Today's Game

Two of the nation's best teams will take to the field today, when Liberty and Elon battle it out at Williams Stadium in both squad's regular-season finales. The Flames are coming off a 30-10 victory over Gardner-Webb, sealing up their second straight undefeated Big South season. Last weekend, the Phoenix gave three-time defending national champion and currently No. 2 Appalachian State all the Mountaineers could handle in a 24-16 defeat at Kidd Brewer Stadium in Boone, N.C.

Coach's Corner

In just three seasons at Liberty, head coach Danny Rocco has taken the Flames from 1-10 (in 2005) to back-to-back Big South Conference championships. The third-year skipper has posted a 23-10 record since taking over the program, helping him garner Big South Coach of the Year honors in both 2006 and 2007. Last year, the Flames were 8-3 and a perfect 4-0 against Big South foes, while this year the Flames became the first 5-0 team in league history.

Along with Rocco, Pete Lembo will be completing his third regular-season at the helm of his program, as the Georgetown graduate has guided Elon to a 20-13 record. Prior to coming to Elon, Lembo served as the head coach for five seasons at Lehigh, leading the Mountain Hawks to a pair of NCAA FCS Playoff berths and two Patriot League championships.

A Familiar Foe

Not too long ago, the Flames and the Phoenix were pioneers in Big South football, battling it out for the league's first title in 2002. The Phoenix claimed victory in 2002, 56-35, at home, helping Elon post one of eight victories over 11 games against the Flames. The Phoenix have won five out of the last six meetings, with Liberty's lone victory in the recent run being a 27-17 win, closing out the 2004 campaign in Lynchburg on Nov. 20. Overall, Elon leads the series 3-2 when facing the Flames in Lynchburg.

Twice as Nice

Liberty's victory over VMI on Nov. 8, coupled with Gardner-Webb's loss to Coastal Carolina, gave the Flames the Big South Conference title for the second straight season. Liberty is one of three programs in league history to win consecutive titles. Gardner-Webb hoisted back-to-back trophies in 2002 and 2003, while Coastal Carolina reeled off three straight championship seasons in 2004, 2005 and 2006.

Home Sweet Home

Today, the Flames welcome visiting Elon to Williams Stadium, a facility Liberty has called home for the past 20 seasons. Liberty rallied for a 37-19 victory over Towson State on Oct. 21, 1989, and has won 65 percent of its contests since, having posted a 72-38 record at the on-campus facility. Last year, the Flames went undefeated at home for the second time in program history, posting a school-record 6-0 mark.

Sensational Sellouts

Thanks to soaking rains in the greater Lynchburg area two days prior to last weekend's match-up with Gardner-Webb, the Flames had their "sellout" streak snapped as 10,636 saw Liberty seal up its second straight Big South title. Prior to the contest, Liberty had filled Williams Stadium beyond capacity 11 straight times. Since head coach Danny Rocco has arrived at Liberty, the Flames have filled Williams Stadium beyond capacity 13 out of 18 games. Liberty has posted a 15-3 record during those contests, averaging 13,121 fans per home game.

Attending to the National Numbers

Following its 12th-consecutive 10,000-plus crowd at Williams Stadium in the Flames' 30-10 victory over Gardner-Webb last weekend, Liberty ranks as one of the nation's elite FCS programs in terms of home attendance figures. The Flames now rank No. 4 nationally in filling stadium capacity (117.05 percent), No. 9 in total home attendance (84,275) and No. 13 in average home attendance (14,046).

Packing Them In at a Record Pace

Six straight 10,000-plus games have Liberty on the verge of breaking its all-time season attendance record at Williams Stadium. The Flames have packed in 84,275 fans into their 12,000-seat on campus facility during their six home games. The season total leaves Liberty just 865 fans away from breaking last year's record of 85,140. If the figure is surpassed, it would mark the third straight year Liberty has set a new attendance record. The 2006 season started the attendance figure climbing trend, when Liberty has 66,765 fans see six home games.

Saturday Night Lights

Under head coach Danny Rocco, the Flames are 11-3 in night games. Since 1976, Liberty has compiled a 53-65-3 record in night games.

In Broad Daylight

Under head coach Danny Rocco, the Flames are 12-7 in games played during the day. Since 1976, Liberty is 114-114-1 in day games.

Natural Versus Artificial Surfaces

Under head coach Danny Rocco, the Flames are 17-7 on artificial turf and 6-3 on natural grass. Overall, Liberty is 97-108-4 on natural grass and 77-75 on artificial turf. The

Flames play their home games at Williams Stadium, which has an artificial surface, as new state-of-the-art FieldTurf was installed prior to the start of the 2006 season. Liberty has posted a 15-3 record at home since the new surface was installed.

Overtime Update

The Flames enter today's game having posted a 3-5 record in overtime games. Liberty's last overtime game came on Sept. 15, 2007, when the Flames dropped a 48-41 decision to William & Mary in double overtime in Williamsburg, Va.

Liberty has only played two of its eight overtime games away from Williams Stadium. Liberty's first extra-period game was a 34-28 road loss to Morgan State on Sept. 21, 1996. Liberty's last victory in an overtime contest came on Nov. 22, 2003, when it closed out the 2003 campaign with a 49-42 win over Hofstra.

Raising Up No. 71

Prior to the start of the Flames' contest against Tusculum on Sept. 1, 2007, Liberty ceremonially honored founder Dr. Jerry Falwell, who had passed away the previous May, by starting a new game day tradition. Members of the University Police force raised a No. 71 flag underneath the Liberty Flames flag above the South end zone, just prior to the team taking the field, bringing the 14,925 fans in attendance to their feet.

The new tradition has become a permanent part of the Flames' pregame ceremonies at all home football games. A different person/group will receive the honor of raising the flag at each game. Today's honorees are parents from Liberty's senior class, representing the family members who helped honor Liberty 26 seniors before kickoff.

Back in the Big South

Liberty is in the midst of its seventh season of competition in Big South Conference action today. Since beginning league play in 2002, Liberty has posted an 18-10 Big South record, thanks to a perfect championship seasons in 2007 (4-0) and 2008 (5-0), while posting back-to-back 3-1 records in 2003 and 2004.

From "Good2Great"

Liberty captured its first-ever Big South championship last year, sweeping through the conference with an unblemished 4-0 league record. Liberty was the fifth program in league history to finish a conference campaign undefeated, winning its Big South games by more than 30 points per game (47.8 average points scored to 17.0 average points allowed).

At the Top Again

For the second year in a row, the Flames were named the preseason favorites to hoist the Big South trophy at the end of the season. Liberty garnered 12 out of 13 first-place votes in the annual Big South coaches and media preseason poll and finished 19 points ahead of second-place Coastal Carolina in total votes.

Noting the Streak

Liberty had its 11-game winning streak snapped on Oct. 18 with a 35-21 loss to Patriot League contender Lafayette. Below is a breakdown of where the streak ranked on the program, conference and national scenes heading into the contest against the Leopards:

- It was the longest winning streak in program history (bettering a 10-game winning streak which spanned the 1988 and 1989 seasons)
- It was the second longest in Big South history (longest was 14-straight by Charleston Southern over the 2005 and 2006 seasons)
- It was the nation's longest active winning streak among FCS programs (ranking ahead of Sacred Heart, James Madison, San Diego and Elon, who all had won six-straight games)

Not Many in the NCAA Could Say the Same

Liberty's 11-game winning streak ranked as the longest active winning streak among FCS programs prior to its loss to Lafayette on Oct. 18. At the time of the loss, Liberty was one of six NCAA programs to own a double-digit winning streak out of 629 total NCAA programs (FBS – 120, FCS – 123, Division II – 150 and Division III – 236). The Flames were joined in the elite group by BYU (FBS, 16-straight), Tuskegee (Division II, 20-straight), Bloomsburg (Division II, 12-straight), American International (Division II, 10-straight) and Wisconsin-Whitewater (Division III, 18-straight).

Big South Barrage

Despite the Flames' 11-game winning streak coming to an end against Lafayette on Oct. 18, one streak remains alive for Liberty, as the Flames have reeled off 11-straight Big South victories dating back to the 2006 season. The last time the Flames dropped a Big South contest was on Oct. 28, when Liberty fell, 28-26, to No. 22 Coastal Carolina. The league run is the longest in Big South history, bettering Coastal Carolina's eight-game conference winning streak that spanned three seasons (11/22/03—10/29/05).

Fierce In Front of Their Own Fans

Not only did the loss to Lafayette on Oct. 18 snap the nation's longest FCS winning streak, but it also halted an 11-game home winning streak for Liberty. The successful home victory run was the longest in program history and was the second longest in the nation at the time among FCS programs. San Diego held the nation's longest FCS home winning streak at 28 games at the time of Liberty's loss.

Voters Continue To Move Flames Up

For the second straight week, Liberty's Big South victory helped the Flames climb slightly in the national FCS polls, as Liberty moved up two spots in both the FCS Coaches poll and Sports Network rankings. Liberty enters the game ranked No. 20 in the FCS Coaches poll and No. 22 in the Sports Network listing. The Flames have been ranked among the nation's Top 25 programs for 10-straight weeks, setting a program record for consecutive weeks in the national polls.

More from the Polls

Speaking of votes, Liberty Head Coach Danny Rocco and Sparky, the program's mascot, are currently in the running for two national honors. In the fan portion of the poll for the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year honor, Rocco ranked second in the Division I-AA listing, as of Wednesday, while Sparky is the second leading write-in candidate in the Capital One Mascot Challenge. Voting in both fan polls opened during the first week of the year and will conclude directly following the conclusion of the regular season.

Sensational Shutouts

For the second time under head coach Danny Rocco, the Flames recorded multiple shutouts in the same season. Earlier this year, the Flames blanked Stony Brook, 33-0, in the Seawolves' first-ever Big South game. On Oct. 25, the Flames shut out Charleston Southern, 42-0, making Liberty the first-ever Big South team to shut out back-to-back opponents. The blanking was the sixth under head coach Danny Rocco and the 19th in program history.

Third and Climbing

In just three seasons, head coach Danny Rocco has moved into third place on the Flames all-time coaching ranks, as Liberty's victory over VMI last weekend was Rocco's 22nd at Liberty, moving him past Ken Karcher (21-46). Ranking ahead of Rocco are Tom Dowling with 33 wins (33-38-2) and Sam Rutigliano, who is the winningest coach in program history (67-53).

Offensive Obsession

For the eighth-straight game and the 10th time this year, the Flames surpassed the 400 total offensive yard mark against Gardner-Webb last Saturday, finishing the game with 442 total offensive yards against the Bulldogs. The yardage run currently has Liberty ranked No. 8 nationally in the statistical category, averaging 450.36 total offensive yards per game.

Just Off the Mark Again

For the fourth time in five games, the Flames missed surpassing the 200-yard rushing mark, as Liberty ran for 195 yards in its 20-point victory over Gardner-Webb last Saturday. Liberty currently ranks No. 11 nationally, by averaging 220.82 rushing yards per game. Since head coach Danny Rocco's arrival in 2006, Liberty has averaged 207.2 rushing yards per game and has surpassed the 200-yard plateau in 15 out of 33 games.

Keeping Your Eyes on the Skies

Those in attendance at Saturday afternoon's game are apt to see some high-flying action, as one of the nation's best aerial attacks will be pitted against a team which has frequented the skies themselves lately. Elon currently ranks No. 25 nationally, as they are averaging 248.18 passing yards per game. The Phoenix have thrown for 200 or more yards in nine out of 11 games and four times for 250-plus yards.

The Flames posted their third-highest passing total of the year last week, when Liberty's quarterbacks completed 13-of-21 passing attempts for 247 yards. Liberty has surpassed the 200-yard passing mark the last five games, throwing for two passing scores in each. The Flames currently rank No. 37 nationally by averaging 229.55 passing yards per game.

Senior Day Salute

Today's game will mark the final home game for 26 players, who have played a part in changing the culture of Liberty football. This talented group of seniors has turned a program, which was 1-10 during their freshman years, around into a two-time Big South championship team.

Best of the Best

The Liberty vs. Elon game, being played today at Williams Stadium, is one of five match-ups across the FCS nation pitting two Top 25 programs against each other. The last time two nationally ranked teams faced off against each other in Lynchburg was on Nov. 15, 1997, when No. 21 Hofstra upended No. 19 Liberty, 40-27. The Flames dropped a pair of games to nationally ranked teams at home that year, as they also lost to No. 25 Hampton, 33-27, in overtime, marking the team's lone setbacks during its 9-2 record-setting campaign.

