The Games

After two contests on the road, the Liberty Flames (11-4, 0-0 Big South) return home this weekend, for a three-game series with the Manhattan Jaspers (8-4, 0-0 MAAC). The defending MAAC regular season champions, the Jaspers were picked to win the 2010 MAAC crown in the conference's preseason coaches poll.

The series opens on Friday at 3 p.m., followed by a 2 p.m. start time for Saturday. The series concludes on Sunday afternoon, with first pitch scheduled for 1 p.m.

Last Time Out

A two-out, infield single with runners at the corners in the bottom of the 11th inning allowed the Duke Blue Devils to edge the Flames, 3-2, Wednesday at the USA Baseball National Training Complex.

In the contest, Liberty recieved two strong pitching performances from Dustin Umberger and J.J. McLeod. Umberger made his first start of the season and allowed one run on one hit over the game's first five innings. McLeod, the last of four Flames to take the mound in the game, gave up one run on four hits over 4 1/3 innings of relief. The right-hander struck out five Blue Devils and walked two. The junior pitched out of several threats, including a base loaded, one out situation in the seventh inning after being summoned from the bullpen.

Right-fielder Michael Robertson tripled in one of the two Liberty runs in the game, while Justin Richardson single home the other.

On Deck

Liberty will start a four-game road trip, with a contest at Virginia Tech, Tuesday. The contest will be the only meeting of the season between the Flames and the Hokies. Game time is scheduled for 5:30 p.m.

Flames on the Air

Sunday's series finale between Manhattan and Liberty may be heard LIVE on WWMC 90.9 FM "The Light." Nick Pierce will handle play-by-play duties and former Flames pitcher Doug Wallace will provide commentary. The broadcast will also be available on the World Wide web at both LibertyFlames.com and thelightonline.com.

Record at Liberty: 79-51-1 (Three Years)

Career Record: Same

After leading the Flames to the best record of any Liberty head coach during his first two years, 68-47-1, Jim Toman has the Flames out to their best start in his three-year tenure.

Last season, Liberty recorded a 33-21 overall record, while posting a 17-9 mark in Big South Conference play, the most victories by the school since joining the conference in 1992. While recording 30 or more wins in each of Toman's seasons in Lynchburg, Liberty reached the plateau for the fifth consecutive season for the first time in the program's 36-year history in 2009.

Liberty set a new fielding standard in 2009, committing the fewest errors, 53 and finishing the year with the highest fielding percentage, .974, in team history. The 2009 team's fielding percentage ranked 16th in the country. From that infield, third baseman Tyler Bream was named a Freshman All-American by the Collegiate Baseball News.

Pitcher Andrew Wilson became the third player during Toman's time at Liberty to be taken in the MLB draft (Atlanta Braves), while catcher Errol Hollinger later signed a free agent contract (Arizona Diamondbacks).

In 2008, the Flames fashioned a 13-3-1 record in the month of May to finish the Toman's first season at Liberty with a 35-26-1 mark. The record made Toman the winningest first-year coach in the program's 36-year history. He guided the Flames to their third straight Big South Championship title game appearance, claiming the conference's runner-up position in 2008. Liberty's May record was the best ever by Flames team.

In addition, the Liberty pitching staff set a new season strikeout record, fanning 508 opposing batters during the year. The Flames' strikeout total led the Big South Conference and their 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings ranked 22nd nationally at season's end. Two pitchers from the staff, Ryan Page and David Stokes, went on to be drafted and play in the professional ranks this past summer. Page was taken in the 20th round of the MLB draft by the Toronto Blue Jays, while Stokes was picked in the 28th round by the Detroit Tigers.

Liberty also eclipsed the school's single-season doubles mark, ripping 155 two-base hits. The total ranked the Flames fifth in the country in the category.

Liberty finished its season with a 14-7 record in conference play. The mark allowed the Flames to claim the No. 2 seed for the Big South Championship, their highest seed for the Big South Baseball Championship since a No. 1 seed in 2000. Liberty would go on to post four consecutive double-digit victories during six games in the Big South Championship to set a championship record with 55 runs scored.

Toman is the sixth head coach in the 35-year history of the Liberty Baseball program. The second-year skipper comes to Liberty after 11 seasons as the senior member of Ray Tanner's coaching staff at South Carolina. Toman worked a total of 18 years alongside Tanner, dating back to the 1990 season at N.C. State.

During his time at South Carolina, Toman served as recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's catchers. Known as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, the 19-year college coaching veteran was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year. Before joining the Gamecock staff in 1996, Toman served under Tanner for seven years at N.C. State.

