The Game

The Liberty Lady Flames (12-7, 6-0 Big South) play host to the High Point Panthers (10-10, 6-1 Big South) in a battle between the first and second-place teams in the Big South Conference standings. Tip-off at the Vines Center is scheduled for 2 p.m., Saturday afternoon.

What to Watch

Saturday's game will match up one of the Big South's most experienced teams with one of the conference's youngest squads. The Lady Flames feature six seniors, three of whom start for Head Coach Carey Green. Meanwhile, the Panthers rely heavily on young talent, including 2008 Big South Freshman of the Year Mackenzie Maier and a favorite for this year's conference freshman of the year plaudit, Shamia Brown.

Several streaks will be on the line for Liberty. The Lady Flames have won nine games in a row overall, 16 straight January contests and 36 consecutive January home games. Liberty is trying to complete its second consecutive unbeaten January.

Lady Flames On The Air

All Lady Flames basketball games may be heard LIVE on WWMC 90.9 FM "The Light." Jamie Hall, celebrating his 15th year of broadcasting Lady Flames basketball, will once again be handling the courtside play-by-play duties for most road games. Josh Wood will serve as the commentator for home contests and will provide color analysis on the road.

Lady Flames On TV

For the sixth season in a row, the Flames Television Network (FTN) plans to broadcast all 12 home women's basketball games. FTN's regular announcing team will consist of Ray Jones on play-by-play and Jamie Hall on color.

Liberty head women's basketball coach Carey Green, in his 10th season with the Lady Flames, has instilled quite a winning tradition during his tenure at the institution. His teams have averaged more than 23 victories per year during his time at Liberty, putting his name alongside the nation's premier women's basketball coaches.

Green has accumulated a 225-75 record on the Liberty bench, good for a winning percentage of .750. He entered the season ranked 10th among active NCAA Division I women's basketball coaches in winning percentage, ahead of renowned coaching names like Rutgers' Vivian Stringer, LSU's Van Chancellor and North Carolina's Sylvia Hatchell.

More importantly, Liberty has won the Big South Tournament title and advanced to the NCAA Tournament eight times with Green as head coach. Liberty has totaled 23 or more victories during seven of those years, including the 2004-05 season, which saw the Lady Flames reach the Sweet 16 for the first time in program history.

Green has actually been to the postseason on 20 occasions as a women's basketball coach, a span which includes a dozen years as an assistant coach at Clemson. In all but one of the 20 appearances, he has experienced the NCAA Tournament.

Last season, Green led the Lady Flames to one of the best seasons in program history. Liberty tied a school record for victories, finishing the year 28-4. Along the way, the Lady Flames captured three tournament titles—the National City Xavier Invitational, the UNLV Lady Rebel Christmas Classic and their eighth Big South Championship in Green's nine years as head coach. The latter championship earned Liberty a spot in the NCAA Tournament for the 11th time. Green won his 200th career game, Jan. 19 at Charleston Southern, and became the first four-time Big South Women's Basketball Coach of the Year in conference history.

Rebounding and defense have always been staples of Green-coached teams, and the 2007-08 Lady Flames were no exception. Liberty outrebounded opponents by an average of 10.2 caroms per game, ranking fifth nationally. The Lady Flames have now been listed among the nation's top five teams in rebounding margin for five-straight years. Liberty led the nation in the category in 2003-04 and 2004-05. The Lady Flames also ended the season ranked in the top 15 in the nation for field goal percentage defense (fourth) and scoring defense (15th).

A key late-season conference victory over High Point in 2006 made Green the winningest coach in Big South Conference history. He is also Liberty's career wins leader.

The record-setting victory was just one of the many reasons the 2004-05 year was a special one on Liberty Mountain. A senior-laden Lady Flames team recorded upset wins over No. 4 seed Penn State (78-70) and No. 5 seed DePaul (88-79) in the first two rounds of the NCAA Tournament, becoming just the second team ever to advance to the Sweet 16 as a No. 13 seed. The Lady Flames ended the season with their highest national ranking to date, 21st (USA Today/ESPN).

Green's track record shows he has the ability to meet strong challenges. The Lady Flames have recorded two wins over UNLV, Virginia and West Virginia and solo victories over No. 19 DePaul, No. 17 Kansas State, No. 25 Penn State, Virginia Tech and Wake Forest during Green's tenure. The upset victory over No. 25 Virginia in 2003 marked Liberty's first win over a Top 25 team.

