The Liberty University Flames (3-3, 0-0 Big South) host the Gardner-Webb University Bulldogs (4-2, 0-0 Big South) in a Big South Conference tilt at Williams Stadium (12,000) in Lynchburg, Va., on October 21, 2006. Kickoff is set for 1 p.m. (EST).

Scouting The Bulldogs

Gardner-Webb enters the game riding a two-game winning streak with a road victory over Southeastern Louisiana, 28-21, and a home win over Glennville State, raising the team's record to 4-2 this year.

Quarterback Devin Campbell leads Gardner-Webb's offense as he has passed for 1,019 yards and seven touchdowns, completing 78-of-149 pass attempts. Four of the seven scoring passes have been caught by wide receiver Duvaughn Flagler, ranking third best in the league by a wideout.

Defensively, linebacker Mario E. Brown leads the Big South Conference and ranks 13th nationally with 64 tackles, while adding a team-high 6.5 tackles for a loss, 3.0 sacks, three interceptions and four pass breakups.

Back In The Big South

Today's game marks the beginning of Liberty's fifth year of competition in the Big South Conference for football. Since starting league play in 2002, Liberty has posted a combined 7-8 overall record with a pair of second-place league finishes (2003 and 2004). However, Liberty will be looking to alter its recent track record with Gardner-Webb as the Bulldogs have bested the Flames three out of the last four years.

Williams Stadium - Home Of The Flames

This year marks the Flames' 17th season of competition in Williams Stadium. Prior to the 1989 season, Liberty played its home games at Lynchburg's City Stadium.

Liberty holds a 58-26 record at the on-campus facility (69.9 winning percentage), and started competition in the venue with a 37-18 victory over Towson on October 21, 1989. The Flames have posted 13 winning seasons at home over the last 16 years, including a perfect 5-0 record during the 1992 campaign.

Fancy New Field For The Flames

The Flames faithful noticed quite a few new items during Liberty's game against St. Paul's on August 31, but one of the most noticeable things that will jump out at people entering the stadium is Liberty's new playing surface.

During the summer, the Athletics Department made a concerted effort to upgrade several athletics facilities, including a new playing surface at Williams Stadium. State-of-the-art FieldTurf was installed at Williams Stadium, replacing the old AstroTurf that had been used since the opening of the facility in 1989.

FieldTurf is the latest innovation in artificial playing surfaces and is the surface of choice for 24 NFL stadiums, including Ford Field where Super Bowl XL was played last February, and at over 40 NCAA stadiums across the country.

Rojas Enters Season As Lone Member Of 100 Career Tackle Club

The Flames graduated three defenders last year that were members of the Flames' 100 career tackle club with C.J. Moore leading the way as he finished his career with 282 career stops. Following the defensive back in the 100 career tackle club were linebacker Kenneth Kemp (163 career tackles) and fellow defensive back Shane Lancaster (162 career stops).

Entering today's game, Liberty has just two players on its active roster with more than 100 career tackles, including senior linebacker Manny Rojas, who leads the squad with 308 career stops. Rojas finished 2005 with a career-high 102 tackles. Brandon Duke joined the club against Savannah State and now has 106 career tackles.

On the verge of joining Rojas and Duke in the elite club are defensive linemen Steve Ackley with 99 career stops and Jason Horn with 88 career stops.

Forecast For Winning Season Looks Good

This year marks the seventh time in the history of the football program that Liberty has started a campaign with a 2-0 record, a fact which bodes well for a possible winning season. In five out of six seasons in which Liberty has started the year with a 2-0 record, the Flames have gone on to post an overall winning record. The only time that Liberty has failed to finish a year above the .500 mark after a 2-0 start was in 1975 when Liberty won its first three games, but finished the year with a 4-5 record.

WOW - What Wonderful Crowds

The excitement of a new brand of Flames' football is quickly growing. Evidence of the excitement has been repeatedly seen in this year's attendance figures as two of Liberty's three home games rank in the Top 15 in the school's attendance annuals.

Last week, the Flames set a Liberty and Big South record as 15,631 fans saw the Flames battled in-state opponent William & Mary in the school's annual Homecoming game. Earlier this year, Liberty nearly filled William Stadium as 11,423 fans watched Liberty defeat Glenville St., marking the 13th-highest attended game in school history.

Larger home crowds have proven to be an advantage for the Flames as Liberty has posted a 12-8 record in Williams Stadium home games where 10,000 or more fans have attended. In 1998, Liberty had three games in which it accumulated 10,000 fans, while four years saw crowds of 10,000 fans assemble at Williams Stadium twice.

Noting The Attendance Numbers

Liberty recorded a school and Big South Conference record for home attendance last Saturday as 15,631 fans saw the Flames' Homecoming game against William & Mary. The game was the 10th most attended I-AA game last week in the country.

Liberty's previous school record for highest home attendance was 12,623 against Charleston Southern (October 3, 1998) and the previous conference high was the 12,273 fans that saw Liberty's come-from-behind victory over VMI (October 4, 2003).

Liberty now holds eight of the Top 10 single game attendance figures in Big South Conference history, including the top seven tallies.

