**The Game**

The Liberty men's basketball team (4-6, 1-1 Big South) returns to action on Saturday, squaring off with NAIA/NCCAA member Kentucky Christian. The contest is the third contest in a five-game home-stand for the Flames. The game also marks the third match-up between the two squads. Liberty currently holds a 2-0 record over the Knights all-time, with the most recent meeting occurring on Jan. 8, 2008. Liberty defeated the Knights inside the Vines Center, 84-45.

**Recent Results**

The Flames turned things around in the latter two contests of the Chicago Invitational Challenge, beginning Nov. 27 with a convincing win over Mississippi Valley State at the UIC Pavilion in Chicago, Ill., 72-53. The following day, the Flames followed up their performance with a second-straight victory, edging the Tennessee State Tigers 63-60.

Liberty began conference play on a positive note Dec. 3, defeating Charleston Southern 69-53. Evan Gordon led the way for the Flames, posting a career-high 21 points and eight rebounds. David Minaya also played a key role, netting 14 tallies.

Looking to start 2-0 in the Big South for the first time in school history, Liberty hosted Coastal Carolina last Saturday night. Unfortunately, the unprecedented achievement did not come to fruition, as the Chanticleers took the contest 73-58.

**Watch and Listen for the Flames**

Saturday's game will be video streamed on the Big South Network. There will be a radio broadcast which will air on the Flames Sports Network (flagship WRVL 88.3 FM) with Jerry Edwards providing the play-by-play for his 29th season. Additionally, an Internet audio broadcast on LibertyFlames.com will be available.

## Head Coach Dale Layer



**Record at Liberty: 4-6 (First Year)**  
**Career Record: 274-199 (17th Year)**

Entering his first season as head coach of the Flames, Dale Layer is the eighth coach in program history. Layer returns to Liberty Mountain after previously serving as an assistant coach for the Flames during the 2007-08 season.

This will be Layer's third head coaching stint and first since leaving Colorado State in 2007. Layer, 50, comes to Liberty most recently from a successful run as an assistant coach at BIG EAST member and nationally ranked Marquette this past season where he worked with the guards. Layer helped the Eagles to a 25-10 record and a second round appearance in the NCAA Tournament despite lacking the full-time services of All-American Dominic James, who injured himself near the end of the season.

Dale Layer first served as an assistant at Liberty during the 2007-08 season, helping the Flames to its best regular season finish since Liberty won the 2004 Big South Championship.

Layer has also demonstrated the ability to develop talent, including former Colorado State center Jason Smith. The seven-footer scored over 1,500 points for Layer's Rams during his three seasons with the program before entering the NBA Draft following his junior campaign. Due to his development under Layer's tutelage, Smith was chosen with the 20th selection of the NBA Draft's first round by the Miami Heat in 2007. His rights were traded to the Philadelphia 76ers. When Smith graduated high school he was ranked as the 276th best player in his class and under Layer developed in three seasons to the 20th selection in the NBA Draft. Several of Layer's recruiting classes at Colorado State were ranked among the top 40 nationally by various recruiting publications.

Layer has a career 274-199 record (17th year) as a head coach, including nine seasons at the helm of Queens University (formally Queens College) in Charlotte, N.C. He also served as the athletics director while at the school and started the basketball program in 1989 from scratch at the formerly all women's institution. Layer's student-athletes excel in the classroom too. In Layer's 16 seasons as a head coach, he has accompanied 43 seniors to be honored on senior night and all 43 earned a college degree, marking 100 percent graduation rate of all players who finish their eligibility under Layer.

After graduating from Eckerd College in St. Petersburg, Fla., in 1980, Layer started his coaching career as an assistant under Jim Harley, his former coach. Before moving on to Queens University, Layer spent seven of the next eight years at Eckerd College except for the 1982-83 season, when he was an assistant at Eastern Kentucky.

Layer made the jump to Division I in 1998 when Ritchie McKay took the head coaching job at Colorado State and named him to his staff. During McKay's two seasons with the Rams, Layer helped lead Colorado State to the NIT Tournament in 1999, where they beat Mississippi State and Colorado before falling to eventual champion, California.

