The Game

Liberty (6-1, 0-0 Big South) will begin a four-game road swing Tuesday at 7 p.m. Eastern, when the Lady Flames make their first-ever trip to Auburn (6-3, 0-0 SEC). Both teams are dominated by youth in 2009-10, after graduating deep, talented senior classes a season ago.

Last Time Out

Liberty bounced back from its first loss of the 2009-10 campaign, posting an 86-45 victory over Division II Glenville State, Dec. 5 at the Vines Center. Three Lady Flames scored in double figures, paced by Devon Brown's 20 points. Liberty also held the Pioneers 54 points below their season scoring average.

On Deck

Liberty will take nearly two weeks off of competition, before traveling north on Route 29 for the Marriott Cavalier Classic. The Lady Flames' opening game of the tournament at John Paul Jones Arena is a 4:30 p.m. matchup with Cornell on Dec. 28.

All Lady Flames basketball games may be heard LIVE on WWMC 90.9 FM "The Light." Jamie Hall, celebrating his 16th year of broadcasting Lady Flames basketball, will once again be handling the courtside play-by-play duties for road games. Nick Pierce and Josh Wood will serve as the primary commentators for home contests.

Lady Flames On TV

For the seventh season in a row, the Flames Sports Network (FSN) plans to broadcast all 15 home women's basketball games. FSN's regular announcing team will consist of Ray Jones on play-by-play and Jamie Hall on color.

Liberty head women's basketball coach Carey Green, beginning his 11th season with the Lady Flames, has instilled quite a winning tradition during his tenure at the institution. His teams have averaged more than 23 victories per year, putting his name alongside the nation's premier women's basketball coaches.

Green has accumulated a 243-78 record on the Liberty bench, good for a winning percentage of .757. He currently ranks ninth all-time among NCAA Division I women's basketball coaches in winning percentage, ahead of renowned coaching names like Rutgers' Vivian Stringer, LSU's Van Chancellor and North Carolina's Sylvia Hatchell.

More importantly, Liberty has won the Big South Tournament title and advanced to the NCAA Tournament nine times with Green as head coach. Liberty has totaled 23 or more victories during eight of those years, including the 2004-05 season, which saw the Lady Flames reach the Sweet 16 for the first time in program history.

Green has actually been to the postseason on 21 occasions as a women's basketball coach, a span which includes a dozen years as an assistant coach at Clemson. In all but one of the 21 appearances, he has experienced the NCAA Tournament.

Last season, Green earned his unprecedented fifth Big South Coach of the Year award, after guiding a team decimated by ACL injuries to a 24-9 record and its 12th NCAA Tournament appearance in the last 13 years. The Lady Flames also won the Hokie Hardwood Classic, claiming their first-ever victory over Virginia Tech in the tournament championship game.

At season's end, Green saw his second player selected in the WNBA Draft, as Megan Frazee was taken in the second round by the San Antonio Silver Stars. She then played part of her rookie season alongside 2005 Liberty alum Katie (Feenstra) Mattera in San Antonio.

Rebounding and defense have always been staples of Green-coached teams, and the 2008-09 Lady Flames were no exception. Liberty outrebounded opponents by an average of 12.7 caroms per game, ranking second nationally. The Lady Flames have now been listed among the nation's top five teams in rebounding margin for six straight years. Liberty led the nation in the category in 2003-04 and 2004-05. The Lady Flames also ended the season ranked in the top 10 nationally for scoring defense (second, 52.6 ppg) and field goal percentage defense (sixth, .345).

A key late-season conference victory over High Point in 2006 made Green the winningest coach in Big South Conference history. He is also Liberty's career wins leader.

The 2004-05 year was a special one on Liberty Mountain, for many reasons. A senior-laden Lady Flames team recorded upset wins over No. 4 seed Penn State (78-70) and No. 5 seed DePaul (88-79) in the first two rounds of the NCAA Tournament, becoming just the second team ever to advance to the Sweet 16 as a No. 13 seed. The Lady Flames ended the season with their highest national ranking to date, No. 21 (USA Today/ESPN).

