The Game

The Liberty University Flames (33-14, 11-7 Big South) host the Tribe of William and Mary (16-27, 9-18 CAA) in a non-conference contest at Worthington Stadium on Saturday, May 6. First pitch is set for 2 p.m.

The Series Against William & Mary

Saturday will be the 39th meeting between the Flames and the Tribe on the diamond. With Liberty's win earlier this season, the all-time series between the two teams is tied, 19-19. Earlier this season, Liberty defeated William and Mary, 15-4, at Plumeri Park on March 5.

Last season, the Flames won the lone game between the two teams at Worthington Stadium, 6-2, on May 7. The scheduled contest between the teams at Plumeri Park was rained out.

The Last Time Out

The Flames fell at Virginia Tech, 8-3 Wednesday night at English Field in Blacksburg, Va. Liberty was held to five hits on the evening. First baseman Aaron Grijalva was 2-for-3 with two doubles, a RBI and a run scored for the Flames.

The Flames on the Radio

This season, the Flames Sports Network plans to broadcast 20 Liberty baseball regular season games. Games will be aired live on WWMC 90.9 FM "The Light" and online on the World Wide Web at www.thelightonline.com. The next LIVE broadcast is scheduled for this afternoon as the Flames square off with the Tribe. The broadcast is set to begin 1:50 p.m.

The Coaches

Saturday will be the second meeting between Liberty head coach Matt Royer and William and Mary head coach Frank Leoni with their respective teams ...

Liberty: Matt Royer (Liberty, '80)

Record at School: 111-100 (Fourth Year)

Overall Record: 429-337 (16 Years)

Notes: Matt Royer is in his fourth year at the helm of the alma mater ... for the second straight season has guided the Flames to 30-win seasons ... on Wednesday, April 5, Royer picked up his 100th victory as Liberty head coach as the Flames downed William and Mary, 15-4 ... on February 21, he won his 400th career game as a head coach when the Flames defeated Longwood, 4-3 ... Liberty is coming off a 2005 season which saw them post 36 wins, tying the most victories at the Division I level in the program's history ... over his first three seasons, the Liberty win total has improved by eight or more games each season ... in his first season as the Flames skipper, Royer led the sixth-seeded Flames into the 2002 Big South Championship game ... prior to his stint at Liberty, he had a nine-year run at Kutztown (Pa.) where he guided the Golden Bears to the Division II College World Series during his last two seasons.

William & Mary: Frank Leoni (Rhode Island, '90)

Record at School: 16-27 (First Year)

Overall Record: 273-460-3 (14 Years)

Notes: Leoni is in his first season at William and Mary after 13 years as the head coach at his alma mater, Rhode Island ... left Rhode Island as the all-time winningest coach in school history ... the past three seasons, he had lead the Rams to three straight Atlantic-10 East Division Championships and last season, saw his team post a school-high 35 wins as Rhode Island won the A-10 title and captured the school's first-ever NCAA tournament berth

Returning to their Alma Mater

The Liberty coaching staff led by head coach Matt Royer, along with assistant coaches Randy Tomlin, Terry Weaver and Reggie Reynolds, is a rarity in Division I baseball. All four are graduates of Liberty University.

Royer received his degree in 1980. Tomlin finished up at Liberty in 1988. Weaver and Reynolds each received their bachelor's from Liberty in 1998. All four played for the Flames on the baseball diamond.

Flames at Worthington Stadium

Over the last 26 years, the Flames have called Worthington Stadium their home. The Flames have compiled an impressive 450-202-4 record at home for a winning percentage of .689 since its inception in 1974. Under head coach Matt Royer, the Flames are proving the stadium to be even tougher for opponents, having posted a 81-35 record (.698) during Royer's four years at the helm. With their victory over Coastal Carolina at the stadium on Sunday, Liberty is 20-6 (.769) at Worthington Stadium this season.

Last season, Liberty was 24-5 at Worthington Stadium. The Flames' 24 wins were the most ever by a Liberty team at the stadium.