While with the Rams, Layer had a 103-106 record, including a 17-13 mark in 2007. In 2003, Layer led Colorado State to the Mountain West Conference Championship and its first NCAA Tournament bid in 13 years, falling to Duke in the first round.

### A Look at the Knights

Kentucky Christian enters Saturday's contest with a 6-5 record on the season. On Thursday, the Knights played host to Cincinnati Christian, but were defeated by the Eagles, 107-52. Kentucky Christian's Cedomir Ilic led the way for the Knights with 13 points and 13 rebounds. Svetomir Ilic also chipped in 10 points.

The Knights missed their top two scorers in the contest, Casey Jones and Eric McKee. Jones currently leads the team in scoring and rebounding, averaging 20.8 points and 8.7 rebounds per game. He is also the Knights' steals leader with 3.7 per game.

McKee follows closely behind Jones in scoring, averaging 18.3 tallies per game, while chipping in 4.9 boards per game. Svetomir and Cedomir Ilic round out Kentucky Christian's top scorers, averaging 10.4 and nine points, respectively.

### Liberty-Kentucky Christian Series Notes

Liberty and Kentucky Christian first matched up on Nov. 20 1979, when both teams were NAIA and NCCAA members. The meeting took place inside the Schilling Center and resulted in a 98-62 win for the Flames. Liberty went on to win the NCCAA national title that season.

The Flames and Knights most recent showdown occurred on Jan. 8, 2008 in the Vines Center. Anthony Smith led the way in the 84-45 Liberty win with 20 points. Alex McClean posted a double-double, tallying 16 points while grabbing 17 boards.

Current Flames guard Jeremy Anderson was also a big contributor in the contest, netting 11 points. The majority of Anderson's tallies came from behind the three-point arc, as the Kentucky native went 3-of-5 from downtown.

### Back in the Day

Like Kentucky Christian, Liberty is no stranger to competing in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). Before moving up the ranks to Division I play, Liberty joined the NAIA in 1975 as an associate member. The program then transitioned to NCAA Division II in 1981, but was still eligible for NAIA postseason play.

Liberty dropped its NAIA affiliation completely in 1984, when it became eligible for NCAA Division II competition. Liberty moved to the top level of college basketball competition on Sept. 1, 1988, when it was accepted for NCAA Division I membership.

During its time in the association, Liberty produced one NAIA All-American, center Steve Issacs, who earned honorable mention honors in 1982 and 1983. Issacs also earned all-district honors from 1981-83. Other Liberty players to earn NAIA all-district honors include Mark Swift (1981), Greg McCauley (1982) and Kenny Gunn (1983). Former Liberty men's head coach Jeff Meyer, who coached the Flames from 1982-97, also earned NAIA All-District Coach of the Year Honors in 1982.

### Success in the NCCAA

Along with its previous NAIA experience, the Liberty men's basketball program was also a member of the National Christian College Athletic Association (NCCAA). The program originated in the NCCAA, before moving up the collegiate ranks throughout the 1980s.

The Flames captured the NCCAA Division I Championship in 1980, defeating Point Loma College, 68-65, at McGilvary Gym on the campus of Tennessee Temple University in Chattanooga, Tenn. Four Flames reached double figures in the contest. Rod Martin led the way with 20 points, followed by Hess (18), Ed Vickers (17) and Roger Webb (10). Vickers also grabbed 17 boards, while Webb dished out 10 assists. Vickers was named to the all-tournament team and Hess was named the tournament's most outstanding player.

Liberty produced six All-Americans during its stint in the NCCAA. Hess was a first-team member in 1980. Five years prior, Mike Goad earned second-team honors (1975). Three other players also earned honorable mentions: Willard DeShazor (1976), Mark Chaffin (1978) and Ed Vickers.

Like Liberty, Kentucky Christian has had its share of success in the NCCAA, garnering seven NCCAA Division II titles (1988, 1989, 1991, 1995, 1996, 1997 and 1999).