Green's track record shows he has the ability to meet those challenges. The Lady Flames have recorded two wins over UNLV, Virginia and West Virginia and solo victories over No. 19 DePaul, No. 17 Kansas State, No. 25 Penn State, Virginia Tech and Wake Forest during Green's tenure. The upset victory over No. 25 Virginia in 2003 marked Liberty's first win over a Top 25 team.

His record against conference foes is equally impressive. He led the Lady Flames on a Big South record 47-game winning streak and currently owns a .917 (154-14) winning percentage against conference teams. Green has marched through conference play with one or fewer setbacks seven times, while guiding the Lady Flames to two undefeated conference seasons.

Scouting Auburn

Auburn is coming off a stellar 2008-09 season, which saw the Tigers win 30 games and claim the SEC regular-season championship. However, Auburn graduated a strong senior class, including two players (Whitney Boddie and DeWanna Bonner) who went on to play in the WNBA.

Due to ACL injuries suffered by Reneisha Hobbs and Morgan Jennings, the Tigers currently only have nine healthy players at their disposal. Nevertheless, Auburn has opened the 2009-10 campaign with a 6-3 record.

The Tigers, who enter Tuesday's game on a three-game winning streak, have been paced by 5-8 junior guard Alli Smalley, the lone returning starter from last year's team. She is averaging a team-high 16.7 ppg, 3.6 rpg and 3.2 apg. KeKe Carrier, a 6-7 center, is the only senior on the team. She is posting 12.6 ppg, 6.4 rpg and 2.0 bpg thus far.

The Coaching Matchup

Liberty Head Coach Carey Green is in his 11th season with the Lady Flames, and has led his team to nine Big South titles. A five-time Big South Coach of the Year, Green owns a 243-78 career record and is the all-time wins leader at Liberty and among Big South women's basketball coaches. His career winning percentage (.757) ranked ninth all-time among NCAA Division I women's basketball coaches at the season's outset. Green is 0-1 versus Auburn.

Nell Fortner is 107-60 in her sixth season as Auburn's head coach and 124-71 in seven total campaigns as a collegiate head coach. The 2009 SEC Coach of the Year, Fortner boasts an impressive coaching resume. Most notably, she guided the U.S. National Team to a gold medal in the 2000 Olympics. Fortner also served as head coach of the WNBA's Indiana Fever for three seasons (2001-03). She is 1-0 all-time against Liberty.

Liberty-Auburn Series Notes

Auburn is 1-0 all-time versus Liberty, after claiming a 64-53 victory at the Vines Center, Dec. 7, 2008. The Lady Flames, who dressed only seven players, led the undefeated Tigers by as many as 10 points during the first half and took a 33-32 advantage into halftime. However, Auburn took control of the game with an 11-0 run, midway through the second half.

Moriah Frazee led the Lady Flames with 14 points and seven rebounds, while Amber Mays chipped in 13 points and four steals. The Tigers' Sherell Hobbs paced all players with 20 points, with DeWanna Bonner adding 17 points and six boards.

Liberty Versus the Southeastern Conference (SEC)

The Lady Flames are 1-13 versus the current Southeastern Conference (SEC) members, including 0-8 in the NCAA Tournament. Liberty is 0-1 against Alabama, 0-1 against Auburn, 0-1 against Florida, 0-3 against Georgia, 1-1 against Kentucky, 0-2 against LSU, 0-1 against South Carolina, 0-1 against Tennessee and 0-2 against Vanderbilt.

Liberty's only win versus a SEC opponent was an 80-76 triumph at Kentucky on Dec. 12, 1998. The Lady Flames became the first Big South team ever to beat a SEC squad. Elena Kisseleva tallied 22 points, while Sarah and Sharon Wilkerson had 21 apiece.

All-Time Record in December

The Lady Flames are 79-102 all-time in December contests, including 35-33 under head coach Carey Green. Last season, Liberty went 4-3 during the calendar year's final month, highlighted by a tournament title at the Hokie Hardwood Classic.