Liberty on the Road

The Flames are 13-8 on the road this season. Their win on Sunday, April 9th at Radford was Liberty's 10th on the road in 2006, one more than last season. In 2005, the Flames went 9-12 on the road in 21 games.

The Flames are scheduled to play three more games away from Worthington Stadium as they finish their regular season road schedule with a Big South three-game weekend series at UNC Asheville, May 12-14.

Liberty has compiled a 187-159 record against current members of the Big South. The Flames have also compiled a 27-16 record in Big South Championship games over the same span.

Flames Among Nation's Leaders

Of the nation's 293 Division I baseball teams, Liberty and 21 other teams have 33 or more wins this season. #1-ranked North Carolina and #12 Virginia lead the nation with 39 wins.

The Flames also show up among the national leaders with a winning percentage of .717 which is currently the 24th best winning percentage in the country. #3-ranked Nebraska, the Big 12 Conference leader, currently has the nation's top winning percentage at .854.

As a team, Liberty ranks among the top 50 in the nation in the following categories (out of 285 teams - as of 4/30):

It's Been Two Years

The Flames have gone 125 games and over two years without being shutout. The last time a Liberty team was shutout was April 10, 2004. Winthrop's Jeff Reeves gave up just three hits in seven innings, and Jonathan Settle and Chris Leroux allowed no hits over the final two innings in shutting out the Flames, 6-0.

During the span, the Flames' mound staff has pitched six shutouts including three this season.

However, this past weekend the Flames were held to one run in back-to-back games as Birmingham-Southern allowed Liberty one run in both Friday and Saturday's games. The Flames had also scored one run only once in a loss at Winthrop on March 24 in 2006, while in 2005, they scored only one run on two occasions in a 1-0 victory over Fairfield on March 9 and the last game of the season in a 2-1 setback to Coastal Carolina on May 27 at the Big South Baseball Championship.

Winning the Close Ones

This season, the Flames are 10-4 in one run games with their 4-3 12 inning win over Coastal Carolina Monday afternoon.

Its record in one-run games was one of the keys to Liberty's strong start to the year. Six of the Flames' first 10 games were decided by one run as Liberty went 5-1 in those games.

A factor in last season's improvement by the Flames was their record in one-run games; a noticeable difference from 2004. Liberty went 10-4 (.714) in one-run games in 2005. In 2004, the Flames went 6-7 (.462) in one-run games.

Liberty opened 2005 by winning its first seven one-run games and went until late April, the 37th game of the season, until dropping its first one-run decision, a 9-8 defeat at Coastal Carolina on April 24th.

Going Extras

This season, the Flames have played four extra inning games, surpassing last year's total of two for all of 2005.

Liberty split back-to-back extra inning games with Coastal Carolina this past weekend. Sunday, the Flames fell 8-6 in 10 innings, while Monday, they rallied for a 4-3 victory in 12 innings.

Liberty dropped a decision to VCU, 4-2, in 10 innings, in their first extra innings game on February 15, while on February 26th, the Flames defeated Rider, 3-2, in 12 innings.

Last season, Liberty played only two extra inning games in 56 games. The Flames won both, defeating Marshall 4-3 in 10 innings on March 13 and Charleston Southern 3-2 in 12 innings on May 22.

Five Alive

Five seems to be the Flames number this season. When allowing an opponent five runs or less, Liberty is 26-3, compared to 7-11 when failing to do so. On the other side, the Flames are 26-7 when scoring five or more runs this season, while posting a 7-7 mark when scoring four or less. In addition, five is also alive as Liberty is 28-6 when leading or tied after five innings and are 5-8 when trailing after five.

Liberty By The Month

Liberty won its last game of April to finish the month with a 14-5 mark. The Flames started the month by winning their first seven games, before dropping a contest in the month. In 2005, Liberty went 8-8 as the team battled for position in May's Big South Conference Baseball Championship during the fourth month of the year.

With their victory on April 11 over James Madison, the Flames won more games this season in the fourth month of the year than last season. Liberty also won nine consecutive games in the month to tie the school's Division I record for most consecutive wins for the second time this year.

