The Game

The Virginia Military Institute Keydets (1-9, 0-3 Big South) host the Liberty University Flames (5-5, 1-2 Big South) in a Big South Conference tilt at Alumni Memorial Field (9,000) in Lexington, Va., on November 18, 2006. Kickoff is set for 1 p.m. (EST).

Scouting The Keydets

VMI enters its final game of the year with a 1-9 record and a 0-3 mark against Big South Conference opponents. The Keydets have dropped nine-straight games which ranks as the second-longest active losing streak in the nation amongst I-AA teams.

Running back Sean Mizzer leads the team and ranks second in the Big South Conference as he has rushed for 851 yards and seven touchdowns. Quarterback Jonathan Wilson has completed 49.5 percent of his pass attempts for 759 yards (45-of-91) and five touchdowns. Middle linebacker Patrick McKinney leads VMI's defensive efforts with a team-best 74 tackles, including 34 solo stops and 40 assisted tackles. McKinney is the leading freshman tackler in the Big South Conference, while ranking sixth overall in tackles per game (7.4) in the league.

Battling In The Big South

This season marks the Flames' fifth year of competition in the Big South Conference for football. Since starting league play in 2002, Liberty has posted a combined 8-10 conference record with a pair of second-place league finishes (2003 and 2004).

Holding Home Field

Liberty ended its home season with a 4-2 record at Williams Stadium this year. Over the Flames' 17-year history of playing football at the on-campus facility, Liberty has finished 14 years with a .500 or better record and a 60-27 overall record (69.0 winning percentage).

Williams Stadium - Home Of The Flames

This year marks the Flames' 17th season of competition in Williams Stadium. Prior to the 1989 season, Liberty played its home games at Lynchburg's City Stadium.

Liberty holds a 60-27 record at the on-campus facility (69.0 winning percentage), and started competition in the venue with a 37-18 victory over Towson on October 21, 1989. The Flames have posted 14 winning seasons at home over the last 17 years, including a perfect 5-0 record during the 1992 campaign.

Fancy New Field For The Flames

The Flames faithful noticed quite a few new items during Liberty's game against St. Paul's on August 31, but one of the most noticeable things that will jump out at people entering the stadium is Liberty's new playing surface.

During the summer, the Athletics Department made a concerted effort to upgrade several athletics facilities, including a new playing surface at Williams Stadium. State-of-the-art FieldTurf was installed at Williams Stadium, replacing the old AstroTurf that had been used since the opening of the facility in 1989.

FieldTurf is the latest innovation in artificial playing surfaces and is the surface of choice for 24 NFL stadiums, including Ford Field where Super Bowl XL was played last February, and at over 40 NCAA stadiums across the country.

Three Flames' Tacklers Tally 100 Career Tackles

The Flames graduated three defenders last year that were members of the Flames' 100 career tackle club with C.J. Moore leading the way as he finished his career with 282 career stops. Following the defensive back in the 100 career tackle club were linebacker Kenneth Kemp (163 career tackles) and fellow defensive back Shane Lancaster (162 career stops).

Entering today's game, Liberty has three players on its active roster with more than 100 career tackles, including senior linebacker Manny Rojas, who leads the squad with 340 career stops. Rojas finished 2005 with a career-high 102 tackles. Brandon Duke joined the club against Savannah State and now has 128 career tackles. Steve Ackley joined the group against Gardner-Webb and now has 115 career tackles.

On the verge of joining Rojas, Duke and Ackley in the elite club are defensive lineman Jason Horn (89 career tackles) and linebacker Nick Hursky (93 career tackles).

Forecast For Winning Season Looks Good

This year marks the seventh time in the history of the football program that Liberty has started a campaign with a 2-0 record, a fact which bodes well for a possible winning season. In five out of six seasons in which Liberty has started the year with a 2-0 record, the Flames have gone on to post an overall winning record. The only time that Liberty has failed to finish a year above the .500 mark after a 2-0 start was in 1975 when Liberty won its first three games, but finished the year with a 4-5 record.

WOW - What Wonderful Crowds

The excitement of a new brand of Flames' football is quickly growing. Evidence of the excitement has repeatedly been seen in this year's attendance figures as three of Liberty's four home games rank in the Top 15 in the school's attendance annals.

On October 14, the Flames set a Liberty and Big South record as 15,631 fans saw the Flames battle in-state opponent William & Mary in the school's annual Homecoming game. One week later, Liberty filled the stadium once again as 12,056 people saw Liberty open Big South Conference play against Gardner-Webb, marking the sixth-largest crowd in school history.

Larger home crowds have proven to be an advantage for the Flames as Liberty has posted a 12-9 record in Williams Stadium home games where 10,000 or more fans have attended. In 1998, Liberty had three games in which it accumulated 10,000 fans, while four years saw crowds of 10,000 fans assemble at Williams Stadium twice.

Noting The Attendance Numbers

Liberty recorded a school and Big South Conference record for home attendance on October 14 as 15,631 fans saw the Flames' Homecoming game against William & Mary. The following week, Liberty had 12,056 fans attend the Flames' conference opener against Gardner-Webb, marking the sixth-highest attendance in school history and the third most in league history.

Liberty's previous school record for highest home attendance was 12,623 against Charleston Southern (October 3, 1998) and the previous conference high was the 12,273 fans that saw Liberty's come-from-behind victory over VMI (October 4, 2003).

Liberty now holds nine of the Top 10 single-game attendance figures in Big South Conference history, including the top eight tallies.

Attendance Ranks Among Nation's Best

Liberty currently ranks 14th in the nation in home attendance based upon stadium capacity as the Flames filled their stadium at 92.73 percent over their six home games of the year (66,765 fans in total). Liberty also ranks 15th nationally in total home attendance and 29th in average attendance per home game (11,128).

The Big South Conference currently has three teams ranked in the Top 15 nationally in attendance based upon capacity (also Coastal Carolina at fourth and Charleston Southern at sixth).

The Coaches

Liberty University Head Coach Danny Rocco is just the second coach in school history to start his Flames coaching career off with a 2-0 record after wins over St. Paul's and Glenville State, while the first-year head coach enters today's game with a 4-5 overall record at Liberty. Rocco came to Liberty after a five-year stint at Virginia, including the last three years as associate head coach. The remainder of Rocco's 22-year assistant coaching career includes stints at Maryland, Texas, Boston College, Tulsa, Colorado, Wake Forest and with the NFL's New York Jets.

VMI is under the direction of first-year head coach Jim Reid who has posted a 1-9 record with the Keydets this year. Reid is a veteran of the coaching ranks as he has posted an 85-91-3 record over 16 years as a head coaching, including stints at Massachusetts (1986-1991) and Richmond (1995-2003).

The Series

This will mark the fifth-straight season that the Flames and the Keydets have squared off against each other on the gridiron and the sixth time overall ... the Keydets enter the game holding a 3-2 edge in the overall series after picking up a 10-7 victory over the Flames in Liberty's Homecoming game last year ... in their last meeting at Alumni Memorial Stadium, Liberty picked up a 38-17 victory over VMI ... the game marked an historic occasion in school history as Dre Barnes became the school's all-time leading rusher as a 32-yard scamper down the right side of the field helped the senior surpass Stacy's Nobles previous record of 3,711 yards rushing ... in 2004 at Williams Stadium, Liberty posted one of the most dramatic comebacks in school history as the Flames recorded four fourth quarter rushing touchdowns to pick up a 31-28 Big South victory over the Keydets on October 4 ... in the first-ever meeting in 1995, the Flames entered the fourth quarter with a 10-point advantage, however, the Keydets reeled off 29-unanswered points to prevent the Flames from taking home the road victory ... in 2002, VMI posted its highest rushing total since 1996 with 338 yards en route to a 24-point victory despite Dre Barnes becoming just the ninth player in school history to rush for 200 yards in a game with a career-high 202 yards on the afternoon.

