The Game

The Liberty Lady Flames (1-4, 0-0 Big South) will play their fifth consecutive game away from the Vines Center Tuesday at 7 p.m., when they travel to James Madison (2-2, 0-0 CAA) for a Commonwealth battle. The contest will match up two of Virginia's best college women's basketball teams, who combined to win 52 games last season.

What to Watch

Liberty is aiming to snap a three-game losing streak and will also look to break a recent trend versus James Madison. The two teams have met each of the past two seasons, with the home team winning each time. The Dukes have been tough to beat at the JMU Convocation Center in recent seasons, winning 47 of their last 50 home games.

The Lady Flames will attempt to become the first team this season to slow down James Madison sophomore guard Dawn Evans. The nation's leading scorer has tallied at least 25 points in each game this year and is currently averaging 30.8 points per contest.

Lady Flames On The Air

All Lady Flames basketball games may be heard LIVE on WWMC 90.9 FM "The Light." Jamie Hall, celebrating his 15th year of broadcasting Lady Flames basketball, will once again be handling the courtside play-by-play duties for most road games. Josh Wood will serve as the primary commentator for home contests and will provide color analysis on the road.

Lady Flames On TV

For the sixth season in a row, the Flames Television Network (FTN) plans to broadcast all 12 home women's basketball games. FTN's regular announcing team will consist of Ray Jones on play-by-play and Jamie Hall on color.

Liberty head women's basketball coach Carey Green, beginning his 10th season with the Lady Flames, has instilled quite a winning tradition during his tenure at the institution. His teams have averaged more than 23 victories per year during his time at Liberty, putting his name alongside the nation's premier women's basketball coaches.

Green has accumulated a 214-72 record on the Liberty bench, good for a winning percentage of .748. He entered the season ranked 10th among active NCAA Division I women's basketball coaches in winning percentage, ahead of renowned coaching names like Rutgers' Vivian Stringer, LSU's Van Chancellor and North Carolina's Sylvia Hatchell.

More importantly, Liberty has won the Big South Tournament title and advanced to the NCAA Tournament eight times with Green as head coach. Liberty has totaled 23 or more victories during seven of those years, including the 2004-05 season, which saw the Lady Flames reach the Sweet 16 for the first time in program history.

Green has actually been to the postseason on 20 occasions as a women's basketball coach, a span which includes a dozen years as an assistant coach at Clemson. In all but one of the 20 appearances, he has experienced the NCAA Tournament.

Last season, Green led the Lady Flames to one of the best seasons in program history. Liberty tied a school record for victories, finishing the year 28-4. Along the way, the Lady Flames captured three tournament titles—the National City Xavier Invitational, the UNLV Lady Rebel Christmas Classic and their eighth Big South Championship in Green's nine years as head coach. The latter championship earned Liberty a spot in the NCAA Tournament for the 11th time. Green won his 200th career game, Jan. 19 at Charleston Southern, and became the first four-time Big South Women's Basketball Coach of the Year in conference history.

Rebounding and defense have always been staples of Green-coached teams, and the 2007-08 Lady Flames were no exception. Liberty outrebounded opponents by an average of 10.2 caroms per game, ranking fifth nationally. The Lady Flames have now been listed among the nation's top five teams in rebounding margin for five-straight years. Liberty led the nation in the category in 2003-04 and 2004-05. The Lady Flames also ended the season ranked in the top 15 in the nation for field goal percentage defense (fourth) and scoring defense (15th).

A key late-season conference victory over High Point in 2006 made Green the winningest coach in Big South Conference history. He is also Liberty's career wins leader.

The record-setting victory was just one of the many reasons the 2004-05 year was a special one on Liberty Mountain. A senior-laden Lady Flames team recorded upset wins over No. 4 seed Penn State (78-70) and No. 5 seed DePaul (88-79) in the first two rounds of the NCAA Tournament, becoming just the second team ever to advance to the Sweet 16 as a No. 13 seed. The Lady Flames ended the season with their highest national ranking to date, 21st (USA Today/ESPN).