His record against conference foes is equally impressive. He led the Lady Flames on a Big South record 47-game winning streak and currently owns a .916 (142-13) winning percentage against conference teams. Green has marched through conference play with one or fewer setbacks six times, while guiding the Lady Flames to two undefeated conference seasons.

Scouting High Point

Eight of Head Coach Tooley Loy's players are either freshmen or sophomores, but the young Panthers have won six of their first seven conference games, claiming second place in the Big South standings.

High Point boasts a trio of double-digit scorers, led by 5-4 sophomore guard Jurica Hargraves, who notches 13.4 ppg. Shamia Brown, a 5-11 freshman forward, is averaging 11.6 ppg and a team-high 5.9 rpg. She is a four-time Big South Freshman of the Week and is a leading contender for this year's Big South Freshman of the Year honor.

Last season's Big South Freshman of the year, 6-3 forward Mackenzie Maier, is contributing 10.1 ppg, 5.5 rpg and 2.5 bpg. She leads the conference in both blocked shots and three-point field goal percentage (.471).

The Panthers have struggled away from the Millis Center this season, going just 2-9 in road/neutral contests.

The Coaching Matchup

Liberty Head Coach Carey Green is in his 10th season with the Lady Flames, and has led his team to eight Big South titles. A four-time Big South Coach of the Year, Green owns a 225-75 career record and is the all-time wins leader at Liberty and among Big South women's basketball coaches. His career winning percentage (.750) ranked 10th among active NCAA Division I women's basketball coaches at the season's outset. Green is 18-5 all-time against High Point.

Tooley Loy owns a 125-100 record in his eighth season coaching at his alma mater. He is a two-time Big South Coach of the Year (2005 and 2007) and has led the Panthers to five top-three finishes in the Big South regular-season standings. He is 4-13 versus Liberty during his coaching career.

Liberty-High Point Series Notes

Liberty owns a 22-8 lead in the all-time head-to-head series with High Point, but the Panthers have enjoyed the most success against the Lady Flames of any Big South team in recent years. High Point is 4-5 in its last nine meetings with Liberty.

The Lady Flames swept all three games against the Panthers last season, earning a 76-57 home decision on Jan. 29, winning 78-68 at the Millis Center on Feb. 23 and eliminating High Point in the Big South Championship semifinal round, 80-43 on March 15.

In 2006-07, High Point swept the season series from the Lady Flames, becoming the only Big South team in the last 11 seasons to do so.

Sisters Megan and Moriah Frazee have flourished against High Point. Megan Frazee is averaging 18.4 ppg and 9.4 rpg in five career meetings with the Panthers, including a 26-point, 14-rebound outburst at High Point last season. Meanwhile, Moriah Frazee is posting 13.4 ppg and 7.0 rpg versus High Point during her career, including a career-high 20-point effort during Liberty's home win over the Panthers last year.

Jurica Hargraves shot extremely well against Liberty as a freshman last season. She canned 11 three-pointers in three matchups against the Lady Flames, with six of them coming in the Big South Championship tilt. Hargraves averaged 17.0 ppg versus Liberty in 2007-08.

New Year's Resolution

Liberty owns a 154-105 all-time record in January contests, after winning its first seven contests of 2009. Head coach Carey Green has gone 70-8 with the Lady Flames during the year's opening month, including a 7-0 January last season.

The Lady Flames have won 36 straight home games during the month of January. Liberty has not lost a January contest at the Vines Center since Jan. 13, 2000, when Elon dealt the Lady Flames a 77-72 setback.

Liberty has won 16 consecutive January contests overall, since a 64-62 overtime loss at High Point on Jan. 20, 2007.

Welcome to the Club

Senior Moriah Frazee drained a pair of free throws with 14:56 remaining in the second half of Liberty's Jan. 24 game against Charleston Southern. The foul shots gave Frazee 1,000 career points, making her the 12th player in program history to reach the milestone.

Frazee's sister Megan is also a member of the 1,000-point club, as are twin sisters Sarah and Sharon Wilkerson, who graduated in 2000. Liberty is the only NCAA Division I women's basketball program featuring multiple sets of sisters in the 1,000-point club.

Green's Perfect 300

Monday's game was the 300th contest of Carey Green's coaching career at Liberty, and it came against his alma mater, Coastal Carolina. The Lady Flames' victory boosted his career winning percentage to exactly 75 percent (225-75).

