The Championship

The No. 2 seed Liberty Flames (39-17, 19-8 Big South) travel to Rock Hill, S.C., Wednesday to open play in the 2010 Big South Baseball Championship at the Winthrop Ballpark. Liberty is the No. 2 seed for the second time in three years.

The Flames will square off Wednesday afternoon against the highest remaining seed from Tuesday's contests between the No. 5-8 seeds. First pitch Wednesday is scheduled for 3 p.m.

The remainder of the double-elimination tournament will continue Thursday through Saturday. The conference champion is scheduled to be crowned Saturday, in Game 12 or Game 13 (if necessary). The Big South Baseball Champion claims the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Baseball Regionals.

Last Time Out

The Liberty Flames could not overcome a six-run third inning by host Winthrop, falling to the Eagles, 8-5, this past Saturday in a Big South Conference contest at the Winthrop Ballpark.

Second baseman P.J. Jimenez had two hits and drove in three runs for the Flames. Curran Redal, Matt Williams and Kenneth also had two hits apiece for Liberty.

Flames on the Air

Each Liberty contest will be broadcast LIVE on WWMC 90.9 "The Light" FM by Nick Pierce and Doug Wallace during the tournament. The broadcasts can also be accessed via links at LibertyFlames.com and the lightonline.com.

In addition, all games will be video streamed live on the Big South Network. Tournament games will be available daily via the \$6.95 Day Pass -- which covers all games played that respective day -- or the \$19.95 Full Championship Pass, which features the tournament in its entirety. A link to the video stream will also be available at LibertyFlames.com.

Real-time "Live Stats" will be available on the Big South, Winthrop and LibertyFlames.com website free of charge.

Record at Liberty: 107-64-1 (Three Years)

Career Record: Same

After leading the Flames to the best record of any Liberty head coach during his first two years, 68-47-1, Jim Toman reached 100 career victories in a 10-7 win over Gardner-Webb on May 2. The three-year coach becomes the fastest out of Liberty's six head coaches in reaching the milestone.

Last season, Liberty recorded a 33-21 overall record, while posting a 17-9 mark in Big South Conference play, the most victories by the school since joining the conference in 1992. While recording 30 or more wins in each of Toman's seasons in Lynchburg, Liberty reached the plateau for the fifth consecutive season for the first time in the program's 36-year history in 2009.

Liberty set a new fielding standard in 2009, committing the fewest errors, 53 and finishing the year with the highest fielding percentage, .974, in team history. The 2009 team's fielding percentage ranked 16th in the country. From that infield, third baseman Tyler Bream was named a Freshman All-American by the Collegiate Baseball News.

Pitcher Andrew Wilson became the third player during Toman's time at Liberty to be taken in the MLB draft (Atlanta Braves), while catcher Errol Hollinger later signed a free agent contract (Arizona Diamondbacks).

In 2008, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish the Toman's first season at Liberty with a 35-26-1 mark. The record made Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's 36-year history. He guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by Flames team.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks this past summer. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty also eclipsed the school's single-season doubles mark, ripping 155 two-base hits. The total ranked the Flames fifth in the country in the category.

Liberty finished its season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed the Flames to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. Liberty would go on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman is the sixth head coach in the 37-year history of the Liberty Baseball program. The second-year skipper comes to Liberty after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 19-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball. Toman's 2003, 2005 and 2006 classes were named the top recruiting classes by the publication.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

In addition, South Carolina posted eight-straight seasons of 40 or more wins with Toman on the Gamecock coaching staff, including 2007. During Toman's 11 seasons at South Carolina, he helped the Gamecocks to a combined 500-220 (.694) record.

Toman earned four baseball letters at N.C. State, 1981-84, and was captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in vocational industrial education in 1985. He received a Master of Science degree in sport management from N.C. State in 1995.

Upon graduation, Toman entered the coaching profession as an assistant at Richmond County High School in Rockingham, N.C., for two years. He moved into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989 as an assistant at Florida International for one year. At FIU, he was responsible for the weight program, worked with the squad's catchers and coached first base. Toman joined the N.C. State staff before the 1990 season.

Flames At the Big South Baseball Championship

This year's appearance marks Liberty's 14th at the Big South Baseball Championship. The Flames enter the 2010 championship having compiled a 39-22 overall record in previous tournament appearances. For the second time in three years, Liberty is the No. 2 seed for the championship.