The Flames have started off May with a setback in their only contest of the month. Last season, Liberty finished the season strong by going 12-4 in the last month of the season and 6-2 in the Big South.

The Flames finished the month of March by winning their last two games to run their record to 12-6 for the month. After falling in the first game of March, Liberty ran off nine straight wins for its longest winning streak of the season during the month. On Saturday, March 11, the Flames won for the 10th time in the third month of 2006, defeating Rutgers, 5-3, to surpass last season's March victory total. Last season, Liberty was 9-6 in March.

For the second year in a row, the Flames staked themselves to a good start to their season in the month of February, posting a 7-2 mark in nine games in the year's second month. The Flames won seven of their eight games in the month of February (7-1) to open the 2005 season.

Baseball in the Commonwealth

Thirteen Division I teams call the Commonwealth of Virginia home. This season, the Flames are scheduled to face opponents from the Commonwealth 20 times. Liberty has posted an 14-4 mark in 18 games against Virginia schools. Liberty has defeated in-state foes Longwood three times, George Mason twice, Virginia Tech, James Madison and William and Mary, all in mid-week non-conference contests, while sweeping three-game series from Big South Conference foes VMI and Radford. The Flames scheduled game against Virginia on March 21 was canceled due to inclement weather.

After today's game, Liberty will face its last opponent from the Commonwealth on Wednesday, May 16 as they host Richmond, who they will play for the second time this season in a mid-week game.

Liberty Reaches 30 Wins Again

With their 6-4 win over Coastal Carolina in the completion of a suspended game on Sunday, April 23, the Flames reached 30 wins in a season for the 12th time in the program's 32-year history. Of the 12, eight have come at the Division I level.

In addition, it is the first time under head coach Matt Royer and the fourth time in Liberty history that the Flames have posted back-to-back 30-win seasons.

Last season, Liberty reached the milestone 30-victory mark for the first time under Royer. On May 17, the Flames won their 30th game of the season in a 10-2 over Richmond at Worthington Stadium in their 47th game of the year. This season, Liberty captured their 30th win in their 40th game.

The 2006 and 2005 teams joined the 2002 and 2001, the 2001 and 2000 and the 1980 and 1981 squads as back-to-back 30-win season teams. Liberty has also had three straight 30-win seasons once in program history as the 2002, 2001 and 2000 teams all won over 30 games.

Winning Streak Ties Division I School Mark For Second Time

For the second time this season, the Flames won nine straight contests tying the Division I school record for the second time. Liberty went from March 29-April 14 without a setback.

The Flames earlier this season tied the school's NCAA Division I record for most consecutive wins with nine straight victories from March 4 to March 17. The mark was also set by both the 1985 and 1995 Flames.

Liberty moved to NCAA Division I baseball competition for the 1984 season. The all-time program record is 15 consecutive wins set in 1976.

Hitting primed the streak as Liberty has reached season-highs in hits twice and scored a season-high 16 runs twice during the nine games. On Saturday, April 1, the Flames scored 16 runs on 19 hits in a 16-8 win over VMI and followed it up this past Friday by banging out 20 hits in a 16-6 win at Radford.

During the streak, Liberty batted .385 as a team and scored 102 runs, an average of 11.3 runs per games. The Flames also saw their team batting average go from .280 to .309.

The nine consecutive wins are the most under head coach Matt Royer in his four years at Liberty. Last season, the Flames won eight straight to close out the 2005 regular season and open the Big South Championship.

Royer's Runners

Liberty entered week, the leaders in the Big South Conference in stolen bases with 85. The Flames rank 25th in the nation in stolen bases per game as they have averaged 1.85 steals per game.

Through 47 games, the Flames have taken advantage of their team speed as Liberty has 36 more stolen bases in 2006 than at this point in season last year.

With two more stolen bases at Virginia Tech, the Flames are now averaging almost two stolen bases per game (1.85) as they have swiped 87 bases in 104 attempts in 2006.