Recipe For Success

Liberty has won nine consecutive games, and the following are a few keys the Lady Flames' success.

- All nine opponents have been held below 60 points.
- All nine opponents have shot below 40 percent from the field.
- Liberty has outrebounded eight of nine opponents by 11 boards or more.
- Megan Frazee has averaged 18.4 ppg and 9.0 rpg, since returning from an ankle injury which sidelined her for eight games.
- Avery Warley has boosted her production to 8.1 ppg, 9.4 rpg and 1.7 bpg.
- The Lady Flames' starting backcourt of Amber Mays and Rachel Hammond has posted 57 assists, 40 steals and only 34 turnovers.

Long-Range Bombers

Liberty has begun to find its outside shooting touch recently, sinking 27 triples and shooting 45 percent from beyond the three-point arc in the last four games.

Leading the way are two of the most prolific three-point shooters in program history. Megan Frazee, ranked ninth on Liberty's career list with 87 triples, has hit 12 of her last 21 from downtown (57.1 percent)

Rachel Hammond, whose 62 career three-pointers put her 15th on the list, has connected on 10 of her last 16 three-point attempts (62.5 percent). Hammond has made six consecutive three-pointers, during her last two appearances.

Hammond tied a career high with four triples in the Lady Flames' win over Charleston Southern on Jan. 24. It was the first time a Lady Flame has hit a quartet of three-pointers this season.

We are the Champions!

The Lady Flames defeated Virginia Tech, 45-43, on Dec. 30 at Cassell Coliseum to win the Hokie Hardwood Classic. Megan Frazee hit the game-winning shot from 18 feet with just 51 seconds remaining, giving Liberty its first-ever win over the Hokies and preventing Virginia Tech from winning its 11th straight home tournament title.

Frazee was named tournament MVP, marking the fourth tournament MVP trophy she has won in the last two seasons (also 2007 National City Xavier Invitational, 2007 Lady Rebel Christmas Classic and 2008 Big South Championship). Avery Warley, who nabbed 29 rebounds in two games at the tournament, also made the all-tournament team.

Sophomore Rachel McLeod has been a clutch free throw shooter for the Lady Flames this season. Most recently, she drilled four consecutive charity tosses during the final minute of Liberty's 59-49 win at Presbyterian on Jan. 17.

McLeod has connected on nine of her 11 foul shot attempts during the final two minutes of games this year, good for an 81.8 percent clip.

In addition, McLeod has scored a team-high 19 of her 53 points in the final two minutes of games during the 2008-09 campaign.

Coach Green Versus the Big South

Liberty head coach Carey Green has enjoyed considerable success versus the Big South during his first nine seasons with the Lady Flames. His teams are 142-13 against Big South opponents, including 118-12 in the regular season and 24-1 in the Big South Championship.

Green has never lost to his alma mater, Coastal Carolina (22-0), or Charleston Southern (21-0) during his time at Liberty.

Fabulous Freshman

Freshman post player Kylee Beecher enjoyed the best game of her young collegiate career, Dec. 13 against Saint Paul's. She paced the Lady Flames with a career-high 18 points, matching the Roanoke, Va., native's point total from her first six appearances. Beecher also contributed six rebounds and a career-best five assists to Liberty's 92-68 win.

As a result, Beecher was tabbed Big South Women's Basketball Freshman of the Week on Dec. 15. She became Liberty's first Big South Freshman of the Week since current Lady Flame senior Moriah Frazee won the award on Feb. 20, 2006.

Turning Up the Heat in the Furnace

The 2008-09 campaign is the 17th season the Liberty University women's basketball team has called the Vines Center its full-time home. Liberty's first-ever contest at the Vines Center was an 86-74 loss to East Tennessee State, on Dec. 7, 1990, but the "Furnace" has served as a favorable venue for the Lady Flames over the years. Liberty is 183-51 (.782) all-time at the Vines Center, including 13-0 last season. The Lady Flames, 5-2 at the Vines Center in 2008-09, have 12 home games scheduled this season.

Dial Three Digits for Long Distance

The Lady Flames have been able to continue a long-standing streak, so far this season. The Lady Flames have made at least one three-pointer in a school-record 122 straight games, a run which began on Feb. 26, 2005. None of the current Lady Flames were in college when the streak started.