Liberty earned the No. 2 seed in 2008, its highest seed since being the No. 1 seed in 2000. That season, the Flames made their third consecutive championship game appearance, forcing Coastal Carolina to a second game for the championship. The Flames set a Big South Championship mark in 2008, scoring 55 runs over the Flames' six contests in the the tournament.

Last season, Liberty entered the tournament as the No. 3 seed. The Flames won their first two games of the double-elimination tournament, before being eliminated by dropping their next two contests.

The Flames have been the fourth seed the most often in their previous tournament appearances. In their previous 13 championship appearances, the Flames have been the top seed twice (2000, 1998), the No. 2 seed once (2008), the No. 3 seed three times (2008, 2007, 2001), the No. 4 seed four times (2005, 2002, 1999, 1997), the No. 5 seed once (2006), and the No. 6 seed twice (2003, 1993).

Liberty's most frequent opponent in the tournament has been Coastal Carolina, with the Chanticleers holding a 9-5 edge over the Flames in previous meetings in the championship.

Toman Reaches 100 Coaching Wins

With a 10-7 win over Gardner-Webb on May 2, Liberty head coach Jim Toman recorded his 100th career coaching win.

Of the six head coaches in Liberty history, Toman becomes the fastest to reach 100 coaching victories. Toman reached the milestone in 160 games, eclipsing program founder and first head coach Al Worthington, who reached his 100th win in 166 games.

A Look at RPI

The web site Boyd's World, which approximates the RPI, shows the Flames ranked at No. 51. The RPI is used to select at-large teams and seed teams for the NCAA Tournament.

Monthly Breakdowns May Musings

Liberty is 9-5 in May, with a 6-5 record in Big South play. Liberty went 4-7 in the month of May last season, including a 1-5 mark in Big South play.

The Flames are 159-124-3 (.561) all-time, including Big South Championship appearances and three NCAA Regional appearances, during May. Liberty has gone 116-93-3 in regular season games during the month.

Analyzing April

The Flames finished the month of April with a 14-4 record, including a 12-1 Big South mark. Last season, the Flames finished the month of April with a 10-8 record. Liberty posted a 9-3 mark in Big South Conference play.

Since 1976, the Flames have recorded an all-time mark of 345-285-1 (.548) in April.

March Mayhem

With three-straight victories to close the month, Liberty posted a 10-8 mark in games during March this season, including a 1-2 start to Big South Conference play. The Flames are 347-275-2 (.558) all-time in program history during the month.

Fast Starts in February

After completing the month of February with a 6-0 record, its best February start since 1995, the Flames have recorded a .500 or better mark for the month 20 out of 23 times. Since beginning play during the month of February in 1984, Liberty has posted an all-time mark of 70-32 for a .686 winning percentage.

Over the past five years, the Flames are 28-9 (.757) during the month of February, while recording a 14-3 mark under head coach Jim Toman during his three years at Liberty.

Home Sweet Home

For the past 32 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium home. Named for program architect and the first Liberty head baseball coach, Al Worthington, Liberty has compiled an impressive 524-238-5 record at the stadium for a winning percentage of .686 since the facility's inception in 1979.

The Flames posted a 19-9 record at Worthington this season. Liberty finished the 2009 regular season with a 19-5 record at the facility and are 49-26-1 at home under three-year head coach Jim Toman's guidance.

Flames on the Road

Liberty finished the regular season with a 18-8 mark on the road this season. Liberty is also 2-0 in contests on neutral fields.

Head Coach Jim Toman's team finished 2009 with a 11-13 final road ledger. The Flames also compiled a 3-3 record on neutral fields.

Liberty at Night

Liberty went 5-5 during the regular season in night contests. The Flames went 8-7 at night last season.

Closing in on Season Win Mark

The Flames begin the week with 39 wins, one shy of the school record of 40 victories, reached by the 1983 Liberty squad which posted a 40-17 mark. It is the only time in the 37-year history of the program that a Flames team won 40 games.

The Liberty's 39 wins tie the 2006 Flames squad for the most in program history at the NCAA Division I level. In 2006, Liberty posted a 39-21 record.

Flames Reach 30 Wins

With an 11-2 victory over the Gardner-Webb Bulldogs on April 30, Liberty has won 30 or more games in a season for the sixth consecutive year, and each of the first three years under head coach Jim Toman. It is the first time in the 37-year history of the program, the Flames have won 30 or more games six-straight years.

