th career coaching win.

Of the six head coaches in Liberty history, Toman becomes the fastest to reach 100 coaching victories. Toman reached the milestone in 160 games, eclipsing program founder and first head coach Al Worthington, who reached his 100th win in 166 games.

All-Time Series Against Coastal Carolina

Friday's meeting will be the 73rd contest between the the Flames and the Chanticleers on the diamond. Coastal Carolina holds a 44-28 advantage in the all-time series.

The Chanticleers have won the last nine meetings between the teams. Coastal Carolina won all four contests between the two last season and in 2009. The last time Liberty defeated the Chants was a 13-1 victory on May 24, 2008 to force a second game to determine the Big South Champion at the Big South Baseball Championship in Danville, Va.

Liberty has not won a regular season contest since March 29, 2008 at Worthington Stadium. The Flames defeated the Chanticleers, 9-6, to win the middle game of the three-game Big South series. Liberty has not taken a three-game regular season series from Coastal Carolina since winning 2-of-3 games played in Lynchburg in 2006.

A Look at Coastal Carolina

After the four-time conference defending champions and preseason favorite dropped 2-of-3 games last weekend at UNC Asheville to open conference play, the Chanticleers will be looking to reverse their conference fortunes this weekend.

Coastal Carolina enters the weekend with a .240 team batting average and has averaged 5.40 runs per game.

Big South Preseason Player of the Year Tommy La Stella leads the Chanticleers with a .344 batting average, 25 RBIs and 22 runs scored. LaStella has also hit five of the team's 14 home runs. The Coastal Carolina second baseman is second in the Big South in RBIs.

Third baseman Scott Woodward is next in hitting for the Chanticleers with a .321 and is tied for second in the Big South in stolen bases with Liberty catcher Casey Rasmus with 17.

Pitching has been the strength of Coastal Carolina this season. The Chanticleers have a 2.89 team ERA and have held its opponents to 3.96 runs per game this season. Opponents have a .223 batting average against the staff.

Sunday's possible starter Josh Conway leads the Coastal Carolina staff and is second in the Big South Conference with a 1.44 ERA. The right-hander is 4-0 with 36 strikeouts over 31 1/3 innings.

2010 All-American Anthony Meo headlines the Chanticleer staff. The junior right-hander is expected to start Friday night's contest. Meo is 2-2 with a 3.50 ERA over 36 innings. He has struck out 36. Left-hander Jim Birmingham will probably get the start on Saturday. He is 2-2 with a 3.48 ERA.

In the bullpen, Ryan Connolly leads Coastal Carolina and is third in the Big South with 13 appearances, all in relief. The sophomore has a recorded two saves and a 1.86 ERA over 19 1/3 innings. Jordan Coons also has two saves for the Chants. Keith Hessler, Aaron Burke and Coons have each made 11 relief appearances.

Easing into April

This weekend's series will open the April schedule for the Flames. Liberty is scheduled to play 17 games in the month, with 12 coming against Big South opponents.

Since 1976, the Flames have recorded an all-time mark of 345-285-1 (.548) in April.

March Musings

Liberty finished the month of March with a 12-6 record. The Flames won 11 of its last 15 contests to close the month.

Liberty posted a 10-8 mark in games during March last season, including a 1-2 start to Big South Conference play. The Flames are 359-281-2 (.561) all-time during the month.

February Record

The Flames finished the the month of February with a 3-5 record. Since beginning play during the month of February in 1984, Liberty has posted an all-time mark of 73-37 for a .664 winning percentage for the month.

Over the past six years, the Flames are 31-14 (.689) during the month of February, while recording a 17-8 mark under head coach Jim Toman during his four years at Liberty.

For the past 32 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium home. Named for program architect and the first Liberty head baseball coach, Al Worthington, Liberty has compiled an impressive 531-242-5 record at the stadium for a winning percentage of .686 since the facility's inception in 1979.

The Flames are 7-4 on the year at Worthington Stadium. Liberty posted a 19-9 record at home in 2010. The Flames are 57-29-1 at home under four-year head coach Jim Toman's guidance.

Road Warriors Again in '11?

The Flames have started the season, 8-7 away from home. Liberty is 6-7 in road contests and 2-0 in neutral site games. Liberty has won six of its last seven games away from Lynchburg.

Liberty is slated to play 29 regular-season contests away from home. The Flames will square off with 27 of their opponents on their home field this season and already have met two teams, Rutgers and Monmouth, on a neutral field during the Keith LeClair Classic in Greenville, N.C., March 11-13. Liberty captured the event by winning all three of its games at the East Carolina-hosted event.