Green's track record shows he has the ability to meet strong challenges. The Lady Flames have recorded two wins over UNLV, Virginia and West Virginia and solo victories over No. 19 DePaul, No. 17 Kansas State, No. 25 Penn State and Wake Forest during Green's tenure. The upset victory over No. 25 Virginia in 2003 marked Liberty's first win over a Top 25 team.

His record against conference foes is equally impressive. He led the Lady Flames on a Big South record 47-game winning streak and currently owns a .913 (136-13) winning percentage against conference teams. Green has marched through conference play with one or fewer setbacks six times, while guiding the Lady Flames to two undefeated conference seasons.

Scouting James Madison

The James Madison Dukes, picked to finish third in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), enter Tuesday's contest with a 2-2 record. They are 1-0 at home, defeating Big South opponent Radford by an 85-61 score in both teams' season opener.

The Dukes graduated three starters from last season's 24-10 squad, including Tamera Young, the first-round draft pick of the WNBA's Atlanta Dream. Dawn Evans, a 5-7 sophomore guard, has picked up the slack and then some. She is averaging 30.8 ppg and has already connected on 20 three-pointers. Evans scored 37 points versus Boston College and 33 against No. 11 Maryland.

The Coaching Matchup

Liberty Head Coach Carey Green is in his 10th season with the Lady Flames, and has led his team to eight Big South titles. A four-time Big South Coach of the Year, Green owns a 214-72 career record and is the all-time wins leader at Liberty and among Big South women's basketball coaches. His career winning percentage (.748) ranked 10th among active NCAA Division I women's basketball coaches at the season's outset. Green is 1-1 versus James Madison in his head coaching career.

Kenny Brooks is 124-64 in his seventh season as head women's basketball coach at his alma mater. He has coached the Dukes to postseason appearances in each of the last three seasons, and JMU is 75-23 during the stretch. James Madison's 2006-07 squad went 27-6, earning an at-large berth to the NCAA Tournament. Brooks owns a 1-1 coaching mark against Liberty.

Liberty-James Madison Series Notes

Liberty picked up its first-ever win against James Madison last season, but the Dukes own a 3-1 edge in the Commonwealth rivals' head-to-head series. James Madison is 3-0 versus the Lady Flames in Harrisonburg, picking up a 94-48 win on Nov. 25, 1985, an 81-56 decision on Feb. 2, 1991 and a 74-64 triumph on Nov. 29, 2006. Liberty's lone victory over JMU came by a 79-66 margin, Dec. 4, 2007 at the Vines Center.

Last season, all five Liberty starters reached double figures in the scoring column versus James Madison, led by Megan Frazee's 20 points and 12 rebounds. Sister Moriah Frazee added 17 points and six caroms. Tamera Young paced JMU's attack with 20 points and 11 boards, while Dawn Evans chipped in with 15 tallies but made just one of her 12 three-point tries.

Liberty Versus the Colonial Athletic Association

The Lady Flames own a 23-57 (.288) all-time record against current members of the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA). Liberty is 0-1 versus CAA opponents this year, dropping its season opener to VCU by a 59-57 score. Last season, the Lady Flames went 2-1 versus CAA foes, defeating George Mason and James Madison and falling to Old Dominion.

Liberty is 0-1 all-time against Delaware, 0-2 against Drexel, 2-11 against George Mason, 1-3 against James Madison, 0-2 against Old Dominion, 4-5 against Towson, 9-22 against VCU and 7-11 against William & Mary.

All-Time Record in December

After going 1-4 during the month of November, the Lady Flames are hoping for a better December. Liberty is 74-98 all-time during the calendar year's final month, including 30-29 under head coach Carey Green.

Last season, the Lady Flames won five of six games in December, including a home victory over James Madison and the UNLV Lady Rebel Christmas Classic title. Liberty's lone loss for the month came at No. 4 North Carolina.

Competing with the Commonwealth

Tuesday's game at James Madison is Liberty's second of five scheduled contests versus teams hailing from the Commonwealth of Virginia. The Lady Flames, who lost their season opener to VCU, will also face St. Paul's (Dec. 13) and Radford twice (Feb. 2 and March 6). A year ago, the Lady Flames went 7-2 against Commonwealth opposition.