Winning Streaks

The Lady Flames are currently on a nine-game winning streak, as they have not lost a game since falling at No. 19/20 Vanderbilt on Dec. 22.

The streak is tied for the 10th longest in program history. Here is a look at the Lady Flames' longest winning streaks, nine of which have come with Carey Green as head coach.

Longest-Tenured Assistant Coaches

The 2008-09 season is Heather Stephens' sixth campaign as an assistant on Carey Green's coaching staff. She is now tied with Jeri (Wiley) Porter as the longest-tenured assistant coach in Liberty women's basketball history. Porter is now the head coach at George Mason. The Lady Flames have gone 135-43 and won four Big South titles during Stephens' tenure and made the "Sweet 16" of the 2005 NCAA Tournament.

Lady Flames Excel in the Classroom

Liberty has received national recognition numerous times for its work in the classroom. Last season, the Lady Flames tallied a 3.354 GPA, ranking 14th in the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Top 25 Team Honor Roll.

It was the third straight season and the fifth time in program history that Liberty has been included in the Top 25 Team Honor Roll. The Lady Flames were listed a program-best seventh in 2006-07 and tied for 14th in 2005-06. Liberty was rated 13th in 1999-2000, which was Carey Green's first season as head coach, and came in 12th during the 1998-99 campaign.

Liberty was one of only three teams to be included in last season's WBCA Top 25 Honor Roll and play in the NCAA Tournament, joining Kansas State and New Mexico.

Nation's Longest Winning Streaks

Liberty has won nine games in a row, which is tied for the ninth-longest active winning streak among NCAA Division I women's basketball games, through Jan. 28.

Auburn and Connecticut have both won a nation-best 20 games in a row.

Reaching the Century Mark

Moriah Frazee made the 100th start of her career on Jan. 24, making her the first Lady Flame with 100 starts since 2000 graduates Elena Kisseleva (117 career starts) and Sharon Wilkerson (107).

Windex Warley

Redshirt freshman Avery Warley has been controlling the glass for the Lady Flames, since returning to campus after Christmas break. She has totaled 85 rebounds in the last nine contests, averaging 9.4 rpg, including a career-high 18 boards versus Virginia Tech on Dec. 30. Warley has been active at both ends of the floor, as 33 of her caroms have come off the offensive glass.

One of Warley's most important rebounds came during the closing stages of Liberty's Jan. 10 win at Winthrop. With the score knotted at 49-all, Warley snared an offensive rebound and converted a layup, giving her team the lead for good with just 30.0 seconds left on the clock.

It was also Warley's offensive rebound off a missed free throw that set the stage for Megan Frazee's game-winning jumper, Dec. 30 at Virginia Tech.

Start Me Up

Head coach Carey Green used only four different starting lineups in Liberty's 32 games last season. The most common starting five consisted of Allyson Fasnacht, Courtney Watkins, Megan Frazee, Rebecca Lightfoot and Moriah Frazee. The unit went 18-2 in its 20 games as a starting unit.

This year, Liberty has already used five different starting lineups in the first 19 games of the season. Moriah Frazee, Rachel Hammond and Avery Warley have been the only three Lady Flames to start every contest.

The Lady Flames' most recent lineup, consisting of Moriah Frazee, Hammond, Warley, Amber Mays and Megan Frazee, is a perfect 9-0.

Counting Up the Votes

Liberty was listed among the "Others Receiving Votes" in the Nov. 25 ESPN/USA Today Coaches Top 25 poll, for the third straight week, receiving one vote.

Last season, the Lady Flames regularly received votes in both national polls, but did not quite crack the Top 25. Liberty's most recent Top 25 ranking came in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll of the 2004-05 season. The Lady Flames were listed No. 21, after reaching the "Sweet 16" of the NCAA Tournament.

Lack of Overtime

Liberty has played only one overtime game in its last 165 outings, a 64-62 setback at High Point on Jan. 20, 2007.

The Lady Flames' most recent overtime victory came on Jan. 6, 2004, when Liberty defeated American, 76-72, on the road in double overtime. No current Lady Flame has won an overtime contest in college.

Liberty's most recent overtime contest at the Vines Center was a memorable one. The Lady Flames defeated Virginia, 77-69, in overtime on Nov. 26, 2002, to claim their first-ever win over the Cavaliers. It also marked Liberty's first win over a ranked opponent, as Virginia entered the game with a No. 25 national ranking.

