The Game

The No. 1 seed Liberty Lady Flames (21-8, 15-1 Big South) will open defense of their Big South Championship title Friday, when they face No. 8 seed Charleston Southern (12-17, 6-10 Big South). Tip-off is scheduled for noon at the Millis Center in High Point, N.C.

What to Watch

Liberty, sporting the stingiest scoring defense in the Big South (52.3 ppg), has won 11 Big South Championship crowns in the last 12 years. The Lady Flames have won their opening game of the tournament 12 straight times.

Meanwhile, Charleston Southern, the conference's highest-scoring team (69.3 ppg), is seeking its first Big South title in program history. The Lady Buccaneers have been ousted in the opening round of the tournament six consecutive seasons.

Lady Flames On The Air

All Lady Flames basketball games may be heard LIVE on WWMC 90.9 FM "The Light." Jamie Hall, celebrating his 15th year of broadcasting Lady Flames basketball, handles the courtside play-by-play duties for most road games. Josh Wood serves as the primary commentator for home contests and provides color analysis on the road.

Lady Flames On TV

For the sixth season in a row, the Flames Television Network (FTN) broadcasted all 12 of Liberty's home women's basketball games. FTN's regular announcing team consisted of Ray Jones on play-by-play and Jamie Hall on color.

This weekend, SportSouth and MASN plan to televise both of Saturday's semifinal contests and Sunday afternoon's championship game. Matt Hogue and Brooke Weisbrod will be on the call.

Liberty head women's basketball coach Carey Green, in his 10th season with the Lady Flames, has instilled quite a winning tradition during his tenure at the institution. His teams have averaged more than 23 victories per year during his time at Liberty, putting his name alongside the nation's premier women's basketball coaches.

Green has accumulated a 234-76 record on the Liberty bench, good for a winning percentage of .755. He entered the season ranked 10th among active NCAA Division I women's basketball coaches in winning percentage, ahead of renowned coaching names like Rutgers' Vivian Stringer, LSU's Van Chancellor and North Carolina's Sylvia Hatchell.

More importantly, Liberty has won the Big South Tournament title and advanced to the NCAA Tournament eight times with Green as head coach. Liberty has totaled 23 or more victories during seven of those years, including the 2004-05 season, which saw the Lady Flames reach the Sweet 16 for the first time in program history.

Green has actually been to the postseason on 20 occasions as a women's basketball coach, a span which includes a dozen years as an assistant coach at Clemson. In all but one of the 20 appearances, he has experienced the NCAA Tournament.

Last season, Green led the Lady Flames to one of the best seasons in program history. Liberty tied a school record for victories, finishing the year 28-4. Along the way, the Lady Flames captured three tournament titles—the National City Xavier Invitational, the UNLV Lady Rebel Christmas Classic and their eighth Big South Championship in Green's nine years as head coach. The latter championship earned Liberty a spot in the NCAA Tournament for the 11th time. Green won his 200th career game, Jan. 19 at Charleston Southern, and became the first four-time Big South Women's Basketball Coach of the Year in conference history.

Rebounding and defense have always been staples of Green-coached teams, and the 2007-08 Lady Flames were no exception. Liberty outrebounded opponents by an average of 10.2 caroms per game, ranking fifth nationally. The Lady Flames have now been listed among the nation's top five teams in rebounding margin for five-straight years. Liberty led the nation in the category in 2003-04 and 2004-05. The Lady Flames also ended the season ranked in the top 15 in the nation for field goal percentage defense (fourth) and scoring defense (15th).

A key late-season conference victory over High Point in 2006 made Green the winningest coach in Big South Conference history. He is also Liberty's career wins leader.

The record-setting victory was just one of the many reasons the 2004-05 year was a special one on Liberty Mountain. A senior-laden Lady Flames team recorded upset wins over No. 4 seed Penn State (78-70) and No. 5 seed DePaul (88-79) in the first two rounds of the NCAA Tournament, becoming just the second team ever to advance to the Sweet 16 as a No. 13 seed. The Lady Flames ended the season with their highest national ranking to date, 21st (USA Today/ESPN).