The Flames went 21-10 away from their home, Worthington Stadium, in 2010. Liberty posted the 10th-best road mark in the nation during the year. The Flames went 18-8 in road games and 3-2 in neutral site contests during the year. Liberty won six consecutive road contests to open the 2010 season.

Playing Under the Lights

Liberty is 1-2 in night games this season. The Flames are scheduled to play 17 games under the stars this year. Liberty's next night game is scheduled to be the first game of the Liberty-Coastal Carolina series at Watson Stadium in Conway, S.C. Game time is scheduled for 6 p.m.

Last season, Liberty posted a 5-6 record in night contests.

Liberty Versus the Big South

Liberty, a 20-year member of the Big South Conference, has compiled a 271-189 (.591) record against the Big South Conference's current membership. The Flames have started conference play this year, 5-1. Liberty finished the regular season in second place in conference play with a 19-7 record in 2010. The victory total was the most wins by a Liberty team since joining the Big South in 1992.

Tuesday, Liberty defeated VCU, 11-1, on the baseball field. The Rams, also a No. 11 seed, won the NCAA Basketball Tournament's Midwest Regional, Saturday with a 71-61 win over Kansas. With the victory, VCU advanced to its first-ever Final Four at Reliant Stadium in Houston, Texas, Saturday.

Get Your Running Shoes On

What a difference a year makes. So far this season, Liberty has taken advantage of its team speed, doubling its stolen base total from a year ago. The Flames have stolen 57 bases in 68 attempts this season, compared to 2010, when the Flames swiped only 21 bases in 33 tries through 26 games. Liberty's 57 stolen bases leads the Big South Conference in the category. The Flames' also entered the week ranked fifth in the nation in the latest NCAA Division statistical rankings (through March 27).

Leading the way for the Flames is catcher Casey Rasmus who is 17-for-18 in steal attempts this season. He is currently tied for second in the Big South Conference in stolen bases with Coastal Carolina third baseman Scott Woodward. Radford's Matt Hillinger leads the conference with 18. Center fielder Ian Parmley is next on the team and ranks fourth in the Big South with 11 thefts (11-for-15).

The Flames stolen base totals are definitely a stark contrast from last season, when only outfielder Curran Redal had stolen six bases at this point in the year. This season, four Liberty players have six or more base thefts. Outfielder Michael Robertson joins the previously mentioned Rasmus and Parmley, with seven stolen bases, while fellow outfielder Doug Bream has six stolen bases. Bream, a senior, entered the year with a career total of two stolen bases over his previous three seasons.

Tyler Bream Moves into Career 2Bs List

With a double in the sixth inning of Liberty's 16-7 victory over Winthrop Saturday, Liberty junior third baseman Tyler Bream moved into the Top 10 on the school's career doubles list with 44.

The third baseman, who had the second-most doubles in a season with 22 in 2010, has eight this year. He is currently tied for ninth in the Big South. Bream is tied with former Flames Darrell Manuel (1980-83), Steve Wright (1995-98) and Joey Monahan (2000-02) for 10th on the all-time list with 44 career doubles.

Former Liberty outfielder Phillip Laurent (2003-06) holds the school career record for two-base hits with 68. He also set the single season record with 27 in 2006.

In addition, shortstop Matt Williams moved to within one two-base hit joining the school's top 10 career list in the category with 43 on Tuesday. The junior doubled in the third inning to reach 43 in the 11-1 win at VCU. Last season, Williams also had 22 two-base hits, tying Bream for second on the single season list.

On the flip side, the catcher leads Liberty and ranks second in the Big South with 17 steals. Rasmus is 17-for-18 in steal attempts.

Weekend Starters Get It Done

Over the past three weekends, Liberty starters, Keegan Linza, John Niggli and Steven Evans have keyed the Flames' success. Liberty has posted an 8-1 record over the three weekends, dropping only a 2-1 contest to Winthrop in the second game of a doubleheader last Friday.

Over the nine games, the Liberty trio has allowed 12 runs over 74 1/3 innings to post a 1.45 ERA. Linza, Niggli and Evans' innings account for 91.7% of the innings pitched during the span. In each of his three outings, Linza has recorded a complete game, while Niggli and Evans have gone the full nine once each.

Leaning On Linza

Senior right-hander Keegan Linza is off to a strong start this season, becoming a reliable part of the Liberty starting rotation.

The right-hander has posted a 5-0 record with a 2.33 ERA during his six starts. He has struck out 35 and walked five, while leading the Big South Conference with 47 2/3 innings pitched. Linza also leads the conference in wins, while ranking fifth in ERA and seventh in the strikeouts.

