The Game

The Liberty University Flames (6-9, 0-1 Big South) return home to take on the Radford Highlanders (5-11, 0-1 Big South) at the Vines Center (8,500) in Lynchburg, Va., on January 9, 2007. Tip-off is set for 7 p.m. EST.

The Coaches

Flames' head coach Randy Dunton is currently in his sixth year overall as head coach of the Liberty basketball program. He served as the interim head coach during the 1997-98 season and was named full-time head coach prior to the 2002-03 campaign. Dunton has posted a 58-76 record since returning to Liberty, which includes two second-place finishes in the Big South and a share of the regular-season title in 2004 en route to the program's second-ever trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Byron Samuels is in his fifth year as head coach at Radford. Samuels brings a 55-76 career record at Radford into tonight's contest.

In his first season, Samuels led RU to its fourth appearance in the Big South Championship finals in six years. The Highlanders upset third-seeded Charleston Southern on its home floor, 65-62 and then upset second-seeded Liberty on its home floor three days later, 55-52.

The Flames opened up their 2006-07 home schedule with six-straight wins. The last time the Flames won six-straight home games was during the 2003-04 season when Liberty won 13-straight home games, culminating with the Big South Championship victory over High Point (89-44) on March 6, 2004. The Flames won 13-straight contests at the Vines Center after losing their home opener to Miami (OH) (55-71) on Nov. 21, 2003.

Losing Streak

The Flames are on their first losing streak, of the season (eight games) after dropping their most recent game at UNC Asheville on Saturday.

Dunton's Best Start

Liberty's 6-1 start was the best under Randy Dunton. Liberty's previous best start under Dunton came during his first season at the helm when the team opened the 2002-03 season with a 4-2 mark.

Six-Game Winning Streak

A Larry Blair First

Larry Blair fouled out for the first time in his career on Dec. 21 against Lipscomb. It took 101 games for Blair to foul out of a game.

McLean Second Big South In Rebounding

Alex McLean currently leads the Big South Conference in rebounds with 8.6 boards per game.

McLean has grabbed at least 10 rebounds in a game six times, which leads the Big South.

Lipscomb Game Is A Special Night For Brewington

Junior Dwight Brewington is one of three players at the Division I level who plays with some sort of hearing impairment. Brewington has 60 percent hearing loss in both ears and plays with hearing aids. Ryan Daniel of Lipscomb and Chris Devine of UC Santa Barbara join Brewington on this short list. Daniel is completely deaf and uses hearing aids, and Devine is deaf in one ear.

The Dec. 21 against Lipscomb presented a unique situation as Brewington and Daniel had the chance to meet on the court. Daniel did not play, while Brewington scored 17 points and grabbed 10 rebounds.

Brewington Debuts

Junior Dwight Brewington made his Flames' debut on Dec. 16 at St. Francis (Pa.). Brewington sat out the first seven games due to the NCAA transfer rule. Brewington came to Liberty via Providence where he averaged 13.3 points a game as a sophomore, earning Preseason NIT all-tournament honors in 2004.

Brewington scored 16 points, grabbed five rebounds, dished out three assists and snared three steals against the Red Flash during his first game in a Liberty uniform.

Opponents Getting Hot From The Field

Eight of the last 12 halves the Flames have allowed their opponent to shoot better than 50 percent from the field, including seven-straight halves.

The Flames started the season with opponents only shooting better than 50 percent from the field in three of 18 halves.

B.J. Jenkins Named Big South New Balance Freshman of the Week

Jenkins earned the honor for the week of Nov. 27-Dec. 3 when he averaged 14.0 points, 3.0 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 2.5 steals in Liberty's two wins, including a 64-56 victory over East Carolina. He shot 64.3 percent from the field (9-of-14), 42.9 percent from long range (3-of-7) and 77.8 from the line (7-of-9). Jenkins scored a career-high 16 points versus Southern Virginia and added 12 points versus East Carolina. Against the Pirates, Jenkins also grabbed three rebounds, dished out three assists and notched three steals in 21 minutes off the bench.

McLean Collecting Double-Doubles

Under the direction of head coach Randy Dunton, the Flames have posted a 16-21 record during the month of January. Overall, Liberty has posted a 137-175 record, 88-53 at home, 45-119 on the road and 4-3 at a neutral location during the month.

