**The Game**

The Liberty Lady Flames (1-0, 0-0 Big South) will face their second opponent from North Carolina's Piedmont Triad in five days, Tuesday at 7 p.m., when UNC Greensboro (1-0, 0-0 Southern) visits the Vines Center. It will be the Spartans' first game at Liberty since the 1997 Big South Championship title game, which saw the Lady Flames claim their first of 12 Big South championships.

**Last Time Out**

Liberty opened the 2009-10 campaign with an impressive 71-26 win over Winston-Salem State, Friday evening at the Vines Center. Redshirt freshman Devon Brown tallied 26 points and seven rebounds in her collegiate debut, and the Lady Flames converted 32 WSSU turnovers into 35 points.

**On Deck**

Liberty will travel to Annapolis, Md., for this weekend's Navy Classic. The Lady Flames will face Tulane in the tournament's opening contest, Friday at 4:45 p.m.

**Lady Flames On The Air**

All Lady Flames basketball games may be heard LIVE on WWMC 90.9 FM "The Light." Jamie Hall, celebrating his 16th year of broadcasting Lady Flames basketball, will once again be handling the courtside play-by-play duties for road games. Nick Pierce and Josh Wood will serve as the primary commentators for home contests.

## Head Coach Carey Green

Liberty head women's basketball coach Carey Green, beginning his 11th season with the Lady Flames, has instilled quite a winning tradition during his tenure at the institution. His teams have averaged more than 23 victories per year, putting his name alongside the nation's premier women's basketball coaches.

Green has accumulated a 238-77 record on the Liberty bench, good for a winning percentage of .756. He currently ranks ninth all-time among NCAA Division I women's basketball coaches in winning percentage, ahead of renowned coaching names like Rutgers' Vivian Stringer, LSU's Van Chancellor and North Carolina's Sylvia Hatchell.

More importantly, Liberty has won the Big South Tournament title and advanced to the NCAA Tournament nine times with Green as head coach. Liberty has totaled 23 or more victories during eight of those years, including the 2004-05 season, which saw the Lady Flames reach the Sweet 16 for the first time in program history.

Green has actually been to the postseason on 21 occasions as a women's basketball coach, a span which includes a dozen years as an assistant coach at Clemson. In all but one of the 21 appearances, he has experienced the NCAA Tournament.

Last season, Green earned his unprecedented fifth Big South Coach of the Year award, after guiding a team decimated by ACL injuries to a 24-9 record and its 12th NCAA Tournament appearance in the last 13 years. The Lady Flames also won the Hokie Hardwood Classic, claiming their first-ever victory over Virginia Tech in the tournament championship game.

At season's end, Green saw his second player selected in the WNBA Draft, as Megan Frazee was taken in the second round by the San Antonio Silver Stars. She then played part of her rookie season alongside 2005 Liberty alum Katie (Feenstra) Mattera in San Antonio.

Rebounding and defense have always been staples of Green-coached teams, and the 2008-09 Lady Flames were no exception. Liberty outrebounded opponents by an average of 12.7 caroms per game, ranking second nationally. The Lady Flames have now been listed among the nation's top five teams in rebounding margin for six straight years. Liberty led the nation in the category in 2003-04 and 2004-05. The Lady Flames also ended the season ranked in the top 10 nationally for scoring defense (second, 52.6 ppg) and field goal percentage defense (sixth, .345).

A key late-season conference victory over High Point in 2006 made Green the winningest coach in Big South Conference history. He is also Liberty's career wins leader.

The 2004-05 year was a special one on Liberty Mountain, for many reasons. A senior-laden Lady Flames team recorded upset wins over No. 4 seed Penn State (78-70) and No. 5 seed DePaul (88-79) in the first two rounds of the NCAA Tournament, becoming just the second team ever to advance to the Sweet 16 as a No. 13 seed. The Lady Flames ended the season with their highest national ranking to date, No. 21 (USA Today/ESPN).

Green's track record shows he has the ability to meet those challenges. The Lady Flames have recorded two wins over UNLV, Virginia and West Virginia and solo victories over No. 19 DePaul, No. 17 Kansas State, No. 25 Penn State, Virginia Tech and Wake Forest during Green's tenure. The upset victory over No. 25 Virginia in 2003 marked Liberty's first win over a Top 25 team.

His record against conference foes is equally impressive. He led the Lady Flames on a Big South record 47-game winning streak and currently owns a .917 (154-14) winning percentage against conference teams. Green has marched through conference play with one or fewer setbacks seven times, while guiding the Lady Flames to two undefeated conference seasons.