Liberty, which is 1-1 to start this month, only has five games scheduled this December. This marks the Lady Flames' fewest games in the month since Liberty played four contests in December 2001.

Fast Start

Liberty's 6-1 start matches the second-best start to a season in program history. Four other Lady Flames squads have won six of their first seven games, including the 1975-76, 1983-84, 1996-97 and 2007-08 teams.

The 1997-98 Liberty squad won 28 consecutive games to open the season, remaining unbeaten until suffering a loss to Tennessee in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

Memorable Debut

Redshirt freshman Devon Brown was among four Lady Flames who made their collegiate debuts during Liberty's 71-26 win over Winston-Salem State on Nov. 13. Brown led Liberty with 26 points and added seven rebounds. Her point total was notable for several reasons.

-- It was the most points a Lady Flame has scored in her collegiate debut since Elena Kisseleva scored 30 points against Bluefield on Nov. 23, 1996.

-- It marked the first time since Feb. 26, 1976 that a Liberty player has matched or exceeded the opponent's score. That day, Trena Criss (33 points) outscored Roanoke College (22) by herself.

Watch Out for Washington

After totaling 19 points during her first four collegiate games, freshman LaKendra Washington exploded for 21 points at Lafayette on Nov. 28. The Milwaukee, Wis., native and Devon Brown have both recorded 20-point outings as freshmen this season. This is the first time since 2001-02, multiple Liberty rookies have recorded 20-point games. That season, Katie Feenstra and Stephanie Walker accomplished the feat.

Freshman of the Week

LaKendra Washington's 21-point, four-steal performance at Lafayette on Nov. 28 was recognized by the Big South Conference on Dec. 1. The freshman guard was named the Big South Freshman of the Week, marking the second consecutive week a Liberty rookie was honored by the Big South.

First Since Frazee

After averaging 21.0 ppg and 10.7 rpg during Liberty's 3-0 week, Devon Brown was honored as Big South Player of the Week on Nov. 24. She became the first Lady Flames freshman to win the award since Megan Frazee captured it twice during her rookie season (Dec. 5, 2005 & Jan. 16, 2006).

National Statistical Rankings

Through the contests of Dec. 6, the Lady Flames were ranked among the NCAA's top 15 teams in six different statistical categories. Liberty was No. 3 in both rebound margin (+15.0) and field goal percentage defense (.308), No. 4 in scoring defense (46.1 ppg), No. 5 in three-point field goal percentage defense (.208), No. 6 in field goal percentage (.488) and No. 14 in scoring margin (+21.7).

Stuck in the 60s

Liberty held Glensville State 54 points below its season scoring average during an 86-45 win on Dec. 5, extending an impressive streak. Liberty has now held 34 consecutive opponents below the 70-point mark, since James Madison recorded a 77-64 win over the Lady Flames on Dec. 2, 2008.

Clamping Down on Defense

The Lady Flames have held 91 consecutive opponents under 50 percent field goal shooting. The last Liberty foe to sink more than half of its field goal attempts was Marist, at the Maryland Terrapin Classic on Dec. 29, 2006.

In 2008-09, the Lady Flames ranked No. 6 nationally in field goal percentage defense, allowing opponents to shoot just 34.5 percent for the season.

Liberty is off to a strong start this season, holding its first seven opponents to 46.1 ppg and 30.8 percent shooting from the field. The Lady Flames lead the Big South and rank in the top five nationally in both categories.

Clamping Down on Defense, Part 2

Liberty limited Winston-Salem State to 26 points during its season-opening victory on Nov. 13. It was the fewest points scored by a Lady Flames opponent since a 79-26 win over Winthrop on Feb. 28, 2005. Liberty has now held four teams below the 30-point mark in 11 seasons under Carey Green.

The Container is Half Full

This season, the Lady Flames are 3-0, when shooting 50 percent or higher from the field. Liberty is now 62-0 under head coach Carey Green, when the Lady Flames sink at least half of their field goals.

Liberty Versus Non-Conference Opposition

Liberty is 6-1 against non-conference opponents this season, boosting its all-time non-conference ledger to 272-294. The Lady Flames have won 14 of their last 17 non-Big South tilts at the Vines Center.