This Date In Liberty History

The Flames have posted a 6-4 record on the 9th of January. In 2003 the Flames beat High Point, 74-70. In 1999, Liberty lost to UNC Asheville, 77-72. In 1995, Liberty won at Towson State, 72-59. In 1993, the Flames lost in overtime at Coastal Carolina, 66-65. In 1992, the Flames won at Campbell, 73-71. In 1989, Liberty lost at St. Francis (Pa.), 90-74. In 1984, the Flames won at Webber, 69-66. In 1982, the Flames beat Belmont Abbey, 69-60. In 1979, Liberty beat Lancaster Bible, 64-53. In 1977, Liberty lost to Olivet Nazarene, 110-82.

Liberty's Offensive Output

Liberty's first two victories of the year marked the first time since the 1992-93 season the Flames have posted back-to-back 30-point wins. The last time that Liberty accomplished the feat, the Flames downed Averett (111-53) and Covenant (96-59) on Dec. 7 and 12, 1992.

Those games also marked the last time the Flames scored 90 points or more in back-to-back games.

Liberty's Offensive Output, Part 2

For the first time in the program's history, Liberty won three-straight games by at least 30 points. Liberty defeated Cincinnati Christian, 101-65, on Nov. 21. Liberty defeated Houghton, 92-46, on Nov. 25. Liberty defeated Southern Virginia, 109-65, on Nov. 27.

A Couple Firsts Against East Carolina

Dec. 2 marked the first time Liberty has beaten East Carolina in the history of the series. The Pirates were victorious in the five previous meetings until Liberty's 64-56 triumph at the Vines Center. The victory also marked the first time Liberty has defeated a team from Conference USA.

Flames Heating Up The Furnace

Nov. 27 marked the first time since the 1987-88 season the Flames have scored at least 90 points in three-straight games, when they accomplished the feat over a four-game span. During the span, the Flames lost to Mount St. Mary's, 105-101, on March 4, 1988. Liberty defeated Ferrum, 104-79, on Feb.26. Liberty beat West Virginia Wesleyan on Feb. 23, 1988, 117-97, and the streak started on Feb. 20, 1988 when Bluefield beat Liberty, 100-97.

Blair Looks To Move Up Liberty Scoring Lists

Larry Blair needs 79 points to jump over Mark Chafin and into sole possession of third place on the Liberty all-time scoring list.

Scoring 100

When the Flames defeated Cincinnati Christian on Nov. 21, 101-65, it was the first time that Liberty reached the century mark in points since Dec. 12, 1992, when Liberty defeated Averett, 111-53.







Scoring 100, Part 2

The Flames have reached the century mark twice this season with wins over Cincinnati Christian (101-65) and Southern Virginia (109-64). The last time Liberty scored at least 100 points in a game twice in one season was the 1991-92 season. Liberty beat Methodist (109-65) on Dec. 3, 1991 and George Mason (100-89) on Dec. 21, 1991.

Liberty Assisting Each Other

As a team the Flames are dishing out 3.6 more assists per game this season than last year. The Flames are averaging 14.0 assists per game this year which places them sixth in the Big South.

Last year, Liberty finished last in the Big South with 10.4 assists per game.

Liberty Picked To Finish Fifth In Big South

For the second-consecutive year, Winthrop was the unanimous selection as preseason favorites in the annual Big South Preseason Basketball Poll among the 30 voters. The Eagles were the conference's regular-season and tournament champion last year following a league-best 23-8 overall record and 13-3 mark in Big South games. Coastal Carolina, last year's regular-season and tournament runner-up, finished second in the voting with 187 points, just five points ahead of No. 3 High Point (182). Charleston Southern, which has reached the Advance Auto Parts Men's Basketball Championship semifinals the past two years, was predicted to finish fourth (121), while Liberty placed fifth in the voting (117). UNC Asheville was predicted sixth (100), followed by Radford (seventh) and VMI (eighth).

Blair Named To BYU Holiday Classic All-Tournament Team

Larry Blair was named to the 2006 BYU Holiday Classic all-tournament team. The four-team tournament was played Dec. 28-30 and featured host Brigham Young, Liberty, Oral Roberts and Seton Hall.