The Series

This will mark the 13th meeting between the two programs and the fifth since starting Big South Conference competition in 2002 ... Gardner-Webb leads the overall series, 7-4-1 ... in their most recent meeting last year, the Flames racked up a season high 479 yards of total offense and scored 13 of their 16 points in the fourth quarter, but their rally fell just short as homestanding Gardner-Webb held on for a 21-16 Big South victory over Liberty at Spangler Field ... in 2004, the Flames handed Gardner-Webb their first-ever Big South Conference loss in a thrilling 17-9 Homecoming victory over the visiting Bulldogs at Williams Stadium ... the 2002 meeting marked a historic moment in school history as the two squad's squared off in the first-ever Big South Conference game with Gardner-Webb walking away from Williams Stadium with a 31-21 victory ... the two squads first met in 1976 and faced each other for six-consecutive seasons until 1981 ... Gardner-Webb has actually defeated Liberty eight times in the series history, picking up a 32-29 victory over the Flames on September 29, 1979 at Victory Stadium in Roanoke, Va., but the verdict of the contest was reversed after the season as the Bulldogs were required to forfeit all their games due to an ineligible player ... the forfeit was just one of two in the history of the Flames' football program ... during the 1978 season, the two squads tied 20-20 on September 30, in Boiling Springs, N.C. ... the tie accounts for just one of four ties in the history of the football program.

Natural Versus Artificial Surfaces

Under head coach Danny Rocco, the Flames are 2-3 on artificial turf and 1-0 on natural grass. Overall, Liberty is 93-105-4 on natural grass and 63-71 on artificial turf. The Flames play their home games at Williams Stadium, which has an artificial surface as new state-of-the-art FieldTurf was installed prior to the start of the 2006 season. Liberty has posted a 2-1 record at home since the new surface was installed.

New Faces On The Sidelines

First-year head coach Danny Rocco has added four new faces to the Flames' coaching staff since taking over the program last December. Rocco has brought in a new offensive coordinator in Scott Wachenheim and a new defensive coordinator in Tom Clark. Rocco also added a new quarterbacks coach in Brandon Streeter and a new defensive line/special teams coach in Chad Wilt.

Remaining from last year's staff are Pete Sundheim (assistant head coach/tight ends), Frank Hickson (running backs), Marshall Roberts (defensive backs), Charlie Skalaski (wide receivers/recruiting coordinator) and Robert Wimberly (linebackers).

Wachenheim Brings New Ways To Flames' Offense

For the first time in over a decade, the Flames are running a two-back offense as new offensive coordinator Scott Wachenheim has brought the offensive scheme back to Liberty. The last time that Liberty ran a two-back set was during the 1994 and 1995 seasons with Lawrence Worthington and J.T. Morris, and the tandem proved to be successful as Worthington finished his career with 2,723 yards rushing which ranks third in school history.

Wachenheim comes to Liberty after spending the previous 12 seasons at Rice, including his last five years as offensive coordinator. Wachenheim helped Rice build a dominant ball-control offense that ranked among the nation's best during his tenure.

During the 2004 season, Rice led the nation in rushing offense (306.5 yards per game), while the Owls' 2003 squad ranked second in the country, racking up a school record of 3,800 rushing yards. In 2001, Wachenheim's direction enabled Rice to break the school record for points scored (333) and total offense (4,846 yards).

Five Flames Honored By Big South

On July 28 the Big South Conference officially kicked off the 2006 football season by hosting its annual Big South Football Media Day in Charlotte, N.C. As part of the yearly ceremony, the conference announced its preseason all-conference teams and the preseason players of the year. Five members of the Flames football program were named to the preseason all-conference squad.

Offensively, sophomore running back/quarterback Zach Terrell, last year's Big South Rookie of the Year, was joined by junior tight end Chris Luck on the preseason all-conference team, which is voted on by the league's head coaches, sports information directors and media panel.

Liberty's defensive selections were led by a pair of senior team captains as defensive lineman Jason Horn and linebacker Manny Rojas were named to the squad. The two elder defensive players were joined by sophomore defensive back Patrick Calvary who had a breakout freshman season for the Flames last year.

Attendance Ranks Among Nation's Best

Liberty currently ranks 13th in the nation in home attendance based upon stadium capacity as the Flames are filling their stadium at 98.89 percent over the first three home games of the year (35,600 fans in total). Liberty also ranks 23rd nationally in total home attendance and 25th in average per home game (11,867). The Big South Conference currently has three teams ranked in the Top 15 nationally in attendance based upon capacity (also Coastal Carolina at third and Charleston Southern at seventh).

Rocco Adds Players From The Next Level

Since taking over the football program last December, head coach Danny Rocco has signed five I-A transfers. A trio of I-A players joined the program last January as running back Rashad Jennings transferred from Pittsburgh, linebacker Stevie Ray Lloyd transferred from Virginia Tech and offensive lineman Zach Davis transferred from East Carolina. Just prior to the start of the season, Rocco added a pair of players he recruited as high school stars as offensive lineman Eddie Pinigis and defensive lineman/linebacker Vince Redd have both transferred from Virginia.

Jennings, Lloyd and Pinigis have each started the first four games of the year, while Davis has seen playing time in three out of four games. Redd is sitting out this year and will be eligible to compete next season.

Overtime Update

The Flames enter today's game having posted a 3-4 record in overtime games, with Liberty's last overtime contest coming against 14th-ranked Coastal Carolina on October 22, 2005. The Flames dropped a heartbreaking, 27-21 decision to the conference foe at Williams Stadium on October 22, 2005, in triple overtime to mark the longest game in school history.

The Flames have only played one overtime game away from Williams Stadium, which was the team's first extra period game, a 34-28 loss at Morgan State on September 21, 1996. Liberty's last victory in an overtime contest came on November 22, 2003, when it closed out the 2003 campaign with a 49-42 win over Hofstra.