Natural Versus Artificial Surfaces

Under head coach Danny Rocco, the Flames are 4-4 on artificial turf and 1-1 on natural grass. Overall, Liberty is 93-106-4 on natural grass and 65-72 on artificial turf. The Flames play their home games at Williams Stadium, which has an artificial surface as new state-of-the-art FieldTurf was installed prior to the start of the 2006 season. Liberty has posted a 4-2 record at home since the new surface was installed.

Four Fearless Leaders

During halftime of Liberty's annual spring game on April 29, head coach Danny Rocco introduced his new player leadership group as he named Jason Horn, Rashad Jennings, Manny Rojas and Jarrett Winfrey as 2006 team captains.

Senior Jarrett Winfrey helps to anchor Liberty's offensive line, while newcomer Rashad Jennings adds some excitement to the Flames' offense at tailback in Liberty's new two-back offensive set.

On the defensive side of the ball, senior Jason Horn leads the Flames' defensive line, while linebacker Manny Rojas returns for his fifth year with the program and serves as the Flames' leader at linebacker.

Overtime Update

The Flames enter today's game having posted a 3-4 record in overtime games, with Liberty's last overtime contest coming against 14th-ranked Coastal Carolina on October 22, 2005. The Flames dropped a heartbreaking, 27-21 decision to the conference foe at Williams Stadium on October 22, 2005, in triple overtime to mark the longest game in school history.

The Flames have only played one overtime game away from Williams Stadium, which was the team's first extra period game, a 34-28 loss at Morgan State on September 21, 1996. Liberty's last victory in an overtime contest came on November 22, 2003, when it closed out the 2003 campaign with a 49-42 win over Hofstra.

Red Zone Report

Entering today's game, the Flames have converted on 27-of-36 Red Zone scoring opportunities (75.0 percent) on the season. Liberty has scored 18 rushing touchdowns, two passing touchdowns and has converted on seven field goal attempts. The Flames have failed to convert on nine Red Zone scoring chances as they missed five field goals, had two passes intercepted, fumbled the ball once and had a half end inside the Red Zone.

Conversely, Liberty's opponents enter the game having converted on 14-of-20 Red Zone scoring opportunities (70.0 percent). Liberty's opponents have scored six rushing touchdowns, six passing touchdowns and two field goals. The Flames' opponents have failed to convert inside the 20-yard line six times as they missed a field goal, turned the ball over on downs twice, had a pass intercepted in the end zone and had two halves end with possession of the ball in the Red Zone.

Rocco Joins Rutigliano In Elite Group

Danny Rocco became just the second coach in the history of the football program to start his Liberty coaching career with a pair of victories as the Flames picked up victories over St. Paul's and Glenville State to open the season.

The first and only other coach to accomplish the feat was Sam Rutigliano (1989-99). The school's all-time winningest coach started his 11-year tenure at Liberty by winning the first six games of the 1989 campaign. The Flames finished 1989 with a 7-3 overall record and Rutigliano finished his career with a 67-53 coaching record, which included six winning seasons.

Danny Demands Stout Defense

Head coach Danny Rocco spent his previous 22 years of football coaching as an assistant/associate coach at various levels on the defensive side of the field and he is quite proud of his current defensive unit at Liberty.

Liberty enters today's game ranked ninth in the nation in scoring defense as the Flames are allowing an average of 14.00 points per game. The Flames recorded shutouts in three out of 10 games and are the only I-AA program to have recorded three shutouts in 2006.

The Flames also rank 17th in rushing defense (110.20 yards per game), 45th in pass efficiency defense (119.08) and 30th in total defense (298.50 yards per game).

Points Are At A Premium

The Flames have allowed just 140 total points this year in 10 games, which has the Flames ranked ninth in the nation in scoring defense (14.00 points per game).

The Flames are currently on pace to break the school record for fewest points allowed in a season as Liberty finished the 1979 campaign with a 9-1-1 record thanks in part to allowing just 176 total points (16.0 points per game).

Still A Young Group

Last weekend marked Senior Day at Liberty as the Charleston Southern contest was Liberty's final home game of the year. Prior to kickoff, the Flames honored nine seniors, marking one of the smallest senior classes in recent history. Liberty has a very young roster this year as 68.1 percent of the team's roster is underclassmen. The Flames roster consists of nine seniors, 19 juniors, 24 sophomores and 36 freshmen.

Defense Dominates In First Half

Western Carolina was the sixth team this year that Liberty has held scoreless during the first 30 minutes of the game as the Catamounts joined St. Paul's, Glenville State, Towson, Savannah State and Gardner-Webb as teams that failed to score on Liberty in the first half. Entering today's game, Liberty has allowed a total of 48 points during the first 30 minutes of the game with 17 points coming in the first quarter and 31 in the second.

Finishing Up Strong

Over the history of the Flames' football program, Liberty has posted a 45-41 record during the month of November. The 11th month of the year has been especially kind to Liberty of late as the Flames finished the month undefeated two out of the last three seasons. Liberty closed out the 2003 and 2004 seasons on a pair of four-game winning streaks.

Flames Against The Best

Last weekend, the Flames picked up their eighth win over a nationally-ranked I-AA team in the history of the program as Liberty downed 24th-ranked Charleston Southern, 34-20. The win gave Liberty its first victory over a nationally-ranked team in 18 tries as Liberty's last win over a ranked team was a 25-19 victory over 15th-ranked Appalachian State on November 22, 1997. Liberty is now 8-39 against ranked I-AA programs.

Horn Finally Back In Action

After sitting out five-straight games, senior captain Jason Horn rejoined the Flames' starting lineup on Senior Day last weekend against Charleston Southern, finishing his limited playing time with an assisted tackle. Horn had been sidelined after suffering a fractured fibula in his left leg during practice leading up to the William & Mary game. At the time of his injury, Horn led the Big South in tackles for a loss and sacks as the senior had recorded 7.5 tackles for a loss (44 yards) and 5.0 sacks (40 yards) over the first five games of the year. Also at the time of the injury, the defensive lineman ranked fifth nationally in sacks (1.00 per game) and sixth in tackles for a loss (1.70 per game).

Moving Over The Million Fan Mark

The Western Carolina game marked a historic day in the annals of Liberty University as the 8,286 fans in attendance helped the Flames move over the 1,000,000 mark in home attendance since the program's inception in 1973.

Liberty currently ranks 14th in the nation in home attendance based upon stadium capacity as the Flames are filling their stadium at 92.73 percent over SIX home games of the year (66,765 fans in total). The Flames are averaging 11,128 fans per game at Williams Stadium this year.

Sensational Shutouts

For the third time in school history and the first since moving to the Division I level, Liberty has posted three shutouts in a season with its 21-0 victory over Western Carolina on November 4. The Flames also recorded three shutouts in 1974 (when they were NCCAA) and in 1976 (when they were NAIA). The Flames are the only team in the country to have recorded three shutouts this year as the Flames broke a six-way tie for the nation's lead in shutouts with their 21-0 blanking of Western Carolina on November 4th. Five other teams in I-AA football have recorded two shutouts this year: Albany, Cal Poly, Massachusetts, Nicholls State and San Diego.