Liberty's best-ever season against non-conference foes came in 1997-98, when the Lady Flames went 14-1 outside the Big South. Liberty's lone non-conference setback that season came to eventual national champion Tennessee in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

Lady Flames to Face Wide Variety of Non-Conference Foes

Liberty is scheduled to face opponents from eight different conferences this season, including CAA (James Madison) Conference USA (Tulane), Ivy (Cornell), MEAC (North Carolina A&T & Winston-Salem State), Patriot (Lafayette & Navy), SEC (Auburn), Southern (UNC Greensboro) and WVIAC (Glennville State) foes.

Depending on how the Marriott Cavalier Classic plays out, the Lady Flames could also square off with an ACC opponent (Virginia).

Painting a Masterpiece

Last season, Liberty regularly controlled the area around the basket, outscoring 29 of 33 opponents in the "points in the paint" statistical category.

This year, the Lady Flames are off to an outstanding start in racking up "points in the paint" once again. Through seven games, Liberty has outscored its opponents by an average margin of 42.3-14.6.

Most recently, the Lady Flames tallied 64 points in the paint to Glennville State's 10 on Dec. 5. In total, 80 of Liberty's 86 points came either in the paint or at the foul line.

Record-Setting Afternoon

Liberty's last game at the Vines Center, an 86-45 triumph over Glennville State on Dec. 5, saw a pair of facility records eclipsed.

The Lady Flames' 67 rebounds set a new Vines Center record, breaking the old mark of 66 boards Liberty grabbed against Valley Forge on Jan. 14, 1995.

Glennville State's 49 three-point field goal attempts shattered the existing Vines Center record of 39 triple tries, lofted by Richmond on Nov. 21, 2000.

There is Only One

Starting point guard Amber Mays is the only senior on this year's team roster. Liberty has not had so few seniors since the 2005-06 Lady Flames played the season without a single senior.

Longest-Tenured Assistant Coaches

The 2009-10 season is Heather Stephens' seventh campaign as an assistant coach on Carey Green's coaching staff. This season, she snapped a tie with Jeri (Wiley) Porter as the longest-tenured assistant coach in Liberty women's basketball history. Porter is now the head coach at George Mason.

The Lady Flames have gone 152-46 and won five Big South titles during Stephens' tenure and made the "Sweet 16" of the 2005 NCAA Tournament.

Same Number, New Face

It may take a few games for Liberty fans to get used to seeing a new player wearing the No. 40 uniform, after Megan Frazee donned the number for the last four seasons. Among many other accomplishments and accolades, Frazee graduated as the No. 2 scorer (1,883 points) and No. 3 rebounder (951 rebounds) in program history, leaving some very big shoes to fill.

Liberty's new No. 40, Devon Brown, has worn the number proudly so far. The redshirt freshman from Waynesboro, Va., the Big South Player of the Week on Nov. 24, is averaging 19.3 ppg and 9.1 rpg, pacing the Lady Flames and the Big South Conference in both categories.

Tallest Since Feenstra

Carra Coy, one of three new freshmen on this year's team, stands 6-6. That makes the Summerville, S.C., native the tallest Lady Flame since 6-8 Katie Feenstra graduated after the 2004-05 campaign.

International Flavor

Freshman Jelena Antic hails from Skopje, Macedonia and sophomore Tolu Omotola was born in London, England, giving Liberty international players on its roster for the 16th consecutive season. The last time the Lady Flames' roster consisted solely of American-born players was the 1993-94 campaign. Every Carey Green-coached team at Liberty has featured at least one international player.

Local Flavor

Even though Jelena Antic was born in Macedonia, she played high school basketball at Liberty Christian Academy in Lynchburg, Va. She is one of four current Lady Flames who attended high school within 70 miles of the Liberty campus, joining Kylee Beecher (Hidden Valley), Devon Brown (Waynesboro) and Brittany Campbell (Brookville).