Nine Is Really Nice

Speaking of the 1997 season, the 2008 version of the Flames matched the 1997 squad and one other on Saturday when Liberty defeated Gardner-Webb, 30-10, to pick up their ninth win of the season. Only three teams in program history have reached the nine-win plateau, as Liberty also did so in 1997 with a 9-2 record and in 1979 with a 9-1-1 mark.

Sweeter the Second Time Around

Liberty won its Big South record 11th-consecutive game last Saturday, defeating Gardner-Webb, 30-10, to cap off its second straight Big South title and a 5-0 season. The Flames are the third program in league history to win consecutive Big South championships and the second to do so with unblemished records. Gardner-Webb also did so in claiming the league's first two titles in 2002 and 2003.

Danny Remains Defense

The Flames held Charleston Southern to 191 total offensive yards on Oct. 25, helping guide Liberty to a 42-0 shutout victory. The figure marked a new season low for a Liberty opponent and was the third fewest yards allowed since head coach Danny Rocco took over the team in 2006. Liberty currently ranks No. 54 nationally in total defense, allowing an average of 340.82 total offensive yards per game.

A Decisive Number

The Flames' prolific offense is starting to catch the eye of the nation, as Liberty ranks No. 15 in scoring offense (34.36 points per game). The 30-point mark seems to be the key number for a Flames victory, as Liberty is 19-2 under head coach Danny Rocco when Liberty scores more than 30 points in a game. The Flames are 4-8 under Rocco when Liberty fails to reach the 30-point threshold.

Record Book Review

Liberty enters its match-up with Southern Conference foe Elon on the verge of setting a new team rushing record. The Flames, which rank No. 11 nationally in rushing yards per game (220.82), need 186 yards to surpass the 2003 squad, who ran for a program-best 2,614 yards. The Flames also need three more rushing touchdowns to tie the 1979 team, who found the end zone 31 times.

Liberty has already set a new record for total offensive yards (4,954), surpassing the 1994 team who finished the year with 4,856 yards. The Flames' current season averages in rushing yards per game, total offensive yards per game (441.5) and passing completion percentage (64.4) currently ranks ahead of the school record in each category.

Points a Plenty under Rocco

In eight out of 11 games this year, the Flames have scored 30 or more points, doing so again in a 30-10 victory over Gardner-Webb last weekend. Liberty currently ranks No. 15 nationally in scoring offense, as the Flames are averaging 34.36 points per game. Last year, the Flames were No. 3 in scoring offense, averaging a program and Big South-record 42.6 points per game. Since head coach Danny Rocco took over the program in 2006, Liberty has averaged 33.4 points scored per game, and Liberty is 19-2 in contests in which LU rolled up 30 or more points in a game.

Don't Forget About the "D"

Despite Liberty's gaudy offensive numbers over the past two-plus seasons, the Flames' defense has played a significant factor in the team's success, bringing a smile to head coach Danny Rocco's face, as he is a 20-plus year defensive coaching veteran. Since 2006, Liberty has held its opponents to an average of 19.1 points per game, meaning Liberty is outscoring its opponents by more than two touchdowns per game (an average of 14.3 points per game) over the span.

Better than All the Rest

One of the busiest crews on the field during a Liberty football game is the "chain gang", as Liberty enters today's match-up with Elon as the nation's leader in third-down conversions. The Flames finished last weekend's game against Gardner-Webb picking up a first down 7-of-13 times, giving Liberty a 53.2 third-down conversion rate on the season (75-of-141). The Flames are averaging 6.8 third-down conversions per game.

Beating Them at the Own Game

The Flames rushed for 195 yards against Gardner-Webb last week, nearly doubling the Bulldogs season average they have been allowing to opponents in 2008. Gardner-Webb came into the game allowing an average of 110.6 rushing yards per game, having held seven of its first 10 opponents under the century mark.

Elon enters the game No. 52 nationally in rushing defense, allowing 139.45 rushing yards per game, including 202 yards to No. 2 Appalachian State last weekend. However, the Phoenix have surrendered the 22nd fewest rushing touchdowns in FCS, allowing only 11 this year.

Knowing the Number

Liberty's defense enters today's game on the verge of setting a new program record. The Flames are allowing 131.64 rushing yards per game. Should the Flames hold Elon to 90 or less team rushing yards, Liberty's defense would set a new program record, surpassing last year's team who limited opponents to 128.5 rushing yards per game. Elon ranks No. 48 in rushing offense (151.82 rushing yards per game) and has been held below 90 yards three times this year.

Frequent First Downs

Liberty's potent offensive attack and high third-down conversion rate have the Flames ranked among the nation's elite in another statistical category. Liberty ranks No. 15 in first down offense, picking up an average of 21.55 first downs per game (237 total). Should the Flames continue to pick up first downs at the same rate, Liberty would break a school record.

The Flames are on pace to pick up 259 total first downs this year, which would surpass the 1993 squad, who finished the year with 241 first downs. Elon is equally as impressive in the statistical category, ranking ahead of Liberty at No. 13 by averaging 21.73 first downs per game.

First Down Frenzy

For just the third time this year, Liberty failed to reach the 20 first down mark against Gardner, as the Flames finished with 19 first downs in a 20-point victory over the Bulldogs. Prior to the contest, Liberty had finished 13 out of 15 games with 20 or more first downs. Three games ago against Presbyterian, Liberty finished with 26 first downs, the second highest total by the Flames this year.

Fewer Flags Go Flying

Liberty and Gardner-Webb nearly completed a first last Saturday, as it wasn't until the 11:55 mark of the fourth quarter that either team was penalized. Gardner-Webb was called for a false start, while Flames were whistled for the same infraction two minutes later (9:45), accounting for the lone two flags during the entire game. The last time Liberty finished a game with only one penalty was against Norfolk State on Nov. 8, 2003.

During the first three games of the year, Liberty averaged 10.7 penalties per game for an average of 101 penalty yards (32 total penalties/303 total penalty yards). Over the last eight games, Liberty totaled 32 infractions for 248 total yards (averaging 4.0 penalties and 31.0 penalty yards per contest).

Trying to Take Better Care of the Ball

For the eighth time in 11 games, Liberty finished a contest with a positive turnover margin. Liberty gave up the ball once on a fourth quarter fumble, while forcing Gardner-Webb to turn the ball over five times. This was the fourth time a Danny Rocco led football team has forced five giveaways and the first since doing so against VMI last year. The Flames currently rank No. 27 nationally in turnover margin (0.63). During Liberty's first two years under head coach Danny Rocco, the Flames valued possession of the football, ranking No. 7 in turnover margin in 2007 (1.27 per game) and No. 20 in 2006 (0.55 per game).

The Ideal Job

If you are looking for the "cushy" job on the Flames roster, you'll find it in the area of punting. Liberty enters today's game as the team tied for the fourth fewest total punts among FCS programs so far in 2008. The Flames have been forced to punt the ball away 31 times over 11 games (2.8 times per game). Fewer punts mean Liberty's offense is successful, but it has hurt its punting game, as Liberty ranks second to last among FCS programs in net punting (25.77).

Road Warriors

Prior to Liberty's loss at Presbyterian on Nov. 1, the Flames had claimed victory in five-straight road games. The run was the longest road winning streak in Big South history and was the second-longest active winning streak among FCS programs. Lafayette, who entered the same week with the nation's longest FCS winning streak, suffered a setback to Colgate on the road, leaving Cal Poly with the nation's longest current winning streak at five games.

Great Out of the Gate

For the second time in program history, the Flames started the season with a 6-0 record before falling to Lafayette on Oct. 18. Liberty also accomplished the feat in 1989; however, the Flames are hoping for a better finish than the previous 6-0 squad, as the 1989 team lost four out of its last five games to close out the year 7-4.

Brock's Best Friends

After allowing three sacks in its season opener against North Greenville, the Flames offensive line has banded together to allow just five sacks over the last 10 games. Liberty currently ranks No. 4 nationally, as the Flames are surrendering 0.73 sacks per game. Last year, Liberty finished the season ranked No. 4 in the country, as the Flames allowed 0.73 sacks per contest. All in all, the Flames have allowed less than a sack per game (0.82/27 in 33 games) since head coach Danny Rocco took over the program in 2006.

A Pair of Picks

For the fourth time this year, the Flames finished a game with multiple interceptions, as Liberty picked off two passes last weekend against Gardner-Webb. Liberty currently ranks second in the Big South by averaging 1.1 interceptions per game, having picked off 12 passes in 11 games.

Returning Rampage

Liberty finished the Presbyterian game on Nov. 1 with a season-high six kickoff returns for 124 total yards. The yardage total was the third highest this year, falling one yard shy of tying the team's mark of 125 yards against Western Carolina and Coastal Carolina. Liberty currently ranks No. 13 nationally in kickoff returns, averaging 22.81 yards per return. The Flames are one of 30 FCS programs to have returned a kickoff for a touchdown in 2008, recording a 76-yard return by Jonathan Crawford against North Greenville in its season opener.

Punt Return Power Down

After five games, the Flames were ranked as one of the top punt return teams in the nation, averaging 17.6 yards per punt return. However, Liberty's last six opponents have kept the Flames from returning punts, as the Flames have returned just six punts over the last six games for a total of zero yards. Last week, Gardner-Webb punted the ball away twice, with neither time Liberty returning the kick. Following the lower punt return

numbers, Liberty now ranks No. 28 nationally in punt returns, averaging 12.24 yards per return. Last year, Liberty ranked No. 8 in return yards per punt (14.24)

Kings of the Return Game

James Madison held onto its No. 1 ranking in FCS football following the weekend of Oct. 18, thanks to a last-second punt return for a touchdown, the Dukes' fourth such return of the season. Liberty and James Madison are among a select few in the nation at the FCS level, as the two programs are joined by 16 others who have returned at least one punt and one kickoff for a touchdown in 2008.

Keeping Them Out of the Backfield

For the eighth time in 11 games, Flames opponents failed to record more than three tackles for a loss against Liberty, as Gardner-Webb tallied three TFLs for a combined loss of 12 yards last weekend. The Flames currently rank No. 3 nationally in fewest tackles for a loss allowed per game (3.55), resulting in a loss of 14.1 average yards per game. Elon also has had some success in the statistical area, ranking No. 13 in tackles for a loss allowed (4.45/24.2 per game).

Red Zone Rapport

Liberty enters today's game scoring on 81.2 percent of their trips inside the Red Zone (39-of-48). The Flames opponent this week, Elon, has succeeded at an even better clip, ranking No. 2 nationally by scoring on 92.7 percent of its drives the get inside their opponents 20-yard line.

On the defensive side of the statistical category, Liberty ranks well ahead of Elon. The Flames rank No. 33 in Red Zone defense, allowing their opponents to score 75.0 percent of the time. Elon ranks No. 102 (out of 118), as the Phoenix defense is allowing opponent to cross the goal line at an 86.2 percent clip.

Legends Enshrined

During Liberty's annual Homecoming game on Oct. 25, the Liberty University Athletics Department honored long-time head coach Sam Rutigliano and former AFC Rookie of the Year and Pro Bowler Eric Green. The pair of Liberty legends joined founder Dr. Jerry Falwell, as jerseys were retired in honor of their accomplishments. A "HC" jersey now hangs in honor of Rutigliano, while a No. 86 jersey rests next to Rutigliano's, paying tribute to Green's storied career at Liberty.

Coaches on the Field

At halftime of the Flames' annual Spring Football Game on April 19, head coach Danny Rocco tabbed six players for leadership roles in 2008, when the skipper named his team captains. Quarterback Brock Smith, running back Rashad Jennings and center Mike Godsil were named offensive team captains. Defensively, nose guard Colin Dugan, linebacker Nick Hursky and defensive back Ryan Greiser were recognized as this year's defensive team captains.

The League's Elite

Rashad Jennings was tabbed the Big South Preseason Offensive Player of the Year at the conference's annual media day on July 25. Jennings, last year's Big South Offensive Player of the Year, set new Big South records in rushing touchdowns (15), all-purpose yards (154.3 per game), total touchdowns scored (17) and points scored (104). Jennings, along with seven other Flames, was named to the Big South's preseason all-conference team, giving Liberty more preseason selects than any other program in the conference this year.

