Ritchie McKay hit the ground running once he arrived on Liberty Mountain, quickly assembling a 2008 recruiting class that Basketball Times ranked at No. 48 on its Top 50 list. Liberty joined eight other schools which are not a part of a BCS football power conference.

Liberty marks McKay's fifth head coaching stint, and his first east of the Mississippi, after stops in the Big Sky, Mountain West, Pac-10 and WAC conferences. With the experience and success that McKay brought with him to Liberty, the true nature of how special his first Liberty recruiting class can be, is reflected in the national recognition it's received prior to the sextet's arrival on campus.

With his recruiting accolades aside, McKay's inaugural season at Liberty was one of improvements. McKay guided the Flames to their first non-losing season in four years, setting three-point shooting records along the way. McKay's squad had a penchant for hitting the trey, setting Liberty records in three-point field goals (288) and attempts (772), while finishing the year with the third-best success rate (37.3 percent) in school history.

Under McKay's tutelage, an already talented Anthony Smith reached new heights. As a junior, Smith was the only player in the nation during the 2008 season to attempt at least 200 three-point field goals and succeed on at least 50 percent of his field goal attempts (51.5) and 40 percent of his three-point field goal attempts (41.0).

Under McKay's guidance, TeeJay Bannister finished the season ranked No. 3 in the nation in assists (224 assists). Bannister's assist mark is a Liberty Division I record, the second-best mark overall in the Liberty annals, serves as the second-best mark in Big South history. Bannister became only the fifth player in conference history to reach the 200-assist plateau in a season.

McKay oversaw a successful campaign from forward Alex McLean as well. McLean was named to the Big South All-Conference first team. The honor marked the sixth-straight year, Liberty has placed a player on the first team, tying the second-best streak in conference history. The streak also serves as the longest current streak among conference teams.

McKay earned his bachelor of arts degree in athletic administration from Seattle Pacific in 1987. A stellar player for the Falcons, McKay left the program as the school's single-season and career record holder for steals, and he was third in career assists. He still holds the school record with 10 steals in a 1987 game against Pacific Lutheran.

McKay is married to the former Julie Summers. The couple resides in Forest, Va., with their two sons, Luke (9) and Gabriel (7) and a daughter, Ellie (12).

Game Preview

The Liberty Flames (17-8, 8-5) conclude their two-game homestand when they welcome the Presbyterian Blue Hose (10-13, 7-5 BSC) into the Vines Center, Monday night. Tip-off is set for 7 p.m., wrapping up the regular season series.

The contest will be televised on the Flames Sports Network, with Ray Jones providing the play-by-play, Tim Scarborough adding the color analysis and Samantha Steele roaming the sidelines. The radio broadcast will air on the Flames Sports Network (flagship WRVL 88.3 FM), with Jerry Edwards providing the play-by-play for his 28th season. Additionally, an Internet audio broadcast on LibertyFlames.com will be available. There will also be a live video stream of the broadcast via the Big South EDGE, available on Big-SouthSports.com.

Recent Results

Liberty enters tonight's game after getting back to its winning ways on Saturday, topping four-time Big South Champions, the Winthrop Eagles. The Flames secured the 10 point victory, 57-47, thanks in parts to Seth Curry's 16 points and Kyle Ohman's 10 markers.

Prior to Saturday's triumph, Liberty suffered a heartbreaking double-overtime loss at Gardner-Webb on Feb. 4, 95-90. Ohman poured in a career-high 38 points in the losing effort. Prior to the Gardner-Webb defeat, Liberty reeled off two straight league wins, starting with a 78-66 triumph over UNC Asheville on Jan. 31. Four starters tallied double figures, led by Seth Curry's 17 markers and Ohman's 16 points. Prior to the UNC Asheville win, Liberty topped visiting High Point on Jan. 27, 78-63. Ohman led the way with 26 points, while Anthony Smith chipped in 23 markers to help put the Flames back on their winning ways. Radford handed Liberty a minor setback on Jan. 24 in double overtime, 94-82. Seth Curry led all scorers with 30 points.

The Radford loss snapped a four game winning streak and an 11 game home winning streak. Before the Radford setback, Liberty scored 14 straight points in the game's final 1:43 to steal away the victory, 61-56, at High Point on Jan. 20. The Flames were down nine points, before Smith scored eight straight points and grabbed three steals in the final 23 seconds to lead the comeback charge.

Youth Will Be Served

According to research by the University of Denver, the Flames are the fourth youngest team in the country, as calculated by average age by Nov. 14, 2008. According to research by Duquesne University, the Flames, with seven scholarship freshmen, are tied with five other teams for second most in the country, behind Duquesne, which has eight scholarship freshmen. Liberty also leads the nation in percentage of minutes played by freshmen.

Liberty versus Presbyterian

Tonight's contest is the fifth all-time meeting between the two schools in basketball. Presbyterian leads the series, 3-1. Prior to the Flames 69-47 victory last season, the other two contests of the series took place during the 1978-79 campaign. Liberty fell at home on Nov. 20, 1978, by a score of 74-60. The Blue Hose were victorious once again in Clinton, S.C., when Liberty fell in overtime, 95-91, in Presbyterian's New Year's Classic on Jan. 5, 1979. Last season, inside the Vines Center, Liberty held the Blue Hose to no three-point field goals in 16 attempts. The Blue Hose captured an exciting double-overtime triumph by one point, 67-66, on Jan. 5, in Clinton, S.C. Of the four games played in the series, two have been played on each team's home court, and both contests played in Clinton, S.C., were decided after regulation.

Attempting to Push Record to 10 Games over .500

With a win tonight against Presbyterian, Liberty will move its season record to 10 games over .500 at 18-8. Before this season, the last time Liberty played in such a contest was nearly 12 years ago on Feb. 8, 1997. The Flames defeated the Winthrop Eagles in Rock Hill, S.C., by three points, 66-63, pushing their record to 17-7 on the season.

Curry Reaches 500 Point Club

Freshman Seth Curry became the 48th player in program history to tally 500 career points. Curry is the third player to reach the club in his first season with the program and the second freshman. As a freshman, George Sweet reached the 500 point club in 1973, in the first year of the program. Mike Goad made his mark on the 500 point club in 1974 as a junior.

Team Rebounding on the Way Up

Liberty as a team was outrebounded in 11 of the season's first 13 games. Since game No. 14, the Liberty squad, which starts five guards, has outrebounded eight of its last 12 opponents, including a current streak of four straight games.