Toman has recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball. Toman's 2003, 2005 and 2006 classes were named the top recruiting classes by the publication.

During his time on the staff in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

In addition, South Carolina posted eight-straight seasons of 40 or more wins with Toman on the Gamecock coaching staff, including 2007. During Toman's 11 seasons at South Carolina, he helped the Gamecocks to a combined 500-220 (.694) record.

Toman earned four baseball letters at N.C. State, 1981-84, and was captain of the Wolfpack his junior and senior seasons. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in vocational industrial education in 1985. He received a Master of Science degree in sport management from N.C. State in 1995.

Upon graduation, Toman entered the coaching profession as an assistant at Richmond County High School in Rockingham, N.C., for two years. He moved into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989 as an assistant at Florida International for one year. At FIU, he was responsible for the weight program, worked with the squad's catchers and coached first base. Toman joined the N.C. State staff before the 1990 season.

The Coaches

Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman is in his third year at the helm of the Flames. In his first two seasons, he guided the Flames to 68 wins, the most during the first two years under any head coach in program history, and best winning percentage (.591) over the same span.

Last season, Liberty posted the most victories in Big South Conference play with a 17-9 mark, since joining the conference in 1992. The Flames recorded an overall record of 33-21 in Toman's second year.

A 21-year member of the college coaching ranks, he served 18 years as a member of Ray Tanner's staffs at South Carolina and N.C. State. Toman was named the 2002 Baseball America/American Baseball Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year and recruited 15 top 25 classes, including all 11 of his seasons at South Carolina. From 2003-2006, three of the four Gamecock recruiting classes were ranked first in the nation by Collegiate Baseball.

During his time in Columbia, S.C., Toman and the Gamecocks made nine NCAA Regional appearances, including eight-straight since 2000, and three-consecutive trips to the College World Series (2002-04). Add in his seven seasons at N.C. State, and Toman has helped lead 15 teams to NCAA Regional appearances.

Kevin Leighton is in his fifth year at the helm of the Manhattan Jaspers. The 2009 MAAC Coach of the Year, Leighton led the Jaspers to a 35-18 mark and the MAAC Regular Season Championship last season. The regular season title was the second consecutive crown for Manhattan. In 2006, he led the Jaspers to the school's first-ever MAAC title and a NCAA Regional berth.

The 24th coach in program history, Leighton is already its third winningest coach and was the quickest to Jaspers head coach to reach 100 wins. He is also ranks among the youngest Division I coaches to reach the plateau. In his five years, Manhattan has posted a 143-82-1 record.

Two of Leighton's players have received All-American honors, while seven have been named Freshman All-Americans.

All-Time Against Manhattan

The Flames and Jaspers have met once before, a three-game series at Worthington Stadium, March 2-4, 2007. Liberty took two of the three contests on the weekend to hold a 2-1 edge in the all-time series.

Scouting the Jaspers

Manhattan enters this weekend's series having won seven out of its last eight contests. In their latest contest Wednesday, the Jaspers defeated Seton Hall, 3-2. The Jaspers were picked to win the MAAC this season in the conference's preseason coaches' poll.

The 2009 Jaspers finished fifth in NCAA Division I and set the MAAC single season record with a .349 team batting average. And, Manhattan has picked up where it left off last season, batting .335 as team. With their early hitting prowess, the Jaspers have averaged 8.8 runs per game this season.

Third baseman Chad Salem, the MAAC Player of the Week, has had a strong start to the year, hitting .500, with a team-leading 21 runs scored and 15 RBIs. Teammates Mark Onorati and Kevin Nieto also enter the weekend with batting averages over .400. Onorati, an outfielder, has hit .467 in 11 games. Nieto, a 2009 All-American outfielder, has posted a .438 batting average.

Meanwhile, the Manhattan pitching staff has given up 8.6 runs per game this season, beginning the weekend with a 7.35 ERA.

MAAC Pitcher of the Week, Tom Costigan, allowed only one run over eight innings in his last outing Friday in a 13-1 win at West Virginia. The senior has recorded a 2-1 mark with a 5.79 ERA in three appearances this season and is expected to start Friday's game.

Relievers John Solding and Tom Moran have been the workhorses of the staff, so far. Solding has made six appearances and pitched 11 innings. He has earned four saves with a 1.64 ERA. He is striking out one batter per inning pitch.

Moran has also made six appearances. He enters the weekend with a 4.50 ERA in six innings of work.

March Mayhem

All four of the Flames losses have come in March. Liberty has posted a 5-4 record, so far during the third month of the year. The Flames are 342-271-2 (.558) all-time in program history during the month.