Duo Grabs All-America Honors

Rashad Jennings and Dominic Bolden were named to the Sports Network's Preseason All-America teams on Aug. 22. Jennings grabbed first-team honors as the nation's premium FCS running back, while Bolden was recognized for his stellar return abilities as a third-team honoree at kickoff return specialist. Both Jennings and Bolden were named to the Sports Network's honorable-mention All-America squad at their respective positions at the end of the 2007 campaign.

Streak Comes to and End

For the first time in 11 games, Rashad Jennings failed to reach the 100-yard mark in game. A head injury caused the running back to miss most of the second half against Gardner-Webb, limiting him to 56 yards on 14 carries. Jennings had reached the 100-yard mark in the previous 10 straight games, setting a new program and Big South record for consecutive 100-yard games.

Big South's Best

Rashad Jennings rushed for 147 yards and two touchdowns against VMI on Nov. 8, allowing the senior to become the Big South's all-time leading rusher in just three seasons. The rushing figure against the Keydets pushed him above former Flame Dre Barnes, who

finished the last three years of his career playing in the Big South, where he ran for 3,409 yards.

Tops of the List

Besides passing Dre Barnes for the Big South all-time rushing mark, Rashad Jennings bested one of Barnes' Liberty markers. Jennings rushed for 147 yards on 24 carries against VMI on Nov. 8, marking his 21st career 100-yard game. Barnes finished his four-year career with 20 100-yard games, while Jennings has surpassed the mark in 21 out of 29 career games over a three-year span.

Making it Look Easy

For the ninth-consecutive game, running back Rashad Jennings recorded a rushing touchdown, finding the end zone on a six-yard run midway through the second quarter against Gardner-Webb. The score gave the senior 272 career points at Liberty, continuing to expand his career record as the Flames' all-time scoring leader among non-kicking players.

Jennings needs 15 more points to become the Big South player with the most points scored by a non-kicking player, as Coastal Carolina's Aundres Perkins holds the record with 286 points.

Leader of the Pack

For the third straight game and the 15th time in his career, Rashad Jennings recorded multiple rushing touchdowns in the same games, as he scored twice against VMI on Nov. 8. Following a score against Gardner-Webb last weekend, Jennings now has 41 career rushing touchdowns, which is a program record and ranks five behind Coastal Carolina Aundres Perkins, who set the Big South's record in 2006 with 46 career rushing touchdowns.

Mr. Consistency

With his 127 rushing yards against Charleston Southern on Oct. 25, Rashad Jennings hit the 1,000-yard mark on the nose for the season. Since joining the Flames roster in 2006, Jennings has reached the 1,000-yard plateau all three seasons to become the first running back in program and Big South history to accomplish the feat.



Single-Season Best

Rashad Jennings might have had his 100-yard streak halted last week against Gardner-Webb, but his 56 yards allowed him to set a single-season program and Big South record. Entering today's game, Jennings has rushed for 1,391 yards, surpassing Dre Barnes' mark of 1,347 yards set in 2003.

One of the Best

Rashad Jennings enters the game leading the Big South in rushing yards per game, scoring and all-purpose yards. The senior is averaging 139.1 rushing yards per game, which ranks No. 4 nationally in the statistical category. Jennings also ranks tied for No. 5 in the country in scoring (10.80 points per game) and No. 16 in average all-purpose yards (156.90).

Still One First for Jennings

Despite just becoming the Big South's all-time career leading rusher, Rashad Jennings is still shooting for a conference single-season record. The senior has yet to lead the league in rushing for a year. During his first two years, Jennings has finished just behind two different Keydets. In 2006, he finished two yards behind Sean Mizzer (1,022 to 1,020 yards). Last year, he finished eight yards behind Howard Abegesah (1,121 to 1,113), meaning Jennings has missed the mark by a combined 10 yards over his first two years at Liberty.

Single-Season King

Rashad Jennings enters this weekend's final regular-season match-up having rushed for 16 touchdowns this year. The figure is the highest in Big South history, besting his own mark set last year of 15 rushing touchdowns and is tied for the program record. Lawrence Worthington first ran for 16 touchdowns in 1995.

A Scoring Machine

Last weekend against Gardner-Webb, Rashad Jennings scored his 18th touchdown of the year (16 rushing and two receiving). The 18 scores gives the senior 108 points on the year, setting a new program and Big South record. Jennings, who currently ranks No. 5 nationally in scoring average (10.8 points per game), set a new program and Big South record by recording 104 points to rank No. 6 in scoring (11.33 points per game). Jennings is the only player in program history reach the 100-point mark in consecutive seasons.

Streaking Quarterback Halted

After back-to-back games with 250 or more passing yards, Brock Smith failed to reach the mark against Presbyterian on Nov. 1. He finished the game against the Blue Hose with his lowest completion percentage of the season at 50.0 percent (15-of-30), marking the first time this year the quarterback has failed to finish a game with a completion percentage above the 60 percent mark. The consecutive 250-yard passing performances gave Smith nine for his career, which ranks seventh in program history.

Playing with the Big Boys

Brock Smith's 269 passing yards against Charleston Southern on Oct. 25, his fourth best single-game passing

performance in his career. The figure pushed him over the 6,000 career passing mark, making him the fourth quarterback in program and Big South to accomplish the feat. Smith enters today's game with 6,763 career passing yards, with his 226 yards against Gardner-Webb moving him into second place on the Big South's all-time list. During the contest, he surpassed Coastal Carolina's Tyler Thippen (6,598 yards), who is currently the starting quarterback for the Kansas City Chiefs, and Gardner-Webb's Nick Roberts (6,690 yards).

Always on the Mark

Brock Smith enters today's game as one of the most efficient passers in the nation. The senior currently ranks No. 7 nationally in passing efficiency, boasting a 162.64 passer ranking. Should the season end today, Smith would finish his career as the most proficient passer in Liberty and Big South history. The senior has a 148.0 career passer efficiency rating, ranking ahead of Charleston Southern's Collin Drafts (134.4) and Liberty's Robby Justino (132.6) in the respective rankings.

A Dynamic Duo

Against Lafayette and Charleston Southern, Jonathan Crawford and Dominic Bolden pulled off a feat no two other wide receivers have in program history. The pair became the 16th receiving duo to surpass the 100 yard receiving mark in the same game against Lafayette. The following weekend, they exceeded the century mark again to become the first pair to do so in consecutive games. Prior to the Lafayette game, the last time two receivers surpassed the 100 yard mark in the same game was against Charleston Southern on Nov. 10, 2001. Adrian Hall (133 yards) and Daniel Thomas (110 yards) did so, helping the Flames down the Buccaneers, 45-31.

Senior's Streak Comes to an End

VMI was the first opponent in four games to keep Dominic Bolden from surpassing the 100-yard receiving mark, as the senior finished the contest with four receptions for 51 yards. Bolden became the fourth player in program history to surpass the 100-yard mark for three straight games, doing so against Lafayette (150 yards), Charleston Southern (117 yards) and Presbyterian (111 yards). The last receiver to surpass the 100-yard mark in three consecutive games was Courtney Freeman in 1997. The program's all-time record for consecutive 100-yard receiving games was set by Pat Nelson at five games over the span of the 1990-91 seasons.

Dominic Demands Notice

Following his third straight 100-yard game giving him five for his career, Dominic Bolden has put himself in the position to add his name to the program's record book. The senior now has 961 receiving yards to his credit, marking the most single-season receiving yards in the last 10 years and the third best single-season performance in program history.

Only two players in program history have finished a season with 1,000 or more receiving yards. Fred Banks finished the 1984 season with 1,029 receiving yards, while Pat Nelson holds the program's single-season record at 1,075 yards set in 1991. Bolden currently leads the Big South and ranks No. 22 nationally by averaging 87.36 receiving yards per game.

Career Day for Crawford

After posting his first 100-yard receiving game against Lafayette, Jonathan Crawford bettered his numbers against Charleston Southern. On Oct. 25, the senior led the Flames with six catches for 124 yards, while two of his six receptions went for touchdowns. The senior now has 683 receiving yards on the year, which is more five times his career total coming into the 2008 season (134 yards on 11 receptions).

Rasberry Rises to the Occasion

Corey Rasberry had a career day against VMI on Nov. 8, catching two passes for 53 yards and a touchdown to help the Flames clinch its second straight Big South title. The senior's first reception was a 19-yard touchdown catch in the first quarter, followed by a career-long reception of 34 yards in the second. The touchdown catch for Rasberry, who came into the game having caught 12 career passes for 124 yards, was his first of any level of organized football.

The Over the Hill Gang

Celebrating the number 40 is often frowned upon, as the 40th birthday is known as moving "over the hill." However, for senior Mike Godsfil it is a number of endearment. Against Lafayette, the senior started his 40th-consecutive career game, doing so at center for each game since he joined the roster as a freshman in 2005. Against Presbyterian on Nov. 1, Godsfil was joined in the elite club by Patrick Calvary, who started his 40th career game. However, Calvary suffered an injury against the Blue Hose, which kept the senior out of the line-up on Nov. 8.

Terrell's Touchdown Run Comes to an End

For the first time in 18 games, Zach Terrell failed to record a rushing touchdown in a game, as the senior finished the Western Carolina game on Sept. 13 with eight carries for 51 yards without finding the end zone. Prior to the game against the Catamounts, the last time Terrell played in a game without rushing for a touchdown was on Sept. 30, 2006, when the then sophomore carried the ball four times for 20 yards without finding the end zone against Wake Forest.

Sensational Specialist

Liberty has two of the nation's best return specialists on its roster in seniors Dominic Bolden and Jonathan Crawford. Bolden, who currently ranks No. 10 nationally by averaging 15.27 yards per punt return, is the Big South's all-time leader with 1,369 career kickoff return yards and three kick offs returned for a touchdown. Bolden also ranks atop the program's listing with a 29.1 kickoff return yard average. Bolden's wideout partner Crawford currently ranks tied for No. 12 nationally, as the senior is averaging 26.59 yards per kickoff return. Both return specialists have returned a kickoff and a punt for a touchdown to account for two of three players in Big South history to accomplish the feat.

Against the Nation's Best

The Flames have won their last two match-ups against Top 25 teams, defeating No. 23 Youngstown, 31-28, earlier this year and No. 24 Charleston Southern, 34-20, on Nov. 11, 2006. All-time Liberty is 9-39 against nationally-ranked FCS programs.

The Purpose-Driven Pair

Liberty is the only team at the FCS level to have two players rank in the Top 25 individually in all-purpose running yards. Rashad Jennings leads the Flames, as he is averaging 156.90 all-purpose yards per game, which ranks No. 16 nationally. Dominic Bolden leads the team in total all-purpose yards (1,640), but ranks No. 21 in the country by averaging 149.09 yards per game.

Total Team Effort

The Flames enter today's game with the best scoring defense in the Big South, while ranking No. 23 nationally by allowing a stingy 20.09 points per game. Senior linebacker Nick Hursky leads Liberty's defensive effort and ranks third in the Big South, as he is averaging 8.5 tackles per game. Hursky is followed on the Flames' defensive listing by Chris Rocco (6.4 per game) and Ryan Greiser (6.3). The trio are the lone three Liberty defenders in the conference's Top 30 individual tackles listing this year.

Duo Honored by Big South

Nick Hursky and Ben Shipp's accomplishments in helping the Flames defeat Gardner-Webb, 30-10 last Saturday, did not go unnoticed by the Big South, as the league honored them as players of the week on Monday. Hursky, this week's Defensive Player of the Week, posted his second-highest career tackle total to lead the Flames with 15 stops. Shipp earned Special Teams Player of the Week accolades after setting a new career high with nine points, as he was 2-of-2 on field goals and 3-of-3 on point-after attempts.

Defining the Word Student-Athlete

On Nov. 6, four Liberty starters were named to the ESPN the Magazine CoSIDA Academic District 3 All-District team. Colin Dugan, Ryan Greiser, Dan Pope and Kevin Richard each received the academic distinction, helped in part by having a 3.30 cumulative GPA. The quartet now will move onto the national ballot for voting, which will determine the CoSIDA Academic All-America team, the highest academic honor a NCAA student-athlete can receive.