Red Zone Report

Entering today's game, the Flames have converted on 16-of-23 Red Zone scoring opportunities (69.9 percent) on the season. Liberty has scored 10 rushing touchdowns, two pass touchdowns and converted on four field goal attempts. The Flames have failed to convert on seven Red Zone scoring chances as they missed five field goals, fumbled the ball once and had a game end inside the Red Zone.

Conversely, Liberty's opponents enter the game having converted on 8-of-11 Red Zone scoring opportunities (72.7 percent). Liberty's opponents have scored four rushing touchdowns, two passing touchdowns and knocked down two field goals. The Flames' opponents have failed to convert inside the 20-yard line three times as they missed a field goal, had a pass intercepted in the end zone and had a half end with possession of the ball in the Red Zone.

Rocco Joins Rutigliano In Elite Group

Danny Rocco became just the second coach in the history of the football program to start his Liberty coaching career with a pair of victories as the Flames picked up victories over St. Paul's and Glenville State to open the season.

The first and only other coach to accomplish the feat was Sam Rutigliano (1989-99). The school's all-time winningest coach started his 11-year tenure at Liberty by winning the first six games of the 1989 campaign. The Flames finished 1989 with a 7-3 overall record and Rutigliano finished his career with a 67-53 coaching record, which included six winning seasons.

Danny Demands Stout Defense

Head coach Danny Rocco spent his previous 22 years of football coaching as an assistant/associate coach at various levels on the defensive side of the field and he is quite proud of his current defensive unit at Liberty.

Liberty enters today's game ranked fourth in the nation in scoring defense as the Flames are allowing an average of 10.83 points per game. The Flames have recorded shutouts in two out of their first four games and are one of just two I-AA teams to have recorded multiple shutouts this year (the other is Cal Poly).

The Flames also rank 30th in rushing defense (114.00 yards per game), 30th in pass efficiency defense (113.88) and 23rd in total defense (277.67 yards per game).

Finally Picking One Up On The Road

The Flames halted a six-game road losing streak on September 23rd with their 28-0 shutout victory over Savannah State. The Flames went winless on the road last year (0-5), while dropping their first road contest of the 2006 season at Towson (10-3). Prior to the victory over Savannah State, Liberty's last road win was in a 43-40 thriller at Chattanooga on November 13, 2005.

Flames Halt I-AA Losing Streak

Liberty halted an 11-game losing streak against I-AA opponents on September 23rd with its win over Savannah State. Last year, the Flames dropped all 10 games against I-AA opponents, while Liberty fell 10-3 the week prior at Towson. Prior to the victory over Savannah State, Liberty's last victory over an I-AA opponent came against Elon, 27-17, in the final game of the 2005 season (Nov. 20).

The Year Of The Cats

The September 23rd game marked the third time this year that the Flames have squared off against a "Tiger" as Savannah State's mascot is the Tigers.

This year, the Flames will square off against four opponents that have feline-related mascots/nicknames as St. Paul's, Towson and Savannah State are the Tigers, while Western Carolina is the Catamounts.

Points Are At A Premium

The Flames have allowed just 65 total points this year in six games, which has the Flames ranked fourth in the nation in scoring defense (10.83 points per game).

The Flames are currently on pace to break the school record for fewest points allowed in a season as Liberty finished the 1979 campaign with a 9-1-1 record thanks in part to allowing just 176 total points (16.0 points per game).

Defense Dominates In First Half

William & Mary became the second team to score on the Flames in the first half of a game last weekend as the Tribe took a lead midway through the second quarter on a three-yard rushing touchdown. The only other team to score on Liberty this year during the first half is Wake Forest as the Demon Deacons scored 27 first half points. Prior to the Wake Forest game, Liberty's first four opponents failed put a single point on the scoreboard during the first 30 minutes of the contest.

Entering today's game, Liberty's best quarter of the season defensively is the first quarter as the Flames have surrendered just 10 total points in the first 15 minutes of the game.

Taking A Look At The Turnovers

The Flames' offense has committed just five turnovers this year as they have fumbled the ball away three times and had two passes intercepted. Liberty's opponents have turned the Flames' six turnovers into 17 points on a pair of touchdowns and a field goal. Equally, Liberty's defense has forced six turnovers as well on two forced fumbles and four interceptions, leading to 14 points on a pair of touchdowns.

Penalties Start To Pile Up

After committing just 21 total penalties over the first four games of the year, Liberty's penalty total has climbed a bit over the last few games. The Flames were whistled for nine infractions during both the Wake Forest and William & Mary games, while Liberty racked up 91 and 85 penalty yards, respectively, against the two teams. Liberty currently ranks third in the Big South in penalty yards as the Flames are averaging 54.0 penalty yards per contest.

Interview Policies

Liberty University head football coach Danny Rocco has requested a 24-hour notice on all interviews, including interviews for himself, members of the coaching staff and the players. Please plan ahead and call the Office of Athletic Media Relations when requesting interviews. All efforts will be made to make sure that the requested individual(s) are available with prior notice.

Preseason camp interview schedule:

Players and coaches are available after each practice session for post-practice interviews for a designated amount of time. If you need to conduct an interview during a different time, please contact the Office of Athletic Media Relations for alternate plans. However, due to the rigorous time schedule of preseason camp, it is requested that every effort be made to conduct following practice sessions.

Regular season interview schedule during game week:

Head coach Danny Rocco, members of the football coaching staff and players are available for interviews Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of game weeks.