Running With The Flames

The Flames rushed for 103 yards and two touchdowns against Charleston Southern last weekend, helping Liberty approach a familiar figure. Liberty enters the final game of the year needing just 80 rushing yards to surpass the 2,000 yard mark for the fifth time in school history (1,920 yards through 10 games) and for the fourth time in the last five years (also in 2002, 2003 and 2004). Liberty ranks second in the Big South and 19th nationally in rushing yards per game (192.00).

Ranking Among The Best Nationally In Turnovers

Liberty has committed just eight turnovers this year and ranks tied for third nationally in fewest turnovers committed. There are only two teams nationally that have committed fewer turnovers than Liberty (Illinois State with six turnovers and San Diego with seven turnovers). Liberty currently ranks tied for 28th in the nation in turnover margin (.50) as the Flames have forced 13 turnovers.

Taking A Look At The Turnovers

Last weekend, Liberty finished the Charleston Southern without a turnover, marking the fourth game this year that the Flames have finished without a turnover. Liberty has taken great pride in taking care of the ball this season as the Flames' offense has committed just eight turnovers (three fumbles and five interceptions). Liberty's opponents have turned the Flames' eight turnovers into just 17 points on a pair of touchdowns and a field goal. Equally, Liberty's defense has forced 13 turnovers as well (five forced fumbles and eight interceptions), leading to 24 points on three touchdowns and a field goal.

Keepers Of The Clock

The Charleston Southern game snapped a five-game streak where Liberty finished a game with a time of possession advantage as the Bucs finished the game with a 56 second advantage, 30:28 to 29:32. This year, Liberty's ground game and solid defensive effort have allowed the Flames to control the clock as Liberty has finished seven of its 10 games with a time of possession advantage. Liberty currently leads the Big South Conference in time of possession (31:04).

Interview Policies

Preseason camp interview schedule:

Players and coaches are available after each practice session for post-practice interviews for a designated amount of time. If you need to conduct an interview during a different time, please contact the Office of Athletic Media Relations for alternate plans. However, due to the rigorous time schedule of preseason camp, it is requested that every effort be made to conduct following practice sessions.

Regular season interview schedule during game week:

Head coach Danny Rocco, members of the football coaching staff and players are available for interviews Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of game weeks.

Tuesday interviews:

Head coach Danny Rocco will host a weekly media press conference each Tuesday during the season to address the media. The press conference will be held in a designated area in the Williams Football Operations Center. The press conference will start at 1 p.m. and run for 30 minutes.

Requested players and members of the coaching staff can be available for one-on-one interviews following Coach Rocco's weekly press conference. Player/coaching staff interviews will start at 1:30 p.m. and will run for 30 minutes. However, players will not be asked to miss class time or any other academic/team requirements for these interviews.

Wednesday and Thursday interviews:

Head coach Danny Rocco, members of the coaching staff and players will be available after practices on Wednesday and Thursday. If you request an interview, you are advised to arrive at least 15 minutes before the scheduled finish time of practice just in case practice finishes early. Coach Rocco, members of the coaching staff and players will not be held if you are not present at the conclusion of practice.

Postgame interviews:

The Liberty University football locker room is closed to members of the media at all times, both at home and on the road.

Home postgame interviews:

Head coach Danny Rocco and requested players/members of the coaching staff will be available after a brief 10-minute cooling off period after each home game. Interviews will be conducted in a designated area inside of the Williams Football Operation Center, beginning with Coach Rocco followed by requested players/members of the coaching staff. Media members will be escorted down onto the field by a member of the Athletic Media Relations staff with approximately five minutes left in the fourth quarter. After the team leaves the playing field and enters the locker room, a member of the Athletic Media Relations staff will escort the media to the designated interview area.

Road postgame interviews:

Head coach Danny Rocco and requested players/members of the coaching staff will be available after a brief 10-minute cooling off period after each road game. Coach Rocco and requested players/member of the coaching staff will be available for interviews outside of the locker room or in a designated interview area (if one is available). A member of the Athletic Media Relations staff will escort the members of the media to the designated interview area.

Ever So Close

Taking away the Flames' I-A game against Wake Forest, the Flames have lost their four other games by a combined 13 points (seven to Towson, three to Gardner-Webb, two to Coastal Carolina and one to William & Mary) or an average of 3.25 points per loss. Coming into the Charleston Southern game, Liberty had dropped six-straight Big South Conference games by six or fewer points, dating back to the beginning of league play in 2005. Liberty had dropped those six games by a total of 22 points and an average of 3.7 points per contest.

Liberty's Turnaround Could Tie For Nation's Best

The Flames enter the VMI game having won four more games this year than last, which ranks tied for second nationally in win improvement over the previous season. Robert Morris leads the nation as they won five more games this year (2-8 last year compared with 7-4 this year). Arkansas-Pine Bluff, Bucknell, Jackson State, Monmouth and Tennessee State have also had four-game improvements since last year.

Keeping The QB Clean

Liberty slipped a bit this weekend in the solid season that they have had in preventing quarterback sacks as the Flames allowed three QB sacks against Charleston Southern (including two on consecutive plays). The Flames have finished five games this year without allowing a sack and Liberty has only allowed 10 sacks all year. Liberty's offensive line has done a great job holding off would-be tacklers as the Flames currently rank 12th nationally in quarterback sacks allowed per game (1.00).

Another Attendance Record Falls

Liberty had 10,823 fans in attendance at the Charleston Southern game last weekend, helping the program surpass the school record for home attendance. Liberty finished the year with a home attendance figure of 66,765, bettering the previous record of 55,990 in 1990 (in seven games). The Charleston Southern game marked the fourth time this year that Liberty has had over 10,000 fans in attendance at a home game, setting a new school record as the Flames previous best was three games in 1998.

Hurrying Up The Hurler

The Flames finished the Charleston Southern game with seven quarterback hurries as they pressured the Buccaneers' hurlers all day and held him to just 187 passing yards. Liberty currently leads the Big South Conference in quarterback hurries as the Flames are averaging 4.5 hurries per contest.

Quite A Kickoff Return Effort

The Flames lead the Big South Conference in kickoff return yardage as Liberty is averaging 24.3 yards per kickoff return, which is almost 5.7 yards per return better than Gardner-Webb who ranks second in the league (18.6 yards per game). Liberty is the only team in the league to have returned a kickoff for a touchdown this year (97 yards by Dominic Bolden against Coastal Carolina and 80 yards by Wynton Jackson against Charleston Southern) and currently ranks sixth nationally in kickoff return yardage. Wynton Jackson leads the league as he is averaging 29.4 yards per kickoff return.

Batting Them Back

Liberty currently ranks first in the Big South Conference in pass breakups as the Flames have tallied a league-best 33 deflections over the first 10 games this year (3.3 per game). The stat is a total team accomplishment as Liberty has just two players rank in the Top 10 in passes defended. On the season, 13 different players have broken up a pass with E.L. Estes (6) and Patrick Calvary (5) leading the way for the team.

Total Team Effort

The Flames have the stingiest defense in the Big South and the ninth best in the nation in scoring defense which is a credit to Liberty's entire defense unit and not just one player. The Flames currently only have two players rank in the conference's Top 10 in tackles (Manny Rojas and Stevie Ray Lloyd both at ninth) and the Flames have just five players in the Top 30.

Don't Run On The Flames

Not only can Liberty run the ball with efficiency, but the Flames aren't bad at defending the run as well as Liberty currently ranks first in the Big South and 17th nationally in rushing defense.

Liberty is allowing an average of 110.20 rushing yards per game and opponents have scored just nine rushing touchdowns in 10 games. Liberty has held four opponents this year to less than 100 rushing yards in a game (St. Paul's, Glenville State, Gardner-Webb and Charleston Southern).