Last season, the Flames posted a 33-21 mark to record its fifth-straight season of 30 wins or more. It was the first time Liberty had accomplished the five-year feat.

Before 2008, the Liberty baseball program had won 30 or more games in a season three consecutive years. The Flames won 30 or more contests three consecutive seasons from 2000-02.

Flames Post Longest Big South Win Streak

This season, Liberty posted the longest Big South winning streak in program history, with 15-straight victories. The streak, which ran from March 27 to May 14, eclipsed the 2001 Liberty team, which won 10-straight Big South games.

New Big South Victory Record

With 19 Big South victories, the 2010 Flames have recorded the most conference wins ever by a Liberty baseball team since joining the Big South in 1992. The mark surpasses last season's 17 wins, which eclipsed the 1995 Liberty squad's 15 conference wins.

Liberty, a 19-year member of the Big South Conference, has compiled a 261-183 (.588) record against the Big South Conference's current membership.

The Liberty third baseman is five hits shy of tying Michael Just, who holds the school record for hits in season, with 94 in 2006. Bream leads the Big South Conference in hits.

Doubles Derby

Third baseman Tyler Bream and shortstop Matt Williams are two of eight players in school history to hit 20 or more doubles in a season. Both Bream and Williams enter the week with 21 two-base hits each. The totals tie both players for third on Liberty's season list with three former Flames, Cody Brown and P.K. Keller, who both hit 21 in 2008 and Mark de Yaz who reached the total in 1981.

Outfielder Phillip Laurent holds the program season record for doubles with 27 in 2006. He is also Liberty's career two-base hit leader with 68.

The Flames have hit 140 doubles this season, surpassing last year's total of 123. The school record is 155, which was set by the 2008 Liberty squad.

Teufel on Season Wins, K List

Liberty left-hander Shawn Teufel begins the week with a 10-3 record. With 10 wins, the senior is currently tied for second on the program's season wins list with former Flames standout Lee Guetterman, who won 10 games in each of the 1980 and 81 seasons. Teufel is one shy of right-hander Jason Jones, who won 11 contests in 2002 to top the list.

Teufel's season strikeout total of 87 also ranks eighth in program history. Former Flame Benji Miller heads the Liberty season strikeout list with 119 in 1998.

Umberger Moves Up On Innings Pitched, K List

Liberty senior right-hander Dustin Umberger enters his final Big South Championship second on the program's career innings pitched list with 315 1/3 innings. The right-hander trails only former Liberty standout Lee Guetterman, who heads the program's career innings pitched list with 334 2/3.

In addition, Umberger is fourth on the school's career strikeout list with 229. Mike Brown, who pitched for the Flames from 1994-97 holds the career strikeout mark with 287.

Umberger became the 53rd pitcher in Big South Conference history to record 200 or more strikeouts on March 17, by striking out two batters at Duke. The senior became the first Flame since David Bechtold in 2005 to strike out over 200 batters. Bechtold struck out 241 hitters from 2002-05.

Taking One for the Team

In each of the past two seasons, the Flames have set a new team record for being hit by a pitch, and this season has been no different. A Liberty player has been hit by a pitch 115 times in 2010, once again setting a new program standard. The total eclipses last season's team record 95, which was set over 54 games.

The Flames rank third nationally in the category in the latest NCAA statistics, through games of May 16. Catcher Nathan Thompson has been hit 19 times to lead the Flames. The Liberty record for number of times being hit by a pitch in a season is 22, set by David Benham in 1998. Benham is also the school's career leader in the category, as the catcher s hit 55 from 1995-98.

Turning Two

Liberty has turned 56 double plays this season, and ranks 27th nationally in double plays in the last NCAA Statistical Report for games through May 16. The Flames total eclipsed last year's season total of 36, recorded over 54 games. The program season record is 77 double plays, set by the 1998 squad.

In addition, the Liberty Flames turned five ground balls into double plays during their 9-1 win over St. John's on March 12. The five double plays turned by the Liberty infield are the most in a game by the Flames over the past 11 seasons. In 2008, the Flames turned four double plays in a game twice. The contest happened a week apart, as Liberty had four double plays in an 11-5 win over Army, March 8. A week later, the Flames recorded four double plays in a 5-0 loss at Southern Miss, March 15. Liberty also turned four double plays this season in a 6-3 victory over Lehigh on Feb. 27.