Tuesday interviews:

Head coach Danny Rocco will host a weekly media press conference each Tuesday during the season to address the media. The press conference will be held in a designated area in the Williams Football Operations Center. The press conference will start at 1 p.m. and run for 30 minutes.

Requested players and members of the coaching staff can be available for one-on-one interviews following Coach Rocco's weekly press conference. Player/coaching staff interviews will start at 1:30 p.m. and will run for 30 minutes. However, players will not be asked to miss class time or any other academic/team requirements for these interviews.

Wednesday and Thursday interviews:

Head coach Danny Rocco, members of the coaching staff and players will be available after practices on Wednesday and Thursday. If you request an interview, you are advised to arrive at least 15 minutes before the scheduled finish time of practice just in case practice finishes early. Coach Rocco, members of the coaching staff and players will not be held if you are not present at the conclusion of practice.

Postgame interviews:

The Liberty University football locker room is closed to members of the media at all times, both at home and on the road.

Home postgame interviews:

Head coach Danny Rocco and requested players/members of the coaching staff will be available after a brief 10-minute cooling off period after each home game. Interviews will be conducted in a designated area inside of the Williams Football Operation Center, beginning with Coach Rocco followed by requested players/members of the coaching staff. Media members will be escorted down onto the field by a member of the Athletic Media Relations staff with approximately five minutes left in the fourth quarter. After the team leaves the playing field and enters the locker room, a member of the Athletic Media Relations staff will escort the media to the designated interview area.

Road postgame interviews:

Head coach Danny Rocco and requested players/members of the coaching staff will be available after a brief 10-minute cooling off period after each road game. Coach Rocco and requested players/member of the coaching staff will be available for interviews outside of the locker room or in a designated interview area (if one is available). A member of the Athletic Media Relations staff will escort the members of the media to the designated interview area.

Hurrying Up The Hurler

Despite playing without Jason Horn, who ranks fifth nationally in sacks per game, Liberty still managed to find its way to William & Mary's quarterbacks as the Flames tied a season high with seven quarterback hurries last weekend. Manny Rojas tallied a career-high four quarterback hurries, while Brandon Duke, Kevin Richard and Tyler Turner added a quarterback hurry each. The Flames currently rank second in the Big South in QB hurries as Liberty is averaging 2.8 hurries per contest. Gardner-Webb leads the league as the Bulldogs are averaging 5.8 hurries a game.

Keeping The Quarterback Clean

Liberty enters today's game ranked tied for 16th in the nation in total sacks allowed as Liberty's opponents have recorded just six sacks over the first six games (1.00 per game). Liberty has finished three games without allowing a sack this year (St. Paul's, Glenville State and Savannah State) and Wake Forest finished with an opponent season-high three sacks on September 30th.

Keeping It Close Against The Conference

Even though Liberty finished last season 0-4 in Big South Conference action, the Flames still finished the year just 17 points shy of winning a league title. Liberty lost its four conference games by a combined 17 points last year (101-84). The Flames dropped a pair of games by three points (10-7 to VMI and 43-40 to Charleston Southern), by five points to Gardner-Webb (21-16) and by six points to Coastal Carolina (27-21 in triple overtime).

Sacking Sensation

The William & Mary game was the first time this season that Liberty has failed to record a quarterback sack in a game. Liberty finished the first four games of the year with three sacks in each game and the Wake Forest game with a single sack. Liberty currently ranks 27th nationally in sacks per game by averaging 2.17 sacks per contest.

Senior defensive lineman Jason Horn individually ranks fifth in the nation as he is averaging 1.00 sacks per contest. However, the Flames will have to continue to step up the defensive pressure if Liberty wants to break the school record as the 1990 squad finished the year with a program-best 40 sacks.

Batting Them Back

Liberty currently ranks first in the Big South Conference in pass breakups as the Flames have tallied a league-best 23 deflections over the first six games (3.8 per game). The stat is a total team accomplishment as Liberty has just two of the top 10 pass defenders in the Big South. On the season, 12 different players have broken up a pass with E.L. Estes and Patrick Calvary leading the way with four breakups each.

Racking Up The Rushing Yards

The Flames finished the William & Mary game with a season-high 315 rushing yards last weekend, marking the team's highest rushing total since Liberty ran for 339 yards against VMI on November 6, 2004. Liberty has now posted at least one 300 rushing yard game per year for four-straight seasons and eight times over the last four years. The rushing total moved the Flames up to 13th nationally in team rushing yards per game as Liberty is averaging 217.17 yards per contest on the ground.

Approaching The Millennium Mark

Wynton Jackson led all Liberty receivers against William & Mary last Saturday with five catches for 51 yards, leaving the junior just 23 yards short of 1,000 career receiving yards as he has caught 79 career passes for 977 receiving yards. Three weeks ago, Jackson's fellow wide receiver Brandon Turner surpassed the 1,000 career receiving mark as he stands with 1,002 career receiving yards.

Manny Ties Conference Record

Manny Rojas led the Flames as he tied a season high with nine tackles against William & Mary last Saturday, giving him 308 career tackles which ties the previous Big South Conference career record held by VMI's Justin Haggard and Todd Baldwin. Coastal Carolina's linebacker Jamar Leath finished the VMI game last weekend with 13 tackles and currently holds the conference record with 321 career tackles.

Rojas also led the Flames with a career-high four quarterback hurries, giving the linebacker five quarterback hurries on the year which ranks third in the Big South Conference.