Last season, Liberty had 51 stolen bases in 66 attempts through 47 games (less than 1.14 per game). The Flames finished the 2005 season with 63 stolen bases in 81 attempts.

Leading the way for the Flames is first baseman Aaron Grijalva with 19 stolen bases. The redshirt sophomore has yet to be caught this season and entered the week fifth in the conference in the category. Third baseman Chad Miller follows with 17 steals, while Patrick Gaillard has swiped 14 bases. Both Miller and Gaillard are also among the Big South leaders in the category.

Flames Come Out Swinging in April

Batting .280 at the start of the month, the Flames have found their stride at the plate in April. As a team, Liberty has hit .364 in the fourth month of the year; raising their team batting average to a season-high .318. The hot hitting has helped the Flames to go 14-5 in the month.

The Flames have reached double-digits in hits in 17 of their 19 contests in April and on Tuesday, April 25 had a season-high 22 hits at George Mason. The hitting has lead Liberty to score double-digits in runs eight times.

Abe Yeakel, Michael Just and Chad Miller each hit over .400 for the month.

The Flames entered the week leading the in the Big South Conference in runs scored and second in batting average and hits.

Thompson Recieves Liberty's Highest Athletic Honor

Senior right-hander Phillip Thompson along with senior woman's soccer goalkeeper Sonia Rodriguez have been named the 2006 Rock Royer/Mack Rivera Award winners, the University's highest athletics honor.

In 1975, the Rock Royer/Mac Rivera Award was established to honor the top senior student-athlete at Liberty University who best exemplifies the standards and lives of both of these great Christian men.

The award, which encompasses more than just athletic ability, is based on an individual's testimony as well as their academic performance as it recognizes the Liberty University senior student-athlete who maintains an exemplary testimony on the playing field, in the classroom and among the student body and the community.

Thompson, who will be graduating in May with a 3.55 GPA in mathematics, has served on the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee and represented the group at the Big South Conference level. The honors student is a two-time Big South Presidential Honor Roll student and has been named to the University's Dean List four times.

On the baseball diamond, the three-year letterwinner has lead the team in saves the past two seasons. Currently a starter, he ranks fourth in the Big South and third on the teams in wins. After becoming a starter, the Ringgold, Va. native was undefeated in the role through his first eight starts, picking five wins and not factoring in the decision in three. He ranks sixth in the conference in innings pitched with 74 and is also among the Big South strikeout leaders with 57. In addition to his 6-4 mark, he has four saves which rank him third in the conference in that category.

Laurent Sets All-Time LU Doubles Mark

With a double in his first at-bat Friday against Birmingham-Southern, Phillip Laurent became the all-time career doubles leader in Liberty history with 57 career doubles. On Tuesday, he added another to move his career total to 58 two-base hits.

The senior entered his final season with the Flames needing 16 doubles to pass former Flames' outfielder Steve Baker, who hit 56 doubles from 1999-2002. The two outfielders both hit their season-high of 18 doubles as a sophomores, leading their squads.

Laurent has 17 doubles this season to lead the Flames and entered the week third in the Big South the category. In his four seasons with the Flames, he has reached double digits in doubles each season.

In addition, with 49 RBI, Laurent currently ranks 5th all-time in Liberty history with 157 career RBI. He is two RBI away from taking over the 4th spot on the career list and enters the week ranked 3rd in the Big South in RBI.

The left-fielder also ranks 2nd all-time with 249 hits. The senior enters the weekend 13 hits shy of Larry Wayne York, a former teammate of Laurent, the all-time Liberty career hit leader with 262 in his four years from 2000-03.

Back-to-Back Jacks as Flames Hit Season-High Four Home Runs

Designated hitter David Giammaresi and catcher Errol Hollinger hit back-to-back home runs in the fourth inning as Liberty hit four home runs, a season-high, in an 18-4 victory at George Mason Tuesday, April 26. Besides the back-to-back home runs, P.K. Keller also hit a solo home run in the fourth. Aaron Grijalva later hit a two-run home run in the eighth inning.