A-MAYS-ing Amber

Junior point guard Amber Mays was voted to the all-tournament team at last weekend's GW Thanksgiving Classic, after a pair of stellar performances for the Lady Flames in the nation's capital.

Mays opened her weekend with an eight-point, four-assist outing versus Hartford on Nov. 28. She then came back with a career-high 14-point effort against South Alabama the following day, sinking six of her seven field goal attempts.

Mays capped the weekend by celebrating her 20th birthday on Sunday (Nov. 30).

Block Party

The Lady Flames rank third in the Big South with an average of 4.0 blocked shots per game, through the first five contests of the 2008-09 season. Leading the way is redshirt freshman Avery Warley, with seven rejections, for a 1.4 bpg average. She sits third in the conference.

Four of Warley's blocks came during Liberty's 45-44 win over UC Riverside on Nov. 21, marking a new career-high. Only one Lady Flame blocked four shots during a game last season, as Moriah Frazee turned away four Radford shot attempts on Feb. 6, 2008.

Sophomore Kittery Maine has also joined in on the fun. In her first appearance of the 2008-09 campaign on Nov. 22, the Georgia native blocked a trio of Western Carolina shots in just 10 minutes of action. The three rejections equaled Maine's career high.

A Flair for the Dramatic

Dating back to last season, five of Liberty's last seven games have been decided by seven points or less. The Lady Flames have won two of those tight contests, and Megan Frazee has hit the game-winning shot both times. Frazee's heroics downed Radford in the 2008 Big South Championship title contest and sank UC Riverside with a buzzer-beater on Nov. 21.

Halfway There?

Liberty had won 23 consecutive games when holding a halftime lead, until last weekend's GW Thanksgiving Classic. The Lady Flames owned a small halftime advantage over both Hartford and South Alabama, before losing both contests.

Liberty only lost once last season when leading at the intermission. The Lady Flames owned a 10-point halftime edge at Virginia Tech on Nov. 19, 2007, before the Hokies stormed back to win, 73-68.

Fabulous Freshman

Freshman guard Brittany Campbell had scored only five collegiate points, before a memorable weekend at the GW Thanksgiving Classic. She hit double figures in the scoring column both days, notching a career-best 11 points against Hartford and 10 markers versus South Alabama.

Campbell's 11 points against Hartford paced all players, making her the first freshman to lead Liberty in scoring since Moriah Frazee had 11 points against DePaul in the first round of the 2006 NCAA Tournament (March 18, 2006).

No Need to be Alarmed

Liberty started the season with a 1-3 record for the third time in head coach Carey Green's 10 years at the helm. On both previous occasions (2001-02 and 2003-04), the Lady Flames went on to claim the Big South championship.

However, Liberty is 1-4 for the first time since the 1994-95 Lady Flames opened the year at 1-5.

Turning Up the Heat in the Furnace

The 2008-09 campaign is the 17th season the Liberty University women's basketball team has called the Vines Center its full-time home. Liberty's first-ever contest at the Vines Center was an 86-74 loss to East Tennessee State, on Dec. 7, 1990, but the "Furnace" has served as a favorable venue for the Lady Flames over the years. Liberty is 178-50 (.781) all-time at the Vines Center, including 13-0 last season. The Lady Flames, 0-1 at the Vines Center in 2008-09, have 12 home games scheduled this season.

Liberty Versus Non-Conference Opposition

The Lady Flames are 1-4 to open the non-conference portion of their 2008-09 slate. Liberty is 261-289 all-time in non-conference outings.

Last season, Liberty went 15-3 versus non-conference opponents. The Lady Flames won all six of their non-conference home games in 2007-08.

Liberty's best-ever season against non-conference foes came in 1997-98, when the Lady Flames went 14-1 outside the Big South. Liberty's lone non-conference setback that season came to eventual national champion Tennessee in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

A Seasoned Bunch

Head coach Carey Green has the rare luxury of featuring six seniors on this season's roster--Alexandria Bream, Megan Frazee, Molly Frazee, Moriah Frazee, Rachel Hammond and Rebecca Lightfoot. The seniors have all started at least once during their career at Liberty, combining for 234 career starts.