Green's track record shows he has the ability to meet strong challenges. The Lady Flames have recorded two wins over UNLV, Virginia and West Virginia and solo victories over No. 19 DePaul, No. 17 Kansas State, No. 25 Penn State, Virginia Tech and Wake Forest during Green's tenure. The upset victory over No. 25 Virginia in 2003 marked Liberty's first win over a Top 25 team.

His record against conference foes is equally impressive. He led the Lady Flames on a Big South-record 57-game winning streak and currently owns a .915 (151-14) winning percentage against conference teams. Green has marched through conference play with one or fewer setbacks seven times, while guiding the Lady Flames to two undefeated conference seasons.

Scouting Charleston Southern

Charleston Southern closed its regular season with three wins in its last five contests, including a Feb. 21 victory over the Big South Championship's No. 3 seed, Radford. The Lady Buccaneers were also the only visiting team to win at the Millis Center this season, defeating High Point by an 82-79 score on Feb. 9.

Leading the way for the high-powered Charleston Southern offense are a trio of strong outside shooters--5-8 senior guard Pam Tolbert, 5-9 sophomore guard Katie Tull and 5-10 junior guard Kelsey Wasmer.

Tolbert is the conference's scoring leader at 15.5 ppg. Tull follows with 13.7 ppg and is shooting a team-best 40.8 percent from behind the three-point arc. Finally, Wasmer averages 10.7 ppg while ranking No. 19 nationally with 75 three-pointers made.

Coach Julie Goodenough's squad also boasts a pair of players who have been tabbed Big South Freshman of the Week this season--5-10 forward Ali Schwagmeyer and 5-5 guard Kiki Rutledge, the reigning weekly award winner.

The Coaching Matchup

Liberty Head Coach Carey Green is in his 10th season with the Lady Flames, and has led his team to eight Big South titles. A four-time Big South Coach of the Year, Green owns a 234-76 career record and is the all-time wins leader at Liberty and among Big South women's basketball coaches. His career winning percentage (.755) ranked 10th among active NCAA Division I women's basketball coaches at the season's outset. Green is 22-0 all-time versus Charleston Southern.

Julie Goodenough is 30-59 in her third season at Charleston Southern and 241-174 in her 15th overall season as a collegiate head coach. Previous to her time with the Lady Buccaneers, Goodenough was Oklahoma State's head coach for three seasons (2003-05). She is 0-6 all-time versus Liberty.

Liberty-Charleston Southern Series Notes

Liberty, which scored 78.5 ppg in a pair of wins over Charleston Southern this season, has defeated the Lady Buccaneers 24 consecutive times, by an average of 24.9 points per game. The Lady Flames lead the all-time head-to-head series, 39-5.

Liberty defeated Charleston Southern, 76-51, on Jan. 24 at the Vines Center. The Lady Flames then completed a sweep of the regular-season series, Feb. 23 at the CSU Field House, with an 81-59 triumph. Megan Frazee averaged 20.0 ppg, 9.5 rpg and 6.0 apg in the pair of Liberty wins. As a team, the Lady Flames made a school-record 70.2 percent of their field goal attempts on Feb. 23 at Charleston Southern.

The Lady Flames are 4-0 all-time against Charleston Southern in Big South Championship matchups. The two teams have faced off in the first round only once previously, at the teams' most recent Big South Championship meeting, March 7, 2006 at the Vines Center. Liberty won that game, 62-46, on its way to the tournament title. Michelle Parker was the Lady Flames' only double-digit scorer, totaling 13 points. CSU's Keena Wicker paced all players with 18 markers.

Charleston Southern's last win over Liberty was a 66-60 decision at the CSU Field House, Jan. 18, 1999. Katie LaRue paced the Lady Buccaneers with 14 points.

How's This For Openers?

Liberty is 14-3 all-time in its opening game of the Big South Championship. The Lady Flames have won 12 straight openers, since losing to UNC Greensboro, 84-40, in the first round of the 1996 tournament.

Breaking it Down by Location

Liberty is 17-0 in Big South Championship contests played at home, 0-1 on the road and 16-5 when games are played at neutral sites. The Lady Flames' lone road contest was a 70-62 setback at Radford in the 1993 semifinal round.

Familiar Territory

For the 11th time in the last 12 seasons, Liberty enters the Big South Championship as the No. 1 seed. The Lady Flames have captured the tournament title on all 10 previous occasions they have owned the top seed. Their other Big South championship came in 1997, as the No. 2 seed.