Rocco Rocketing to the Top

Having finished with a double-figure tackle total in three out of the last five games, defensive back Chris Rocco has quickly ascended to No. 2 on the Flames season tackle list. Rocco is coming off a career day against Gardner-Webb, finishing second on the team with a career high 11 stops, while recording his first two career fumble recoveries. He has now recorded 70 tackles in 2008, which ranks No. 10 in the Big South among all tacklers and second best among defensive backs.

Torpedo Tim

Tim Torrence gave Liberty's defensive backfield the spark it needed to keep Gardner-Webb's quarterback Devin Campbell in check last weekend. The speedy junior finished third on the team with eight stops, setting a new career high for Torrence, besting his seven tackles against Charleston Southern last year. Equally as important, the defensive back found his way twice into the Bulldogs backfield, resulting in his first two career sacks for a loss of 19 total yards.

Walter Payton Award Watch

What this year's candidates are doing in 2008

A plethora of preseason distinctions for Liberty's Rashad Jennings culminated with one of the nation's top FCS honors, as the running back was named to the preseason Walter Payton Award watch list on Aug. 29, 2008. The preseason list of the 16 best FCS offensive players in the nation was announced by the Sports Network, the organization which will conduct the voting for the prestigious honor.

The watch list was revised on Oct. 16, and Jennings was one of 13 holders from the original 16 preseason watch list members. The trio of newcomers to the list include Sam Houston State quarterback Rhett Bomar, Weber State quarterback Cameron Higgins and Monmouth running back David Sinisi.

The Sports Network will revisit the Walter Payton Award watch list two more times before voting commences. The list of 16 candidates will be reviewed early in November, before the finalized list will be handed over to the voting panel at the conclusion of the regular season.

The top three finalists will be announced by the Sports Network on Dec. 1, while the winner will be announced at the Sports Network FCS Awards Dinner, held on the eve of the NCAA Division I Football Championship game (Dec. 18).

Game No. 1 - Liberty 49, North Greenville 10

Aug. 30, 2008 - Lynchburg, Va. - Williams Stadium (15,311)

Liberty extended its FCS nation-leading home winning streak to nine-straight games, opening the year with a 49-10 win over visiting North Greenville, on Aug. 30, at a packed Williams Stadium.

With the victory, Liberty opened the year with a 1-0 record and moves its mark to 20-2 in its last 22 home-opening contests. The win was Liberty's third-straight by 30 or more points and fifth time in the previous six games. The loss dropped North Greenville to 0-1 on the season.

The victory also pushed Liberty's overall winning streak to six games, dating back to the previous year. The run was tied for third longest in program history and the longest since the Flames won six straight during the 1992 and 1993 seasons.

The game was played in front of 15,311 fans, which ranked as the second-largest crowd to attend a Liberty home game and the largest to ever see a Flames victory. The figure only ranked behind Liberty's 2006 contest against William & Mary, when 15,631 fans packed Williams Stadium for the Flames' annual Homecoming contest.

Early-game jitters plagued both squads with a pair of miscues leading to two turnovers on each squad's opening possession. Liberty won the coin toss and elected to receive, but on the 10th play of the drive, quarterback Brock Smith was sacked by Emmanuel Davis at the North Greenville 30-yard line, and the lost ball was picked up by Johnell Bell.

Not to be outdone by the Crusaders, Liberty's defense made its presence known six plays later. North Greenville passer Richard Harb tried to find an open receiver over the middle, but the Flames' Ryan Greiser tackled him just as he was trying to catch the ball, which caromed into the arms of Tim Torrence for his first career interception at Liberty's 39-yard line.

Eight plays later, Zach Terrell, who was moved to wide receiver in the offseason, found a way to continue his amazing rushing touchdown streak. The senior took a pitch from Smith and found the end zone 15 yards later for a score. The scoring burst gave Terrell his 17th-consecutive game with a rushing touchdown and lifted Liberty to a 7-0 edge with 3:01 left in the first.

Liberty's defensive backs made their second big play of the game, when Chuck Duffey stepped in front of a Harb pass at the North Greenville 36-yard line and returned it 27 yards, deep into the Crusaders' red zone.

Big South Preseason Player of the Year Rashad Jennings was handed the ball three-straight plays. On the third run, the senior found a hole over the left tackle for a two-yard rushing touchdown, giving Liberty a 14-0 lead with 1:19 left in the opening period.

On the second play of the second quarter, Harb was picked off again, this time by Greiser at the 40-yard line. Nearly three minutes later, Jennings took his third handoff of the drive and found the end zone for a six-yard rushing touchdown to push the Flames' lead to 21-0, 12:00 before halftime.

After the first three-and-out series of the game, Liberty quickly added to its lead with its first big offensive play of the game. Smith dropped back in the pocket at midfield and found Dominic Bolden open in the near corner of the end zone for a 48-yard scoring strike, extending the Flames' advantage to 28-0 with 9:25 left in the first half.

The North Greenville offense pieced together its first sustained drive of the first half, following the touchdown pass, getting inside Liberty's red zone.

However, the drive stalled at the seven yard line after a four-yard tackle for a loss by defensive captain Nick Hursky. The Crusaders had to settle for a 24-yard Michael Sears field goal to put the visitors on the scoreboard, 28-3, with 2:07 remaining before the intermission.

Liberty maintained its 28-3 advantage entering the locker room, but quickly added to its lead in the third quarter.

After gaining possession of the ball following a three-and-out series, Liberty extended its advantage when Smith found Jonathan Crawford open for an 18-yard scoring strike at the 12:16 mark of the third, sealing the victory for the homestanding Flames.

Liberty managed to score two more times the rest of the game, highlighted by a 76-yard kickoff return for a touchdown by Crawford midway through the third quarter.

Liberty rolled up 440 total offensive yards on the night, averaging 7.7 yards per play. The Crusaders finished the game with 247 total offensive yards, averaging 3.4 yards per play. The Flames led an even offensive attack, rushing for 241 yards and passing for 261. North Greenville predominantly passed during the game, amassing 178 yards in the air to 69 yards on the ground.

Penalties plagued the contest, as Liberty was whistled for 13 infractions for 136 yards to account for the most penalty yards under third-year head coach Danny Rocco.

Jennings posted his 13th career 100-yard rushing game, hitting the mark on the nose on 13 carries. The senior found the end zone twice during the contest, marking his 11th career multiple-touchdown game and the sixth time in the last seven contests. Terrell followed by rushing eight times for 70 yards and his 27th career rushing touchdown.

Smith had pinpoint accuracy on the evening, completing 14-of-17 pass attempts for 171 yards and two touchdowns. Spencer Landis saw considerable time in the second half, completing 3-of-4 passing attempts for 28 yards.

Bolden led eight different receivers, posting his first collegiate 100-yard game by catching five passes for 100 yards. Crawford followed by matching Bolden with five receptions for 44 yards. Both receivers finished the game with touchdown receptions.

Chad Brown led a near 100 team tackle total in the game (95 for Liberty), finishing the contest with a career-best seven stops. The linebacker duo of Patrick Bannon and Nick Hursky ended the game with six stops apiece.

Game No. 2 - Liberty 44, Glenville State 27

Sept. 6, 2008 - Lynchburg, Va. - Williams Stadium (13,917)

Five of Liberty's six touchdowns on the evening were for 20 or more yards, pushing the Flames to a 44-27 victory over Glenville State, on Sept. 6, in front of 13,917 fans at Williams Stadium.

The victory, played in front of the seventh-largest crowd in program history, pushed Liberty's record to 2-0. The loss evened the Pioneers' record at 1-1 early in the 2008 season.

The 17-point win extended Liberty's home winning streak to 10 games, the longest in the country among FCS programs at the point of the contest. The Flames entered the game tied with Dayton, as the Flyers had also claimed nine-straight home wins. However, Dayton had the weekend off before it hosted Fordham at home on Sept. 13.

The Flames wasted little time getting on the scoreboard, finding the end zone on the fourth play of their opening possession. On a third-and-three play from the Liberty 28-yard line, quarterback Brock Smith dumped a pass off to Dominic Bolden.

The senior made an acrobatic catch, and following two key blocks down field, scoring on a 72-yard touchdown reception. The longest reception of Bolden's career put Liberty up 7-0 at the 12:14 mark of the first.

Liberty continued to pepper the airways, making quick work offensively. After a second three-and-out series, Smith's pin-point toss to Jonathan Crawford on the near side extended the Flames' lead to 14-0 on the third play of the ensuing drive with a 33-yard touchdown reception.

Big plays persisted, but this time for Glenville State, as the Pioneers found the scoreboard on the second-longest rushing touchdown surrender by a Danny Rocco-led football team.

Following a 34-yard sweep to the right by Jerry Seymour, the senior bettered the run by busting through the line for a 56-yard rushing touchdown with 8:01 left to play in the opening period.

Liberty responded by mounting its longest drive of the first quarter, pieced together a five-play drive that saw the Flames move the ball 58 yards for a score. Mike Brown tried to get into the lengthy-play category himself, when the redshirt freshman caught a ball in open space at midfield,

but he was shoved out of bounds by a pair of Pioneer defenders at the two-yard line.

Two plays later, Zach Terrell pushed his rushing touchdown streak to 18-consecutive games, finding a gap in the line for a one-yard score. Paul Young's point after attempt was blocked, leaving the score at 20-7 with 5:38 left to play in the high-scoring first period.

The margin remained the same until the second quarter, when Liberty's defense forced the Pioneers to punt for the third time in the game. Dustan Fox booted the ball 41 yards downfield with Bolden fielding it at the 28-yard line.

Just like his touchdown catch, the senior used several key blocks, which opened up holes for Bolden's first career punt return touchdown.

The senior's second of three scores on the evening was his fourth career special teams' return for a touchdown, following behind three kickoff returns.

Bolden showcased his big-play ability one last time before the halftime siren sounded, catching a 28-yard pass from Smith over his left shoulder in the far corner of the end zone to give Liberty a 27-7 intermission advantage.

A Matt Bevin's 38-yard field goal midway through the third quarter, followed by a 45-yard touchdown burst by Mike Brown in the fourth sealed the victory for the Flames. The Pioneers managed to tack on two late touchdowns during the final two minutes of the game and recovered an on-side kick for a third possession.

But a pair of negative-yardage stops of quarterback James McCants, including a nine-yard sack by Trey Jacobs closed out the victory.

Terrell posted his eighth career 100-yard rushing game, leading the Flames 239-yard rushing attack by carrying the ball 24 times for 110 yards and the one-yard touchdown.

Seymour rushed 15 times for 145 yards and a score, averaging an impressive 9.7 yards per rushing attempt.

Smith completed 7-of-11 pass attempts for 202 yards and three touchdowns. The contest marked the sixth time the quarterback has tossed three touchdowns in a single game and moved the senior into fourth

place on Liberty's all-time career touchdown passing list.

Smith now has 36 touchdown passes to his credit, moving past Ben Anderson's 35 touchdowns thrown during his four-year career (1994-97).

Crawford led the Flames with four receptions for 77 yards and a score. Bolden made the most of his three catches, finishing the game with 88 yards and two touchdown passes.

Bolden also finished the contest with 265 total all-purpose yards, ranking as the fifth most in Big South Conference single-game history.

A pair of newcomers paced the Flames defensive effort. Linebacker Jamal Giddens, who got his first career start on the evening, led Liberty with eight stops. Daryl Robertson followed with seven stops, including three and a half tackles for a loss.

Game No. 3 - No. 25 Liberty 19, Western Carolina 16

Sept. 13, 2008 - Cullowhee, N.C. - E.J. Whitmire Stadium (7,289)

No. 25 Liberty withstood two fourth-quarter touchdowns and made a key fourth-down stop with 1:39 remaining to hold on for a 19-16 road victory over Western Carolina, on Sept. 13, at E.J. Whitmore Stadium.

With the victory, the Flames moved to 3-0 for the first time since the 1997 season, a year Liberty finished its campaign with a 9-2 overall record. Western Carolina's second-straight loss dropped the Catamounts to 1-2 on the season.

The three-point win also pushed Liberty's winning streak to eight games, dating back to its 2007 Big South championship season. The winning streak was the second longest active winning streak among FCS program at the time, ranking one behind Dayton's nine-game streak. The Flyers also held on for a 23-20 home victory over Fordham earlier in the day.

After holding the homestanding Catamounts to a three-and-out series on their opening possession, Liberty methodically used its running game and a pair of key third-down conversions to take an early lead.