Blair averaged 20.0 points and 3.5 rebounds per game during the three-day event at the Marriott Center on the Brigham Young campus in Provo, Utah.

Blair made quite the impression on his opponents during the tournament. "Larry Blair is one of the toughest players we've played against all year. Blair hit some of the toughest shots I've seen. There may be a spot for him in the leagues ahead," said Oral Roberts Head Coach Scott Sutton.

Making the List

Larry Blair earned preseason honors in seven different 2006 publications. Blair was named to the collegeinsider.com Mid-Major Preseason All-American Team. The guard also was selected Athlon Sports Big South Preseason Player of the Year along with being named to the Athlon Sports Big South Preseason Team, Big South Conference Preseason Team, CBS Sportsline.com Big South Preseason Team, Lindy's Big South Preseason Second Team, Sporting News Big South Preseason Team and Street & Smith's Big South Preseason Team.

Larry Blair A Scoring Machine

During Larry Blair's career, he has scored at least 20 points in 44 of his 106 games. Blair has scored at least 15 points in 67 out of 106 career games and has tallied double figures in 35- straight





contests and 48 of his last 49 games.

Blair's Back On The Big South Team

For the third-straight season, guard Larry Blair was named to the Big South Preseason All-Conference team as he was one of five players named to the preseason all-conference squad. He was joined by Coastal Carolina's Jack Leasure, High Point's Arizona Reid and Winthrop's Torrell Martin and Craig Bradshaw, with Martin being named the league's Preseason Player of the Year.

Blair, who received five first-place votes and 86 total points, has earned all-conference honors all of his three seasons at Liberty, including first-team accolades the past two years. He was second in overall conference scoring last season at 22.6 and averaged a league-high 24.2 points in 16 Big South games. He was one of only two players to rank in eight-or-more different conference statistical categories. Blair scored 20-or-more points in a game a league-high 18 times, including six 30-point efforts, and he entered the 2006-07 season 12th in Big South history with 1,580 career points – 572 away from breaking the conference all-time scoring record.

Brewington Named Big South's Top Newcomer

Dwight Brewington was named the Top Newcomer to the Big South by Street & Smith's and CBS Sportsline.com. The Providence transfer averaged 13.3 points per game for the Friars as a sophomore during the 2004-05 season.

New to the Game

Junior college transfer Alex McLean came to Liberty via Suffolk Community College. The two years he spent at Suffolk in Long Island, N.Y., were the first years of organized basketball the Bay Shore, N.Y., native has played. McLean did not play basketball in high school. In his first game with the Flames, McLean scored 13 points and grabbed eight rebounds at Oklahoma on Nov. 16. McLean has reached double figures in points in every game but against Florida and is averaging 13.3 ppg and 8.6 rbg so far this season.

Only 6-2 as a high school senior, McLean played bass, piano and drums in the Bay Shore High School band.

McLean Breaks Vines Center Records

Junior Alex McLean's 17 rebounds on December 21 versus Lipscomb broke a three-way tie for most rebounds in a game at the Vines Center. McLean previously shared the record after grabbing 15 rebounds on Nov. 21 versus Cincinnati Christian. Peter Aluma grabbed 15 boards against Drake on Dec. 5, 1996 and Parish Hickman collected 15 rebounds against Towson State on Feb. 11, 1993.

McLean's 13 defensive rebounds versus Lipscomb also broke a Vines Center record which was previously held by Julius Nwosu when he grabbed 11 versus Campbell on Feb. 6, 1993.

Blair, in his fourth career collegiate game, faced #2 Duke in the Great Alaska Shootout on Nov. 28, 2003, scoring five points in 25 minutes of action.

Blair faced #1-seed St. Joseph's on Mar. 18, 2004 in the first round of the 2004 NCAA Tournament, scoring nine points in 33 minutes of action.

Liberty Men's Hoops To Participate In 2007 Great Alaska Shootout

Liberty is one of eight teams which will take part in the 2007 Carrs/Safeway Great Alaska Shootout scheduled for Nov. 20-24 at Anchorage's Sullivan Arena. In addition to Liberty, the eight-team field features host Alaska Anchorage, Butler, Gonzaga, Michigan, Texas Tech, Washington State and Western Kentucky.

