**The Games**

The Liberty Flames (15-15, 5-4 Big South) travel to High Point, N.C., for a three-game Big South series with the High Point Panthers (16-16, 3-6 Big South) at Coy O. Willard Stadium, Friday-Sunday. The opening game of the series on Friday and Saturday's middle game are both scheduled to start at 6 p.m. The first pitch for Sunday's finale is scheduled for 1 p.m.

**Last Time Out**

Liberty left fielder Doug Bream had a career-high five hits, but the Flames came up short in a slugfest with the James Madison Dukes, 16-12, on a windy Wednesday afternoon at Worthington Stadium.

Bream went 5-for-5 in the game, with four singles and a double. In addition, the Liberty senior scored three times. Bream surpassed his previous career-high of four hits in a 12-7 win over James Madison at Worthington Stadium on April 21, 2010. It was the first time a Liberty Flame has had five hits in game since outfielder Curran Redal in a 14-8 victory over High Point in game one of a Big South Conference doubleheader at Worthington Stadium on April 3, 2010.

With the wind gusting from 17-20 mph throughout the game, the two teams combined to hit seven home runs. James Madison, which leads the country in home runs, belted five in the contest, while Liberty hit two round trippers.

The visiting Dukes scored six times in the ninth to overcome a 12-10 Liberty lead for the win.

Liberty will travel to Harrisonburg, Va., for a rematch with the James Madison Dukes, Tuesday. Game time at Veterans Memorial Stadium is slated for 6:30 p.m.

**Head Coach Jim Toman**

**Record at Liberty:** 125-81-1 (Fourth Year)

**Career Record:** Same

After leading his team to a school-record 42 victories in 2010, Jim Toman enters his fourth year at Liberty with the best mark of any Flames head coach over his first three years.

Since taking over the program for the 2008 season, Liberty has won 35 or more games twice and last season posted only the second 40-win campaign in the 37-year history of the program. The Flames notched a 110-66-1 record during his first three seasons on Liberty Mountain.

On May 2, 2010, Toman recorded his 100th career victory, as the Flames defeated Gardner-Webb, 10-7, at Worthington Stadium. The sixth coach in program history, Toman became the fastest Liberty baseball head coach to amass the milestone, passing first coach Al Worthington, by reaching his 100th win in 160 games, six fewer than Worthington.

The impressive strides made by the program have not gone unnoticed. This past November, Rivals.com cited Liberty as one being one of college baseball's top 10 rising programs.

Last season, the Flames had their best season under Toman, posting a school record for wins in a single season with a 42-19 record. The team's ledger was boosted by a 21-8 road mark, the nation's 10th-best road record in 2010.

In addition, Liberty recorded a 19-7 mark in Big South play, eclipsing its record of the previous season for most victories by the school since joining the conference in 1992. The Flames finished second in the league's regular season and were conference runner-up at the Big South Baseball Championship.

Pitcher Shawn Teufel became the fourth player from one of Toman's Liberty squads to be taken in the MLB Draft. The two-time Big South all-conference first team pitcher and National Pitcher of the Year Watch list member capped a strong senior campaign by being selected by the Detroit Tigers.

In 2009, Liberty recorded a 33-21 overall record, while posting a 17-9 mark in Big South Conference play. Liberty set a new fielding standard in 2009, committing the fewest errors, 53, and finishing the year with the highest fielding percentage, .974, in team history. From that infield, third baseman Tyler Bream was named a Freshman All-American by the Collegiate Baseball News.

Pitcher Andrew Wilson became the third player during Toman's time at Liberty to be taken in the MLB draft (Atlanta Braves).

In 2008, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish Toman's first season at Liberty with a 35-26-1 mark. The record made Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's history. He guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by a Flames team.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB Draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty finished its season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed the Flames to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. Liberty would go on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman was named the sixth head coach in the history of the Liberty Baseball program in June 2007, after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and coached the catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 22-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. During his final years with the Gamecocks, he recruited many of the players who were members of the 2010 South Carolina National Championship team. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight straight between 2000 and 2007, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 14 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

Toman was a four-year letterwinner at N.C. State from 1981-84, and served as team captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons.