The last time Liberty had six seniors was during the 1997-98 season. That year, Lisa Bateman, Erma Jackson, Mari Kong, Tiffany Ratcliff, Erin Wall and Flori Willie helped the Lady Flames record the only undefeated regular-season in program history. Liberty ended the year at 28-1, losing only to national champion Tennessee in the NCAA Tournament.

Tournament Time

Liberty could play as many as 10 tournament contests in 2008-09, not counting a possible NCAA Tournament appearance at season's end. The Lady Flames already competed in the Preseason WNIT and GW Thanksgiving Classic. They are still scheduled to participate in the Hokie Hardwood Classic (Dec. 29-30) and the Big South Women's Basketball Championship (March 13-15).

Tuesday's game against James Madison will actually be Liberty's first non-tournament contest of the year, after the Lady Flames opened up 1-4 in the Preseason WNIT and GW Thanksgiving Classic.

Dial Three Digits for Long Distance

Liberty has made only six total three-pointers in the first five games of the season. However, the Lady Flames have been able to continue a long-standing streak. The Lady Flames have made at least one three-pointer in a school-record 108 straight games, a run which began on Feb. 26, 2005. None of the current Lady Flames were in college when the streak began. Freshman Brittany Campbell, who kept the streak alive with a pair of triples at the GW Thanksgiving Classic, was a freshman at Brookville High School when the streak began.

Coming Through in the Clutch

Four of Liberty's first five contests this season have been decided by 10 points or less, and the Lady Flames are 1-3 in close games.

The Lady Flames were 9-2 in games decided by 10 points or less during the 2007-08 campaign.

Longest-Tenured Assistant Coaches

The 2008-09 season is Heather Stephens' sixth campaign as an assistant on Carey Green's coaching staff. She is now tied with Jeri (Wiley) Porter as the longest-tenured assistant coach in Liberty women's basketball history. Porter is now the head coach at George Mason. The Lady Flames have gone 124-40 and won four Big South titles during Stephens' tenure and made the "Sweet 16" of the 2005 NCAA Tournament.

Lady Flames Excel in the Classroom

Liberty has received national recognition numerous times for its work in the classroom. Last season, the Lady Flames tallied a 3.354 GPA, ranking 14th in the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Top 25 Team Honor Roll.

It was the third straight season and the fifth time in program history that Liberty has been included in the Top 25 Team Honor Roll. The Lady Flames were listed a program-best seventh in 2006-07 and tied for 14th in 2005-06. Liberty was rated 13th in 1999-2000, which was Carey Green's first season as head coach, and came in 12th during the 1998-99 campaign.

Liberty was one of only three teams to be included in last season's WBCA Top 25 Honor Roll and play in the NCAA Tournament, joining Kansas State and New Mexico.

Start Me Up

Head coach Carey Green used four different starting lineups in Liberty's 32 games last season. The most common starting five consisted of Allyson Fasnacht, Courtney Watkins, Megan Frazee, Rebecca Lightfoot and Moriah Frazee. The unit went 18-2 in their 20 games as a starting unit.

The Lady Flames' most successful grouping, which won all six games in 2007-08, featured Fasnacht, Watkins, Megan Frazee, Molly Frazee and Moriah Frazee.

This year, Liberty has used two different starting lineups already. Their most successful lineup--Rachel McLeod, Rachel Hammond, Megan Frazee, Moriah Frazee and Avery Warley--has gone 1-1.

Counting Up the Votes

Liberty was listed among the "Others Receiving Votes" in the Nov. 25 ESPN/USA Today Coaches Top 25 poll, for the third straight week, receiving one vote.

Last season, the Lady Flames regularly received votes in both national polls, but did not quite crack the Top 25. Liberty's most recent Top 25 ranking came in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll of the 2004-05 season. The Lady Flames were listed No. 21, after reaching the "Sweet 16" of the NCAA Tournament.

2008-09 Opponents in the National Rankings

Two of Liberty's 2008-09 opponents appear in the current Top 25 polls. Auburn is listed No. 14 in the AP Top 25 poll and fellow SEC member Vanderbilt is ranked No. 16 this week.