Rashad On The Run

Rashad Jennings posted his second-best rushing total of the year with 186 yards on 22 carries (8.5 average), doing all the damage in just over two quarters as he was injured on his first carry of the third quarter last Saturday. Jennings' only rush of the third quarter was a 62-yard run that helped put the Flames in scoring position to take a lead. The 62-yard scamper was the longest non-touchdown run in Big South Conference history. Jennings' 186 rushing yards moved him up two spots nationally as the sophomore now ranks 11th in the country in rushing yards per game (127.2).

Fewer Yards Through The Air

After seeing the Flames' aerial attack slowly increase for four-straight games, Liberty saw a dramatic fall off against William & Mary as just 71 of the team's 386 yards (18.3 percent) came via the passing game. Brock Smith and Zach Terrell combined to pass for 71 yards as the two hurlers completed a combined 8-of-15 pass attempts. Liberty currently ranks fourth in the Big South in passing yards per game as the Flames are averaging 120.8 yards per game.

Total Team Effort

The Flames have the stingiest defense in the Big South and the fourth best in the nation which is a credit to Liberty's entire defense unit and not just one player. The Flames currently have just two players rank in the Top 10 of the conference in tackles (Stevie Ray Lloyd at seventh and Manny Rojas at 10th) and just five players all together in the league's Top 25 tacklers.

Finding The End Zone

Rashad Jennings leads the Flames and the Big South Conference in scoring as the running back has found the end zone eight times this year with all eight coming on rushing touchdowns. Jennings currently ranks 23rd in the nation in scoring as he is averaging 8.00 points per contest.

On The Mend

For the second-straight week, the Flames will be without the services of senior defensive lineman Jason Horn who suffered a fractured fibula in his left leg during practice leading up to the William & Mary game.

Jason Horn currently leads the Big South in tackles for a loss and sacks as the senior has recorded 7.5 tackles for a loss (44 yards) and 5.0 sacks (40 yards) over the first five games of the year. The defensive lineman currently ranks fifth nationally in sacks (1.00 per game) and sixth in tackles for a loss (1.70 per game). Horn has recorded a tackle for a loss in four out of five games this year (no TFL against Savannah State) and a sack in three out of five games (two against St. Paul's and Glenville State and one against Wake Forest).

Liberty University first-year head coach Danny Rocco started his head coaching career off with a resounding 27-0 shutout victory over visiting St. Paul's at Williams Stadium in the annual Western Virginia Educational Classic.

The contest marked the 15th time in school history that Liberty has shut out an opponent and the first time since October 28, 2000, when Liberty handed visiting Samford a 24-0 loss at Williams Stadium.

After the contest, Total Action Against Poverty, a non-profit organization that is based out of Roanoke and who sponsored the Classic, named Liberty's Rashad Jennings the game's offensive MVP as he rushed for 160 yards on 25 carries and scored twice, while St. Paul's Clinton Gee was named the game's defensive MVP as he finished with a game-high 11 tackles.

The game, which was played in front of an impressive crowd of 8,546 fans despite a steady rain throughout the evening, remained scoreless until midway through the first quarter as six-straight rushing attempts set up Jennings for a three-yard run up the middle to give Liberty a 7-0 lead with 9:50 left to play in the first quarter.

The two teams traded two sets of possessions over the remainder of the quarter and the score remained the same until midway through the second as Ben Beasley knocked through a 27-yard field goal to push Liberty's lead to 10-0 with 4:57 left before halftime. The scoring drive consisted of nine-straight rushing attempts that ate up 5:37 on the game clock.

After forcing the Tigers to punt six plays later, Wynton Jackson put the Flames in prime field possession as he returned the punt 46 yards to St. Paul's 32-yard line.

A 29-yard sideline pass from Brock Smith to Brandon Turner put the Flames back at the Tiger's three-yard line. And Liberty was able to push the ball across the goal line with a second three-yard score this time by Zach Terrell with 57 seconds left to play in the half.

But Zac Kolegue had his 34-consecutive PAT streak, the third longest in school history, come to an end as the junior missed the kick wide to the left, leaving the score at 16-0 at halftime.

Liberty took the opening kick of the second half and continued to stick to its rushing game as eight-straight rushing attempts by Jennings and Terrell resulted in another score. Jennings took a hand off from Terrell for a one-yard run up the middle to cap off a 60-yard drive and push the Flames' advantage to 22-0 after Beasley's PAT was blocked at the 9:31 mark of the third quarter.

After a pair of three-and-out series, Beasley was able to pin the Tigers deep in their own territory with a 34-yard punt to the St. Paul's 12-yard line. Two plays later, back-up quarterback Michael Garrison intentionally grounded a pass in the end zone to avoid a sack, giving Liberty another two points by virtue of the sack.

With most of its reserve players in the game, Liberty managed to tack on three additional points mid-way through the fourth quarter as Beasley capped off a seven-play, 33-yard drive with a 32-yard field goal at 9:11 in the fourth quarter to give Liberty's its final 27-0 margin of victory.

The Flames' power rushing attack and new 3-4 defense proved to be a winning combination in the contest as Liberty rushed for 274 yards on 50 carries (5.5 average yards per carry). On the defensive side of the ball, Liberty allowed the Tigers just 57 total offensive yards on 40 plays, while St. Paul's got the ball their the one 35-yard line three times during the game to mark the best field position of the contest.

For the second-straight game, the Flames rushed their way to a victory as Rashad Jennings rushed for three scores and Zach Terrell added another to lead Liberty to a 31-7 victory over Glenville State in front of 11,423 fans.