All-time, Liberty has been seeded No. 1 11 times, No. 2 once, No. 3 twice, No. 6 twice, No. 7 once and No. 8 once. The Lady Flames have never won the tournament championship when seeded No. 3 or lower.

Success Versus Current Big South Teams

Liberty is 26-3 in Big South Championship games against the seven other teams currently eligible for the tournament. Radford is the only current conference member which has ever defeated the Lady Flames in the tournament, doing so in 1993, 1994 and 2007.

Avoiding the Upset

The Lady Flames own a 31-0 record all-time in the Big South Championship, when the Lady Flames are seeded higher than their opponents.

Commonwealth Teams in the Championship Game

Either Liberty or Radford has appeared in all 22 Big South Championship title games in conference history. However, last season was the first time the Lady Flames and Highlanders had ever faced each other in the championship game.

Attempting to Bounce Back

For only the sixth time in program history, Liberty lost its final regular-season game before the start of the Big South Championship. The Lady Flames won the 1997 title, after falling to Winthrop in their final regular-season matchup. Most recently, however, Liberty fell to Radford, 57-55, in the 2007 semifinal round, after dropping its season finale to the same Radford squad.

Lack of Overtime

None of Liberty's 39 Big South Championship contests have gone to overtime. Most of the time, the games have been decided by a wide margin, as 28 of the Lady Flames' tournament tilts have featured a double-digit spread between the two teams.

A Look Back

Liberty opened the 2008 Big South Championship at the Justice Center in Asheville, N.C., as the No. 1 seed and enjoyed a first-round bye.

On the second day of the tournament, the Lady Flames met No. 4 seed High Point in the semifinal round. Seven Liberty players scored eight or more points in a comfortable, 80-43 win. Megan Frazee led the way with 17 points and seven rebounds, despite being limited to 16 minutes of work due to foul trouble. Jurica Hargraves paced the Panthers with 20 points and six triples.

Liberty then faced Commonwealth rival and No. 2 seed Radford in the championship game, the following afternoon. The Lady Flames came back from an 11-point second-half deficit and scored the winning basket with just 0.3 seconds remaining, when Megan Frazee's over-the-head flip from close range found the bottom of the net. Tournament MVP Frazee totaled 26 points and 12 boards in Liberty's dramatic, 66-65 win. Kelli Darden was the Highlanders' star, posting 21 points and nine rebounds.

Masterful in March

Liberty has gone 33-11 during the month of March under Carey Green, with eight of the setbacks coming in the NCAA Tournament. The Lady Flames are 9-2 in the regular season, 22-1 in the Big South Championship and 2-8 in the "Big Dance" during the year's third month, under his direction. Last season, Liberty went 4-1 in March. This year, the Lady Flames are off to a 2-1 start during the calendar year's third month.

The Lady Flames are 41-36 all-time in March contests and did not pick up their first victory in the month until the program's 13th season. Liberty's initial March triumph was an 82-69 win over Randolph-Macon on March 3, 1988.

Making Some History

Liberty's 80-61 win at Radford on March 6 was the Lady Flames' 15th conference victory this season. Liberty becomes the first Big South women's basketball team ever to win 15 conference games in a single season. Four previous Big South squads (including Liberty in both 2002-03 and 2003-04) had posted 14 conference victories.

We Are the (Regular-Season) Champions!

Liberty's 81-59 win at Charleston Southern on Feb. 23 not only kept the Lady Flames unbeaten in conference play, but it clinched the outright Big South regular-season title. Liberty has now captured 11 conference regular-season crowns in the last 12 years.

In a Class All Her Own

Megan Frazee won her third straight Big South Women's Basketball Player of the Week on March 2, marking her sixth conference weekly honor this season. She extends her Big South record to 18 career Big South Women's Basketball Player of the Week plaudits. Former Liberty standout Katie Feenstra previously held the record, with 15 awards.

Nation's Longest Streak

Megan Frazee has scored in double figures in a school-record 65 straight games, a streak which began on Jan. 27, 2007. The streak is the longest active double-digit scoring streak among NCAA Division I women's basketball players.

Utah's Megan Warburton ranks second on the list, with 63 consecutive double-digit scoring efforts, entering this weekend's Mountain West Conference Tournament.