## Scouting UNC Greensboro

The UNC Greensboro Spartans return four starters from last year's team, which finished 13-18. Highlighting the returnees are 5-7 senior guard Lakiah Hyson and 5-9 junior guard Monique Floyd. Hyson was the Spartans' second-leading scorer in 2008-09, averaging 10.5 ppg. Meanwhile, Floyd was honored as the Southern Conference Defensive Player of the Year.

Like Liberty, UNC Greensboro defeated a MEAC opponent in its season opener. The Spartans put four players in double figures during their 85-68 home triumph over Morgan State on Saturday. Amanda Leigh's 18 points and four triples paced the UNCG attack, while Floyd chipped in 15 points, seven rebounds and eight assists.

UNC Greensboro's tallest player, 6-4 redshirt junior center Agne Girstautaitė, may be a familiar face to Lynchburg-area basketball fans. She played high school basketball at Holy Cross Regional School in Lynchburg.

## The Coaching Matchup

Liberty Head Coach Carey Green is in his 11th season with the Lady Flames, and has led his team to nine Big South titles. A five-time Big South Coach of the Year, Green owns a 238-77 career record and is the all-time wins leader at Liberty and among Big South women's basketball coaches. His career winning percentage (.756) ranks ninth all-time among NCAA Division I women's basketball coaches at the season's outset. Green is 1-1 all-time versus UNC Greensboro.

Lynne Agee, beginning her 29th season as UNC Greensboro's head coach, is listed among the national leaders in several categories. Her career coaching record of 580-298 ranks Agee No. 12 among active NCAA Division I coaches in wins. Agee is 16-6 coaching against Liberty, including a 14-5 record at UNCG and a 2-1 mark as Roanoke College's head coach.

## Liberty-UNC Greensboro Series Notes

Tuesday's game will be the 20th all-time meeting between former Big South rivals, Liberty and UNC Greensboro. The Spartans own a 14-5 advantage in the head-to-head series and a 6-3 edge in games contested at Liberty.

The Lady Flames took the teams' most recent meeting by a 62-44 score, Nov. 13, 2007 at UNC Greensboro. Molly Frazee's career-high 17 points helped Liberty win its season opener. Gini Grimsley was the lone Spartan to reach double figures, ending up with 10 points.

## Liberty Versus the Southern Conference

Liberty has played 58 games against the current members of the Southern Conference, going 27-31. The Lady Flames are 0-2 versus Appalachian State, 2-1 versus College of Charleston, 2-0 versus Davidson, 11-3 versus Elon, 0-1 versus Furman, 0-2 versus Georgia Southern, 1-0 versus Samford, 5-14 versus UNC Greensboro, 3-8 versus Western Carolina and 3-0 versus Wofford.

The Lady Flames could meet a second Southern Conference foe this season on Dec. 29, with Samford entered in Virginia's Marriott Cavalier Classic.

**This Brings Back Memories**

Tuesday's contest will be the first time UNC Greensboro has played at the Vines Center since March 1, 1997, one of the most memorable days in Liberty women's basketball history. A crowd of 2,319 at the Vines Center saw the Lady Flames upset the top-seeded Spartans, 89-82, in that day's Big South Championship title game. The come-from-behind victory began a string of 10 straight conference titles for the Lady Flames.

**Nifty in November**

Liberty is 59-37 all-time during the month of November, and the Lady Flames have gone 24-19 during the year's 11th month with Carey Green as head coach. Last season, the Lady Flames struggled during the opening month of the season, going 1-4. Liberty's lone November win in 2008-09 was notable, as a 45-44, buzzer-beating triumph over UC Riverside on Nov. 21 marked the first Preseason WNIT victory in program history.

In 2008-09, the Lady Flames are 1-0, with four November contests remaining on the docket. After Tuesday's game, Liberty will head to Annapolis, Md., for a pair of contests at the Navy Classic (Nov. 20-21). The month's schedule will draw to a close Nov. 28, when the Lady Flames make their first-ever visit to Lafayette.

**Big Shoes to Fill**

Seven seniors graduated from last year's Liberty team, which went 24-9 and won its second consecutive Big South title. The graduates, who include Alexandria Bream, Megan Frazee, Molly Frazee, Moriah Frazee, Rachel Hammond, Rebecca Lightfoot and Jessica Nelson, accounted for 57.0 percent of the Lady Flames' points and 41.7 percent of the team's rebounds in 2008-09.

Headlining the group was Megan Frazee, who claimed the Big South Player of the Year and Big South Championship MVP awards before being drafted by the WNBA's San Antonio Silver Stars.