## Fantastic Freshmen

Several Liberty freshmen are getting acclimated to the collegiate game fast, posting double-digits on the scoreboard in recent contests. In the Dec. 3 win over Charleston Southern, Evan Gordon proved age is only a number, racking up 21 points and hitting 4-of-5 from behind the three-point arc.

In the contest versus Tennessee State on Nov. 28, Chris Perez and Patrick Konan netted 12 and 11 points, respectively. The day before against Mississippi Valley State, Konan posted a season-high 16 points. Late in the first half, the Ivory Coast native went on a scoring spree. With 4:12 remaining in the half, Konan tallied eight points in just 1:28. In the same contest, Gordon recorded double figures with 14 points.

## Big Man on Campus

Redshirt freshman Carter McMasters received his first collegiate start on Nov. 22 against Notre Dame, making him the first player to start at center for the Flames since the 2007-08 season. The last Flame to receive the nod in the post position was Russell Monroe, March 1, 2008. Since that time, Liberty had gone without a starting center in 41-consecutive contests.

Redshirt senior Tyler Baker suffered an ACL tear on Nov. 19 against Old Dominion. The forward recently underwent surgery and is out for the season.

## Career Highs All Around

In the Dec. 3 match-up against Charleston Southern, two players rewrote their personal record books, posting career highs in multiple categories. Flames' guard Evan Gordon netted 21 points in the contest, shooting 6-of-10 from the field, including four three-point field goals in the first half. The Indiana native also achieved a career-high in rebounds, finishing with eight boards. At the foul line, Gordon tallied his highest freethrow total to date, sinking five shots.

David Minaya also experienced a record altering night, achieving a career-high 14 points. Like Gordon, Minaya was also money from the charity stripe, hitting six shots.

## Boarding the Bricks

Flames point guard Jesse Sanders achieved a career high in rebounds against Mississippi Valley State at the Chicago Invitational Challenge on Nov. 27. Sanders grabbed 11 boards in the contest, besting his previous career high of 10. Prior to setting a new career high, Sanders had posted 10 rebounds in back-to-back games against Presbyterian (Feb.9, 2009) and Charleston Southern (Feb. 14, 2009).

## Foreign Born

Freshman forward Patrick Konan, a native of the Ivory Coast, is the first Flame hailing from outside the United States since the 2004-05 season, when Liberty's roster featured three foreign-born players — power forward Leo Lightbourne (Andros, Bahamas), guard John Clarke (Freeport, Bahamas) and Glyn Turner (Auckland, New Zealand).

Standing out among the trio was Lightbourne, who was named to the 2005 Big South Second Team his senior season. After finishing his collegiate career at Liberty, Lightbourne began playing professionally in Europe.

## No Rest in November

Liberty men's basketball is coming off one of the busiest Novembers in the program's 37-year existence. The 2009-10 schedule featured eight contests in November, tying for the most match-ups during the 11th-month in school history. The last season Liberty played eight November games was in 1979 during the program's NAIA days. The team was coached by Dale Gibson and finished with a 4-4 November record (28-11 on the season).

The Flames played their eighth contest on Nov. 30 against Mt. Vernon Nazarene and then jumped into their December slate the next night against the Cougars. This season, the Flames had five days rest between their last November and first December contest.

## Tops in the Big South

Liberty currently leads the Big South in team free throw percentage, shooting 157-of-213 (73.7 percent) from the foul line. Next in line is High Point with 70.9 percent (105-of-148). Kyle Ohman leads the Big South in free throw percentage, shooting 46-of-52 (88.5) percent from the foul line. Ohman's success at the charity stripe includes 20-consecutive made free throws, a streak spanning the season's first four contests.

### Reaching for 900

After Liberty's contest against Charleston Southern on Dec. 3, Kyle Ohman now has scored 896 points, ranking him 22nd on Liberty's all-time scoring list. Ohman needs 59 points to grab the 21st spot, which is held by 2008 Liberty graduate Alex McLean.