Of its 39 victories this season, Liberty has hit at least one home run in 27 or 69 percent of the time. The Flames are 27-4 when homering in a game this season.

Baseball's New LU Hall Famers

Former Liberty Flames pitching standout Lee Guetterman and baseball program founder and first coach Al Worthington are two of the five members of the Liberty Athletics Hall of Fame, who will be inducted into the hall during the Savannah State-Liberty football game on Oct. 2.

Guetterman becomes the second baseball player to be inducted into the Liberty Athletics Hall of Fame, joining Sid Bream who was inducted in the Hall's first class this past fall.

During a highly successful four-year stint in a Liberty uniform, Guetterman set benchmarks that still stand three decades later. He is Liberty's all-time career leader in games started (47), complete games (30), shutouts (7), wins (29) and innings pitched (334.2). Additionally, his 3.07 career ERA ranks second in school history, while his 220 strikeouts is fifth on Liberty's all-time listings.

Not just a dominating force on the mound, he certainly helped out his own cause at the plate. He posted a .325 career batting average, with 108 RBIs and 82 runs scored. The impressive statistics helped him earn NAIA All-America first-team honors as a senior in 1981.

Guetterman was drafted by the Seattle Mariners in the fourth round of the 1981 MLB Draft, beginning an 11-year career, which saw him play for the Mariners, New York Yankees, New York Mets and St. Louis Cardinals.

Following a four-year standout career at Samford in football and baseball, Worthington played for five different major league programs, including a five-year stint with the Minnesota Twins.

In 1974, Worthington started Liberty's baseball program. His 13-year coaching stint enabled him to become the winningest coach in program history. Following the first year of the program, Liberty never again had a losing record during the final dozen years under his tutelage.

Worthington was named Liberty's fifth Director of Athletics in Dec. 1983, a role he held until he retired in 1989.

How About Jimenez

Second baseman P.J. Jimenez is putting together quite a year for his final season in a Liberty uniform.

The senior enters the week among the Big South leaders in several offensive categories. Jimenez ranks third in the conference with a .383 batting average and second with 87 hits. Also, his 56 runs scored is tied for fifth.

This season, the second baseman is one of three Flames to have played in every Liberty contest. He leads the Flames in batting average, raising his average from .271 last season to .383 this year. Jimenez has 27 multiple-hit games, including 11 three-hit contests.

In the field, he has made five errors in 273 chances for a .982 fielding percentage, equaling his fielding percentage of a season ago. Last season, Jimenez had 223 chances in the field.

Tough to K - Redal at it Again

After being one of the toughest hitters in the nation to strike out in 2009, Liberty outfielder Curran Redal is once again proving to be hard to strike out this season. The senior has fanned 3 times in 236 at bats this season, or once per every 18.2 at bats. The outfielder ranked as the 13th-toughest batter to strike out in the country in the latest NCAA statistics, through games of May 16.

Last season, Redal finished the year, striking out once every 21.3 at bats, ranking him ninth among NCAA Division I batters in the country. Redal struck out only 10 times in 213 at bats over 54 games in 2010.

The outfielder began the week ranked fourth in the Big South Conference in on base percentage with a .478 average.

Evans Posts Career-High in Wins

Liberty pitcher Steven Evans pitched eight scoreless innings, as the Flames defeated the Winthrop Eagles, 8-2, this past Thursday night at the Winthrop Ballpark.

Evans held the Eagles in check over eight innings, scattering five hits, to run his record to 8-2 on the season. His season win total is a career-high for the junior. The left-hander struck out three and walked two batters. After pitching out of jams in the first two innings, Evans did not allow hit from the third inning until the first Winthrop batter of the eighth.

Besides wins, the junior pitcher has also posted personal career highs in innings pitched (80.0) and strikeouts (75). He is also on pace to set a career-low for ERA. The left-hander currently sports a 3.26 ERA.

Second baseman P.J. Jimenez and shortstop Matt Williams led all hitters in the game with three hits apiece.

Bream's Walk-off Lifts Flames Past VCU

Trailing 6-5 in the bottom of the ninth, Liberty third baseman Tyler Bream blasted a two-run home run, his second of the contest, giving the Flames a 7-6 walk-off victory over the VCU Rams at Worthington Stadium, May 18.