Liberty Cinches First Winning Season Since 2004

With Liberty's victory over Winthrop on Saturday, the Flames have successfully claimed their first winning season since 2004 when the program won the Big South Championship, finishing with an 18-15 mark.

Curry Adapts Game

Freshman Seth Curry has hit a little shooting slump over the past five games. At the conclusion of his career-best 35 point performance at VMI on Jan. 17, Curry was hitting 45.9 percent of his shots, including 39.9 percent of his three-point attempts for the season. In the five games since the VMI contest, Curry has hit only 33.6 percent of his attempts, including 25.4 percent of his three-point shots.

During the five game period, Curry has adapted his game, averaging 6.0 rebounds per game versus 3.7 caroms he was averaging after the VMI contest. Assists are up too, from 1.8 to 3.2 helpers per game.

Smith Accomplishes Liberty First

Anthony Smith dished out his 200th career helper on Feb. 4 at Gardner-Webb, making him the first player in Liberty program history with at least 1,000 career points, 500 career rebounds and 200 career assists.

Curry Taking Charity from the Stripe

Seth Curry has made 47 of his last 49 free throw attempts, including 20 straight. Curry is currently No. 4 in the Big South for free throw efficiency this season at 82.4 percent.

LU Nab Back-to-Back-to-Back Big South Player of the Week Awards

Kyle Ohman averaged 21.0 points, 59.1 percent from the field (13-of-22) and 57.1 percent from beyond the arc (8-of-14) in two Big South wins for the of week Jan. 26-Feb. 1, earning Big South Choice Hotels Player of the Week honors.

Ohman's accolade gives Liberty a strangle hold on the weekly award for three weeks, marking the first time a school has won three straight Big South Player of the Week honors since Liberty accomplished the feat during the 1995-96 season. Peter Aluma won the first two awards during the run, while Marcus White followed up with one of his own, finishing off the trio of honors. Ohman's award follows Anthony Smith's honor on Jan. 26, while Seth Curry earned his second nod this season as player of the week on Jan. 19.

ESPNU BracketBuster Pairings Announced

Liberty is set to play the Old Dominion Monarchs of the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) in this year's ESPNU BracketBusters, as announced by ESPN on Feb. 2. The game will be televised on the ESPN family of networks, Feb. 21 in Norfolk, Va., inside the Ted Constant Convocation Center.

Big South Player of the Week Fun Fact

Kyle Ohman joined Seth Curry and Anthony Smith as the third different Liberty Flame this season to win Big South Player of the Week honors, marking the first time in program history that three different Flames garnered player of the week certificates in the same season. The Big South has now accomplished the feat in three straight seasons. The 2006-07 Winthrop Eagles (Craig Bradshaw, Michael Jenkins and Torrell Martin) and the 2007-08 UNC Asheville Bulldogs (K.J. Garland, Kenny George and Bryan Smithson) started the streak. Both Winthrop and UNC Asheville ended up winning the Big South Conference regular season championship the season they accomplished the feat. The VMI Keydets have also had three different players earn Big South player of the week honors this season (Chavis Holmes, Travis Holmes and Austin Kenon).

McKay Eyes 200 Career Victories

In his 13th season of head coaching, Ritchie McKay currently owns 198 career head coaching victories, needing just two more to reach the 200 career triumph milestone. All of McKay's victories have come at the Division I level and in five different conferences (Big Sky, Big South, Mountain West, Pac-10 and WAC).

Curry and Ohman Reach Single Season Top 5 for 3-Point Field Goals

Seth Curry currently has 74 three-point field goals this year, giving him Liberty's second-best individual total for a season, trailing only 2008's Anthony Smith (84). On Saturday, Curry passed 1994's Matt Hildebrand (73) for his current position in second. Curry's mark also bests all Liberty freshman, topping 2004's Larry Blair (63).

Kyle Ohman currently has 70 three-point field goals this year, giving him Liberty's fourth-best individual total for a season, trailing only Smith, Curry and Hildebrand. Entering the season, Ohman's 2008 season (63) had tied for the fifth-best total, a mark that has fallen to seventh this season.

Three Amigos

Seth Curry, Kyle Ohman and Anthony Smith have contributed 196 of Liberty's 229 three-pointers this season. The total comes out to 85.6 percent of the Flames' treys coming from the trio.

Lights Camera Action

Liberty freshman Seth Curry had a cameo role in the basketball motion picture Juwanna Mann. Curry was 11 years old when the movie was released in the summer of 2002. In a scene that was filmed in the backyard of a previous home his family owned in Charlotte, the main character of the movie, Jamal Jefferies, sees a young girl playing basketball with a group of young boys. The Jefferies character, who recently was suspended from the NBA, gets the idea of dressing up as a women to play in the WNBA. Curry was one of the young boys playing in the game the Jefferies character witnessed.

Overtime Craze

After going 75 overtime-free games, a streak that was broken on Nov. 29 when Liberty experienced a double-overtime affair with William & Mary, the Flames have now registered a total of five overtime games this season. The five overtime mark breaks a program season best of four set in 1996. Four of Liberty's overtime contests this season have been of the double-overtime variety, a first for the program. Only Bucknell and Idaho State have played as many overtime games as the Flames this season.

Liberty is 2-3 this season in overtime contests and 20-32 all-time. Liberty is 2-1 inside the Vines Center and 0-2 on the road in overtime contests this season.

The overtime free streak, which was snapped this season, served as the second-longest in program history and the longest during Liberty's Division I era. Liberty's overall longest streak without an overtime contest is 134 games from Dec. 8, 1972, until Dec. 9, 1977.

Best Start through First 20 Games

Liberty registered a 14-6 mark through the first 20 games of the season. The record is the best mark for the Flames since they started the 1991-92 campaign with a 17-3 mark, Liberty's first season in the Big South Conference.

Curry Nabs First Career Double-Double

On Jan. 27, Seth Curry became the first Liberty freshman to collect a double-double since Peter Aluma on Feb. 5, 1994. The former Liberty standout and NBA performer tallied 13 points and pulled down a game-high 10 rebounds at UMBC. Liberty won the game 75-64. Curry notched his first career double-double with 16 points and a game-high 10 caroms in Liberty's 78-63 triumph over High Point on Jan. 27. Fellow freshman Jesse Sanders almost recorded a double-double in the same game with Curry, recording nine assists and nine rebounds.

