This experience led him to working with the San Diego Padres on two different occasions as a Digital Specialist and Ticket Operations Manager. Post-Graduate school, he skated into the hockey industry as an Event and Promotions Coordinator with The Rinks (under the Anaheim Ducks Ownership umbrella).

Post-covid, Daniel jumped into the muddy waters of Tough Mudder and Spartan Race. He worked as both as a Festival Event staff and Festival Manager during his tenure with the companies from 2021-2024. As a Festival Manager, he managed up to 7 full-time staff and 30-50 volunteers in multiple functional areas. Coordinated with multiple internal and external entities to create seamless events throughout the year. This experience and development of connections opened the door in 2022 to travel to Qatar for the FIFA World Cup 2022.

In Qatar, Daniel was a Deputy Manager of Load Zone Operations for TMS Global at the bus hub located in Souq Waqif. During operations, his team serviced over 100,000 spectators attending 8 different stadiums. Him and his team of 14 provided classroom and hands-on training with 92 new staff members who had little to no event experience. Throughout the duration of the games, he managed a team of 22 supervisors and ground staff.

Since leaving Spartan/Tough Mudder, Daniel has joined the FIFA World Cup 2026 Canada, Mexico, and the United States as a Manager, Workforce for the United States operations headquartered in Miami. This role will consist of helping develop and implement workforce planning and operations strategies for both the FIFA Club World Cup in 2025 and the FIFA World Cup in 2026. Working in close collaboration with numerous Functional Areas throughout the planning and operational process to forecast tournament requirements and needs. Experiential Learning: Combining an Introduction to Sports Management Course with a Sports Management Student Club to plan, execute, and evaluate a Forty-Year-Old Local Sports Event

A Sports Management Student Club combined with an Introduction to Sports Management Course to teach students vertical leadership development, including planning, executing, and evaluating a fundraising event that has been in the local community for four decades, will be discussed!

McDonald and Spence (2016) discussed how experiential learning impacts student lateral and vertical development. Indeed, the sports management literature fully explores students "learning from doing" by hosting three-on-three basketball competitions, softball events, and even golf tournaments. Likewise, most sports management programs highlight volunteer opportunities with local parks and recreation organizations, interscholastic and intercollegiate competitions, bowl games, national championship events, professional team games, road races, marathons, and pickleball tournaments (Hardin, Bemiller, & Pate, 2010). However, there appears to be a gap in the research examining partnerships with a student-led club and an academic course.

The purpose of this oral presentation is to learn from students who are part of a Division III institution, (members or officers) from the college's sports management club, currently taking or have taken the Introduction to Sports Management course that jointly runs the 40th annual Tom Duckett Memorial Golf Event, held each year during Homecoming Weekend in LaGrange, Georgia. Students will discuss roles, tasks, and outcomes to present a best practice!

Servant Leadership Coaching

Marty Durden, Ed.D. (Shorter University)

Servant leadership is a topic of discussion in our society but widely misunderstood by educators. While our colleagues have a vague comprehension of servant leading, educators view it as a chain of service projects. One reason for this conundrum is because popular servant leadership has a sparse body of research to validate its effectiveness in the world of athletic coaching.

The original purpose of this study was to research the motivational effects of servant leadership coaching on high school student-athletes and to provide functional information for coaches and educators regarding the positive results of the servant leadership coaching philosophy.

The research on this topic is unique as it was the first academic study regarding the motivational effects of servant leadership coaching. This philosophy has become a topic of discussion throughout the coaching fraternity and begs research upon the transferability of this leadership style to the profession of athletic coaching. It is reasonable to believe the body of evidence indicates that servant leadership is a relevant model for leaders and possesses the potential to positively influence a nationwide audience of young people.

The ongoing research utilizes a simple Likert scale to gather information from student athletes for ages high school through college. The students in the sample are from Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, and Texas. The results of the surveys and interviews indicated that the servant leader behaviors of trust, competence, affection, fairness, and empowerment possess significant inherent motivational power that resonates with Millennials and Generation Z. Results indicated a significant link with higher levels of effort and attention.

The findings indicate that the concept of servant leadership coaching has a positive effect on the motivational levels of student-athletes. The information demonstrates that this audience values trust above all other coaching traits. The aim of the study is to present a quantitative list of the servant leadership constructs that will provide functional information for professional educators and coaches to gain greater insight into the value of servant leadership behaviors that result in increased player motivation of team members.

Professional Development for Sport Management Students: Challenges and Opportunities

Rachel Elms, Ph.D. (Tarleton State University)

Sport management programs have long viewed internships and practicum experiences as the cornerstone for students' academic preparation (Bell & Countiss, 1993). Furthermore, sport management programs have a history of incorporating experiential learning opportunities into the curriculum to improve students' applicable and transferable skills (Faure et al., 2021). While both internships and experiential learning hold value for students, professional development promotes student-career readiness and is linked to student learning (Reeves, 2010). Professional development includes career training and continued education to build on these applicable skills. The purpose of this work is to present an overview of the Professional Development (PD) Point Program at Tarleton State University. This presentation will focus on the implementation of this program which requires that all sport management majors obtain 15 professional development credentials to support their career goals while providing a foundation for the creation of their professional portfolio and resume. Students can complete a variety of points in six varying categories which include research, service, fitness, leadership, memberships, and certifications. This presentation will address current challenges in addition to posing potential revisions for enhancing the effectiveness of the program while keeping current with national trends. It will also include recommendations for the implementation of similar programs which may involve (a) methods for boosting credibility and confidence through network-building; (b) credentials for career advancement within the industry; and (c) opportunities for enhanced leadership skills.

PANEL 9: THE ULTIMATE START-UP

Tyson Jeffers What Does It Take to Start a MiLB Team?

Tyson is the General Manager for the MiLB's newest team – the Hub City Spartanburgers, the High-A affiliate of the Texas Rangers. Born and raised in Mississippi, Tyson attended Mississippi State University. While at Mississippi State, he received his undergraduate degree in Risk Management, Insurance, and Financial Planning and then earned his MBA.

After graduation, Tyson accepted a job with the St. Paul Saints, currently the Triple-A Affiliate of the Twins, in St. Paul, MN. With the Saints, Tyson held many sales-focused roles, including Ticket Sales Manager, Corporate Partnerships Activation Manager, Ticket Sales Manager, Director of Ticket Sales and Director of Corporate Partnerships. During Tyson's 8 years with the Saints, he was part of the staff that helped build the Saints' current ballpark, CHS Field, which was a \$65M ground-up build that opened in 2015.

In pre-COVID 2020, Tyson moved to New York State to become the Assistant General Manager for the Hudson Valley Renegades, currently the High-A Affiliate of the New York Yankees. Tyson remained the AGM of the Renegades for 2 years before being elevated to General Manager of the club. While with the Renegades, Tyson helped in securing \$25M+ to be utilized to a revitalization project of the 30-year-old ballpark. The project included fully replacing the field and outfield wall, renovating the visiting clubhouse spaces, building a new home clubhouse, and expanding the capacity to include a new premium Club space and new group areas. This project was completed before the start of the 2024 season.

After almost four years with the Renegades, Tyson was tapped to start up the Spartanburgers located in Spartanburg, SC. In Nov 2024, Tyson moved to Spartanburg as the sole employee of the organization to build the staff and manage the construction of their \$120M ballpark project. In the last year, Tyson has helped build the staff to 15 full-time staff members, launch the team's brand/identity, and is helping prepare the team for their inaugural season in 2025.