**Memorable Debut**

Redshirt freshman Devon Brown was among four Lady Flames who made their collegiate debuts during Liberty's 71-26 win over Winston-Salem State on Friday. Brown led Liberty with 26 points and added seven rebounds. Her point total was notable for several reasons.

-- It was the most points a Lady Flame has scored in her collegiate debut since Elena Kiseleva scored 30 points against Bluefield on Nov. 23, 1996.

-- It marked the first time since Feb. 26, 1976 that a Liberty player has matched or exceeded the opponent's score. That day, Trena Criss (33 points) outscored Roanoke College (22) by herself.

-- It was the most points scored by any Liberty player other than Katie Feenstra or Megan Frazee since Dec. 4, 2004. That day, Kristal Tharp racked up 26 points in the Lady Flames' 77-56 victory over No. 17 Kansas State.

**Clamping Down on Defense**

The Lady Flames have held 85 consecutive opponents under 50 percent field goal shooting. The last Liberty foe to sink more than half of its field goal attempts was Marist, at the Maryland Terrapin Classic on Dec. 29, 2006.

In 2008-09, the Lady Flames ranked No. 6 nationally in field goal percentage defense, allowing opponents to shoot just 34.5 percent for the season.

Liberty is off to a strong start this season, limiting Winston-Salem State to 11 made field goals and 26.2 percent shooting from the field on Friday.

**Clamping Down on Defense, Part 2**

Liberty limited Winston-Salem State to 26 points during Friday's season-opening victory. It was the fewest points scored by a Lady Flames opponent since a 79-26 win over Winthrop on Feb. 28, 2005. Liberty has now held four teams below the 30-point mark in 11 seasons under Carey Green.

## Home Winning Streaks

The Lady Flames are currently riding an 11-game home winning streak, through Friday's 71-26 victory over Winston-Salem State. The streak began Dec. 13, 2008, with a 92-68 home win against St. Paul's.

Liberty has also won 14 consecutive Big South home games since UNC Asheville defeated the Lady Flames at the Vines Center by a 54-51 score on Feb. 24, 2007.

## Turning Up the Heat in the Furnace

The 2009-10 campaign is the 18th season the Liberty University women's basketball team has called the Vines Center its full-time home. Liberty's first-ever contest at the Vines Center was an 86-74 loss to East Tennessee State, on Dec. 7, 1990, but the "Furnace" has served as a favorable venue for the Lady Flames over the years. Liberty is 189-51 (.788) all-time at the Vines Center, including 10-2 last season. The Lady Flames are 1-0 to start this year's 15-game home schedule.

## A Good Omen?

Liberty is slated to play 15 home games this season, for the first time since the 1997-98 campaign. That year, the Lady Flames were 15-0 at home and carried a perfect 28-0 record into the NCAA Tournament.

## Liberty Versus Non-Conference Opposition

Liberty is 1-0 against non-conference opponents this season, boosting its all-time non-conference ledger to 267-293. The Lady Flames have won 12 of their last 14 non-Big South tilts at the Vines Center.

Liberty's best-ever season against non-conference foes came in 1997-98, when the Lady Flames went 14-1 outside the Big South. Liberty's lone non-conference setback that season came to eventual national champion Tennessee in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

## Lady Flames to Face Wide Variety of Non-Conference Foes

Liberty is scheduled to face opponents from eight different conferences this season, including CAA (James Madison) Conference USA (Tulane), Ivy (Cornell), MEAC (North Carolina A&T, Winston-Salem State), Patriot (Lafayette), SEC (Auburn), Southern (UNC Greensboro) and WVIAC (Glenville State) foes.

Depending on how the Navy Classic and Marriott Cavalier Classic play out, the Lady Flames could also square off with teams from the ACC (Virginia) and MAAC (Loyola (Md.)).

## Tar Heel State Tests

Tuesday's game against UNC Greensboro will be the second of nine contests Liberty plays against teams hailing from North Carolina this season. The Lady Flames, 1-0 against Tar Heel State foes in 2009-10, are also slated to face Gardner-Webb (twice), High Point (twice), North Carolina A&T, North Carolina Central and UNC Asheville (twice).

In 2008-09, the Lady Flames were 8-2 versus teams from the state directly to their south, highlighted by a win over Gardner-Webb in the Big South Championship title game.

## Keeping Good Company

Liberty finished the 2008-09 season ranked in the top 10 nationally in four statistical categories. The Lady Flames ended up No. 2 in both scoring defense (52.6 ppg allowed) and rebound margin (+12.7). They were also No. 6 in field goal percentage defense (.345) and No. 10 in field goal percentage (.456). Liberty has now ranked as one of the nation's top five teams for rebounding margin for six consecutive seasons.