Wynton Wows Crowd With Return

Wynton Jackson returned a kickoff 80 yards for a touchdown against Charleston Southern last Saturday, giving Liberty its second kickoff return for a touchdown on the season. Liberty is just one of three teams nationally to have returned two kickoffs for a score, while Liberty ranks sixth in the country in kickoff return yardage as the Flames are averaging 24.3 yards per return.

Turner Turns In Another Find Day

Brandon Turner posted his second-straight 100-yard receiving game as the junior caught five passes for 110 yards and a touchdown against Charleston Southern last weekend. This marks the second-straight week that Turner has finished a game with 100 receiving yards, allowing the junior to become the ninth player in school history to post back-to-back 100 yard games and the first since Trey Miller did so in 1998.

Terrell Is On A Tear

For the fifth-straight week and the 12th time this season, Zach Terrell found the end zone as the sophomore finished the Charleston Southern game with two rushing touchdowns (fourth time this year with two rushing touchdowns in a game).

Terrell leads the Flames with 12 rushing touchdowns this year, making him the 10th player in school history to rush for 10 or more touchdowns in a season. Terrell currently leads the Big South with 12 rushing touchdowns and is tied for the conference's lead along with Coastal Carolina's Jerome Simpson as both players are averaging 7.2 points per game.

Quite The Tandem

Zach Terrell and Rashad Jennings enter the VMI game with a combined 21 rushing touchdowns, which ranks third in school history for combined rushing touchdowns by a pair of running backs. Kim Raynor (15 TDs) and Glenn Inverso (13 TD) are the only running tandem to rush for more than 10 touchdowns in the same season as they do so in 1979. Ranking second was the tailback-fullback combination of Lawrence Worthington (16 TD) and J.T. Morris (7 TDs) as the pair rushed for 23 touchdowns in 1995.

Rashad Jennings enters today's game with a team-best 909 yards rushing, which leads the Big South Conference and ranks 37th nationally. Jennings needs to finish with 69 rushing yards during today's game to crack the Flames' Top 5 rushing list by sophomore running backs as Stacy Nobles ranks fifth in school history as the sophomore rushed for 977 yards in 1997. Dre Barnes is the sophomore school record holder as the school's all-time leading rusher ran for 1,304 yards in his second year with the program in 2002.

Big Day For Brock

Brock Smith threw for a season-high 224 yards against Charleston Southern on Saturday as he completed 12-of-17 pass attempts. Smith also tossed two touchdown passes for the second time this season. His 224 passing yards marked the third most passing yards that Smith has tossed in a game in his career. The performance also pushed Smith over the 2,000 career yard passing mark as the sophomore has thrown for 2,063 yards and 11 touchdowns in his two years with the Flames.

Rojas Closes The Gap On Conference's Top Spot

Manny Rojas currently ranks second in Big South Conference history as he enters today's game with 340 career tackles. The senior added 11 more tackles to his career tally last weekend against Charleston Southern, helping him gain ground on Coastal Carolina's Jamar Leath as the senior finished with nine tackles against Gardner-Webb to give him 348 career stops.

Rojas Ranks Among Program's Best Tacklers

With his 11 tackles against Charleston Southern last weekend, Manny Rojas moved into sixth place on the Flames' all-time tackles list as he moved past Eric Carroll (1987-90) who finished his career with 325 tackles. Liberty University first-year head coach Danny Rocco started his head coaching career off with a resounding 27-0 shutout victory over visiting St. Paul's at Williams Stadium in the annual Western Virginia Educational Classic.

The contest marked the 15th time in school history that Liberty has shut out an opponent and the first time since October 28, 2000, when Liberty handed visiting Samford a 24-0 loss at Williams Stadium.

After the contest, Total Action Against Poverty, a non-profit organization that is based out of Roanoke and who sponsored the Classic, named Liberty's Rashad Jennings the game's offensive MVP as he rushed for 160 yards on 25 carries and scored twice, while St. Paul's Clinton Gee was named the game's defensive MVP as he finished with a game-high 11 tackles.

The game, which was played in front of an impressive crowd of 8,546 fans despite a steady rain throughout the evening, remained scoreless until midway through the first quarter as six-straight rushing attempts set up Jennings for a three-yard run up the middle to give Liberty a 7-0 lead with 9:50 left to play in the first quarter.

The two teams traded two sets of possessions over the remainder of the quarter and the score remained the same until midway through the second as Ben Beasley knocked through a 27-yard field goal to push Liberty's lead to 10-0 with 4:57 left before halftime. The scoring drive consisted of nine-straight rushing attempts that ate up 5:37 on the game clock.

After forcing the Tigers to punt six plays later, Wynton Jackson put the Flames in prime field possession as he returned the punt 46 yards to St. Paul's 32-yard line.

A 29-yard sideline pass from Brock Smith to Brandon Turner put the Flames back at the Tiger's three-yard line. And Liberty was able to push the ball across the goal line with a second three-yard score this time by Zach Terrell with 57 seconds left to play in the half.

But Zac Kolegue had his 34-consecutive PAT streak, the third longest in school history, come to an end as the junior missed the kick wide to the left, leaving the score at 16-0 at halftime.

Liberty took the opening kick of the second half and continued to stick to its rushing game as eight-straight rushing attempts by Jennings and Terrell resulted in another score. Jennings took a hand off from Terrell for a one-yard run up the middle to cap off a 60-yard drive and push the Flames' advantage to 22-0 after Beasley's PAT was blocked at the 9:31 mark of the third quarter.

After a pair of three-and-out series, Beasley was able to pin the Tigers deep in their own territory with a 34-yard punt to the St. Paul's 12-yard line. Two plays later, back-up quarterback Michael Garrison intentionally grounded a pass in the end zone to avoid a sack, giving Liberty another two points by virtue of the sack.

With most of its reserve players in the game, Liberty managed to tack on three additional points mid-way through the fourth quarter as Beasley capped off a seven-play, 33-yard drive with a 32-yard field goal at 9:11 in the fourth quarter to give Liberty's its final 27-0 margin of victory.

The Flames' power rushing attack and new 3-4 defense proved to be a winning combination in the contest as Liberty rushed for 274 yards on 50 carries (5.5 average yards per carry). On the defensive side of the ball, Liberty allowed the Tigers just 57 total offensive yards on 40 plays, while St. Paul's got the ball their the one 35-yard line three times during the game to mark the best field position of the contest.

For the second-straight game, the Flames rushed their way to a victory as Rashad Jennings rushed for three scores and Zach Terrell added another to lead Liberty to a 31-7 victory over Glenville State in front of 11,423 fans.

Liberty quickly moved down the field on the opening drive of the game as the Flames capped off the seven-play, 77-yard drive with a 24-yard run to the right by Jennings for a score at the 11:50 mark of the first quarter. Besides the Jennings' run, the drive was highlighted by a 22-yard rush by fullback Chris Stokes and an 18-yard slant pass from Brock Smith to Wynton Jackson. The score remained the same until late in the first quarter when Ben Beasley connected on a 25-yard field goal with 67 seconds left to finish off a six-play, 31-yard drive and give Liberty a 10-0 lead.

Three plays into the ensuing drive, linebacker Stevie Ray Lloyd picked off a pass from Glenville State's Mike Williams, giving the Flames possession of the ball at the Pioneers' 31-yard line. Two plays later, Jennings found a hole up the middle and dashed 30 yards to the end zone for his second touchdown of the evening at the 13:53 mark of the second quarter, extending the Liberty lead to 17-0.