In his last five starts, the senior has not allowed more than two runs. Linza has thrown complete games in each of his three two outings in victories over Rutgers, Charleston Southern and Winthrop to up his career total to four.

On March 11 against Rutgers at the Keith LeClair Classic, the senior held off the Scarlet Knights in the ninth inning for a 5-2 win. Linza gave up two runs on seven hits over the full nine innings. He struck out five and did not walk a batter. He retired the first 10 Scarlet Knight batters to face him in the contest and did not allow a runner past second base until the seventh inning, when Rutgers scored its first run of the contest.

This next Friday, the Salisbury, N.C., native went the distance again in a 2-1 victory over Charleston Southern, setting the table for a weekend sweep. Linza scattered eight hits over nine innings, striking out a career-high 10 batters and walking one. The right hander's 10 punchouts eclipse his previous career high of eight in an 11-2 win over Kennesaw State during his first appearance in a Liberty uniform on Feb. 20, 2010.

This past Friday, Linza pitched the full nine again in a 5-2 win over Winthrop. The senior gave up two runs, scattering nine hits in the contest. He struck out five and walked two batters.

With a 13-0 career record, the right-hander has not lost since joining the Flames in 2010.

Evans Pitches Way into Record Book

After striking out six in a 16-7 victory over Winthrop Sunday, senior left-hander Steven Evans has moved into fifth on Liberty's all-time strikeout list with 225, surpassing former Liberty standouts Lee Guetterman (1978-81), who had 220 career strikeouts, and Benji Miller (1995-98), who had 224 strikeouts. Mike Brown (1994-97) is Liberty's career strikeout leader with 287. Evans is currently third in the Big South with 40 strikeouts this season.

Also with the victory, Evans moves into a tie for fifth on the program's career wins list with 22. The senior, who has a career record of 22-10, is tied with Niles Creekmore (1983-86), Alex Dooley (1999-02) and Michael Solbach (2005-07) on the all-time list. The previously mentioned Guetterman won 29 games during his career to top the Liberty all-time wins list.

A fixture of the Flames pitching staff over the past four years, Evans has a 22-10 record with a 3.18 ERA. The left-hander has pitched 261 2/3 innings, striking out 225 and walking 87 batters, a 2.6 to 1 strikeout to walk ratio. With 6 2/3 innings, the senior will move into the Liberty career innings pitch list, tying Kyle Bryan, who pitched 268 1/3 innings as a Flame from 1981-85.

Picking Up the Pace

With new bats and new rules to speed up time between innings and govern mound visits, the time Flames contests have been played in this season has seen a significant drop. So far this season, Liberty games have run an average of 2:29, compared to 2:47 at this point in 2010, an 18-minute difference.

Last season through 26 games, Liberty had already played seven games which lasted three hours or longer, with the the longest being 3:43 in a 14-13, 10 inning set-back to Manhattan on March 20. This season, the Flames have had only three games go over three hours, the longest 3:11 in a 17-5 loss in game two of a twinbill at Mercer on Feb. 19.

Are New Bats Affecting Power Numbers?

How much has the new bat affected play this season? The Flames have 32 less hits than last season through 26 games and have seen their extra base hits drop also. The Flames have 66 extra base hits - 46 doubles, five triples and 15 home runs, so far in 2011. Liberty has a .398 slugging percentage.

In comparison at this point last season, the Flames had 24 more extra base hits or 27% more than this season. Jim Toman's 2010 club had 90 extra base hits at this point of the season - 63 doubles, six triples and 21 home runs

It is What I Like About Sunday

Liberty has opened the year 4-0 in games played on Sunday. In those games, the Flames have outscored their opponents, 21-7, and has a .254 batting average compared to a .173 for their opponents.

Led by starter Steven Evans, who has recorded both of his wins this season on Sunday, Liberty pitchers have posted a 1.75 ERA over their four games.

Flames Take Series with Season-High in Runs

Shortstop Matt Williams drove in five runs with four hits, including one a home run, as the Liberty Flames cranked out a season-high for runs in a 16-7 victory over the Winthrop Eagles in the final game of a three-game Big South series, this past Saturday at Worthington Stadium. The win allowed the Flames to take the three-game series, two games to one, and start the season 5-1 in the Big South.

In the contest, the Flames scored a season-high 16 runs, eclipsing their previous high in a 12-2 win over Binghamton on March 4. In addition, Liberty tied their season-high for hits in a contest with 20. Every member of the Liberty batting order had at least one hit in the contest.

Outfielder Michael Robertson and first baseman Jeff Jefferson each had three hits in the contest. Jefferson also scored twice and drove in three runs. Austin Taylor hit a three-run home run and drove in four runs for the Flames.