## The Coaches

Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman is in his fourth year at the helm of the Flames. During his time at Liberty, he has guided the Flames to a 125-81-1 record. He led the Flames to the best mark of any Liberty head coach over his first three seasons on Liberty Mountain.

Last season, the Flames had their best year under Toman, posting a school record for wins in a single season with a 42-19 record. The team's ledger was boosted by a 21-8 road mark, the nation's 10th best road record in 2010.

In addition, Liberty recorded a 19-7 mark in Big South play, eclipsing its record of the previous season for most victories by the school since joining the conference in 1992. The Flames finished second in the league's regular season and were conference runner-up at the Big South Baseball Championship.

In 2009, Liberty posted the most victories in Big South Conference play with a 17-9 mark, since joining the conference in 1992. The Flames recorded an overall record of 33-21 in Toman's second year.

A 24-year member of the college coaching ranks, he served 18 years as a member of Ray Tanner's staffs at South Carolina and N.C. State. Toman was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and recruited 16 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina.

Head Coach Chris Cozart is in his third year at High Point. During his three seasons, he has posted a 69-78 record.

Last season, he led the Panthers to their first winning season in Division I, posting a 31-29 (15-12 Big South Conference). The Panthers finished third in the Big South Tournament, the best finish for HPU, and set program records in batting average, hits, doubles, home runs, runs batted in, runs scored, stolen bases and walks.

Cozart came to High Point following a highly successful 12-year coaching stint at UCF, where he moved up the ranks from student assistant to associate head coach during his tenure. A key member of the Knight coaching staff over the past decade, he helped to develop UCF into one of the nation's elite Division I baseball programs. In his role as the pitching coach, Cozart built a tradition of pitching excellence during his time at UCF.

At UCF, Cozart helped guide the Knights to a 455-274 overall mark during his 12 seasons on the coaching staff. The Knights made five NCAA Tournament appearances during that stretch and also captured four conference championships.

### All-Time Series Against High Point

Friday will be the 64th meeting between Liberty and High Point on the baseball diamond since 1976. The Flames hold the advantage in the all-time series, 36-27.

Last year, the two teams met five times. Liberty took two-out-of-three from High Point during the regular season, winning the first two games of their three-game series at Worthington Stadium, April 2-3.

Later in the year, the Panthers and Flames met twice in the Big South Baseball Championship at Rock Hill, S.C. High Point edged Liberty in the first meeting on May 27, 2-1. The Flames eliminated the Panthers on May 29 to advance to the title game, 9-5.

The last time the two teams met at Willard Stadium, March 20-22, 2009, Liberty swept the three-game series between the two teams. Highlighting the weekend sweep was a nine-RBI performance by Tyler Bream in a 19-5 win in the series finale on March 22. The third baseman tied the Liberty record for RBIs in game.

## A Look at High Point

After splitting two midweek contests with Wake Forest, High Point will enter the weekend 16-16 overall and 3-6 in the Big South Conference ledger. Last weekend, the Panthers were swept by Winthrop in conference play.

High Point is hitting .295 as team and has averaged 5.9 runs per game. Outfielder Steve Antolik leads the Panthers in hitting and is fourth in the Big South with a .389 batting average. He has scored a team-high 28 runs and is second on the team with 28 RBIs. Second baseman Murray White IV leads the Panthers with 30 RBIs.

High Point's pitching staff will enter the weekend with a 4.56 ERA. Opponents are hitting .295 and average 5.6 runs per game.

Friday's starter Cody Allen leads the Panther staff with a 3.38 ERA. In seven starts, the right-hander has posted a 2-3 record with 53 strikeouts and 13 walks over 45 1/3 innings. Sunday's probable starter Mike Caldwell also has a below 4.00 ERA. The senior has a 3.61 ERA and a 3-1 record in seven starts.

Mikel Rodenberg and Spence Andrews have been the prime hurlers out of the bullpen for High Point. Rodenberg has not recorded a decision in 13 appearances. He has a 4.86 ERA over 16 2/3 innings. Andrews has made 12 appearances. He is 2-1 with a 4.22 ERA over 21 1/3 innings.

### Analyzing April

The Flames have started the month of April 0-4. Liberty is scheduled to play 17 games in the month, with 12 coming against Big South opponents.