Later in the quarter, the Flames mounted their final scoring drive of the half with Jennings getting the call for the third time. The sophomore rushed up the middle on a three-yard scoring play to give Liberty a 24-0 lead with 1:39 left before halftime.

Glenville State threatened to break Liberty's scoreless streak in the final 90 seconds of the first half as the Pioneers quickly moved down the field thanks to Williams completing 4-of-5 pass attempts for 67 yards, including a 19-yarder to Tavon McGee to get to the Liberty three-yard line with four seconds left. However, a Williams slant pass to McGee in the corner of the end zone was broken up by Patrick Calvary to preserve the shutout as time ran out. After holding the Pioneers to just 14 yards on nine plays on the opening drive of the second half, Jackson returned a punt 25 yards to midfield to give Liberty its first possession of the third quarter.

Smith completed a 21-yard sideline pass to Dominic Bolden, followed by four more rushing plays by the rushing tandem of Jennings and Terrell, with Terrell getting the call on a six-yard run to the right at the 6:45 mark to give Liberty a 31-0 lead.

The Flames entered the fourth quarter attempting to post back-to-back shutouts for the first time since 1974; however, the Pioneers put together a nine-play 55-yard drive; capped off by a six-yard scoring pass play from Williams to McGee. On a fourth-and-goal play, Williams was able to find McGee amongst a large group of Liberty defenders, cutting Liberty's lead to 31-7 with 12:18 in the contest to give the game its final score.

Jennings finished the game with 15 carries for 161 yards and three touchdowns, while averaging 10.7 yards per attempt. Jennings becomes the first player since Sam Gado in 2004 to post back-to-back 100-yard games, while Gado was also the last player to rush for three scores in a game against VMI on November 6, 2004.

Terrell followed with eight carries for 53 yards and a touchdown, while the Flames finished the contest with 275 yards, one more yard than Liberty's 274 in its season opener against St. Paul's. Smith posted a much better performance in his second game of the year as the sophomore quarterback completed 11-of-16 pass attempts for 112 yards.

Jackson led six different Liberty pass catchers as the junior finished the game with five receptions for 49 yards, while Nick Hursky led the Flames' defense in total tackles with 10 stops and Jason Horn posted his second-straight impressive outing with nine tackles, 2.5 tackles for a loss (12 yards), 2.0 sacks (12 yards), a quarterback hurry and a punt block.

Neither team was able to fully get its offense on track throughout the whole game; however, Towson scored just enough to remain undefeated on the year and hand the Flames their first loss in a 10-3 Tigers' victory at Unitas Stadium.

The first half of the game proved to be a defensive stalemate as the two teams combined for just 144 yards of total offense on 53 total plays with neither team putting points on the scoreboard. Liberty finished the half with 63 yards on 29 plays, while the Tigers tallied 81 yards on 24 plays. Liberty punted the ball seven times, while the Tigers punted five times and turned the ball over on downs after a failed fourth-down conversion attempt. The Flames recorded their initial first down of the game with 4:45 left to play in the second quarter as Zach Terrell completed a 14-yard pass play to Dominic Bolden over the middle on a third-and-eight play.

The 14-yard pickup somewhat sparked the Flames' offense as Liberty mounted its longest drive of the game. An 11-play, 38-yard drive that used up 6:57 on the game clock got the Flames to the Towson 42-yard line before Liberty recorded its seventh punt of the first half. The furthest the Tigers advanced the ball was to Liberty's 34-yard line early in the second quarter. The Tigers finally broke the scoreless streak on the opening drive of the third quarter as Sean Schaefer completed an eight-yard slant pass to Demetrius Harrison at the 9:20 mark, accounting for the junior wide receiver's first touchdown reception of the year and the second of his career.

The scoring drive of 13 plays and 79 yards that used up 5:31 on the game clock was kept alive by a key fourth down conversion as Schaefer completed a 16-yard pass to Eric Yancey that put the Tigers at Liberty's 19-yard line.

Liberty advanced the ball to midfield on its first drive of the second half, but once again was forced to punt the ball away. Ben Beasley seemed to pin the Tigers deep in their own territory as his 51-yard punt put the Tigers at their own nine-yard line; however, Yancey returned the punt for 35 yards.

On the first play of the drive, Schaefer found Paul Perry open for a 44-yard reception to the Liberty 12-yard line, giving the Tigers the momentum. After an attempted rush up the middle, Schaefer found Daryon Arnold open in the corner of the endzone for an apparent second touchdown, but the wideout was flagged for offensive pass interference to negate the score. Liberty's defense took advantage of the second chance as three plays later, the Tigers were forced to attempt a 41-yard field goal and Chris Desautels' attempt from the center of the field fell considerably short to leave the score at 7-0 at the end of the third quarter.

After a three-and-out series to start the fourth quarter forced the Tigers to punt the ball, Liberty put together its second-longest drive of the day and cut into the lead as Beasley connected on a 27-yard field goal with 9:37 left to play in the contest to cap off a 10-play, 49-yard scoring drive. Towson pushed its lead back to seven points on the ensuing drive as Towson capped off a 13-play, 79-yard drive that ate up 5:19 of the game clock with a 30-yard field goal by Desautels with 4:07 remaining in the ball game.

A 32-yard kickoff return by Wynton Jackson on the ensuing drive gave the Flames prime field position with just under four minutes to play. Brock Smith completed a 26-yard pass play to Rashad Jennings on the first play, while passes to Darnell Edwards (12 yards) and Turner (eight yards) helped the Flames move to Towson's 15-yard line.

After a four-yard gain on a draw play by Jennings, Smith completed a slant pass to Turner, but the junior was struck by Tony Lumpkin and coughed up the ball at the 12-yard line, while Richard Lee recovered the lost fumble to seal the victory for the home team.

For the second time this season, Rashad Jennings rushed for three touchdowns in a game and the Flames recorded a shutout victory as Liberty posted a 28-0 road victory over Savannah State at Ted Wright Stadium.

The Flames wasted little time getting on the scoreboard as the two teams traded three-and-out possessions, while Ben Beasley pinned the Tigers deep inside their own territory as his 29-yard punt gave Savannah State possession on its own nine-yard line.

On the first play of the ensuing drive, Quinton Beasley was given the ball and the tailback got outside the tackles; however, linebacker Manny Rojas was able to strip the ball from the running back and Ryan Greiser recovered the miscue on the six-yard line.

On the next play, Brock Smith handled the ball to Jennings and the tailback found a hole up the middle, leading to his team-leading sixth rushing touchdown of the year and first of the evening to give Liberty a 7-0 lead with 10:54 left to play in the first quarter.

The score remained the same until early in the second quarter when Liberty looked like it was going to have to give up the ball after being held; however, Beasley was struck by Charles Huggins on the punt attempt, giving Liberty new life after the roughing the kicker penalty at its own 47-yard line.

And the Flames made the Tigers pay for their second mistake of the contest as Jennings got outside on the left side of the field and found an opening that enabled him to score his second rushing touchdown of the night. The 53-yard touchdown run gave Liberty a 14-0 lead at 11:10 in the second quarter and was his longest run since joining the program.

Liberty looked like it was going to add to its lead late in the second quarter as a 25-yard run by Jennings got the Flames down to the Tigers' one-yard line. However, after a pair of penalties pushed the Flames back to the 20-yard line, Liberty had to settle for a field goal attempt, but Beasley pushed the 25-yard attempt wide left, leaving the score at 14-0 at halftime. That marked the fourth-straight game that Liberty has held its opponent scoreless in the first half.