Liberty saw several lengthy streaks snapped during the team's final two regular-season games. Below is a list of the streaks which recently fell by the wayside.

Long-Range Bombers

Megan Frazee, tied for eighth on Liberty's career list with 95 triples, has hit 20 of her last 38 shots from downtown (52.6 percent).

Rachel Hammond, whose 78 career three-pointers rank 11th on the list, has connected on 26 of her last 50 three-point attempts (52.0 percent). Hammond made a program-record nine consecutive triples without a miss, between Jan. 24-31.

Hammond made five treys against High Point on Jan. 31, marking the first time a Lady Flame has connected on five three-pointers in a single game since Dec. 15, 2001, when Daina Staugaitiene did so at Hampton.

Accurate Avery

Avery Warley made a career-best 11 consecutive field goal attempts, between Feb. 9 and Feb. 21. The Big South field goal percentage leader at 64.4 percent, Warley has connected on 37 of her last 43 field goals (86.0 percent). Only current WNBA player Katie Feenstra has shot higher than 64.4 percent for a season in program history.

National Leader

The Lady Flames enter the postseason as the nation's No. 1 team for rebounding margin, with a +12.3 margin. Liberty owns a slight lead over Stanford, after outrebounding 25 of its 29 opponents this season.

Liberty has led the nation in rebounding margin on two previous occasions, doing so in back-to-back seasons (2003-04 and 2004-05). The Lady Flames are 19-6 this season, when outrebounding their foes.

Magic Number is 65

Liberty enjoys life in the fast lane. When the Lady Flames' offense has scored 65 or more points this season, Liberty is 10-0. However, the Lady Flames are just 11-8 when failing to reach the 65-point plateau.

A Star On the Court and In the Classroom

Megan Frazee, a kinesiology major with a 3.91 cumulative GPA, was recognized on Feb. 23 as a first-team ESPN The Magazine Academic All-American. A second team Academic All-American last season, Frazee is the first Lady Flame ever to earn first-team status. She is Liberty's sixth first-team honoree at the Division I level, in all sports. Frazee is also the fourth individual in school history to earn multiple Academic All-America honors.

Coach Green Versus the Big South

Liberty head coach Carey Green has enjoyed considerable success versus the Big South during his first nine seasons with the Lady Flames. His teams are 151-14 against Big South opponents, including 127-13 in the regular season and 24-1 in the Big South Championship.

Green has never lost to his alma mater, Coastal Carolina (23-0), or Charleston Southern (22-0) during his time at Liberty.

First Since Feenstra

When Rachel Hammond tallied a career-high 25 points against High Point on Jan. 31, she became the first Liberty player not named Frazee to score 20 points in a game since March 22, 2005. That day, Katie Feenstra went for 29 points against DePaul, sending the Lady Flames into the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16.

Winning Streaks

The Lady Flames' 18-game winning streak, halted at High Point on Monday, was the fourth longest in program history and the longest since the 2003-04 campaign.

Lady Flames Excel in the Classroom

Liberty was one of only three Division I women's basketball teams (also Kansas State and Portland State) to place three players on the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District teams. Megan Frazee (3.91 GPA, Kinesiology) was a first-team honoree for the third straight season, while classmates Moriah Frazee (3.64 GPA, Nursing) and Rachel Hammond (3.95 GPA, Social Science) made the second team.

Lady Flames Excel in the Classroom, Take Two

Liberty has received national recognition numerous times for its work in the classroom. Last season, the Lady Flames tallied a 3.354 GPA, ranking 14th in the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Top 25 Team Honor Roll.

It was the third straight season and the fifth time in program history that Liberty has been included in the Top 25 Team Honor Roll. The Lady Flames were listed a program-best seventh in 2006-07 and tied for 14th in 2005-06. Liberty was rated 13th in 1999-2000, which was Carey Green's first season as head coach, and came in 12th during the 1998-99 campaign.

Liberty was one of only three teams to be included in last season's WBCA Top 25 Honor Roll and play in the NCAA Tournament, joining Kansas State and New Mexico.

Attracting the Voters' Attention

Liberty, which closed the regular season with 18 wins in its last 19 games, earned a single vote in the March 10 ESPN/USA Today Coaches Top 25 poll. The Lady Flames were also listed among the "Others Receiving Votes" for three weeks early in the season, a streak which ended with the Nov. 25 poll.