Since 1976, the Flames have recorded an all-time mark of 345-289-1 (.544) in April. Last season, Liberty finished the month of April with a 10-8 record. The Flames posted a 9-3 mark in Big South Conference play.

### March Musings

Liberty finished the month of March with a 12-6 record. The Flames won 11 of its last 15 contests to close the month.

Liberty posted a 10-8 mark in games during March last season, including a 1-2 start to Big South Conference play. The Flames are 359-281-2 (.561) all-time during the month.

### February Record

The Flames finished the the month of February with a 3-5 record. Since beginning play during the month of February in 1984, Liberty has posted an all-time mark of 73-37 for a .664 winning percentage for the month.

Over the past six years, the Flames are 31-14 (.689) during the month of February, while recording a 17-8 mark under head coach Jim Toman during his four years at Liberty.

### Home Sweet Home

For the past 32 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium home. Named for program architect and the first Liberty head baseball coach, Al Worthington, Liberty has compiled an impressive 531-243-5 record at the stadium for a winning percentage of .686 since the facility's inception in 1979.

The Flames are 7-5 on the year at Worthington Stadium. Liberty posted a 19-9 record at home in 2010. The Flames are 57-30-1 at home under four-year head coach Jim Toman's guidance.

### Road Rumbings

The Flames are 8-10 away from home this season. Liberty is 6-10 in road contests and 2-0 in neutral site games. Liberty is slated to play 29 regular-season contests away from home. The Flames will square off with 27 of their opponents on their home field this season and already have met two teams, Rutgers and Monmouth, on a neutral field during the Keith LeClair Classic in Greenville, N.C., March 11-13.

The Flames went 21-10 in road contests in 2010. Liberty posted the 10th-best road mark in the nation during the year. The Flames went 18-8 in road games and 3-2 in neutral site contests during the year.

## Get Your Running Shoes On

What a difference a year makes. So far this season, Liberty has taken advantage of its team speed, doubling its stolen base total from a year ago. The Flames have stolen 65 bases in 77 attempts this season, compared to 2010, when the Flames swiped only 22 bases in 35 tries through 30 games. Liberty's 65 stolen bases lead the Big South Conference in the category. The Flames also entered the week ranked fourth in the nation in the latest NCAA Division statistical rankings (through April 3).

Leading the way for the Flames is catcher Casey Rasmus, who is 17-for-18 in steal attempts this season. He is currently second in the Big South Conference in stolen bases. Center fielder Ian Parmley is next on the team and ranks fourth in the Big South with 14 thefts (14-for-19).

The Flames' stolen base totals are definitely a stark contrast from last season, when only outfielder Curran Redal had stolen six bases and led the team at this point in the year. This season, five Liberty players have six or more base thefts. Outfielder Michael Robertson and shortstop Matt Williams join the previously mentioned Rasmus and Parmley, with seven stolen bases apiece, while fellow outfielder Doug Bream has six stolen bases. Bream, a senior, entered the year with a career total of two stolen bases over his previous three seasons.

## Tyler Bream Moves into Career 2Bs List

With a double in the sixth inning of Liberty's 16-7 victory over Winthrop on March 26, Liberty junior third baseman Tyler Bream moved into the Top 10 on the school's career doubles list with 44.

The third baseman, who had the second-most doubles in a season with 22 in 2010, has six this year. He is currently tied for ninth in the Big South. Bream is tied with former Flames Darrell Manuel (1980-83), Steve Wright (1995-98) and Joey Monahan (2000-02) for 10th on the Liberty all-time list with 44 career doubles.

Former Liberty outfielder Phillip Laurent (2003-06) holds the school career record for two-base hits with 68. He also set the single season record with 27 in 2006.

In addition, shortstop Matt Williams moved to within one two-base hit joining the school's top 10 career list in the category with 43, last Tuesday. The junior doubled in the third inning to reach 43 doubles in the 11-1 win at VCU. Last season, Williams also had 22 two-base hits, tying Bream for second on the single season list. The shortstop is tied for the Liberty lead with left fielder Doug Bream with nine doubles this season.

## Casey Rasmus - Base Cop

Flames catcher Casey Rasmus has been tough on base stealers this season. The junior begins the week having thrown out 41% (14-of-34) of would-be base stealers. Rasmus leads the Big South Conference in caught base stealers.