One other opponent is receiving votes in the national polls. Big South member Coastal Carolina (4 votes) was noted in the AP poll for the second straight week.

Liberty in the National Statistical Rankings

Liberty finished the 2007-08 season ranked among the nation's top 25 teams in six statistical categories. The Lady Flames ended up fourth in field goal percentage defense (.341), fifth in rebound margin (+10.2), seventh in scoring margin (+16.8), eighth in won-lost percentage (.875), 14th in field goal percentage (.459) and 15th in scoring defense (54.9 ppg).

The Lady Flames have ranked among the nation's top five teams in rebound margin for five consecutive seasons. Liberty led the nation in rebound margin in back-to-back seasons (2003-04 and 2004-05).

Lack of Overtime

Liberty has played only one overtime game in its last 151 outings, a 64-62 setback at High Point on Jan. 20, 2007.

The Lady Flames' most recent overtime victory came on Jan. 6, 2004, when Liberty defeated American, 76-72, on the road in double overtime. No current Lady Flame has won an overtime contest in college.

Liberty's most recent overtime contest at the Vines Center was a memorable one. The Lady Flames defeated Virginia, 77-69, in overtime on Nov. 26, 2002, to claim their first-ever win over the Cavaliers. It also marked Liberty's first win over a ranked opponent, as Virginia entered the game with a No. 25 national ranking.

Double the Fun

Megan Frazee's 28 points and 11 rebounds versus VCU on Nov. 14 gave the senior 37 career double-doubles, ranking second on the Lady Flames' career list during the NCAA Division I era. Katie Feenstra, now of the WNBA's Atlanta Dream, owns the program Division I record with 49 double-doubles.

Frazee's fellow seniors, Moriah Frazee and Rebecca Lightfoot, have crafted one double-double apiece during their time at Liberty.

The Container is Half Full

The Lady Flames went 9-0 last season when shooting 50 percent or higher. Liberty is now 49-0 in such contests under head coach Carey Green.

Big South Preseason Favorites

Triple the Trouble

Liberty sports the only set of triplets currently playing for the same NCAA Division I women's basketball team--seniors Megan, Molly and Moriah Frazee. Last season, the Frazees averaged 37.6 points and 19.0 rebounds per outing, good for 52.5 percent of the Lady Flames' total scoring output and 44.8 percent of the team's boards. Collectively, the Frazee triplets have totaled 2,782 career points and 1,470 career rebounds.

Megan, Molly and Moriah Frazee started together six times last season and have done so 14 times in their career. One of the Frazees led the Lady Flames in scoring in 30 out of 32 games during the 2007-08 campaign.

Miss Consistency

Megan Frazee has scored in double figures in each of her last 46 games, dating back to Jan. 27, 2007. It is the longest such streak of her career and the longest by a Liberty player since Elena Kisseleva tallied 10 or more points in 62 straight contests, spanning the 1996-97, 1997-98 and 1998-99 seasons.

Frazee has only scored nine or fewer points on four occasions at Liberty, and has never done so in consecutive outings.

Clamping Down on Defense

The Lady Flames have held 56 consecutive opponents under 50 percent field goal shooting. The last Liberty foe to sink more than half of its field goal attempts was Marist, at the Maryland Terrapin Classic on Dec. 29, 2006.

Liberty is off to a good start defensively in 2008-09. Three of the Lady Flames' first five opponents shot below 40 percent from the floor. Liberty ranks second in the Big South with a .364 opponents' field goal percentage.

A Short Commute

Freshman guard Brittany Campbell attended high school literally right down the street from Liberty University at Brookville High School. She is the first Lynchburg-area player to suit up for the Lady Flames since Tekita Butler in the 2002-03 season.

Lofty RPI

Liberty finished the 2007-08 season ranked No. 31 in the NCAA's official RPI listing. The Lady Flames were listed ahead of numerous notable women's basketball programs, including Georgia (No. 32), Arizona State (No. 35), Minnesota (No. 37) and Ohio State (No. 40).

The Lady Flames were the fifth-highest ranked team from a non-BCS football conference, trailing only Old Dominion (No. 9), UTEP (No. 18), Marist (No. 25) and Western Kentucky (No. 30).