20-20 Club

Liberty has made Big South Conference basketball history this season. Not only have the Lady Flames reached the 20-win plateau, but Coach Ritchie McKay's squad also owns a 22-11 ledger, through the Big South Men's Basketball Championship.

The university boasts a pair of 20-win basketball teams for only the second time in program history. In 1996-97, the Lady Flames went 22-7, while their male counterparts racked up a 23-9 mark.

The feat had only been accomplished on four previous occasions in Big South annals: by Radford in 1991-92, UNC Greensboro in 1994-95, Liberty in 1996-97 and Winthrop last season. Liberty is the first conference school to make two appearances in the 20/20 club.

A Daunting Non-Conference Slate

The Lady Flames' non-conference schedule was billed as one of the toughest in program history, and it lived up to its reputation. Liberty's Division I non-conference foes eligible for conference play combined to win 73.9 of their conference games, going 136-48.

Three of Liberty's non-conference opponents (East Tennessee State-Atlantic Sun, Vanderbilt-SEC and Western Carolina-Southern) have already won their respective conference tournament championships.

Liberty in Tournaments

Liberty participated in a trio of early-season tournaments, going a combined 3-4 in the Preseason WNIT (Nov. 14-22), GW Thanksgiving Classic (Nov. 28-29) and Hokie Hardwood Classic (Dec. 29-30).

The Lady Flames captured the Hokie Hardwood Classic championship, posting victories over North Carolina A&T and host Virginia Tech at Cassell Coliseum. The title was Liberty's third regular-season tournament championship in the last two seasons, including the 2007 National City Xavier Invitational and UNLV Lady Rebel Christmas Classic.

Liberty in the National Rankings

The Lady Flames have been surging upward in the NCAA national statistical rankings. Liberty now ranks in the top 10 nationally in four statistical categories (through the games of March 8). The Lady Flames lead the nation in rebounding margin (+12.3) and sit No. 3 in scoring defense (52.1 ppg), No. 4 in field goal percentage defense (.340) and No. 7 in field goal percentage (.462).

Liberty and No. 1 Connecticut are the only two teams in the nation which rank in the top 10 of all four of those categories.

Lack of Overtime

Liberty has played only one overtime game in its last 175 outings, a 64-62 setback at High Point on Jan. 20, 2007.

The Lady Flames' most recent overtime victory came on Jan. 6, 2004, when Liberty defeated American, 76-72, on the road in double overtime. No current Lady Flame has won an overtime contest in college.

Liberty's most recent overtime contest at the Vines Center was a memorable one. The Lady Flames defeated Virginia, 77-69, in overtime on Nov. 26, 2002, to claim their first-ever win over the Cavaliers. It also marked Liberty's first win over a ranked opponent, as Virginia entered the game with a No. 25 national ranking.

The Container is Half Full

Liberty connected on 62.5 percent (30-of-48) of its field goal attempts versus Radford on March 6, shooting over 50 percent for the eighth time in the regular season's last 12 games. The Lady Flames are 9-0 this year, when making more than half of their field goals. Liberty is now 58-0 in such contests under head coach Carey Green.

Free Throws are Falling

Liberty is the Big South's best free throw shooting team, making 68.8 percent of its attempts on the season. However, the Lady Flames were in rare form March 2 against Presbyterian. Liberty made its first 14 foul shots of the night and ended the game at 17-of-19 (89.5 percent). The program single-game record for free throw accuracy is 18-of-19 (94.7 percent).

Individually, Moriah Frazee shot eight-for-eight from the charity stripe against the Blue Hose, pacing Liberty's team sharpshooting.

Chief Thiefs

Starting guards Amber Mays and Rachel Hammond have been keys to Liberty's defensive efforts, as they rank fifth and 10th, respectively, on the Big South steals leaderboard.

Mays has notched 42 steals in the past 16 games (2.6 spg average), including a career-high eight-steal effort versus East Tennessee State on Jan. 13. Her eight steals were the most by a Lady Flame since Sharon Wilkerson recorded eight thefts at High Point on Feb. 21, 2000. Mays tied for the fifth-most steals in a single game in Liberty history. The junior is the first Lady Flame to tally at least 50 steals in a season since 1999-2000.