The Container is Half Full

Liberty connected on 54.9 percent (28-of-51) of its field goal attempts versus Coastal Carolina Monday, shooting over 50 percent for the second game in a row. The Lady Flames are 3-0 this year, when making more than half of their field goals.

The Lady Flames went 9-0 last season when shooting 50 percent or higher, and Liberty is now 52-0 in such contests under head coach Carey Green.

A Boost from the Bench

Liberty's bench was a short one for a good portion of the year, as the Lady Flames battled the injury bug. Since Rebecca Lightfoot returned from injury, though, the bench has played a key role in the Lady Flames' success.

Liberty's bench has outscored its opponent's bench in five of the six games since Lightfoot's return, helping the Lady Flames win each of those contests. This season, Liberty is 8-2 when its reserves score more points than the opponents' bench performers.

Chief Thiefs

Starting guards Amber Mays and Rachel Hammond have been keys to Liberty's defensive efforts, as they rank fifth and seventh, respectively, on the Big South steals leaderboard.

Mays has notched 23 steals in the past six games, including a career-high eight-steal effort versus East Tennessee State on Jan. 13. Her eight steals were the most by a Lady Flame since Sharon Wilkerson recorded eight thefts at High Point on Feb. 21, 2000. Mays tied for the fifth-most steals in a single game in Liberty history.

Seven more steals will make Mays the first Liberty player since Sharon Wilkerson in 1999-2000 to record 50 steals in a season.

Meanwhile, Hammond has been a consistent disruptive force on defense this season, tallying multiple steals in 12 of the first 19 games. As a result, the senior has already established a career high with 36 steals.

Triple the Trouble

Liberty sports the only set of triplets currently playing for the same NCAA Division I women's basketball team--seniors Megan, Molly and Moriah Frazee. Career totals of 1,000 points and 500 rebounds represent a very solid collegiate performer. The Frazee triplets have averaged more than 1,000 points and 500 rebounds between them.

During Liberty's Jan. 3 victory over Gardner-Webb, the triplets exceeded the 3,000-career point total. Megan, Molly and Moriah Frazee have totaled 3,189 points and 1,656 rebounds during their time at Liberty. Those figures represent 43.0 percent of the Lady Flames' points and 34.5 percent of the team's rebounds since they arrived on campus.

Miss Consistency

Megan Frazee has scored in double figures in each of her last 55 games, dating back to Jan. 27, 2007. It is the longest such streak of her career and the longest by a Liberty player since Elena Kisseleva tallied 10 or more points in 62 straight contests, spanning the 1996-97, 1997-98 and 1998-99 seasons.

Clamping Down on Defense

The Lady Flames have held 70 consecutive opponents under 50 percent field goal shooting. The last Liberty foe to sink more than half of its field goal attempts was Marist, at the Maryland Terrapin Classic on Dec. 29, 2006.

Liberty is off to a good start defensively in 2008-09. Fourteen of the Lady Flames' first 19 opponents, including the last nine in a row, have shot below 40 percent from the floor. Liberty leads the Big South and ranks No. 30 nationally with a .353 opponents field goal percentage.

The Lady Flames are 12-2 this season when their opponents shoot under 40 percent from the field, but 0-5 when their foes make at least 40 percent of their field goal tries.

Climbing the Big South Rebounding Ladder

Megan Frazee's nine rebounds versus Charleston Southern on Jan. 24 made her the 10th player in Big South Conference history to pull down 800 career boards.

Frazee will pass Tammy Brown of Campbell, a 1991 graduate, for ninth place on the Big South career rebounding list with four more rebounds.

A Short Commute

Freshman guard Brittany Campbell attended high school literally right down the street from Liberty University at Brookville High School. She is the first Lynchburg-area player to suit up for the Lady Flames since Tekita Butler in the 2002-03 season.

International Flavor

The addition of Tokyo, Japan native Jessica Nelson to the Lady Flames' roster gives Liberty an international player for the 15th consecutive season. The last time the Lady Flames' roster consisted solely of American-born players was the 1993-94 campaign. Every Carey Green-coached team at Liberty has featured at least one international player.