An Outstanding Opener

Megan Frazee tallied a game-high 28 points against VCU on Nov. 14, marking the most points she has ever scored in a season-opening game. It was also the most points tallied by a Lady Flame in a season opener since Nov. 23, 1996, when freshman Elena Kisseleva dropped 30 markers on Bluefield in an 89-45 Liberty victory at the Vines Center.

A Lucky 13

As a result of Megan Frazee's big performance versus VCU, which also included a game-high 11 rebounds, she was tabbed this season's inaugural Big South Women's Basketball Player of the Week. It is the 13th time in Frazee's career she has captured the conference's weekly honor.

Only former Liberty standout Katie Feenstra has collected more Big South Women's Basketball Player of the Week awards in conference history. Feenstra finished her Liberty career with 15 weekly plaques.

Anything You Can Do ...

Last season, Megan Frazee became the 11th player in program history to score 1,000 career points, eclipsing the magical mark at North Carolina on Dec. 30, 2007. This year, she could get some company from within her own family. Sister Moriah Frazee enters the James Madison contest with 873 points, leaving her 127 shy of 1,000.

If Frazee scores at her current season average of 9.8 points per contest, she is due to hit the milestone on Jan. 24, during the Lady Flames' home game with Charleston Southern.

Frazee is also climbing Liberty's career rebounding chart. She currently ranks 23rd in program history with 473 boards, leaving her six behind Flori Willie for the 22nd spot.

The Frazees would not be the first sister duo to score over 1,000 points at Liberty. Sharon and Sarah Wilkerson, who graduated in 2000, totaled 1,733 and 1,331 points, respectively.

First Time Since Feenstra

Redshirt freshman Avery Warley established a pair of career highs during Liberty's Nov. 21 victory over UC Riverside, coming up with 11 rebounds and four blocked shots. In the process, she became the first Liberty to tally at least 10 rebounds and four blocks in the same contest since the final game of Katie Feenstra's brilliant Liberty career. The 6-8 Feenstra, now of the WNBA's Atlanta Dream, notched 12 rebounds and four blocks versus No. 1 seed LSU in the "Sweet 16" of the NCAA Tournament, on March 26, 2005.

Finding a Way in the 40s

Remarkably, Liberty is 2-1 over the past two seasons, when scoring fewer than 50 points in a game. Most recently, the Lady Flames defeated UC Riverside by a 45-44 score, last Friday. Last season, Liberty posted a 45-38 home triumph over Richmond on Jan. 5, 2008.

Challenging Schedule

On paper, Liberty's 2008-09 schedule appeared to be one of the most difficult in program history. So far, it is living up to expectations. The Lady Flames' first five opponents (VCU, UC Riverside, Western Carolina, Hartford and South Alabama) are a combined 17-11 on the year.

Liberty battled back from a 21-4 deficit in its season opener to take a pair of second-half leads. However, visiting VCU edged the Lady Flames, 59-57, in a first-round Preseason WNIT contest, as Radoslava Bachvarova drained three free throws with just 2.1 seconds left. VCU tallied the evening's first 12 points, before Megan Frazee canned a one-handed floater from six feet, at the 14:10 mark of the opening half. The Rams later notched nine straight points, bolstering their advantage to 21-4 at 10:48. Liberty limited VCU to one field goal over the final 4:20 of the opening stanza, running off an 11-2 surge in the meantime and closing the gap to 31-27 at the intermission. Megan Frazee finally gave Liberty its initial lead of the contest, 45-44, draining a three-pointer from the right wing at the 11:02 mark. The Lady Flames' next lead did not come until 4:30 remained on the game clock, when Megan Frazee found Avery Warley for an open layup. Warley's basket was part of a 7-0 Liberty burst. Megan Frazee's reverse layup at 3:11 capped the run, increasing the Lady Flames' lead to 54-51. VCU came back to tie things up again, 54-54, when Quanitra Hollingsworth split a pair of free throws with 2:18 remaining, setting the stage for a frenetic final minute of play. Mays put Liberty on top, 56-54, with a driving layup at the 44-second mark, before Hollingsworth answered with a hoop from in close, 10 seconds later.