Ohman leads the Flames with 15.5 points per game and is tied for seventh in the Big South in scoring with Charleston Southern guard Jamarco Warren. Ohman currently has 155 points on the season, making him the first Flame to reach the century mark this season.

### Finding the Mark

Liberty garnered its best first half three-point shooting percentage of the season on Dec. 3 against Charleston Southern, hitting 5-of-11 from behind the arc (45.5 percent).

### Watch List Week

The Nov. 17 contest against Clemson marked Liberty's first encounter with a member of the 2009-10 Naismith Award Watch List, as Trevor Booker entered the Vines Center, collecting 12 points and 12 rebounds. The second meeting with a watch list member took place on Nov. 22, when the Flames traveled to South Bend, Ind., for a match-up with Notre Dame's Luke Harangody. The Fighting Irish's center posted 32 points and nine rebounds on the night.

The Naismith Award Watch List consists of the nation's top 50 players, who are selected based on their performances last season and expectations heading into the 2009-10 campaign. The list will be narrowed down to 30 players in February and four finalists in March. In addition to making the list, Harangody is also nominated for the 2009-10 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.

### Starter and Stopper

In the Nov. 19 contest against Old Dominion, freshman Patrick Konan earned the first start of his collegiate career. During the contest, Konan tallied six points, while grabbing six boards. The forward looked even more impressive on the defensive end, helping hold Old Dominion's leading scorer and big man Gerald Lee to just four points.

### Like Father, Like Son

The addition of Evan Gordon to the Flames' roster this season makes him the program's first second-generation player. Evan's father, Eric Gordon, Sr., suited up for the Flames from 1981-1984. The three-year letterwinner is currently No. 16 on Liberty's all time scoring list with 1,154 points.

While Gordon is the first second-generation Flame, he is not the first player whose father is also in the Liberty men's basketball annals. Mark Manley, who played three seasons with the Flames between 1998 and 2002 is the son of Dan Manley, the program's first head coach (1973-77).

### All-American Brothers

Two members of the 2009-10 Flames' roster are younger brothers of 2008 All-Americans. Eric Gordon, Jr., is the older brother to freshman guard Evan Gordon. The elder Gordon spent one season at Indiana and was Third Team All-America member in his lone season with the Hoosiers. Gordon was picked seventh overall by the Los Angeles Clippers in the 2008 NBA Draft and averaged 16.1 ppg his rookie season in the league. He is currently averaging 18.9 ppg with the team.

Sophomore point guard Jesse's Sanders older brother Thomas received an honorable mention on the 2008 All-America listing. The elder Sanders played four seasons at Gardner-Webb prior to the team joining the Big South. In his senior season with the Runnin' Bulldogs, he was named 2008 Atlantic Sun Player of the Year. He currently plays professionally in Spain.

**Game 1**  
*Fairfax, Va.*

The Flames (0-1) jumped out to quick 6-0 lead thanks to back-to-back treys from senior forward Kyle Ohman. Following a George Mason basket, the Mechanicsburg, Pa., native tallied two more points to maintain the six-point cushion at 16:12 in the first half. The Patriots soon erased the deficit, racking up five quick points off a three-point play and a steal to cut Liberty's lead to one. An Ohman free throw gave the Flames a 9-7 advantage at 15:35, but the Flames' lead would end when Patriots guard Cam Long hit a three-pointer to put George Mason up 10-9 at 14:25. The Patriots gradually extended their lead over the course of the half's remaining 14 minutes. The largest Mason lead occurred at 3:33, as the Flames trailed the home team 35-20. Guards Jesse Sanders and Jeremy Anderson provided the Flames with scoring, posting a quick layup and three-pointer to cut the deficit to 10, 35-25, with 2:39 left on the clock. George Mason would answer with a trey of its own followed by a dunk, going back up by 15. Freshman guard Chris Perez put up a layup at 0:55 making it 40-27 at halftime. At the start of the second half, Sanders made the first strike, posting a jumper to cut the Patriots' lead to 11. George Mason then began gradually increasing its advantage over the Flames just as it did in the first half. A free throw at 14:19 would give the Patriots' their largest lead of the contest, holding a 53-34 advantage over the Flames. Liberty received another scoring punch from Sanders less than a minute later, as the guard nailed a trey and a layup to trim the deficit to 14. Both teams would trade baskets the next four minutes. The Flames began chipping away at the George Mason lead as Ohman recorded a layup to give Liberty a spark, making it 62-50 with 8:04 remaining. The deficit was cut to seven points three minutes later thanks to a trey from freshman guard Evan Gordon, trimming the Patriots lead to seven points, 64-57, at 6:07. Liberty would later come within three points of the Patriots at 2:31 off two free throws from red shirt freshman Carter McMasters, 68-65. Both teams traded baskets down the stretch, with George Mason extending its lead to seven off free throws at 0:07. Guard David Minaya closed out the game with a three-pointer for Liberty, but George Mason was able to escape with their 17th-straight home victory.