Defending the Free Throw

If a team can successfully defend free throws, Liberty is doing so against Big South opponents. Only UNC Asheville (on Nov. 18 and Jan. 31) and VMI (on Jan. 17) have connected on better than 70 percent of their free throw attempts.

Dishing Assists

Liberty has dished out at least 15 assists in four of its last five contests. The Flames recorded 20 helpers against Radford on Jan. 24 and 22 against High Point on Jan. 27. Liberty dished out 15 assists on Jan. 31, dropping under the 20 assist mark for the first time in three games. The Flames dished out 16 assists on Feb. 4 at Gardner-Webb.

Double Figure Scoring

Six out of Liberty's last seven wins have been by double figures or more. Liberty's lone victory in the stretch that did not reach a double-figure margin was at High Point on Jan. 20. Liberty trailed by nine points with 1:43 left in the game, before scoring 14 straight points to win by five markers.

Sanders Doesn't Turn the Ball Over

Freshman point guard Jesse Sanders has recorded six games this season without a turnover. Sanders leads the conference in assist-to-turnover ratio at 2.33.

Bench Help

Liberty tallied 15 points off the bench against UNC Asheville on Jan. 31. The total bench points were more than the bench had scored in the previous four games combined.

Hitting Three Point Buckets

Liberty is currently second in the Big South Conference in made three-point buckets at 9.2 per game. The Flames have reached double figures in made three-point field goals in three of their last six games. As a team, Liberty is connecting on 35.5 percent (61-of-172) from beyond the arc during the five game span.

Curry Eyes Some Big South Records/Sets Another

Seth Curry currently has 505 points, having passed Charleston Southern's Omar Carter (466) for a Big South Conference record for freshman scoring. Carter, a former high school teammate of Curry at Charlotte Christian, set the record last season. Curry now has his sights set on Coastal Carolina's Jack Leasure and his Big South freshman record of 85 three-point buckets set in 2005.

Also of note, no freshman in Big South history has ever averaged more than 20 points per game. Curry currently tallies 20.2 markers per contest, leaving the season to play out to see if the Charlotte, N.C., native could be the first.

Curry Pulls Two Weekly Awards on Jan. 19

For the second time this season, Seth Curry has been named Big South Choice Hotels Player of the Week and Dick Vitale's "Diaper Dandy" of the Week on the same day. It first happened on Dec. 1.

Smith Starts Slow From Beyond the Arc

Anthony Smith shot 26.2 percent (16-of-61) from beyond the arc through the season's first 12 games. Since his slow start, Smith is shooting 48.0 percent (36-of-75) from three-point range over the past 13 games.

This is nothing new for Smith, as the Plano, Texas native shot 27.3 percent (9-of-33) from three-point range through the first six games of last season. Smith heated up in game seven against Longwood on Nov. 27, 2007, connecting on 7-of-8 from three-point land, jumpstarting him to finish the final 26 games connecting on 43.6 percent (75-of-172) of his shots. Smith finished the year connecting on 41.0 percent (84-of-205) of his attempts, giving him the fifth-best success rate for a season in program history. The 84 three-point field goals and 205 three-point attempts were program bests.

Top Scorers

Liberty has Seth Curry (20.2 ppg) and Anthony Smith (18.0 ppg), both ranked in the top four in the Big South in scoring, helping Liberty register the second best team scoring average in the league, 75.4.

Smith's Last 15 Games

Anthony Smith has tallied at least 20 points in eight of his last 15 games. Over that span Smith is averaging 18.7 ppg, 6.4 rpg and is hitting 55.3 percent of his field goals, including 43.5 percent of his three-point attempts.

Smith Climbs Career Minutes Played List

Senior Anthony Smith currently sits second all-time in the Liberty annals in minutes played. The Plano, Texas native has played 3,796 minutes in his career, only ranking behind Larry Blair (4,123). For Smith to catch Blair, the guard would have to continue averaging his current rate of 35.6 minutes per game, while Liberty would need to reach the championship round of the Big South tournament.

No Bench Points

Liberty tallied no bench points in its 91-80 victory at VMI on Jan. 24. Liberty has never scored that many points and won a game without any points coming from its bench. The last time Liberty received no bench scoring was on Nov. 16, 2006, at Oklahoma. Liberty lost to the Sooners, 74-48.

Curry Scores 30 Points and another Liberty First

Seth Curry scored 30 points on Dec. 22 against Northern Colorado, becoming the first freshman in the Liberty Division I era to score at least 30 points during a regular season contest. Jamaal Bennett tallied 35 points in the quarterfinals of the 1999 Big South Championship, making him the only other freshman in Liberty's Division I era. One other freshman in the Liberty annals has accomplished the feat, as George Sweet did so during the first year of the program, the 1972-73 season. Sweet tallied 30 points on the nose on three separate occasions. Curry became the first Division I Liberty freshman to reach the 30-point plateau three times, after tallying 35 points on Jan. 17 at VMI, and pouring 30 markers against Radford on Jan. 24.

Smith Reaches the 1,000 Point/500 Rebound Club

With three rebounds on Jan. 27, Anthony Smith became the 36th player in Big South history to score at least 1,000 career points and grab 500 career rebounds. Smith became the ninth player in program history to accomplish the feat and the fourth during the Division I era.

Smith Reaches the 1,500 Point/500 Rebound Club

Anthony Smith has 1,588 career points and 517 career rebounds. He tallied his 500th career rebound against High Point on Jan. 27 to become the ninth player in Big South history with 1,500 career points and 500 career rebounds.

Curry Top Scoring Freshman in the Nation

Seth Curry's 26-point performance at Virginia on Nov. 25 pushed his points per game average to 22.3, helping him bypass the Cavaliers' Sylvan Landesberg (22.0) as the nation's top scoring true freshman. Curry has held the distinction ever since and is currently the only freshman in the Top 50 in scoring and is No. 25 overall at 20.2 ppg.

Smith on Liberty's Career Three-Point List

Anthony Smith has 197 career three-point field goals, ranking No. 4 all-time in the Liberty record books. Next on the list is Matt Hildebrand (207).

Ohman on Liberty's Career Three-Point List

Kyle Ohman has 135 career three-point field goals, needing five more to pass Mark Reed (139) for No. 5 all-time in the Liberty record books.

Ohman Crashes the Boards

Kyle Ohman is pulling down 5.5 rebounds a game this season. The average is 3.0 more caroms per contest than the former walk-on averaged a season ago.