Rashad Jennings carried the ball five times for 17 yards, while quarterback Brock Smith completed 3-of-5 pass attempts for 37 yards to move the Flames into scoring position. A majority of the senior's passing yardage came on a 26-yard completion to Dominic Bolden on a third-and-10 play from Liberty's 45-yard line.

Ben Shipps capped the opening 12-play, 69-yard scoring drive, which used 5:03 on the game clock, by booting a 29-yard field goal through the uprights with 7:40 left on the first quarter game clock to give the Flames the early 3-0 edge.

Liberty looked like it might hold Western Carolina scoreless over the remainder of the period, including a stop on a third-and-six play from the Flames' 29-yard line. However, Liberty was whistled for a roughing the passer penalty on the play, extending the Catamounts possession.

Two plays later, Quan Warley picked up two precise blocks on the near side of the field, and scored on a 15-yard sweep. The scoring jaunt was the first career touchdown for Warley, and gave the Catamounts a 7-3 lead with 1:23 left to play in the opening quarter.

Following fumbles by both teams, Liberty drove downfield and tried to tack points on the scoreboard midway through the second quarter. But the drive stalled inside the Catamounts' red zone at the 13-yard line, leaving the Flames to settle for a field goal attempt.

However, a 30-yard attempt by Shipps was blocked by a leaping Chris Edwards at the line of scrimmage, leaving Western Carolina a four-point lead with 5:47 left to play before halftime.

Liberty's offense had one more chance before intermission, driving down to the Catamounts' four-yard line. The Flames looked like they might get their first touchdown of the evening, when Smith broke out of the pocket and found Corey Rasberry open in the flat.

But, the floating pass slipped through the tight end's fingers, leaving the Flames to settle for a 27-yard field goal by Shipps with 32:5 ticks left in the opening half, as the home team headed to the locker room with a 7-6 lead.

The Flames dominated every aspect of the game during the first 30 minutes of action, except on the scoreboard. Liberty held a 20:08-9:52 time of possession advantage and tallied 186 total offensive yards to Western Carolina's 81 total offensive yards.

Liberty continued to control the battle for the clock, grinding out an 80-plus yard, opening drive of the first half. But once again, the Catamounts kept the Flames out of the end zone, as Liberty took the lead momentarily on a 23-yard field goal by Shipps.

However, Western Carolina was whistled for an unsportsmanlike penalty on the kicking attempt to give Liberty a fresh set of downs.

And the Flames took advantage of the extra opportunity, when Dominic Bolden took the handoff on a reserve to the far side of the field. The senior scored when he completed his three-yard rushing play with a burst through two defenders, putting Liberty on top for the first time in the contest, 13-7, at the 8:44 mark of the third quarter. The 12-play, 86-yard drive used up 6:10 on the game clock.

With Western Carolina driving downfield, Liberty's defense forced its second

turnover of the evening. Ian Childress broke through the line and sacked Catamounts' quarterback Andy Horn for the second time, forcing a fumble, which was recovered by Chad Brown.

Eight plays later, Smith called his own number on a one-yard keeper, scoring his second career rushing touchdown to push Liberty's lead to 19-7 with 45.5 left to play in the third quarter. Shipps extra point was blocked, giving Liberty a 12 point edge.

The Catamounts quickly struck back on the first play of the fourth quarter, as Horn found Marquel Pittman open on a screen pass. The sophomore took the ball and found several holes in Liberty's downfield defense, scoring on a 78-yard touchdown reception. Blake Bostic continued the kicking struggles by both teams on the evening, missing the extra point to leave Liberty up six, 19-13, with 14:46 left to play in the ball game.

After a three-and-out series by Liberty, the Catamounts continued to pressure the Flames, getting down inside Liberty's red zone to the seven-yard line. But a nine-yard sack by Chad Brown, followed a delay of game penalty on Western Carolina forced the host team to settle for a 38-yard, Bostic field goal at 7:12 to pull within three points at 19-16.

A second straight three-and-out series forced Liberty to punt the ball away with 3:34 left to play, but Mike Larsson pinned the Catamounts deep in their own territory at the 10-yard line on the ensuing punt.

A six-yard pass play from Horn to Warley enabled Western Carolina to move the chains once. But four plays later, Horn's pass attempt to Adam Hearn fell short of the receiver to give Liberty possession of the ball and enable the Flames to wind out the clock.

At game's end, the Flames were still dominate in the box score totals. Liberty finished with 72 plays to the Catamounts 52 plays, enabling the Flames to outgain the home team 338 yards to 247. Liberty also finished the game with 37:36 of total time of possession.

Game No. 4 - No. 25 Liberty 31, No. 23 Youngstown State 28

Sept. 27, 2008 - Youngstown, Ohio - Stambaugh Stadium (20,630)

Rashad Jennings rushed for a career-best 220 yards and three touchdowns, but it was a 24-yard field goal by Matt Bevins as time expired that lifted No. 25 Liberty to a 31-28 victory over No. 23 Youngstown State, on Sept. 27, at Stambaugh Stadium.

With the victory, the Flames remained unbeaten in 2008, moving their record to 4-0 on the season, and extend their winning streak to an FCS-best nine-straight games. The win was Liberty's ninth over a ranked FCS opponent in program history and the first since Liberty defeated No. 24 Charleston Southern, 34-20, on Nov. 11, 2006.

Liberty won the game's coin toss and deferred to the Penguins, giving Youngstown State the ball to open the contest. And the home team took quick advantage of the game's first possession, methodically moving the ball downfield to score with 7:38 left in the first quarter.

Penguins quarterback Brandon Summers completed eight-of-eight passes to account for 62 of the team's 77 yards on the 13-play drive. The eighth-consecutive completion was a seven-yard slant to Dominique Barnes on the far side of the field, giving Youngstown State an early 7-0 lead.

Following a Brock Smith intercepted pass and the two teams trading three-and-out series, Summers kept his passing streak alive by completing his next four pass attempts to get the Penguins to the Liberty 18-yard line, ending the opening 15 minutes of action.

After resetting the chains at the south end of the stadium, Summers showed that he can do damage on the ground as well. The junior faked a pass attempt, freezing the defense and allowing the speedy hurler to burst up the middle and score on an 18-yard run, six seconds into the period, extending the home team's advantage to 14-0.

Liberty overcame its opening-quarter jitters, responding with a 70-yard scoring drive to pull back within seven points. The Flames kept to the ground for seven of the 10 plays in the drive, including the final play of the drive, which ate up 4:21 on the game clock.

Zach Terrell used blocks by Derek Bishop and Rashad Jennings to find a hole on the left side of the line for a three-yard rushing touchdown, giving the senior his 29th career rushing touchdown.

After forcing the Penguins to punt the ball away on the next possession, the Flames continued to pound away at Youngstown State with a ground attack.

Eight of Liberty's nine plays on the 86-yard drive, which lasted 4:48 on the clock, were of the rushing variety. Three were of note, as Jennings got the Flames into Youngstown State territory, bouncing off two defenders at the line of scrimmage to open up a hole for a 55-yard game, his fifth-longest run since joining the Flames' roster.

Three plays later, the drive would have stalled in the Penguins' red zone, but Smith tucked the ball away and the quarterback leaped over two defenders to pick up 10 yards on a third-and-seven play.

Jennings was handed the ball on the following three plays, including a two-yard scoring run to the near side of the field with 2:03 left before the intermission. The senior's 13th carry of the evening needed an extra effort to find the end zone, knotting the contest at 14-14.

Youngstown State tried to break the deadlock, quickly marching downfield on the ensuing drive and getting the ball down to the Flames' 16-yard line. But on third-and-six, Summers was flushed from the pocket and his sideline toss was picked off by Chuck Duffey with three seconds left on the game clock, leaving the game tied at half.

Liberty took the ball on its second possession of the second half and scored their 21th-unanswered point, thanks to a trick play and some strong rushing by Jennings.

At its own 36-yard line, Terrell took a pitch from Smith and the A-back player tossed his first pass since 2006, hooking up with Dominic Bolden 51 yards downfield. Prior to his career-long pass play, the one-time quarterback's last pass was against Charleston Southern on Nov. 11 of that season.

Three plays later, Jennings muscled his way into the end zone from two yards out, capping off an eight-play, 95-yard drive to push Liberty's lead to 21-14 with 2:21 left to play in the third.

Liberty's defense quickly forced the Penguins to punt the ball away on the ensuing drive. The three-and-out series was keyed by a pass break-up by Chris Rocco and an 11-yard sack by Jamal Giddens.

Bolden, who entered the game ranked No. 9 nationally in average punt return yards (17.5 per return), proved why he is one of the best return men in the nation. The senior broke several tackles on the far side of the field, staying in bounds all the way on a 52-yard punt return to the YSU six-yard line.

On the following play, Jennings once again got extra yardage on a rushing play, extending the nose of the football over the goal line for a six-yard rushing touchdown with 28 seconds left in the third quarter, boosting Liberty's lead to 14 points, 28-14.

However, homestanding Youngstown State didn't go down quietly, as the Penguins regrouped for a fourth-quarter charge. After Jonathan Crawford fumbled the ball at midfield following a reception, Youngstown State quickly moved downfield and pulled within seven, 28-21, when Summers capped an eight-play, 50-yard drive with a four-yard pass play to Donald Jones with 6:19 left.

Liberty, trying to run out the clock, managed to advance the ball to the Youngstown State 34-yard line. However, on a third-and-four play, Smith's attempted sideline pass was picked off by Mike Barlak with 2:31 left in the ballgame, giving the home team another chance.

Youngstown State continued to ride the strong throwing arm of Summers, as the junior completed six-straight passes to move the Penguins 64 yards downfield in just 52 seconds. The sixth and final pass was an 11-yard strike to Ferlando Williams in the near side of the end zone, tying the game at 28-28 with 1:29 left in regulation.

An out-of-bounds kickoff gave Liberty possession at the 40-yard line, where Smith countered Summers' quick moving of his squad. Liberty's senior quarterback completed four-of-seven pass attempts, including an eight-yard slant to Mike Brown that moved the ball into potential field goal range.

Following a five-yard run up the middle by Jennings to give Liberty the ball on the near-side hash mark, head coach Danny Rocco called on the freshman kicker, Bevins, to clinch the victory. With the clock at three seconds, Bevins sent the ball through the uprights for his second career collegiate field goal, lifting Liberty to a momentous victory.

Game No. 5 - No. 20/21 Liberty 43, Coastal Carolina 38

Oct. 4, 2008 - Conway, S.C. - Brooks Stadium (7,322)

For the third-straight road game, No. 20/21 Liberty outlasted an opponent, this time picking up a 43-38 victory over Big South rival Coastal Carolina in its conference opener, Saturday night, at Brooks Stadium.

With the win, the Flames ran their record to 5-0 on the year and 1-0 in Big South play. The victory extended the nation's longest FCS winning streak to 10 games and tied a program record, as Liberty also reeled off 10-straight wins over the span of the 1988 and 1989 seasons.

For the third time in 2008, the Flames put points up on the scoreboard during their opening drive, taking a 7-0 lead with 9:36 left to play in the opening 15 minutes.

Rashad Jennings carried the ball four times on the eight-play drive, however, the senior tailback was the intended target of quarterback Brock Smith on third-and-eight play from the Coastal 23-yard line. Jennings caught the pass over the middle and broke several tackles before getting the nose of the football over the goal line to give Liberty the early advantage.

After a three-and-out series on the ensuing drive, Liberty's special teams, which entered the game ranked No. 11 in the nation in punt return yardage, showcased its return prowess. Dominic Bolden, who ranked eighth individually coming into the contest, made use of a key block by Wes Cheek to clip off a 39-yard punt return.

Bolden's third-longest punt return of the season set up Liberty's next scoring opportunity, as three plays later, Matt Bevins knocked down a 22-yard field goal at the 6:37 mark, pushing LU's advantage to 10-0.

Coastal Carolina made a quarterback change on the following drive, placing redshirt freshman Jamie Childress under center. And the move by head coach David Bennett paid off, as the rookie scored his first collegiate touchdown, diving one yard on a third-and-goal play with 1:56 left to play in the first quarter to trim Liberty's lead to three points, 10-7.

The Flames failed to move the chains on their next drive, forcing to punt the ball away four plays later as time expired on the first quarter game clock. Starting quarterback Zach MacDowall returned the game, completing two out of his three pass attempts

for 46 yards to get the Chanticleers into Liberty territory.