This will be the Flames' second appearance at the Great Alaska Shootout. In 2003 the Flames went 1-2 at the event, scoring a 65-48 victory against Canisius in the opening round before falling to No. 2 Duke, in the second round and Seton Hall in the third round.

"This Great Alaska Shootout field is certainly one of the strongest in recent years," said head coach Randy Dunton. "The elite status of these programs will provide a fabulous experience for our team."

"The positives from competing against these programs will be a catalyst for our team's performance level," added Dunton.

Dunton returns to Anchorage, where he began his coaching career in prolific fashion at the high school ranks, accumulating a career record of 127-36, good for a .779 winning percentage. He won a pair of state championships and his teams finished as state runner-up twice at Anchorage Christian between 1985-88. In 1989, Dunton led West Anchorage to the AAAA State Championship game with a 22-8 record before coming to Liberty as an assistant coach in 1990.

"It is an honor for me to have the opportunity to return to Anchorage and to have our Liberty University Flames be part of such a prestigious basketball event." stated Dunton.

Flames Facing New Foes This Year

Liberty's season opener against Oklahoma was the first game of six this season versus an opponent Liberty has never previously faced. In addition to the Sooners, Liberty's non-conference schedule pitted the Flames against Houghton College, Southern Virginia, BYU, Oral Roberts and Florida as first-time opponents on the hardwood.

Early Signing Period

Liberty Head Men's Basketball Coach Randy Dunton has announced that Nathan Campbell and Ehimen Orukpe have signed national letters of intent for the 2007-08 academic year.

Campbell (6-6, 215, F, Cary, N.C.) is currently attending the prestigious Hargrave Military Academy in Chatham, Va., where was averaging 13.0 ppg and 7.0 rpg through the first seven games of the season. Campbell is the first player to ever sign with Liberty out of Hargrave Military Academy, which has sent numerous of its alumni into the SEC, ACC and NBA, including Josh Howard of the Dallas Mavericks, who attended Wake Forest after his days at Hargrave.

Orukpe (7-0, 220, C, Delta, Nigeria) is currently playing for the Ebun Comet, one of the elite amateur club teams in Nigeria, which showcased such talent as former Flames great Peter Aluma. Orukpe is currently averaging 12.0 ppg and 9.0 rpg a game for Ebun. Orukpe's current coach, Ayo Bakare, coached the 1998 Nigerian National Team, which included former Flame Julius Nwosu.



For the second-straight game, the Flames' defense stymied its opponent as Liberty held visiting Houghton College to just 28.1 percent shooting from the field and 46 points in a 92-46 26. percent should have been at the Vines Center. With the victory, Liberty pushes its record to 2-1 on the year with its second-straight 30-point win after downing visiting Cincinnati Christian, 101-65, two days before Thanksgiving The loss drops Houghton to 1-2 on the early season. Liberty's first two victories of the year marks the first time since the 1992-93 season that the Flames have posted back-to-back 30-point wins. The last time that Liberty accomplished the feat, Liberty downed Averett (111-53) and Covenant (96-59) on December 7 and 12, 1992. However, Anzuluni's basket would be the last for the Highlanders for the next four minutes as Liberty scored 21-unanswered points, capped by a lay-up by McLean at the 8:09 mark, giving Liberty a 36-11 lead. Corky McMullen snapped Houghton's scoreless streak with a three pointer just 14 seconds later, but the basket would prove to be just one of two that the Highlanders would connect on in the final eight minutes of the opening half as Liberty closed out the period on a 17-4 run, taking a 53-18 lead into the intermission. The Flames finished the opening 20 minutes shooting 57.9 percent from the field (22-of-38) while holding Houghton to just 29.2 percent from the floor (7-of-24). McLean led the Flames in the first as the junior scored 15 points on 7-of-8 shooting from the field. The second half didn't prove to be any better for the Highlanders as the closest the visitors got was 33 points on two separate ocasions during the first three minutes. Anthony Smith's jumper off a feed from Justin Holland at the 13:35 mark gave Liberty a 40-point cushion it would never relinquish. The tandem of McLean and Blair paced the way for the Flames again as McLean led the team by scoring 26 points on 11-of-13 shooting from the field, followed by Blair's 24 points, four assists and two steals. Porter followed with 10 points and seven boards and Damien Hubbard pulled down a gamehigh eight rebounds. The scoring performance allowed Blair to climb up another rung on the Big South all-time scoring list to climb up another rung on the big Soutin ait-time scoring list as he moved into eighth place by passing Mark Mocnik of Campbell (1989-93) who finished his career with 1,635 points. Blair, who has 1,654 career points, now stands just 10 points shy of seventh place on the conference's list as Wirthrop's LaShawn Coulter (1992-95) finished his career with 1,664 points. Houghton was led by Luke Mortenson as the guard was the only Highlander to reach double figures with 11 points. Anzuluni came off the bench to lead the team with five rebounds.