Liberty quickly moved down the field on the opening drive of the game as the Flames capped off the seven-play, 77-yard drive with a 24-yard run to the right by Jennings for a score at the 11:50 mark of the first quarter. Besides the Jennings' run, the drive was highlighted by a 22-yard rush by fullback Chris Stokes and an 18-yard slant pass from Brock Smith to Wynton Jackson. The score remained the same until late in the first quarter when Ben Beasley connected on a 25-yard field goal with 67 seconds left to finish off a six-play, 31-yard drive and give Liberty a 10-0 lead.

Three plays into the ensuing drive, linebacker Stevie Ray Lloyd picked off a pass from Glenville State's Mike Williams, giving the Flames possession of the ball at the Pioneers' 31-yard line. Two plays later, Jennings found a hole up the middle and dashed 30 yards to the end zone for his second touchdown of the evening at the 13:53 mark of the second quarter, extending the Liberty lead to 17-0.

Later in the quarter, the Flames mounted their final scoring drive of the half with Jennings getting the call for the third time. The sophomore rushed up the middle on a three-yard scoring play to give Liberty a 24-0 lead with 1:39 left before halftime.

Glenville State threatened to break Liberty's scoreless streak in the final 90 seconds of the first half as the Pioneers quickly moved down the field thanks to Williams completing 4-of-5 pass attempts for 67 yards, including a 19-yarder to Tavon McGee to get to the Liberty three-yard line with four seconds left. However, a Williams slant pass to McGee in the corner of the end zone was broken up by Patrick Calvary to preserve the shutout as time ran out. After holding the Pioneers to just 14 yards on nine plays on the opening drive of the second half, Jackson returned a punt 25 yards to midfield to give Liberty its first possession of the third quarter.

Smith completed a 21-yard sideline pass to Dominic Bolden, followed by four more rushing plays by the rushing tandem of Jennings and Terrell, with Terrell getting the call on a six-yard run to the right at the 6:45 mark to give Liberty a 31-0 lead.

The Flames entered the fourth quarter attempting to post back-to-back shutouts for the first time since 1974; however, the Pioneers put together a nine-play 55-yard drive; capped off by a six-yard scoring pass play from Williams to McGee. On a fourth-and-goal play, Williams was able to find McGee amongst a large group of Liberty defenders, cutting Liberty's lead to 31-7 with 12:18 in the contest to give the game its final score.

Jennings finished the game with 15 carries for 161 yards and three touchdowns, while averaging 10.7 yards per attempt. Jennings becomes the first player since Sam Gado in 2004 to post back-to-back 100-yard games, while Gado was also the last player to rush for three scores in a game against VMI on November 6, 2004.

Terrell followed with eight carries for 53 yards and a touchdown, while the Flames finished the contest with 275 yards, one more yard than Liberty's 274 in its season opener against St. Paul's. Smith posted a much better performance in his second game of the year as the sophomore quarterback completed 11-of-16 pass attempts for 112 yards.

Jackson led six different Liberty pass catchers as the junior finished the game with five receptions for 49 yards, while Nick Hursky led the Flames' defense in total tackles with 10 stops and Jason Horn posted his second-straight impressive outing with nine tackles, 2.5 tackles for a loss (12 yards), 2.0 sacks (12 yards), a quarterback hurry and a punt block.

Neither team was able to fully get its offense on track throughout the whole game; however, Towson scored just enough to remain undefeated on the year and hand the Flames their first loss in a 10-3 Tigers' victory at Unitas Stadium.

The first half of the game proved to be a defensive stalemate as the two teams combined for just 144 yards of total offense on 53 total plays with neither team putting points on the scoreboard. Liberty finished the half with 63 yards on 29 plays, while the Tigers tallied 81 yards on 24 plays. Liberty punted the ball seven times, while the Tigers punted five times and turned the ball over on downs after a failed fourth-down conversion attempt. The Flames recorded their initial first down of the game with 4:45 left to play in the second quarter as Zach Terrell completed a 14-yard pass play to Dominic Bolden over the middle on a third-and-eight play.

The 14-yard pickup somewhat sparked the Flames' offense as Liberty mounted its longest drive of the game. An 11-play, 38-yard drive that used up 6:57 on the game clock got the Flames to the Towson 42-yard line before Liberty recorded its seventh punt of the first half. The furthest the Tigers advanced the ball was to Liberty's 34-yard line early in the second quarter. The Tigers finally broke the scoreless streak on the opening drive of the third quarter as Sean Schaefer completed an eight-yard slant pass to Demetrius Harrison at the 9:20 mark, accounting for the junior wide receiver's first touchdown reception of the year and the second of his career.

The scoring drive of 13 plays and 79 yards that used up 5:31 on the game clock was kept alive by a key fourth down conversion as Schaefer completed a 16-yard pass to Eric Yancey that put the Tigers at Liberty's 19-yard line.

Liberty advanced the ball to midfield on its first drive of the second half, but once again was forced to punt the ball away. Ben Beasley seemed to pin the Tigers deep in their own territory as his 51-yard punt put the Tigers at their own nine-yard line; however, Yancey returned the punt for 35 yards.

On the first play of the drive, Schaefer found Paul Perry open for a 44-yard reception to the Liberty 12-yard line, giving the Tigers the momentum. After an attempted rush up the middle, Schaefer found Daryon Arnold open in the corner of the endzone for an apparent second touchdown, but the wideout was flagged for offensive pass interference to negate the score. Liberty's defense took advantage of the second chance as three plays later, the Tigers were forced to attempt a 41-yard field goal and Chris Desautels' attempt from the center of the field fell considerably short to leave the score at 7-0 at the end of the third quarter.