Curry Tallies a Big South Conference First

Seth Curry was named Choice Hotels Big South Player of the Week on Dec. 1, making the first time that a true freshman earned the weekly award since the institution of the Big South Freshman of the Week award for the 1990-91 season. Kennedy Okafor from Maryland-Baltimore County won the award as a redshirt freshman on Dec. 15, 1997.

Curry and Sanders Team Up for another Big South First

On Dec. 1, Seth Curry and Jesse Sanders were named Big South Player and Freshman of the Week respectively. It marked the first time in the history of the Big South Conference that a school swept the weekly awards, with the player of the week also being a freshman.

Curry Receives Weekly Accolades From ESPN's Dick Vitale

Seth Curry was named Dick Vitale's Diaper Dandy of the Week on Dec. 1 for his play against Virginia, Coker and William & Mary, all Flames' victories. Curry averaged 23.0 ppg and 4.0 rpg, while shooting 51.9 percent from the floor and 41.7 percent from three-point land during that span.

Ohman Hitting the Trey

Since the arrival of head coach Ritchie McKay, Kyle Ohman has appeared in all 57 contests he has coached. Ohman only appeared in 10 games prior to McKay's arrival. Since the opening day of the 2007-08 season, Ohman has connected on 40.1 percent (133-of-332) of his three-point shots. Ohman's career 39.5 percent mark (135-of-342) ranks No. 3 all-time in the Liberty annals.

McKay inside the Vines Center

Head Coach Ritchie McKay has a career 26-3 mark inside the Vines Center (.897 winning percentage). His three losses came on Jan. 15, 2008, to Winthrop (59-50), on Feb. 26, 2008 to VMI (81-79) and on Jan. 24 to Radford (94-82) in two overtimes. McKay won 11 straight inside the Vines Center, before his first career setback. Ironically, McKay's most recent defeat came after 11 straight triumphs.

Curry in the Clutch

Seth Curry scored 13 points, on 6-of-7 shooting, during two overtime periods on Nov. 29, leading the Flames to an 80-74 victory over William & Mary. Curry's trey with 18 seconds tied the game at 71, sending the contest into the second overtime period. Curry's heroics helped him earn tournament MVP honors in the Liberty Thanksgiving Classic.

Curry in the Clutch Part II

Seth Curry reprised his role from the William & Mary double-overtime victory, helping Liberty dispose of George Mason in overtime on Dec. 1, 69-66. Curry's triple with 17.7 seconds left sent the game into the extra frame. From that juncture, Curry scored five of Liberty's eight points in overtime, including an 18-foot jumper to put the Flame ahead for good with 40.6 left in the extra period.

Curry in the Clutch Part III

Seth Curry nailed a three-point bucket at the buzzer in overtime on Jan. 5, sending the Flames to a second overtime at Presbyterian. Liberty would later fall in double-overtime, 67-66.

Ohman Ties a John Paul Jones Arena Record

Kyle Ohman scored 17-first half points against Virginia on Nov. 25, tying a John Paul Jones Arena record for first half points. Ohman shares the record with North Carolina's Tyler Hansbrough and Hampton's Vincent Simpson.

Curry Ties another Record

Seth Curry played all 50 minutes during Liberty's double-overtime win against William & Mary on Nov. 29. By doing so, Curry tied the program record for minutes played in a game, becoming the fourth player to do so. The last time was by Mike Minett on Feb. 10, 1986, against Longwood, roughly four years and six months before Curry's birth.

Liberty Wins Three Against In-State Non-Conference Foes

The Dec. 1 win over George Mason gave Liberty three non-conference victories over intra-state Division I teams for the first time since the 1999-2000 season. Liberty beat James Madison (79-70), Richmond (64-61 2OT) and Virginia Tech (62-61) that season. This year, Liberty has topped Virginia (86-82), William & Mary (80-74 2OT) and George Mason (69-66 OT).

Shooting the Trey

Liberty is averaging 26.0 three-point attempts a game. Opponents are barely trailing the Flames in that category, heaving up 24.4 long range shots a game.

Grabbing the Rebound

Liberty is eighth in the Big South Conference in rebounding margin. Opponents are rebounding 1.7 more caroms a game than the Flames. Liberty has been outrebounded in 14-of-25 games this season.

Assists are Up and Turnovers Down

Liberty has a positive assist-to-turnover ratio at 1.2, ranking Liberty second in the Big South. Jesse Sanders leads the team with a 2.33 ratio, as he has dished out 107 assists to 46 turnovers. That marks leads the Big South and is No. 34 nationally.

Sanders is Pulling Offensive Boards

Liberty's point guard, Jesse Sanders, has pulled down a team-high 55 offensive rebounds. He is averaging 2.2 offensive rebound per game average, or 21.7 percent of Liberty's team average.

Curry Joins Elite Liberty Circle

Freshman Seth Curry became the fourth Liberty freshman, and the third since the Flames moved to Division I, to reach the 20-point plateau in his collegiate debut, when he tallied 23 markers against Montreat on Nov. 14.

The first Liberty freshman to accomplish the feat was Willard DeShazor, who poured in 29 points against Tennessee Temple on Nov. 28, 1973. Chris Toomer scored 21 points against Maine on Nov. 23, 1990, in his first collegiate game. Jay Boykin was the last Liberty freshman, until Curry, to reach 20 points in his collegiate debut. He scored 20 points against Drake on Nov. 24, 1995, when Curry was five years old.

The previous three members of this exclusive Liberty club played all four years at Liberty, but Deshazor was the only player to reach the 1,000-point club (1,569). Toomer is next with 583 career points.

Notes From Virginia Win

Liberty's win over Virginia snapped the Cavaliers 36-game November home winning streak, which dated back to 1994. The win also snapped Virginia's 16-game winning streak against Big South opponents, which dated back to Liberty's last win over the Cavaliers in 1998. The win also snapped Virginia's 15-game winning streak against non-conference in-state opponents, which dated back to 2002.

Seth Curry and Kyle Ohman led Liberty with 26 points, while Anthony Smith chipped in 21 markers. The performance by the trio marked the first time three players have scored 20 against Virginia in the same game since Juan Dixon (23), Chris Wilcox (21) and Lonny Baxter (20) did so for Maryland on March 3, 2002.

The Curry/Lynchburg Connection

Freshman Seth Curry isn't the only member of his family to appear in a college game on the Liberty campus. Seth's father, Dell Curry, as a freshman, poured in a game-high 19 points, on 7-of-13 shooting, for Virginia Tech on Dec. 7, 1982, in the Hokies' 71-53 triumph over the Flames.

