The Flames head out on the road with a non-conference contest against the VCU Rams, Tuesday. The game will be the first of five-straight road games for Liberty. Game time at the Diamond in Richmond, Va., is scheduled for 3 p.m.

**Head Coach Jim Toman**

**Record at Liberty: 122-76-1 (Fourth Year)**

**Career Record: Same**

After leading his team to a school-record 42 victories in 2010, Jim Toman enters his fourth year at Liberty with the best mark of any Flames head coach over his first three years.

Since taking over the program for the 2008 season, Liberty has won 35 or more games twice and last season posted only the second 40-win campaign in the 37-year history of the program. The Flames notched a 110-66-1 record during his first three seasons on Liberty Mountain.

On May 2, 2010, Toman recorded his 100th career victory, as the Flames defeated Gardner-Webb, 10-7, at Worthington Stadium. The sixth coach in program history, Toman became the fastest Liberty baseball head coach to amass the milestone, passing first coach Al Worthington, by reaching his 100th win in 160 games, six fewer than Worthington.

The impressive strides made by the program have not gone unnoticed. This past November, Rivals.com cited Liberty as one being one of college baseball's top 10 rising programs.

Last season, the Flames had their best season under Toman, posting a school record for wins in a single season with a 42-19 record. The team's ledger was boosted by a 21-8 road mark, the nation's 10th-best road record in 2010.

In addition, Liberty recorded a 19-7 mark in Big South play, eclipsing its record of the previous season for most victories by the school since joining the conference in 1992. The Flames finished second in the league's regular season and were conference runner-up at the Big South Baseball Championship.

Pitcher Shawn Teufel became the fourth player from one of Toman's Liberty squads to be taken in the MLB Draft. The two-time Big South all-conference first team pitcher and National Pitcher of the Year Watch list member capped a strong senior campaign by being selected by the Detroit Tigers.

In 2009, Liberty recorded a 33-21 overall record, while posting a 17-9 mark in Big South Conference play. Liberty set a new fielding standard in 2009, committing the fewest errors, 53, and finishing the year with the highest fielding percentage, .974, in team history. From that infield, third baseman Tyler Bream was named a Freshman All-American by the Collegiate Baseball News.

Pitcher Andrew Wilson became the third player during Toman's time at Liberty to be taken in the MLB draft (Atlanta Braves).

In 2008, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish Toman's first season at Liberty with a 35-26-1 mark. The record made Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's history. He guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by a Flames team.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB Draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty finished its season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed the Flames to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. Liberty would go on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman was named the sixth head coach in the history of the Liberty Baseball program in June 2007, after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and coached the catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 22-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. During his final years with the Gamecocks, he recruited many of the players who were members of the 2010 South Carolina National Championship team. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight straight between 2000 and 2007, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 14 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

Toman was a four-year letterwinner at N.C. State from 1981-84, and served as team captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons.

## Toman Reaches 100 Coaching Wins

With a 10-7 win over Gardner-Webb on May 2, 2010, Liberty head coach Jim Toman recorded his 100th career coaching win.

Of the six head coaches in Liberty history, Toman becomes the fastest to reach 100 coaching victories. Toman reached the milestone in 160 games, eclipsing program founder and first head coach Al Worthington, who reached his 100th win in 166 games.

### The Coaches

Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman is in his fourth year at the helm of the Flames. During his time at Liberty, he has guided the Flames to a 122-76-1 record. He led the Flames to the best mark of any Liberty head coach over his first three seasons on Liberty Mountain.

Last season, the Flames had their best year under Toman, posting a school record for wins in a single season with a 42-19 record. The team's ledger was boosted by a 21-8 road mark, the nation's 10th best road record in 2010.

In addition, Liberty recorded a 19-7 mark in Big South play, eclipsing its record of the previous season for most victories by the school since joining the conference in 1992. The Flames finished second in the league's regular season and were conference runner-up at the Big South Baseball Championship.

In 2009, Liberty posted the most victories in Big South Conference play with a 17-9 mark, since joining the conference in 1992. The Flames recorded an overall record of 33-21 in Toman's second year.

A 24-year member of the college coaching ranks, he served 18 years as a member of Ray Tanner's staffs at South Carolina and N.C. State. Toman was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina.