Liberty came out of the locker room and put together a solid scoring drive on the first drive of the third quarter as the Flames capped off a seven-play, 86-yard drive that used up 3:34 on the clock. Zach Terrell found an opening on the outside for his third rushing touchdown of the year, a three-yard quarterback keeper, as the score pushed Liberty's lead to 21-0 at the 11:01 mark of the third quarter.

The Flames increased their lead to 28 points, 28-0, on the third play of the fourth quarter as Jennings broke through the middle of the line for a three-yard score, his third of the evening, with 13:41 left to play in the game. The scoring opportunity was set up by a 45-yard pass play from Terrell to Brandon Turner to get Liberty inside the Tigers' 10-yard line and helped set up the final score of the game.

The Tigers dominated time of possession with a near eight-minute advantage (33:56 - 26:04); however, the Flames' bend but don't break defense kept Liberty in the game. Liberty has allowed just 17 total points over the first four games of the season, marking the best four-game defensive span in school history as the previous record was 25 points over four games in 1974. Since making the move to Division I play, the best four game span is 34 points in 1988.

Jennings finished the night with 194 yards on 21 carries, averaging 9.2 yards per carry and three scores. The 194 yards ties him with Kim Raynor for the 27th-best single-game rushing performance in school history as Raynor rushed for 194 yards against Ferrum on November 3, 1979.

The Demon Deacons opened up a 20-point lead in the first half and played solid defense in the second en route to a 34-14 Homecoming victory over visiting Liberty in front of 29,623 people at Groves Stadium.

Wake Forest wasted little time getting on the scoreboard as Riley Swanson picked off a Brock Smith sideline pass at the Liberty 44-yard line on the third play of the contest.

Liberty held the Demon Deacons to just seven yards on the ensuing drive, forcing Wake Forest to attempt a lengthy field goal which Sam Swank hit as the 52-yard field goal gave the home team a 3-0 lead at the 11:59 mark. The field goal marked the first time this season that a team has scored on the Flames in the first half.

After a three-and-out series by Liberty, the Demon Deacons added to their advantage on the second play of the next drive as Kevin Harris found a hole on the outside and scampered 27 yards for a touchdown, giving Wake Forest a 10-0 lead with 9:07 left to play in the first quarter.

The score remained the same until early in the second when the Deacons capped off a seven-play, 91-yard drive with a second touchdown run by Harris. The tailback rushed seven yards over the left tackle to give Wake Forest a 17-0 edge with 13:08 left to play before halftime.

The Flames started to settle down in the second quarter as Liberty pieced together an 11-play, 81-yard scoring drive capped off by a pass from Smith to Darnell Edwards in the corner of the end zone. The scoring drive was kept alive by a 23-yard gain by Wynton Jackson as the wide out caught a sideline screen pass on a third-and-three play earlier in the drive.

The nine-yard touchdown marked the first time that Wake Forest had given up a touchdown in seven quarters, trimming the lead to 17-7 with 8:43 left before halftime.

The Demon Deacons added three more points to their lead on the next drive as Swank knocked down a 37-yard field goal with 5:38 left to play in the second quarter to finish off a eight-play, 51-yard drive.

After a Liberty drive ended at middle field, which was aided by a 41-yard reception by Brandon Turner, Wake Forest regained possession. And the home team thrilled the Homecoming crowd with seven more points before the intermission as Riley Skinner found Nate Morton open for a 59-yard touchdown reception to give Wake Forest a 27-7 lead heading into the locker room.

Neither team was able to find the scoreboard during the third quarter as the teams traded a combined five possessions between them during the scoreless quarter (three by Wake Forest and two by Liberty).

The score remained the same until the Demon Deacons put together their longest drive of the day as they capped off a 10-play, 54-yard drive with a three-run yard by De'Angelo Bryant with 6:30 left to play, pushing Wake Forest's lead to 34-7.

However, the Flames kept things interesting as Liberty answered right back on the ensuing drive as Smith completed 5-of-6 pass attempts to lead the Flames down the field. Liberty finished off the drive with Smith and Edwards hooking up for the second time on the game on a six-yard pass to the corner of the end zone at 2:10 to give the game its final margin.

Visiting William & Mary survived three missed field goals and blocked an extra point attempt en route to a 14-13 victory over Liberty at Williams Stadium in front of a record-setting 15,631 fans for the Flames' Homecoming game.

With the victory, the Tribe ups its record to 2-4 on the season and the loss evens Liberty's record at 3-3. The crowd marked the largest home attendance in school history, surpassing the previous record of 12,623 fans that saw Liberty pick up a 28-21 overtime victory over Charleston Southern on Homecoming Weekend in 1998 (Oct. 3).

Liberty had the chance to jump out to an early lead on its opening drive of the game as the Flames marched 70 yards down the field, but Ben Beasley pushed a 30-yard field goal wide right at the 7:36 mark of the first quarter.

William & Mary also looked like it was going to score on its opening drive of the game as the Tribe moved the ball 78 yards on 16 plays. However, Jake Phillips' attempted pass on a third-and-goal play was picked off by E.L. Estes in the end zone, keeping the game scoreless.

On the ensuing drive, the Flames gave William & Mary the ball back in excellent field position after a Brock Smith pass was intercepted by Alan Wheeling at the 50-yard line and returned to Liberty's 37. And William & Mary made good on the turnover as six plays later Elijah Brooks rushed up the middle for a three-yard score to give William & Mary 7-0 lead with 8:27 left to play before halftime.

Liberty answered back on the following drive as 14 of the drive's 15 plays were of the rushing variety with the only pass play coming on an 11-yard reception by Dominic Bolden on a fourth-and-four play to keep the drive alive.

After four-straight rushing plays by Rashad Jennings, quarterback Zach Terrell kept the ball himself for a one-yard score on a draw play just 55 seconds before halftime. However, Zac Kolegue's point-after attempt was blocked by Cortenous Herbert, allowing the Tribe to maintain a 7-6 lead at the intermission.

After holding William & Mary on a three-and-out series to start the third quarter, Jennings found an opening on the far side of the field for a 62-yard gain, giving Liberty the ball on the William & Mary 13-yard line. The play proved to be costly, though, as the redshirt sophomore running back was injured on the play and didn't return to the field the remainder of the game.

Despite the injury, Liberty took advantage of the gain and three plays later, Terrell found a hole on the left side of the line for a six-yard scamper into the end zone. Terrell's second rushing touchdown of the game gave Liberty a 13-7 lead at the 10:57 mark.

William & Mary quickly answered on the ensuing drive by capping off an eight-play, 74-yard drive with a five-yard run up the middle by Brooks, his second touchdown of the day, allowing the visitors to regain the lead, 14-13, with 5:50 left to play in the third.

Liberty got inside the Red Zone again on its next drive by advancing to the 18-yard line, but Beasley's 35-yard field goal attempt was blocked by Travis McLaurin, allow the Tribe to maintain its one-point advantage.

Liberty's defense held strong in the fourth quarter with a pair of three-and-out drives to set up the Flames' next scoring chance. Coach Danny Rocco's offense methodically marched down the field on 17 plays, reaching the W&M 20-yard line. But Beasley missed his third field goal try of the afternoon as his 37-yard attempt sailed wide right with 2:07 on the game clock, ending the Flames' chances for a victory.

Liberty won most of the statistical battles of the day as the Flames outgained the Tribe, 386 to 265 yards in total offense, 315 to 170 yards rushing and 36:01 to 23:59 in the time of possession battle.

A pair of Hunter Smith fourth-quarter field goals, including one with five seconds left on the clock, proved to be the difference as Gardner-Webb overcame a 17-point half-time deficit to pick up a 27-24 Big South win over Liberty at Williams Stadium.