Meanwhile, Hammond has been a consistent disruptive force on defense this season, tallying multiple steals 14 times. As a result, the senior has established a career high with 46 steals.

Backcourt mates Mays and Hammond have combined for 108 steals, the most thefts by a Liberty duo since head coach Carey Green's first season at Liberty, 1999-2000. That year, Sharon Wilkerson and Elena Kisseleva totaled 136 steals.

Triple the Trouble

Liberty sports the only set of triplets currently playing for the same NCAA Division I women's basketball team--seniors Megan, Molly and Moriah Frazee. Career totals of 1,000 points and 500 rebounds represent a very solid collegiate performer. The Frazee triplets have averaged more than 1,000 points and 500 rebounds between them.

During Liberty's Jan. 3 victory over Gardner-Webb, the triplets exceeded the 3,000-career point total. Megan, Molly and Moriah Frazee have totaled 3,493 points and 1,810 rebounds during their time at Liberty. Those figures represent more than 40 percent of the Lady Flames' points and more than a third of the team's rebounds since they arrived on campus.

On March 6 at Radford, Megan and Moriah Frazee combined to score 46 points, including 32 in the first half.

Chasing A Record

Megan Frazee has posted 12 double-doubles this season, including one in eight of her last 10 outings, pushing her career total to 48. Katie Feenstra owns the program record, with 49 career double-doubles.

Clamping Down on Defense

The Lady Flames have held 80 consecutive opponents under 50 percent field goal shooting. The last Liberty foe to sink more than half of its field goal attempts was Marist, at the Maryland Terrapin Classic on Dec. 29, 2006.

Liberty is off to a good start defensively in 2008-09. Twenty-three of the Lady Flames' first 29 opponents have shot below 40 percent from the floor. Liberty leads the Big South and ranks No. 4 nationally with a .340 opponents field goal percentage.

Windex Warley Climbing the Charts

Avery Warley has not only ranked among the Big South rebounding leaders throughout her first season in a Liberty uniform, but she has also taken her place among the top freshman rebounders in program history.

Warley has tallied 211 rebounds through her first 29 games with the Lady Flames, ranking fourth among Liberty freshmen. The Washington, D.C., native trails only Cheri Yates (267 rebounds in 1988-89), Elena Kisseleva (248 rebounds in 1996-97) and Michelle Fricke (226 rebounds in 1999-2000) on the Lady Flames' freshman record list.

The addition of Tokyo, Japan native Jessica Nelson to the Lady Flames' roster gives Liberty an international player for the 15th consecutive season. The last time the Lady Flames' roster consisted solely of American-born players was the 1993-94 campaign.

Milestone Victory

Liberty is 505-404 all-time in women's basketball, since the inception of the program in 1975-76. The Lady Flames picked up win No. 500 in program history, Feb. 16 versus Winthrop. Here is a look at some of Liberty's milestone triumphs.

Down, But Not Out

On Jan. 13, East Tennessee State ran out to an early seven-point advantage at the Vines Center, before Liberty rallied for a 64-54 win. It was the fifth time the Lady Flames have erased a six-point deficit to win this season (also UC Riverside, North Carolina A&T, Virginia Tech and Winthrop).

Liberty's largest rally of the season came on Dec. 30, in the Hokie Hardwood Classic title game against Virginia Tech. The Hokies led by eight points midway through the second half, but the Lady Flames came back to notch a 45-43 triumph.

Less Than a Point Per Minute

Liberty held Presbyterian to 11 first-half points on March 2, marking the seventh time this season, the Lady Flames have limited their opponent to fewer than 20 first-half markers. Liberty has gone on to win all seven contests.

During the Lady Flames' last 19 games, they have outscored their opponents by an average score of 32.7 to 22.1 in the first half.

Liberty Triumvirate

Megan Frazee now ranks No. 7 all-time in the Big South for points (1,809) and No. 5 for rebounds (912). She is one of three players to rank in the top 10 of both categories. The other two include former Liberty standouts, Katie Feenstra and Elena Kisseleva.

If Frazee scores at least 37 points at the Big South Championship, she will become the conference's only player to rank in the top 5 for both points and rebounds.