The game featured two fathers of 2008 All-Americans. Dell's older son Stephen is an All-American performer at Davidson, while the Flames' Eric Gordon saw his son, Eric Gordon, Jr. picked in the first round of the NBA Draft by the Los Angeles Clippers after an All-American season at Indiana. Liberty's Gordon, scored six points and dished out two assists against Curry's Virginia Tech squad that cold December night in 1982.

Curry Ties Vines Center Record in Debut

Seth Curry's seven steals against Montreat on Nov. 14 tied a Vines Center record that was originally set by Delawn Grandison on Jan. 7, 1999 against Tusculum and was last achieved by Maurice Watkins on Jan. 15, 2001 against Charleston Southern. Curry became one of seven players to record seven steals inside Liberty's home.

My Brother is an All-American

Freshmen Seth Curry and Jesse Sanders each are younger siblings of All-Americans from last season. Curry's older brother Stephen is currently an All-American performer at Davidson, nearly lifting the Wildcats to the 2008 Final Four. Sanders' older brother Thomas earned All-American honors at Gardner-Webb after being named 2008 Atlantic Sun Player of the Year. The elder Sanders poured in 21 points and pulled down 10 rebounds in the Bulldogs' 84-68 upset win at No. 20 Kentucky on Nov. 8, 2007.

10 Wins Prior to New Years

Liberty defeated Cincinnati Christian on Dec. 28, marking the first time in program history the Flames have recorded 10 wins before New Years. Three times, the program has managed nine wins before New Years, doing so during the 1979-80, 1983-84 and 1996-97 seasons.

Next on the Scoring List for Anthony Smith

With 1,588 career points, Anthony Smith sits in eighth place all-time in the Liberty annals for scoring and third in Division I scoring. On Jan. 27, Smith passed Larry Jackson (1,539), a four-year letterwinner from 1995-98 and Willard DeShazor (1,545), a four-year letterwinner from 1974-77.

Next up on the scoring list is Ed Vickers (1,658), a three-year letterwinner from 1978-80. Smith needs 71 points to move past Vickers into seventh place all-time.

Smith Can Shoot

Senior Anthony Smith was the only player in the nation in 2008 to attempt at least 200 three-point field goals and succeed on at least 40 percent of his three-point field goal attempts (41.0), while also connecting on 50 percent of his field goal attempts (51.5). He was one of five players in the nation to accomplish the same feat, while attempting at least 100 three-point field goals. The other players were Mario Chalmers (Kansas), Lee Cummond (BYU), Malik Hairston (Oregon) and James Harden (Arizona State).

Road Woes

The Flames have lost 42 of their last 52 road games, dating back to the start of the 2005-06 season. Three of the wins during the span came during the 2006-07 season. A 66-63 victory at Charleston Southern on Jan. 22, 2007, a 118-108 victory at VMI on Feb. 21, 2007 and a 64-48 win at Radford on Feb. 24, 2007. The victory in Lexington was the Flames first since Dec. 7, 1991, and the win at Radford was Liberty's first since Feb. 22, 1997. The fourth road win was a 55-53 triumph at East Carolina on Nov. 17, 2007, the fifth road win was on Jan. 28, 2008 at VMI, 87-81 and the sixth was a 65-51 triumph at Coastal Carolina on Feb. 16, 2008. Liberty secured its seventh road victory during that span on Nov. 25 at Virginia, 86-82. For the third time during the stretch, Liberty won against VMI, at Cameron Hall on Jan. 17, 91-80. For the second time in three seasons, Liberty won back-to-back road contests when they won at High Point on Tuesday, 61-56.

Lynchburg, Va.**

Seth Curry had a banner night, scoring 23 points and tying a Vines Center record with seven thefts as the Liberty Flames (1-0) defeated the Montreat Cavaliers (1-2), 97-77, in front of 5,198 raucous fans. The win marks the first season-opening win for the Flames since they topped Tusculum, 84-58, on Nov. 17, 2000, inside the Vines Center. Curry's seven steals tied a Vines Center record that was originally set by Delawn Grandison on Jan. 7, 1999 against Tusculum and was last achieved by Maurice Watkins on Jan. 15, 2001 against Charleston Southern. Curry becomes one of seven players to record seven steals inside Liberty's home edifice. The Flames sprinted out to a 15-3 lead when Brolin Floyd nailed a three-point bucket from the corner at 13:28. Making his first collegiate appearance, Curry scored Liberty's first five points and seven of the Flames' first 12 during the run. Montreat managed one field goal by Timmy Harper at the 17:53 mark, before being held without a field goal until the 10:18 mark, when Seth Moore tallied a bucket in the paint. By that time, Liberty had extended its advantage to 21-6. The Cavaliers were able to cut the deficit to 10 points, 34-24, via an 18-13 advantage, capped by a Vincent Dombrowski three-point bucket at 3:45. Liberty quickly extended the lead back to 15 points, 39-24, courtesy of five straight points by Floyd. A trey from the corner at 2:34 capped the mini surge. Liberty closed out the half on a 9-5 run, capped by an Anthony Smith bucket as the half expired. The Flames went into the break with a 48-29 lead. The Flames were led in the opening stanza with 14 points by Curry, followed by 10 points by Floyd. Liberty connected on 42.9 percent (18-of-42) from the floor and 33.3 percent (5-of-15) from beyond the arc. Montreat shot 33.3 percent (10-of-30) from the floor and 16.7 percent (2-of-12) from beyond the arc in the first period. The Cavaliers came out of the break on an 11-5 spurt, capped by a MJ Njoku bucket at the 16:25 mark, cutting the score to 55-40. Liberty then reeled off seven straight points, taking a 20-point advantage, 60-40, after two free throws by Kyle Ohman at 15:36. The difference between the teams did not change much the rest of the contest, as Liberty finished with the 20-point win, 97-77. The Flames finished the night connecting on 47.8 percent (33-of-69) from the floor and 46.2 percent (12-of-26) from three-point range. Montreat tallied a 40.6 percent (28-of-69) success rate from the field and 25 percent (7-of-28) from beyond the arc. Smith led the Flames with 25 points on 10-of-15 shooting, while moving into 15th place on Liberty's all-time scoring list, passing Eric Gordon (1,154). Smith pulled down a team-high nine rebounds in the victory. Floyd added 15 points and Ohman chipped in 14 points, as every player who appeared for the Flames tallied at least two points.