After a three-and-out series to start the fourth quarter forced the Tigers to punt the ball, Liberty put together its second-longest drive of the day and cut into the lead as Beasley connected on a 27-yard field goal with 9:37 left to play in the contest to cap off a 10-play, 49-yard scoring drive. Towson pushed its lead back to seven points on the ensuing drive as Towson capped off a 13-play, 79-yard drive that ate up 5:19 of the game clock with a 30-yard field goal by Desautels with 4:07 remaining in the ball game.

A 32-yard kickoff return by Wynton Jackson on the ensuing drive gave the Flames prime field position with just under four minutes to play. Brock Smith completed a 26-yard pass play to Rashad Jennings on the first play, while passes to Darnell Edwards (12 yards) and Turner (eight yards) helped the Flames move to Towson's 15-yard line.

After a four-yard gain on a draw play by Jennings, Smith completed a slant pass to Turner, but the junior was struck by Tony Lumpkin and coughed up the ball at the 12-yard line, while Richard Lee recovered the lost fumble to seal the victory for the home team.

For the second time this season, Rashad Jennings rushed for three touchdowns in a game and the Flames recorded a shutout victory as Liberty posted a 28-0 road victory over Savannah State at Ted Wright Stadium.

The Flames wasted little time getting on the scoreboard as the two teams traded three-and-out possessions, while Ben Beasley pinned the Tigers deep inside their own territory as his 29-yard punt gave Savannah State possession on its own nine-yard line.

On the first play of the ensuing drive, Quinton Beasley was given the ball and the tailback got outside the tackles; however, linebacker Manny Rojas was able to strip the ball from the running back and Ryan Greiser recovered the miscue on the six-yard line.

On the next play, Brock Smith handled the ball to Jennings and the tailback found a hole up the middle, leading to his team-leading sixth rushing touchdown of the year and first of the evening to give Liberty a 7-0 lead with 10:54 left to play in the first quarter.

The score remained the same until early in the second quarter when Liberty looked like it was going to have to give up the ball after being held; however, Beasley was struck by Charles Huggins on the punt attempt, giving Liberty new life after the roughing the kicker penalty at its own 47-yard line.

And the Flames made the Tigers pay for their second mistake of the contest as Jennings got outside on the left side of the field and found an opening that enabled him to score his second rushing touchdown of the night. The 53-yard touchdown run gave Liberty a 14-0 lead at 11:10 in the second quarter and was his longest run since joining the program.

Liberty looked like it was going to add to its lead late in the second quarter as a 25-yard run by Jennings got the Flames down to the Tigers' one-yard line. However, after a pair of penalties pushed the Flames back to the 20-yard line, Liberty had to settle for a field goal attempt, but Beasley pushed the 25-yard attempt wide left, leaving the score at 14-0 at halftime. That marked the fourth-straight game that Liberty has held its opponent scoreless in the first half.

Liberty came out of the locker room and put together a solid scoring drive on the first drive of the third quarter as the Flames capped off a seven-play, 86-yard drive that used up 3:34 on the clock. Zach Terrell found an opening on the outside for his third rushing touchdown of the year, a three-yard quarterback keeper, as the score pushed Liberty's lead to 21-0 at the 11:01 mark of the third quarter.

The Flames increased their lead to 28 points, 28-0, on the third play of the fourth quarter as Jennings broke through the middle of the line for a three-yard score, his third of the evening, with 13:41 left to play in the game. The scoring opportunity was set up by a 45-yard pass play from Terrell to Brandon Turner to get Liberty inside the Tigers' 10-yard line and helped set up the final score of the game.

The Tigers dominated time of possession with a near eight-minute advantage (33:56 - 26:04); however, the Flames' bend but don't break defense kept Liberty in the game. Liberty has allowed just 17 total points over the first four games of the season, marking the best four-game defensive span in school history as the previous record was 25 points over four games in 1974. Since making the move to Division I play, the best four game span is 34 points in 1988.

Jennings finished the night with 194 yards on 21 carries, averaging 9.2 yards per carry and three scores. The 194 yards ties him with Kim Raynor for the 27th-best single-game rushing performance in school history as Raynor rushed for 194 yards against Ferrum on November 3, 1979.

The Demon Deacons opened up a 20-point lead in the first half and played solid defense in the second en route to a 34-14 Homecoming victory over visiting Liberty in front of 29,623 people at Groves Stadium.

Wake Forest wasted little time getting on the scoreboard as Riley Swanson picked off a Brock Smith sideline pass at the Liberty 44-yard line on the third play of the contest.

Liberty held the Demon Deacons to just seven yards on the ensuing drive, forcing Wake Forest to attempt a lengthy field goal which Sam Swank hit as the 52-yard field goal gave the home team a 3-0 lead at the 11:59 mark. The field goal marked the first time this season that a team has scored on the Flames in the first half.

After a three-and-out series by Liberty, the Demon Deacons added to their advantage on the second play of the next drive as Kevin Harris found a hole on the outside and scampered 27 yards for a touchdown, giving Wake Forest a 10-0 lead with 9:07 left to play in the first quarter.

The score remained the same until early in the second when the Deacons capped off a seven-play, 91-yard drive with a second touchdown run by Harris. The tailback rushed seven yards over the left tackle to give Wake Forest a 17-0 edge with 13:08 left to play before halftime.