The Chanticleers took to the ground for the next three plays, getting a pair of 15-yard jaunts from Arthur Sitton and Jamie Fordham. The second by Fordham gave Coastal Carolina a 14-10 lead with 12:30 left in the second quarter.

Liberty regrouped on its next drive, piecing together its longest drive of the first quarter. On the 12th play of the drive, Smith faked a handoff to Jonathan Crawford and found Jennings wide open in the near side of the end zone for his second receiving touchdown of the game. The four-yard receiving by the senior with 7:01 left before the break, gave Liberty a 17-14 lead.

Five plays later, Patrick Calvary picked off his seventh career pass, moving the senior into fifth place on the Big South all-time interception list, which gave Liberty possession with 4:44 left to play before halftime.

The Chanticleers looked like they might have halted the Flames on a third-and-13 play from the Coastal Carolina 23-yard line. However, Smith got a key block on the offensive line from Jennings so the senior could find Bolden open on a slant route, to give Liberty a 10-point lead with 29 seconds left before the intermission.

Liberty drove down the length of the field on the first drive of the second half, thanks in part to a third-down conversion play that saw B.J. Hayes scamper for 44 yards. However, the drive stalled in the Red Zone, as the Flames had to settle for a 28-yard field goal by Bevins, which gave Liberty a 13-point edge, 27-14, with 11:40 left in the third.

The Chanticleers looked like they quickly answered, as MacDowall hooked up with Sitton for a screen pass, which the senior took the end zone less than a minute later. However, the play was called back due to a holding penalty at midfield.

Infractions continued to plague the Chanticleers on the drive, as CCU was whistled for four more on the drive, including a second wave off on a MacDowell touchdown pass to Brandon Whitley, leaving the home squad to settle for a 42-yard field by Justin Durham at the 5:11 mark of the third quarter, cutting the lead to 10 points, 27-17.

Following a 17-play drive that had Liberty's defense on the field for 6:24, the Flames quickly ushered their defenders back on the field, as Hayes scored on the next play.

The 66-yard sweeping touchdown run to the far side of the field, Liberty's longest run of the year, pushed the Flames lead to 17 points, 34-17, as the Flames doubled the Chanticleers up 15 seconds later.

Coastal Carolina mustered some fourth-down magic on the ensuing drive, as Liberty looked like it might tackle MacDowall and regain possession on downs.

But the sophomore squirmed away from several would-be tacklers to find Chris Floyd open for a 21-yard play at the LU six-yard line. MacDowall called his own number on the next play, cutting the lead back to 10 points, 34-24, with 1:23 left in the third.

The two teams traded touchdown during the first five minutes of the fourth quarter. Jennings tacked on his third touchdown of the game, this time on the ground. The senior bowled over several defenders, scampering for a 35-yard rushing touchdown with 11:53 left in the game.

However, Coastal Carolina quickly moved the ball downfield and pulled within eight points, 40-32, following a Marquel Willis touchdown pass from MacDowall and a two-point conversion pass to Trent Usher with 11:53 remaining on the clock.

Trying to wind down the game clock, LU handed the ball to Jennings five times on the next nine-play drive, helping set up a 34-yard field goal by Bevins with 7:34 left, pushing Liberty's lead to 11 points, 43-32.

Kent Hicks intercepted the ball on the next play, but Liberty was forced to punt four plays later, following a three-and-out series. MacDowall quickly moved the Chanticleers downfield 91 yards on 15 plays, completing the drive with a 14-yard touchdown pass to Willis with 1:59 left on the game clock. A two-point rushing attempt by Fordham failed, leaving the score at 43-38.

Liberty recovered an attempted on-side kick and handed the ball off to Jennings on the next three plays. On the third rush, Jennings broke free for a sure touchdown run, but the senior slid down at the one-yard line, ending the game as Liberty was then able to run the clock out.

Game No. 6 - No. 15/16 Liberty 33, Stony Brook 0

Oct. 11, 2008 - Lynchburg, Va. - Williams Stadium (14,563)

The first two possessions of the game set the tone, as Liberty reeled off its 11th-straight victory and its fifth shutout under Danny Rocco, when the Flames downed Stony Brook, 33-0, at Williams Stadium.

The victory pushed Liberty's record to 6-0 on the year and 2-0 in Big South play. The win extended the nation's longest FCS winning streak and set a new program record, surpassing the previous mark set during the 1988 and 1989 seasons. The Flames have now won eight-straight Big South games, tying Coastal Carolina's mark for consecutive league victories.

The loss, the Seawolves' fifth-straight since opening the year with a 42-26 victory over Colgate, dropped Stony Brook's record to 1-5 and 0-1 in conference action, as the visitors were playing in their first-ever Big South Conference game.

The Flames won the opening coin toss and elected to take the ball, trying to jump out ahead of the visiting Seawolves. The Flames pieced together a 17-play drive to open the game, which stalled at the Stony Brook 10-yard line, leaving Liberty to settle for a 27-yard field goal by two-time reigning Freshman of the Week Matt Bevins.

The drive ate up 9:03 on the game clock, marking the longest drive in duration under head coach Danny Rocco, bettering an 8:41 drive against Glenville State earlier this year. The field goal gave the Flames an early 3-0 lead with 5:57 left to play in the first quarter.

Liberty quickly regained possession of the football, after forcing the Seawolves to punt the ball away after a three-and-out series. Flames defensive back Ryan Greiser upended wideout Lynell Suggs just as the senior was attempting to catch the football, negating the would-be, first-down reception.

Liberty managed to move the football much quicker on the ensuing drive, marching 64 yards downfield to open up a 10-0 lead. Mike Brown took a handoff from quarterback Brock Smith and scored on a 29-yard reverse play with 97 seconds left in the opening quarter.

For the third-straight drive, Liberty managed to put points on the scoreboard, stringing together a seven-play, 80-yard drive to push the lead to 17-0 with 12:05 left in the second quarter.

Liberty kept the ball on the ground five out of seven plays during the drive, including a sweeping 14-yard run by Rashad Jennings to the far side of the field, giving the senior his 32nd career rushing touchdown.

Stony Brook tried to get on the scoreboard late in the second quarter, as the Seawolves mounted their longest drive during the opening 30 minutes. However, the visiting team's push ran out of steam at the Liberty 23-yard line. Luke Gaddis came onto the field, but his 41-yard field goal attempt sailed wide left, leaving the Flames with a 17-point advantage at the break.

For the first time since Liberty's season opener against North Greenville, the Flames held an opponent without a first-half touchdown. The Flames more than doubled the Seawolves in total offensive yards in the first half, 256 to 127, with 165 of their yards coming on the ground.

On the second play of the third quarter, Liberty's Nick Hursky forced the ball loose from Stony Brook tailback Edwin Gowins, giving the Flames possession at the Seawolves' 43-yard line.

Liberty handed the ball off to Jennings five-straight plays, with the senior capping off his own 43-yard drive with a two-yard sweeping run to the left for a score, pushing the Flames' lead to 23-0 with 12:15 left in the third quarter.

Following Stony Brook's third three-and-out series of the afternoon, the Flames pushed their advantage to 30 points on the ensuing drive. Smith completed all three of his pass attempts during the 82-yard drive, including a crisp slant pass to Dominic Bolden for four yards for a score, securing the victory for the homestanding team.

The Flames managed to tack on three points in the fourth quarter on a 22-yard Bevins field goal, while keeping the Seawolves from denting the scoreboard for the 18th shutout in program history and the fifth under Rocco.

The Flames managed to continue their offensive dominance in the contest, doubling up the visitors. Liberty finished with 466 total offensive yards on 79 plays (5.9 average yards per play) to Stony Brook's 233 yards on 46 plays (5.1 average yards per play).

The 233 yards allowed by Liberty's defense marked the third fewest by a Rocco-led program against a Division I opponent.

For the third-straight outing, the Flames bettered their rushing total from the previous game, as Liberty finished the contest with a season-best 299 rushing yards.

Jennings was the leading ground grainer for Liberty, rushing for 101 yards and two touchdowns on 24 carries. The contest accounted for the 17th time the senior has surpassed the century mark during his career, tying him for most 100-yard games in Big South history, along with former Liberty running back Dre Barnes.

The Stony Brook running back tandem of Gowins and Big South preseason all-conference selection Conte Cuttino combined for 93 rushing yards. Gowins finished with a team-high 55 yards on seven carries, while Cuttino led the team with 11 carries for 38 yards.

Smith won the battle of the quarterbacks, as the Liberty senior completed 14-of-20 pass attempts for 136 yards and a score. Stony Brook's Dayne Hoffman tallied 142 yards as he was 13-of-23, while being picked off once.

Bolden led a plethora of wide receivers on the afternoon, as his four receptions for 46 yards and a touchdown were the most by 16 different players who caught a pass in the game. Suggs was Hoffman's favorite target in the contest, pulling in three receptions for 33 yards.

Defense dominated the contest, with Hursky and Greiser leading the effort. Both senior captains finished the game with six tackles.

Liberty, who entered the game ranked No. 27 in the nation in tackles for a loss, added to its total with six negative-yardage stops during the contest for a combined 19 yards. The Flames also finished with seven pass break-ups, marking a new season high and tying for the most under a Rocco-coached football program.

Game No. 7 - Lafayette 35, No. 14/15 Liberty 21

Oct. 18, 2008 - Lynchburg, Va. - Williams Stadium (15,483)

No. 14/15 Liberty overcame a first-half offensive barrage by Lafayette to give itself chances late in the game. However, the visiting Leopards withstood several second-half charges to take a 35-21 victory over Liberty.

The loss ends the nation's longest FCS winning streak at 11 games, dropping the Flames to 6-1 on the season. Liberty, which was looking for its first-ever 7-0 start in program history, also saw its 11-game home winning streak snapped in front of 15,483 fans.

The win pushed Lafayette's record to 5-1 on the season and is the Leopards' second-straight road victory during their current five-game road swing.

Lafayette scored first in the contest, taking advantage of a Liberty error the first time the Flames touched the football. The Flames stopped the Leopards on their opening drive, but Liberty's Dominic Bolden mis-played a bounding ball on the ground during the punt, with Lafayette quickly jumping on the loose pigskin.

Seven plays later, Lafayette's DeAndre' Morrow took a handoff from quarterback Rob Curley and scored on a sweeping play to the far side of the field. The six-yard run gave the visitors a 7-0 lead with 8:10 left in the opening quarter.

However, it didn't take long for Bolden to redeem himself for his errant play early in the first, as the senior turned a short-yardage screen pass into a lengthy touchdown reception. Smith found the wideout open, and he used several key blocks downfield to record a 60-yard touchdown reception, knotting the game at 7-7 just 49 seconds later.

Lafayette forced the Flames to punt the ball away on Liberty's next possession, which Shaun Adair returned 63 yards to the Liberty 13-yard line. The return was a season long for Lafayette and was the longest the Flames have allowed since Charleston Southern returned a punt for a score against Liberty on Nov. 11, 2006.

Morrow was given the ball on the first play of the drive and he made a carbon copy of his scoring run from earlier in the game. However, this time the junior found the end zone from 13 yards out, giving the visitors a 14-7 lead with 2:02 left in the opening quarter.

The Flames tried to get on the scoreboard early in the second quarter, but Matt Bevins' 47-yard field goal attempt into the wind came up just shy of the crossbar with 12:38 left in the first half.

The Leopards pieced together their first double-digit play drive of the opening half, with Joe Russo capping off a 10-play, 71-yard drive, when the fullback scored from four yards out. The four-yard burst pushed Lafayette's lead to 21-7 at the 8:41 mark.

Five plays later, a previously quieted Rashad Jennings made his presence known quickly. Surveying the defense, Smith called an audible at the line of scrimmage, changing the play up, which he handed off to Jennings. The senior broke through the line of scrimmage and outran Lafayette's defenders, cutting the Leopards' lead to seven points, 21-14, on a 58-yard touchdown run.

After Lafayette forced the second Liberty three-and-out series of the ball game, the Leopards mounted their longest scoring drive of the game. With the first-half clock winding down, Curley found Tim Watson in the far corner of the end zone on a 19-yard flag route for a touchdown, giving Lafayette a 28-14 edge at the intermission.

The Leopards finished the opening period with 249 total offensive yards, as compared to the Flames' 202 yards. However, Lafayette almost doubled up Liberty in terms of plays, 46 to 24. The Leopards continually moved the ball during the first 30 minutes, picking up 15 first downs, as the squad converted on 8-of-11 third-down plays.