Painting a Masterpiece

With five players 6-2 or taller in Carey Green's eight-man rotation, the Lady Flames are the tallest team in the Big South Conference. The Lady Flames have used their size to their advantage this season, outscoring all 16 conference foes in the "points in the paint" category. Liberty is winning the "points in the paint" battle by an average of 17.8 points per contest, within conference play.

Power Outage

Liberty's opponents have found it difficult to light up the scoreboard against the Lady Flames this season. The Lady Flames rank No. 3 nationally, yielding only 52.3 ppg. The figure is well below Liberty's single-season record for fewest points allowed, 54.7, during the 2001-02 season.

Liberty held 17 straight opponents to fewer than 60 points, between Dec. 29 and March 2. On the year, the Lady Flames have kept 14 opponents from reaching the 50-point mark.

Liberty battled back from a 21-4 deficit in its season opener to take a pair of second-half leads. However, visiting VCU edged the Lady Flames, 59-57, in a first-round Preseason WNIT contest, as Radoslava Bachvarova drained three free throws with just 2.1 seconds left. VCU tallied the evening's first 12 points, before Megan Frazee canned a one-handed floater from six feet, at the 14:10 mark of the opening half. The Rams later notched nine straight points, bolstering their advantage to 21-4 at 10:48. Liberty limited VCU to one field goal over the final 4:20 of the opening stanza, running off an 11-2 surge in the meantime and closing the gap to 31-27 at the intermission. Megan Frazee finally gave Liberty its initial lead of the contest, 45-44, draining a three-pointer from the right wing at the 11:02 mark. The Lady Flames' next lead did not come until 4:30 remained on the game clock, when Megan Frazee found Avery Warley for an open layup. Warley's basket was part of a 7-0 Liberty burst. Megan Frazee's reverse layup at 3:11 capped the run, increasing the Lady Flames' lead to 54-51. VCU came back to tie things up again, 54-54, when Quanitra Hollingsworth split a pair of free throws with 2:18 remaining, setting the stage for a frenetic final minute of play. Mays put Liberty on top, 56-54, with a driving layup at the 44-second mark, before Hollingsworth answered with a hoop from in close, 10 seconds later. Warley went to the free throw line on the Lady Flames' ensuing possession, splitting a pair of free throws with 6.4 seconds remaining. Her connection briefly put Liberty in front, 57-56, before Bachvarova's clutch charity tosses for the Rams.

Game 2
Cullowhee, N.C.

Megan Frazee banked in a layup from the left side of the lane as the buzzer sounded, giving the Lady Flames a thrilling, 45-44 win over UC Riverside in a Preseason WNIT consolation contest at the Ramsey Center in Cullowhee, N.C. The Highlanders had taken a 44-43 advantage with just 3.3 seconds left, when Alyssa Morris made a tightly-contested three-pointer from the right wing. Her hoop capped a 9-0 UC Riverside surge, consisting solely of triples. UC Riverside appeared to seal its first victory of the year, when Roney Friend intercepted Liberty's inbounds pass with 0.9 ticks remaining. However, Friend shuffled her feet, giving the Lady Flames one final opportunity, with the ball out of bounds under the basket. Rachel Hammond bounced the inbounds pass to a cutting Frazee, who calmly sank the game-winning shot from close range. Liberty notched the evening's first seven points, keeping the Highlanders off the scoreboard for the first 5:29 of play. The game was deadlocked at 15 apiece, before the Highlanders suffered another extended scoring drought. Liberty kept UC Riverside scoreless for 4:19, reeling off seven consecutive points in the meantime. Amber Mays split a pair of free throws 2:25 before halftime, giving the Lady Flames a 22-15 edge. Liberty led 22-17 at the intermission. It was UC Riverside which opened the second half on a roll. The Highlanders recorded the first nine points of the stanza. Tainoisouti Lott's layup at the 15:53 mark increased UC Riverside's first advantage of the contest to 26-22. Four straight tallies by Friend boosted the Highlanders to their largest lead, 32-26, with 12:26 showing on the second-half clock. Liberty later went back on top with a 13-0 run between UC Riverside hoops. Mays' pair of free throws made the score 43-35, Liberty, with 4:10 remaining.

An 11-0, late second-half run helped No. 13/14 Auburn to pull away from Liberty in a tightly-played contest.