The Flames started to settle down in the second quarter as Liberty pieced together an 11-play, 81-yard scoring drive capped off by a pass from Smith to Darnell Edwards in the corner of the end zone. The scoring drive was kept alive by a 23-yard gain by Wynton Jackson as the wide out caught a sideline screen pass on a third-and-three play earlier in the drive.

The nine-yard touchdown marked the first time that Wake Forest had given up a touchdown in seven quarters, trimming the lead to 17-7 with 8:43 left before halftime.

The Demon Deacons added three more points to their lead on the next drive as Swank knocked down a 37-yard field goal with 5:38 left to play in the second quarter to finish off a eight-play, 51-yard drive.

After a Liberty drive ended at middle field, which was aided by a 41-yard reception by Brandon Turner, Wake Forest regained possession. And the home team thrilled the Homecoming crowd with seven more points before the intermission as Riley Skinner found Nate Morton open for a 59-yard touchdown reception to give Wake Forest a 27-7 lead heading into the locker room.

Neither team was able to find the scoreboard during the third quarter as the teams traded a combined five possessions between them during the scoreless quarter (three by Wake Forest and two by Liberty).

The score remained the same until the Demon Deacons put together their longest drive of the day as they capped off a 10-play, 54-yard drive with a three-run yard by De'Angelo Bryant with 6:30 left to play, pushing Wake Forest's lead to 34-7.

However, the Flames kept things interesting as Liberty answered right back on the ensuing drive as Smith completed 5-of-6 pass attempts to lead the Flames down the field. Liberty finished off the drive with Smith and Edwards hooking up for the second time on the game on a six-yard pass to the corner of the end zone at 2:10 to give the game its final margin.

Rashad Jennings was held to just 35 yards on 19 carries on the day, his second fewest rushing yards since joining the program, while Zach Terrell rushed for 20 yards on four carries. Wake Forest rushed for 196 yards on the afternoon with Harris leading the team with 77 yards on eight carries and the two rushing touchdowns.

Visiting William & Mary survived three missed field goals and blocked an extra point attempt en route to a 14-13 victory over Liberty at Williams Stadium in front of a record-setting 15,631 fans for the Flames' Homecoming game.

With the victory, the Tribe ups its record to 2-4 on the season and the loss evens Liberty's record at 3-3. The crowd marked the largest home attendance in school history, surpassing the previous record of 12,623 fans that saw Liberty pick up a 28-21 overtime victory over Charleston Southern on Homecoming Weekend in 1998 (Oct. 3).

Liberty had the chance to jump out to an early lead on its opening drive of the game as the Flames marched 70 yards down the field, but Ben Beasley pushed a 30-yard field goal wide right at the 7:36 mark of the first quarter.

William & Mary also looked like it was going to score on its opening drive of the game as the Tribe moved the ball 78 yards on 16 plays. However, Jake Phillips' attempted pass on a third-and-goal play was picked off by E.L. Estes in the end zone, keeping the game scoreless.

On the ensuing drive, the Flames gave William & Mary the ball back in excellent field position after a Brock Smith pass was intercepted by Alan Wheeling at the 50-yard line and returned to Liberty's 37. And William & Mary made good on the turnover as six plays later Elijah Brooks rushed up the middle for a three-yard score to give William & Mary 7-0 lead with 8:27 left to play before halftime.

Liberty answered back on the following drive as 14 of the drive's 15 plays were of the rushing variety with the only pass play coming on an 11-yard reception by Dominic Bolden on a fourth-and-four play to keep the drive alive.

After four-straight rushing plays by Rashad Jennings, quarterback Zach Terrell kept the ball himself for a one-yard score on a draw play just 55 seconds before halftime. However, Zac Kolegue's point-after attempt was blocked by Cortenous Herbert, allowing the Tribe to maintain a 7-6 lead at the intermission.

After holding William & Mary on a three-and-out series to start the third quarter, Jennings found an opening on the far side of the field for a 62-yard gain, giving Liberty the ball on the William & Mary 13-yard line. The play proved to be costly, though, as the redshirt sophomore running back was injured on the play and didn't return to the field the remainder of the game.

Despite the injury, Liberty took advantage of the gain and three plays later, Terrell found a hole on the left side of the line for a six-yard scamper into the end zone. Terrell's second rushing touchdown of the game gave Liberty a 13-7 lead at the 10:57 mark.

William & Mary quickly answered on the ensuing drive by capping off an eight-play, 74-yard drive with a five-yard run up the middle by Brooks, his second touchdown of the day, allowing the visitors to regain the lead, 14-13, with 5:50 left to play in the third.

Liberty got inside the Red Zone again on its next drive by advancing to the 18-yard line, but Beasley's 35-yard field goal attempt was blocked by Travis McLaurin, allow the Tribe to maintain its one-point advantage.

Liberty's defense held strong in the fourth quarter with a pair of three-and-out drives to set up the Flames' next scoring chance. Coach Danny Rocco's offense methodically marched down the field on 17 plays, reaching the W&M 20-yard line. But Beasley missed his third field goal try of the afternoon as his 37-yard attempt sailed wide right with 2:07 on the game clock, ending the Flames' chances for a victory.

Liberty won most of the statistical battles of the day as the Flames outgained the Tribe, 386 to 265 yards in total offense, 315 to 170 yards rushing and 36:01 to 23:59 in the time of possession battle.