Gaining Some National Recognition

Liberty earned a single vote in the most recent ESPN/USA Today Coaches Top 25 Poll, released on Dec. 8, marking the second straight week the Lady Flames have received a vote.

Liberty also collected one vote in the AP Top 25 Poll, released on Nov. 30.

Turning Up the Heat in the Furnace

The 2009-10 campaign is the 18th season the Liberty women's basketball team has called the Vines Center its full-time home. The "Furnace" has served as a favorable venue for the Lady Flames over the years. Liberty is 191-52 (.786) all-time at the Vines Center, including 10-2 last season.

The Lady Flames are 3-1 to start this year's 15-game home schedule and are 99-10 in their last 109 home games, dating back to the 2001-02 season.

Noting the 90s

The Lady Flames scored a season-high 90 points during their Nov. 28 victory at Lafayette. It was the 10th time Liberty has reached the 90-point plateau under head coach Carey Green.

The Lady Flames' most recent 90-point outburst came during a 92-68 home win over St. Paul's, Dec. 13, 2008.

Liberty had not scored 90 points in a road game since a 94-75 triumph at Richmond, Dec. 4, 1999 in the opening round of the Wachovia Women's Invitational.

Corralling the Caroms

Liberty has ranked among the nation's top five teams in rebounding margin for six consecutive seasons, including a No. 2 listing in 2008-09. Even though two of the top three rebounders from last year's squad graduated, the Lady Flames have gotten off to a strong start again this season.

Liberty has won the rebounding battle in each of its first seven games this season, by an average of 15.0 boards per contest. Leading the way are redshirt freshman Devon Brown (9.1 rpg) and redshirt sophomore Avery Warley (8.1 rpg).

Lack of Overtime

Liberty has played only one overtime game in its last 186 outings, a 64-62 setback at High Point on Jan. 20, 2007. Since that contest at the Millis Center, the Lady Flames have played 85 consecutive games without needing extra time.

The Lady Flames' most recent overtime victory came on Jan. 6, 2004, when Liberty defeated American, 76-72, on the road in double overtime. No current Lady Flame has won an overtime contest in college.

Liberty's most recent overtime contest at the Vines Center was a memorable one. The Lady Flames defeated Virginia, 77-69, in overtime on Nov. 26, 2002, to claim their first-ever win over the Cavaliers. It also marked Liberty's first win over a ranked opponent, as Virginia entered the game with a No. 25 national ranking.

Big Shoes to Fill

Seven seniors graduated from last year's Liberty team, which went 24-9 and won its second consecutive Big South title. Alexandria Bream, Megan Frazee, Molly Frazee, Moriah Frazee, Rachel Hammond, Rebecca Lightfoot and Jessica Nelson accounted for 57.0 percent of the Lady Flames' points and 41.7 percent of the team's rebounds in 2008-09.

Headlining the group was Megan Frazee, who claimed the Big South Player of the Year and Big South Championship MVP awards.

Youth will be Served

Underclassmen have stepped up to fill the void left by the seven seniors who graduated from the 2008-09 Liberty roster. Through the first seven games of the 2009-10 campaign, the Lady Flames' freshmen and sophomores are accounting for 72 percent of the team's points and 74.9 percent of Liberty's rebounds.

The Lady Flames' top five rebounders are all either freshmen or sophomores, as are four of the top five scorers.

Wanted for Theft

The Lady Flames ranked only sixth in the Big South in steals last season, averaging 7.9 steals per contest. This season, an active, aggressive Liberty defense ranks No. 31 nationally with an average of 11.1 steals per contest, through the year's first seven games.

As expected, senior point guard Amber Mays is the Lady Flames' chief thief so far, with 20 steals. She recorded a team-high 68 steals a year ago. Mays is also getting considerable assistance from LaKendra Washington (12 steals) and Devon Brown (11).

Regular-Season Tournament Success

The Lady Flames won the Navy Classic championship, Nov. 20-21 in Annapolis, Md. It was Liberty's fourth regular-season tournament title in the past three seasons, including the 2007 National City Xavier Invitational, the 2007 Lady Rebel Christmas Classic and the 2008 Hokie Hardwood Classic.