Jennings picked up 15 yards on the Flames' first rushing attempt of the second half. However, four plays later the drive stalled, forcing Liberty to punt. Bevins was brought on to punt, but Lafayette's Andy Romans got behind the line of scrimmage. The senior linebacker blocked the kick, picked it up and returned it 15 yards to push the visitors' lead to 21 points, 35-14.

The Flames offense tried to regroup on the ensuing drive, stringing together its longest drive of the afternoon at 12 plays. Liberty managed to get down to the Leopards' two-yard line, but the Flames couldn't punch the ball in, leaving the squad to settle for a field goal try.

Bevins connected on the 26-yard field goal attempt, but the Flames were whistled for illegal formation, forcing Liberty to move five yards back and retry the kick. And this time, the freshman was not as successful, missing his second field goal attempt of the game wide left.

The score remained the same until the first play of the fourth quarter, when Smith found Jonathan Crawford open on a 19-yard post route. The senior's third receiving touchdown of the year pulled the Flames back within 14 points, 35-21, with 14:56 left to play in the contest.

Liberty's defense continued to hold the Leopards in check, forcing Lafayette to punt the ball away with 11:02 left in regulation.

Smith quickly moved the Flames down the field, completing 4-of-6 pass attempts, followed by a 32-yard jaunt by Jennings up the middle to get into the Leopards' red zone at the five-yard line.

However, Lafayette's blockers came up strong, keeping the Flames out of the end zone by inches. Jennings, a Walter Payton Award candidate, picked up four of the five yards needed to score, but was halted on a fourth-and-one just shy of the goal line with 6:58 left in the ball game.

Liberty pressed the Leopards during the remaining seven minutes, but Lafayette sealed the victory with its continued solid play. Lafayette finished things off with a fake punt, where Romans was snapped the ball directly and picked up a first down, enabling the Leopards to wind out the game clock.

The Flames dominated the second half, outgaining Lafayette, 273 yards to 89. However, both squads were only able to add one touchdown apiece to the scoreboard during the final 30 minutes of the contest. Liberty finished the game with 475 total offensive yards to Lafayette's 338.

Liberty, who came into the game ranked No. 7 in the nation by averaging 251 rushing yards per game, was held to a season-low 131 yards on 28 carries. Jennings recorded his 18th career 100-yard game to set a new Big South record, rushing for 148 yards. straight conference win.

Game No. 8 - No. 20/21 Liberty 42, Charleston Southern 0

Oct. 25, 2008 - Lynchburg, Va. - Williams Stadium (14,365)

The No. 20/21 Flames scored on their first five possessions and never looked back, en route to a 42-0 Homecoming shutout victory over Charleston Southern at a sold out Williams Stadium.

With the victory, the Flames raised their record to 7-1 on the year and 3-0 in Big South play. The loss was the second straight for the Buccaneers, dropping Charleston Southern to 3-5 on the season and 1-2 in Big South action.

The Flames got on the scoreboard first, scoring on Liberty's opening possession of the contest. Liberty handed the ball off to Rashad Jennings three out of the first four plays, but took to the airways to jump out to a 7-0 lead two and half minutes into the contest.

Brock Smith found Jonathan Crawford open on a near-side slant route. The senior caught the pass at midfield and after spinning to evade a would-be tackler, Crawford had nothing but open field between him and the end zone, resulting in a 69-yard touchdown reception.

After a three-and-out series on the ensuing Buccaneer drive, Charleston Southern was forced to punt for the second-straight drive. However, Andy Brown's punt attempt was blocked by Larry Claiborne, giving Liberty possession at the visitor's 25-yard line.

Head coach Danny Rocco went to his bag of tricks on the drive's first play. Smith handed the ball to B.J. Hayes, but once the freshman got outside the far-side hash marks, he handed it to Dominic Bolden, who found a seam for a 25-yard touchdown run to push Liberty's lead to 14-0 with 6:12 left in the opening period.

Bolden almost had his second multiple touchdown game of the season, as the senior was pushed out of bounds at the one-yard line, giving him a 40-yard reception on the second play of the second quarter.

Jennings gave the Flames their third touchdown of the game and the senior's 10th rushing score of the year. The running back burst through the line of scrimmage for the one-yard score, pushing Liberty's lead to 21-0 with 13:53 left in the second quarter.

Following Liberty's second interception of the game, this one by Chris Rocco, the Flames alternated run and pass plays to dent

the scoreboard for the fourth-straight drive. On the six play of the 57-yard drive, Smith connected with Crawford for a second time on the afternoon.

The 10-yard slant pass to the senior pushed Liberty's advantage to 28-0 with 7:57 left before the break and gave Crawford his second multiple touchdown game of the season.

Following the third three-and-out series of the game for Charleston Southern, Liberty pieced together its longest drive of the contest at 12 plays, resulting in the team's fifth-straight scoring drive.

Jennings rushed six times on the 12-play, 61-yard drive, including the final yard to give the senior his second one-yard rushing touchdown on the afternoon to advance Liberty's lead to 35-0, 73 seconds before the halftime festivities.

Liberty's defense continued to make quick work of the Buccaneers, forcing Charleston Southern to punt the ball away 38 seconds later to give Liberty one last possession before intermission.

However, the Flames finally ran into something it couldn't beat, as the Flames ran out of time before it could add points to the scoreboard, resulting in its first drive of the game that didn't add points to Liberty's lead.

The Flames dominated the Buccaneers on both sides of the ball during the opening 30 minutes. Liberty finished with a 210 total offensive yard advantage, 321-111, and a 14-4 edge in first downs. Thanks to two lengthy passing plays, Liberty's passing attack pick up most of the team's yardage, as the Flames threw for 194 of the 321 first half yards.

The score remained the same until the 10:39 mark of the fourth quarter. Smith called his own number on a third-and-goal from the one-yard line. The senior got a push from his offensive line, allowing him to score his third career rushing touchdown to seal the victory.

The remainder of the game belonged to the defensive players in the red jerseys, as Liberty posted its second-straight Big South shutout and the sixth shutout overall under Rocco.

The defense finished with seven quarterback hurries, six tackles for a loss and two

sacks. The Flames had their third game of the year with more than one interception, while adding five break-ups and two forced fumbles.

For the fifth-straight game and the seventh time this year, Liberty finished a game with more than 400 yards of total offense. The Flames, who entered the game ranked No. 6 in the nation in average total offense (453 yards), upped their numbers by finishing the contest with 492 yards. Charleston Southern's 192 yards was a season low for a Liberty opponent and was the third fewest under Rocco.

Jennings recorded his 19th career 100-yard rushing performance, rushing for 127 yards and two touchdowns. The yardage gave the senior 1,000 rushing yards on the year, marking the third-straight season he has hit the mark.

For the fifth time in eight games, the Flames held an opponent under 100 team rushing yards, with Antwan Ivey leading the way with 23 yards on seven carries for the Buccaneers.

Smith had another sharp performance for Liberty, completing 17-of-27 pass attempts for 269 yards and two touchdowns. The yardage on the day pushed the senior's career total to 6,097 yards, making him the fourth quarterback in school and Big South history to eclipse the 6,000 yard mark.

For the second-straight week, both Bolden and Crawford surpassed the 100-yard receiving mark in the same contest. This time Crawford led the way with a career-high 124 yards on six receptions. Bolden finished with 117 yards on five catches.

Wes Cheek led Liberty's strong defensive effort, finishing the game with a career high nine tackles. Hursky followed by recording eight stops, followed by a career-best seven stops by Clairborne to go along with his first career interception.

Game No. 9 - Presbyterian 31, No. 17/17 Liberty 28

Nov. 1, 2008 - Clinton, S.C. - Bailey Memorial Stadium (6,193)

In a back and forth battle, it was a 28-yard field late in the fourth quarter that lifted Presbyterian to an upset victory over No. 17 Liberty, 31-28, at Bailey Memorial Stadium.

The loss snapped the longest Big South road winning streak in league history at five games and drops the Flames to 7-2 on the season. The victory raised the Blue Hose season mark to 4-5 and gave Presbyterian a victory at home in nine out of their last 10 games.

For the second-straight week and the fifth time this year, the Flames put points on the scoreboard the first time they touched the football. Liberty quickly moved down-field, getting the ball just past midfield on five plays to set up a 42-yard touchdown pass from Brock Smith to Dominic Bolden with 12:16 left in the opening quarter.

Presbyterian quickly answered back, evening the game at 7-7 just four minutes later. The Blue Hose picked up a third and fourth down conversion, keeping a nine-play drive alive, which set up a 25-yard pass over the middle from Brandon Miley to Patrick McKoy for a score at 8:11.

The Flames took to the ground on the ensuing drive, moving the ball 61 yards on seven out of nine rushing plays. The 4:02 drive ended with a six-yard burst up the middle by Rashad Jennings, giving the senior his 12th rushing touchdown of the year and the 37th of his career.

The see-saw battle continued, when Miley called his own number on the third play of the second quarter to even the contest at 14-14. The redshirt hurler just snuck the nose of the football over the goal line on a fourth-and-goal play, capping the 13-play, 71-yard drive with 13:35 left before halftime.

Both teams' defensive units started to settle down, as the Blue Hose forced the Flames to punt the ball away after a three-and-out series. However, Derrick Overbolt was able to get behind the line of scrimmage and blocked Matt Bevins punt to give Presbyterian the ball at the Liberty 17-yard line.

Three players later, Miley looked for a receiver in the near-side corner of the end zone, but the Flames' Patrick Calvary was able to pick the pass attempt off. The interception was the eighth of the senior's career,

moving him into a tie for fourth place on the Big South's all-time career interception list.

Just as the offense dominated the first half, the defensive units made their presence known during the second 15-minute period. The two teams combined for 28 points and 273 total offensive yards in the first quarter, while being held scoreless for a combined 65 total offensive yards in the second quarter.

Jennings finished the first half with 14 rushing attempts for 72 yards and a touchdown, while Smith completed 9-of-15 pass attempts for 98 yards and the 42-yard scoring strike.

The scoreless streak continued until the 2:27 mark of the third quarter, when Jennings scored from two yards out, as he overpowered the Blue Hose's defensive line. The 15-play, 81-yard drive, which ate up 7:02 on the game clock, was keyed by a red zone third-down conversion.

Smith faked a handoff to Jennings, but pulled the ball back and used a block from the tailback to move the chains on a five-yard gain on third-and-five from the Liberty 10-yard line.

But it didn't take long for Presbyterian to even the score at 21-21. The Flames were flagged for a personal foul penalty on the extra point attempt, moving the start of the kickoff back to the 15-yard line.

Bevins kickoff was returned 45 yards past midfield by Bryson Summers to the Liberty 25-yard line. On the next play, Miley threaded the needle and found Brandon Clark open on a slant route, with the senior outrunning two would-be tacklers to tie the game eight seconds later.

Quick scoring drives left the game tied 28-28 heading into the fourth quarter, following lengthy plays by both squads and a 1:42 period that saw 28 points added to the scoreboard.

After trading five-yard penalties, Smith evaded several defenders in the pocket to give himself enough time to find Bolden open on the far side of the field for a 58-yard scoring play, giving the Flames the momentary seven-point lead, 21-14, at 1:13.

Following a 21-yard kickoff return by Chetyuane Reeder, the senior picked up 70 more yards on a screen pass from Miley before he was shoved out of bounds at the

one-yard line. On the next play, running back S.J. Worrell leaped over a pile of players at the goal line, tying the game with 45 seconds left in the third with his fifth rushing touchdown of the year.

The Flames looked like they might keep the offensive barrage going on the ensuing drive, but the movement was stopped at the 11-yard line, leaving the Flames to settle for a field goal attempt. However, Ben Shipp wasn't able to attempt the 28-yarder as the snap sailed wide of holder Mike Brown, giving the Blue Hose possession of the football with 11:58 left to play.

In almost similar fashion, the Blue Hose had their next drive stall at the 11-yard line, but this time Presbyterian was able to knock down the 28-yard attempt, giving the home squad their first lead of the day, 31-28, with 7:04 left to play.

The three-point field goal by Cam Miller was Presbyterian's second field goal of the year and the first since Miller knocked down a 24-yarder against Fayetteville State on the second week of the year.