Liberty wasted little time taking control of the game as the Flames scored on their opening drive of the contest. Liberty kept to the ground on the scoring drive as nine of its 11 plays were of the rushing variety, including a six-yard touchdown run by Zach Terrell. The sophomore cut to the outside and found a hole to give Liberty a 7-0 lead with 9:56 left to play in the opening quarter.

After holding the Bulldogs to just 13 yards on the ensuing drive, the Flames regained possession and marched down the field to seemingly score their second touchdown of the game on a four-yard run by Terrell. But the play was negated on a holding penalty, pushing the Flames back to the 15-yard line. The Flames had to settle for just three points with Zac Kolegue's 23-yard field goal giving Liberty a 10-point lead with 25 seconds left in the quarter. The score remained the same until late in the second, when Liberty hit paydirt once again. Brock Smith rolled to the right to mislead the defense and found Brandon Turner open over the middle of the field. The junior scampered to the opposite side of the field, including a dive into the corner of the end zone to complete a 26-yard pass play for a touchdown with 49 seconds left before halftime.

Liberty entered the locker room at intermission leading by a 17-0 count and holding a 225-total offensive yard advantage over Gardner-Webb, while tallying 14 first downs to the Bulldogs' three.

However, as much as the first half belonged to the home team, the second half was dominated by the visitors, starting with the opening drive of the third quarter. Devin Campbell completed three-straight 10-plus yard pass attempts, including a 21 yarder to Kory Alston on the first play, to set up a two-yard run by Bubba Wallace for a touchdown just 2:10 into the period.

After a three-and-out series by Liberty, Gardner-Webb kept to the air as 10 of the next 12 plays were passing plays. The drive was capped off by a three-yard strike from Campbell to Austin Gaines. The senior made an acrobatic catch in the back of the end zone to pull Gardner-Webb within three points, 17-14, at the 8:19 mark of the third.

And for the second-straight drive, Liberty failed to pick up a first down, punting the ball away after three plays and giving the Bulldogs possession at their own 27-yard line. Gardner-Webb quickly moved the ball downfield on a mixture of passing and rushing plays. A nine-yard slant from Campbell to Duvaughn Flagler at 2:33 gave the visitors a 21-17 lead, allowing the Bulldogs to erase a 17-point deficit in under 13 minutes (12:27).

The Flames' offense was able to find its first-half stride on the ensuing drive as Liberty marched down the field on 12 plays for 57 yards, capped off by a one-yard run over the left tackle by Terrell. The touchdown allowed the home team to regain the lead, 24-21, with 12:28 left in the game. Liberty's defense was finally able to find some answers for Gardner-Webb's second-half passing attack on the following drive as the Bulldogs' drive stalled at Liberty's 26-yard line, forcing them to settle for a 44-yard field goal by Hunter Smith that knotted the contest at 24 apiece with 9:03 left to play.

The Flames were able to move the ball down the field on the following drive as well, but a key third-down stop at Gardner-Webb's 38-yard line as the Bulldogs held Wesley Cheek to a single yard on a rushing attempt, forced the Flames to punt.

And Gardner-Webb went back to what was working in the second half as Campbell completed 5-of-7 pass attempts to get Smith in field goal range. The senior didn't disappoint as he nailed a 40-yard field goal with five seconds left to seal the victory.

The Coastal Carolina Chanticleers used two passing touchdowns from Tyler Thigpen and a 33-yard scoring run by Aundres Perkins in the fourth quarter to pick up a 28-26 victory over visiting Liberty Flames at Brooks Stadium.

Coastal Carolina wasted little time taking the lead as Mike Tolbert broke through several tackles on the second play of the game and rushed 70 yards downfield for the score, giving the home-standing Chanticleers a 7-0 lead just 37 seconds into the contest. The Flames had a chance to answer back on their first drive of the contest as Liberty used a good mix of running and passing to move the ball all the way down to the Coastal five-yard line. However, the 60-yard drive was halted in the Red Zone as Brock Smith's pass over the middle was picked off by Quinton Teal in the end zone, marking just the third time this year that Liberty has had a pass picked off.

On their next drive, Liberty once again got inside the Red Zone and the Flames didn't waste the scoring opportunity. Rashad Jennings capped off an eight-play 65-yard drive with a 10-yard touchdown run up the middle to knot the game at 7-7 with 2:57 left to play in the opening quarter.

The Flames attempted to break the tie midway through the second quarter as Zac Kolegue was called on to try a 39-yard field, the longest field goal attempted by a Flame this year. But, the score remained the same as the junior narrowly pushed the attempt to the left, leaving the score 7-7 at the break.

Liberty was finally able to break the tie on its first drive of the third quarter as Kolegue capped off a 13-play, 44-yard drive to open the half with a 37-yard field with 8:00 left to play in the quarter. On the third play of the ensuing drive, E.L. Estes picked off a Thigpen pass, giving Liberty possession of the ball at Coastal's 39-yard line. Nine plays later, the Flames tacked on three more points as Kolegue knocked down a 28-yard field to give Liberty a 13-7 lead at the 2:42 mark of the third.

Liberty looked like it was going to get the ball right back as Thigpen was sacked on the second play of the next drive, causing him to fumble the ball with Tyler Turner picking up the loose ball. However, Ryan Greiser was penalized for a face mask, the first of many second half penalties on both teams, allowing the Chanticleers to retain possession.

And Coastal Carolina took advantage of the second chance as six plays later, Thigpen found Santini Washington with a three-yard scoring strike to regain the advantage at 14-13 with 13:21 left to play in the fourth. After a three-and-out series forced the Flames to punt, Coastal Carolina quickly added to its lead. Thigpen found Jerome Simpson open on the near side of the field and the all-conference wide out broke two tackles for a 66-yard touchdown, pushing the home team's lead to 21-13 at the 9:17 mark.

But the Flames didn't lay down as Dominic Bolden returned the ensuing kickoff 93 yards for a touchdown, marking the first time that Liberty has returned a kickoff for a touchdown since Sam Gado did so on the same field two years ago on a 97-yard return (Oct. 23).

The sophomore was whistled for a personal foul as he ended his return by diving to the corner of the end zone to avoid two would-be tacklers. The officials viewed the dive as excessive celebration, moving Liberty back to the Coastal 18-yard line on the point after attempt where Brock Smith wasn't able to find an open receiver on the two-point attempt, allowing Coastal Carolina to hold on to a 21-19 lead with 8:59 left to play.

The Chanticleers added to their lead on the ensuing drive as Coastal Carolina ate up some of the clock on an eight-play, 80-yard scoring drive to used up 4:38 on the game clock. Perkins capped off the drive with a 33-yard scoring burst up the middle to give the Chanticleers a 28-19 lead with 4:15 left on the clock. The Flames were whistled for a personal foul on the touchdown run and a pair of personal fouls on the PAT, allowing Coastal Carolina to kickoff from Liberty's 20-yard line. However, infractions cost the Chanticleers on the ensuing drive as Coastal Carolina was flagged for two personal fouls on the drive, aiding in Liberty moving down the field 65 yards on five plays in 45 seconds. Terrell capped off the drive with a three-yard run up the middle to pull the Flames within two points, 28-26, with 3:28 left to play.

Liberty attempted to gain one last possession but Thigpen was able to complete a 17-yard pass play to Simpson on a fourth-and-four play, allowing the Chanticleers to keep possession of the ball and run out the clock.