After allowing a combined four runs the previous week at the Keith LeClair Classic, Liberty starters, Keegan Linza, John Niggli and Steven Evans once again turned the trick, holding the Buccaneers to four runs over the entire three-game series.

Linza got things started, Friday. The senior right-hander outdueled his Charleston Southern counterpart, going the distance in his second consecutive outing in a 2-1 win.

Flames Belt 20 in Game as Bats Come Alive vs. Binghamton

In its home opener on March 4, Liberty pounded out 20 hits, a season-high in a 12-2 win over the Bearcats in the first game of the year at Worthington Stadium. The last time the Flames had 20 or more hits in a single game since Liberty belted 21 hits in a 16-9, 10-inning victory at Presbyterian College on April 25, 2010.

The Flames hit .396 as team during the three-game series with Binghamton and averaged 9.3 runs per game.

Leading the way during the series was catcher Casey Rasmus, who hit .545 and tied for the team-high in hits with six. The junior ripped his first home run of the season and scored four times during the three-game series.

Third baseman Tyler Bream and shortstop Matt Williams also had six hits during the weekend series. Williams hit his first roundtripper of the year and had a double and triple among his hits.

In addition, infielders Austin Taylor and Justin Sizemore helped power the Liberty offense with big offensive weekends. Taylor hit .444 (4/9) with a double and two home runs, driving in a team-high seven runs during the series. Sizemore belted his first home run of the year and had five RBIs for the Flames.

Linza and Niggli Come Up Big at UNF

Liberty right-handers Keegan Linza and John Niggli each picked up their first win of the year, with strong outings Feb. 25-27 at North Florida.

Linza allowed two runs on eight hits over 7 1/3 innings in his second start of 2011, running his record to 1-0, in a 4-2 victory, Feb. 25 in game one of a doubleheader. The senior struck out seven batters and walked one. Designated hitter Jeff Jefferson backed the right-hander with a solo home run, his first of the season in the seventh.

With a 9-1 victory on Feb. 26, Niggli won his first start in a Liberty uniform. The junior gave up one run on four hits over six innings, moving to 1-0 on the year. He struck out five batters and walked two. Third baseman Tyler Bream had four hits, driving in two runs and right fielder Michael Robertson hit his first home run of the year, powering the Flames past the North Florida Ospreys in the series finale.

Williams Starts Off Strong

Liberty shortstop Matt Williams started his year on a high note, Feb. 18-20 at Mercer. The junior hit a team-high .533 with a double, triple, two runs scored and three RBIs during the Flames' season-opening series.

Williams was one of two Flames to collect four hits in a contest during the four-game series. The shortstop went 4-for-5 in game two of a doubleheader on Feb. 19. Designated hitter Ian Parmley also had four hits in his first game in a Liberty uniform in the team's season opener, Feb. 18.

Season-long Road Trip Starts Year

The Flames completed a season-long nine game road trip to open the 2011 season. During the swing, Liberty traveled to Mercer, North Florida and Virginia Tech for games to begin the year. During the trip, the Flames traveled 2,314 miles. Its trip to Jacksonville, Fla., Feb. 25-27, for a four-game series with North Florida was the longest road trip of the year for head coach Jim Toman's squad.

Connections - Part I

Three Liberty Flames, catcher Casey Rasmus, third baseman Tyler Bream and infielder Austin Taylor, each have connections to Major League Baseball through family members.

Rasmus, a junior, is in his first season as a member of the Liberty roster. His brother Colby is a member of the St. Louis Cardinals and enters his third season as an outfielder with the team in 2011.

Bream, also a junior, is the son of former major leaguer Sid Bream. Sid Bream, a Liberty standout during his collegiate days, played 12 seasons in the majors (1983-94) with the Los Angeles Dodgers, Pittsburgh Pirates, Atlanta Braves and Houston Astros.

Taylor, a senior, is the nephew of former major leaguer Bill Taylor. Bill Taylor spent parts of eight seasons with the Oakland A's, New York Mets and Tampa Bay Rays.

Connections - Part II

Three Flames are carrying on a family tradition, as a member of their family formerly played baseball at Liberty.

First baseman/outfielder Doug Bream's uncle Dave was a member of the Liberty baseball program from 1982-85.

Third baseman Tyler Bream's father, Sid, and two uncles, Dave and Sheldon, were members of the Flames. Sid, who went on to play in the major leagues, was a standout for Liberty on the diamond from 1979-81. The first baseman and Liberty Athletics Hall of Fame member was named a NAIA and NABC All-American in 1981, as the Flames reached the NAIA National Tournament.