Winthrop is in its first year under Tom Riginos, who was officially introduced as the new baseball coach at Winthrop University on August 4, 2010. He is just the third head coach in the program's history.

Riginos, pronounced rih-JEEN-uhs, takes over the Eagle baseball program after spending the previous eight seasons on the Clemson baseball staff under head coach Jack Leggett. He spent the past three years as the associate head coach/recruiting coordinator for the Tigers, and was an assistant head coach from 2003-07. A 20-year member of the coaching ranks, Riginos also was an assistant coach at Stetson and Eastern Kentucky.

### All-Time Series Against Winthrop

Friday's meeting will be the 74th meeting between the Flames and the Eagles on the diamond. Winthrop holds a razor-thin 38-35 edge in the all-time series between the two teams.

Last season, the Eagles and Flames met five times, three during the regular season at Winthrop and twice in the Big South Baseball Championship also in Rock Hill, S.C. Behind Steven Evans, Liberty took the first meeting, 8-2, on May 20, 2010, only to see the host Eagles take the final two games of the series, 11-2 and 8-5.

The Flames, the second seed, and Winthrop, the fifth seed, then met the following week at the Big South tournament. Liberty took an 8-5 victory to advance on March 26 and later in an elimination contest, defeated the Eagles, 9-7 on May 28.

## A Look at Winthrop

The Eagles will enter this weekend's series looking to snap a three-game losing streak. Winthrop dropped both its games this week against No. 1-ranked Florida in Gainesville, 22-5 and 10-0.

Winthrop has hit .271 as a team this season and is averaging 5.4 runs per game. The Eagles are ninth in the Big South in batting average.

Senior Eddie Rohan leads the Winthrop offense and is currently fourth in the Big South with a .408 batting average. He hit his first home run of the season Tuesday against at Florida, which puts him all alone in second place for most career home runs at Winthrop. A two-time All-Big South team member, he also leads the Eagles with 14 RBI on the season.

Winthrop has hit two home runs this season. Outfielder Patrick Gamblin has also hit a home run for Winthrop.

The Eagle pitching staff has posted a 5.44 ERA and is allowing 6.9 runs per contest, so far this season. Opponents have hit .308 against the Winthrop staff.

Junior right-hander Tyler Mizenko, Friday's expected starter, leads the Eagles starters with a 2-0 record and a 3.07 ERA over 29 1/3 innings.

Meanwhile, senior right-handers Robert Lake and Matteo D'Angelo are expected to start Saturday and Sunday's contests. Lake enters the weekend 0-2 with a 5.04 ERA. D'Angelo is 2-3 with a 3.86 ERA. Both pitchers have made five starts.

Sophomore Tommy Lawrence tops all relievers with a 1.98 ERA and is tied with sophomore Eric Ruth with nine appearances. Lawrence is 1-1 with a team-best three saves on the season. Ruth has a team-high three victories, all in relief, sporting a 3-0 mark with a 3.22 ERA over 22 1/3 innings. He has struck out a team-high 21 batters.

## The Flames-Chants to meet on ESPNU

Liberty's weekend series with the Winthrop Eagles will not be the only time the Flames have a game televised this season. The middle game of Liberty's three-game Big South series at Coastal Carolina on April 2 is scheduled to be televised on ESPNU, starting at 4 p.m. The contest will be second time the Chanticleers and the Flames have met in game on ESPNU. In 2009, Liberty squared off with Coastal Carolina in Conway, S.C., on the network, falling 13-7, on May 1.

## March Musings

Liberty will enter this weekend's series with a 9-5 record during the month of March. With one game canceled this month due to inclement weather, Jim Toman's squad has four games remaining in the month.

Liberty posted a 10-8 mark in games during March last season, including a 1-2 start to Big South Conference play. The Flames are 356-280-2 (.560) all-time during the month.

## February Record

The Flames finished the the month of February with a 3-5 record. Since beginning play during the month of February in 1984, Liberty has posted an all-time mark of 73-37 for a .664 winning percentage for the month.

Over the past six years, the Flames are 31-14 (.689) during the month of February, while recording a 17-8 mark under head coach Jim Toman during his four years at Liberty.