**Game 2**  
*Lynchburg, Va.*

The Knights struck early with a three-pointer from guard Bryce Pendleton, latching on a layup and a second trey to take an early 8-0 lead at 16:50. Kyle Ohman then answered by scoring the Flames' first points six points for the second-straight game to spark Liberty's offensive attack. At 12:41, Carter McMasters knotted the game at eight with a baseline jumper. Following a Knights' basket, freshman Evan Gordon made a layup to kick start a 15-0 Flames run. Pendleton ended Liberty's run with a trey, making it, 25-13, at 5:37. The Flames added six more points, before the Knights answered with one at the foul line. After a layup from point guard Jesse Sanders, freshman guard Chris Perez made his mark with two-straight baskets to give Liberty a 37-14 advantage with 2:52 remaining in the half. Southern Virginia stopped the 6-0 spurt with a layup a minute later. Patrick Konan scored the first points of his collegiate career, hitting a layup at 1:29 to give the Flames a 23-point margin. The Knights concluded the 20-minute period with a three-pointer by Derek Cutler, making it 39-19 Liberty at halftime. In the second half, forward Tyler Baker racked up six-straight points in the first two and a half minutes to extend Liberty's advantage. Liberty managed to hold the Knights scoreless for nearly three minutes of play, before Southern Virginia's Cory Evans nailed a jumper at 17:19, to make it 45-21. A minute later, David Minaya electrified the Vines Center crowd with a two-handed jam, finishing off a layup attempt from Gordon. Both teams traded baskets over the next five and a half minutes, with Liberty holding a 53-33 lead over the Knights at 10:55. The Flames began to distance themselves further from the Knights in the contest's final 10 minutes. With 8:26 remaining, Gordon faked out his defender with a spin move en route to a layup to increase Liberty's bulge to 65-40. The fast breaks began for Flames with under eight minutes left, when Perez found Minaya for a quick dunk. Perez found himself on the opposite end of a one-two scoring punch soon after, when Baker dishd it to him for a layup to give the Flames a 29-point advantage at 7:16. Liberty went on to outscore the Knights 20-13 over the final seven minutes to capture their first win of the 2009-10 season, 89-53.