The only other NCAA Division I women's basketball team to end up in the top 10 of those four statistical categories last year was undefeated national champion Connecticut.

## There is Only One

Point guard Amber Mays is the only senior on this year's team roster. Liberty has not had so few seniors since the 2005-06 Lady Flames played the season without a single senior.

### Longest-Tenured Assistant Coaches

The 2009-10 season is Heather Stephens' seventh campaign as an assistant coach on Carey Green's coaching staff. This season, she snapped a tie with Jeri (Wiley) Porter as the longest-tenured assistant coach in Liberty women's basketball history. Porter is now the head coach at George Mason.

The Lady Flames have gone 148-45 and won five Big South titles during Stephens' tenure and made the "Sweet 16" of the 2005 NCAA Tournament.

### Same Number, New Face

It may take a few games for Liberty fans to get used to seeing a new player wearing the No. 40 uniform, after Megan Frazee donned the number for the last four seasons. Among many other accomplishments and accolades, Frazee graduated as the No. 2 scorer (1,883 points) and No. 3 rebounder (951 rebounds) in program history, leaving some very big shoes to fill.

Liberty's new No. 40, Devon Brown, made a positive first impression Friday night versus Winston-Salem State. The redshirt freshman from Waynesboro, Va., single-handedly matched the Lady Rams' point total, recording 26 points and seven rebounds in 22 minutes of action.

### Tallest Since Feenstra

Carra Coy, one of three new freshmen on this year's team, stands 6-6. That makes the Summerville, S.C., native the tallest Lady Flame since 6-8 Katie Feenstra graduated after the 2004-05 campaign.

### International Flavor

Freshman Jelena Antic hails from Skopje, Macedonia and sophomore Tolu Omotola was born in London, England, giving Liberty international players on its roster for the 16th consecutive season. The last time the Lady Flames' roster consisted solely of American-born players was the 1993-94 campaign. Every Carey Green-coached team at Liberty has featured at least one international player.

### Local Flavor

Even though Jelena Antic was born in Macedonia, she played high school basketball at Liberty Christian Academy in Lynchburg, Va. She is one of four current Lady Flames who attended high school within 70 miles of the Liberty campus, joining Kylee Beecher (Hidden Valley), Devon Brown (Waynesboro) and Brittany Campbell (Brookville).

## Corralling the Caroms

Liberty has ranked among the nation's top five teams in rebounding margin for six consecutive seasons, including a No. 2 listing in 2008-09. Even though two of the top three rebounders from last year's squad graduated, the Lady Flames got off to a strong start on Friday.

Liberty won the rebounding battle against Winston-Salem State, 39-25, with a trio of players grabbing seven or more boards. Avery Warley paced the Lady Flames with nine rebounds, while Devon Brown and Danika Dale hauled in seven apiece.

## 2009-10 Opponents in the National Rankings

One of Liberty's potential 2009-10 opponents, Virginia, appears in the preseason AP and ESPN/USA Today Coaches Top 25 rankings. The Cavaliers have been listed No. 14 by the AP and No. 18 in the ESPN/USA Today poll.

Liberty could meet Virginia on its home floor at John Paul Jones Arena Dec. 29, pending the results of the previous day's games in the Marriott Cavalier Classic.

## Lack of Overtime

Liberty has played only one overtime game in its last 180 outings, a 64-62 setback at High Point on Jan. 20, 2007. Since that contest at the Millis Center, the Lady Flames have played 76 consecutive games without needing extra time.

The Lady Flames' most recent overtime victory came on Jan. 6, 2004, when Liberty defeated American, 76-72, on the road in double overtime. No current Lady Flame has won an overtime contest in college.

Liberty's most recent overtime contest at the Vines Center was a memorable one. The Lady Flames defeated Virginia, 77-69, in overtime on Nov. 26, 2002, to claim their first-ever win over the Cavaliers. It also marked Liberty's first win over a ranked opponent, as Virginia entered the game with a No. 25 national ranking.

## Recipe for Success

Last season, Liberty won 24 games and several common themes cropped up during many of the Lady Flames' victories. Liberty was 23-0 when leading with 5:00 to play in the contest, 11-0 when scoring 71 or more points and 10-0 when shooting 50 percent or higher from the field. The first two of those trends held true during the Lady Flames' win over Winston-Salem State, as Liberty led with 5:00 remaining and tallied 71 points.