Hubbard grabbed a game and career-high 12 rebounds as the Flames out rebounded the Knights 61-22. Southern Virginia struggled all night from the field finishing the game shooting 31.0 percent on 18-of-58 shooting. Johnson led the Knights with 18 points on 7-of-18 shooting. Larry Blair moved into fourth place on the Liberty all-time scoring list as he scored 12 points. Brewington chipped in 14 points on 5-of-9 shooting in the loss. Young led the way for BYU with a game-high 17 points and Sam Burgess scored 12 points in the win.

The Liberty University Flames (6-7) committed a season-high 21 turnovers to overshadow Larry Blair's 26 points as Oral Roberts (7-7) earned a 90-58 victory at the Marriott Center on Saturday night. The game served as each team's third and final game of the BYU Holiday Classic. Game 15 Asheville, N.C.

The Flames dropped their 19th-straight road game and their eighth-consecutive contest overall as Liberty (6-9, 0-1) fell in its Big South Conference opener at UNC Asheville (5-10, 1-0) on Saturday night at the Justice Center, 84-77. The last time the Flames won a road game was on Feb. 24, 2005 at the Justice Center, when Liberty topped the Bulldogs, 84-70. Larry Blair, who paced Liberty with 21 points, passed Whit Holcomb-Faye of Radford for third place on the Big South all-time scoring list on his jumper with 11:50 left in the game. Blair has now tallied 1,869 career points The Flames started out the game on a 5-2 run capped by a tip-in by Damien Hubbard with 17:01 left in the first half, but that turned out to be Liberty's largest lead of the game. Liberty lost the advantage for good less than a minute later, when UNC Asheville's Bryan Smithson hit a three-point basket to give his team a 7-5 lead with 16:17 remaining in the half. The Flames proceeded to fall behind 37-18 by the half as the Bulldogs went on a 35-13 run, fueled by six blocks by UNC Asheville's 7-6 center, Kenny George. In addition, Liberty's shooting from the field was stone cold in the opening half. The Flames were 7-of-31 (22.6 percent) from the field during the opening 20 minutes. No Flame had more than one field goal in the first half and Hubbard led Liberty with four points. The second half started out not much better than the first, as the Flames got down by as many as 26 points when Smithson scored with 9:30 left in the game to make it 65-39. The Flames then got hot, going on an 18-2 run, which was capped by a three-point play by Blair with 3:35 left in the game, making it 71-59. A three-point basket by B.J. Jenkins wrapped up a game-ending 18-13 run by Liberty, but it was not enough as the Flames fell for the 12th time in 16 all-time Big South openers. Blair scored his 21 points on 8-of-19 shooting. Dwight Brewington scored 16 points on 6-of-12 shooting and Alex McLean rounded out Liberty's top scorers with 15 points and seven rebounds in the loss. The Flames were hot in the second half, shooting 56.1 percent on 23-of-41 field goal attempts. The Bulldogs were proficient from the field the entire evening, shooting 52.7 percent for the game on 29-of-55 tries. Smithson led the way for the Bulldogs with 21 points, while K.J. Garland scored 17 points. Vincent James scored 12 points and Garrett Moles rounded out the top UNC Asheville performers with 10 points and 10 rebounds.e netted a game-high 16 points, despite hitting just 3-of-14 attempts from the field, as his scoring total was aided by a 9-of-12 outing at the