**Game 3**  
*Lynchburg, Va.*

The Tigers began their offensive attack early, off a three-pointer from David Potter. Turnovers and solid defensive pressure from Clemson stifled the Flames in the opening minutes, while the visiting squad managed to pull out to a 6-0 lead at 15:58. Tyler Baker tallied Liberty's first point 30 seconds later, going one-for-two at the foul line. Clemson responded by going on another 11-0 tear, making it 17-1 at 13:12, which forced Liberty to call a timeout. Following the stoppage, Jesse Sanders raced down the court and laid it in for Liberty's first field goal of the contest. After a Clemson basket, Kyle Ohman sank two free throws to cut the deficit back to 14. The Flames received quality minutes from Patrick Konan, as he posted a layup with 11:03 left in the half and later found Carter McMasters alone underneath the basket for a two-handed jam. Clemson created a fast break opportunity at 9:42 when Andre Young snatched a pass from Sanders and dished it to Trevor Booker for a quick dunk. Shortly after stepping onto the court, Johnny Stephens drained a baseline jumper just before the shot clock sounded to make it 32-13 at 6:26. Sanders followed up the Florida native's effort with a layup to give Liberty two-straight baskets, but Clemson answered the brief burst with another 9-0 run. Minaya ended the Tigers' scoring streak at 1:35 with a layup. Minaya's teammate and fellow Oldsmar Christian alum Chris Perez chipped in another hoop less than a half-minute later to give Liberty a first half total of 19. Booker then tacked on one more point at the foul line for a 42-19 Clemson lead at halftime. Liberty came out in the second half immediately applying defensive pressure. However, the Tigers managed to pick up where they left off, posting six unanswered points. Baker ended the run, shooting a trey to make it 48-22 at 17:03. Booker countered by tallying five points off back-to-back long-range jumpers. After two made free throws from Konan, both teams went scoreless for the next three and a half minutes, until Potter ended the drought with his fifth three-pointer of the contest to give the Tigers a 56-24 lead with 12:18 remaining. Clemson then tacked on a made free throw to extend its lead to 33. Less than a minute later, Stephens capitalized on an old-fashioned three-point play to cut it back to 30. With the offensive pace slowing on both sides, the Tigers managed to distance themselves further from the Flames, forcing turnovers and hitting outside shots, outscoring Liberty 22-12 in the last 11 minutes. Liberty ultimately fell to the No. 22 team in the country, 79-39.

*Lynchburg, Va.*

The Monarchs looked to run early, lighting up the scoreboard with a layup in just 13 seconds of the opening. A scoring lull ensued over the next two minutes, until Old Dominion's Ben Finney drained a shot from outside the three-point arc. The Flames quickly answered with a stick back from Patrick Konan. The basket by the freshman, who got his first career start on the night, trimmed the lead to three, 5-2, at the 17:16 mark. Konan then made his presence known again 28 seconds later, picking the pocket of Darius James, which resulted in a jumper from David Minaya. The Monarchs responded by going on an 11-0 run, to take a 16-4 advantage at 13:20. Ohman ended the streak, hitting a jump shot to cut the deficit to 10, 16-6, less than a minute later. Turnovers became a factor as the Monarchs capitalized on Liberty's miscues to go on another 13-0 run. Ohman came through for the Flames once again with an old-fashion three-point play, trimming the Monarch's lead to 20, 29-9, with 4:28 remaining. The Monarchs pace slowed in the closing minutes of the period, as the two Commonwealth teams headed into the locker room with the halftime score favoring the visitors 35-14. The Monarchs extended their margin in the second half with 10-unanswered points. Minaya netted the first basket for the Flames during the second half, making it 45-16 in favor of Old Dominion at 15:31. Old Dominion then posted six-straight points to extend its lead to 35. The Monarchs led by as much 36, but Liberty would find its range, trading baskets with Monarchs down the stretch. Old Dominion would go on to take the contest 73-41, handing the Flames their second-straight home loss and the third on the season.

**Game 5**  
*South Bend, Ind.*

Notre Dame's Luke Harangody lived up to his billing, posting the first four points of the contest to give the Fighting Irish the early lead. The Flames answered with baskets from Patrick Konan and Carter McMasters to knot the game at four. Jonathan Peoples recaptured the lead for the Fighting Irish with a three-pointer, but Liberty's McMasters matched the shot with a trey of his own, tying it again at 15:40. After made shot at the free line by the Irish, Kyle Ohman hit another Liberty three-point basket, giving the Flames a two-point advantage, 10-8. The Flames took the opening tip and capitalized immediately with five-straight points courtesy of a Kyle Ohman trey and a jumper by Evan Gordon. Charleston Southern lit up the scoreboard first, posting five unanswered points courtesy of baskets from Quinton Goods and Jamarco Warren. The Flames rallied with a flurry of their own at 18:11, as Evan Gordon knocked down a trey following a Kyle Ohman basket to knot the contest at five. Patrick Konan gave Liberty the lead thanks to a dish from Gordon, making it 7-5 at 16:31.