Bream's uncles, Dave and Sheldon, were also members of the Flames baseball team during their college days. Dave played infield for Liberty from 1982-85, while Sheldon was an outfielder with the Flames from 1989-93. Tyler and Doug are second cousins.

MLB Draft Picks Dot Roster

A trio of players, who are on the Liberty roster for 2011, have been selected in the Major League Baseball Draft. Senior Austin Taylor and juniors Michael Robertson and Tony McClendon have each been selected in a Major League Draft.

Taylor, an infielder, was drafted out of Thomas County Central High School by the Cincinnati Reds in 2007. The junior college transfer was taken in the 43rd round.

Robertson was also picked in the MLB Draft by the Cincinnati Reds in 2009. The outfielder was selected in the 40th round of the draft.

McClendon, in his first year as a Flame, has been selected in two different MLB Drafts. The outfielder was taken in 2008 by the Houston Astros in the 40th round. Last year, McClendon was chosen by the Oakland A's in the 47th round.

Six 2011 Flames hail from the Golden State, the second highest number on the roster next to Liberty's home state of Virginia. Seven members of the Liberty roster are natives of Virginia. Four Flames each hail from the states of Florida, Georgia, North Carolina and Washington, while three are Pennsylvania natives. States also represented on the Liberty roster are Alabama, Arizona, New York, South Carolina and Tennessee.

The Captains

Seniors Jeff Jefferson, Mark Swanson and Steven Evans, along with junior Tyler Bream have been chosen as captains for the 2011 Liberty Baseball team. The four were selected by virtue of a team vote.

The home runs were two of the Flames' three home runs in the frame, as first baseman Trey Wimmer later hit a three-run home run. The Flames went on to defeat the Blue Hose, 14-7.

Five or More RBIs in a Game - Shortstop Matt Williams drove in five runs with four hits in a 16-7 Liberty win over the Winthrop Eagles, last Saturday at Worthington Stadium. Williams had a two-run single in the fifth inning, a home run leading off the sixth and a two-run double in the seventh, as the Flames scored a season-high 16 runs.

Inside the Park Home Run - Kenneth Negron belted a liner into the right field gap which glanced off the Coastal Carolina right fielder's glove to cash in two runners at Charles Watson Stadium in Conway, S.C. on April 28, 2007. When the ball rolled all the way to the wall, the Liberty second baseman came home and scored standing up for his first home run of the season, knotting the back-and-forth contest with the No. 19 Chanticleers at 7-7. Coastal Carolina rallied in the bottom of the eighth inning to take the contest, 9-7.

Grand Slam Home Run - Trailing 9-5 in the seventh inning, catcher Errol Hollinger drove a 1-0 pitch over the left field wall at Masters Field in Boiling Springs, N.C., tying the visiting Flames with the Gardner-Webb Bulldogs, April 26, 2009. Liberty was down 9-3 in the contest after six innings. The Flames later won the game in the 11th inning, 10-9, on a lead-off home run by first baseman Trey Wimmer.

Cycle - Third baseman Chad Miller hit for the cycle in his first four at bats as the Flames downed the Longwood Lancers, 8-0, April 18, 2006 in a non-conference contest at Worthington Stadium. Miller led off the home half of the first inning with a home run and in the second, drove in a run with a double to the wall off the left field wall. In the fourth, the third baseman singled and completed the cycle in the sixth inning with a triple. Miller had two RBIs and scored four runs in the contest.

No-Hitter - Dan Valentin pitched a seven-inning no-hitter against Elon on April 16, 2000, at Worthington Stadium, marking the first no-hitter by a Flames pitcher in 20 years. Valentin walked seven batters and struck out eight in the game to give Liberty a 4-0 win. This game sparked three-consecutive shutouts for Valentin, during a span of 29-consecutive scoreless innings.

Shutout - Steven Evans handcuffed the East Carolina Pirates over 7 1/3 innings, giving up three hits and striking out nine batters, and Dane Beakler pitched a scoreless 1 2/3 innings to close out the contest in a 2-0 Liberty win, March 13 at Clark-LeClair Stadium in Greenville, N.C.

Triple Play - Liberty has never recorded a triple play.

Grand Slam Home Run - Winthrop first baseman Patrick Gamblin capped a nine-run sixth inning with a grand slam in an 11-2 victory over the visiting Flames, on May 21, 2010 at Winthrop Ballpark in Rock Hill, SC. Gamblin hit his two-out home run to straight-away center field.

No-Hitter - UNC Asheville's Jason Walker pitched a seven-inning no-hitter against the Flames on April 29, 2000, at Greenwood Field in Asheville, N.C. Walker allowed two walks and struck out four, leading the Bulldogs to a 3-0 win.