**Game 2
Asheville, N.C.**

The Liberty Flames (1-1, 0-1 BSC) dropped their Big South Conference opener for the third straight year at UNC Asheville (3-0, 1-0), as the Bulldogs recorded an 84-56 victory, inside the Justice Center. The Bulldogs opened up the contest quickly, staking themselves to a 7-0 advantage, courtesy of a Reid Augst bucket at 16:50. The Flames finally got on the board at the 16:10 mark on a Seth Curry jumper from the wing. Over the next eight minutes, UNC Asheville extended its lead to 24-10, via a 17-8 spurt, including nine straight Bulldog points. Quinard Jackson finished off the run with a bucket at 8:35. Liberty trailed by as many as 21 points during the first half, 46-25, when John Williams banked a shot in with 41 seconds remaining in the stanza. Curry finished off the half with five straight points, versus the Bulldogs two points, sending the Flames into the break trailing 19 points, 49-30. The Bulldogs didn't slow down entering the second half, extending their lead to 27 points, 64-37, via a 15-7 jaunt, capped by two free throws from J.P. Primm at the 12:17 mark. The two teams played nearly even basketball over the final 12 minutes of the game, as UNC Asheville outgained Liberty by a point, 20-19, during the remainder of the game to seal the victory. Liberty struggled from the field on the afternoon, connecting on 31.7 percent (19-of-60) from the floor. The Flames shooting percentage from beyond the arc was not much better, as Liberty only hit 21.4 percent (6-of-28) from three-point range, including being shutout from long range in the second half. UNC Asheville looked sharp in the opening Big South game of the year, hitting 49.2 percent (29-of-59) from the floor and 52.9 percent (9-of-17) from beyond the arc. Curry led Liberty with 18 points and pulled down six rebounds. Anthony Smith chipped in 13 points and four rebounds in the losing cause.

Seth Curry and Kyle Ohman each tallied a career-high 26 points, helping the Liberty Flames (2-1, 0-1 BSC) defeat the Virginia Cavaliers (3-1, 0-0 ACC), 86-82, inside John Paul Jones Arena. The Flames jumped out to an early 10-2 lead, courtesy of eight straight Ohman points, including two three-point buckets. Curry capped the run with a jumper from the left elbow at 15:35. Virginia cut the deficit to four points, 13-9, via a 7-3 spurt, capped by Jerome Meyinsse's rebound and put back at 12:10. Liberty extended its lead back up to eight points, 17-9, when Curry hit a lay-up at 10:34. Liberty retook the lead, 43-41, when Smith tallied a trey from the wing at 16:15. A Calvin Baker trey at 15:55 gave the Cavaliers another one point lead, 44-43. The Flames then scored five-straight points to take a four-point advantage, 48-44. Curry connected on a trey from the wing and Smith tallied a bucket in the paint at 15:01. The Liberty Flames (3-1) used 22 points and eight rebounds from Seth Curry to cruise to an 88-66 win over the Coker Cobras (3-3) in the opening game of the Liberty Thanksgiving Classic, inside the Vines Center. Coker struck early, staking themselves to a quick 5-2 advantage via a trey by Lukas Varga at 19:25, followed by a Josh Poston jumper at 17:41. Kyle Ohman tied the game at five all on his three-point bucket at 17:23. Ohman's three-pointer sparked the Flames, as Liberty went on a 20-5 run, which was capped by a Jesse Sanders bucket on an Anthony Smith pass at the 11:04 mark. Sanders got things started and was perfect from the field, tallying nine of the 20 points during the run to give the Flames the 25-10 lead. **Game 5
Lynchburg, Va.**

Seth Curry tallied 13 of his 21 points during two overtime periods, helping the Liberty Flames (4-1) to a thrilling double-overtime victory over the William & Mary Tribe (3-4), 80-74, inside the Vines Center. With the victory, the Flames were the champions of the Liberty Thanksgiving Classic. William & Mary wasted no time getting on the board in the first overtime, scoring on two Quinn McDowell free throws at the 4:53 mark in the first overtime. After a Curry bucket at 4:38 tied the game for the sixth time, Schneider hit another three-point bucket at 4:26, giving the Tribe the 65-62 advantage. Liberty then regained the lead, 66-65, via two Kyle Ohman free throws and another Curry bucket at 2:49. Sanders extended the lead to three points, 68-65, at the 2:02 mark after he was successful on his two attempts from the charity stripe. The Tribe answered back quickly, tallying six straight makers, courtesy of a McDowell three-pointer and a Danny Sumner bucket with 56 seconds left. Kendrick Brown made one-of-two attempts from the free throw line, staking the Tribe to a three-point lead, 71-68, with 28 seconds left. The never-say-die attitude of the Flames witnessed Curry connected on a 27-footer with 18 seconds left, tying the game at 71 all. A Sumner contested three-point attempt fell incomplete, sending Liberty to its first double-overtime contest since Feb. 16, 2002. Schneider once again put the Tribe on his back, hitting a three-point bucket at 4:39 in the second overtime, giving William & Mary the 74-71 lead. However, that would be all the Tribe would score during the final five minutes, as Liberty tallied nine straight points to seal the victory. Curry scored six of the nine points, capping the game with a transition dunk with three seconds left. Curry, tournament MVP, finished with 21 points on 9-of-19 shooting. The freshman played 50 minutes in the contest, tying a program record for minutes played. Mike Minnett was the last Flame to play 50 minutes in a game, when he did on Feb. 10, 1986, four years prior to Curry's birth.