Giammaresi's two-run homer and Hollinger's solo blast were the first back-to-back home runs by the Flames since Grijalva and Laurent hit back-to-back solo home runs in the eighth inning of 5-4 setback to Radford at Worthington Stadium on May 13, 2005.

Before Tuesday, Liberty had hit three home runs in a game four times this season. The Flames hit three home runs in Big South games against VMI (March 31) and Charleston Southern (April 15), while hitting three round trippers twice in a three-game series at George Washington. Liberty hit a trio of home runs on Friday (March 10) and followed with three more on Sunday (March 12).

Miller Named Big South Player of the Week

Liberty senior third baseman Chad Miller (Wheat Ridge, Colo.) has been selected as the Big South Conference Choice Hotels Baseball Player of the Week for games played April 18-24.

Miller batted .619 (13-21) in five games last week, leading Liberty to three victories and a Big South series win over Coastal Carolina. He opened the week hitting for the cycle in his first four at-bats in an 8-0 win over Longwood.

The third baseman then hit .538 (7-13) against the Chanticleers, including three doubles, three runs, three runs batted in and three walks, while posting three hits each in games one and two vs. Coastal Carolina. For the week, Miller had a .704 OBA, 23 total bases and a 1.095 slugging percentage, in addition to eight runs scored, six RBI, five doubles, one triple, one home run, five walks and four multi-hit games.

Flames Tabbed Fourth in Big South Preseason Baseball Poll

Liberty has been picked to finish fourth in the Big South Conference this season in the league's annual preseason baseball poll as voted on by the conference's head coaches and Sports Information Directors.

Defending Big South champion Winthrop was chosen as the team to beat this season, while Eagles pitcher/infielder Heath Rollins was voted the conference's Preseason Player of the Year.

The Flames, coming off a 36-19 mark, which tied the school record for most Division I victories in a season, in 2005 and the first 30-win season under four-year head coach Matt Royer, received one first-place vote and 112 points in being selected fourth.

Winthrop received 12 first-place votes and 156 points in being tabbed first. The Eagles were followed by Coastal Carolina, who received four first-place votes and 140 points, and Birmingham-Southern, who received a first-place vote and 127 points. After Liberty in fourth, VMI was selected fifth (72) with Charleston Southern being tabbed sixth (64). High Point (59), Radford (42) and UNC Asheville (38) rounded out the conference voting.

Rollins finished with 12 first place votes and 45 points in being picked the conference's Preseason Player of the year. He was followed by VMI's Kelly Sweppenhiser (18 points and two first-place votes), the Flames' Aaron Grijalva (17 points and two first-place votes) and Birmingham-Southern's Brandon Hynick (17 points and two first-place votes).

2005 Flames Tie School Record For Wins; Notch Most Wins Under Royer

With their win over Radford in the 2005 Big South Baseball Championship, Liberty tied the school mark for most victories at the Division I level. The win total ties the 2000 Liberty squad. The record for wins is 40 set in 1983 at the NAIA level.

The win total was the most wins in head coach Matt Royer's three years at the helm of his alma mater and the first time the Flames have reached or passed the milestone 30-victory mark in his tenure.

On May 17, the Flames won their 30th game of the season in a 10-2 over Richmond at Worthington Stadium. It was the 11th 30 win season in the program's history. Of the 11, seven have come at the Division I level.

Making Their Mark in 2005

Not only did the Flames tied the program record for victories at the Division I level with 36, but Matt Royer's squad posted other all-time school marks in 2005.

The Flames had the best fielding percentage in the history of the program as the 2005 squad set the all-time record for fewest errors (62) in a season and had the highest fielding percentage in school history (.971).

The pitching staff also got into the act, recording the second lowest ERA (4.10) since Liberty moved to the Division I level in 1984.

Individually, Michael Solbach pitched five complete games, the most by a freshman pitcher in school history.

After the season, first baseman Aaron Grijalva became the third Flame to be named a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American by the Collegiate Baseball News.