Last season, Liberty posted a 16-3 (.842) overall mark and started 7-1 in Big South play during the month.

Liberty is scheduled to play 18 games during March. Three of those games will begin Big South Conference play. The Flames will travel to UNC Asheville for a weekend conference series, March 26-28 at Greenwood Field.

Fast Starts in February

After completing the month of February with a 6-0 record, its best February start since 1995, the Flames have recorded a .500 or better mark for the month 20 out of 23 times. Since beginning play during the month of February in 1984, Liberty has posted an all-time mark of 70-32 for a .686 winning percentage.

Over the past five years, the Flames are 28-9 (.757) during the month of February, while recording a 14-3 mark under head coach Jim Toman during his three years at Liberty.

Home Sweet Home

For the past 32 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium home. Named for program architect and first Liberty head baseball coach, Al Worthington, Liberty has compiled an impressive 510-231-5 record at the stadium for a winning percentage of .687 since the facility's inception in 1979.

After completing their first homestand of the season, last Sunday, the Flames have posted a 5-2 record at Worthington this season. Liberty is slated to play 28 contests at home in 2010.

The Flames finished the 2009 regular season with a 19-5 record at the facility and are 33-18-1 at home under three-year head coach Jim Toman's guidance.

Flames on the Road

After starting the year, 4-0 in road games, the Flames have dropped their last two road games for a 4-2 road mark. Liberty is also 2-0 in contests on neutral fields.

The Flames finished 2009 with a 11-13 final road ledger. The Flames also compiled a 3-3 record on neutral fields.

Making It Tough to Score

Liberty enters this weekend's series, allowing its opponents 3.8 runs per game. The mark currently ranks 13th in the country. UCLA tops the list, yielding 2.4 runs per game this season.

Scoring First

The Flames have gotten on the scoreboard first in 12 of its 15 contests this season. Liberty is 11-1, when scoring first.

In 26 out of Liberty's 33 victories last season, the Flames hit at least one home run in the contest. Liberty had a record of 26-6 when hitting at least one roundtripper in a game.

Jim Toman's squad belted 60 home runs last season, 14 more than in 2007. Liberty's 60 home runs were the most by the Flames since 2002, when Liberty hit 86.

The Flames have started this season out in similar fashion, hitting at least one home run in nine of their 11 wins in 2010. Liberty has hit a total of 15 home runs in 2010, with catcher Nathan Thompson leading the team with four.

Starting Sensations

One of the keys to the Flames' early season success has been the performance of their three weekend starters, Shawn Teufel, Keegan Linza and Steven Evans.

The trio has combined to post a 9-0 record during their weekend starts, with a 1.14 ERA. All three hurlers have each recorded 3-0 marks this season. During their weekend starts, teams have hit .171 against the trio and struck out 62 times

Teufel's Scoreless Streak

Senior left-hander Shawn Teufel enters his Friday start against Manhattan not having given up a run over his last 21 innings of work. Teufel gave up one run in the first inning of his season-opening start at Kennesaw State on Feb. 19, and has not allow one since.

The streak tops a previous career-high of 10 scoreless innings by the pitcher last season from April 4-18. The scoreless span has left the left-hander eight innings shy of the school record of 29, set by Tim Harrell in 2000.

With the streak, Teufel leads the Big South Conference with a 0.41 ERA and according to Boyd's World.com is fourth in the country in the category.

Three Flames Lead Conference Categories

Several Liberty players are among the Big South statistical leaders. One of them is third baseman Tyler Bream, who begins the week as the conference leader with a .462 batting average. Bream is also fourth in the league with 19 RBIs.

Catcher Nathan Thompson also heads up a conference listing with a .865 slugging percentage. The senior is also second with a .521 on base percentage and tied for fourth in the Big South with four home runs.

Pitcher Shawn Teufel has posted a 0.41 ERA to lead the Big South. Teufel is also second in the conference, holding opposing hitters to a .159 batting average.

Umberger Among Flames' All-Time K Kings

Liberty senior right-hander Dustin Umberger entered 2010, his final season in a Flames uniform, already listed among the program's all-time leaders in strikeouts.

The right-hander went over 200 strikeouts for his career, Wednesday at Duke, striking out two in his first start of the season. Umberger has struck out 201 batters during his Liberty career to rank sixth on the school's career strikeout list.

The right-hander is 11 strikeouts away from moving ahead of Randy Tomlin for fifth place on the list. Tomlin recorded 211 strikeouts for the Flames from 1986-88. Mike Brown, who pitched at Liberty from 1994-97, holds the career strikeout mark with 287.