Lynchburg, Va.**

Liberty head coach Ritchie McKay must have loved the outcome of Saturday's double-overtime victory, because he ordered the sequel behind the late-game heroics of Seth Curry, in the Liberty Flames' (5-1) 69-66 overtime victory over the George Mason Patriots (5-2), inside the Vines Center. Jesse Sanders tallied a bucket at 18:37, pushing Liberty's lead to 10 points, 34-24. However, the Patriots came roaring back, scoring eight straight points to pull within two points, 34-32. A Vaughn bucket at 16:33 finished the run. Sanders put Liberty back on the scoreboard, 36-32, via two free throws at 15:59. A Birdsong bucket cut the lead back down to two points, 36-34, at 15:23. The Patriots made a push, taking its first lead of the game at the 11:26 mark, 44-43, courtesy of an Andre Cornelius trey. George Mason's first of the game. That bucket capped a 10-7 run. Five straight Curry points, capped a 7-4 spurt, helping the Flames reclaim the lead, 51-48, at the 8:09 mark. Back-to-back points by Cam Long gave the Patriots the advantage, 52-51, with 6:09 remaining in the contest. Later, a Monroe tip-in at 3:52, gave George Mason a two-point lead, 56-54. A Smith bucket and two free throws by Sanders gave Liberty back a two point lead, 58-56, with 1:48 on the clock. But, the Patriots scored five straight markers on a Long triple and a Birdsong layup, taking a solid three-point advantage, 61-58, with 29 seconds remaining, thus setting the stage for more heroics from Curry. The Patriots would not score again, as Smith nailed a trifecta, bringing Liberty within a point, 66-65, with 2:28 left. Then with 40.6 seconds on the clock, Curry rolled off an Ohman screen and nailed an 18-footer, giving Liberty a one point lead, 67-66. Liberty would never trail again. A Vaughn pass went through the hands of Birdsong and out of bounds with 13.1 seconds left. Curry was fouled by Cornelius before the ball was inbounded, sending the freshman to the line for the one-in-one. Lynchburg, Va.**

Anthony Smith poured in a game-high 27 points on 11-of-17 shooting, lifting the Liberty Flames (6-1, 1-1 BSC) over the Gardner-Webb Bulldogs (2-5, 1-1) in Big South Conference action, 68-59, inside the Vines Center. A Grayson Flittner three-point tally at 15:00 broke a 7-7 tie, pushing the Bulldogs ahead, 10-7, giving Gardner-Webb the advantage, something they would enjoy most of the first half. Answering a Seth Curry trey at 13:51, Jonathan Moore hit a three-point bucket at 13:30, extending the Gardner-Webb advantage to six points, 18-12. Liberty managed to cut the Gardner-Webb lead down to two points, 20-18, via a 6-2 spurt, capped by a Smith bucket in the lane after Brolin Floyd picked off Aaron Linn's pass. **Game 8
Clemson, S.C.**

After leading for the majority of the game, the Liberty Flames (6-2, 1-1 BSC) nearly won their second game in less than 24 hours, but fell late to the Clemson Tigers (9-0, 0-0 ACC), 80-75, inside Littlejohn Coliseum. Liberty defeated Gardner-Webb, 68-59, Saturday afternoon inside the Vines Center. Upon completion of the conference contest, the Flames boarded a charter flight out of Lynchburg for Sunday's non-conference tilt at Clemson. The Tigers jumped out to a quick 6-2 lead, capped by a Raymond Sykes bucket in the paint at 17:14. Liberty quickly countered, and charged ahead with their first advantage of the contest, 17-11, courtesy of a 15-5 run. Seth Curry and Kyle Ohman each hit two triples during the spurt, while Anthony Smith capped the run by hitting the back end of a two shot foul at 14:21. Clemson grabbed the lead back at 27-25, via a 16-8 spurt. A Trevor Booker putback at 8:11 ended the Tigers' push to retake the lead. Tucker nailed both attempts, giving DePaul the one point lead, 64-63, with 1.1 seconds left. A full court heave missed the mark, giving DePaul a slim victory. Curry finished with a game-high 16 points, after being held to two points in the opening stanza.

Seth Curry and Anthony Smith each had career days, as the Liberty Flames (13-6, 4-3 BSC) snapped the VMI Keydets (14-3, 6-1 BSC) winning streak at 10 games, in front of a capacity crowd of 5,029 fans inside Cameron Hall. The gathering at Cameron Hall served as the first capacity crowd in the facility's history, topping previous appearances by North Carolina and a Ralph Samson led Virginia squad. Keith Gabriel stroked a three at 17:33, giving VMI an early five point edge, 7-2. Liberty bounced back quickly, as a Kyle Ohman trey at 14:36 capped an 8-2 run, allowing the Flames to take their first lead on the afternoon, 10-9. The Keydets retook the lead, 23-16, courtesy of a 14-6 jaunt. Chavis Holmes finished off the sprint with a three-point bucket at 11:49. The run include another Gabriel trey and a Willie Bell bucket in the paint. Liberty stormed back, running out to a 10 point lead, 36-26, as the visitors netted 20 of the game's next 23 points. Curry hit three field goals from beyond the arc and punctuated the scoring burst with a two point field goal at 1:21. Curry scored 13 of Liberty's 20 points during the run. Two Gabriel buckets in the closing minute broke up the Liberty sprint, before Anthony Smith grabbed an offensive board after Gabriel blocked a Jesse Sanders shot, placing the ball through the cylinder with 2.2 seconds left. The bucket sent the Flames into the intermission with a nine point lead, 39-30. The Flames pushed their lead up to 13 points, 46-33, scoring 10 of the first 13 points in the second period. Smith tallied a bucket in the paint at 17:17, ending the run. Liberty then extended its lead to 16 points, 55-39, when Curry sank his fourth free consecutive free throw at 13:54. VMI regained its composure and surged back into the contest, cutting its deficit to seven points, 55-48, via nine straight points. Austin Kenon capped the run with a lay-up at 12:08. However, the lane jumper would prove be as close as the home team would get the remainder of the game. Liberty quickly extended the lead back up to 17 points, 67-50, courtesy of a Sanders old-fashioned three-point play at 9:22, to finish off a 12-2 spurt. Liberty extended the lead up to 20 points, 75-55, via two Ohman makes from the charity stripe at 6:04. Liberty, who leads the Big South in field goal shooting percentage, increases its season average by shooting 53.2 percent (33-of-62) from the floor, while hitting 42.9 percent (9-of-21) of its three-point attempts. The game also marked the eighth contest Liberty has shot over 50 percent from the floor and the 53.2 average is the fifth best on the year. Curry led all scorers with his career-high 35 points on 10-of-15 shooting. Curry went 4-of-6 from three-point range and connected on all 11 of his free throw attempts. Smith pulled down a career-high 17 rebounds to go with his 21 points.

The Liberty Flames (14-6, 5-3) scored 14 straight points over the final 1:43 to overcome a nine point deficit and escape with their second straight conference road victory, defeating the High Point Panthers (5-13, 1-7 BSC), 61-56, inside the Millis Athletic Center. A basket by Johnny Stephene broke a 45-45 tie and gave the Flames a 47-45 lead at 7:33 in the second half. It was the last field goal Liberty would score until the game's final seconds. High Point ripped the lead away from the Flames with 11 straight points to take a nine point lead, 56-47. A dunk by Short completed the run at 2:10. After the bucket, High Point did not score again. Making the first of his three thefts in the final 25 seconds, Smith plucked the ball out of David Singleton's hands in front of the High Point bench. Smith followed the triple by snaring the ball from Singleton with 10 seconds, and Seth Curry scored a bucket in transition putting Liberty up by four, 60-56 with 4.7 ticks left on the game clock. High Point called timeout, but the Panthers turned the ball over again when Smith intercepted a Barbour pass, sealing the Liberty victory. Sanders added a free throw with 2.2 seconds left to cap the five point triumph, 61-56. Smith scored 19 second half points and finished with 24.