Behind by a run in the ninth, center fielder Curran Redal led off the bottom half of the final inning with a single to left field off VCU pitcher Robbie Andrews and moved to second base on a ground out by shortstop Matt Williams. Bream followed by belting the first pitch from the Ram closer over the left field wall and into the Liberty bullpen for the 7-6 victory.

The home run was his second of the afternoon and seventh of the season. Bream evened the contest at 1-1 with a two-out roundtripper in the bottom of the game's opening inning. The Liberty third baseman had four hits and drove in four runs in the contest.

The blast was Bream's second career walk-off home run, as the sophomore hit a three-run home run on April 22 of last year to provide the Flames with a 4-3 win over Virginia Tech.

P.J. Jimenez chipped in two hits for the Flames in the contest.

Jimenez Garners Player of the Week Honors

Liberty senior second baseman P.J. Jimenez has been named the Big South Player of the Week for games played May 3-9. He becomes the third Flame to win the award, joining outfielder Curran Redal (April 5) and third baseman Tyler Bream (Feb. 28)

Jimenez batted .611 (11-18) with nine runs scored, four doubles, four walks, two stolen bases and three runs driven in five wins during the week for the Flames. He had four multi-hit games, including three hits at George Mason as well as in the series finale at Charleston Southern.

The senior scored four times against the Patriots on May 4, then went 2-2 with two RBI and two doubles against Maryland on May 5. In Liberty's series sweep of Charleston Southern, Jimenez had two hits, two walks and two runs scored on May 7, and added a hit and stolen base in Liberty's 4-1 win, the following afternoon. He finished the weekend by doubling, drawing a walk and scoring two runs, May 9.

For the week, he posted a .833 slugging percentage and a .667 on-base percentage. He handled 22 fielding chances during the week without an error.

The win was the first time since May 24, 2009, when Liberty defeated then No. 13 Coastal Carolina at the Big South Championship to force a second game for the conference title, that the Flames have defeated a ranked opponent.

Flames Take Three from No. 26 VMI

All nine Flames in the starting line-up had at least one hit to power a 19-hit attack, as Liberty defeated the No. 26 VMI Keydets, 13-8, April 18 at Worthington Stadium to complete a three-game sweep of the Big South Conference series. Curran Redal had four hits and scored twice, while Justin Richardson added three hits, a RBI and scored twice for the Flames.

Left-hander Steven Evans upped his record to 5-1, allowing three runs on 10 hits over the first 6 1/3 innings. He struck out seven batters and walked one.

Teufel's Scoreless Streak Ends

Senior left-hander Shawn Teufel gave up only his second run of the season March 19. A Manhattan home run in the fourth halted the left-hander's scoreless innings streak at 24, which spanned over five starts for the senior. Teufel had allowed only one prior run, in the first inning of his season-opening start at Kennesaw State on Feb. 19, and has not allow one since.

The streak tops a previous career-high of 10 scoreless innings by the pitcher last season, from April 4-18. The scoreless span left the left-hander five innings shy of the school record of 29, set by Tim Harrell in 2000.

Best Start Since 1995

Liberty started its 2010 season with a 9-0 record. The mark tied the 1995 Flames for the best start to a year in the 36-year history of the program. Liberty tied the mark with a 10-1 win over Delaware State at Worthington Stadium on March 7.

The Flames' start was the best during the three-year tenure of Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman. During Toman's first season in 2008, the Flames opened the year, 5-1.

Liberty also tied the programs' record for consecutive wins at the NCAA Division I level with the streak. Five other Flames squads have won nine consecutive games (2009, 2008, 2006, 1995, 1985). The 1976 Liberty team holds the school record for consecutive victories with 15.

Bream Named Conference Player of the Week

Liberty sophomore third baseman Tyler Bream was named as the Big South Conference Choice Hotels Baseball Player of the Week for Feb. 23.

Bream hit .700 (7-for-10) in the Flames' three-game, season-opening sweep of Kennesaw State. The third baseman scored six runs and drove in five RBIs during the three-game series, reaching base three times in each contest to record a .688 on-base percentage. The sophomore had two doubles and a towering two-run home run during the weekend to post a 1.200 slugging percentage.

Bream opened the season on Feb. 19 by going 3-for-3, including an RBI-double and a two-run homer, while driving in four runs. The following afternoon, the third baseman walked twice, drove in a run with a sacrifice fly and scored twice.