Voted as one of the three toughest pitchers to face in the conference by Big South head coaches in a preseason poll by CollegeInsider.com, Umberger returned to the Liberty roster after receiving a medical redshirt in 2009.

In 2008, he led the league with 88 strikeouts and tied for second with eight wins. The right-hander posted an 8-3 record with one save and a 3.80 ERA over 83 innings. He walked only 19 batters for a 4.6-to-1 strikeout to walk ratio. After starting the year in the bullpen, Umberger made nine starts, pitching two complete games and compiling a 6-1 record.

Liberty Takes Two From St. John's

With wins, last Friday and Saturday, Liberty took two games of its three-game series with the St. John's Red Storm, this past weekend at Worthington Stadium. The series was the first-ever meeting between the two teams.

On Friday, the Flames belted three home runs in a 9-1 win over the Red Storm. In the game, Liberty plated a run in the first inning to stake itself to a lead it never relinquished.

In the second, the Flames extended their lead with the first of their three round trippers in the contest. With one out, right fielder Michael Robertson connected for a solo home run, his second of the year. Later in the inning with two men aboard and two out, second baseman P.J. Jimenez ripped the second home run of the inning, his first of the year. The three-run home run gave Liberty a 5-0.

After a rain delay, shortstop Josh Richardson hit a solo home run, his second of the day, for the third Flame homer of the contest.

In addition, Liberty turned five ground ball double plays in the contest. Left-hander Shawn Teufel tossed six scoreless innings in the contest to run his record to 3-0 on the year.

Saturday, after battling back with four runs in the seventh inning to tie the contest at 9-9, Liberty plated five runs in the eighth for a 14-9 victory. Third baseman Tyler Bream and catcher Nathan Thompson hit back-to-back run-scoring doubles to give the Flames an 11-9 lead. Three batters later, first baseman Trey Wimmer blasted a three-run home run, his first of the year, to make it, 14-9, Flames.

Left-hander Chris Roach pitched two scoreless innings of relief to pick up his first victory in a Flames uniform.

Double Delight

Last Friday, the Liberty Flames turned five ground balls into double plays during their 9-1 win over St. John's. The five double plays turned by the Liberty infield are the most in a game by the Flames this decade.

In 2008, the Flames turned four double plays in a game twice. The contest happened a week apart, as Liberty had four double plays in an 11-5 win over Army, March 8. A week later, the Flames recorded four double plays in a 5-0 loss at Southern Miss, March 15. Liberty also turned four double plays this season in a 6-3 victory over Lehigh on Feb. 27.

Best Start Since 1995

Liberty started its 2010 season with a 9-0 record. The mark tied the 1995 Flames for the best start to a year in the 36-year history of the program. Liberty tied the mark with a 10-1 win over Delaware State at Worthington Stadium on March 7.

In addition, the Flames' start was the best during the three-year tenure of Liberty Head Coach Jim Toman. During Toman's first season at Liberty in 2008, the Flames opened the year, 5-1.

Liberty also tied the programs' record for consecutive wins at the NCAA Division I level with the streak. Five other Flames squads have won nine consecutive games (2009, 2008, 2006, 1995, 1985). The 1976 Liberty team holds the school record for consecutive victories with 15.

Flames Open Home Slate with Sweep

The weekend of March 5-7, Liberty opened its 2010 home schedule with a sweep of a three-game series with the Delaware State Hornets. The Flames dominated the series, outscoring the Hornets, 34-2, over the span of the three games. Liberty also hit .368 as a team, while Flames pitchers limited Delaware State to a .167 batting average.

Catcher Nathan Thompson paced Liberty at the plate in the series, going 5-for-10 (.500) with two home runs, a double, five runs scored and seven RBIs. In Sunday's final game, the senior catcher hit his team-leading fourth home run, a three-run round tripper in the first inning, and drove in five of Liberty's runs in the Flames' 10-1 win. Center fielder Curran Redal also hit .500 for Liberty.

Flames pitchers had a 0.72 ERA during the three-game series, striking out 24 and walking 10. Starters Keegan Linza and Steven Evans each won their third game of the year in as many outings, while Friday's starter Shawn Teufel ran his mark to 2-0 on the season.

Starters Strong at Hughes Brothers

Strong pitching helped the Flames win each of their three games in the Hughes Brothers Challenge, Feb. 26-28, in Wilmington, N.C.

On the 26th, starter Shawn Teufel did not allow a run over six innings in a no decision against Morehead State. The Flames rallied with three, two-out runs in the seventh inning to take a 5-2 win. Catcher Nathan Thompson tied the game with a home run in the frame.