## Home Sweet Home

For the past 32 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium home. Named for program architect and the first Liberty head baseball coach, Al Worthington, Liberty has compiled an impressive 529-241-5 record at the stadium for a winning percentage of .685 since the facility's inception in 1979.

The Flames are 5-3 on the year at Worthington Stadium. Liberty posted a 19-9 record at home in 2010. The Flames are 55-28-1 at home under four-year head coach Jim Toman's guidance.

### Get Your Running Shoes On

What a difference a year makes. So far this season, Liberty has tried to take advantage of its team speed, doubling its stolen base total from a year ago. The Flames have stolen 42 bases in 52 attempts this season, compared to 2010, when the Flames swiped only 17 bases in 26 tries through 22 games. Liberty's 42 stolen bases leads Radford by one for the Big South Conference lead.

Leading the way for the Flames is catcher Casey Rasmus who is 11-for-11 in steal attempts this season. He is currently third in the Big South Conference in steals. Center fielder Ian Parmley who is next with eight thefts (8-for-11).

The Flames stolen base totals are definitely a stark contrast from last season, when only outfielder Curran Redal had stolen five bases at this point in the year. This season, four Liberty players have five or more base thefts. Outfielders Michael Robertson (six) and Doug Bream join the previously mentioned Rasmus and Parmley, with five or more stolen bases.

### Casey Rasmus - Base Cop

Flames catcher Casey Rasmus has been tough to on base stealers this season. The junior has thrown out 48% (12-of-25) would-be base thieves this year. Rasmus leads the Big South Conference in caught base stealers.

On the flip side, the catcher leads Liberty and ranks third in the Big South with 11 steals. Rasmus is 11-for-11 in steal attempts.

### Evans Pitches Way into Record Book

With a career-high 12 strikeouts in a 5-2, complete-game victory over Charleston Southern last Sunday, senior left-hander Steven Evans moved into seventh on Liberty's all-time strikeout list with 219, surpassing Randy Tomlin who had 211 for the Flames from 1986-88. With one strikeout this weekend, he will tie Lee Guetterman (1978-81) on the career K list. Mike Brown is Liberty's career strikeout leader with 287. Evans is currently tied for second in the Big South with 34 strikeouts this season.

Also with the victory, Evans moved into a tie for eighth on the program's career wins list with 21. The senior, who has a career record of 21-10, is tied with Kyle Bryan (1981-85), Doug Smith (1980-82) and Brian Harrell (1996-2000) on the all-time list. The previously mentioned Guetterman won 29 games during his career topping the Liberty all-time wins list.

A fixture of the Flame pitching staff over the past four years, Evans has a 21-10 record with a 3.60 ERA. The left-hander has pitched 255 1/3 innings, striking out the 219 and walking 84 batters, a 2.6 to 1 strikeout to walk ratio.

### Leaning On Linza

Senior right-hander Keegan Linza is off to a strong start this season, becoming a reliable part of the Liberty starting rotation this season.

The right-hander has posted a 4-0 record with a 2.33 ERA during his five starts. He has struck out 30 and walked five, while leading the Big South Conference with 38 2/3 innings pitched. In his last four starts, the senior has not allowed more than two runs.

Linza has thrown back-to-back complete games in his last two outings in victories over Rutgers and Charleston Southern to up his career total to three.

On March 11 against Rutgers at the Keith LeClair Classic, the senior held off the Scarlet Knights in the ninth inning for a 5-2 win. Linza gave up two runs on seven hits over the full nine innings. He struck out five and did not walk a batter. He retired the first 10 Scarlet Knight batters to face him in the contest and did not allow a runner past second base until the seventh inning, when Rutgers scored its first run of the contest.

This past Friday, the Salisbury, N.C., native went the distance again in a 2-1 victory over Charleston Southern, setting the table for a weekend sweep. Linza scattered eight hits over nine innings, striking out a career-high 10 batters and walking one. The right hander's 10 punchouts eclipse his previous career high of eight in an 11-2 win over Kennesaw State during his first appearance in a Liberty uniform on Feb. 20, 2010.

With a 12-0 career record, the right-hander has not lost since joining the Flames in 2010.