A Clutch Performer

Megan Frazee drained a game-winning 18-foot jumper with 51 seconds left on Dec. 30 at Virginia Tech, representing her third game-winning shot in the senior's last 13 appearances. Frazee also defeated Radford (March 16, 2008 - Big South Championship) and UC Riverside (Nov. 21, 2008 - Preseason WNIT) with close-range field goals in the final seconds.

In Good Company

On Monday, Megan Frazee was honored as Big South Women's Basketball Player of the Week. It was the third time the senior has captured the award this season and was her 15th career weekly conference honor.

Frazee is now tied with former Liberty standout Katie Feenstra for the most Big South Player of the Week awards captured during a career, in conference history.

Cranking Up the Defense

Liberty has played exceptional defense during its current nine-game winning streak. The Lady Flames have held North Carolina A&T, Virginia Tech, Gardner-Webb and Coastal Carolina all to season-low point totals during the stretch. Liberty's nine foes have scored only 48.4 ppg against Liberty and have combined to shoot just 32.8 percent from the field.

Winning the Battle of the Boards

The Lady Flames have outrebounded 15 teams in their first 19 games of the season. Only three teams (Western Carolina, James Madison and Winthrop) have won the rebounding battle against Liberty this season, as the Lady Flames lead the Big South Conference with a +9.7 rebounding margin.

Liberty, which currently ranks No. 10 nationally for rebounding margin, has finished in the top five nationally in the category for five consecutive seasons. The Lady Flames led the nation in rebounding margin during both the 2003-04 and 2004-05 campaigns.

Coming Through in the Clutch

With Liberty's 55-51 win at Winthrop on Jan. 10, the Lady Flames improved to 3-2 this season, in games decided by five points or less. Two of Liberty's contests during the team's current nine-game winning streak have been tight victories, as the Lady Flames also pulled out a 45-43 win at Virginia Tech on Dec. 30.

Last season, Liberty excelled in tight situations, winning five of its seven contests decided by five points or less. The Lady Flames' close victories included the championship games of the National City Xavier Invitational, Lady Rebel Christmas Classic and Big South Championship.

Down, But Not Out

On Jan. 13, East Tennessee State ran out to an early seven-point advantage at the Vines Center, before Liberty rallied for a 64-54 win. It was the fifth time the Lady Flames have erased a six-point deficit to win this season (also UC Riverside, North Carolina A&T, Virginia Tech and Winthrop).

Liberty's largest rally of the season came on Dec. 30, in the Hokie Hardwood Classic title game against Virginia Tech. The Hokies led by eight points midway through the second half, but the Lady Flames came back to notch a 45-43 triumph.

Less Than a Point Per Minute

UNC Asheville managed only 19 first-half points against the Lady Flames on Jan. 19. Liberty has held four opponents to fewer than 20 points during the opening half this season, including Gardner-Webb, which scored only 14 points prior to the break on Jan. 3.

Lynchburg, Va.

An 11-0, late second-half run helped No. 13/14 Auburn to pull away from Liberty in a tightly-played contest. The Tigers were able to remain undefeated on the season with a 64-53 triumph over the Lady Flames. Lady Flame Amber Mays came up with four steals during the game's first five minutes. Two of her thefts came during a 10-0 Liberty surge, which turned a 7-5 deficit into a 15-7 advantage, at 14:08. Liberty's edge eventually reached 10 points, 23-13, after Kittery Maine put back her own missed shot, 10:54 before the intermission. Rachel Hammond scored all 13 of her points during the second half, and Liberty limited Winston-Salem State to three field goals in the first 17:30 after halftime, at the C.E. Gaines Center. Liberty broke open a close game against Gardner-Webb with a 18-2 run spanning the first and second halves. The victory, coupled with a High Point setback, enabled Liberty to move into first place in the Big South Conference standings. After Lindsey Thompson pulled the home team within four points, 11-7, with a long three-pointer from the right wing, the red-clad Lady Flames scored 13 straight markers to open up their first double-digit advantage of the evening. Liberty then went scoreless for 5:30, during which time the Chanticleers crafted a 7-0 run to slice their deficit in half. Kendra Reynolds' contested jumper in the paint cut the Lady Flames' advantage to 26-19. The same seven-point margin separated the two teams at the intermission, as Liberty took a 28-21 lead into the locker room. The Lady Flames opened the second half on an 8-2 run. Moriah Frazee hit three layups during the surge, including one which increased her team's lead to 36-23 at the 16:01 mark. Coastal Carolina tallied a 7-1 run soon thereafter.