After trading a pair of three-and-out series, the Flames took possession of the football at the 11-yard line with 3:18 left in the contest. A mixture of Jennings running plays and 3-of-5 passing from Smith got the Flames to the Presbyterian 24-yard line.

However, Smith was sacked for an eight-yard loss, while his pass to Crawford in the end zone was battled away by Justin Bethel on a fourth-and-15 play, securing the upset victory in front of 6,193 fans for Presbyterian's Parents' Weekend.

For the sixth-straight game and the eighth time this year, the Flames rolled up 424 total offensive yards, as Liberty outgained Presbyterian 424 to 390 yards. However, 301 of the 390 yards by Presbyterian were through the air, leading to three of the team's four touchdowns.

Jennings was the game's leading rusher, gaining 188 yards on the ground with two touchdowns. The 188-yard game was the 20th 100-yard rushing performance of his career, tying the running back with Dre Barnes for the school's all-time mark for career 100-yard games.

Game No. 10 - No. 25/25 Liberty 38, VMI 26

Nov. 8, 2008 - Lexington, Va. - Foster Stadium (6,813)

No. 25 Liberty overcame a slow start on the afternoon to not only claim a 38-26 victory over VMI, but its second straight Big South Conference title. With the victory at Foster Stadium, the Flames clinch the regular season title with one conference game remaining on their 2008 Big South slate.

The win, Liberty's 10th straight against Big South foes to extend its league record winning streak, gives the Flames a two-game cushion with one game Big South game remaining on the year for each conference opponent.

The Keydets dropped their third straight Big South Conference game to fall to 3-6 on the year and 1-3 in league action. The setback is also VMI's third straight to Liberty and pushes the Flames series record versus VMI to 5-3.

Both teams experienced some jitters early on in the game, as Rashad Jennings fumbled the ball on the first Flames' play early in the first, giving the Keydets possession in Liberty territory.

After picking up a first down to get to the Liberty 10-yard line, VMI gave the football back to the Flames when Tim Maypray fumbled on a diving play up the middle, helping settle both teams down.

After trading possessions, the Flames got on the scoreboard with a big play, when Brock Smith found Mike Brown open in the end zone. The 53-yard deep pass, the sixth 50-plus yard pass play by Liberty this year, was hauled in by the redshirt freshman, giving Liberty a 7-0 lead with 5:16 left in the first quarter.

On the first play of the ensuing drive, Chaz Jones broke a few tackles at the line of scrimmage and scampered 53 yards downfield to put the Keydets into Liberty territory. However, the drive stalled five plays later, leaving VMI to settle for a 48 field goal by Greg Stevens, trimming Liberty's lead to four points, 7-3, at the 2:45 mark.

The Flames continued to shake off their sluggish start, adding their second touchdown to the scoreboard two and a half minutes later. Smith faked a handoff to Rashad Jennings and found Corey Rasberry open for a 19-yard touchdown reception on the far side of the field.

The first touchdown reception of the

senior tight end's career gave the Flames a 14-3 with 14 ticks left on the first quarter game clock.

Liberty made quick work of the Keydets on its next drive, moving the ball 74 yards on three plays to push its lead to 21-3 with 12:44 left before halftime. The drive was capped off by a 32-yard touchdown run by Jennings, as the senior broke three attempted tackles for his 39th career rushing touchdown.

The Keydets managed to drive inside the Flames red zone once again. However, three straight rushing attempts by VMI, including a two-yard attempt by Maypray that was stopped by Kevin Richard on the goal line on fourth down, gave the ball back to Liberty.

After a quarterback sneak by Smith gave the Flames some breathing room, the Flames handed the ball off to Jennings. However, the senior got clogged up on the line of scrimmage and several Keydets surrounded the running back in the end zone, pulling the Keydets back within 16 points, 21-5, with 4:56 left in the first half.

The two-point play was the first safety by a Liberty opponent since the Flames snapped a punt attempt out the back of the end zone against Hofstra on Nov. 23, 2002.

Following the free kick after the safety, the Keydets continued to march downfield on the Flames adding seven more points on an eight-play, 46 yard drive.

The possession was capped off by an 11-yard touchdown burst up the middle by Joe Taylor, cutting Liberty's lead to 21-12 with 1:12 left before the break.

VMI outgained the Flames in the first half, finishing the opening 30 minutes of action with 254 total offensive yards to Liberty's 218. All 254 yards by the Keydets came via the ground game, while the Flames ran for 70 yards and passed for 148 more.

Smith was the Flames' leading offensive player in the first half, as the quarterback was 7-of-10 for 148 yards and two touchdowns. Jennings carried the ball seven times for 48 yards, getting most of his yardage on the 32-yard touchdown run.

Following the Flames punting the ball away on their first drive of the second half, the Keydets continued to chip away at Liberty's advantage.

A 53-yard pass play from Maypray to Zach Collins, VMI's first completion on the afternoon, helped the Keydets advance the ball onto Liberty's side of the field. Five plays later, Jones capped off an eight-play, 90-yard drive with a two-yard burst over the right tackle, cutting the lead to two points, 21-19, at the 7:15 mark of the third quarter.

Jennings helped the Flames move the ball downfield on Liberty's next drive, a possession which saw Liberty eat up 4:44 on the game clock on a 10-play drive.

With third-and-nine on the nine-yard line, the Flames ran four receivers onto the field, with Smith finding one of them, as Brown moved the chains by stretching the ball to the one-yard line on the catch.

Smith called his own number on the next possession, as the senior picked up his third rushing touchdown of the year and the fourth of his career. The one-yard run up the middle extended Liberty's lead to nine points, 28-19, with 2:31 left in the third quarter.

The Keydets fumbled the ball away on their next drive as Maypray mishandled the ball, which was recovered by Ian Childress at the VMI 40-yard line.

The combination of Smith and Jennings continued to move the Flame downfield, setting up a 24-yard field goal by Ben Shipps to push Liberty's lead to 12 points, 31-19, with 8:30 left in the Big South contest.

The Keydets continued to press to stay in the contest, piecing together their longest drive of the game to pull back within five points, 31-26. Jones took the last three plays on the 14-play drive, finishing the 73-yard march with a four-yard scamper with 2:10 left in the ball game.

However, the Flames finally squashed VMI's hopes on the next three plays. Liberty recovered an attempted on-side kick at the 36-yard line. Jennings was given the ball on the next play and the senior broke through the line for the score, giving him back-to-back seasons with 15 rushing touchdowns.

On the ensuing kickoff, the Keydets fumbled the ball for the sixth time this week and the 13th time over the last two games. Chad Brown struck returner Rajah Jenkins with Brandon Robinson covering up the miscue to seal the victory for Liberty.

Game No. 11 - No. 22/24 Liberty 30, Gardner-Webb 10

Nov. 15, 2008 - Lynchburg, Va. - Williams Stadium (10,636)

No. 22/24 Liberty ran its unbeaten Big South streak to 11-straight games, finishing back-to-back conference championship seasons with a 30-10 victory over Gardner-Webb at Williams Stadium.

With the victory, the Flames raise their record to 9-2 on the year and finish the conference slate unbeaten at 5-0. The loss ends the Bulldogs' season at 5-6 and 2-3 in Big South play.

The game remained scoreless until midway through the first quarter of play. Rashad Jennings caught his longest pass of the year, a 42-yarder on the far side of the field, where the senior used several key blocks to tip toe down the sidelines, getting the Flames into Bulldog territory.

Seven plays later, the Flames drive was halted at the Gardner-Webb 11-yard line, leaving the Flames to settle for a 28-yard Ben Shipp's field goal at the 4:43 mark of the opening 15 minutes of action.

The early low-scoring affair continued until the middle part of the second quarter. Brock Smith completed a 36-yard out-of-bounds pass to Jonathan Crawford, moving the Flames to the Gardner-Webb six-yard line.

On the next play, Liberty handled the ball off to Jennings, who burst through the line of scrimmage for his 16th touchdown of the year, giving the Flames a 10-0 lead with 9:12 left before halftime. The scoring run tied Jennings with Lawrence Worthington for the school's single season record, as Worthington did so in 1994.

On Gardner-Webb's first play of the ensuing drive, Wes Cheek stepped in front of a Devin Campbell pass, intercepting it and returning it nine yards to the Gardner-Webb 25-yard line.

The Flames quickly shook off the slower offensive start of the game, adding seven more points six seconds later. Smith hooked up with Crawford again, this time finding the senior in the corner of the end zone for a 25-yard touchdown scoring play, extending Liberty's lead to 17-0 at 8:55.

The Bulldogs collected themselves on the next drive, stringing together their most effective offensive series of the first half to put points on the scoreboard against Liberty for the first time in six quarters.

Gardner-Webb had the ball first-and-goal on the three yard line; however, an 11-yard sack by Nick Hursky, the Flames third of the opening 30 minutes, helped keep the Bulldogs out of the end zone.

The visitors were forced to settle for a 32-yard field by Ryan Gates with 4:41 left in the second, marking the first time Gardner-Webb scored on Liberty since a fourth-quarter field goal the last time the Bulldogs visited Williams Stadium on Oct. 21, 2006.

Lengthy plays by Dominic Bolden bookended Liberty's final scoring drive of the first half to give the Flames their 24-3 advantage. The senior returned the kickoff 23 yards, and eight plays later, Smith found the wide out open for a 31-yard touchdown reception 32 seconds before the half time buzzer sounded. The scoring reception was the ninth of Bolden's season, leaving him shy of Eric Green's single-season record 10 touchdown receptions in 1989.

The Flames dominated the game during the first half, both on the scoreboard and on the stat sheet. Liberty doubled up Gardner-Webb in total offensive yards, 262 to 131, despite the Flames finishing with only three more plays than the Bulldogs, 35-32.

Liberty amassed nearly two-thirds of its yards via the passing game, as the Flames quarterbacks combined to complete 9-of-14 pass attempts for 180 yards.

Just like the first quarter, Liberty was the only team able to add points to the scoreboard in the third quarter, getting a 42-yard field goal by Bevens at the 8:39 mark, the Flames' longest field goal of the year and giving them a 27-3 lead.

However, the Bulldogs didn't go quietly, as Gardner-Webb pieced together its longest drive of the contest to open the fourth quarter and pull back within 17 points.

Long runs of 21 and 12 yards by David Montgomery helped Gardner-Webb march 91 yards downfield to score their first touchdown of the game. After the Bulldogs got when the 10-yard line again, the Flames tried to piece together another goal line stand.

Liberty stopped Gardner-Webb on third-and-goal from the one, as Campbell was unable to sneak the ball across the goal line. However on the next play, the senior handed

the ball off to Patrick Hall, who was able to sneak around Liberty's offensive line, scoring from one-yard out, to cap off a 13-play drive and make the score 27-10.

The Flames handed the ball off to running back Zach Terrell five straight plays on their next drive. The senior picked up 31 yards on those carries, moving Liberty into field goal territory, and allowed Shipp to knock down a 28-yard field goal and give Liberty a 20-point lead with 7:28 left in the contest.

The Bulldogs managed to push the football back onto Liberty's side of the field on the ensuing drive. However, Jamal Giddens struck Montgomery on a third-and-seven run from the 23-yard line, forcing the junior to cough up the ball and bring the celebratory Gatorade shower down upon head coach Danny Rocco.

Liberty outgained Gardner-Webb by 79 yards overall, 442 to 363, despite the Bulldogs nearly doubling their first-half production with 232 total offensive yards in the second half.

Gardner-Webb, who came into the game with the nation's No. 27 ranked rushing defense (110.6 yards per game), allowed nearly double their average yards, as Liberty rushed for 195 yards on 42 carries. The Bulldogs finished the game rushing for 116 yards on 34 attempts.

The two teams finished the game with equal passing yards despite different paths. Liberty's quarterbacks completed 13-of-21 pass attempts without an interception. Gardner-Webb's hurlers finished the game 25-of-41 with two passes being picked off by the Flames, accounting for two of the Bulldogs' five turnovers.

Jennings set one school record and saw another come to an end in the contest, as the senior finished the game rushing for 56 yards on 14 carries. The yardage gave the senior 1,391 yards on the year, allowing him to become the program and Big South single-season leader, while seeing his 100-yard game rushing streak come to an end at 10 games.

Smith was 11-of-18 for 226 yards and two touchdown passes, while Campbell completed 24-of-40 attempts for 242 yards and the two picks.