## Picking Up the Pace

With new bats and new rules to speed up time between innings and govern mound visits, the time Flames contests have been played in this season has seen a significant drop. So far this season, Liberty games have run an average of 2:31, compared to 2:45 minutes at this point in the season in 2010, a 14-minute difference.

Last season through 22 games, Liberty had already played six games which lasted three hours or longer, with the the longest being 3:43 in a 14-13, 10 inning setback to Manhattan on March 20. This season, the Flames have had only three games go over three hours, the longest 3:11 in a 17-5 loss in game two of a twinbill at Mercer on Feb. 19.

## Are New Bats Affecting Power Numbers?

How much has the new bat affected play this season? The Flames have 20 less hits than last season through 22 games and have seen their extra base hits drop. The Flames have 50 extra base hits - 35 doubles, three triples and 12 home runs, so far in 2011. Liberty has a .382 slugging percentage.

In comparison at this point last season, the Flames had 25 more extra base hits or 33% more than this season. Jim Toman's 2010 club had 75 extra base hits - 54 doubles, three triples and 18 home runs at this point in the season. Also, it had a .453 slugging percentage.

## It is What I Like About Sunday

Liberty has opened the year 4-0 in games played on Sunday. In those games, the Flames have outscored their opponents, 21-7, and has a .254 batting average compared to a .173 for their opponents.

Led by starter Steven Evans, who has recorded both of his wins this season on Sunday, Liberty pitchers have posted a 1.75 ERA over their four games.

## Complete Games Highlight Sweep

Each of Liberty's starting pitchers of its three-game Big South series pitched a complete game, keying a sweep of the Charleston Southern Buccaneers in the first conference series of the year.

After allowing a combined four runs the previous week at the Keith LeClair Classic, Liberty starters, Keegan Linza, John Niggli and Steven Evans once again turned the trick, holding the Buccaneers to four runs over the entire three-game series.

Linza got things started, Friday. The senior right-hander outdueled his Charleston Southern counterpart, going the distance in his second consecutive outing in a 2-1 win. Linza allowed one run on eight hits, striking out a career-high 10 to run his record to 4-0 on the year.

Niggli followed-up with a gem of his own on Saturday afternoon. The junior right-hander threw his first complete game in a Liberty uniform in a 5-1 victory. Niggli gave up one run on five hits, striking out four. From the third inning on, the junior dominated, not allowing a Charleston Southern hit until a two-out infield single in the ninth inning. Taylor, a senior, is the nephew of former major leaguer Bill Taylor. Bill Taylor spent parts of eight seasons with the Oakland A's, New York Mets and Tampa Bay Rays.

## Connections - Part II

Three Flames are carrying on a family tradition, as a member of their family formerly played baseball at Liberty.

First baseman/outfielder Doug Bream's uncle Dave was a member of the Liberty baseball program from 1982-85.

Third baseman Tyler Bream's father, Sid, and two uncles, Dave and Sheldon, were members of the Flames. Sid, who went on to play in the major leagues, was a standout for Liberty on the diamond from 1979-81. The first baseman and Liberty Athletics Hall of Fame member was named a NAIA and NABC All-American in 1981, as the Flames reached the NAIA National Tournament.

Bream's uncles, Dave and Sheldon, were also members of the Flames baseball team during their college days. Dave played infield for Liberty from 1982-85, while Sheldon was an outfielder with the Flames from 1989-93. Tyler and Doug are second cousins.

**Five or More RBIs in a Game** - Catcher Nathan Thompson had four hits, including a home run, and drove in seven runs in Liberty's 16-9, 10-inning victory over Presbyterian College, April 25, 2010 at the PC Baseball Complex in Clinton, S.C.

**Inside the Park Home Run** - Kenneth Negron belted a liner into the right field gap which glanced off the Coastal Carolina right fielder's glove to cash in two runners at Charles Watson Stadium in Conway, S.C. on April 28, 2007. When the ball rolled all the way to the wall, the Liberty second baseman came home and scored standing up for his first home run of the season, knotting the back-and-forth contest with the No. 19 Chanticleers at 7-7. Coastal Carolina rallied in the bottom of the eighth inning to take the contest, 9-7.
