If You Test Positive for COVID-19 (Isolate)

Everyone, regardless of vaccination status must:

- Stay in your designated quarantine location or place of residence if you live off campus, for 5 days.
- If you have no symptoms or your symptoms are resolving after 5 days, you can leave your designated quarantine location or place of residence if you live off campus.
- Continue to wear a mask around others for 5 additional days.

If you have a fever, continue to stay in your designated quarantine location or place of residence if you live off campus until your fever resolves.




Positive Test Quarantine Protocol

Example Positive Result: Mary develops cough and fever on January 1st. Her symptoms have improved, and she does not have a weakened immune system. She must remain in quarantine through January 6th, and then wear a mask through January 12th.

Example Positive Result: Mary gets tested for COVID-19 on January 1st and receives a positive test result. She has no symptoms. She must remain in quarantine through January 6th, and then wear a mask through January 12th.

Direct Exposure Quarantine Protocol - Vaccinated

If you have been boosted, completed the primary series of Pfizer or Moderna vaccine within the last 6 months, or completed the primary series of J&J vaccine within the last 2 months, you must:

- Wear a mask around others for 10 days.
- Test on day 5, if possible.

If you develop symptoms get a test and stay in your designated quarantine location or place of residence if you live off campus.

• What counts as Direct Contact?

- You were within 6 feet of someone who has COVID-19 for a total of 15 minutes within a
 48 hour time-frame
- You provided care at home to someone who is sick with COVID-19
- You had direct physical contact with the person (hugged or kissed them)
- You shared eating or drinking utensils
- They sneezed, coughed, or somehow got respiratory droplets on you



Direct Exposure Quarantine Protocol - Not Vaccinated/Not boosted

If you completed the primary series of Pfizer or Moderna vaccine over 6 months ago and are not boosted, completed the primary series of J&J over 2 months ago and are not boosted, or are unvaccinated, you must:

- Stay in your designated quarantine location or place of residence if you live off campus, for 5 days. After that continue to wear a mask around others for 5 additional days.
- Test on day 5 if possible.

If you develop symptoms get a test and stay in your designated quarantine location or place of residence if you live off campus.

• What counts as Direct Contact?

- You were within 6 feet of someone who has COVID-19 for a total of 15 minutes within a
 48 hour time-frame
- You provided care at home to someone who is sick with COVID-19
- You had direct physical contact with the person (hugged or kissed them)
- You shared eating or drinking utensils
- They sneezed, coughed, or somehow got respiratory droplets on you



Direct Exposure Quarantine Protocol - Not Vaccinated/Not boosted

Example Direct Exposure (not vaccinated): Mark was around a friend on January 1st, who tested positive for Covid-19. Mark is a direct contact. Mark is not vaccinated. He must quarantine through January 6th and then wear a mask through January 12th.

Example Direct Exposure (not boosted): Mark was around a friend on January 1st, who tested positive for Covid-19. Mark is a direct contact. Mark got his last dose of the Pfizer vaccine 7 months ago and has not received his booster shot. He must quarantine through January 6th and then wear a mask through January 12th.

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