On the flip side, the catcher leads Liberty and ranks second in the Big South with 17 steals. Rasmus is 17-for-18 in steal attempts.

## Evans Pitches Way into Record Book

After striking out six this past Sunday at Coastal Carolina, senior left-hander Steven Evans has moved into fourth place on Liberty's all-time strikeout list with 231, surpassing former teammate Dustin Umberger (2006-10), who finished his career last year with 230 strikeouts. Mike Brown (1994-97) is Liberty's career strikeout leader with 287. Evans is currently third in the Big South with 46 strikeouts this season.

Also with the victory, Evans moves into a tie for fifth on the program's career wins list with 22. The senior, who has a career record of 22-10, is tied with Niles Creekmore (1983-86), Alex Dooley (1999-02) and Michael Solbach (2005-07) on the all-time list. Liberty standout Lee Guetterman (1978-81) won 29 games during his career to top the Liberty all-time wins list.

In addition with seven innings of work Sunday, the senior moved into the Liberty career innings pitched list's Top 10 with 268 2/3 innings. Evans passed Kyle Bryan, who pitched 268 1/3 innings as a Flame from 1981-85 to move into 10th on the program's all-time list.

A fixture of the Flames' pitching staff over the past four years, Evans has a 22-10 record with a 3.58 ERA. The left-hander has walked only 87 batters for a 2.7 to 1 strikeout to walk ratio.

## Are New Bats Affecting Power Numbers?

How much has the new bat affected play this season? The Flames have 48 less hits than last season through 30 games and have seen their extra base hits drop also. The Flames have 74 extra base hits - 51 doubles, six triples and 17 home runs, so far in 2011. Liberty has a .393 slugging percentage.

In comparison at this point last season, the Flames had 32 more extra base hits or 30% more than this season. Jim Toman's 2010 club had 106 extra base hits at this point of the season - 77 doubles, seven triples and 22 home runs.

## Doing the Dougie

Wednesday afternoon, outfielder Doug Bream had a career-high five hits in a 16-12 setback. Bream surpassed his previous career-high of four hits in a 12-7 win over James Madison at Worthington Stadium on April 21, 2010. It is the first time a Liberty Flame has had five hits in game since outfielder Curran Redal in a 14-8 victory over High Point in game one of a Big South Conference doubleheader at Worthington Stadium on April 3, 2010.

By going 5-for-5 in the contest, the senior outfielder raised his season batting average to .333 and he leads the Flames in RBIs with 23. Only teammate Matt Williams, hitting .364, has a higher batting average on the team.

Bream has had at least one hit in 26 of 30 games and is tied with Williams for the team lead with 13 multiple-hit games. He leads the team with eight multiple-RBI games and 10 doubles.

## It is What I Like About Sunday

Liberty has opened the year 4-1 in games played on Sunday, and in its lone loss, it was defeated 5-4. In Sunday games, the Flames have outscored their opponents, 25-12, and have a .259 batting average compared to a .199 for their opponents.

Led by starter Steven Evans, who has recorded two wins this season on Sunday, Liberty pitchers have posted a 2.25 ERA in the five games.

Outfielder Michael Robertson and shortstop Matt Williams have also made the most of Sunday play. Robertson has hits .429 with five RBIs, four runs scored and hit both of his home runs this season on Sunday. Williams is batting .400 on the first day of the week. The shortstop has eight hits, including two doubles, three RBIs and scored two runs in his five Sunday games.

## Breams Big at VCU

Liberty third baseman Tyler Bream hit a two-run home run and drove in three runs and left fielder Doug Bream had three RBIs in an 11-1 Flames victory over the VCU Rams, March 29 at the Diamond.

Tyler Bream hit a two-run home run in the fifth inning, with Doug aboard to give the Flames a 6-1 advantage. It was one of two hits the third baseman had on the day. Doug Bream also had two hits in the game.

Catcher Cody Rasmus had three hits and scored three runs for Liberty, which had 12 hits in the game. Shortstop Matt Williams and designated hitter Marcus Grimaldi had two hits each in the victory.

Pitcher Garrett Baker picked up the win, moving to 3-2 on a staff day for the Flames. Liberty used six pitchers in the game, scattering 11 hits. The Flames combined to strike out eight batters and walk two.

## Flames Take Series with Season-High in Runs