The Bulldogs' cut their deficit to three points, 62-59 after a wacky play where UNC Asheville tallied five points on one trip down the court. Eric Stubbs tallied a bucket, while being fouled by Ohman. Stubbs missed the ensuing free throw, but was able to get his own rebound after the ball was batted around under the bucket. Sean Smith hit the ensuing trey, capping the possession. Stubbs scored another two markers at 3:58 to bring what was at one point in the half a 17 point lead for Liberty, down to two points, 63-61. It was as close as the Bulldogs got on the evening, as Liberty quickly surged to a 14 point advantage, 76-62, via a 13-1 run. An Ohman trey completed the run with 31 seconds left. Ohman's bucket came on the heels of Brolin Floyd's old fashioned three-point play and a Jesse Sanders tip-in. Liberty held down the fort, as UNC Asheville managed to make a two point dent into its deficit, falling by 12, 78-66. Curry tallied a team-high 17 points, pushing him past former Charlotte Christian teammate.

Reigning Big South Player of the Week Kyle Ohman poured in a career-high 38 points, pulled down 10 rebounds and hit 16-of-18 from the free throw line, but 24 team turnovers led to the Liberty Flames' (16-8, 7-5 BSC) double-overtime setback, 95-90, to the Gardner-Webb Bulldogs (11-11, 7-5 BSC), inside Paul Porter Arena. Gardner-Webb fared better from the floor, hitting at a 42.9 percent (15-of-35) clip, including 35.7 percent (5-of-14) from three-point land. Takayo Siddle nailed a trey with 10 seconds left, tying the game at 72-72. Liberty was unable to attempt a game-winning shot, sending the two teams into an extra session. In the first overtime, Liberty never trailed. The Flames held a four-point advantage after four straight free throws were tallied, two by Curry and another two by Ohman, giving the Flames an 80-76 advantage with 11 seconds to play. Then Siddle took over again for the Bulldogs, going the length of the court to lay the ball in with six seconds left, cutting Liberty's lead to two points, 80-78. Ohman turned the ball over into the waiting hands of Siddle, who tossed a prayer up as time expired. Falling backwards, from the elbow, Siddle's attempt fell through the cylinder, sending the game into the Flames' fourth double overtime contest of the season with the score tied, 80-80. Back-to-back buckets by Henley and Siddle quickly gave the Bulldogs an early four-point edge in the second overtime, 84-80. Siddle's bucket capped the spurt at the 3:21 mark. A Curry jumper at 1:17 cut the Bulldogs' lead to one point, 87-86. Siddle was fouled by Jesse Sanders with 46 left, sending the Bulldogs to the line for two free throws. Siddle hit both of them, pushing the Gardner-Webb lead back to three points, 89-86. Ohman drew a foul from C.J. Hailey with 32 seconds left, sending the junior to the line to shoot three free throws. Ohman nailed the first two, bringing Liberty within in one point, 89-88. Ohman's third attempt rimmed out, falling into the waiting hands of Henley. Blank was fouled on the play, but since a trainer came onto the court to view his injured eye, a substitute had to come in to shoot the double-bonus foul in Blank's place. Dillon Boggs sank the first attempt, pushing the Bulldogs' lead to two points, 90-88. Boggs' second attempt bounced out and was grabbed by Ohman. However, Ohman came down on the baseline after bumping into Floyd, forcing a Flames turnover. Gardner-Webb closed the game out at the free throw line, sinking 5-of-6 from the charity stripe, sealing the double-overtime triumph. Ohman's career-high 38 points tied Larry Blair for the program's third-highest point total ever against a Big South Conference foe.

Seth Curry tallied a game-high 16 points in a defensive struggle, inside the Vines Center, as the Liberty Flames (17-8, 8-5 BSC) grabbed a 10-point victory, 57-47, over the visiting Winthrop Eagles (6-17, 5-8 BSC). After Chris Malcolm tallied Winthrop's first two markers at the 19:09 mark, Liberty scored eight straight points, taking an early 8-2 lead. Anthony Smith's trey was followed by a bucket by Brolin Floyd, and the run was capped by Kyle Ohman's three-pointer at 17:13. Winthrop pulled within three points, 10-7, after a Justin Burton three-point field goal at 12:41. The Flames quickly countered with an Austin Smith 11-foot field goal and a Seth Curry three-pointer, extending their lead to six points, 15-9, with 10:49 left in the opening stanza. Back-to-back successful jumpers by Charles Corbin capped a 7-2 Winthrop spurt, cutting the Eagles' deficit to one point, 17-16, with 9:33 left in the first half. Liberty answered the Eagles' run, tallying a 9-1 spurt of its own, extending the lead to nine points, 26-17, with 4:36 left on the first-half clock. The Eagles entered the intermission down two points, 28-26, after closing out the first half on a 9-1 run. Corbin closed the run, hitting back-to-back attempts from the charity stripe at the 1:06 mark. A Floyd bucket at 18:29 gave the Flames a four-point lead, 32-28, but the Eagles quickly tied the game. Mantoris Robinson and Corbin tallied consecutive buckets, capping the quick jaunt at 17:26, knotting the game at 32-32. Liberty retaliated by sprinting ahead to a 14-point lead, 51-37, its largest of the game. Curry sank two freebies from the charity stripe at 5:20, finishing the 19-5 run. Winthrop started to make things interesting, scoring six straight points to trim its deficit down to eight points, 51-43, after a Mark-David Vil bucket went through the hoop at 4:13. But Curry scored five of Liberty's final six points, including an NBA-range dagger with 1:16 left in the contest, to seal the Flames' victory, 57-47. Curry became the first freshman in Big South history to eclipse the 500-point mark in a season, finishing with a game-high 16 points, to go along with six rebounds and two assists. Smith's work on the glass helped the Flames claim a slight, 37-36 rebounding edge for the contest. It was the fourth straight game Liberty has won the rebounding battle.