## A-MAYS-ing Amber

Senior point guard Amber Mays enjoyed a strong first season with the Lady Flames in 2008-09, after spending her first two years of college at State Fair Community College. Numerous times, she recorded certain statistics which were the "first since ..." or "most since ..."

Here are a look at some of Mays' notable accomplishments from last season.

- Played the most minutes (1,002) in program history since Stacey White in 1989-90.
- Tallied the most steals (68) by a Lady Flame since Sharon Wilkerson in 1999-2000.
- Finished with the most assists (126) by a Lady Flame since Sarah Wilkerson in 1998-99.
- Came up with eight steals against East Tennessee State on Jan. 13, the most by a Lady Flame since Sharon Wilkerson had eight versus High Point on Feb. 21, 2000.
- Totaled 10 points, eight assists, six rebounds and five steals against St. Paul's on Dec. 13, recording the first 10-5-5-5 stat line by a Lady Flame since Sharon Wilkerson accomplished the feat Feb. 18, 1999 against UNC Asheville.

## Windex Warley

Avery Warley immediately endeared herself to head coach Carey Green last season as a redshirt freshman, by virtue of her exceptional rebounding ability. The Washington, D.C., native finished her rookie season with 256 rebounds, which ranks second among freshmen in program history (behind Cheri Yates' 267 rebounds in 1988-89). Warley is already just 23 boards away from becoming one of the top 50 career rebounders ever at Liberty, after opening the 2009-10 campaign with a team-high nine boards on Friday.

#### Dale Delivers

Liberty head coach Carey Green remarked several times during the preseason that Danika Dale was one of the most improved players on his roster. The 6-1 sophomore from Fort Hood, Texas certainly justified his claim versus Winston-Salem State on Friday.

Dale played the most minutes of any Lady Flames reserve (23), contributing six points, seven rebounds, three assists, three steals and two blocked shots. Her rebound and blocked shot totals both set new career highs.

#### Filling the Void

Graduated senior Rachel Hammond paced the 2008-09 Lady Flames with 42 made three-pointers. It is unclear at this time how Liberty will replace her outside scoring punch, as the Lady Flames' seven returning players have combined to make just 37 career triples.

Leading the way is Rachel McLeod, who has knocked down 21 three-pointers during her first two seasons at Liberty, shooting 31.3 percent from beyond the arc. Redshirt freshman Brittany Campbell connected on six triples in just five games last year, before suffering a season-ending knee injury Dec. 2 at James Madison.

Newcomers accounted for all four of Liberty's three-pointers versus Winston-Salem State, led by Devon Brown's three-for-five effort. LaKendra Washington sank the Lady Flames' other trifecta on Friday.

#### A Winning Tradition

Liberty had never won more than 16 games in a season until 1996-97, when the Lady Flames captured their first-ever Big South Conference title. That year, Liberty went 22-8. Since then, the Lady Flames have never won fewer than 18 games and have recorded 11 total 20-win seasons.

#### An Uncommon Occurrence

The Lady Flames are opening the season with back-to-back home games for only the second time in Carey Green's 11 seasons as head coach.

In 2004-05, Liberty hosted Virginia Union and Richmond to tip off its "Sweet 16" season, claiming an 83-56 victory over the Panthers and dropping a 65-45 contest at the hands of the Spiders.

Liberty's defense set the tone for its season-opening victory over Winston-Salem State, keeping the Lady Rams off the scoreboard for the first 8:44 of play. Meanwhile, redshirt freshman Devon Brown took care of things at the offensive end, exploding for 26 points in the Lady Flames' 71-26 triumph at the Vines Center. As previously mentioned, the Rams did not find the bottom of the net for the first 8:44, as Liberty jumped out to a 13-0 lead. The first seven points of Brown's collegiate career came during the Lady Flames' game-opening surge. The Rams scored six of the contest's next seven markers, trimming their deficit to 14-6 on Jillian Charlet's layup at the 6:38 mark of the opening half. However, Winston-Salem State managed only six points for the remainder of the stanza, while Liberty's lead ballooned to 18. Brown sent the Lady Flames into halftime with a 30-12 advantage, swishing back-to-back triples in the final minute of the period to close out at 15-point half. Liberty put the game away with a 20-4 run to open the second half, sparked by a pair of freshmen. Brown had 13 points and LaKendra Washington tallied five markers during the surge, which lasted 9:09. Winston-Salem State got no closer than 31 for the remainder of the contest, and the Lady Flames went on to wrap up a 45-point win, 71-26. It was the fewest points a Liberty opponent has scored since the Lady Flames limited Winthrop to 26 markers on Feb. 28, 2005.