Starter Keegan Linza was in control during his seven innings of work, running his mark to 2-0 on the year on Feb. 27. He gave up one run on four hits, as Liberty defeated Lehigh, 6-3. Catcher Jerry Neufang belted his first home run of the year in the contest and shortstop Matt Williams had four of the Flames' eight hits in the game.

On Feb. 28th, backed by a four-hit effort, including a home run, by third baseman Tyler Bream, Steven Evans ran his record to 2-0 on the season in a 12-2 win over UNC Wilmington. Evans allowed two runs on six hits over 6 2/3 innings for the victory. Shortstop Josh Richardson and right fielder Michael Robertson each also hit roundtrippers for the Flames.

Bream Named Conference Player of the Week

Liberty sophomore third baseman Tyler Bream was named as the Big South Conference Choice Hotels Baseball Player of the Week for Feb. 23.

Bream hit .700 (7-for-10) in the Flames' three-game, season-opening sweep of Kennesaw State. The third baseman scored six runs and drove in five RBIs during the three-game series, reaching base three times in each contest to record a .688 on-base percentage. The sophomore had two doubles and a towering two-run home run during the weekend to post a 1.200 slugging percentage.

Bream opened the season on Feb. 19 by going 3-for-3, including an RBI-double and a two-run homer, while driving in four runs. The following afternoon, the third baseman walked twice, drove in a run with a sacrifice fly and scored twice. In the final game of the series on Feb. 21, Bream finished the series by going 4-for-5 with a double and three runs scored to lead the Flames to the sweep.

Flames Open Season with Road Sweep

Liberty opened its 2010 season with a three-game sweep of host Kennesaw State, Feb. 19-21. Led by third baseman Tyler Bream, who hit .700 in the series, the Flames batted .321 during the series and posted double-digit run totals in each contest. Right-fielder Michael Robertson hit .417 with a team-high six RBIs in his debut in a Liberty uniform.

In the opener of the series on Feb. 19, Bream went 3-for-3 with four RBIs and a home run in a 10-2 victory and in the final game of the three-game set on Feb.21, the third baseman went 4-for-5 with a double and scored three runs in another 10-2 win. Robertson drove in two runs in each game of the series and was 3-for-5 and scored three runs in the Flames' victory in the final game of the series.

The Liberty mound staff held the Owls in check over the span of the series. The Kennesaw State batters hit .194 for the series and struck out 31 times. Flames right-hander Keegan Linza highlighted the weekend for the staff, allowing one run on two hits and striking out eight over six innings in his first outing in a Liberty uniform in an 11-2 victory during the middle contest on Feb. 20. Freshman Josh Richardson did not allow a run in two appearances out of the Flames bullpen during the weekend.

Third Baseman Bream Named Freshman All-American

Liberty third baseman Tyler Bream was selected to the Louisville Slugger Freshman All-America team, chosen and announced by Collegiate Baseball newspaper last season. The infielder becomes the fourth Flame to be named to Louisville Slugger team in its 19-year history.

Bream finished the year ranked third in the Big South Conference with 57 RBIs. In 46 games, the Zelienople, Pa., native hit .337 with 16 doubles and eight home runs. He scored 35 runs for the Flames and was third on the team with 107 total bases.

Bream opened his first season in a Liberty uniform as the starter at third base and started the first 46 games of the 2009 campaign, until an injury cut short his maiden season of college baseball. He tied the school record with nine RBIs in a game during the Flames' 19-5 victory over High Point, March 22. During a seven-game stretch, Bream drove in 23 runs (March 20-29), leading to him being named the Big South Player of the Week on March 30.

Returners Redal and Teufel Honored in 2009

Senior outfielder Curran Redal and pitcher Shawn Teufel were named to the 2009 Big South Conference first and the VaSID All-State second teams.

In his first year with the Flames in 2009, Redal finished the season ranked among the Big South leaders in batting average (.380), hits (81), triples (4) and on base percentage (.447). He scored 50 runs and drove in 42 runs, with 13 doubles and six home runs.

Redal also set a new Big South record by hitting safely in 32 consecutive games from Feb. 24-April 17. He led the Flames with 23 multi-hit games and 13 multi-RBI contests. The outfielder was selected the Big South Player of the week for March 9-16.

Teufel finished the year second in the Big South with nine wins and third with 72 strikeouts in his first season on the mound for the Flames. The left-hander was also among the conference leaders in ERA (4.33). He went 9-2 in 14 games over 72 2/3 innings, and won six consecutive starts from March 22 to May 2.