For the third time in school history and the first time since playing at the Division I level, Liberty recorded its third shutout of the season as the Flames held the visiting Western Carolina Catamounts scoreless in a 21-0 victory at Williams Stadium.

Earlier this year, the Flames blanked St. Paul's (27-0) in their season opener and shutout Savannah State (28-0) to snap a six-game road losing streak in September. Liberty also shut out three opponents in 1974 and 1976 when the Flames were competing at the NCCAA and NAIA levels, respectively.

The Flames broke a scoreless tie midway through the first quarter as Rashad Jennings capped off a seven-play, 49-yard drive with a two-yard touchdown run. The tailback bowled over the defensive line up the middle for a score with 4:58 left to play in the first quarter.

Six of the seven plays on the scoring drive were of the running variety with the only pass coming on a 25-yard sideline pass from Brock Smith to Brandon Turner that saw the junior wide out pushed out of bounds just one yard shy of the goal line.

The score remained the same until late in the second quarter when Liberty mounted its longest drive of the afternoon with an 11-play, 67-yard scoring effort to push its lead to 14-0 with 25 seconds left before halftime. Zach Terrell finished off the drive with a two-yard run to the left side of the field, marking the fourth-straight week that the sophomore has rushed for a score.

Liberty held the Catamounts to just three first downs over the first 30 minutes of action and 128 total yards of offense. The 14-0 lead marked the sixth time this year that Liberty has gone into the locker at halftime having held an opponent scoreless over the first two periods.

The Flames kept things rolling on its first drive of the third quarter as Smith hooked up with three different receivers to help march Liberty down field 78 yards on six plays. The final play of the drive was a 36-yard completion to Turner in the corner of the end zone, giving Liberty a 21-0 lead with 11:51 left to play in the third.

The remainder of the game belonged to the Flames' stout defense as the closest that Western Carolina got to the end zone over the final 27 minutes of the contest was the Flames' 20-yard line on the next drive, despite going for it on fourth down three times in the second half.

The contest marked a historic day in school history as the 8,286 fans in attendance at the afternoon game helped push the Flames over the 1,000,000 mark in home attendance since the inception of the program in 1973.

The Flames held the Catamounts to just 273 yards in the contest, the second-fewest yards Liberty has allowed this season. Conversely, the Flames made wise use of their offensive yards as Liberty managed just 307 total offensive yards in the game, also marking its second-lowest output of the year.

For the fifth-straight game and the seventh time this year, the Flames' rushing attack and solid defensive effort allowed Liberty to control the play clock as Liberty finished with 31:43 to 28:17 time of possession advantage in the contest.

Terrell led the Flames' rushing attack and missed posting his fifth career 100-yard game by a yard as he carried the ball 20 times for 99 yards and a score. Jennings added 13 rushing attempts for 38 yards and his conference-leading 10th rushing touchdown of the season.

Darius Fudge became the second running back to rush for 100 yards against the Flames this year as the senior rushed for 102 yards on 23 carries.

Smith finished the game with 161 yards passing by completing 11-of-20 attempts, including the touchdown pass to Turner. Spencer Landis completed his first two collegiate passes as the freshman completed 2-of-3 attempts for 11 yards late in the contest. Western Carolina's Todd Spitzer completed 20-of-31 pass attempts for 164 yards.

Turner posted his second career 100-yard receiving game as the junior caught a team-best seven passes for 101 yards and a score. Eight different players caught passes for the Catamounts with Michael Hines leading the team with seven receptions for 33 yards.

Manny Rojas posted his 10th-career double-figure tackle game of his four-year career with the Flames as the senior linebacker finished the game with 10 tackles and two quarterback hurries. Liberty pressured Spitzer all afternoon as the Flames finished the game with a season-high 13 quarterback hurries. Shelton Gaffney led the Catamounts with nine tackles.

The 2006 Flames football senior class closed out their days at Williams Stadium in style as Liberty ended 24th-ranked Charleston Southern's 14-game winning streak with a 34-20 Big South Conference victory.

The win gave Liberty's its first victory over a nationally-ranked team since 1997 and the eighth win over a ranked I-AA team in school history. Liberty's last win over a nationally-ranked team was a 25-19 victory over 15th-ranked Appalachian State on November 22, 1997, allowing the Flames to finish the season with a 9-2 record.

The Flames wasted little time getting on the scoreboard as Liberty marched down field on the opening drive of the game 80 yards on six plays for a score. The drive was capped off by an eight-yard touchdown run by Zach Terrell at the 11:45 mark to give Liberty a 6-0 lead as Zac Kolegue's extra point sailed wide left.

The drive was highlighted by a trick play as quarterback Brock Smith handed the ball off to Terrell who threw the ball back to Smith on the opposite side of the field for a 27-yard gain, giving Liberty the ball inside the Buccaneers' Red Zone.

After holding Charleston Southern on the ensuing drive, the Flames quickly added to their lead as Smith found Brandon Turner open in the flat and the junior scampered 56 yards down field for a score, upping the Liberty advantage to 13-0 with 6:48 left in the first quarter.

The score remained the same until midway through the second quarter as C.J. Hirschman returned a punt 63 yards for a touchdown at 7:54 to pull the Buccaneers within six points, 13-7. The punt return marked the fourth time this year that Liberty has allowed an opponent to score in the first half this year.

However, Liberty had some special team's magic of its own as Jackson fielded the ensuing kickoff at the 20 yard line and found a few gaps down field, allowing him to return the kickoff 80 yards for the Flames' third touchdown of the afternoon and give Liberty a 20-7 lead.

It is the second time this year that Liberty, who entered the game ranked seventh nationally in kickoff return yardage, has returned a kickoff for a touchdown as Dominic Bolden returned a kickoff 93 yards against Coastal Carolina on October 28.

Charleston Southern started to march down field on the next drive until Collin Drafts fumbled the ball on a quarterback scramble, forced by Tyler Turner and recovered by Colin Dugan, giving the Flames the ball back at the Liberty 43-yard line.

Seven plays later, Terrell found the end zone for the second time of the afternoon and the 13th time this year as the sophomore ran nine yards to the near side of the field and dove into the corner of the end zone for a 27-7 Liberty lead just 2:18 before halftime.

Neither team found the scoreboard in the third quarter; but, the Buccaneers did suffer a loss late in the quarter. Drafts scrambled 12 yards down field for a Buccaneer first down to get to the Liberty 30-yard line, but the quarterback was injured on the play and did not return. And two plays later, Draft's back-up Eli Byrd was picked off by Ryan Greiser.

Liberty sealed its victory early in the fourth quarter as Smith found Wynton Jackson open deep down field, lofting a ball over two defenders and the wide out scampered 45 yards to the end zone for the score to give Liberty a 34-7 lead with 8:58 left to play in the contest.

However, the Buccaneers never quit as they tried to make the most of their last nine minutes. Byrd completed a 31-yard scoring strike to Bryant Burch on the next drive, while Charleston Southern took advantage of botched punt snap to set up Byrd for a one-yard touchdown run with 19 seconds left, but Liberty's lead was too large, ending the Buccaneers' undefeated season.

For the first time in school history, the Flames had over 10,000 fans attend four different games on the year, including today's game with 10,823 fans. Liberty's finished the 2006 home season with a school record 66,765 in total home attendance, surpassing the previous record of 55,990 set over seven games during the 1990 campaign.

The Flames finished the game with a season-high 251 passing yards, including 224 yards and two scores by Smith as he completed 12-of-17 attempts, plus the 27-yard pass play from Terrell to Smith. Drafts finished the game with a season-low 116 yards passing, despite completing 15-of-20 passes in three quarters of action.