Removing the Suspense

Liberty has not played in many tightly contested games so far this season. Only one contest (Dec. 1 versus James Madison) has been decided by 10 points or less. Through seven games, the Lady Flames have only experienced three total ties and four lead changes.

Furious Comeback

The Lady Flames fell behind Navy, 20-4, 7:56 into the Navy Classic championship game on Nov. 21. Liberty then outscored the host Midshipmen, 51-23, during the remainder of the game to claim an improbable 55-43 victory.

It was the Lady Flames' largest comeback since Nov. 27, 2001, in a matchup with VCU at the Vines Center. The Rams owned a 38-22 advantage with 18:41 remaining in the second half, before the Lady Flames rallied for a 65-60 victory.

See You in a Month

The Lady Flames' game versus Glenville State on Dec. 5 was Liberty's final contest at the Vines Center for a month. By the time the Lady Flames come back home to host North Carolina A&T on Jan. 5, they will have played games in three different states (Alabama, North Carolina and Virginia) and opened Big South Conference play.

Liberty's defense set the tone for its season-opening victory over Winston-Salem State, keeping the Lady Rams off the scoreboard for the first 8:44 of play. Meanwhile, redshirt freshman Devon Brown took care of things at the offensive end, exploding for 26 points in the Lady Flames' 71-26 triumph at the Vines Center. As previously mentioned, the Rams did not find the bottom of the net for the first 8:44, as Liberty jumped out to a 13-0 lead. The first seven points of Brown's collegiate career came during the Lady Flames' game-opening surge. The Rams scored six of the contest's next seven markers, trimming their deficit to 14-6 on Jillian Charlet's layup at the 6:38 mark of the opening half. However, Winston-Salem State managed only six points for the remainder of the stanza, while Liberty's lead ballooned to 18. Brown sent the Lady Flames into halftime with a 30-12 advantage, swishing back-to-back triples in the final minute of the period to close out at 15-point half. Liberty put the game away with a 20-4 run to open the second half, sparked by a pair of freshmen. Brown had 13 points and LaKendra Washington tallied five markers during the surge, which lasted 9:09. Winston-Salem State got no closer than 31 for the remainder of the contest, and the Lady Flames went on to wrap up a 45-point win, 71-26. It was the fewest points a Liberty opponent has scored since the Lady Flames limited Winthrop to 26 markers on Feb. 28, 2005.

Liberty held its second straight opponent to below 30 percent field goal shooting and put three players in double figures versus UNC Greensboro. As a result, the Lady Flames opened the campaign with their second straight victory, a 60-42 triumph at the Vines Center. Devon Brown scored 26 points for the second consecutive game to open her college career. Neither team found the bottom of the net for the first 2:38 of the game, before UNC Greensboro's Amanda Leigh drained a 15-foot jumper to break the ice. However, the blue-clad Spartans only made one field goal over the next 10:37. During their stretch of cold shooting, Liberty opened up a 16-4 lead, aided by six Brown points. UNCG scored six of the next nine points, trimming its deficit to 19-10 on Lakhia Hyson's jumper at the 5:27 mark. The Spartans were still within nine at 23-14, before Brown sparked a 9-3 Liberty burst with seven points and a steal. Her theft led to Amber Mays' layup, which gave the Lady Flames their largest lead of the opening half, 32-17. UNC Greensboro then scored the stanza's final four markers, cutting Liberty's halftime advantage to 11 points, 32-21. The Spartans emerged from the locker room with a 7-3 surge. A 24-2 first-half run gave Liberty a lead it never relinquished, and the Lady Flames went on to win the opening game of the Navy Classic, 63-52 over Tulane. After Tulane's Brittany Lindsey scored the game's first hoop on a lob play, the Green Wave only managed two points over the next 12:46. 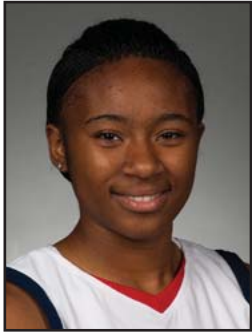
